Description and Reasons for Notification

Great Wilbraham Common supports neutral grassland communities of the calcareous loam grassland type. This is a type that is now rare in Britain. Only fragments are known to persist, chiefly as small areas of common land. This site is one of the largest remaining species-rich grasslands in Cambridgeshire.

The sward is characterised by the presence of such grasses as white bent *Agrostis stolonifera* and red fescue *Festuca rubra*. Other characteristic species include quaking-grass *Briza media*, glaucous sedge *Carex flacca*, lady's bedstraw *Galium verum* and salad burnet *Poterium sanguisorba*. A number of locally uncommon species are also present. They include purple milk-vetch *Astragalus danicus*, felwort *Gentianella amarella*, meadow saxifrage *Saxifraga granulata*, green-winged orchid *Orchis morio* and sulphur clover *Trifolium ochroleucon*.
