



# A to Z of information

#### Barbecue evening

The evening will be held in the upper part of the castle park in front of the orangery. It is a private event open to invited guests only. 230 people have been invited for the barbecue evening, which starts at 7 pm on Friday and officially ends at 1.30 am.

The private chef of the Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg family, who works at Berleburg Castle, Martin Jacobsen, is in charge of the culinary treats this evening. Mr Jacobsen, originally from Denmark, will be supported by a team including three chefs (a woman and two men) from the Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg house, as well as Martin Jacobsen's predecessor, Jimmi Hansen. The team is complemented by a chef who works for the Danish Royal House, Lisbeth Bager-Bertelsen.

Hence, there will be a distinctly Danish influence to the cuisine this evening. For instance, the beef is a gift from the Andersen family, renowned Danish butchers from Bjerringbro in Denmark, who are friends of the family. Guests will also be able to enjoy fish, seafood, salads and a variety of sauces, all with a noticeable Danish style.

Dishes to be served at the barbecue evening:

The service for the Barbecue evening is being provided by Vierling catering company from Overath near Cologne.



The entertainment programme (singing, music and dancing) was developed under the lead of Goldrausch Entertainment. The "singing chef", Oliver Obermoeller, is particularly worthy of mention. With his company, Sing-Cuisine of Borgholzhausen, he offers the guests both cooking and entertainment. On the barbecue evening, he will act as DJ and sing, accompanied by a band which includes Cuban musicians, entertaining with pop and salsa music.

Princess Nathalie and Alexander Johannsmann particularly wanted a casual and informal evening with their friends. Therefore the dress code is "casual". For men, this might include jeans, an open-necked shirt with open collar and no tie. For ladies, the dress code means a skirt, summer dress or trousers.

#### Choir

On the day of the wedding, the religious ceremony will be accompanied by Danish girls' choir "St. Annae Pige Kor" from Copenhagen. Princess Benedikte, Princess Nathalie's mother, is the patron of this girls' choir, which currently has 45 members.

The girls are aged between 14 and 16. They will be accompanied by Danish organist Philip Schmid-Madsen. The choir will contribute Danish and English songs as well as psalms to the festive celebration. During their stay in Germany, the choir girls will stay with families from Bad Berleburg.

#### Dinner

The wedding ceremony will culminate in a dinner-dance on the evening of Saturday 18 June, in the marquee accommodated in the castle park. Some 230 guests will enjoy an exquisite four course menu, prepared by the Vierling catering company.

Parfait de foie gras of duck and goose with icewine gelée Brioches

Atlantic lobster on a wild garlic sauce Dialogue of green and white asparagus

Poached filet of veal with a jus of champagne truffle Summer vegetables with Pommes Anna

Tartlets with yogurt mousse and rhubarb Strawberry terrine, mixed summer berries Wedding cake

During dinner, entertainment will be provided once again by Goldrausch Entertainment and the band.

The dance will be opened by Princess Nathalie and Alexander Johannsmann with a traditional Danish first waltz with music from the ballet "Et Folke sagn / a folk tale". The 3-act ballet was written by Niels Gade [1817 - 1890] and J.P. Emilius Hartmann [1805-1900], who are among Denmark's most important composers.

#### **Flowers**

The flowers inside and in front of the church will be supplied and arranged by BlumenENK (owned by Thomas Dietz) from Düsseldorf. BlumenENK is also in charge of the floral display in the castle courtyard and in the reception room on Saturday evening. The flowers have been selected by Princess Benedikte, Princess Nathalie's mother. While the marquee will mostly be decorated with white and pink peonies, the floral arrangements in the church will be dominated by white roses.

The decoration of the marquee and for the barbecue evening will be provided by Ochs company (owned by Frank Feuerherdt) from Cologne.



## Getting to the church

Both Princess Nathalie and Alexander Johannsmann have decided to arrive at the church by car.

Princess Nathalie will arrive in a Rolls Royce Phantom 2 Sidelight Cabrio, made in 1935. The car's owner, Hans-Georg Schneider, has kindly offered it for the occasion and he will drive it himself to the church and back.

The groom will be driven to the church in a Rolls Royce Silver Wraith, built in 1954; this car is also owned by Hans-Georg Schneider.

The guests will arrive at the foot of the stairs of the church in private cars and buses. The guests staying at the castle will be brought to the church in minibuses.

#### Marriage

The marriage ceremony will be held according to the Protestant tradition and in the German language. The order of service sheet is available in the English language.

At 4 pm, the first guests are expected to arrive at the Protestant church; shortly before 5 pm the groom, Alexander Johannsmann, accompanied by his friend Peter Lösser will arrive and Richard Prince of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg will escort his daughter Princess Nathalie into the church. The marriage ceremony will take about one hour.

#### Official reception

#### **Pastor**

The religious wedding ceremony will be performed by local Protestant Pastor Claudia Latzel-Binder. She already baptized Konstantin, the son of Princess Nathalie and Alexander Johannsmann, who was born last year, in the chapel of Berleburg Castle. The royal family and Claudia Latzel-Binder have known each other since the funeral service which the Pastor Latzel-Binder held for Princess Nathalie's grandmother.

The wedding celebrations are to be photo-documented by in-house photographer Karl-Anton Koenigs, who is a member of the family. Mr Koenigs will be assisted by two freelance photographers from the Ron Allen photo studio of Bad Berleburg.

#### Rifle club

On Saturday 18 June, Bad Berleburg's rifle club will provide a musical salute to the wedding couple and their guests in the castle courtyard. The club, chaired by the 1st President and team captain Markus Weller, 2nd President Dirk Pöppel and 3rd President Carsten Zumrode, will play three pieces. Their performance will begin at 7.15 pm in the castle courtyard.

# The Wedding Dress

Designer is Henrik Hviid from Denmark.

The dress is made from heavy ivory satin with a silk organza lining. The top in lace is open necked and long sleeved. From the broad pleated satin belt, the three meter long and two meter broad train starts. The monograme of the bridlecouple is embroided with pearls and crystals towards the bottom of the train.

#### Vail

The vail of irish lace (1905) was a wedding gift for Queen Ingrid's mother Crown-Princess Magaret of Sweden. Queen Ingrid wore the same vail for her wedding 1935 followed by her three daughters, (Queen Magarethe, Queen Anne-Marie and Princess Benedikte Princess) as well as Alexandra Sayn Wittgenstein, Princess Alexia of Greece and Crown-Princess Mary.

#### Tiara

The tiara from 1904 was a wedding gift for Crown-Princess Magaret of Sweden and was worn by the three sisters, Queen Anne-Marie, Queen Magarethe and Princess Benedikte and two grand daughters, Princess Alexandra and Princess Alexa, for each of their wedding.



# Hitch-free Wedding

For the church wedding of Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg and Alexander Johannsmann, a number of streets, including Schlossstrasse will have to be blocked temporarily

Bad Berleburg, 3 June 2011. The city of Bad Berleburg is getting ready for an exceptional event. Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg and Alexander Johannsmann will be getting married on Saturday 18 June in the Protestant church - the civil service took place last year. Hundreds of guests are expected from Germany and abroad. Such an event requires extensive and well thought-out logistics.

In order to ensure the ceremony goes as planned, without any hitches, a range of measures have been taken, in particular modifications to the traffic routing. The wedding couple and the royal family ask local residents, especially those who live in the vicinity of the castle and the church for their understanding on this important day. They hope that the temporary limitations will not cause too much inconvenience.

The changed traffic routing will be as follows: from Friday 17 June up to and including Sunday 19 June, "Schlossstrasse", "Goetheplatz" and "Parkstrasse" (from "Ederstrasse" until "Am Berlebach") will be closed to all traffic. This "traffic arrangement" ordered by the district of Siegen-Wittgenstein applies to both private cars and trucks as well as motorbikes and bikes. Residents are generally excepted from this closure.

On the day of the marriage, Saturday 18 June, Schlossstrasse, Goetheplatz and Parkstrasse will also be closed to residents for a short period of time (from around 3.45 pm to 6.15 pm), for security reasons. During this time no vehicles will be able to enter or leave these areas. On Saturday 18 June, no vehicles will be permitted to stop along Schlossstrasse, between house numbers 14 and 24.

The car parks at the castle wall (Parkstrasse) are also affected by the wedding celebrations. They will be closed from 8 am on Friday 17 June to 8 am on Sunday 19 June. The castle courtyard will be closed to the public from 2 pm on Friday 17 June up to and including Sunday 19 June. The same applies to the upper castle park, which is expected to be closed from Tuesday 14 June until Thursday 23 June.

A security service will monitor the closed areas and diversions to ensure that everything runs smoothly.

# International celebration with a local flavour

Many citizens of Bad Berleburg will contribute to the success of Princess Nathalie's and Alexander Johannsmann's wedding

Bad Berleburg, 10 June 2011. When Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg and Alexander Johannsmann get married at the Protestant church in Bad Berleburg this Saturday, 18 June, there will be many local citizens behind the scenes helping to make the event a success.

The programme for the celebrations is as follows. The events will start on Friday 17 June at 7 pm with a barbecue evening in the upper part of the castle park, in front of the orangery. 230 guests from Germany and abroad are invited. The wedding couple explicitly wanted a "casual" evening, which means that the dress code will be "casual" too. For men, this means jeans, an open-necked shirt with open collar and no tie. For ladies, the dress code might include a skirt, summer dress or trousers.

The private chef of the Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg family, Martin Jacobsen, is in charge of the culinary treats at this event. Mr Jacobsen, originally from Denmark, will be supported by a team of five additional chefs, including the chef who works for the Danish Royal House, Lisbeth Bager-Bertelsen. Hence, there will be a distinctly Danish influence to the cuisine this evening.

The barbecue evening will be photo-documented by the in-house photographer, who is also a member of the family. He will be assisted by two employees from the Ron Allen photo studio of Bad Berleburg.

In addition to local police, the Bad Berleburg security company WaSi will make sure that the whole wedding runs safely and without trouble. The firm will also monitor the changes to traffic routing. They specialize in providing security for medium-sized industrial companies, retailers, private households and public buildings.

At a wedding, the attire of the bride and groom naturally attracts much attention. The wedding dress of the bride remains a closely-guarded secret. But we can tell you that no fault will be found with the cut and fit of the morning suit to be worn by the groom at the wedding. Bad Berleburg-based tailor Kerstin Kraemer has ensured that it fits him perfectly.

The wedding ceremony will start at 5 pm on Saturday 18 June. The service will take about one hour. Guests will start to arrive at the church at 4 pm. Princess Nathalie will be escorted to the church and to the altar by her father, Richard Prince of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg. Both the bride and groom will arrive at the church by car.

The religious wedding ceremony will be organized and held by local Protestant Pastor Claudia Latzel-Binder. She already baptized Konstantin, the son of Princess Nathalie and Alexander Johannsmann, who was born last year, in the castle chapel. The service will be held in the German language according to the Protestant rite. 45 singers aged 14 to 16 years from the Danish girls' choir "St. Annae Pige Kor" of Copenhagen will accompany the ceremony in the church. Princess Benedikte, Princess Nathalie's mother, is the patron of the choir. The young Danish singers are being welcomed as guests at the homes of families in Bad Berleburg.



The service will be immediately followed by a reception for some 370 guests in the castle courtyard and reception hall. The 230 wedding guests will be joined on this occasion by another 140 people from the personal and social environment of the family.

At 7.15 pm, Bad Berleburg's rifle club will provide a musical salute to the wedding couple in the castle courtyard. The club, chaired by the 1st President and captain Markus Weller, 2nd President Dirk Pöppel and 3rd President Carsten Zumrode will play three pieces. The formal reception will end around 7.45 pm.

From 8 pm onwards, the wedding celebrations for the wedding couple and its 230 guests will culminate in a dinner-dance in the marquee located in the castle park.



# About the Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg family

The family, headed by Richard-Casimir Karl August Robert Konstantin Prince of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg, has lived continuously at Berleburg Castle. It is not common practice among the aristocracy for the heads of the family to live permanently in one place. The Counts of Wittgenstein, originally also named "von Battenberg", date back to the 12th century.

The first mention of the Count of Wittgenstein is in a deed by Count Werner I (who died in 1215) and dates back to 1174. The name of Wittgenstein goes back to the castle near Laasphe with the same name (Widichen = Widukinds-stein).

From that time onwards, the Counts increased their possessions and won through against their mighty neighbours, the Landgraves of Hesse, the Counts of Nassau and Archbishops of Cologne and Mainz. The city of Berleburg, which was founded in 1258 by Siegfried I, came to be a major outpost as the family's reach expanded towards the Rothaargebirge area.

In 1359, the Wittgensteiner family's male line died out and so possession passed to Count Salentin of Sayn (who died in 1392), the husband of hereditary princess Adelheid von Wittgenstein. Since then, the family has been called "von Sayn-Wittgenstein" and "zu Sayn-Wittgenstein" respectively.

Count Ludwig von Sayn zu Wittgenstein, as he called himself, lived from 1532 to 1605. In his testament, written in 1603, he decreed that the county be distributed among his three eldest sons after his death. His son Georg V (1565 to 1631) inherited the northern part of the County of Wittgenstein, Franche-Comté of Züschen including Medebacher Zehnt, the sovereignties of Neumagen on Mosel, Homburg vor der Mark and the house of Bruch. This branch of the family has since then been known as "zu Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg" and was awarded the title of Imperial Prince in 1792.

Richard-Casimir Karl August Robert Konstantin Prince of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg is the eldest son of Gustav Albrecht Prince of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg (1907 - 1944) and his Swedish wife, Countess Margareta Fouche d'Otrante (1909 - 2005). Since his father was officially declared dead in 1969, Richard has been considered the head of the house of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg. Richard attended Gymnasium (German High School) and then graduated in science in forestry. After graduating, he went to work in the Accounts Office of Wittgenstein-Berleburg, in Berleburg Castle; the Accounts Office is in charge of managing some 13,000 hectares of forest and some 150 plots of land in Germany and abroad as well as company shareholdings.

He met his future wife at the wedding of former Dutch Crown Princess Beatrix von Oranien-Nassau to German Diplomat Claus von Amsberg. On 3 February 1968, he and Princess Benedikte of Denmark got married at Fredensborg Castle. Princess Benedikte was born on 29 April 1944 and was the second daughter of King Fredrik IX (1899 - 1972) and Queen Ingrid (1910 - 2000). The couple have three children, Gustav Frederik Philip Richard (born 12 January 1969), Alexandra Rosemarie Ingrid Benedikte (born 20 November 1970) and Nathalie Xenia Margareta Benedikte (born 2 May 1975).



# Biography

## Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg

HSH Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg was born on 2 May 1975 in Copenhagen, the youngest daughter of HRH Princess Benedikte of Denmark and HSH Richard Prince of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg.

Princess Nathalie grew up in Germany. She attended primary school in Bad Berleburg and then moved to the Johannes-Althusius-Gymnasium, also in Bad Berleburg, for her secondary education. Princess Nathalie attended sixth form at Louisenlund boarding school in Schleswig-Holstein and completed her Abitur (A' Level equivalent) in 1994.

From 1994 to 1998, she attended dressage rider training at State Stud Flyinge in Southern Sweden, taught by Finnish dressage rider Kyra Kyrklund.

From 1998 to 2005, she was trained by Klaus Balkenhol at Coesfeld and returned to Bad Berleburg in 2005, where she became a freelance horse breeder.

Princess Nathalie has Danish citizenship and is fluent in Danish. She has represented Denmark at international tournaments and championships for many years.

Some of her successes include the bronze medal obtained at the European championship at Verden and the Bronze medal obtained in the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. She was Danish Champion in 2002 and 2009 and gained second place in the World Cup Finals in 2011.

#### Alexander Johannsmann

Alexander Johannsmann was born on 6 December 1977 in Gütersloh, the only son of Heinrich-Wilhelm Johannsmann and his wife Jutta Johannsmann, née Henkenjohann.

Alexander Johannsmann attended primary school at Isselhorst and then moved to the Anne-Frank-Gesamtschule in Gütersloh. From 1996 to 1999, he trained to be a carpenter and from 1999 to 2005, he worked for joinery company Homeyer in Gütersloh. In 2005, Alexander Johannsmann joined the international horse forwarding agency, Friedrich Johannsmann.

Alexander Johannsmann's father, Heinrich-Wilhelm Johannsmann, was a successful show jumper and participated in the Olympic Games, as well as in world and European championships. Since his riding career ended, he has worked as a trainer for show jumpers.

The civil wedding of Princess Nathalie and Alexander Johannsmann took place on 27 May 2010 at Berleburg Castle. Their son, Konstantin, was born on 24 July 2010 at Bad Berleburg.

The family lives at Berleburg Castle.



# Civil wedding of HSH Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg and Alexander Johannsmann

Bad Berleburg, 28 May 2011. HRH Princess Benedikte of Denmark and HSH Prince Richard of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg announce the civil wedding of HSH Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg and Alexander Johannsmann on 27 May 2010. The marriage took place in the orangery in Berleburg Castle park. The religious ceremony is expected to be held in 2011.

Princess Nathalie is the youngest daughter of Princess Benedikte and Prince Richard. The Princess lives at Berleburg Castle, where she breeds and trains the family's dressage horses. The Princess is an active rider. She became Danish dressage champion in 2002 and 2009 and won the Bronze medal with the Danish team at the Olympic Games in Beijing and Hong Kong in 2008. The Princess will not change her name as a result of her marriage.

Alexander Johannsmann is 32 years old and a German citizen. He works in the international firm of his uncle, which specializes in transporting horses. Alexander Johannsmann grew up in an environment where equestrian sports play a major role. His father, formerly an internationally successful show jumper is today a renowned trainer of show jumpers. Alexander Johannsmann will also retain his name after the wedding.

The couple will live at Berleburg Castle.



# Birth of Konstantin Gustav Heinrich Richard

Bad Berleburg, 25 July 2010. HSH Princess Nathalie of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg, daughter of HRH Princess Benedikte and HSH Prince Richard of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Berleburg, gave birth to a healthy son on Saturday 24 July at 6.45 pm in the clinic of Bad Berleburg. He is named Konstantin Gustav Heinrich Richard.

Princess Nathalie's husband, Alexander Johannsmann, accompanied his wife throughout the birth.

Both mother and baby are fine.

It is expected that the family will return in a few days' time from the clinic in Berleburg to Berleburg Castle.

With Princess Nathalie's son, Princess Benedikte and Prince Richard now have three grand-children.



# Christening of Konstantin Gustav Heinrich Richard
