

LIBERALS TRAIL NDP BY SEVEN, BUT ADRIAN DIX TRAILS HIS PARTY BY 14: CHRISTY CLARK TOP PICK FOR PREMIER. WANT TO FIND OUT HOW YOUR NEIGHBOUR IS VOTING? CHECK THEIR DRIVEWAY

- The BC NDP maintain a seven-point lead on the BC Liberals with four days to go before voters head to the polls. (VOTING INTENTION: NDP 41.1%, LIB 34.6%)
- Voting intention looks to be hardening among Liberals and New Democrats, but Green Party and Conservative Party supporters are less sure. Only two thirds of this group say they're unlikely to change their mind between now and election day.
- It's not all good news for the New Democrats. Despite his party's commanding lead, Adrian Dix trails Christy Clark on the question of who the best choice to be Premier is. (BEST CHOICE: Christy Clark 31.8%, Adrian Dix 27.6%)
- In other findings, it looks like it's time to shelve the "Latte Liberal" stereotype. BC Liberal supporters are no more likely to favour Starbucks over Tim Horton's than their NDP counterparts.
- If you're still set on making snap judgments about who's a Liberal and who's a New Democrat, you could do worse than stereotyping on car type. Drivers of SUVs and Crossovers are significantly more likely to mark an X next to the Liberal candidate, while drivers of compacts and trucks are equally enthusiastic about the NDP.
