 Michigan leads the all-time series with Eastern Michigan, 9-0. Including Saturday, all 10 games have been played in Ann Arbor.

• It marks the first time since 1976 U-M has opened a season with five consecutive home games.

• Michigan has won its last 10 regular season non-conference games.

• U-M has won its last 11 September games.

• Michigan's win last Saturday over Notre Dame gave the Wolverines their first three-game winning streak over the Fighting Irish since 1908. U-M won its first eight games over Notre Dame, spanning from 1887-1908.

• The Wolverines' 35-31 comeback win over Notre Dame from a 17-point deficit last Saturday was tied for the thirdlargest comeback victory in Michigan history.

• The Wolverines are plus-5 in turnover margin. They were a combined minus-32 the last three seasons.

QUICK START FOR WOLVERINES

• U-M has started 2-0 for the third consecutive season. It marks the first time since 1995-97 the Wolverines have started 2-0 in three consecutive seasons. Michigan started 4-0 in 2009 and 5-0 in 2010.

• Michigan has been honored during the first two weeks of the season with Big Ten Player of the Week honors. After becoming the first Michigan player to ever score two defensive touchdowns in the same game against Western Michigan, senior linebacker BRANDON HERRON earned Defensive Player of the Week honors. Junior quarterback DENARD ROBINSON was honored this week as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after scoring five touchdowns and passing for a career-best 338 yards and four touchdowns in Saturday's dramatic 35-31 comeback victory vs. Notre Dame.

• The two programs, separated by only 11 miles, will meet for just the 10th time on Saturday.

• Michigan has claimed victories in all nine previous matchups.

• U-M has outscored the Eagles (Hurons, former nickname) by a 296 to 59 margin.

• The Hurons did not score a point six of the first seven match-ups in the series.

• The first game played between the two schools came in 1896, an 18-0 victory by the Wolverines at U-M's Regents Field.

THE LAST TIME VS. EASTERN MICHIGAN...

• Holding a 24-17 halftime lead, Michigan scored 21 unaswered second-half points to defeat Eastern Michigan, 45-17. Michigan totaled 448 yards, including 380 yards rushing, and was led by CARLOS BROWN's 187 yards and two touch-downs. Quarterback DENARD ROBINSON also ran for touchdowns of 13 and 36 yards.

BRADY HOKE AGAINST EASTERN MICHIGAN • Head Coach Brady Hoke is 4-2 against Eastern

• Head Coach Brady Hoke is 4-2 against Eastern Michigan. Hoke, who owns a 28-21 mark against MAC schools, was head coach of Ball State for six seasons (2003-08) and led Ball State to an 8-0 conference mark in 2008.

MICHIGAN VS. MID AMERICAN CONFERENCE

Michigan is 28-1 against teams currently in the MAC.
The Wolverines have outscored MAC opponents by a 1013-281 margin in those 29 games.

• All 29 of the games against MAC schools have been played at Michigan Stadium.

• U-M defeated Western Michigan 34-10 on 9/3/11, and this is the 12th consecutive year that Michigan has matched up with a MAC school.

WOLVERINES FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2011

• Eight of Michigan's 12 2011 regular-season opponents received bowl bids in 2010, while compiling a 72-33 record (.686 winning percentage).

LAST WEEK...

Michigan forced five turnovers to rally from a 17-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat Notre Dame, 35-31, last Saturday at Michigan Stadium. DENARD ROBINSON's 16-yard pass to ROY ROUNDTREE with two seconds left gave Michigan the victory. It marked the third consecutive season the Wolverines defeated Notre Dame in the final 27 seconds of the game (2009, Tate Forcier to Greg Mathews with 11 seconds remaining; 2010, Robinson two-yard rush with 27 seconds remaining). U-M's win tied for the third-largest comeback victory in school history.

Robinson totaled 446 of the team's 452 yards. He had a career-best 338 yards and four touchdowns passing, while rushing for 108 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. He became the 15th Wolverine to have 10 career 100-plus yard games.

Michigan scored two touchdowns in the final 1:12 of the game. Robinson first drove the Wolverines 58 yards on five plays in 1:04, capped off by a Vincent Smith 21-yard touchdown pass to give U-M its first lead of the game, 28-24.

Following a four-play, 61-yard touchdown drive to give Notre Dame a 31-28 lead with :30 left, Robinson led Michigan on a three-play, 80-yard touchdown drive for the game-winner. Robinson hit JEREMY GALLON on a 64-yard pass on 2ndand-10 from the Michigan 20, reaching the Notre Dame 16-yard line. One play later, Robinson hit Roundtree for the game-winning score.

ENTERING 2011...

• Michigan returns 18 starters from 2010, nine on offense and nine on defense.

• On offense, C DAVID MOLK, RG PATRICK OMAMEH, QB DENARD ROBINSON and WR ROY ROUNDTREE started all 13 games in 2010, while DE RYAN VAN BERGEN, DE CRAIG ROH, LB CAM GORDON and S JORDAN KOVACS started all 13 games on defense.

• The offensive line welcomes back four starters from the 2010 squad that allowed only 11 sacks and helped U-M total a school-record 6,353 yards of offense. MOLK, OMAMEH, LT TAYLOR LEWAN and RT MARK HUYGE have combined for 74 career starts and 87 career games on the offensive line.

• Of the 16 players that scored a touchdown for Michigan in 2010, 13 return in 2011.

• U-M returns eight of 10 players from 2010 that had a rushing attempt, and six of seven players that scored a rushing touchdown.

• U-M returns 13 of 16 players from 2010 that had a reception, seven of eight players with 75-plus receiving yards and seven of nine players that recorded a touchdown catch.

• The U-M football team elected three seniors, TE KEVIN KOGER, C DAVID MOLK and DT MIKE MARTIN, as captains for the 132nd team in school history.

BIG PLAY THREATS

• The Maize and Blue has produced 10 plays from scrimmage that have chewed up 20+ yards, three vs. WMU and seven vs. Notre Dame. Five different U-M players contributed big plays against the Fighting Irish.

Fifth-year senior wide receiver JUNIOR HEMINGWAY had three catches (43 TD, 45, 77) for 165 yards vs. ND. The 77-yard play was U-M's longest passing play since 2007.

Long passes were also completed against ND to junior/sophomore receiver JEREMY GALLON (67 yards), fifth-year senior receiver KELVIN GRADY (27) and junior running back VINCENT SMITH (21, TD).

POCKET PRESENCE

• Michigan's offensive line allowed just 11 sacks in 2010, which led the Big Ten. That trend has continued in 2011. The line has allowed one sack in two games.

RED ZONE RETURNS

• The Wolverines are 5-for-5 to start the season in red zone touchdown efficiency. Junior/sophomore running back FITZGERALD TOUSSAINT had two red zone touchdowns vs. WMU 9/3.

• U-M had three red zone touchdowns against

Notre Dame in as many trips inside the 20. • Michigan scored on 78.0 percent of its red zone

opportunities in 2010 (44-55). • Forty (40) of those 44 scores were touchdowns

with four field goals (28 rushing/12 passing).

TURNOVER MARGIN

• The Wolverines had a +3 turnover margin vs. Western Michigan 9/3, the first time they won the turnover margin since 9/11/10 at Notre Dame (+3). Michigan continued that trend 9/10 vs. Notre Dame with a +2 margin. The Wolverines are now +5 for the 2011 season.

QUICK-STRIKE OFFENSE

• Michigan scored five touchdowns vs. Notre Dame 9/10, and all five touchdown drives came on five plays or less. In all five scoring drives, U-M totaled 306 yards on 19 plays. The longest drive took 2:35, while the Wolverines covered 80 yards on three plays in :30 for the game-winning touchdown.

• Michigan had three offensive touchdown drives vs. WMU 9/3, including one that took just three plays to cover 87 yards in :40.

• In 2010, Michigan scored 24 touchdowns on drives that elapsed two minutes or less; 12 of those drives spanned less than one minute. The Wolverines scored 10 touchdowns on drives that took three plays or less.

THIRD-DOWN EFFICIENCY

• U-M has converted on 6-of-15 third-down opportunities (40%) this season.

• The three third-down conversions vs. WMU contributed to a pair of touchdown drives.

• Two of the three third-down conversions agaist Notre Dame led to touchdowns.

Michigan has been held without a point in the first quarter of each of the first two games.
Michigan was just three points shy of tying the school record for most points in a fourth quarter

(31) when it racked up 28 points against Notre Dame to pull out a come-from-behind win.

On Jan. 11, 2011, Brady Hoke was named the 19th head coach in University of Michigan football history. An eight-year member of U-M's defensive coaching staff from 1995-2002, he returns to Ann Arbor after spending eight seasons as head coach at Ball State (2003-08) and San Diego State (2009-10). While at U-M, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, '98, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl champion squad. During his tenure, U-M posted a 76-23 overall record, claiming at least 10 victories on four occasions.

The 2010 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, Hoke guided the Aztecs to a 9-4 record, marking the most victories since 1996 (8), while earning the program's first trip to a bowl game in 12 years, a 35-14 victory over Navy. Six of his players earned first-team All-MWC honors in 2010, including running back Ronnie Hillman, the league's freshman of the year. Seven additional players earned second team (4) and honorable mention (3) honors. In 2009, Hoke's first season at San Diego State, five players were named to All-MWC teams, while 11 were MWC All-Academic selections.

As head coach at Ball State, he mentored players to 35 All-MAC selections in six years en route to a pair of bowl game appearances in 2007 and '08. The 2008 season marked the best season in program history, recording a school-record 12 wins and completing an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular season campaign.

Collectively, Hoke has 28 years of collegiate coaching experience beginning with assistant positions at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94) and Michigan (1995-2002).

A 1982 graduate of Ball State University, Hoke earned four letters (1977-80) with the Cardinals. He was part of the only two teams in Ball State football history to post undefeated conference seasons: as a player in 1978, and as the head coach in 2008. Hoke led Ball State to the 1978 MAC championship, and as a team captain in 1980 earned All-MAC second-team honors. He graduated from Fairmont East High School in Kettering, Ohio, in 1977. He and his wife, the former Laura Homberger, have one daughter, Kelly.



MICHIGAN STADIUM



Michigan Stadium -- 1927-2011 (85 Years)

The football program is in its 85th season in the "Big House" in 2011, with a 386-120-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has increased nine times to its present 109,901. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 35 times in the past 36 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 114,804 fans against Notre Dame in the first night game ever in Michigan Stadium. The previous mark was 113,090 fans against Connecticut during the 2010 rededication of Michigan Stadium.

Michigan has drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 232 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan.

The Wolverines drew 782,776 fans for their seven-game home schedule in 2010. The seven-game average of 111,825 broke Michigan's NCAA record of 111,025 fans per contest set during the 2004 season.

Michigan Stadium was the only college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones. It was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

- **CAPACITY:** 109,901 -- the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football -- closer to the playing field with no running track -- no posts or other obstructions.
- **COMPLETION:** 1927 --- at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.
- FIRST GAME: October 1, 1927 -- Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

DEDICATION GAME: October 22, 1927 -- Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

- REDEDICATION GAME: September 4, 2010 -- Michigan defeated Connecticut, 30-10. ATTENDANCE: Since 1927 -- 43,829,460 fans have watched the Wolverines play 521 games. Stadium attendance record of 106,982 set Nov. 22, 1997 against Ohio State. Since expansion of the "Big House" in 1998, and the rededication in 2010, the single-game attendance record is 114,840 set against Notre Dame on Sept. 10, 2011. The NCAA season record of 782,776 set in 2010.
- FIELD: 360 x 160 feet -- Installed new FieldTurf in 2010. The original FieldTurf surface was installed in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season. Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.



ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- Senior weakside linebacker Brandon Herron (Stafford, Texas/ Dulles) became the first Wolverine in school history to post two defensive scores in a single contest, helping lead the University of Michigan football to a 34-10 win over Western Michigan in the 2011 season opener, which was declared final with 1:27 in the third quarter due to weather on Saturday (Sept. 3) inside Michigan Stadium. The victory is head coach Brady Hoke's first at the helm of the Michigan program.

Although the opening kickoff featured 90-degree heat and sunny skies, storms from the southwest rolled over Michigan Stadium in the second half. The game was suspended twice in the third quarter after lightning was spotted within six miles of the stadium. The first suspension resulted in only a 30-minute delay, but the bleak outlook of the second suspension forced Michigan and Western Michigan officials to call the game with 1:27 left in the third quarter and declare the Wolverines the winner. This is the first Michigan football game to end before all 60 minutes of regulation have been played.

Herron, who racked up a career-high eight tackles, returned both an interception and a fumble to the south end zone for touchdowns. His 94-yard interception return for a touchdown midway through the second quarter was the longest interception return in program history, besting Ken Tureaud's 92-yarder in 1961. Senior/junior safety Jordan Kovacs (Curtice, Ohio/Clay) led the defense in tackles (10), TFLs (two) and sacks (two), and registered the forced fumble that led to Herron's second touchdown.

On the offensive side of the ball, junior/ sophomore running back Fitzgerald Toussaint (Youngstown, Ohio/Liberty) -- in his first career start -- recorded 11 carries for a career-high 80 yards and a career-best two touchdowns. Both of Toussaint's scores were from within two yards of the goal line (one yard, two yard). He also registered a 43-yard run late in the third quarter that set up senior running back Michael Shaw's (Trotwood, Ohio/Trotwood-Madison) 44-yard touchdown sprint -- the longest of touchdown of his career -- two plays later for Michigan's final touchdown. After Western Michigan scored on its opening drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown on fourth down, Michigan countered with a one-yard touchdown run by Toussaint on the ensuing possession. Toussaint earned six carries on the 16-play scoring drive, including a key three-yard run on fourth-and-one to the WMU 16-yard line to extend the possession. Junior quarterback Denard Robinson (Deerfield Beach, Fla./ Deerfield Beach) was perfect in his first drive of the 2011 campaign, completing 5-of-5 passes for 33 yards and adding 26 yards on the ground.

The Broncos had two opportunities to retake the lead, but first missed a 38-yard field goal wide right and, after maneuvering the way down to the U-M four-yard line, sophomore/freshman outside line-backer Jake Ryan (Westlake, Ohio/St. Ignatius) broke through the Broncos' offensive line and deflected the intended pass straight up into the air and into the waiting arms of Herron, who tip-toed the right sideline before hurrying down field with a convoy of Michigan defenders for a 94-yard return for a touchdown, giving the Wolverines their first lead of the game, 14-7, with 6:58 remaining in the second quarter.

U-M then forced a three-and-out to set up Toussaint's second touchdown late in the second half -- a twoyard dive up the middle. Robinson connected with junior/sophomore wide receiver Jeremy Gallon (Apopka, Fla./Apopka) and senior/junior wide receiver Roy Roundtree (Trotwood, Ohio/Trotwood-Madison) on both his pass attempts, before four straight Michigan carries covered the final 22 yards into the end zone, including a Robinson 10-yard dance and weave through the WMU defense for a first down.

Western Michigan added a 36-yard field goal with 43 seconds left to cut the Wolverines' lead to 20-10 heading into halftime.

Kovacs made the play of the second half when he stormed in on a blitz and lit up the WMU quarterback, forcing a fumble. Herron picked up the loose ball, his second career fumble recovery, and thundered 28 yards into the end zone for his second defensive score of the game for a 27-10 Michigan advantage. The Wolverines followed the defensive score with the long touchdown run by Shaw to take a 24-point lead, and were driving again late in the third quarter, after fifth-year senior defensive end Ryan Van Bergen (Whitehall, Mich./Whitehall) recovered a Western Michigan fumbled snap, when the officials issued the second weather-related suspension, ultimately ending the game.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- For the third straight season, the University of Michigan football team overtook Notre Dame in the final 30 seconds, as junior quarterback Denard Robinson (Deerfield Beach, Fla./Deerfield Beach) completed a 16-yard pass to senior/junior wide receiver Roy Roundtree (Trotwood, Ohio/ Trotwood-Madison) with two seconds remaining to give the Wolverines a 35-31 comeback victory in the Under the Lights contest on Saturday (Sept. 10) inside Michigan Stadium. In front of a record crowd of 114,804 fans, the Wolverines clawed their way back into the game from a 14-0 deficit in the first quarter, tallying 28 fourth-quarter points.

Robinson completed 11 passes for 338 yards and four touchdowns. He also ran for one more score to go with a team-high 108 yards rushing. The lead changed three times in the final minute and a half of the contest, before U-M scored the go-ahead touchdown to end a 30-second, 80-yard drive.

Fifth-year senior wide receiver Junior Hemingway (Conway, S.C./Conway), who dons the No. 21 jersey, accumulated 165 yards receiving on three catches, including a careerlong 77-yard catch that resulted in a U-M touchdown on the next snap. Hemingway scored the first receiving touchdown of the 2011 season on the same night former Wolverine wide receiver and Heisman winner Desmond Howard, who wore the No. 21 jersey from 1988-91, was honored during the pre-game ceremony as the first-ever Michigan Football Legend.

The U-M offense was stagnant in the first quarter, registering only 27 yards of offense, while the Fighting Irish got off to a fast start, driving down the field on their first two drives -- 57 and 83 yards, respectively -- to take a 14-0 lead.

The Wolverines swung momentum in their favor early in the second quarter when senior/ junior safety Jordan Kovacs (Curtice, Ohio/ Clay) recorded his fourth career interception, stepping in front of Notre Dame wideout Michael Floyd, who finished with 13 catches for 159 yards, near the sidelines to pick off Notre Dame sophomore quarterback Tommy Rees' third-down throw. Two plays later, the Maize and Blue's aerial attack got back on track. Rolling out to the right, Robinson threw an underthrown ball to a streaking Hemingway down the left sideline. Hemingway broke off his route at the three-yard line, jumped in the air for the catch and lunged for the pylon for a 43-yard touchdown to cut Notre Dame's lead in half, 14-7.

The Michigan defense made another big stop on Notre Dame's ensuing drive when senior/junior cornerback J.T. Floyd (Greenville, S.C./J.L. Mann) notched the Wolverines' second interception of the night. Floyd picked off Rees' forced pass near the goal line and returned it to the U-M 18-yard line. The Wolverines did not capitalize on the turnover, punting the ball back to the Fighting Irish three plays later and Notre Dame tacked on a 38-yard field goal to take a 17-7 lead into halftime.

The second half opened with the Fighting Irish driving the football into Michigan territory twice, but the Maize and Blue defense forced a punt and a fumble. However, Notre Dame extended its lead to 17 points on its next drive with a 15-yard touchdown pass from Rees to sophomore wide receiver T.J. Jones on thirdand-nine with 2:13 left in the third quarter.

The Wolverines responded immediately, as Robinson's 77-yard pass-and-catch with Hemingway brought Michigan to the Notre Dame six-yard line. On the ensuing snap, Robinson picked up a Michigan fumble at the one-yard line on the first play of the fourth quarter and scampered into the end zone untouched to cut Notre Dame's lead to 24-14.

The Wolverines' comeback continued when junior/ sophomore linebacker Brandin Hawthorne (Pahokee, Fla./Pahokee) made plays on each snap of Notre Dame's ensuing three-and-out, including a pass breakup and tackle for loss (three yards). Michigan made it a one-possession game five plays later when Robinson lobbed a 14-yard touchdown pass to junior/sophomore wide receiver Jeremy Gallon (Apopka, Fla./Apopka) in the back right of the end zone.

The defense came up big once again when fifthyear defensive end Ryan Van Bergen (Whitehall, Mich./Whitehall) picked up a fumble by Rees on the Michigan nine-yard line, and then forced Notre Dame to a three-and-out on the Fighting Irish's next possession.

The Wolverines then charged 58 yards down the field over five plays, ending the series when junior running back Vincent Smith (Pahokee, Fla./Pahokee) hauled in a screen pass from Robinson and dodged 21 yards through defenders to give Michigan a three-point lead with 1:12 remaining.

The Irish mounted a rally of their own in a 42-second series that concluded with a 29-yard completion to Riddick for the touchdown with 30 seconds left. Michigan completed its comeback on the ensuing drive with Robinson's 16-yard reception to Roundtree for the game-winning score.
