After his PhD in Cambridge (1985), Dr Mehrotra was Associate Professor of Economics, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi (1988-1991).

He is a human development economist and his research interests span industry and trade issues, the impact of macro-economic policy on health and education, the informal sector, and the economics of health and education. His books include: *India and the Soviet Union: Trade and Technology Transfer* (1990); *Development with a Human Face: Experiences in Social Achievement and Economic Growth* (1997); *Universalizing Elementary Education in India: Uncaging the Tiger Economy* (2005); *The Economics of Elementary Education in India* (2006). Two co-authored books were published in 2007, *Asian Informal Workers: Global Risks, Local Protection* and *Eliminating Human Poverty: Macro-economic Policies for Equitable Growth*.
