

At Western Illinois



At Western Illinois

2006 (Sophomore season): Converted all 42 extra point attempts to rank fifth among the school's single-season record book... broke the Western Illinois record for most consecutive PATs made and still remains perfect in his career (89-for-89)... only one other Division I sophomore (Sam Swank, Wake Forest) continued a perfect career (61-for-61) and just four Division I juniors are perfect on PATs... also handled the Leathernecks' kickoff duties, tallying 25 touchbacks on 58 kicks... made seven of his 13 field goal attempts... hit a career-long 53-yarder, equalling the third-longest field goal in school history, against Kentucky Wesleyan and matched it at the UNI-Dome... was 5-of-7 from under 50 yards.

2005 (Freshman season): Became Western Illinois' first true freshman place-kicker since 1994 and the first to start on opening day since 1990... converted all 47 PATs, setting school records for most consecutive extra points in a single season, most extra points by a freshman and most consecutive extra points by a freshman... hit all 10 PAT tries against lowa Wesleyan, tying a school record for most extra points in a game by a freshman...

Only FCS junior perfect on career PATs

connected on five of nine field goal attempts... became just the second player in school history to compile a perfect PAT percentage... hit a career-long 47-yard field goal against Northern Iowa, which was the longest by a Western Illinois freshman... his 47 PATs were more than all 41 other I-AA players who were perfect on extra point attempts in 2005... there were only four I-A players with a higher perfect total.


