Collector discusses life, works of Key Largo artist

Art collector Chuck Faulkner comes to the Florida Historical Society and the Library of Florida History (in the same building) at 2 p.m. Saturday to speak about mid-20th century Key Largo artist Harry Sonntag and his work.

Faulkner has an extensive collection of Sonntag's watercolors, which will be on display all day Saturday at the Florida Historical Society. Faulkner also will be on hand to speak to people one-on-one during the Cocoa Village Gallery Walk on Saturday evening.

FHS executive director Ben Brotemarkle expects the talk and gallery walk to be informative and exciting.

"There's an interesting story in how Faulkner came to own about 200 of Sonntag's works, which were believed to have been lost in a fire." Brotemarkle said.

Considered eccentric, the artist lived in an abandoned

shack. He fed himself by fishing and growing vegetables in his backyard.

Upon finding an abandoned lime packing plant, Sonntag put up a sign — the Key Largo Art Gallery — and created the first independent art gallery in Key Largo.

"He captures a particular place in time really well," Brotemarkle said. "He documents the natural beauty of Florida, but also the people living and working in Key Large in the mid-20th cen-
