Religion is held in very low esteem, 'I take for granted that you would not for a moment think of sending either of them out with any other view other than of becoming settlers. Sarah Bernhardt plays ~Hamlet, 1899

[Bernhardt (Sarah)] An important 8pp A.L.s. from Lewis Campbell at 33 Campden House Chambers, London, dated 17th June, 1899, to a Dr Ward, analysing in great detail a production of 'Hamlet' in which the lead role was taken by Sarah Bernhardt. Campbell was Prof. of Greek at St. Andrew's University and specialised in the philosophy of Plato and the Tragedies of Sophocles. Ecumenical, enlightened and 'mildly Bohemian' (E.M. Craik in O.D.N.B.), he encouraged student associations and founded a Shakespearian society. His correspondent 'Dr. Ward' may have been Henry Leigh Douglas ('Harry') Ward, an authority on medieval epic literature. Sarah Bernhardt is frequently described as 'the most famous actress the world has ever known.' Her performance in the title role of a prose adaptation of "Hamlet" received rave reviews, but the notion of a troubled young man being played by a middle aged woman (she was then aged 55) also provoked controversy. Cork: Indenture dated 25 April 1668 whereby Richard and Henry Titchborne [sic] of Dublin grant property in Cork City to Noblet Dunscombe, Thomas Farren and Robert Fletcher of Cork, to hold for 61 years at an annual rent of £160. The Titchbornes were sons of Sir Henry Titchborne, one of the "Forty-Nine Officers," i.e. those who were serving in the royalist army in Ireland as of 5 June 1649 and who were offered lands confiscated from the Irish in lieu of arrears of pay. Sir Henry was the builder of Beaulieu House in Co. Louth, where he died in 1667. His two sons Richard and Henry were granted the confiscated property in Cork and Dublin that had been due to him, and in this deed they rent out the Cork property to three prominent citizens. This is a lengthy document, listing the Titchborne property in Cork house by house and stating in each case the names of the present tenants and the forfeiting owners who had held it in 1641. An important document showing how urban property was apportioned following the Cromwellian confiscations and the Acts of Settlement and Explanation passed by Charles II. 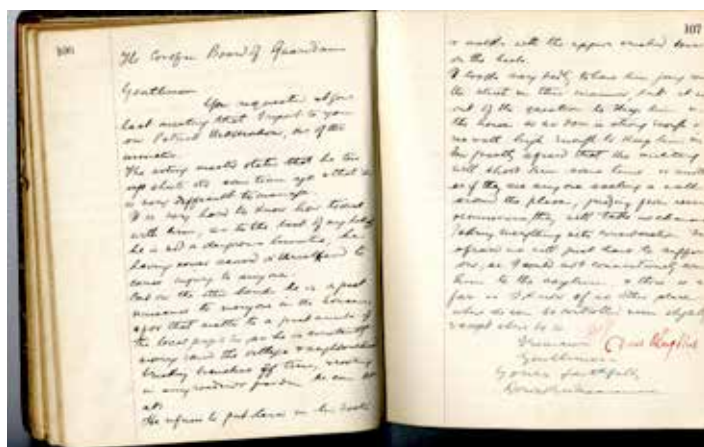

Westropp (T.J.) An important file of Letters, (with some other papers) dating between 1884 and 1903, written by the Limerick antiquarian scholar T.J. Westropp of 77 Lr. Leeson St., Dublin, to his cousin Lt. Col. William Kiely Westropp of 6 Sherrcliffe Rd, Folkestone, Kent. The letters (approx. 22) are written in his distinctive clear neat hand and mainly comprise genealogical information on the Westropp family especially material for the entry in a forthcoming edition of "Burke's Landed Gentry". There are also comments - generally frank and often witty - on family members (especially following the death of their cousin Sir Michael Westropp in 1890), as well as politics and masonic matters. His letter of 7 April 1893, for instance, reflects his views on the Second Home Rule Bill; 'I was delighted to see you were fighting to save us from ruin, ruffianism, Roman supremacy, cornerboys, priests' nominees, sharking politicians and civil war. We are fighting here but sore weary; if a miracle does not open the voters' eyes in Great Britain we are about done for.'

Thomas Johnston Westropp (1860 - 1922) belonged to a landowning family of Co. Limerick. His life was devoted to studying Irish antiquities, particularly the prehistoric and medieval remains of his native county and of Clare (one of his letters includes two sketches of shiela-na-gigs). He was the author of some 300 articles in local and national journals, meticulously researched, written and illustrated; 'in contrast to that of most of his contemporaries, Westropp's work is still frequently used by modern scholars' (Liam Irwin in D.I.B.). His correspondent Lt. Col. Wm. Kiely Westropp (1846 - 1905) was an officer in the 68th Durham Light Infantry and served in Bhutan and Afghanistan. As an Archive, w.a.f. (1) €550 - 750

Important Genealogical & Legal Archive

Mahony or O'Mahony, Kerry & Wicklow: A large and extremely important collection of genealogical and legal documents and of political and personal correspondence relating to the Mahony or O'Mahony family and to estates in Cos Kerry and Wicklow.

The O'Mahonys were one of the principal Gaelic septs of West Munster. In the 18th century they produced some distinguished soldiers in the Irish Brigade in the service of France, especially Count Daniel O'Mahony, hero of the defence of Cremona in 1702. In later times John O'Mahony was a leader of the Fenian Brotherhood and Sylvester Mahony ("Father Prout") a well-known poet.

The branch that generated this archive used the christian name Pierce or Peirce in five successive generations:

1. **Peirce Mahony (1750-1819)** was manager of the Earl of Devon's estates in Co Limerick.
2. **Peirce Mahony of Kilmorna, Co Kerry (1792-1853)** established a highly successful firm of solicitors in Dublin in partnership with his brother David ("Peirce did all the talking and David did all the work"). He was Daniel O'Connell's private solicitor, playing an important part in the campaign for Catholic Emancipation (1829) and in the defence of O'Connell and his colleagues in the State Trials of 1843-44. David Mahony bought Grange Con in Co Wicklow, which became another of the family seats.
3. **Peirce Kenifeck Mahony of Kilmorna (1817-1850)** married Jane Gun Cuninghame, who after his death married secondly Colonel W.H. Vicars; they were the parents of Sir Arthur Vicars, Ulster King of Arms. Peirce's younger brother David inherited Grange Con; he developed the gardens there and was also a keen hunting man.
4. **Peirce Charles de Lacy O'Mahony of Grange Con (1844-1930)**, nationalist politician and philanthropist, "was remarkable in having had successively three names, two wives and three faiths, and for being honoured by the kings of two opposing countries in World War I" (Wikipedia). An ardent home ruler, he courageously supported Parnell during the O'Shea divorce scandal. In 1904 he opened an orphanage in Bulgaria. In his later years he styled himself The O'Mahony of Kerry and resided on his estate in Wicklow, where he lived as an Irish chieftain, attired in saffron kilt and accompanied by wolfhounds and bagpipers.
5. **Peirce Gun Mahony of Kilmurry, Co. Kerry (1873-1914)** assisted in the genealogical work of his uncle Sir Arthur Vicars and bore the title Cork Herald. He died in a shooting accident at Grange Con in 1914. His younger brother Dermot Gun O'Mahony (1881-1960) was a pioneering farmer in Patagonia and later lived at Grange Con, where he was succeeded by his elder daughter Patricia and her husband Lt Col Richard K. Page.

This archive contains briefly:

- Printed briefs compiled in connection with the Irish State Trials of 1843-44. Alarmed by the success of O'Connell's "monster meetings" in his campaign for the repeal of the Act of Union, the government banned his proposed meeting at Clontarf. Fearful of provoking bloodshed, O'Connell cancelled the meeting. He was arrested, charged with conspiracy, sentenced to three months' imprisonment and fined £2,000. He was ably defended by his solicitor Peirce Mahony. Although the

House of Lords quashed the conviction and criticised the unfairness of the trial, O'Connell's perceived meekness severely damaged the effectiveness of the repeal campaign. The briefs give details of previous "monster meetings" and of the legal proceedings against O'Connell and his associates.

- Two letters patent of Queen Victoria appointing Pierce Mahony to be Clerk of the Crown in the Court of Queen's Bench in Ireland (1849) and David Mahony to be Clerk of the Crown for Co Kerry (1854). Both are fine documents on vellum, with decorated borders containing royal portraits and emblems. Each has the great seal attached, in perfect condition.
- Two fines (fictional lawsuits used to determine the conveyance of land prior to 1833) on vellum and written in Latin. They date from the 5th year of George II (1731-32) and relate to the sale of house property in Dublin (at Abbey Green in Oxmantown and in Capel Street) by John Lambert and Charles Capper and their wives to Elizabeth Williams.

Co. Waterford Elections

Co. Waterford: File of ten documents relating to the election for Waterford County, 10 June 1829 to 22 Jan 1830.

In 1826, after a sensational campaign, Henry Villiers-Stuart, backed by O'Connell, had defeated one of the two sitting MPs, Lord George Beresford, on the issue of Catholic Emancipation. However, when Stuart resigned his seat after the passing of the Emancipation Act in 1829, Beresford was re-elected. At the general election later that year, O'Connell himself took one of the two seats and Beresford the other. The file includes correspondence between Peirce and David Mahony, a draft of Lord George Beresford's address to the electorate, and letters from Charles Maunsell in Waterford and Barton Anderson in Dungarvan providing much local information. ARCHIVE OF DOCUMENTS RELATING TO SIR ARTHUR VICARS

Archive: Sir Arthur Edward Vicars (1860-1921) was born in Warwickshire, the youngest of five children of Col W.H. Vicars, 61st Regt, and Jane Mary Gun Cuninghame of Mount Kennedy, co Wicklow. His mother had previously been married to Peirce K. Mahony of Kilmorna, Co Kerry, and Vicars identified strongly with the Ireland of his half-brothers. He developed a passionate interest in Irish heraldry and genealogy, and in 1893 was appointed Ulster King of Arms in succession to Sir Bernard Burke. He did much to develop the office, expanding its archival collection and giving it a permanent home at the Bedford Tower in Dublin Castle. Unfortunately, his reputation has been permanently tarnished by the unexplained disappearance of the so-called "Irish Crown Jewels" from his custody in 1907, which led to his dismissal. He retired to Kilmorna, where he was shot dead when the house was looted and burned by the IRA in 1921.

The archive contains briefly:

A file of letters, many of them copies but also some originals, relating to Vicars's ambitions to receive some heraldic appointment. In 1892 he applied for the post of Athlone Pursuivant (a junior officer of arms in Ireland) on the death of Bernard Louis Burke, but on the death of Sir Bernard Burke at the end of the same year he applied to be made Ulster King of Arms, to which he was appointed on 23 February 1893 at the early age of thirty.

The file includes testimonials (mostly MS or printed copies) from prominent heralds and scholars and a Catholic bishop (Kildare and Leighlin); copies of letters written by Vicars; letters from peers (Lord Cloncurry, the Duke of Leinster, Lord Mayo), including Lady Wolseley whose husband was Commander in Chief, Ireland.

On 2 October 1892 Vicars's half-brother Peirce Mahony writes that Sir Bernard Burke is dying and urges him: "You should move at once."

ORIGINAL ILLUMINATED CHARTER OF CHARLES II WITH DETAILS OF PROPERTY GRANTS IN CORK CITY

Co. Cork: A magnificent original charter of Charles II dated 19 August in the 19th year of his reign (1667), listing many properties in the city of Cork with the names of forfeiting proprietors and new tenants.

The purpose of the charter was to satisfy the demands for compensation of the "Forty-Nine Officers" - those officers who had served in the royalist army during the wars in Ireland prior to 5 June 1649, remaining loyal to the King thereafter and who had not therefore been granted lands by the Cromwellian government. It lists property in Cork City which had been held by Irish Catholics in 1641 and consequently forfeited under Cromwell, and which is now granted to the officers who had petitioned. They are represented by their trustees Captain Hercules Langford and Robert Fitzgerald Esq., and there is also a separate grant of land in counties Antrim and Armagh to Captain Langford.

The charter consists of three membranes of vellum, measuring respectively approx 78 x 77, 78 x 59 and 75 x 34 cm (30¾ x 30½, 30¾ x 23¼ and 29¾ x 13½ inches). It is in fine condition but lacks its seal. The text (approx 6500 words) is in English. The head of the first sheet is exuberantly illuminated, the first six words being gilded with a silver background. The initial letter "C" of Charles is contained within a separate scrollwork panel in the left hand corner and surrounds a portrait of the King. To the right are the royal arms, with the lion and unicorn supporters also shown separately, together with national emblems such as the rose, thistle and fleur-de-lis (for England, Scotland and France), and a butterfly and dragonfly.

The survival of the charter is miraculous: it was discovered by chance during a waste-paper campaign in the city, and rescued. The lengthy text (misdated to 1666) was transcribed and published in 1964 in the Journal of the Cork Historical and Archaeological Society, together with a brief introduction, tabular summary, and map.

This document is of major importance in tracing the development of Cork in the early modern period, especially as the Civil Survey for Cork city and county (apart from the barony of Muskerry) has not survived. It compares interestingly with a valuation of Cork City carried out in 1663-64 and published in vol. VI of the Civil Survey, edited by R.C. Simington.

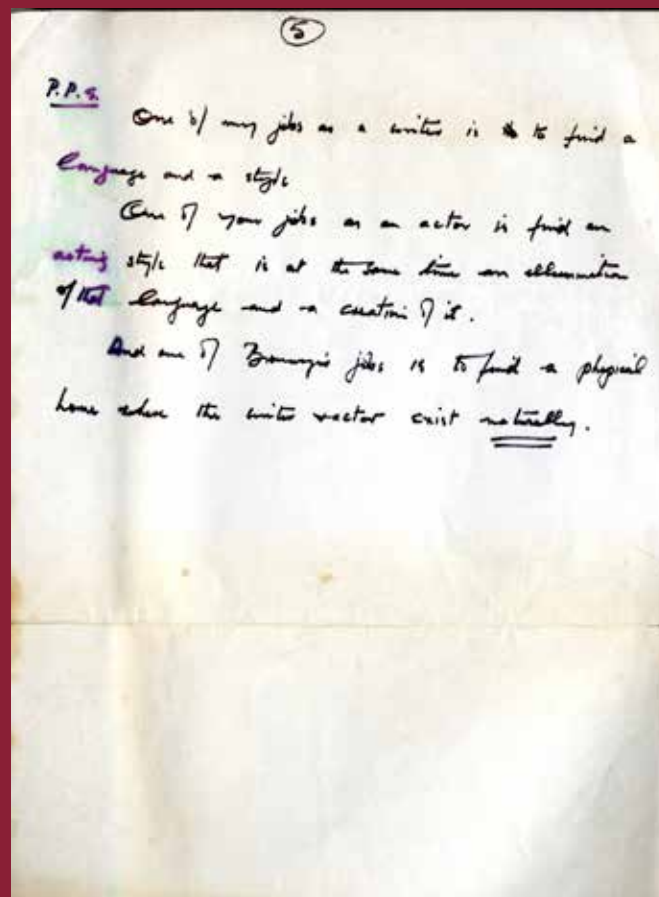
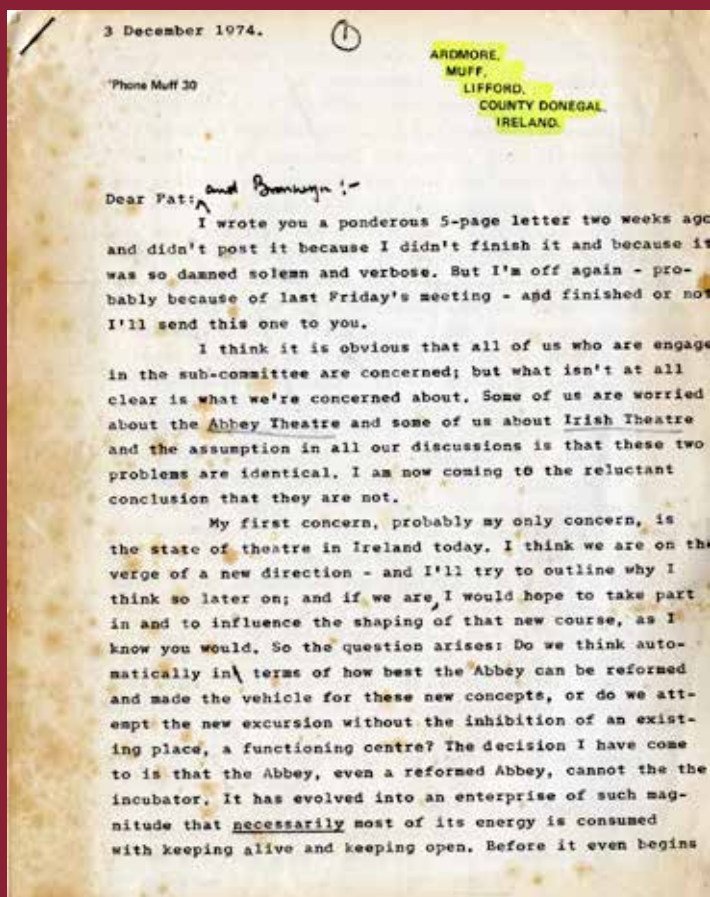
Interesting 1916 Association**TOM CLARKE & SEAN MAC DIARMADA**

A paid cheque for two pounds four shillings dated Oct. 18 1910, drawn on Northern Banking Co. in Dublin, signed by Thos. J. Clarke and made out to Seaghan Mac Dermott, stamped 'PAID 18 OCT. 1910'; triangular excision to side. Countersigned rear.

A remarkable item linking the two men who, between them, were largely responsible for the planning of the Easter Rising. Tom Clarke, the old Fenian, served 15 years in British jails for his part in a dynamite mission. After his release he established a new life in America, where he married and became a citizen, but in 1907 he returned to Ireland to plan the revival of the IRB. Sean Mac Diarmada, born in 1883 (the first year of Clarke's imprisonment), was one of the young men whom he brought to the fore, as a full-time Republican organiser, a member of the IRB Supreme Council and manager of the IRB-sponsored paper *Irish Freedom*. Both men were members of the military council which planned the Rising, both signed the Proclamation, both fought in the GPO, and both were executed thereafter. The two were personally very close; Mac Diarmada, whose parents died in his youth, regarded Tom and Kathleen Clarke almost as surrogate parents. Note: the counter-signature to rear seems to be also in Clarke's hand, rather than MacDiarmada's. Presumably Clarke cashed the cheque for MacDiarmada for some reason. (1) €800 - 1000

The Playwright gives his view of the State of Irish Theatre & outlines the Case for a New Departure

FRIEL, Brian, dramatist [1929-2015]. An important typescript signed letter, 5 pp, with a manuscript postscript, December 1974, from his home near Lifford, Co. Donegal, to the Abbey actor Pat Laffan (a member of the Actors Equity Council) and the theatre designer Bronwyn Cassin, giving a frank view of the state of Irish theatre, and outlining the case for a new departure. The letter arises from discussions in an Equity subcommittee of which Friel and Laffan were members.

'My first concern, probably my only concern,' Friel says, 'is the state of theatre in Ireland today. I think we are on the verge of a new direction .. Do we think automatically in terms of how best the Abbey can be reformed and made the vehicle for these new concepts, or do we attempt the new excursion without the inhibition of an existing place ..? The decision I have come to is that the Abbey, even a reformed Abbey, cannot [be] the incubator. It has evolved into an institution of such magnitude that necessarily most of its energy is consumed with keeping alive and keeping open. Before it even begins to think of what kind of plays it ought to do .. it is concerned .. with its capital, its publicity, its expenditure, its intake, its public, its cleaners, its caterers .. These are not the problems that are exercising me. Nor were they the problems of Yeats-Gregory-Fay ..

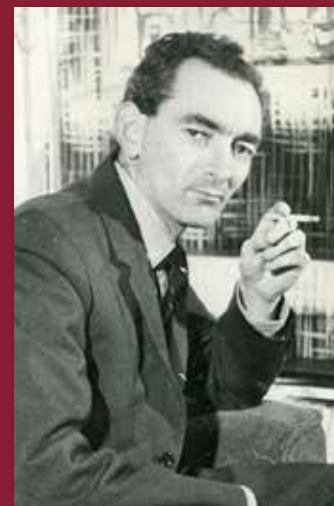
'Our concern .. is to forge a new Irish drama .. The new voice I think I detect and the new direction I know to be necessary are the things that engage me now, and these could not find accommodation in Abbey Street. Even if the Abbey could be restructured .. the whole Abbey enterprise would be too lavish and too expensive to nurture a new and delicate and uncertain idea ...

'When I come to a writing-down of what form the new Irish drama will take, of course I falter. I have no precise answers ...

He says it will not be a Gaelic-speaking or a poetic drama, because both of these are elitist in practice and theatre is by definition vulgar, of the vulgus. It has nothing at all to do with politics because they are trivial, of no importance whatever.

'What I envisage is a small group of actors, writers, designers who are drawn together out of mutual concern and interest; a vague but very real awareness that what is taking place on Irish stages bears very little

relationship to either the imaginative or the day-to-day life we inhabit; a recognition that what it is to be Irish must be shaped and presented; a knowledge that the old seam of realism-naturalism is exhausted; a conviction that we cannot grab a theory from England or Germany or the U.S. or wherever .. a belief that these new definitions .. will evoke a response at first from tiny audiences but later from greater numbers .. and that we must find new eyes and ears and tongues to see and hear and express the Ireland that hasn't been expressed dramatically for 30 years.'



Although Friel remained with the Abbey for some years more, notably with his great play *Faith Healer* [1979], it is clear that the line of thinking outlined here was what led him in 1980 to become co-founder of the Field Day Theatre -- precisely the kind of loose creative collaboration he suggests in this remarkable letter. Throughout the 1980s his work was produced by Field Day, beginning with *Translations* [1980], but in 1990 he finally returned to the Abbey with *Dancing at Lughnasa*.

With an earlier manuscript signed letter to Laffan, May 1974, 2 pp, outlining similar ideas, and a note dated 27 Oct. (no year) about casting for a film.

An important collection of letters from one of the great masters of Irish Theatre, outlining ideas and dilemmas which are still relevant today. Friel rarely gave interviews, and this is a very valuable exposition of his ideas as he approached a turning point in his career. A Saoi of Aos Dána, with a string of Broadway successes to his name, Friel was undoubtedly the leading Irish playwright of the latter half of the 20th century. (3)

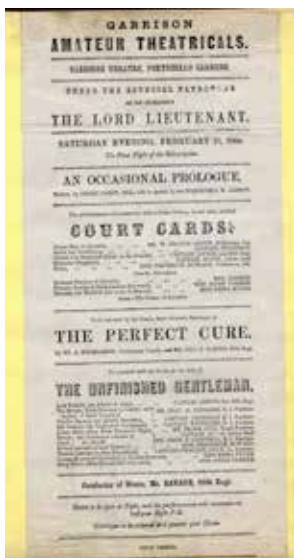

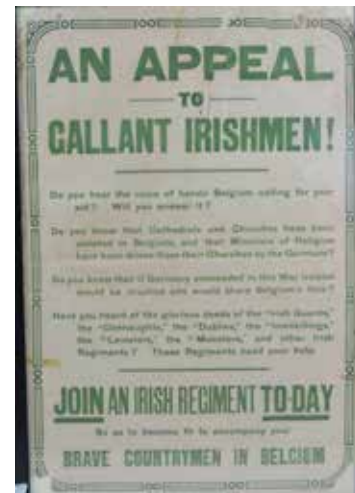

Frank Mac Dermot, Author, Politician, His Archive

Frank MacDermot (1886-1975): Frank MacDermot was the youngest son of Hugh Hyacinth MacDermot, Prince of Coolavin, a distinguished lawyer who served under Gladstone as Solicitor General for Ireland in 1886 and Attorney General for Ireland in 1892-95. He grew up fully aware of his Gaelic heritage, his Catholic faith, and his family's involvement with the law and politics. Throughout his life he was committed to the cause of a self-governing, thirty-two-county Ireland, and was prepared to steer his own route towards that goal. In 1910 he joined the United Irish League of William O'Brien, which aimed to solve Ireland's problems by bringing together parties of all opinions. He campaigned on behalf of Home Rule, and was a member of the Liberal Party's Home Rule Committee. He served with distinction during the Great War, ending with the rank of major. His reaction on learning of the 1916 Rising was that it scuppered any chance of achieving a united Irish state. In 1932 he was elected an Independent TD for Roscommon. He was a founder of the Centre Party, which coalesced with Cumann na nGaedéal to form the United Ireland Party. He initially supported General O'Duffy as leader of the new Fine Gael Party, but soon withdrew his allegiance as O'Duffy's eccentricities became more apparent. He also resigned from Fine Gael when it attacked de Valera for supporting the League of Nations sanctions against Italy following Mussolini's invasion of Abyssinia.

In 1937 MacDermot played a major part in the debates on the new constitution. A rapprochement with de Valera followed, and was one of the Taoiseach's nominees to the new Seanad Éireann in 1938. He opposed Ireland's neutrality during the War, claiming that it was in the country's best interests to support the Allies and that the victorious Nazis would not hesitate to snuff out an independent Irish state. He resigned as a senator in 1942 and lived for the next few years in New York. Thereafter he played little part in Irish affairs, living mostly in Paris until his death at the age of 89.

His views, for so long derided as old-fashioned, have been justified by time - in particular, his disapproval of the increasingly narrow Catholicism of the new state, his pursuit of social justice for minorities, and his firm belief that the "Irish Question" would only be resolved by involving all parties, North and South.

The article comprises an account of the conspiracies of the United Irishmen and others, their relations with the French revolutionaries, and the British government's awareness of these.

Author's name not given; it was not Frank MacDermot as he is acknowledged in footnote 69, his name being mis-spelt. The date must be between 1966 (MacDermot's article on Arthur O'Connor, cited in footnote 65) and MacDermot's death in 1975.

Reviews of Frank MacDermot's biography of Wolfe Tone (1939)

"Press cuttings." An album containing press reviews and correspondence relating to MacDermot's book *Theobald Wolfe Tone: A Biography* (London, Macmillan, 1939).

Typed list of contents clipped into front.

There are approximately twenty reviews, including some by distinguished columnists of the time. These include Harold Nicolson, Desmond MacCarthy, Stephen and Denis Gwynn, Desmond Ryan, Constantia Maxwell, P.S. O'Hegarty, R.B. McDowell, Robert Lynd, Robert Speaight, Robert Noakes and others.

There are thirteen letters. The correspondents include J.L. Maffey (UK representative to "Éire"), Sir Shane Leslie, Michael Browne Bishop of Galway, T. W. Moody, and Dan Breen (requesting that MacDermot sign his copy). Some were eminent historians of the day, though less well known now, such as Sir Patrick Cadell, Humphrey Sumner, J. Chartres Molony, and R.H. Hodgkin.

"Ireland and the War", 1941-1942

• Article by Frank MacDermot entitled "Ireland and the War" published in *The Saturday Evening Post*, 29 November 1941 (the last issue, as it turned out, before the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor brought the United States into the War).

• Cassette tape recording of broadcast made by Frank MacDermot in the USA in 1942 entitled "Ireland and the War" (supplementing his article on this subject in the *Saturday Evening Post*). He maintains that it is time "Éire" joined the war on the side of the Allies, and is at pains to point out the disastrous consequences to Ireland as a whole if Germany were to inflict significant damage on Britain. Quality of tape not good, but the speech is repeated several times - and what a treat to hear the voice of a significant Irish politician more than seventy years later.

Sir Roger Casement and his diaries (12 items, mainly 1956-57)

Casement was put on trial for high treason in 1916. While the case against him was strong, he had powerful supporters and there were pleas for clemency. However, the British Government circulated privately diaries said to be written by Casement, which contained many detailed references to homosexual acts. The prevailing attitude to homosexuality among the British Establishment,



and revulsion against the nature of the acts described, alienated much liberal opinion, and Casement was duly hanged. The diaries were then withdrawn and access to them was prohibited.

Irish nationalists stoutly maintained that the diaries were forged by the Government in order to secure Casement's conviction. Others claimed that they were genuine, and the controversy still rages today in spite of many biographical studies. It is generally agreed that the Government's use of the diaries at his trial was reprehensible.

Frank MacDermot's view was, as usual, balanced and articulate - a plea for information and justice. In 1937 he raised a question in the Dáil requesting that de Valera should ask the UK Government for an inquiry; Dev refused.

In 1956-7 the matter flared up again, with the publication of conflicting biographies by the English journalist René McColl, the Irish nationalist historian Herbert Mackey, and the poet Alfred Noyes, with contributions from H. Montgomery Hyde, the Ulster MP and historian of homosexuality in Britain. This file contains original letters, copy letters, news cuttings of letters, book reviews and an extract from *Hansard* relating to the Casement controversy. The writers include Frank MacDermot, Sir Shane Leslie, Ralph Partridge, Montgomery Hyde, Letitia Fairfield, René McColl, Herbert Mackey and others.

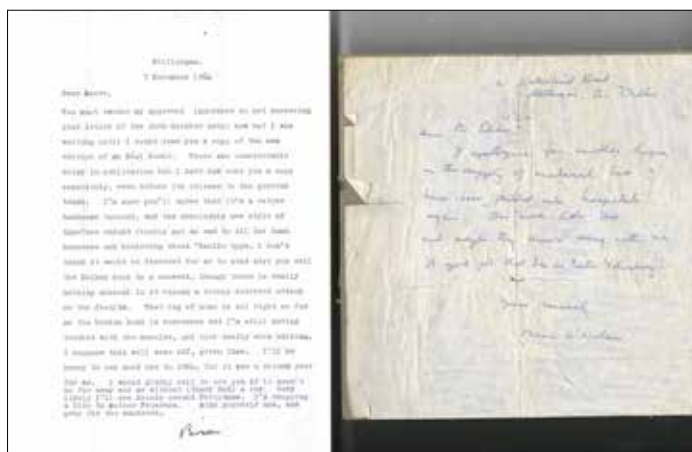

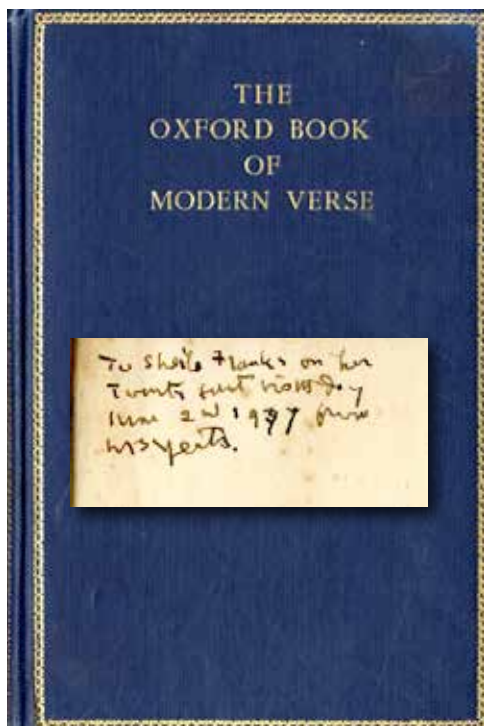
A very good collection of more than 20 autograph letters signed (mostly with initial 'D' or 'Doug') to his cousin and friend Aileen Crofton, from various addresses, six on Áras an Uachtaráin headed paper (two on mourning paper - his wife died in 1939), some with related envelopes, mostly undated, except for the letters on Presidential paper which are mostly dated 1939/40.

We have not investigated this correspondence in detail. It appears to be domestic and non-political, mostly concerning family news, gifts received (e.g. a handsome pair of socks), his and her health, various relations and their comings and goings, with occasional touches of Hyde's humour. It was evidently a close friendship, and Hyde several times reproaches her for having passed through Dublin without coming to see him. The latest dated letter is March 12 '40.

Hyde was probably the last resolutely non-political President of Ireland. He was elected President without opposition in 1937, and held office until his term expired in 1945. He died in 1949.

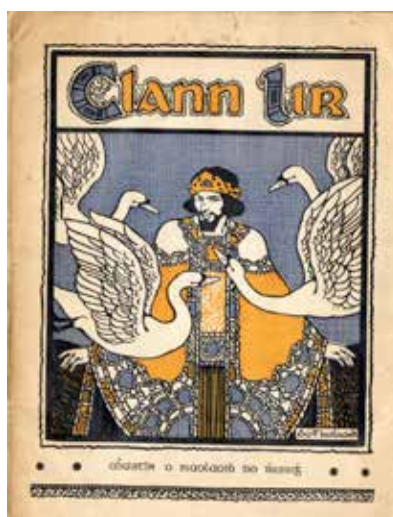

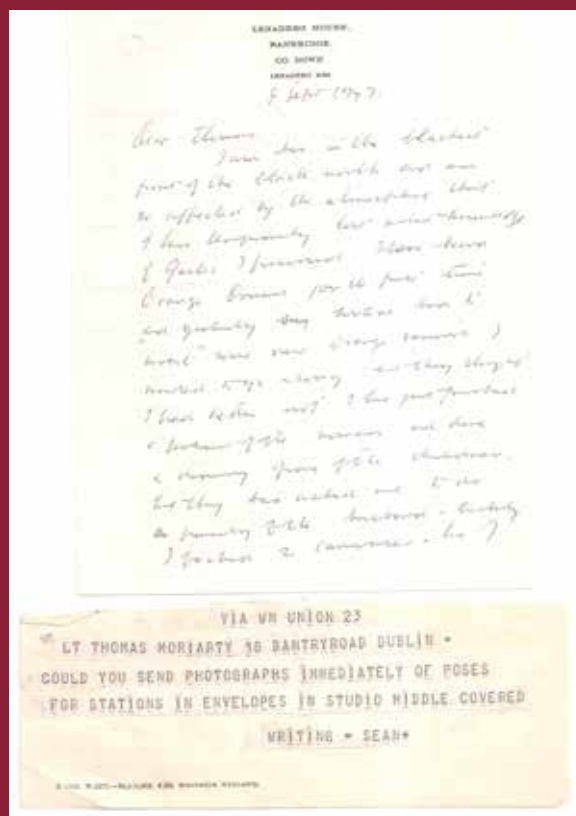
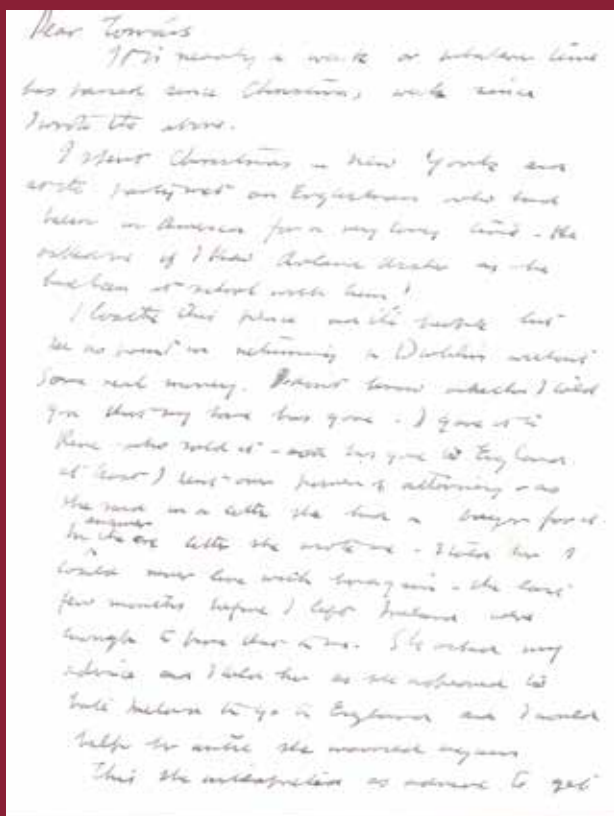

A Painter's Life

O'SULLIVAN, SEÁN RHA [1906-64]. An important collection of autograph signed letters to his friend and patron Tomás Ó Muircheartaigh, the distinguished photographer, about seventy letters and notes, in English and Irish, with two telegrams from Philadelphia and a note from O'Sullivan's wife Rene.

A splendid collection which enables us to track O'Sullivan's creative activities over a period of some 15 years, 1945-60, with letters from Paris, London, Manchester, various stately homes in England and Northern Ireland, and several from Philadelphia, as well as Neary's public house in Dublin, his studio in Stephen's Green, and his home in Blackrock, a few with related envelopes. One letter (Sept. 1954) comes from St. Patrick's Hospital, where the painter was possibly undergoing a 'cure'.

In June 1945 O'Sullivan has to put off a trip to Kerry because his current sitter has the 'flu'; in July '46 he is in Manchester to paint the Lord Mayor's portrait. 'Is uathbhásach an áit í seo. Tá an biadh - a bhfuil ann di - go huathbhásach & tá gach rud eile gann dá réir.' ['This is an awful place. The food is awful, the little there is, and everything else is correspondingly scarce.'] In August he apologises profusely for missing an appointment, and says he has been 'ar an bhagon' [on the wagon] since then. 'Tá a lán oibre agam faoi láthair agus tá me ag obair go tréan' ['I have a lot of work on hands at present and am working hard']; in September he is to go to Glin, where Madame Fitzgerald has asked him for a portrait and a 'conversation piece' with the family. On 8 September he is in Banbridge, Co. Down, 'in the blackest part of the black north and I am so affected by the atmosphere that I have temporarily lost what knowledge of Gaelic I possessed. I have heard Orange drums for the first time, and yesterday my hostess had to 'unveil' some new Orange banners, I wanted to go along but they

thought I had better not.' On 12 September he reports that the lady of the house and her husband and friends were very pleased with his portrait and sketches, 'ní fuláir mar sin go bhfuil an obair go dona' [therefore it must be poor work]. 'Tá na daoine annso ana-lághach & ní fhéadfaidís a bheith níos muinntearaí liom, acht mar sin féin ní de'n saghas céanna iad.' ['The people here are very pleasant, and could not be friendlier, but all the same they are of a different sort.']

In December 1947 he writes from Wiltshire, c/o The Marquess of Bath, where the pictures are going well; but in February '48 his wife Rene writes to acknowledge a loan of £10, 'which shall be returned as soon as possible'. In July he is back in Wiltshire, and in August at Mrs. Pilkington's, Stretton House, Lancashire, wife of a major glassmaker. He is painting their two young daughters, aged 4 and 8, a difficult task, everyone is delighted with the results - except himself. He is tired of the English, they are very civilised, but entirely lacking in humour or any sense of 'ragairneacht' [enjoyment] — and so on.

In January 1956, writing from Philadelphia, he says his exhibition has been a great success. 'Deirtear liom ná fuil aoinne sa tír chun mé a shárú chun dreach-shamhail a dhéanamh, & dheineas peictiúirí do dhaoine gur péinteáladh iad leis na daoine ba mhó ainm sa tír.' [I am told there is nobody in this country who can match me for a likeness, though I have drawn people who have been painted by some of the biggest names here.] He says he has made a lot of money, but spent it again, mostly, as he fell off the wagon. To tell the truth, he says, he hates this place. 'Tá níos mó géire inntleachta & grinn ag an dream is boichte in Éirinn ná ag an dream is saidhbhre annso' ['The poorest people in Ireland have more wit and humour than the richest here']. All he wants now, he says, is to make some good money, and keep it if possible, and return home to Ireland. In a continuation in English, he tells O Muircheartaigh that his marriage is over and his home has gone. 'I gave it to Rene - who sold it and has gone to England. I told her I could never live with her again - the last few months before I left Ireland were enough to prove that to me.'

These are splendid and at times moving letters, showing the painter's humour and honesty, his keen observation and awareness, and they amount almost to a diary of his work and life over an extended period of some 15 years. Tomás Ó Muircheartaigh, a civil servant from the well-known Kerry family, was a distinguished photographer and a patron of the arts. He commissioned O'Sullivan to draw portraits of writers in Irish like Tomás Ó Criomhthain, 'Peig' and Máirtín Ó Cadhain, and was evidently a close and loyal friend of the (sometimes erratic) painter.

Each monthly issue consists of a single folded sheet, giving four pages foolscap. Pages one and two include original poetry and ballads, illustrated by two or three hand coloured drawings by Yeats. The third page is given to a single large drawing, usually uncoloured. These include some very fine and ambitious drawings, some of London scenes, some of 'Life in the West of Ireland'. The rear page is always blank.

Yeats made all the drawings himself, and edited the verse, with contributions from friends including Ernest Rhys, John Masefield, Lady Gregory, Douglas Hyde and James Stephens. The plates were printed at Cuala and were hand coloured under the supervision of Elizabeth Corbet Yeats.

Artistically it is a unique enterprise. The full set includes over 200 drawings by Jack Yeats, most of them hand coloured. The series gives a remarkable insight into his ideas and interests, featuring many themes echoed or developed in his oil paintings. A few of the drawings were issued as Cuala prints, but the vast majority have never been reproduced. For anyone interested in Jack Yeats and his work, a set of Broadside is a very desirable acquisition. Full sets in original condition are rare. (1) See illustration on page 62 €6000 - 7000

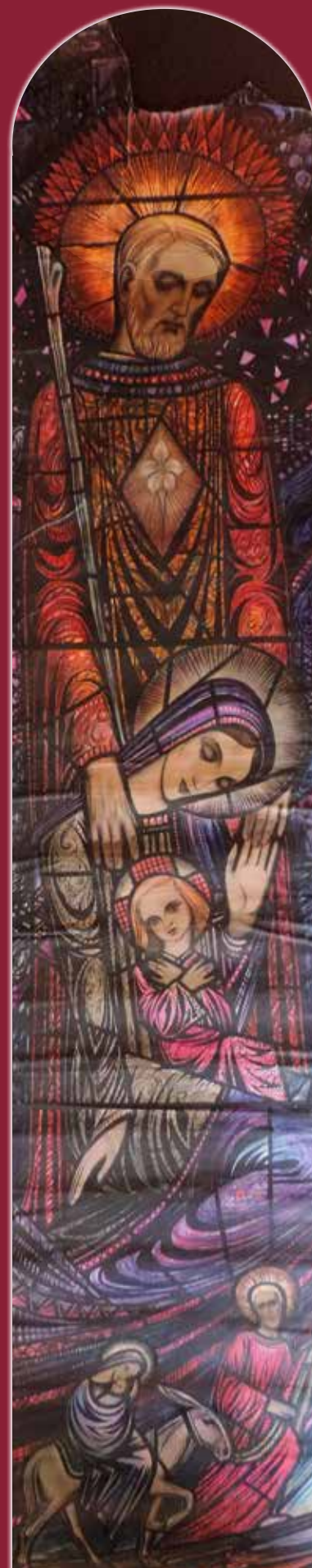
THE STAINED GLASS DESIGNS OF RICHARD J. KING (1907-74)

Born in Castlebar, where his father was an RIC Sergeant, King's family moved to Westport in 1922 and to Dublin in 1926, where King entered the Metropolitan School of Art. He had always been good with his hands, and made a violin as a young man. He studied illustration and design under Austin Molloy, a friend of the stained glass artist Harry Clarke, and on Molloy's recommendation he went to work at the Clarke family firm in 1928. Harry Clarke died in 1931, and in 1935 King became manager of the Clarke studios. He left in 1940 to set up on his own, working both in stained glass and in graphic design. He executed a series of high-profile stamp designs for the Irish Post Office, including the GAA and the Four Masters stamp of 1944. He supplied regular colour designs to the Capuchin Annual, where he joined the staff in 1940, while continuing to work extensively in stained-glass design. His windows are in churches and public buildings throughout the world, including Boston College, Massachusetts, St Thomas More Jesuit Chapel, University of West Australia (where there are twenty-one windows, including Stations of the Cross), and St. Columba's College, South Perth, Australia. 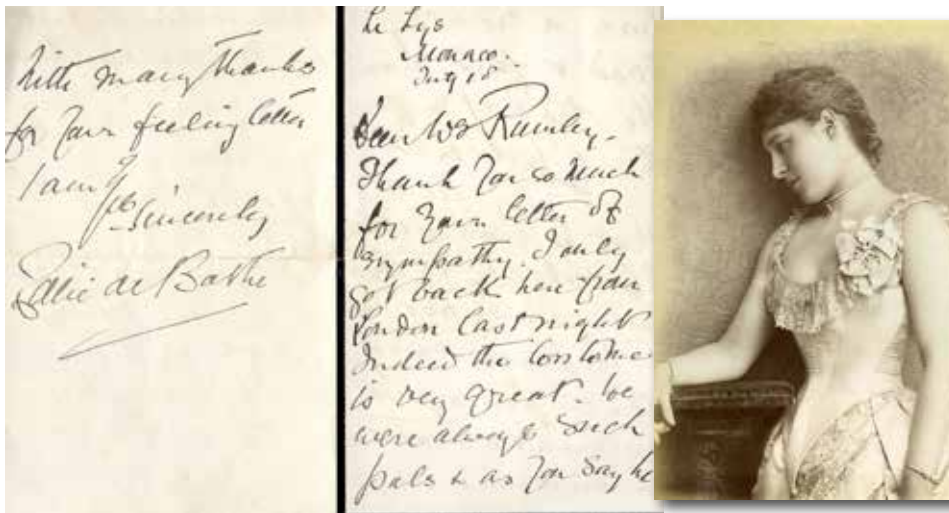
With an autograph signed letter (2 pp, single sheet) from John (giving a Salisbury address, dated 'Friday'), to a Mr. Conroy, saying 'he spoke to Mr. McDonough about rooms [in Galway] but has heard nothing, and asking Conroy to make enquiries about the rooms, 'those behind the new dock .. If I had these rooms and got them simply furnished I would come over to Galway to do some work'. Also mentions Macnamara, presumably Francis, father of Caitlin, who married Dylan Thomas (after having an affair with John).

Also with an autograph signed letter to John, March 1902, 1 pp, addressed from 'On the Veldt, Western Transvaal', from Tom McDonagh (probably one of the Galway merchant family). 'I am now trekking with Keirs Column .. under Walter Kitchener, in all I think we have about 20,000 men & are in search for Boers .. I expect there will be a hell of a fight soon. I am with the field hospital. I expect this time they will collar De La Rey for we are after him .. Don't write, we may be away three months.' The letter in two portions, with tape stains at the separation.

A most interesting collection, which effectively authenticates the drawing. Augustus John did stay in Galway for a time, and produced a major mural painting there; he also stayed at Coole with Robert Gregory. As a collection, w.a.f. (1) €1750 - 2500

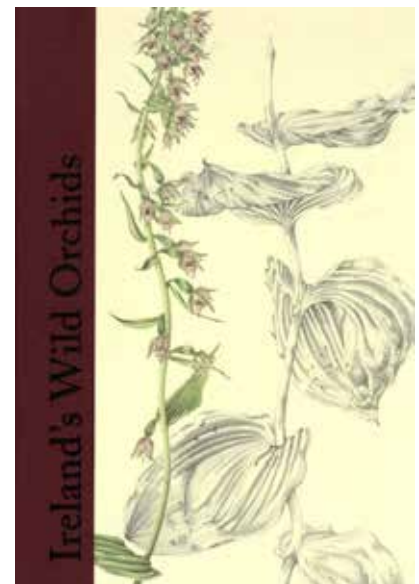

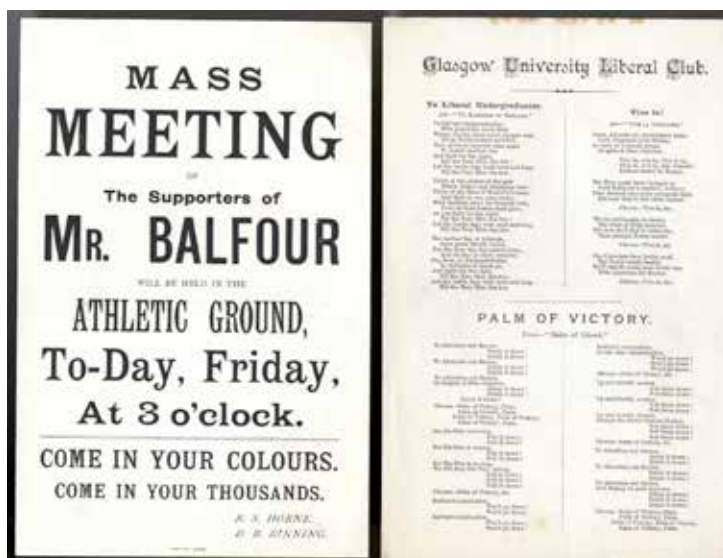
The King offers Comfort to the 'Jersey Lily'

DE BATHE, Lillie [nee Le Breton, better known as Lillie Langtry]. An original manuscript signed letter, 4 pp (single folded sheet), on mourning paper, from her home in Monaco, dated July 18 (no year), to Mrs Rumley, responding to condolences about the death of her husband, Gerald de Bathe, the letter signed Lillie de Bathe. 'Indeed the loss to me is very great - We were always such pals & as you say he was a really good & fine man. He did not suffer thank God & had never any idea that he was so ill .. Everyone was very kind. The King sent for me to Buckingham Palace & had a long talk privately with me ..'

Lillie Langtry, the 'Jersey Lily', made her entrance to high society through the painter Frank Miles and his friends including Oscar Wilde. At a society dinner, she caught the eye of the Prince of Wales, with whom she had a long affair. A spectacular beauty in her youth, she was painted by many artists including Millet. Hugo de Bathe, a well-to-do baronet, was her second husband, though in later years she lived mainly on her own. (1) €350 - 500



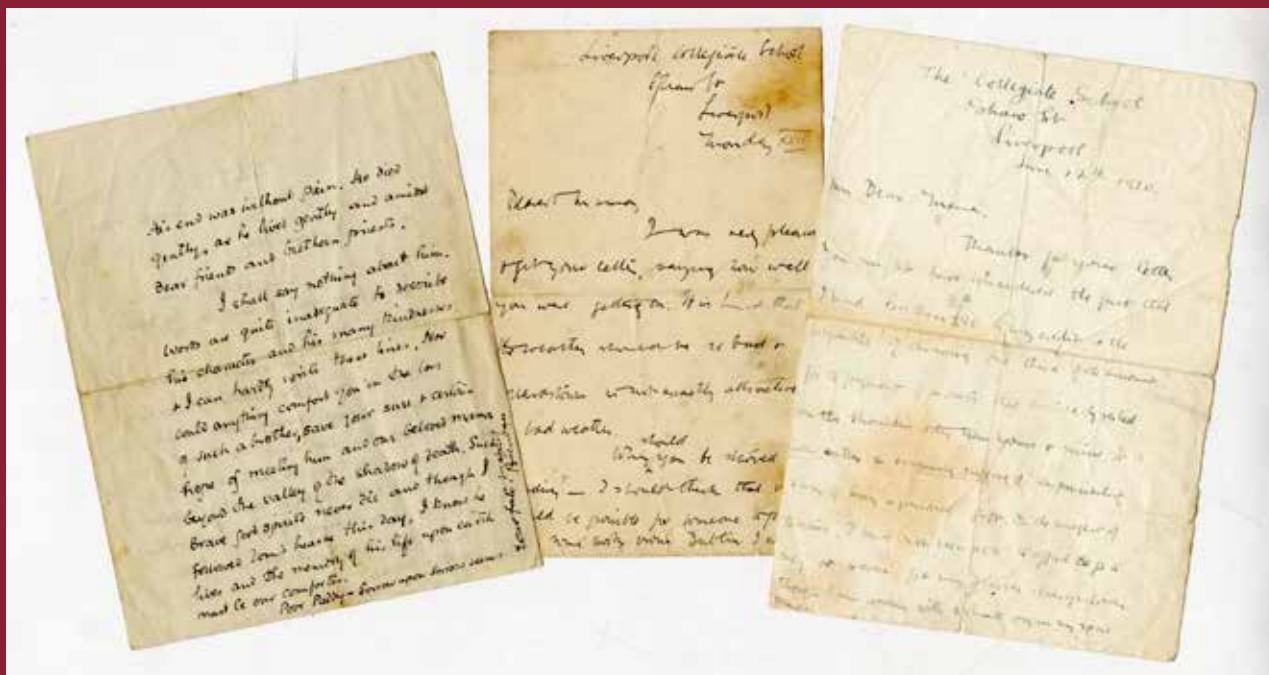

Churchill's Private Secretary

BRACKEN, Brendan [1901-58]. An important collection of eleven autograph signed letters to his mother, 1920-28, with a further four letters to [his brother?] Paddy, 1928-34, one incomplete letter to his mother, a telegram and some related items, also an attractive photographic portrait (worn) of Bracken's mother and a Keogh portrait of a child (the young Brendan?). Born in Templemore, Co. Tipperary, Bracken ran away from the Jesuit College in Mungret, and went to Australia for a time. In 1919 he went to Liverpool as a teacher, and later established himself as a journalist and newspaper proprietor in London. He became a Conservative MP and a supporter and close friend of Winston Churchill. He was Churchill's parliamentary private secretary 1939-41, Minister for Information 1941-5 and First Lord of the Admiralty 1945, and was arguably the most influential person of Southern Irish birth throughout World War II. He was at various times co-proprietor of *The Economist* and Chairman of *The Financial Times*.



The letters give an excellent flavour of his personality, his early struggles and his rapid rise. The first, 20 June 1920, from a Liverpool school, mentions a financial loss and says 'I have not been able to afford to go to [a doctor], or to even get my glasses changed ... I am in indifferent health and will soon be without a post as I am leaving here at the end of the term ... I do not feel like answering the taunts etc which I have received, & no useful purpose can therefore be served in endeavouring to convince you that I am other than you imagine. I will respect your evident wishes, that you do not desire to have any more to do with me ... [but] Should you desire to keep in touch I will do so ...'

Evidently the correspondence continued, because an undated letter (also from Liverpool) says he was very pleased to get her letter. He says he is thinking of going to Edinburgh for the winter session at the University, if he can get some kind of a post, 'but there are so many hungry Scotchmen that I fear my chances are poor.'

On 15 February 1923, his 22nd birthday, now in London, he writes very warmly. 'You have had many sorrows & difficulties in life, & for many years you have had to face them alone ... But you've surmounted them all, which is the great test of life ... Anything that I am able to do is altogether due to you ... A month later, 'We are deep in an awful fight at Westminster and I think we are going to win ... We are fighting the three great parties ... & only Winston could pull it off. A good deal of attention here is directed to the Irish vote which may pull the fat out of the fire - it will I hope be given in Winston's favour ...' [this may relate to a by-election contest].

In August 1923, he is 'off to Budapest next week ... Business is booming there and I am hoping to be appointed Trade Commissioner for Hungary in London. I will, of course, hold this job with the one I now hold. It ought to be worth a couple of thousand a year -- not a bad sum to begin with ...' and he talks about buying a small country house outside London if it goes ahead.

In November, writing on letterhead of *The Illustrated Review*, he is just back from Dublin,

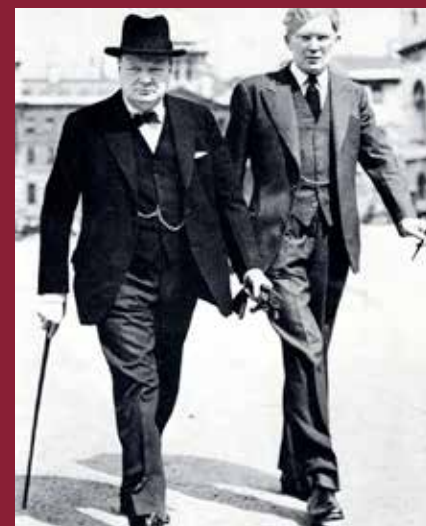
where he saw Nancy. 'I was walking back to Yeats' house [presumably WBY] when I ran in to her.' A year later, November 1924, 'I shall never be so happy as I was last week. Dear Winston became chancellor after two years of enforced absence from Parliament.'

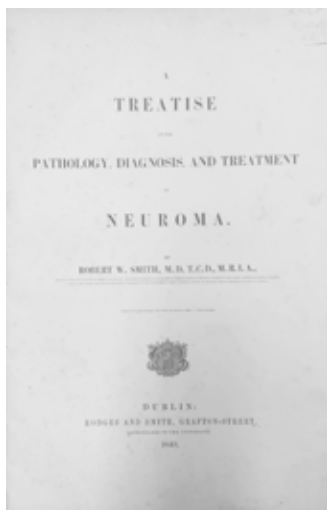
Another remarkable letter, March 1925, thanks his mother for her offer of a sum of money, which however he cannot accept because he has no need of money. 'I am filled with affection and admiration for the remarkable way you battled alone for us after Papa's death. Your difficulties were immense, but they were less than your courage. The hardest troubles you had to bear came from me, & I am never likely to forget this fact ...' The telegram, dated 31 May 1929, says simply 'Won'. This must refer to Bracken's election to Parliament as MP for North Paddington. There is a play written by Tom Kilroy titled 'Double Cross' one half of which is about Brendan Bracken, the other half is about Lord Haw Haw, two Irishmen, both of whom turned their backs on Ireland.

*This is a highly important correspondence, particularly since Bracken's personal papers were destroyed (on his instructions) after his death.

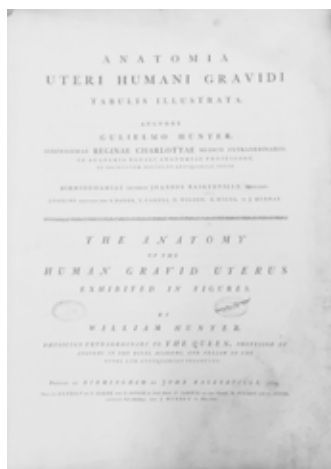

Glasgow University Elects a New Rector, 1890

Balfour (Arthur): Conservative propaganda issued in advance of the rectorial election of 15 November 1890, comprising all five issues of a magazine entitled The College Unionist and leaflets and broadsheets with copies of speeches, newspaper articles. Frequent use is made of cartoons and parodies of well-known ballads.

The Lords Rector of Glasgow University are elected every three years. The election of 1890 was fiercely contested between supporters of the two candidates, the Hon. Arthur Balfour and the Earl of Aberdeen. The propaganda reflects the passion with which the literate public followed political developments at the time. The two candidates were: Arthur Balfour (1848-1930), a wealthy Scottish landowner and nephew of the Conservative Prime Minister, Lord Salisbury. At the time of the election he was Chief Secretary for Ireland, in which post he even-handedly took firm measures against agrarian unrest and absentee landlords. He was a staunch opponent of Home Rule. In 1902 he succeeded his uncle as Prime Minister.

Lord Aberdeen (1847-1934) was a Liberal and a devoted supporter of Gladstone, under whom he had briefly served as Lord Lieutenant of Ireland in 1886 (his second term, from 1905 to 1915, would prove a great deal more memorable).

The Conservative campaign stresses Balfour's firm hand in Ireland and there is much mockery of the stereotypical Irishman:

My name is Bill O'Brien, from New Tipperary flyin'

The heart of 'Bloody Balfour' I'm a thorn in' But before the break of morn, he'll be cursin' all forlorn

For I'm off to Philadelphia in the morning' Balfour won. Are university politics so lively these days?!

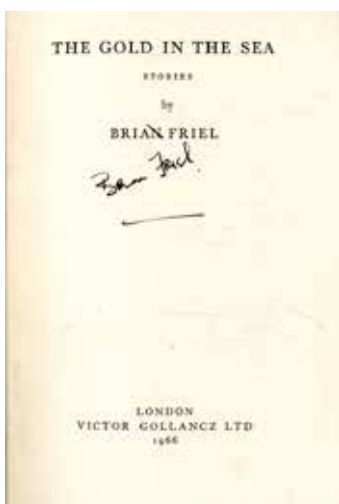

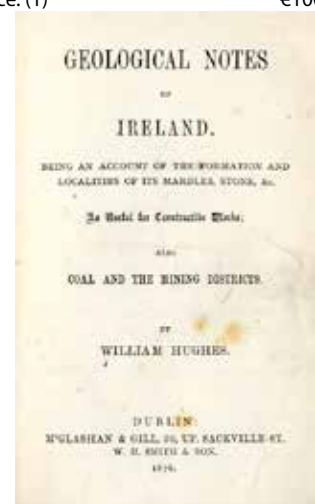

Wise, Pt. III: l pp. 3- 7. The infamous Hotten piracy advertised in his 1862 catalogue as: *The Lost Poems of the Poet Laureate - These are the choice poems that have been dropped or thrown aside by the Poet during his literary career [actually suppressed from Poems chiefly Lyrical 1830, and Poems 1833]... The little volume also includes variations in the text, and the successive changes that have taken place in the growing up of the poems. It is understood that only an exceedingly limited number of copies have been taken off...* An injunction against the sale of the volume was obtained by Tennyson and Hotten was subsequently obliged to surrender all the copies in his power. The editorship has been confidently ascribed to J. Dykes Campbell, then Cochrane & Co.'s representative in Toronto, but the printer, possibly Walford in England., remains obscure.

The rarity of the book appears to be somewhat disputed: according to Campbell only about 40 or 50 copies were "brought" to London: Wise himself possibly only acquired his copy latterly, since it is not mentioned until the Addenda to the Ashley Catalogue; and R.H. Shepherd in his Tennyson Bibliography 1896 states that he had never seen a copy. On the other hand Hotten himself while insisting on the volume's extreme rarity and desirability, was selling it for 9/6d, and John Carter recently described it, deprecatingly, as appearing with "the by now familiar note that it was so rigorously suppressed that very few copies are now in existence." See *Book Collector* Winter, 1963, pp. 492 - 3. Apparently some copies were also issued in large paper format, and others in green, not blue, wrappers. €250 - 350
