A Message from Dr. Gere

Dear Graduates, Parents, and Friends of SJ/MDHS:

I'd like to share some good news!

On Saturday, December 5, 2009 Monsignor Donovan High School was honored by the Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Trenton, Charity and Justice Alliance with the **Gaudium et Spes Award**. This is the fifth year that the Alliance is presenting the award. Monsignor Donovan High School is the *only* school to ever be recognized with the honor.

Held on the first Saturday of December, the day is set aside to acknowledge ministries of charity and justice and to remember those who serve in those ministries. The award is presented in recognition of the recipient's actions to affect positive social change in their community.

I was on hand along with Father Patrick McPartland, Mr. Dennis Gallagher, Religion Department Supervisor and Christian Service Program Coordinator and his predecessor, Mrs. Suzan Fichtner to accept the award presented by The Most Reverend John M. Smith, J.C.D., D.D., Bishop of Trenton. Along with us were several students and alumni, all of whom are/ were instrumental in MDHS Christian service programs.



Other honorees at the special Mass, held at St. Gregory the Great Church in Hamilton, included Father Anthony Carotenuto, pastor of St. Anthony

Parish, Red Bank; Mary Goss, director of the diocesan Office of Catholic Relief Services; Catherine Hegeman, parishioner of St. John Neumann Parish, Mount Laurel and the Mount Carmel Guild, Trenton.

In explaining the Gaudium et Spes celebration, Father Ronald Cioffi, coordinator of the diocesan Social Concerns Ministries, said that its purpose is to highlight "individuals, groups and parish communities that work through the year to implement the values and principles of Catholic Social teaching. The vast pastoral outreach inspired by Catholic Social Teaching was given renewed vigor and prominence by the Second Vatican Council in its landmark Pastoral Constitution 'Gaudium et Spes' (The Church in the Modern World)"

It was an honor to accept an award in recognition of the school's mission to "respect and serve others." Our students are out in the community every day feeding the hungry, clothing the unfortunate, lending a helping hand and mentoring the young.

My sincere gratitude to Mrs. Suzan Fichtner and Mr. Dennis Gallagher for establishing and sustaining one of the finest high school Christian Service programs.


Faculty Focus

A Returning Graduate is now a Veteran Teacher.

James Courtney '84

Jim Courtney is a member of the first graduating class of Monsignor Donovan High School. Upon graduation, Jim matriculated to Mount Saint Mary's College in Emmitsburg, Maryland to major in Sociology. (In 1999, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from his alma mater in recognition of the impact he makes on his students.)

His immediate plans were not to return to MDHS, but in his words, "Hollywood...... but no one came to discover me." He instead worked for International Insurance Company in New York City and for Moore Business Forms in Washington DC. When he decided that he'd like to teach, he thought the best person with whom to speak was his former high school guidance counselor, Mr. A. It was Mr. A. who inspired "Court" to come back to Monsignor Donovan High School.



As a student at MDHS, Court was involved in Cross Country and the plays. ("Remember, I was going to Hollywood!") As a faculty member, he is the coach of the Surf Team and also a retreat director. He teaches a senior religion elective, "Spirituality and Contemporary Issues," in which the class looks at the media culture and how it shapes views on life. In 1997, he started a tradition of having senior artists paint inspirational murals on his classroom walls.

Mr. Courtney joined the MDHS teaching staff in 1990, which makes him a twenty year veteran teacher! When asked his favorite memory as both a student and a staff member he had the same thing to say, "All the amazing people I got/get to encounter, especially the students."

There is an alumni tradition among the Courtney family and friends. His siblings, Lisa '83, Bob '86 and Mike '88 are all SJ/MDHS graduates. Mr. Courtney's wife, Christine (Suskevich) is a 1989 graduate; all of her siblings are also SJ/MDHS grads. Their two sons are in the sixth and fourth grades and in September 2010, their daughter will enter kindergarten, all at St. Joseph's Grade School.

Among his hobbies and interests are live music, brewing homemade beers and collecting interesting wines. Surfing is also a passion. As the Surf Team coach, Court organizes the annual Doug Oland Memorial Surf Contest,



held the weekend after Labor Day. (See Alumni Bulletin Board) Since 1995, the Courtney's have been the owners of the Surf Taco restaurant in Seaside Park. He and his staff are instrumental in the organization of the school's annual Surf Fashion Show held in the spring to benefit Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity.

In Court's words, "Over the past 20 years, people have asked me what was the best thing about Donovan? It's the people. Fr. Donovan believed in creating a sense of community and I'd have to say his spirit still motivates us today to keep community, or should I say, family, as the top priority here at our school." St. Joseph's Century Club to Honor Mrs. Jeanne Punderson

Founded forty-seven years ago, the Saint Joseph's Century Club provides scholarships for students from Saint Joseph's Grade School who attend Monsignor Donovan High School. Each year, a Gala is held to raise funds for these scholarships.

The **2010 Century Club Gala** will be held on **Friday**, **May 14**, **2010** at the Holiday Inn in Toms River. This year's honoree is **Mrs. Jeanne Punderson**.

Jeanne Voelker Punderson grew up in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn where she graduated from St. Angela Hall Academy on Washington Ave. Jeanne graduated from the College of St. Elizabeth in Convent Station, New Jersey with a Bachelor of Science degree. She was employed as a dietician by Bellevue Hospital in Manhattan until her marriage, in 1943, to James Punderson. They were married at the Cathedral of the Air, Lakehurst, where James was stationed as a Navy blimp pilot. They settled in Lakehurst and became active members of St. John's Parish. Jeanne managed through her enthusiasm and faith to revitalize the St. John's Rosary Altar Society.

She became an active and well-known member of the St. Joseph community when the first of her nine children began to attend the grade school in 1950. She became a charter member of the PTA, which began with the arrival of **Father Lawrence Donovan**. Jeanne continued her involvement with the PTA while all of her children attended and graduated from the grade school. During this time, she was involved in a variety of roles, including president of the PTA.

In 1960, the Punderson's moved to Island Heights. Their commitment to Catholic education increased, as did their involvement in St. Joseph Parish. Over the years, Jeanne and Jim were active in Parish Council, Holy Name Society, PTA's, fundraisers, building committees, and social activities. Throughout those years, Jeanne and Jim developed a close relationship with Monsignor Donovan and vigorously assisted him in his goals to develop St. Joseph parish and "his" Catholic schools.

The two oldest Punderson children are St. Rose High School graduates, as St. Joseph High School was not yet built. Their son, **Monsignor Joseph Punderson**, was a member of St. Joseph High School's first graduating class. Jeanne continued her involvement in the high school also, serving as president of the PTA. Today, Jeanne continues her involvement as a Trustee of St. Gertrude Church, Island Heights. She also serves as a charter member of the St. Joseph Endoument

member of the St. Joseph Endowment Committee for Catholic Education.

Jeanne and her daughter Mary Punderson Henderson '72 are the only mother and daughter in SJ/MDHS history to both serve as presidents of the PTA.

All nine of the Punderson children are college graduates; seven having attained Masters Degrees. Jeanne has 18 grandchildren, six of whom graduated from St. Joseph Grade School. Five grandchildren are graduates of Monsignor Donovan High School.




