






Message From The General Secretary

TRUE AND AUTHENTIC PRAYER


It is appropriate that the Editorial Board of the 'Sowing Circle' has chosen the theme of "Prayer" for this issue. Prayer has become very much a part of our lives that prayer often becomes a routine that we follow day by day. Hence we often lose sight of the true meaning and theology of Prayer.



Hindus and people of other faith communities also do give a lot of importance to prayer. Judaism also had a high ideal of prayer as follows:



- b. There was the saying "He who prays within his house surrounds it with a wall that is stronger than iron".
- c. The only regret of the Rabbis was that it was not possible to pray all the day long.
- d. Every Jew was demanded to recite *Shemoneh Esreh*, which means The Eighteen. It consisted of 18 prayers, to be recited 3 times a day 9.00 a. m, 12 noon and 3.00 p. m.
- e. For every occasion, the Jewish liturgy had prayers before and after each meal, prayers in connection with light, fire, lightening and on seeing the New moon. The tendency was to repeat the right prayer at the right time. So there was the danger of slipping into formalism.
- f. There was also a tendency to connect prayer with certain places, especially the temple or the synagogue. Some Rabbis even said that prayer was effiliacious only if it was offered in the temple or in the synagogue. Here, there was the danger that a man might come to God as being confined to holy places.
 - g. There was also the tendency to pray long prayers an idea that if people batter long enough at God's door, God will answer.
 - h. There was also the fact that the Jews prayed to be seen by people. Every Jew prayed standing, with hands stretched out, palms upward and with head bowed. Wherever he was, he prayed to be seen at a street corner or in a market place.



It is with this background that Jesus taught his disciples a 'Prayer' that could be a model of how to pray, which is known as 'The Lord's Prayer'. Jesus was disgusted by the rigid formalism and Server-centeredness reflected in the Jewish prayer.

The Lord's Prayer - A True and Authentic Prayer

The Lord's Prayer occurs in two forms, one in Matthew 6:9-13; the other in Luke 11:2-4. The two versions of the Lord's Prayer occur in very different contexts. In Matthew, the prayer occurs in the Sermon on the Mount. In Luke, on the other hand, the prayer is introduced as a response to the disciples' request, "Lord, teach us to pray". It is possible that Jesus would have taught the prayer in two different contexts and to two different groups of people. Whether the version in Matthew or in Luke is original is a question of dispute. Because of the brevity of the account in Luke, some say this is earlier. But in terms of the context, there are scholars who take the account in Matthew as original.

The Biblical Scholars opine that the Lord's Prayer could have been used in two different contexts to meet the needs of two different groups. In Matthew, it speaks to those who are in danger of meaningless repetition of formulas. In Luke, it speaks to Gentile Christians who need initial instruction in prayer.

The Lord's Prayer has the following content:

(a) Address (b) 'Thou' Petitions (c) 'We' Petitions (d) Doxology From the contents as listed above, we can derive the theology of True and Authentic Prayer.

First of all, a true and authentic prayer is to be prayed only by believers who can call God their Father: Only a person who is sure of this filial relationship can pray this prayer. In other words, 'Prayer' is not a mere babbling of meaningless words, which are repeated again and again. Rather, 'Prayer' is a relationship between God and the one who prays. The realization that I am praying to my "father" is highly significant - a father who knows me, a father who cares for me, a father who is able to meet all my needs. It is this connection that makes 'Prayer' true and authentic. I am not praying to a distant entity, but to the One who is with me and near me.

Secondly, a true and authentic prayer should have a missionary focus: This becomes clear from the "Thou Petitions" in the Lord's Prayer as follows: "Hallowed be your name". Acknowledging the actuality and the Holiness of God is a pre-requisite for a true and authentic Prayer.

"Your Kingdom come". Praying that God's Kingdom or Reign would be established on earth – God's Kingdom of peace and justice is yet another characteristic of true and authentic Prayer.

"Your will be done". Praying that God's will be done on earth; that the revealed commands of God will be lived out by people as Christ has carried out the will of the Father is yet another characteristic of true and authentic Prayer.

<u>Thirdly</u>, a true and authentic prayer should be corporate in nature: The very beginning of the Lord's Prayer is corporate in nature. The Lord's Prayer begins with the address "Our Father". Further, the "We Petitions" in the Lord's Prayer make this abundantly clear:

"Give us this day our daily bread" expresses a concern for the hungry and the needy. The petition also speaks about the corporate daily dependence on God for sustenance.

"Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" expresses a desire to build up a situation where enemies are turned to friends through an act of forgiveness.

"Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" projects an emphasis on personal relationships. A concern not to do anything evil which affects our relationship with others is emphasized.

Fourthly, a true and authentic prayer is God Centered: The Lord's Prayer begins and ends with the thought on God – 'God' as "Father" in the beginning and the thought on the absolute power and majesty of God at the end.

Conclusion

The theme of the forthcoming 10th Assembly of the World Council of Churches to be held at Busan, Republic of Korea from October 30 to November 8, 2013 is a Prayer, "God of Life: Lead us to Justice and Peace". The theme in the form of a prayer is an affirmation that God is the God of Life; that life in all its fullness for all is possible only when there is peace with justice and that the God of Life is with us in our struggles, working with us for a just and peaceful world. Our prayers should not be a mere repetition of words and phrases. Rather, our prayers should be action oriented towards building up a new world order marked by God's Peace and Justice. This is, indeed, the essence of the prayer that our Lord taught His first band of disciples and all of us. And, this indeed, is the gist of the 'True and Authentic Prayer'.



GOD'S OPEN INVITATION TO COMMUNE WITH HIM

Prayer is not composing a convenient shopping list and giving God a call, expecting free home delivery. Prayer takes concrete form in the context of a loving relationship with God possible through Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. God takes the initiative in calling us to Himself and prayer is our response to God in faith when we hear Him. Prayer is not as much about answers, as it is about our relationship with God of holy love – at its best, an intimate conversation between a trusting child and a loving Father. Our gratitude for God's saving action in Jesus Christ (Romans 7:25; 1 Corinthians 15:57) is the starting point and context of all Christian prayer.

Share in Sonship

The intimacy of the Son's filial relation to the Father distinguished Jesus from all others. Similarly, believers too attain closeness with the Father by sharing in Jesus' son-ship. The Bible teaches:

"The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to son-ship. And by Him we cry, 'Abba, Father'" (Romans 8:16). The Spirit gives us a share in the son-ship of Jesus, making it possible to pray to the Father "in the name of Iesus," with the assurance of a hearing. Jesus promised: "And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father" (John 14:13). We must rejoice in the fact that our participation in Christ's sonship creates a bond among all believers in the world-wide community of Christ.

Unceasing and Interceding

Christians are exhorted to pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5: 17; cf. Ephesians: 6:18). When we do not know what to pray, the Spirit intercedes for us with sighs that cannot be uttered (Romans 8:26). Unceasing



prayer refers to an ongoing attitude of dependence on God in which the life of faith is to be lived. It is an attitude permeating individual activities of believers at all times. While praying, our love for neighbours is integrated into our relationship with God as we participate in His love for the world. Prayer is a safeguard against our practice of neighbour becoming ritualistic moral work.

Temporal Nature of our Situation

The encouragement to pray is linked to the temporal nature of our human situation before the consummation of God's Kingdom. This helps explain why the first three petitions (Matthew 6:9-13) Name, Kingdom, and Will precede the rest. Only with these conditions satisfied, can petitions follow for daily bread, forgiveness of debts, and protection against

temptation to apostasy. Within Christian prayer, human wishes, concerns, and requests are subordinate to God's goal for His creation and there is opportunity for integration of the two. Believers cling to God, in petitionary prayer, as they face the uncertainty of their future. Jesus reprimands anxiety, but encourages prayer.

Cooperation with God

God gives us, His creation, a share in establishing His kingdom in the world by encouraging them to pray. The kingdom does not come on this world like fate; with everything unalterably fixed from the start. Hence, believers are summoned to co-operate with God, on His way to the future of His kingdom, through our actions and prayers. We cannot bring in, the kingdom, based on our actions. Only God can do this and only His providence knows how our various acts can relate to this goal and be effective. Thus, in our awareness of the limits of human action, prayer is the highest form of our participation in bringing in the kingdom of God, and a stimulus and pointer for believers' action.

Paul Stimulated by Prayer

Listening to the feeble voices of poverty, injustice and cruelty challenged Paul and his friends to combine prayer with action; to demonstrate courage and compassion. On a Sunday morning in Philippi, when Paul and his friends were going to a meeting place for prayer, a slave girl met them on the way. She had "a spirit by which she predicted the future" (Acts 16: 16) and was exploited by her owners, who made a lot of money on account of her fortune telling. Paul who believed in human dignity, equality, freedom and mutual respect, was pained at the condition of the girl. He prayed for her healing and deliverance and the slave girl came to feel, for the first time, unconditionally loved as a true daughter of God.

The consequences of doing good, as visible in the case of the deliverance of the girl, were violent. Paul and his companions were stripped,

Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field." beaten and thrown in prison, yet they continued in prayer and singing hymns to God. Not moans but melody came from their mouth (Acts 16: 25). So should it from ours!

Following Jesus

Iesus revealed the Good News of His Kingdom by His words of proclamation, deeds of healing and a life of compassion. He grieved over the multitudes of people who felt helpless. As Matthew 9:35-38 records, "Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field."

We are not called to respond to the world's needs with resources limited to our own initiative and strength. Jesus calls us to pray, to ask for help from the God of holy love who commissioned us for our task.

The Bible is the Word of God

We believe that the Bible is the Word of God because of its divine origin. The Bible shows God's desire to establish a relationship with the people. The very first chapter of the Bible tells us that God created human beings in God's own image and likeness (Genesis 1:26-27). Even when Adam and Eve chose to disobey God, God continued to pursue them. The very question that God asks in the Bible is "Where are you? (Genesis 3:9). This question shows what is central to God's heart -PEOPLE. No wonder King David asked God, "Why do you care about us, humans?" (Psalm 8:4). How amazing it is to think and believe that God, the Creator of the universe, actually chose to establish a relationship with us – human persons: boys and girls, young men and women, adult men and women from all walks of life, irrespective of our background, socioeconomic status and geographical areas!

The Bible is God's story of God's great work in bringing people whom God created, back to Himself, for a meaningful relationship, through our Saviour and Redeemer, the Lord Jesus Christ. God's Word tells us not of human persons seeking a lost God, but of God going after lost children, young people and adult men and women, so that those who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, shall not perish but have everlasting life. We shall look at the following to understand how Scripture Engagement and Prayer go together as two sides of the same coin.

A Biblical Theology of Prayer

The Bible presents the God of prayer, the God who calls before we answer and answers before we call (Isaiah 65:24). In the biblical history, prayer is not presented as a separate spiritual discipline, but prayer rises as people's answer to God's address. We see in the Old Testament how God speaks to men and women; and how they speak to God - for example Adam, Eve, Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Moses and others. Prayer in the New Testament is addressed to the Father. In the teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ, in the record of Acts and in the Epistles, followers of Christ bow to the Father from whom the whole family in heaven and on earth is named (Ephesians 3:14). In addressing the Father we can respond to the full revelation of the Trinity - Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. The

Spirit who makes intercession for us guides our praying, for the Spirit witnesses to the Father and to the Son.

Prayer to the Father shows the consciousness of sonship (and daughter-ship) that crowns prayer in Christ. We look to the Lord Jesus Christ. We come to the Lord with our burden of sin and receive forgiveness and life. When the Lord receives us to Himself and unites us to Himself we are brought into a relation with God the Father. We are made children of God (John 1:12). Yes, children by the new birth. In Christ there is no longer male and female - we are sons in the Son. The prayer to the Father, breathes assurance as well as our total dependence. We realise that our relationship with God breathes assurance, our total dependence on God and the love of God is all our hope.

Scripture Engagement

The Bible is the inspired Word of God as Apostle Paul says in 2 Timothy 3:16-17, and therefore, it makes the Bible, the foundation for what we believe and how we live. We need to read it, study it and understand it, so that, everyone may be proficient and equipped for every good work.

Our blessed assurance is that God has made us what we are, and in our union with Christ Jesus God

Good works are manifestations of what we know and believe. That is why the Scriptures are there to teach, correct, rebuke, and train us for right living. The Word of God is our guide to that which is right, pure, holy, and truthful. So that we might believe that which is true, not false, and in truth, accurately do that which is pleasing in the sight of God, for His glory, and for the welfare of people and God's entire creation.

has created us for a life of good deeds, which God has already prepared for us to do (Ephesians 2:10).

works Good manifestations of what we know and believe. That is why the Scriptures are there to teach, correct, rebuke, and train us for right living. The Word of God is our guide to that which is right, pure, holy, and truthful. So that we might believe that which is true, not false, and in truth, accurately do that which is pleasing in the sight of God, for His glory, and for the welfare of people and God's entire creation.

As followers or disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ, we try to engage with the Scripture individually, as a family, as a church and as a community, in order to apply the insights, principles, lessons, that we learn for human relationships in everyday life. This helps us in solving problems, resolve issues, make choices and decisions. For example, in guiding our children to grow in the fear of God, in the choice of schools and colleges for their education, in selecting the career and even life partners. Human as we are, we are prone to make mistakes in making choices and decisions. Applying God's Word to daily life in our particular socio-cultural contexts is a big challenge as we need to struggle to make conscious efforts to obey God, which in turn helps us to be more God-reliant than self-reliant. Let us listen to the following heart-warming testimonies, to understand the importance of Scripture Engagement and Prayer.

Mrs. Vani Jeyaraj shares: "We are from South India. Our parents arranged our marriage based on caste system and dowry system. At that time we were nominal Christians and therefore, we went along with the traditions of our families. As the days went by, God blessed us with two children – a son and a daughter. Then we started attending a home Bible Study. We began to engage with the Word of

God, and pray through the Scriptures. God began to speak to us. God helped us to look at ourselves and we started praying, "Lord, change me". We prayed for inner healing and thorough cleansing, in the light of the daily Bible reading, and we continue to do that. We have been experiencing inner cleansing and healing. God began to speak to us about the practice of caste system and dowry system. It was a daily struggle for us but God's grace was sufficient to find a solution.

To cut the story short, my husband returned the dowry taken at the time of our marriage, to my brothers as my parents are not alive now. Later we met several couples who were also led by the Scriptures to do this. It is amazing how God's Word can speak to us and help us to make a difference in this world. Now our children are ready for marriage. Our son wants to marry a lovely believer from Dalit background. We have accepted it as from the Lord. We have created a family slogan now: 'No taking dowry and no giving dowry. No caste system, at any cost".

Mr. Singh shares: "We live in North India. My wife and I are from two different cultures. We believe that the Holy Spirit has brought us and our families together.


Our parents have been engaged in reaching out to people of various faith communities with the Word of God, ushering them to the Lord Jesus Christ. Our daughter met a committed Christian from down South, in a Youth Camp. They had the privilege of getting acquainted with each other in the Youth Bible Study. They believe that God wants them to get married, but John's parents are not happy about this. They are lovely people, doing marvellous work for the Lord. The only reason for rejecting our daughter is that we are not from their community. But these two young people are persevering with love, in prayer, claiming God's promises. We are encouraging them to continue to trust the Lord to speak to their parents, as it is good to get parents' consent for the marriage. We do believe that God will make a way in His time.

We make mistakes but we know that when we say 'Sorry to Lord Jesus and to others', we are forgiven.

Thus, Scripture Engagement refers to a fuller human experience that recognizes that we are not only hearers or readers of the Word of God but also appliers (doers) of God's Word in everyday life, fully realising that as human persons, we sin against God and one another, but God's forgiveness is available to all, and therefore we can enhance a meaningful life for all, fully leaning on God.

In this article we shall look at the concept of Prayer in the Pentateuch–Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. Remember these books are also known as the Books of Law and the Books of Moses.

Prayer is an outpouring of the heart to God. It is more than the recital of well known phrases. Prayer is an exposition of sorrow, pain, persecution and peril believing that God, our father is able to redeem us out of all troubles. Knowing a little about prayer reveals a lot about its power. This is because the time of worship is indeed a time of spiritual uplift. The more we pray, the more is the treasure of spiritual enlightenment and edification showered on us. Robert Burns says that prayer is correspondence with the Triune God – the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Prayer knows no language; but a cry. Hagar offered a heart-felt cry in the hour of her distress and loneliness in the wilderness. The Lord heard her affliction and Hagar said, "Thou God seest me" (Genesis 16:13). The most difficult journey in the wilderness had blessed climax, when God was the goal. Hagar was comforted by God's promise (Genesis 16:10,11).

The Holy Bible gives about 650 definite prayers out of which only 450 have recorded definite answers as in the case of Hagar. The remaining 200 prayers are either unanswered or unheard.

Origin of Prayer: "After Enosh was born to Seth, then began men to call upon the name of the Lord" (Genesis 4:26). With the coming of Enosh, men were conscious of their weakness and sought refuge in God. Enoch and Noah walked with God (Genesis 6:9). The word "walking" implies progress; and "walking with God" implies "Spiritual Progress," which is dependent upon unbroken Communion with God. This, in fact, is

the origin of prayer, which is communion with God, leading to spiritual progress. The tempo of spiritual progress and prayer increased steadily as, "Abram built an altar unto the Lord and called upon the name of the Lord" (Genesis 12:7). Worship, communion and promise are all bound up in God's call to Abraham and in Abraham's calling upon the name of the Lord. In the covenant given to Abraham the underlying thought is that, "true family life depends upon family recognition of God".

In this age of grace, "our access to God is made possible by Him who is our altar and the offering thereon" (Hebrews 10:19, 13:10). In the earlier books of the Bible God speaks more to man than man does to God. But we do too much of talking in our prayer sessions. We should develop the art of listening more to God's voice. How impressive is the silent obedience of Abraham when

God commanded him to offer his son as a sacrifice!

Abraham's Prayers

Abraham's intercessory prayer for Ishmael: This is the first recorded prayer found in Genesis 17:18, "And Abraham said unto God that Ishmael might live before Thee". The humble prayer of the Patriarch received prompt reply from our gracious and prayer hearing God, "As for Ishmael I have heard thee. Behold I have blessed him and will make him fruitful and will multiply him exceedingly [Genesis 17:20]. Abraham's prayer guides parents to believe that God hears and answers the prayers for our children.

Abraham's prayer for Sodom: Abraham drew nearer to God and asked, "Will Thou destroy the righteous along with the wicked? - if there be 50 righteous – if there be 45 righteous – if there 40 or 30 or 20 or 10 righteous?" The Lord replied, "I will not destroy Sodom even for ten's sake" (Genesis 18: 23 -33). Abraham made this interesting prayer with deep humility and lowliness of spirit carrying in his heart the sins and sorrows of Sodom. This prayer reveals that humility is the first essential of efficacious prayer. This does not mean that all heart cries with humility for cities and sinners are answered. About Judah God said to Jeremiah "Pray not thou for this people, neither lift up cry nor prayer Joseph was the man without prayer. The Bible shows that there is complete absence of prayer in the life of Joseph. We observe that for long Joseph tred the path of sorrow, he was afflicted, tormented, persecuted, imprisoned and yet it is never said that Joseph prayed.

for them nor make intercession to me, for I will not hear thee" (Jeremiah 7:16).

Joseph was a man without Prayer

Joseph was the man without prayer. The Bible shows that there is complete absence of prayer in the life of Joseph. We observe that for long Joseph walked the path of sorrow, he was afflicted, tormented, persecuted, imprisoned and yet it is never said that Joseph prayed. The whole tenor of his life suggests an overwhelming sense of the presence of God. The controlling power that Joseph exercised in his memorable answer to the Portiphar's wife: "Can I do this great wickedness and sin against God" (Genesis 39:9) reveals that Joseph was a God conscious man and must have lived in full harmony with God. Even though there is

no recorded evidence in the Bible about Joseph's prayer, he must have practiced the presence of God without, literally kneeling down and praying.

Prayer as a two-way channel

In Exodus we read the key phrase," Moses said unto God and God said unto Moses" (Exodus 3: 13, 14). In prayer, we unburden our hearts to God and God speaks to us through His word. True prayer is two way channels - we speak to God and God speaks to us. When Moses sought about the responsibility of bringing the people out of Egypt, his prayer reads like a dialogue full of life in which one speaker argues with the other with questions and answers. Another example of God speaking to man and man speaking to God is found in the book of Jonah.

Book of the Bible without Prayer

Leviticus is the book dealing with the way of approach to God. But strangely, there is no mention about prayer. The absence of prayer in Leviticus is noticeable in the consecration of the priests (Leviticus 8:12) and with other offerings. The service of peculiar solemnity (Leviticus 9:22) and the imposing of ceremonies associated with the great Day of Atonement (Leviticus 16:12) cannot be

taken as prayer. Yet many commentators of the Bible are of the view that prayer and praise are part and parcel of all the services of the tabernacle.

Three-fold priestly Blessing

The Book of Numbers reveals that prayer is our vital breath and the weaponless hand of prayer is more powerful than armies. It also contains the sins, sorrows and grumblings of the Israelites. The three-fold priestly blessing of Moses upon the people is unique, stately and heartfelt. "The Lord bless thee and keep thee; the Lord make his face shine upon thee and be gracious unto thee; the Lord lift up his countenance upon thee and give thee peace" (Numbers 6:24-26).

We can easily see the Holy Trinity in the threefold benediction of Moses. The same is true of the three-fold invocation of Jacob (Genesis 48:15,16) and the three-fold invocation of Daniel as in Daniel 9:19, "O Lord, hear; O

(Numbers 6:24-26).

Lord forgive; O Lord hearken and do". The divine three-fold character of God is revealed as the "God of the spirits of all flesh" (Numbers27:16), the father of spirits (Hebrews 12:9) and the father of the Lights (James 1:17).

In Deuteronomy, there is repetition of the Laws and guidelines and emphasis is given to faith in God and obedience to God and consequent blessings from Him. Moses' prayer for the privileged task of crossing the river Jordan is recorded in Deuteronomy 3:23-25. This request was not granted because Moses lost his temper at the rock and smites it, while he should have only spoken to it. Prayers of thanksgiving include gratitude for material things like land and food (Deuteronomy 8:10, 26:4]. The benediction of heaven was sought only after tithes were reserved for the widows and fatherless (Deuteronomy 26:12-15). Here lies a lesson for our hearts to help the poor and the downtrodden. Blessings for obedience to God and curses for disobedience to God are listed very clearly in the Book of Deuteronomy, Chapter 28.

UBS DAY OF PRAYER: PEARL JUBILEE CELEBRATION



The United Bible Societies is a fellowship of Bible Societies. It is made up of 146 Bible Societies operating in over 200 countries and territories. Together, they are the biggest translator, publisher and distributor of the Bible in the world. They are also active in areas such as literacy training, HIV and AIDS prevention and disaster relief. Bible Societies work with all Christian Churches and many international nongovernmental organisations.

On May 9, 1983 when 13 United Bible Societies met together in England, they initiated the UBS Day of Prayer on May 9th because the United Bible Societies was formed as a fellowship on May 9, 1946.

The purpose of UBS Day of Prayer is to look at what God has been doing in the Bible Societies around the world with an attitude of gratitude, and to pray for various concerns, together, from the rising of the sun to the going down.

The Bible Society of India celebrated the Pearl Jubilee of the UBS Day of Prayer meaningfully at the Central Office, Shillong Translations Centre, Auxiliaries and the Sales Depot in Port Blair during the month of May 2013, under the guidance of Resource Mobilisation and Church Relations Department of the Bible Society of India. A brief report about the Celebration at the Central Office is featured here.

The 30th anniversary of the UBS Day of Prayer, was celebrated at the Central Office, LOGOS on Friday, the 10th May 2013, in honour of the visit of the President of the Bible Society of India, Rev Dr P.N.S. Chandra Bose, around the theme "The One who has called you is faithful and He will do it" (1 Thessalonians 5:24).


Records, files, correspondence, Bibles in full and portions etc., need to be gathered, collected in the archives for storage and preservation in a systematic manner for future use and research.

As such, work on the materials from the BSI Office at William Carey Centre, Hall Road, began a year ago. It first had to be cleaned. dusted, sorted out and dewormed before classifying and cataloguing them. They were then shifted to the Archives at the Logos premises on Mahatma Gandhi Road, Bangalore. Preparations were earlier made to accommodate these files and materials in a proper room with shelves and racks for accessibility. An Archivist has been appointed and is being trained to look after and collect necessary materials for the Archives, from the various Auxiliaries and Departments of the Bible Society of India.





Trauma Counselling Awareness Consultation




forward to this event every year and there has been an encouraging response in the past eleven years.

Let us praise God for these departed brothers and sisters. Let us pray for their bereaved families.





the young people responded in obedience to God to follow the Lord Jesus Christ more dearly and to support the Bible Cause.


Book Fair

Easter 2013 in Kolkata





Bible Society marks 200 years of Indian language holy books

MUMBA: The Mumbai branch of the Bible Society of India (BSI) will observe its bicentennial this week. The group's primary job was to translate the Bible into Indian languages, but in the process, translators contributed

substantially to the standardisation of scripts and vocabu-laries too. The BSI came to Kolkata in 1811 and a branch was established in Mumbai two

The process of translation was usually long. Before trans-lating the Bible into Gujarati, for instance, the translators spent 468 hours over 78 sessions to list the Gujarati equivalent of each word found in the Bible.

Prominent Indian scholars were involved in the translation

process. Among important translators of the Marathi Bible in the early twentieth century were Pandita Ramabai and Raobahadur Athavle

"During the process of trans-lating the Bible into Indian languages, the translators contributed to the standardisation of their scripts, grammar and spellings," said Rev Dr Victor Gollapalli, secretary of the Mumbai unit of the BSL

A book brought out to mark the bicentennial called 'Advancing the glory of god', written by Dr MD David, reports that Hormusji Pestonji, a member of the Gujarati Bible Revision Committee, wrote in 1848 that he read the scriptures in Gujarati and English together, in order to learn the foreign

The BSI has published com-plete versions of the Bible in 66 Indian languages and portions of the book in 67 language







The following hymns, "What a Friend We have in Jesus" by Joseph Scriven and "Sweet Hour of Prayer" by William Walford talk about 'Prayer'. Let us enjoy these songs during our Family Quiz Time.

A. WHAT A FRIEND WE HAVE IN JESUS

- 1 What a Friend we have in Jesus,
 All our sins and griefs to bear!
 What a privilege to carry
 Everything to God in prayer!
 O what peace we often forfeit,
 O what needless pain we bear,
 All because we do not carry
 Everything to God in prayer!
- 2. Have we trials and temptations?
 Is there trouble anywhere?
 We should never be discouraged,
 Take it to the Lord in prayer.
 Can we find a friend so faithful
 Who will all our sorrows share?
 Jesus knows our every weakness,
 Take it to the Lord in prayer.
- 3. Are we weak and heavy-laden,
 Cumbered with a load of care?
 Precious Saviour, still our refuge—
 Take it to the Lord in prayer;
 Do thy friends despise, forsake thee?
 Take it to the Lord in prayer;
 In His arms He'll take and shield thee,
 Thou wilt find a solace there.

Irish born Joseph M. Scriven (1819-1896) was 25 years old, in love and to be married. The day before his wedding his fiancé died in a tragic drowning accident. Heartbroken, Joseph sailed from his homeland to start a new life in Canada. While in Canada working as a teacher, he fell in love again and became engaged to Eliza Roche, a relative of one of his students. Once again, Joseph's hopes and dreams were shattered when Eliza became ill and died before the wedding could take place.

Although one can only imagine the turmoil within this young man, history tells us that his faith in God sustained him. Soon after Eliza's death Joseph joined the Plymouth Brethren and began preaching for a Baptist church. He never married, but spent the remainder of his life giving all his time, money and even the clothes off his own back to help the less fortunate and to spread the love and compassion of Jesus wherever he went.

Around the same time that Eliza died, Joseph received word from Ireland that his mother was ill. He could not go to be with her, so he wrote a letter of comfort and enclosed one of his poems entitled What a Friend We Have in Jesus.

Many years later a friend was sitting with Joseph, as he was very ill. During this visit, the friend was very impressed when he ran across his poems, including What a Friend We Have in Jesus. As a result of this visit, almost 30 years after his letter of comfort to his mother, Joseph's poems were published in a book called Hymns and Other Verses. Soon thereafter, noted musician Charles C. Converse (1834-1918) put music to one of those poems: What a Friend We Have in Jesus.

Well-known musician and revivalist Ira D. Sankey (1840-1908) was a great admirer of Joseph Scriven. In 1875, Sankey came upon the music and words for What a Friend We Have in Jesus. He included it as the last entry into his well-known publication Sankey's Gospel Hymns Number 1.

B. SWEET HOUR OF PRAYER

- 1. Sweet hour of prayer! Sweet hour of prayer!
 That calls me from a world of care,
 And bids me at my Father's throne
 Make all my wants and wishes known.
 In seasons of distress and grief,
 My soul has often found relief
 And oft escaped the tempter's snare
 By Thy return, sweet hour of prayer!
- 2. Sweet hour of prayer! Sweet hour of prayer!
 The joys I feel, the bliss I share,
 Of those whose anxious spirits burn
 With strong desires for Thy return!
 With such I hasten to the place
 Where God my Saviour shows His face,
 And gladly take my station there,
 And wait for Thee, sweet hour of prayer!

- 3. Sweet hour of prayer! Sweet hour of prayer!
 Thy wings shall my petition bear
 To Him whose truth and faithfulness
 Engage the waiting soul to bless.
 And since He bids me seek His face,
 Believe His Word and trust His grace,
 I'll cast on Him my every care,
 And wait for Thee, sweet hour of prayer!
- 4. Sweet hour of prayer! Sweet hour of prayer! May I Thy consolation share, Till, from Mount Pisgah's lofty height, I view my home and take my flight: This robe of flesh I'll drop and rise To seize the everlasting prize; And shout, while passing through the air, "Farewell, farewell, sweet hour of prayer!"

The composer of this song, William Walford was blind, but this did not make him worthless. On the contrary, as he sat by the fire in his English home in the mid-nineteenth century, his hands kept busy, whittling out useful objects, such as shoehorns. His mind was active, too.

Called on to preach from time to time in a rural English church, he composed sermons in his head to deliver on Sundays. He memorized a huge amount of the Bible which he quoted verbatim in his sermons. Some of his folk thought he had memorized the entire Scripture, cover to cover. William also composed lines of verse. And he prayed.

Thomas Salmon, a New York native, spent some time in Coleshill, Warwickshire, England, where he became acquainted with William. He tells this tale of what happened one day, while he was visiting the blind pastor:

"...He repeated two or three pieces which he had composed, and having no friend at home to commit them to paper, he had laid them up in the storehouse within. "How will this do?" asked he, as he repeated the following lines, with a complacent smile touched with some light lines of fear lest he subject himself to criticism. I rapidly copied the lines with my pencil, as he uttered them, and sent them for insertion in the Observer, if you should think them worthy of preservation."

The Observer did consider them worth preserving, and they were published on this day, September 13, 1845, becoming a beloved hymn.

Beyond the fact that he was blind and the few details recorded by Thomas Salmon, we know little of William Walford. But his hymn has touched hundreds of thousands of lives on both sides of the Atlantic, expressing the genuine joy he found in prayer.
