'LTTE should give up violence - Mervin Silva

Moving an Adjournment Motion in Parliament Wednesday TNA's Jaffna District member Mavai Senthirajah asked the Government to declare a ceasefire ending the present armed conflict in the North and East so that conditions for peace talks with the LTTE could be created.

He was speaking about the state of the civilians in the North and East and said the attacks by the Armed Forces had created a 'grave humanitarian crisis in the past two to three weeks.

Joining the debate **Deputy Labour Minister Mervin Silva** said President Mahinda Rajapakse was prepared to start peace talks with the LTTE from the very day he was elected President in November last year but the LTTE had not reciprocated but kept on attacking the armed forces and civilians.

However the Rajapakse family which had given one of its sons to the Army, another to the police knew how to fight a war if the necessity arose. It was up to the LTTE to change its policy and seek a political solution by holding talks with the government which was always ready to hold talks.

Minister for Media Anura Priyadarshana Yapa said the government at no stage said it did not accept the ceasefire agreement but only said it needed amendments as there were some weak areas in it. The Government started peace talks but it was the LTTE kept out of the arranged peace talks table. But now the LTTE has pushed the government into the position of making limited counter attacks to

prevent the provocative attacks of

Sivanathan Kishor (TNA) said it was because the LTTE prevented the Tamil people of the North to vote during the last Presidential Election that Mahinda Rajapakse was able to win the election and become President.

In the attacks by the Sri Lanka Air Force 60 children were killed and over hundred injured. The road to Jaffna was closed and other roads in the north were also closed though there was no fighting in those areas.

Minister of Foreign Affairs Mangala Samaraweera said the members of Parliament for the North and East in the House worshipped the Sun God of the Kilinochchi Junges but now the LTTEs real image is before the people when it has attempted to assassinate the Ambassador for Pakistan who represents a country that has helped Sri Lanka as a

It was very surprising that member Mavai Senathirajah who spoke about the displacement of Tamil civilians in the North failed to say even one word about more than 10.000 Muslims who were displaced when the LTTE attacked the Muslim town Mutur, he said.

Samaraweera said the LTTE agents in USA has been arrested for trying to bribe an official with million dollars. The LTTE had millions of dollars to spend on bribes and procure arms in the West while the poor Tamil civilians in the North and East were suffering under their yoke paying unjust taxes to the LTTE.

Minister of Social Services

Douglas Devananda said any victory in war was only an illusion. Taking up arms could be justified for a proper cause but the LTTE is only creating misery for the Tamil people and was not prepared to come to the peace talks even when the Government was prepared for it. LTTE is an organization thriving on dead bodies of the Tamil people. It is abducting children and forcing them to become child

When the Government was supplying electricity to the North and East and building roads or sending medicines for the hospitals in these areas, the LTTE says it is only soap as it does not want the Tamil people to benefit. Some members in the House are looking at everything through the eyes of the Tiger but the EPDP is trying to help the people to live, Devananda said.

Pathmini Sithamparanathan (TNA) said there is state terrorism in the North and East and aerial bombings. The Government should start negotiations with the LTTE without resorting to attacks.

Deputy Minister Hussain Bahila said Senthirajah's motion did not contain a word about the killing of 100 Muslim youth who were dragged away from their families, lined up and shot dead by the LTTE while they were fleeing in fear of LTTE attacks.

President Mahinda Rajapakse resorted to counter attacks only after continued attacks by the LTTE in violation of the ceasefire agreement. But he was committed to peace and was willing to settle the problem finding a political

The National Peace Council calls for immediate halt to war

Reverse the growing humanitarian tragedy through new ceasefire

The widespread and heavy fighting between government forces and the LTTE over the past several weeks has created a major humanitarian crisis. According to humanitarian workers, the situation is as bad as it has ever been in the 20 years of war, or even worse. Over 160,000 people have become refugees since April this year, and the numbers are increasing rapidly day by day. The National Peace Council demands that those who have been displaced and otherwise affected as a result of the fighting should be protected according to international humanitarian norms.

What is most tragic about this phase of war is that it is undeclared, although it is raging in full force in parts of the north east. Due to the uncertain status of the Ceasefire Agreement, there is a climate of impunity and lack of adherence to international norms of humanitarian conduct. Humanitarian organizations have been complaining that they cannot take relief supplies to where they are most needed.

The National Peace Council condemns the uprooting of tens of thousands of people, most of them Muslims, due to the attack on the town of Muttur, the targeted killings, and the displacement of similar numbers of Tamil people into Vakarai where there has been severe air force bombing. We condemn the air force bombing of an educational and training facility in Mullaitivu in which over a hundred teenage girls are reported to have been either killed or injured. We also condemn the execution style killing of 16 Tamil and one Muslim aid workers in Muttur in contravention of the

Geneva Conventions and international humanitarian law to which Sri Lanka is a signatory.

We also condemn the assassination of the deputy head of the government's peace secretariat, Kethesh Loganathan in his home in a Colombo suburb and the claymore mine attack on the Pakistan High Commissioner in Colombo that killed seven security forces personnel and civilians. The discovery of large numbers of claymore mines in vehicles apprehended by the security forces indicates more such attacks to come.

The National Peace Council calls for an immediate halt to the war and to the killings and for the government and LTTE to re-engage in negotiations. There is a terrible sense of fear amongst the people, and the early closure of schools is indicative of the sense of crisis. If there is no political solution that comes through negotiation, what is guaranteed is a festering conflict that will be full scale war at worst or a life sapping guerilla war at best. Whatever the temporary vicissitudes of the military battlefield, one factor remains uppermost, and that is, that ethnic conflicts do not end through war.

We call on the government and LTTE to immediately cease all hostilities and negotiate a new Ceasefire Agreement; in the meantime we demand that international humanitarian law and norms in respect of war-affected populations should be strictly adhered to.
