



- Bucknell will begin its 128th season of football Sept. 7 vs. Marist at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. It marks the second consecutive year the Bison and Red Foxes have squared off in the season opener.
- This is the ninth straight year Marist is on Bucknell's schedule.
- Just eight of Bucknell's 11 opponents from 2012 remain on the Bison 2013 schedule. Sacred Heart (Sept. 28), Dartmouth (Oct. 19) and VMI (Nov. 23) replace Delaware (L, 19-3), Harvard (L, 35-7) and Bryant (W, 24-21).
- Bucknell will have five home games this year, marking the fourth time in the last five campaigns it has five home contests and six road games.

NEW FACES ON COACHING STAFF


- For the first time in Joe Susan's tenure as Bison head coach, the Bucknell coaching staff featured significant turnover in the offseason. Susan brought in Matt Applebaum (OL), John Bowes (LB/ST) and Eric Wicks (DB) to replace Ross Pennypacker, Chad Rogosheske and Chip Taylor, who had been mainstays on the Bison staff the past three years.
- Returning to the coaching staff in 2013 is volunteer assistant Rich Scarantino. Scarantino takes over the running back coaching duties from Bill Morrow. He previously held the position in 2010, Susan's first at Bucknell.
- In addition to the new on-field coaches, Eric Hahn has joined the program in the role of administrative coordinator. He will be responsible for team video and team travel as well as many other duties.

SUCCESS IN CLOSE GAMES

- Bucknell has had success in close games in recent years. In fact, the Bison have posted a 15-10 record in games decided by seven points or less since 2006.
- Seven of Bucknell's 11 games in 2012 were decided by seven points or less.

RETURNING ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE PLAYERS

- Bucknell had seven players named All-Patriot League last fall and five of them will return in 2013.
- First-team selections Travis Friend and Matthew Steinbeck return as do secondteam picks Evan Byers, Sean Sellers and Tracey Smith.
- The only All-Patriot League players to graduate were Samuel Oyekoya and Beau Traber.

- Bucknell's bye week came prior to its first game a year ago, causing the Bison to play 11 games in 11 weeks.
- This year, Bucknell is idle week two (Sept. 14), meaning this season the Bison will play 10 consecutive weeks starting Sept. 21 at Cornell.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

• Senior DE Sean Sellers, junior LB Evan Byers and junior S Matthew Steinbeck earned preseason recognition from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA). All three veterans were named to the CFPA watch list for their respective position. Sellers had 32 tackles, eight tackles for loss and a team-high six sacks last year, while Byers posted a team-high 100 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks and picked off three passes. Steinbeck led the Patriot League with six interceptions, was among the nation's leaders in interceptions per game and posted 44 tackles.

OPPONENTS

- Bucknell's 11 2013 opponents posted a combined 54-66 (.450) record in 2012.

Bucknell certainly has plenty of experience in close games heading into 2013. Seven of the Bison's 11 outings in 2012 were decided by a touchdown or less. Fourth-year head coach Joe Susan is expecting his squad will turn some of those close losses into wins this year with more experience. In fact, the experience on the field will be a strength for Bucknell this fall as it returns nine starters on the offensive side of the ball and seven more on defense. Included among those 16 returning starters are five All-Patriot League players.


"One of the things we in the coaching profession do not like is waiting for anything," said Susan, who led the Bison to a 6-5 mark and a five-win turnaround in 2011. "The thing that happened last year is we were in close games where we were in position late in the game to either tie or take the lead and how you do in those close games defines you as a team.

"You do have to be realistic when you look at the number of younger players we had on the field. Those players are still in our system and they will use last year's experience as a learning opportunity and show they can now make it happen. Learning how to do it and actually doing it are different things, though, and we plan to be ready come September."

The invaluable game experience that dots the roster will almost certainly lead to more victories this fall, but Susan also expects more wins thanks to the familiarity of the players with the system. The entire roster has now played for one college head coach and in one system since the current seniors took to the Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium field for the first time on Susan's first day of preseason camp in the summer of 2010.

"The thing that is important is they know what we expect from them from a work standpoint," commented Susan, who is impressed by the leadership from the senior class. "They have been in our weight room and the older guys can have an impact and show the young ones the way we do things when they arrive. When you are dealing with younger players, there are a lot of directions they can go, and luckily most of our players have a good feel for the direction we want them to go."

Having a fourth-year starting quarterback, four juniors on the offensive line and the program's first group of student-athletes to be recruited with merit aid as freshmen, wins are expected to come at a higher rate.



"We will work hard to take a step forward this season" said a smiling Susan. "I think with the incoming freshman class, plus the talent we have coming back, the league shapes up as anybody's to take this year. Most Patriot League games are close and we need to learn how to win the close games."

Bucknell's preseason depth chart features 10 seniors, 10 juniors and two sophomores listed as likely starters. The Bison this year return 38 lettermen. Below is a position-by-position look at the team heading into preseason practice.

Offense

The Bucknell offense has a fourth-year starting quarterback, a threetime All-Patriot League fullback, a talented group of tight ends and a veteran receiver who will finish his career among the Bison all-time leaders in receiving yards, but anytime Susan discusses the Bison offense the conversation undoubtedly comes back to the offensive line. After a year of uncertainty on a line that featured four first-time starters, three sophomores and one freshman, Bucknell now has some experience to go along with talent on the line.

The Bison offense averaged 15.0 points per game a year ago to rank 114th in the nation (out of 121), but thanks to a year of growth on the offensive line, Susan expects to unleash more of the playbook in the pro-style offense this fall. The extra options, including more deep balls, should lead to more points and give Bucknell more chances at victories.

"With the evolution of the offensive line allowing us to run the ball effectively, we will be able to throw the ball more effectively," explained Susan, who hopes the offensive execution will keep third downs more manageable this fall. "We have to take our shots. We have to make sure people honor the down-field ball so they are not packing nine guys in the box."

Susan will also attempt to keep the balance that the Bison have been known for in recent years. Since he took over the program in 2010, Bucknell has averaged 394 rushing attempts for 1,195 yards per year. Over the same span, the Bison have passed 296 times per year for an average of 1,820 yards.

Quarterback

Senior Brandon Wesley is expected to hold down the quarterback position for a fourth consecutive year. He has a chance to become the first Bison signal caller to start more than 40 games in a career, and he enters his final campaign ranked first in program history in pass completions and pass attempts and second in passing yards and total offense.

Wesley, the 2010 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, had his third consecutive solid season last fall when he completed 174 of 289 passes for a career-high 1,781 yards and seven touchdowns. The consistent Texas native has had very comparable numbers each of his first three campaigns and will be looking to conclude his career on a high note as one of the most statistically impressive quarterbacks in school history.

"Brandon had an outstanding spring and you can see where his experience helps him," praised Susan. "He displayed a stronger and more accurate arm in the spring and we are going to modify how we ask him to run. Most of his best runs are scrambles and we will focus on those."

Trey Lauletta served as Wesley's backup last year and will begin 2013 in the same position, but he has the ability to push the durable Wesley to stay sharp.

Lauletta appeared in two games in 2012, taking one snap at Marist and playing the entire second half at Holy Cross. He was 10-for-23 for 80 yards in limited action, but showed plenty of the positives that were on display in the 2011 season finale at Colgate that featured him completing 24 of 39 passes for 196 yards.

"Trey had a really good spring, too," said Susan, who noted Wesley and Lauletta were the only two quarterbacks to participate in spring practice. "He put his mind to getting stronger. He displayed a stronger arm

and really worked on his agility. He is never going to be a running quarterback and we are not asking him to be, but he got a lot better. If he is putting pressure



on Brandon, our team is better."

Freshmen RJ Nitti and Alexander Romango are the other two quarterbacks on the roster. Nitti is 6'4", 220, while Romango is 6'2", 210, and Susan likes that size for the quarterback position.

"The size is what we want in the system," explained Susan. "We are not running the option here, but that size helps them buy time and makes them harder to tackle."

Susan, who admitted that because of the talented offensive line he is not concerned about the relative lack of depth with only four quarterbacks on the roster, noted Nitti is coming off a knee injury, but will be ready for preseason practice.

Running Back

One year after returning two potential All-Patriot seniors (Tyler Smith, Jeremiah Young) at running back, Bucknell enters 2013 with many questions, but plenty of solutions, at the position. Senior Charles Thompson and sophomores Matt DelMauro and Brian Regan are the leading candidates to see the bulk of the carries. They have combined for just 39 carries in their career, with Thompson responsible for 35 of them.

"It is tough to have one guy in there the whole game in a tailback offense and we have confidence that all three guys can play at this level," said Susan. "We will likely play the hot hand and it might change from week to week."

Thompson has the most experience of the trio, while DelMauro put together the best spring. In fact, he was named the Most Improved Offensive Player at the conclusion of spring practice and he had a standout

spring game, rushing 11 times for 65 yards and two touchdowns.

"Matt on a tall day is 5'8", but he is not small by any means," said Susan. "He has become much more defined in



his running ability and we saw that during the spring."

Regan is the fastest guy on the team and will also see plenty of time on special teams returning kicks, a role he filled last season. Regan did receive four carries as a rookie, including a 17-yard rush in the season finale vs. Bryant.

Freshmen Anthony DelRusso and CJ Williams will join the running back fold. DelRusso's high school in New Jersey ran the same offense as Bucknell, while the 205-pound Williams is a year older than his classmates after spending one successful year at Navy Prep.

Fullback

Bucknell senior fullback Travis Friend has the potential to become just the 11th player in league history to be named All-Patriot League four times. A co-captain, Friend was a Second Team All-Patriot League selection as a freshman and sophomore before moving up to the First Team last fall.

Susan lays incredible expectations on the fullback and tight end positions and he expects big things out of Friend once again.

Friend caught 16 passes for a career-high 136 yards last year and also ran the ball eight times for 24 yards, but one of his most important attributes is his blocking ability, which he can do from both the fullback or tight end spots on the field.

"Travis has gotten so much better," beamed Susan about the three-year starter. "We can do so many different things with him, whether we line him up at fullback or tight end. He's very smart and very important to our protection schemes. He leads by example with his work ethic."

Despite often lining up in the backfield, Friend does not receive a lot of carries, but Susan promises to give him a handful this year, likely on third downs.

Kareem Hyman will serve as Friend's backup at fullback. The junior came to Bucknell as a quarterback in 2011 and played mostly on special teams in 2012.

"It is hard for Kareem to be behind

Travis," mentioned Susan. "He is very talented, but is still just a couple years removed from being a quarterback. Both Kareem and Travis are very important to what we do offensively."

Tight End

With five viable options competing for playing time, Bucknell has more depth at tight end than it has had at any time in recent memory, and the fact that none are seniors shows why the position was not part of the incoming recruiting class. Susan has plenty of versatility at his disposal at tight end, which is excellent because it is such a focal point of the offense.

Junior Patrick Kelly and sophomore Brian Duncan are the top two tight ends that will typically line up attached to the offensive line. They will serve more as blocking tight ends, while juniors Josh Lebo and converted wide receiver Jake Hartman will spend more time out as receivers. Joe Sangimino, who returns to the team after a one-year absence, will provide strong depth at the position.

It's good to have this group within our offense," said Susan. "You combine these five guys with our two fullbacks and we have a lot of personnel matchups we can create."

Kelly and Lebo shared time at tight end with the graduated Nick Gatto the last two years. Kelly has five career catches for 32 yards, while Lebo has 14 receptions for 104 yards, including 11 catches for 82 yards in 2012.

Duncan did not see action in a game as a rookie last fall, while Hartman missed all but the opener at Marist with a knee injury.

Wide Receiver

Veterans Victor Walker, Josh Brake and Kyle Sullivan are expected to anchor the wide receiver positions in 2013. Walker will be a starter for a fourth consecutive year. He is on pace to become the ninth Bison to reach 100 career receptions and is within reach of becoming the third Bucknell player to reach 2,000 yards receiving. The Frederick, Md., native enters his senior campaign with 85 catches for 1,410 yards and four touchdowns.

He currently ranks 11th in program annals in receiving yards.

"Victor had a good spring," praised Susan. "He is much more powerful catching the ball in and out of his breaks. (Assistant coach) Bryan (Bossard) has done a great job with him."

Junior Josh Brake started five games a year ago and was second on

the team to Walker in both receptions (27) and receiving yards (395).

"Josh had a really good sophomore year," said Susan about the Flower Mound, Texas, native. "He is hard to cover because of his size and he is strong in his routes."

Sullivan is the jack-of-all-trades on the team as he will punt and return punts in addition to his duties as a receiver. He had nine catches for 82 yards last fall and was the squad's primary punt returner and backup punter.

Susan expects junior Vinnie Pini to have a breakout year and complement Walker on deep balls. Sophomore Matthew Jegede is another player Susan is excited about. A 6'4", 210-pound player, Jegede missed last year with a knee injury. He is a coverage dilemma because of his size, and he is excellent at attacking the ball.

Offensive Line

The success and progression of the offensive line will have a major impact on the final win total for Bucknell in 2013. Thus, it's a good thing the majority of the group spent the summer on campus working out with strength and conditioning coach John Field. Returning starters Lonnie Rawles, Brandon Noblett and Nevin Hagman remain listed first on the depth chart, while fellow returning starter Clayton Hoffmaster will enter the season as a backup to Hagman at right guard.

Daniel McManus is projected to take over at left guard, while 325-pound Ramy Kased will be the starting right tackle.

Most of these names registered significant playing time a year ago, but there has been some shifting on the line. McManus has taken over for the graduated Troy Steinhilber, while Hagman moved inside from right tackle.



spring," praised Susan.
"If we keep this group healthy it can be formidable within the league. The big question mark is still the left guard position. Hoffmaster played a lot for us last year and I think he will put a lot of pressure on McManus.

"Once we come out of preseason we want to have an answer at each position, but if we have to play six, we'll play six."

Susan, who coached the seniorless offensive



line briefly during the spring, also singled out the progression of sophomores Vikram Shenoy and Nick Craven.

Joining the offensive line group this year are five freshmen who average 6'4", 286 pounds. Overall, Bucknell's average offensive lineman average 6'4", 289 pounds, up from 6'2", 277 pounds in 2010, Susan's first at the helm of the program.

Defense

Two years ago, Bucknell's defense was instrumental in equaling the biggest one-year turnaround in program history (+5 wins) as the Bison were second in the nation in forced turnovers (39) and led the country in turnover margin (+2.45). Unfortunately, Bucknell was unable to catch lightning in a bottle a second year in a row and dropped out of the stratosphere to a more normal 16 forced turnovers and +0.27 turnover margin last fall.

Susan is hoping to make those turnover margins return to the 2011 figures and he is confident they will if the team listens to two mantras that are repeated constantly around Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium: "The Ball is the Program" and "Catch the Ones They Throw You".

"We dropped a few last year," said Susan. "We dropped a couple critical ones in the Cornell game that would have changed the scoring. We teach ball disruption every day. We will work hard to be better at creating turnovers this year."

While Bucknell did not force as many turnovers as the previous year, the Bison were still a very strong defensive squad in 2012. They ranked seventh nationally in rushing defense and 41st in total defense. Their average of three sacks per game was ninth in the country.

All-Patriot League players dot every level of the defense as seniors Sean Sellers and Tracey Smith anchor the defensive line, junior Evan Byers will lead the linebackers and classmate Matthew Steinbeck was among the nation's leaders in interceptions in the defensive backfield.





Defensive Line

Susan likes to rotate many bodies on the defensive line and during the spring at least six players stood out as ones he feels comfortable playing a lot of snaps. Ideally, though, he would like to see that number expand to eight, putting the Bison far ahead of other Patriot League teams in terms of depth and the ability to wear down an offensive line.

"Depth at defensive line is so important," described Susan, who is entering his 37th year as a college coach. "We have six guys to play four spots. We would like to develop more depth and have eight guys, but I am not sure many teams in the league have that many options."

Second Team All-Patriot League selections Sellers and Smith headline the defensive line group. Sellers, who is coming off a year when he posted 32 tackles, eight tackles for loss and six sacks, was one of three Bison defensive players to earn preseason recognition from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

"I told Sean that it's the postseason notoriety that counts," deadpanned Susan. "When I talk to people in our league about our headaches, they say

they can't block Sean Sellers and they can't block Tracey Smith."

A two-year starter who has been an integral part of the defensive line the last three years, Smith posted career highs in all statistical categories last year, totaling 45 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and three sacks.

Sellers will continue to operate from his defensive end position,

while Smith will hold down the nose guard spot again.

Junior Connor Hayes is the frontrunner to take over the opposite end from the graduated Samuel Oyekoya. Dylan McDonnell is also in the mix there, but he battled a foot injury in the spring, opening the door for Hayes to get more reps, and he showed plenty of promise and skills.

Senior Brent Forbes, a local player from Shamokin Area High School who had 12 tackles in a reserve role a year ago, and junior Demetrius Baldwin-Youngblood, an athletic player who registered 15 stops while playing in all 11 games with two starts, will battle for the other starting position.

Linebacker

Junior Evan Byers last year became the first Bison since 2009, and just the fifth since 2000, to reach the century mark for tackles as he posted a team-high 100 on the season. He was a First Team All-Patriot League selection and earned the team's MVP honor as he proved to be one of the better players in the conference in his first year as a starter. Like Sellers, he earned preseason recognition from the CFPA.

Bucknell utilizes a 4-2-5 defensive setup, meaning there are just two linebackers in the scheme. Byers' fellow starter Beau Traber graduated last May, leaving a position to fill. Susan has plugged in junior Lee Marvel

after moving him from safety to his more natural linebacker spot. Marvel was third on the squad with 58 tackles last season and his 6.5 tackles for loss ranked third.

Similar to the defensive line, the Bison will try to use depth as an advantage at linebacker. Seniors Matt Johnson and co-captain Jeff Goyette will add a combined 62 career games of experience off the bench, while sophomore Audrey Dieujuste will try to break into the lineup after coming to Bucknell from Florida highly regarded.

Safety

Bucknell has plenty of experience and talent at its whip safety and free safety positions with First Team All-Patriot Leaguer Matthew Steinbeck and senior two-year starter Ryan Morgan in the mix. Steinbeck joined Byers and Sellers with preseason honors from the CFPA after a season in which he led the Patriot League in interceptions (6) and was tied for second nationally in interceptions per game (.55). He was eighth on the team with 44 tackles and was one of just four Bison defensive players to start all 11 games.

Morgan missed most of spring practice with an injury, but should be good to go in the fall. He has appeared in 32 career games and has 124 tackles and nine tackles for loss while proving to be a hard hitter in the defensive backfield.

Seniors Wayne Stewart and Derek-London Dierkes will provide depth to give the Bison plenty of veteran leadership at those two safety positions.

The strong safety position will be a little younger with sophomores Louis Taglianetti and Clayton Ewell, as well as converted linebacker junior

Dominique Daniels, in the mix for playing time. Ewell earned a lot of playing time in the spring with Taglianetti out with an injury. Both impressed Susan as rookies last fall, while Daniels was named the team's Defensive Scout Team Player of the Year at the conclusion of the 2012 campaign.





The Bison defensive backfield will be loaded with experience this fall. Three seniors and one junior dot the two-deep at cornerback. Combine that with three seniors and a junior on the two-deep at free and whip safety and Susan will have plenty of options this year.

"There is more ability for us to use nickel and dime this year," commented Susan. "We're a built-in nickel with our 4-2-5, but there are more dime packages we're excited about."

Senior co-captain Derrick Palmer is slated to start at one cornerback spot, while classmate Tajh Turner's outstanding spring vaulted him into the projected starting spot on the other side.

A veteran of 30 career games and 20 starts, Palmer has piled up 112 tackles over his first three seasons and

his 12 career pass breakups are the most of any current Bison.

Turner came to Bucknell as a wide receiver and has not appeared in a game since his rookie season, but Susan has seen strong improvement from him and expects a solid senior campaign.

Speedy Sal Vallala and the athletic Jaylen Amaker will provide depth at cornerback. Both have received plenty of playing time on both special teams and defense over the last few years.

Susan is also excited about incoming freshmen Tory Hudgins and Nick O'Brien, who are both approaching 6'0", a solid height for cornerbacks in the Patriot League.

Special Teams

Special teams has been a strength of the Bison throughout Susan's tenure as head coach and 2013 should be no different. The Bison have the best long-snapper in the league, a veteran punter who earned All-Big East honors at Rutgers and one of the top kick returners in the country, highlighting the strength of the special teams group.

Goyette will return for his fourth year as long-snapper. Susan routinely calls him the best long-snapper in the Patriot League and has compared his snapping times to those of players in the NFL.

Sullivan will take over the punting duties from three-year starter Ryan Gutowski, who graduated in May as the program's all-time punting leader. Sullivan was an All-Big East choice in 2010 and will give a different look for most returners since he punts with his left foot. His backup will be senior Sean Cobelli.

The versatile Sullivan will also return to his role as punt returner for a second straight year. Last season he ranked 33rd nationally in punt return average.

"Sully is one of the more reliable players in terms of catching the ball on punts," said Susan. "There is so much variety in punts, so that is a very important skill. We're asking him to do a lot with punting, holding for placements, returning and as a wide receiver. He is a very important part of this team."

Running backs DelMauro and Regan also spent time returning punts

during spring practice.

COACHING STAFF



In his first three years on the Bison sideline, Joe Susan has certainly impacted the culture of the Bucknell program. He has his favorite sayings like "The Ball is the Program", which focuses on limiting and creating turnovers, and certain philosophies like the Thought Box, which symbolizes leaving all off-field distractions away from the field during practices and games. Additionally, Susan strives to recruit strong citizens to Bucknell and mold them into even better people by the time they graduate.

With his efficient coaching style and zest for recruiting, it hasn't taken long for Susan to make an impact at Bucknell. In just his second season at the helm of the Bison, Susan led the Bison to a five-win improvement, equaling the program record.

Susan, who for the first time starting with this fall's incoming class has merit aid scholarships at his disposal, led Bucknell to a 6-5 overall record in 2011, following a 1-10 first year. The five-win gain was among the best in the nation and sets the stage for even better things to come under Susan, a former Bucknell assistant coach.

Bucknell posted a 3-8 mark last fall (2012), but with 16 regular starters and five All-Patriot League players back in the fold, Susan expects to guide another impressive turnaround in the win column.

A veteran of 37 years in the college coaching profession, Susan was named the Bob Odell Head Football Coach at Bucknell University on Jan. 27, 2010.

Susan, 57, is Bucknell's 26th head coach since the program's inception in 1883, and he took over a program that currently ranks 21st all-time in Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) victories with more than 570.

Susan, a 1978 graduate of the University of Delaware, served near-decade-long stints at Bucknell (1981-1990), Princeton (1991-1999) and Rutgers (2001-2009) before becoming the Bison head coach. He has had tenures at both the Football Bowl Subdivision (Rutgers, Memphis) and Football Championship Subdivision (Bucknell, Princeton, Davidson) levels.

A native of South River, N.J., Susan returned to Bucknell from Rutgers, where he spent the previous nine years as an assistant coach on Greg Schiano's staff. Schiano, a three-time letterwinner at Bucknell who was recruited by Susan, played for the Bison teams Susan coached and served as co-captain as a senior in 1987.

"I am thrilled for our student-athletes and football program to be able to welcome Joe Susan and his family back to Bucknell," said Bison director of athletics and recreation John Hardt at the time of Susan's hiring. "His 30-plus years of successful experience in college football have prepared him exceptionally well to lead our program and reestablish the winning traditions of Bison Football. Through his student-focused approach, Joe has demonstrated an ability to recruit and mentor top-notch student-ath-

letes at all levels of college football. Coach Susan has a passion for the sport of football and devotion for the young men he coaches on a daily basis. I know he is eager to get to work, and everyone associated with Bison Athletics is looking forward to welcoming him back to campus."

At Rutgers, Susan spent three years as the offensive line coach before adding tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator to his duties in 2003. As recruiting coordinator, he was integral in securing several highly touted and nationally ranked recruiting classes, including the 2009 group, which was ranked in the top 25 nationally by ESPN.com. His main recruiting areas were Central New Jersey, Western Pennsylvania, Eastern Florida, Delaware and Canada, although he directed Rutgers' national efforts.

Prior to Susan's arrival at Rutgers, the Scarlet Knights had not posted a record above .500 for nearly a decade and had qualified for one bowl game in 131 years of football. In 2009, Rutgers played in its fifth consecutive bowl game and finished 9-4.

Susan directed a deep corps of tight ends during his tenure at Rutgers that included former three-time All-Big East selection Clark Harris, a 2007 seventh-round draft choice of the Green Bay Packers.

Prior to his time at Rutgers, Susan got his first chance as a head coach when spent one year as the frontman at Davidson in 2000. He led the Wildcats to a 10-0 record, the only unbeaten team in school history, and a single-season record for wins. Susan was named the Coach of the Year by the Division I-AA Independents Sports Information Directors Association. Additionally, he received a Presidential Citation from the University of Delaware for outstanding achievement.

At Princeton, Susan served as both the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for nearly a decade. In addition to recruiting duties at the Ivy League institution, he organized and implemented year-round strength and conditioning programs, developed and coordinated the spring football clinic and coordinated travel plans for away games.

Susan's initial tour of duty at Bucknell began in June 1981. From 1981 through 1988 he was in charge of the offensive line and served as strength coach for the Bison under head coaches Bob Curtis and George Landis. When Lou Maranzana was hired as head coach prior to the 1989 campaign, Susan was promoted to assistant head coach while still keeping his duties with the offensive line.

Susan's first foray into the coaching profession came at his alma mater where he was a graduate assistant on two separate occasions, separated by a one-year volunteer stint at Gettysburg.

Susan enjoyed an outstanding playing career at Delaware (1973-76), as his teams compiled a 36-12-1 record in his tenure there. The 1976 Newark Touchdown Club Offensive Lineman of the Year, Susan helped the Blue Hens to two Lambert Cups (1974, 1976) and the NCAA Division II national championship game.

In addition to a bachelor of arts degree in psychology from Delaware, Susan earned his master's in physical education with an emphasis in exercise physiology from his alma mater in 1982.

Off the field, Susan is a member of the American Football Coaches Association, the National Strength and Conditioning Association, the University of Delaware Alumni Association and the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

Susan and his wife, Cindy, have three children: 29-year-old son Matthew, 27-year-old daughter Jessica and 25-year-old daughter Julia.

Rob Odell Endowment



Bucknell trustee emeritus Norman E. Garrity, a member of the Class of 1962, and his wife Mary Lou Roppel Garrity, a member of the Class of 1964, have established the Bob Odell Head Football Coaching Endowment. The Garritys' significant gift to the university permanently endows the head coach position for football, along with providing funds for the program.

Garrity played under Coach Odell, who passed away in December 2012, and was a member of the 1960 team that won the Lambert Cup title as the best team in the Eastern United States. He also served as an assistant football coach during the 1963 season. Garrity has been a member of Bucknell's Board of Trustees since 1995. In 2004 he received the alumni Athlete Achievement Award, given to former Bucknell athletes who have achieved success in their chosen profession. Garrity served in a variety of manufacturing and engineering management positions with Corning Inc. In 2003 he received the Loyalty to Bucknell Award for extraordinary service to Bucknell as a Trustee, member of Reunion Gift committees and volunteer for the Career Development Center. Garrity was also awarded the Bud Ranck Award for his service and devotion to the football program. In addition to the Odell endowment, he funded the Garrity Family Scholarship and the state-of-the-art artificial surface for the football field.

Prior to the 2005 season finale against Holy Cross, the Bucknell football program and Bison Athletics honored Odell's service and friendship to Bucknell with a special monument, which was unveiled in the closed end of Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium.

Odell is a member of the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame and the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. As head football coach from 1958-64, Odell took over a struggling program and compiled a 37-26 record. He led the Bison to college football prominence, winning Lambert Cup titles in 1960 and 1964 while producing five straight winning seasons and a 32-13 record from 1960-64.

An All-American himself as a halfback at Penn, Odell won the Maxwell Trophy and finished second in the Heisman Trophy voting in 1943. He later served as head coach at Penn from 1965-70 and at Williams from 1971-86. His overall coaching record stood at 136-104-5. A second-round draft pick of the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1944, Odell served as a communications officer in the U.S. Navy during World War II before starting his football coaching career. He began as an assistant coach at Yale, then moved on to Temple and Wisconsin. Odell retired to Lewisburg and volunteered his time and football expertise back to the program on the field, in the radio booth and as a loyal supporter of the Bison football squad. And, thanks to the generosity of Norm Garrity, he will forever have his name associated with Bucknell's endowed head coaching position — The Bob Odell Head Football Coach."

A standout defensive lineman and linebacker at Bucknell from 1997 to 2000, Matt Borich is in his fourth year coaching the defensive line at his alma mater. Prior to 2012 spring practice, Borich added duties as the defensive run game coordinator. He was elevated to defensive coordinator in the summer of 2013.

Borich earned three varsity letters, received the Coaches Award for Leadership and was a member of Bucknell's class with the most wins in school history (29) during his time as a Bison. He totaled 62 tackles in 32 career games and graduated in May of 2001 with a degree in economics.

Bryan Bossard will serve as Bucknell's offensive coordinator and will coach the wide receivers for a fourth straight year in 2013.

Like Bison head coach Joe Susan, Bossard is a graduate of Delaware and a former Bucknell assistant, having played for the Blue Hens from 1985-88 and coached the Bison in 1992 and 1993. At Delaware, he was a three-time letterwinner and was voted the team's defensive MVP as a senior, when he was also a second-team all-conference selection and piled up 122 tackles.

Prior to his time at Bucknell, Bossard was on the staffs at Pittsburgh (2008-09) and Maryland (2005-07). At both places, he coached the wide receivers and returners, while also recruiting in the Maryland, Delaware, Virginia and Washington, D.C., areas.

While with the Panthers, Bossard worked under former NFL coach Dave Wannstedt. Bossard had previously worked for Wannstedt in a pair of NFL summer coaching internships with the Chicago Bears in 1996-97. Pittsburgh posted a solid 19-7 record and appeared in a pair of bowl games during Bossard's tenure.

Two receivers Bossard coached were selected in the 2009 NFL Draft. Maryland's Darrius Heyward-Bey was a first-round pick of the Oakland Raiders, while Pittsburgh's Derek Kinder was drafted by the Chicago Bears in the seventh round. Heyward-Bey was a Freshman All-American under Bossard's watch in 2006. A year later he also helped Terps wideout and future NFLer LaQuan Williams earn Freshman All-America accolades.

Prior to his time at Maryland, Bossard spent three years coaching the receivers and returners at his alma mater. He helped lead the Blue Hens to the 2003 Division I-AA national title with a 15-1 mark. During that championship season, Delaware had three different receivers catch 50 passes or more. Bossard was also a member of the Blue Hens' coaching staff from 1994-98 in the same capacity, helping Delaware to three consecutive national semifinal appearances.

Bossard broke into the collegiate coaching ranks as a graduate assistant at Delaware. He then coached defensive backs at Morehouse College (1991) and West Chester University (spring 1992), before arriving at Bucknell for a two-year stint in Lewisburg, where he worked with the defensive backs and returners.

In 1999, Bossard coached the receivers at Army before moving on to a defensive back coaching position at Wyoming during the 2000 and 2001

- Bucknell won its season opener for the fifth time in the last seven years.
- A 36-yard field goal by Sean Cobelli with 4:50 to play in the fourth quarter proved to be the winning points for Bucknell. The field goal capped a 14-play, 65-yard drive that took 7:29 off the clock.
- Bucknell had to recover an onside kick in the final minute to seal the victory. Victor Walker landed on the kick.
- Bison QB Brandon Wesley was 20-for-27 passing for 190 yards. It was his fourth career game with

at least 20 completions.

- Bucknell's offensive line consisted of four first-time starters who had never before been on the field during a regulation game. The line yielded just one sack and helped the Bison register 332 yards of total offense, a figure that was higher than all but two games in 2011.
- The string of close games in the Bucknell-Marist series continued. With the final two-point margin, the five most recent Bison-Red Foxes matchups have been decided by 32 points.
- Bucknell held Marist under 20 points for the eighth time in eight all-time meetings.
- Wesley and Marist QB Chuckie Looney were a combined 14-for-15 for 130 yards in the first quarter.



- Bucknell lost its Patriot League opener for the first time since 2007.
- Bison QB Brandon Wesley registered the thirdhighest passing day of his career (239 yards), and his highest against an opponent other than Cornell. He also equaled his career high with 76 rushing yards, posted a career-long 45-yard rush, passed for a touchdown and rushed for another.
- Donald Quarles recorded a career-high five pass breakups, equaling the most by an FCS player in the first four weeks of the season. Quarles was the first Bison since 2000 with five pass breakups.
- Bucknell outgained Lafayette 223-128 in the second half. The Bison piled up 10 of their 14 first downs after intermission.
- Lafayette, which had seven interceptions the week before vs. Penn, won the turnover battle, 3-0. It broke a string of 15 straight games forcing a turnover for the Bison.

NOTES

- Bucknell won two of its final three games to post a winning record in November for the first time since 2004.
- Bucknell placed seven players on the All-Patriot League Teams. Junior FB Travis Friend, senior DE Samuel Oyekoya and sophomore S Matthew Steinbeck were named to the first team, while junior DE Sean Sellers, junior DL Tracey Smith, senior LB Beau Traber and sophomore LB Evan Byers landed on the second team.
- Junior QB Brandon Wesley broke the Bucknell career records for pass completions (461) and pass attempts (806). He finished the season second in program history in passing yards (4,926) and total offense (5,401). Wesley has started 32 consecutive games at quarterback. He completed 174 of 289 passes for 1,781 yards in 2012 as he became the third player in program history to post three consecutive 1,000-yard passing seasons.
- Sophomore S Matthew Steinbeck finished the season tied for second nationally in interceptions (6). He is one of only three Bison since 2000 to have at least six picks in a season and he is also one of three Bucknell players in the last 15 years with interceptions in four consecutive games.
- Sophomore LB Evan Byers recorded a team-high 100 tackles this year to rank fifth in the Patriot League. He became the first Bison since 2009, and just the fifth since 2000, to reach 100 tackles in a season. He led the team in tackles seven times last fall and posted at least six stops in every contest.
- Bucknell finished 2012 ranked in the top 10 in the nation in rushing defense for a second straight year. In 2011, the Bison were third nationally, while the 2012 squad was seventh in the country.
- Entering their contest against Bucknell, Bison opponents were 34-22 in 2012. Ten of the 11 opponents entered their game against Bucknell having won at least one game in a row.
- Senior DE Samuel Oyekoya was one of 147 semifinalists nationwide for the Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman". A three-time Patriot League Academic Honor Roll member and member of the Academic All-Patriot League Team, Oyekoya graduated with a 3.21 cumulative gradepoint average while majoring in economics and political science.
- Bucknell faced three nationally ranked opponents last year (No. 13 Delaware, No. 21 Harvard, No. 7 Lehigh).
- Seven of Bucknell's 11 games were decided by a touchdown or less.

- Bucknell's 33 sacks were its most since accumulating 33 in 2000.
- Bucknell broke the program record for consecutive games scoring last season. The Bison have scored points in 75 straight games (old record: 72 games from 1996 to 2002). The streak remains alive entering the 2013 campaign.

PATRIOT LEAGU

Now in its third decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 24 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Boston University, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh, Loyola (Md.) and Navy as full members, and Fordham, Georgetown and MIT as associate members. Boston University and Loyola University Maryland join the Patriot League beginning with the 2013-14 season. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. The League also had 80 percent of its teams posting an APR score of 985 or higher in the most recent data, and 71 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports.

The Patriot League's mission is simple: to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2012-13 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams accomplished the following:

- The Patriot League ranked second among all conferences in multi-year APR rating, and led all leagues in men's basketball and baseball APR.
- 71 Patriot League teams, and 74 from full-member institutions, received NCAA Public Recognition Awards for finishing in the top 10 percent of their sport in APR data.
- 86 Patriot League teams, and 96 overall from full League members, recorded perfect graduation success rates.
- All eight Patriot League schools scored above 85 percent in graduation success rates.
- Bucknell won the Patriot League Presidents' Cup by 0.5 points over Navy in the closest-ever finish for the title. The Bison won the overall crown for the 18th time and seventh in the last eight seasons
- Lehigh repeated as the top men's program in the Presidents' Cup standings, while Navy once again led the way on the women's side.
- Six Patriot League student-athletes were awarded NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships: Navy's Chris Galvin (Track and Field), Laura Gorinski (Swimming and Diving), Brigid Byrne (Track and Field) and Jasmine DePompeo (Women's Lacrosse), Fordham's Patrick Murray (Football) and Bucknell's Christian Treat (Swimming and Diving).
- Army's Brendan Buckley won the Senior CLASS Award in men's lacrosse as well as the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year honor for men's at-large sports.
- Finalists for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Brendan Buckley (Army), Peter Baum (Colgate) and Mike Huffner (Bucknell), Men's Lacrosse; C.J. McCollum (Lehigh) and Mike Muscala (Bucknell), Men's Basketball; Chris Rowley (Army), Baseball.
- 11 student-athletes earned Capital One Academic All-America recognition, including first-team selections for Navy's Jasmine DePompeo

(Women's At-Large), Colgate's Chris Looney (Football) and Army's Brendan Buckley (Men's At-Large)

- 43 student-athletes received Capital One/ CoSIDA Academic All-District first-team recognition.
- Navy's Laura Gorinski (Women's Swimming) and Army's Ariana Mankus (Volleyball) were the Patriot League nominees for the NCAA Woman of the Year award.
- Bucknell's Mike Muscala earned multiple postseason All-America honors in men's basketball and played in the NABC All-Star Game.
- Colgate women's basketball senior Rebekah Ward earned a Watson Fellowship to study abroad for a year.
- Bucknell's Leonard Joseph and Navy's Zack Duncavage each earned second-team All-America ca honors at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.
- Fordham's Patrick Murray was named a consensus FCS All-American and won the Fred Mitchell Award as the top placekicker in the nation outside of the Football Bowl Subdivision.
- Georgetown's Robert McCabe and Colgate's Gavin McCarney each finished in the top five in the voting for the FCS Player of the Year awards and were named All-Americans by multiple outlets.
- McCabe was also named the ECAC FCS Defensive Player of the Year, and was one of three Patriot Leaguers to sign NFL free agent contracts along with Lehigh's Ryan Spadola and Billy Boyko.
- Holy Cross' Mike Ahmed was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 20th Round of the Major League Baseball Draft, while teammate Alex Maldonado and Army's Chris Rowley later signed free agent contracts with the Toronto Blue Jays.
- Colgate's Peter Baum, Lehigh's David DiMaria and Army's John Glesener were all Tewaaraton candidates in men's lacrosse.
- Baum was taken with the top overall pick in the Major League Lacrosse Draft by the Ohio Machine, leading a list of seven Patriot Leaguers chosen by MLL teams.
- Navy's Jasmine DePompeo was up for the Tewaaraton award in women's lacrosse, and became the first Patriot Leaguer since 1997 to be named an All-American by the IWLCA.
- Navy became the first Patriot League team to win an NCAA Women's Lacrosse Tournament game when it beat Monmouth in the first round.

Presidents' Cup

The Presidents' Cup signifies overall excellence in the 24 sports sponsored by the Patriot League, and Bucknell has won the Cup 18 times in its 23-year existence, including 14 of the last 16 years.

The Presidents' Cup is awarded annually to the institution that accumulates the highest point total over the entire academic year, with points awarded on the basis of the school's finish in each of the 24 Patriot League sports. If there is a league tournament in a sport, the points are awarded based on the average of the regular season and tournament finish, and if there is no post-season tournament, points are awarded based on regular-season standings.

Histor

Bucknell Football: More Than a Century of Tradition

The game bore little resemblance to what we now know as football, and even one of the school names has been changed. In November of 1883, a group of students from Lafayette College journeyed west to play a group from the University at Lewisburg in the relatively new sport of football. The sport was so new, in fact, that the majority of the dozen or so students from Lewisburg, who did not have a coach and had practiced only briefly, had never seen a game of football before playing in one.

The players from Lewisburg, whose school would be renamed Bucknell University in 1886, lost that first game, 59-0, and perhaps because of that experience, their school did not play another official game until 1887.

Still, the seeds had been planted for a program that would grow into one of the most respected programs in the East by the 1950s, and will celebrate its 128th season in 2013.

Scores of marvelous players have donned the Orange and Blue over the course of the 127 seasons of Bucknell football, and each season gives rise to new names, new heroes, new legends.

Here is a quick trip through the colorful tradition that is Bucknell football:

1891

Still playing without a full-time coach, Bucknell gains its first victory ever with a 16-10 triumph over Lafayette. The Bison also defeat Cornell (4-0) and Penn State (12-10) on their way to a 6-2-1 record. The team includes Andrew Wyant, who later goes on to play for the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagg at the University of Chicago and is a member of both the Bucknell Hall of Fame and the National Football Hall of Fame.

1900

Christy Mathewson concludes his marvelous Bucknell football career and begins a professional baseball career that ranks among the best of all time. A hard-running fullback and tackler, "Matty" also excels as a kicker and gains national attention with two field goals against Army.

1918

Bucknell records the first of its three undefeated seasons. En route to a 6-0 record, the Bison are nothing short of dominant, outscoring opponents 236-7. The season ushers in a quarter-century of prosperity, as Bucknell enjoys 24 winning seasons in the next 26 years.


1924

The team sets a then-school record for victories with an 8-2 mark and meets

Lafayette on October 18 in the first football game ever played in Memorial Stadium. Wally Foster, the captain of that Bucknell team, scores the first points in stadium history.

1931

Led by future NFL Hall of Famer Clarke Hinkle, Bucknell rolls to an unbeaten 6-0-3 record. The Bison's undefeated mark is tested in the final game of the season, against also-unbeaten Fordham, but the Bison prevail, 14-13, in a classic at the Polo Grounds.




1934

Edward (Hook) Mylin leads the Bison to a 6-2-2 regular-season record and a berth in the first Orange Bowl game, on January 1, 1935. After a two-day train trip to Miami for the game, Bucknell hammers the University of Miami, 26-0.

1951

In the midst of a four-year stretch in which Bucknell goes 27-8, head coach Harry Lawrence and his team finish perfect at 9-0, perhaps the finest season in school history. The defense includes Little All-America defensive tackle George Young (long-time general manager of the New York Giants), while the relentless offense averages 463.3 yards per game. That breaks the Eastern record set in 1945 by a Davis- and Blanchard-led Army team.

After opening the season at 2-2, Bucknell rolls past Lafayette, Lehigh, Colgate, Temple and Delaware — by a combined score of 107-14 — to finish 7-2 and win its first-ever Lambert Cup. Quarterback Paul Terhes earns Little All-America honors.

1964

Just four years after leading Bucknell to its first Lambert Cup title, head coach Bob Odell repeats that feat, as the Bison finish 7-2. After opening the season with a loss, Bucknell wins seven of the next eight games, including a 21-14 season-ending win at Delaware. The Bison squad features Little All-America end Tom Mitchell, who would later enjoy a fine pro career with Baltimore and San Francisco.

1968

Sam Havrilak sets a Bucknell single-game total offense record with 397 yards against Colgate, a mark that still stands. Havrilak, who would graduate with every Bucknell total offense record, later played with Tom Mitchell for the Baltimore Colts.



1978

Ken Jenkins arrives at Bucknell, and over the next four years, develops into one of the finest players in Bucknell history. He would set a school record with 1,270 rushing yards in 1980, and he later played with three NFL teams.

1986

Two years after formation of the league is announced, the Colonial League (later renamed the Patriot League) debuts with six members — Bucknell, Colgate, Lehigh, Lafayette, Holy Cross and Davidson. The Bison's first-ever league game is one for the ages. Trailing Colgate in the fourth quarter, 39-25, Bucknell rallies to take a 40-39 lead with 52 seconds left, but the Red Raiders drive for a game-winning field goal attempt with four seconds left. After a bobbled snap from center, Colgate completes an impromptu pass play that nearly goes for a touchdown, but Bison defensive back Robert Hawkins drags down the receiver at the 9-yard line on the final play of the game.

1989

Bucknell's newly-renovated stadium is rededicated in honor of Christy Mathewson. Much like the stadium's namesake, Bucknell opens play in the "new" facility with a victory, handing Dartmouth a 36-20 setback on September 30.

1995

The Tom Gadd tenure begins at Bucknell, and the Bison finish 7-4. Rich Lemon becomes Bucknell's all-time rushing leader on opening day.

1996

Fittingly, Rich Lemon concludes his remarkable career with a Patriot League title, as Bucknell outlasts Colgate, 28-27, in the heart-stopping season finale. The win gives Bucknell its first football title in over 30 years. Lemon graduated with 4,742 rushing yards, nearly 2,100 more than the previous record-holder.



1997

The Bison roll out to a 10-0 record before falling to Colgate in their season finale to finish 10-1. The 10 wins were the most in school history, and many came in thrilling fashion, as the Bison won seven times by seven points or less.

2001

Bucknell celebrates its seventh straight winning season, a first in Bison annals.

2003

After the legendary Tom Gadd loses a long battle with brain cancer, Bucknell turns to Tim Landis as its 25th head coach. Landis quickly resores the good fortunes of the Bison football program. After a 2-9/0-7 season in 2002, Bucknell finishes 6-6/4-3 in one of the nation's best one-season turnarounds.

2004

Bucknell wins its final four games of the season for the first time since 1975 to claim its first winning season since 2001 with a 7-4 record.

2006

Bucknell finishes with a 6-5 record and posts a five-game improvement from 2005, equaling the largest jump in program history.

2010

On Jan. 27, Joe Susan is introduced as the 26th head coach in Bucknell history.

2011

In its second year under Susan, Bucknell equals the school record with a five-win improvement from 2010. The Bison posted a 6-5 overall mark one year after going 1-10. Highlighting the campaign was an impressive ability to force turnovers. Bucknell finished first nationally in turnover margin (+2.45) and DB Bryce Robertson led the country in interceptions with 13, breaking both the program and Patriot League standards.

The Top 10:

A Look at the Top 10 Most Significant Bucknell Football Games Ever Played... And the One That Wasn't

Stephen Taylor wasn't able to observe a football team practicing as he made his way to Harrisburg early in 1846 with the proposed charter for the fledgling University at Lewisburg, but even before the name of the school was changed in recognition of benefactor William Bucknell, the sport had been introduced on campus and gained some popularity.

Today, the sport is a fixture on fall Saturdays, and its history is prominent in any accounting of Bucknell's athletic heritage. The Bison gridiron story (did you know that the word "gridiron" derives from the manner in which the field was formerly marked?) includes many notable games, and we could probably argue for the next 150 years as to which were the most significant.

Before designating the 10 most significant games, please permit a look back at some of the more noteworthy games played by Bucknell football teams.

In 1881, a group of students from Bucknell and State College (as Penn State was known in those days) played a game of football which, at one time, was recognized as the first contest in the sport by either school, though now both schools say that it was only an informal meeting.

Bucknell's first official football game came against Lafayette on Thanksgiving Day, 1883, but a lack of student interest following that initial venture curtailed play for four years. In 1887, the sport returned to stay as Bucknell played its first two official games with Penn State.

Within another four years, Bucknell was playing regular schedules, and by 1895, the university had its first head coach.

The 1900 team finished 4-4-1, but gained national attention in an 18-10 loss to West Point. All the scoring for Bucknell came on two field goals by a hard-running fullback named Christy Mathewson.

The New York writers covering the game spread the word about this talented athlete, whose 48-yard field goal in that game was the longest in the country that year. Mathewson, who went on to become one of the nation's most admired athletes as a pitcher for the New York Giants, liked football more than baseball, and if the National Football League had existed at the time, it is probable that baseball would have been deprived of one of its greatest and most famous players.

Bucknell originally played football on Loomis Field, now home of the University's Gateway residences. In 1924, the Bison moved into what is now Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium, and christened the new field against Lafayette before a crowd of 15,000. Lafayette won the contest, 21-3, despite a 43-yard field goal

by Bison captain Wally Foster to open the scoring.

Late that year, Bucknell beat Navy, 6-0, and Rutgers, 12-7, to highlight the first of three seasons in which Bucknell was coached by "Uncle Charlie" Moran, who had led Centre College's "Praying Colonels" to a memorable upset of Harvard. The Bison finished 8-2 in 1924, which represented the most victories ever by a Bucknell team.

Moran's 1925 team visited President Calvin Coolidge in the White House while in Wash-



ington to play Georgetown, and the Bison were rolling along at 6-2-1 when they played at the University of Detroit on Thanksgiving Day. The Bison won that game, 7-0, but the flamboyant coach also had scheduled a game at Dayton two days later. The travel and two games in three days were too much, and the weary Bison dropped a 19-0 decision.

This was not the first time Bucknell encountered scheduling difficulties. The 1891 team, led by Hall of Famers Andrew Wyant and "Warhorse" Allen, opened the season with a 16-10 victory at Lafayette, but then had to play Lehigh the following day and suffered a 62-4 beating.

Future College Football Hall of Famer Carl Snavely made his debut as Bucknell coach in 1927, and promptly posted a 13-7 win over Penn State, the Bison's first win ever in State College. His teams went on to beat the Nittany Lions for the next three years, and then the future Big Ten power dropped Bucknell from its schedule for three years.

Times do change.

In 1929, Bucknell completed its second 8-2 season in history with a 78-0 win over Dickinson. In that game, future college and professional Hall of Famer Clarke Hinkle scored 50 points, still a Bucknell record.

A 7-6 loss to Temple on Oct. 10, 1930 was noteworthy, for it was the first regularly-scheduled night football game ever.

Bucknell went 6-0-3 in 1931 for its second of three undefeated seasons, and the record included season-ending wins over two of the powers of the day, Washington & Jefferson (10-6) and Fordham (14-13). The latter was played before a large crowd at the Polo Grounds, where Christy Mathewson had gained fame for the New York Giants.

Edward "Hook" Mylin arrived on the scene in 1934 and led Bucknell to a 7-2-2 record that included a 13-7 win over Penn State and a 26-0 rout of Miami in the Orange Bowl.

In 1938, the second season under Al Humphreys, the Bison won at Penn State, 14-0. It was the last time that Bucknell would defeat the Nittany Lions, who rose to national prominence following the end of World War II.


In 1949, Bucknell finished 6-2, and both losses (to Temple and Gettysburg) were by one point. Gettysburg scored the winning TD in its 34-33 win in the final 40 seconds.

Bucknell closed out the 1950 season with four straight wins, which set the stage for the 1951 campaign, in which the Bison rolled to a 9-0 mark. The perfect season concluded with a 21-20 win at Colgate and a 33-6 trouncing of Delaware in Memorial Stadium that led to a more than mild celebration on campus.


The 1951 team boasted several All-East and Little All-America players, and the Associated Press poll released on Nov. 20 listed Bucknell at No. 20 in the nation.

In 1954, BU beat Lehigh, 48-46, in a wild affair that produced the highest losing score ever by a Bison opponent.

One of the great eras in Bucknell football began in 1958 with the arrival of

Bob Odell, and after a 1-8 mark in that first season, Odell led Bucknell to a 15-8 Homecoming win over Rutgers in 1959. The following year, a shutout of Delaware capped a 7-2 season and earned the first of two Lambert Cups for Odell's teams. The Bison reclaimed Eastern supremacy in 1964, winning the Lambert Cup with a 7-2 mark.

Bucknell won the Middle Atlantic Conference title in 1965 with a 26-14 win over Delaware, and closed the season with a 22-14 win over Davidson. In that game, All-America Tom Mitchell was chasing the national

record for career receiving, and coach Carroll Huntress and his staff devised a formation designed to hit Mitchell with short passes while he was in the backfield. On the second attempt, a bad snap from center led to a big loss, and attempts at the record were abandoned.

Mitch Farbstein, a member of the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, was captured in the pages of *Life* after he led Bucknell to a 14-13 win over Gettysburg in 1971. That same year, the bruising fullback scored five touchdowns in a 33-0 win over Lafayette.

A 39-yard field goal by Al Yuknus with 20 seconds left gave Bucknell a 19-17 win at Dayton in the 1982 season opener, the Bison's first visit to the southern Ohio city since "Uncle Charlie" tried to win two games in three days in 1925. The game was also one of the hottest in Bucknell annals, as gametime temperature on the artificial surface was 112 degrees.

In 1987, back-to-back home games with Holy Cross (a 48-10 loss) and Columbia (a 62-20 win) brought the national news media to Lewisburg in droves.

The media came first to chronicle the Frank Merriwell-like heroics of the Crusaders' Gordie Lockbaum, and then returned the next week as Columbia attempted to escape its collegiate-record losing streak.

The Lions attempted an onside kick on the opening kickoff, but that failed, and Bucknell led 28-0 by the end of the first quarter and the Lions went on to their 37th straight loss.

Lou Maranzana's first season as head coach in 1989 included a very special afternoon, as the Bison's home stadium was rededicated to the memory of Christy Mathewson. Matty would have been proud, as the Bison that day beat Dartmouth, Maranzana's alma mater, 36-20.

The Tom Gadd era began in 1995, and the 7-4 record included a dramatic 21-14 win at Colgate in the first overtime game in Bucknell history.

The drama of that contest, though, paled in comparison to the Bucknell-Colgate

Did You Know?

- Bucknell played George Washington at home on Oct. 10, 1925, the day Christy Mathewson was buried in Lewisburg. In his memory, there was no cheering in the first quarter.
- Penn State dropped Bucknell from its football schedule for three years. It happened after the Bison beat the Nittany Lions three straight times between 1927-30.
- The 1935 Orange Bowl game between Bucknell and Miami featured the first-ever college football photograph transmitted over the wire by the Associated Press.

game in 1996, as the Bison and Red Raiders again played into overtime, this time with the Patriot League title on the line. In a game that will be long remembered by all in attendance, Bucknell battled to a 28-27 win when a Colgate two-point conversion pass in overtime was batted down by Brandon Little, who would later earn All-America honors.

Bucknell built on its

championship season by winning its first 10 games the following fall and compiling a 12-game winning streak, the second longest in school history. In the process of posting more wins than any other Bison team, Coach Gadd's charges were nationally ranked and led the Patriot League in total defense for the third straight year. However, the memorable season and win streak came to an end with a 48-14 loss at Colgate in a game that again decided the Patriot League crown.

The Bison continued their winning ways in 1999, turning in their

fifth straight winning season with a 7-4 record behind an offense that scored 320 points — the third-highest single-season total in school history. Quarterback Don McDowell turned in one of his career-best performances to lead the Orange and Blue to a 21-16 victory at nationally ranked Colgate, while Jabu Powell stepped in at running back and led the Bison to their first win at Penn's Franklin Field (23-16) in over 30 years.

In 2001 the Bison made it seven straight winning seasons — a first in the history of the program — while playing on their new state-of-the-art FieldTurf.

With their football fortunes reaching heights never before seen, the Bison were dealt a devastating blow when Gadd had to step aside in 2002 to battle brain cancer. He lost that battle in March 2003. Gadd tied the BU record for career coaching victories with 48, achieving that figure faster than any of his predecessors.

Tim Landis succeeded Gadd in 2003, and quickly restored Bucknell's recent tradition as a Patriot League contender. The Bison finished in third place with a 4-3 league record, just one year after finishing 0-7. In his second season the Bison improved to 7-4 and were 4-2 in the Patriot League to record their second consecutive third-place finish.

In 2006, Landis helped orchestrate an impressive turnaround as the Bison equaled the program record by posting a five-win improvement from the year before. Bucknell finished with a record of at least .500 for the third time in Landis' tenure as it alternated wins and losses the entire season for a 6-5 mark.

The final game of the 2007 season, an impressive 38-24 win over Patriot League champion Fordham, served as a springboard toward an improved 2008 campaign for the Bison, who finished 5-6, a two-win improvement over the previous season.

Former Bucknell assistant coach (1981-90) Joe Susan took over the Bison in 2010 and is in the process of returning the team to the top of the Patriot League as he enters his fourth season on the Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium sideline. In 2011, he led Bucknell to a 6-5 record, a school record-tying five-win improvement from the previous fall.

On the following pages are the 10 most significant Bucknell football games ever played, compiled in chronological order. There are certainly many more games that deserve consideration, but we had to make some tough choices. Let the friendly arguments begin.

Lafayette 59, Bucknell 0 (November 30, 1983)

Certainly not a score for Bucknell followers to remember, but the game is historic because it was the first one. A brief excerpt from an account of the game indicates that the style of both play and writing have changed over the years:

"...At this point the time for the first inning was up, and a breathing spell of fifteen minutes was given. At the beginning of the second inning, the University team came up somewhat discouraged, but nevertheless determined to make the other side work for whatever they might secure.

"They now used several of Lafayette's tricks with good result, and showed that it was but want of skill and practice that they had worked so disastrously in the first part of the game. For a full fifteen minutes, the ball was carried about the field without either side gaining a single point."

Bucknell 12, Rutgers 7 (November 22, 1924)


The win gave tremendous recognition to the Bucknell football program. Playing at Franklin Field in Philadelphia, 'Mose' Wilbach scored both touchdowns for the Bison. Rutgers had gone into the contest undefeated.

Bucknell 14, Fordham 13 (November 21, 1931)

The game, played at the Polo Grounds, capped an undefeated (6-0-3) season and ended the brilliant Bucknell career of Clarke Hinkle, regarded by many as the finest Bucknell player ever.

Fordham also entered the game undefeated, and the contest was covered extensively by the New York media, bringing national attention to Bucknell and its football program.

The game, though, was marred by tragedy; Fordham's Connie Murphy died from injuries sustained in the game.

Bucknell 26, Miami 0 (January 1, 1935)

The very first Orange Bowl Game, this contest is probably the most written-about game in Bucknell history. The Bison's appearance in the game — which was no doubt aided by tireless efforts of publicity director Art Brandon — continues to bring widespread national publicity to Bucknell each January 1.

The game showcased the coaching talents of "Hook" Mylin, and the first AP photo ever transmitted from a college football game came from this contest.

As for the halftime show, which has become a staple of current Orange Bowl games, a newspaper account indicates that, "between the halves, the University of Miami band paraded around the field, followed by a truck carrying several University coeds in an orange-colored bowl. The young ladies threw oranges and tangerines, with more or less accuracy, among the spectators."

Bucknell 21, Colgate 20 (November 10, 1951)

Every victory in 1951 was necessary for the undefeated season, but this win came in the next-to-last game, on the road, and was one of only two games all year decided by seven points or less. It was also Bucknell's only win over Colgate in the 1950s; the Red Raiders ended BU's record 17-game winning streak in 1952.

Bucknell 26, Delaware 0 (November 19, 1960)


This was the fourth shutout in nine games for a terrific defensive team, and precipitated 24 hours of furious campaigning that led to Bucknell's first-ever Lambert Cup.

The win also came on the heels of eight straight losses to Delaware, and clinched first team Little All-America honors and other awards for quarterback Paul Terhes.

Bucknell 24, Harvard 21 (October 3, 1964)

The Bison ended 73 years of frustration against the Ivy League, and the large number of Boston media in attendance were in high praise of Bucknell. The win also provided the impetus for two other three-point wins and Bucknell's second Lambert Cup in four years.

The contest also started Tom Mitchell en route to the first of two straight Little All-America and Eastern small college Player of the Year campaigns.





Bucknell 26, Delaware 14 (November 20, 1965)

The victory clinched the Middle Atlantic Conference title, which was — until 1996 — the Bison's only football conference championship ever. The game also closed the curtain on one of the finest careers in Memorial Stadium history, as Tom Mitchell played his final home game.


Bucknell 28, Umass 15 (November 4, 1972)



Bucknell 41, Colgate 7 (November 11, 1972)

These games have been combined into one for this list, as they were the final two home games of coach Fred Prender's first year, and resulted in two big upsets.

UMass had entered the game undefeated (6-0), but Mitch Farbstein and Bob Langan each ran for two touchdowns as the Bison beat the Minutemen.



The next week, Bucknell faced a Colgate team that stood 4-2-1, and had hammered Bucknell, 47-24, the year before. Farbstein was unstoppable, rushing for 192 yards and a touchdown as the Bison routed the rivals from the Chenango Valley.

Student enthusiasm has been unsurpassed since that time, and the goal posts came down after both games.

Bucknell 28, Colgate 27 (November 23, 1996)

Bucknell and Colgate met in Lewisburg with the Patriot League championship at stake, and the Bison won their first football league title in 31 years in dramatic fashion, as Brandon Little broke up a Colgate two-point conversion try in overtime.

Bucknell had lost an early 14-0 lead, and trailed 21-14 before Jim Fox engineered a remarkable 99-yard scoring drive midway through the fourth quarter, tying the game at 21-21 and forcing overtime.

Bucknell scored first in overtime, with Fox throwing his fourth touchdown pass of the game. Colgate answered, and then opted for a two-point conversion rather than a kick that would have forced a second overtime. With the league title riding on a single play, Colgate quarterback Ryan Vena rolled right and threw into the end zone, but Little batted the pass down, and bedlam ensued.

The game also was the final Bucknell contest for record-setting running back Rich Lemon.




Honorable Mention: Bucknell ?, Delaware ? (November 23, 1963)

The list above was restricted to games that were actually played. A game that was never played, however, also deserves mention.

On Nov. 22, 1963, the nation was shocked and paralyzed by the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The Bucknell campus mourned with the rest of the world, and the football game scheduled at home the next day with the University of Delaware was postponed.

Bucknell had won three of its first five games before stumbling in a 14-13 loss to Lafayette. However, victories over Temple, Colgate and Lehigh brought the Bison to 6-3 going into the Delaware game.

A victory would give Bucknell a tie with Delaware for the Middle Atlantic Conference University Division championship. The Blue Hens were 8-0



overall and ranked first in the national small college polls conducted by both the Associated Press and United Press International.

Interest in the game was at an all-time high on campus, in Lewisburg and the surrounding area, and the media almost certainly would have overflowed Memorial Stadium's press facilities. A sellout was a distinct possibility.

And then the shots rang out in Dealey Plaza. We watched a president take the oath of office on an airplane. We cried. We saw Jack Ruby make a shambles of any pretense of security. We cried again as a young boy saluted his father and the funeral procession moved slowly down Pennsylvania Avenue. We talked about what had happened and tried to get back to some semblance of "normal."

That included trying to reschedule the football game for the following weekend (Delaware said no), Thanksgiving Day (Delaware said no), or at a neutral site (Delaware said no).

The game that might have brought Bucknell its first conference crown and one of the largest home crowds in history was never played.

Delaware finished the season undefeated with its 8-0 record. UPI kept the Blue Hens at the top of their poll and awarded them a national championship plaque. AP, though, asked questions about why the game wasn't played, and learning of the Blue Hens' intransigence, dropped Delaware to second in its final ranking.

The game would be the last Bison contest to be canceled until 2001, when the September 11 tragedy again brought a halt to the sports world, including the Bucknell-Cornell football game.

George Young (1930-2001)

George Young, noted National Football League executive and former Bison football star, passed away in December 2001 at the age of 71. Young earned Little All-America honors in 1951 on the Bison team that went 9-0, the last Bucknell team to finish a season undefeated.

A 1952 BU graduate, Young played in the Blue-Gray All-Star Game and then one season with the Dallas Texans before breaking into the front office ranks with the Baltimore Colts in 1968. He held several positions in that organization before moving to the Miami Dolphins as director of personnel and pro scouting in 1974. Young was named general manager of the Giants in 1979, serving 19 years with

Young was named general manager of the Giants in 1979, serving 19 years with that organization and helping it to Super Bowl titles following the 1986 and 1990 seasons. The winner of the NFL's Executive of the Year Award an unprecedented five times, Young was named Senior Vice President of Football Operations for the NFL in 1998.

Young was inducted into the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame in 1980.



On December 22, 1994 Tom Gadd was introduced as Bucknell's new head football coach. Raised in California, Gadd was highly regarded in college football circles as a defensive guru, although he was hardly a household name among Bucknell followers in Lewisburg, Pa. It did not take him long to make his presence felt.

Taking over a program that had enjoyed only one winning season in its previous 14, Gadd quickly instilled a winning spirit back into Bison Football, and he re-connected with the alumni, involving them in every step of the program. An inspiring presence not only in the locker room, but all across campus and in the surrounding communities, Gadd never had a losing season at Bucknell. The no-name from the other coast became one of the most beloved coaches in Bucknell annals, and he led the Bison football program to its most glorious seven-year stretch ever. On March 1, 2003, Tom Gadd passed away after a two-year fight with brain cancer. While the disease robbed Bucknell of a legend and a friend, his legacy will long carry on.

The Tom Gadd Era (1995-2001)

In seven years under Tom Gadd, Bucknell ...

- Enjoyed seven straight winning seasons, the only time in the 120-year history of the program it's ever happened.
- Won 48 games, lifting Gadd into a tie for first on Bucknell's all-time list of winning coaches. He achieved that mark faster than any other coach.
- Won 73.7 percent of its home games. Bucknell went 28-10 at home under Gadd.
- Placed a total of 97 players on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll, more than any other team.
- Captured only the second conference championship in program history, and the first since 1965. Bucknell won the Patriot League title in 1996.
- Established school records for most wins in a season and in a sevenyear period. The Bison enjoyed their first 10-win season in 1997.







Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium Monuments





HALL OF FAME

Gene Depew '71 first made his mark on the gridiron for the Bison football team, and then for another 31 years as Bucknell's head baseball coach. Molly Creamer '03 scored almost 2,500 points and is generally considered the finest women's basketball player in program history. Ian Joseph '01 still holds six Bucknell baseball records. Becki Marshall '02 finished first at the Patriot League Cross Country Championship three years in a row. Jen Zimmerman '00 was a two-time Regional All-American in field hockey. These outstanding alumni represent the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2013 and will be formally inducted on Homecoming Weekend this fall.

The 35th Hall of Fame class will be inducted at a dinner ceremony on Friday, Oct. 25 as part of Homecoming Weekend festivities. The new Hall of Famers will also be re-introduced at halftime of the Bucknell-Lehigh football game on Saturday, Oct. 26.

The Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1979 to honor the very best in the history of Bison athletics. This year's induction brings to 234 the number of outstanding student-athletes, coaches, administrators and friends of Bucknell whose contributions to Bucknell athletics are forever preserved in the Hall of Fame.

GENE DEPEW '71 retired following the 2012 baseball season after coaching at his alma mater for more than 40 years, including the final 31 as head baseball coach. One of the longest-tenured coaches in Bucknell history in any sport, Depew won 591 games, more than five times the amount of any other Bison baseball coach. The Bison were especially successful over his last 17 years, finishing either first or second in the Patriot League eight times, including six regular-season titles and five Patriot League Tournament crowns. Depew guided Bucknell to five NCAA Tournament appearances over that span, highlighted by a memorable 7-0 victory over fourth-ranked Florida State in 2008.

As an undergraduate, Depew was a standout football player for the Bison. He was a three-year letterwinner, earned All-Middle Atlantic Conference Honorable Mention in 1969, and served as co-captain of the team his senior year. Following graduation, Depew returned



to Bucknell to coach the defensive line, and he would remain an assistant football coach until 1992. He was first introduced to the baseball program in 1974, when he was hired as an assistant coach under Hall-of-Famer Tommy Thompson. Prior to the 1982 baseball season, Depew was chosen to succeed Thompson as head baseball coach. He won the Patriot League Coach of the Year award four times (1993, 1996, 2003, 2009), had four Patriot League Pitchers of the Year, four Players of the Year and two Rookies of the Year.

MOLLY CREAMER '03 has been elected to the Hall of Fame in her first year of eligibility (candidates become eligible 10 years after graduation), and she was a unanimous choice among the voting committee. Her career records show why. Many consider Creamer to be the premier player in Bucknell and Patriot League women's basketball history. She was a three-time Patriot League Player of the Year and three-time PL scoring leader. Following her senior campaign in which she averaged a whopping 27.1 points per game, Creamer was picked as a Kodak/WBCA and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American.

In four years Creamer scored 2,462 career points (21.0 ppg) to set Bucknell and Patriot League records. Even while pouring in that many points, she also ranked No. 2 in program history in assists with 593. Creamer became only the second woman in NCAA history to lead her conference in both scoring and assists three straight years. Creamer also set school and league career records for field goals made (823) and attempted (1889), free throws made (621) and attempted (740) and free-throw percentage (.839). She owns the Bucknell record for made 3-pointers (195), and her 27.1 points per game as a senior also shattered school and league standards.

Creamer broke school and league records with an incredible 44-point game at Lafayette. That night she scored the team's final 29 points in a 71-67 win. She also had a 43-point game against Army and set a school record with 14 assists against Lehigh. Creamer was the Most Valuable Player of the 2002 Patriot League Tournament, as she helped Bucknell win the title and advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.



Following graduation Creamer became a first-round draft pick of the WNBA's New York Liberty.


IAN JOSEPH '01 was a three-time All-Patriot League outfielder, and he will become the fifth baseball alumnus coached by Gene Depew to enter the Hall of Fame, joining Ted Aceto, Mike Anders, Kevin Eiben and Joe Markulike. Joseph was a switch-hitter who graduated with Bucknell career marks in games played (192), starts (189), stolen bases (99), at-bats (683), runs scored (162), walks (99), singles (166), and he tied the career mark for assists by an outfielder with 15. With the exception of the atbats and singles records, which currently stand second, all of those marks still hold up today. Joseph owns the career stolen base mark by more than 40 over the second highest ranking player in Bison history, and he still owns Patriot League career records in at-bats, runs scored and stolen bases.

Joseph helped lead the Bison to the 2001 Patriot League championship and the program's second-ever trip to NCAA Regionals.

Bucknell has had some outstanding women's distance runners through the years, and BECKI MARSHALL '02 was one of the best. Marshall crossed the finish line first at the Patriot League Women's Cross Country Championship in 1999, 2000 and 2001. Combined with former teammate and fellow Hall of Famer Julie Sweitzer's titles in 1997 and 1998, Bucknell claimed the conference women's cross country champion five years in a row.

Marshall was named to the Patriot League Women's Cross Country All-Decade Team in 2000 - following her sophomore year - and she was an All-Region honoree in 1999. She helped lead the Bison to four straight Patriot League cross country team titles, and in 1999 she was the No. 1 runner as Bucknell qualified as a team for the NCAA Championship for the first and only time in program history.

Marshall also starred on the track, where she captured Patriot League gold medals in the 1,500 and 5,000 meters as well as the distance medley relay. She earned All-Patriot League honors three times each indoors and outdoors, and she was a part of seven Patriot League championship squads in track and field. She became the first Bucknell woman to break 17



minutes in the 5,000-meter run, and today she ranks third on Bucknell's all-time list in that event.


Marshall is also one of the most decorated scholar-athletes in Bucknell history. She won four Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year citations, including three in cross country, and in 2001 she was named the league's overall Scholar-Athlete of the Year for all sports. Marshall was also a national Academic All-America Third Team selection in 2002.

JEN ZIMMERMAN '00 will become the 13th field hockey student-athlete to be enshrined in the Hall of Fame. She was an extremely versatile player who stood out at both ends of the field. A two-year captain, Zimmerman was a Regional All-America selection in both 1998 and 1999. She also garnered All-Pa-



triot League honors as a junior and senior, and as a junior she was named Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year. A member of the Patriot League All-Decade Team for field hockey, Zimmerman graduated with school records for assists in a career (26), assists in a season (10) and goals in a game (4), and she ranked fourth in total points (74). She is one of only three players in program history to record four goals in a game, joining fellow Hall of Famers Kathy Kline Grove and Karin Wegener Knisely, and no Bison has scored four times since Zimmerman did it against Columbia on Sept. 11, 1999.

Zimmerman was the Patriot League Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1999 and was a three-time member of the National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-Academic Team.



Bison in National Halls of Fame

In addition to the 75 football-playing members of the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, five inductees have also been elected to national football halls of fame.

▶ The most famous member of the Hall is probably Christy Mathewson, who is also a charter member of the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y. At Bucknell, Mathewson was an outstanding dropkicker and fullback on Bison football teams from 1898-1900.

▶ Clarke Hinkle, an outstanding back who later starred for the Green Bay Packers, is a member of both the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

▶ Andrew Wyant, a Bison star from 1888-91, who later went on to play with the University of Chicago, is a member of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

▶ Carl Snavely and Edward "Hook" Mylin are members of the National Football Hall of Fame and the Helms Hall of Fame. Snavely went 42-16-8 at Bucknell from 1927-33 and also coached at Cornell, North Carolina and Washington (Mo.) University. Mylin, who succeeded Snavely, coached Bucknell's Orange Bowl championship team.

▶ Bob Odell, who coached Bucknell to Lambert Cup titles in 1960 and 1964, was inducted into the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame in 1992 in honor of his remarkable career at Penn.





Bucknell has continued its long tradition of academic and athletic excellence in large part because of the Bison Club, which provides support for all of Bucknell's varsity intercollegiate athletics programs.

Membership in the Bison Club helps the Bucknell athletics programs defray expenses of recruiting, equipment purchases and team travel. In fact, Bison Club gifts account for nearly 40 percent of the athletic department's operating budget. In recent years the Bison Club has received approximately \$2 million in donations and the goal is to increase that figure every year.

The Bison Club also sponsors the annual Senior Athletic Awards Banquet, one of the highlights of the athletic year at Bucknell. At the banquet, each qualified senior student-athlete is presented with a Bucknell ring, watch or framed varsity letter in recognition of his or her achievements. Special awards honor the most outstanding student-athletes in the senior class.

In addition, the Bison Club sponsors the Bucknell Athletic Hall of Fame, which now includes 229 members and is located on the second floor of Bucknell's Gerhard Fieldhouse.

Todd Newcomb, Bucknell Class of 1988, is in his 13th year as the director of the Bison Club. He is the second full-time director of the organization since it was founded nearly 60 years ago, following Jim Campbell, who served in that capacity for 11 years before retiring in the summer of 2000. In addition to his duties as senior associate director of athletics for external affairs, Newcomb coordinates fundraising efforts for all 27 men's and women's varsity sports, alumni functions and special events.

Working closely with Newcomb and the director of annual giving to identify and solicit new annual donors to the Bison Club are director of athletics development Tom Harvey and assistant director of athletics development Terry Conrad. In addition, former Bucknell Hall of Fame lacrosse coach Sid Jamieson has served as a fundraising assistant for the past eight years.







ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Bucknell plays its home games in a picturesque, 89-year-old stadium that pays tribute to one of its most distinguished alumni and to its numerous war veterans.

The stadium, dedicated in 1924 in honor of Bucknell men and women who served the United States in time of war, was renovated and renamed in 1989 to recognize perhaps Bucknell's most honored alumni and one of the true heroes of American sports.

Christy Mathewson was one of the five original members of the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y., but gained his initial athletic fame as a fullback, punter and dropkicker at Bucknell from 1898-1900.

One of the truly outstanding players of his era, Mathewson kicked a point after touchdown in the first varsity game of his freshman year, and in the next three years added 13 touchdowns and eight field goals.


Mathewson gained national attention when he dropkicked two field goals against Pennsylvania in 1899 and added a 45-yard field goal against Army the following year. As a result, he was named the "12th man" on Walter Camp's 1900 All-America team.

Reports in Bucknell files indicate that Mathewson practiced his dropkicking hour after hour, and these reports also note that his punting was exceptional throughout his career, a three-year stretch during which he scored 106 points.

"Matty" was also a punishing runner, and one game account makes note of a 65-yard touchdown run and a 70-yard kickoff return.

The facility that bears Mathewson's name has seen plenty of transformation over the last 25 years. A new locker room and weight room were constructed in 1987. The Tom Gadd Weight Room was updated with brand new equipment in 1999, allowing Bison players an outstanding facility for daily use and weight training.

In 1988, the horseshoe edifice was totally resurfaced and new seating was added. New concession stands, rest rooms, ticket booths and souvenir stands were added a year later, along with an eight-lane, all-weather track, which was resurfaced in 2003 and



again in the summer of 2012.

The section at the south end of the stadium was landscaped in 1988, and a new scoreboard and messageboard were added. Other upgrades include new lights, which feature a nearly 10-fold increase in candle power.


A FieldTurf playing surface was initially installed in the summer of 2001 as a gift from Norm Garrity '63 and his wife, Mary Lou '64. That surface was replaced during the summer of 2012 with a new state-of-the-art synthetic grass.

Bucknell was one of the first Division I schools to install FieldTurf as a full-time playing surface in a football stadium.










ATHLETIC FACILITIES



With 18 Patriot League Presidents' Cups in 23 years, national leadership in graduation rates, 124 Academic All-Americans since 1970 and 131 Patriot League Scholar-Athletes in 23 years, Bucknell is clearly at the head of the class in terms of upholding the scholar-athlete model.

The Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center, one of the finest collegiate athletics and recreation venues of its kind, ensures the continuation of that success.

The facility enhances each of Bucknell's 27 varsity programs and greatly expands the scope of its growing intramural and recreational sports offerings. A visually appealing structure located along Moore Avenue on the "downhill" side of campus, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center was designed to reach out to all members of the campus community, including the student body, varsity student-athletes, faculty, staff and alumni.

Three primary venues lie within the facility: the Arthur D. Kinney Jr. Natatorium, the 4,000-seat Gary A. Sojka Pavilion and the Krebs Family Fitness Center. Other features include a prominent location for the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, a display of Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, a sports medicine and athletic training suite, classrooms, modern offices for coaches and staff and sufficient locker room space for varsity and recreational athletes.

The facility is named in honor of Ken Langone, a 1957 Bucknell graduate who, along with his wife Elaine, pledged \$11 million toward the center's construction. Langone was a member of the university Board of Trustees from 1980 to 1996.

One of the special qualities of the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the manner in which it supplements the pre-existing facilities. The facility surrounds Gerhard Fieldhouse and historic Davis Gymnasium, which serves as a competition venue for the Bison volleyball and wrestling teams, as well as intramural, recreation and other varsity practice activities.

As Bucknell continues to strive toward its mission of setting the standard of excellence in college athletics, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the centerpiece in an already impressive cache of athletics facilities that includes the 13,100-seat Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium and its brand new FieldTurf gridiron and 8-lane track surface; the scenic Bucknell Golf Club and Bachman Golf Center; and the spacious West Fields complex, which encompasses Depew Field (baseball), Becker Field (softball) and the adjoining Graham Field (AstroTurf for field hockey and women's lacrosse) and Emmitt Field (natural grass for soccer) venues that are complemented by the beautiful Holmes Stadium.

A closer look behind the walls of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center:

Ramer Schaffner Memorial Hall

Ramer Schaffner Memorial Hall greets guests as they enter the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center. The entry hall features the busts of 2nd Lt. George H. Ramer and 1st Lt. Dwite H. Schaffner, Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, and provides access to Gerhard Fieldhouse and the Krebs Family Fitness Center on the ground level. Guests may proceed to the second level to enter Davis Gym, administrative offices and the Hall of Fame, which celebrates Bucknell's Patriot League championships and other notable feats.

Krebs Fitness Center

Promoting lifetime wellness, the Krebs Family Fitness Center contains state-of-the-art cardiovascular and strength conditioning equipment. The 16,000-square-foot center includes over 175 positions for equipment within three distinct areas. The first-level cardiovascular and pin-select equipment is open for student, faculty and staff use at all times. Directly above, the mezzanine also contains cardio equipment, with scenic views of the campus and natatorium. In July 2008, a new Mondo floor was installed.

The third area, the Berger Family Weight Room, sits on the former site of Freas-Rooke Pool, and is used for instructional free-weight training and varsity workouts. The facility received all new weightlifting equipment in the summer of 2010.

Kinney Natatorium

Kinney Natatorium features a 50-meter by 25-yard Olympic class pool, which accommodates four varsity programs — men's and women's swimming and diving and men's and women's water polo — while enhancing the recreational aquatics opportunities for the Bucknell community. The pool itself features two moveable bulkheads, allowing for multiple team practices and recreational swimming to occur simultaneously.

Natatorium amenities include seating for 500 spectators, restrooms, separated varsity and visiting team locker rooms, a poolside classroom, sauna, steam room and concession stands.


In its first decade, Kinney Natatorium has played host to several major events, most notably the 2005 NCAA Men's Water Polo Championship. The facility has also served as host of six Patriot League Swimming and Diving Championships, two Eastern Water Polo Championships and an exhibition game against the U.S. women's water polo national team, drawing rave reviews at each. Beginning in the spring of 2005, the PIAA state swimming championships moved to Kinney Natatorium.

Soika Pavilion

Sojka Pavilion provides the Bison men's and women's basketball programs with one of the finest arenas in the East. A "first-class" venue capable of seating 4,000 spectators for sporting and other campus events, the pavilion has walk-down access to all seats and unobstructed views of the playing surface or concert stage for all spectators. The seating bowl features approximately 1,500 fixed seats and 2,500 retractable seats, enabling an "expandable" open floor area with sufficient space for three basketball courts for recreational activities and varsity practices. The spacious upper-level concourse includes two concession areas, restrooms, handicapped seating and several suites that overlook the floor.

Behind the scenes, on the floor level, Sojka Pavilion provides a green room for performance acts and other functions, a catering kitchen for special events, ticket windows, locker room space for home and visiting teams and officials, and a loading dock capable of accommodating team buses and production trucks for televised events.

Dozens of nationally televised basketball games have been aired from Sojka Pavilion. A 2005 meeting with nationally ranked Villanova drew a school-record crowd of 4,433.



ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Whether it is the varsity student-athlete, the intramurals participant or the fitness buff looking for a nice workout, members of the Bucknell community benefit from a wide array of first-class athletics facilities. The completion of the Kenneth Langone Athletics & Recreation Center in 2003 highlighted a facilities boon at Bucknell. Sojka Pavilion, Kinney Natatorium and the Krebs Fitness Center are the centerpieces of the sparkling indoor facility, nicely complementing the renovated Davis Gym and Gerhard Fieldhouse, all of which lie under the same roof. Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium is the largest of the outdoor facilities, with 13,100 seats surrounding the brand new FieldTurf playing surface and 8-lane track. Holmes Stadium, completed in 2007, is an impressive covered grandstand featuring all chair-back seating, along with the accompanying support facilities (locker rooms, athletic training room, press box, concession/merchandise stand, etc.) that service both Emmitt Field (natural grass for soccer) and Graham Field (AstroTurf for field hockey and women's lacrosse). The next phase of the West Fields improvement project includes significant upgrades for baseball and softball. Both diamonds recently received new playing surfaces. FieldTurf at Depew Field (baseball) was laid in time for the start of the 2010 season, while new sod was installed in the outfield of Becker Field (softball) in 2012. Both facilities also now have new dugouts, fencing and scoreboards, as well a brick entry plaza, and fundraising continues for the final phase: new grandstands and press boxes for both venues. Also located on the western end of campus are numerous grass fields for intramurals and recreation, as well as a highly regarded 18-hole golf course, the Bucknell Golf Club. Recently completed on the BGC property is a new indoor/outdoor instructional golf facility, Bachman Golf Center, which provides a year-round training center for the Bison golf teams. The Bison rowing team has its own Boathouse located about 10 miles south of





From Presidents' Cups to Academic All-Americans to graduation rates that are ranked annually in the national top-10, Bucknell is clearly at the head of the class when it comes to upholding the scholar-athlete ideal.

- According to federal data released by the NCAA each fall, Bucknell's student-athlete graduation rate annually ranks in the top 10 among all Division I institutions. Bucknell has led the nation in graduation rates twice, and in the most recent survey in the fall of 2012, Bucknell ranked No. 2 in the nation.
- Bucknell has claimed a league-high 131 Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year since the league's inception as an all-sports conference in 1990-91.
- A total of 399 Bison appeared on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2012-13 after recording a GPA of 3.2 or better during their sport's competition season. Among all BU student-athletes, 509 made the Dean's List with GPAs of 3.5 or better during 2012-13.
- In addition to the 124 Capital One Academic All-Americans produced since 1970, Bucknell has also claimed 338 Academic All-District honorees over the same span, including nine in 2012-13.
- Bucknell has earned 95 Patriot League championships in 23 years in the league. In addition, Bucknell has had 120 conference players of the year, 103 PL coaches of the year and a whopping 570 individual league champions from sports such as cross country, track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and golf.

- 26 of Bucknell's 27 varsity squads posted team GPAs of 3.0 or better in the spring of 2013.
- Bucknell has captured the Patriot League Presidents' Cup, signifying the league's all-sports champion, 18 times in the 23-year history of the affiliation, including 14 of the last 16 years.
- Bucknell ranks FIFTH in the nation (to Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford) in total number of Capital One Academic All-America selections with 124.
- A major element in ensuring Bucknell's commitment to athletics excellence is the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics & Recreation Center, which opened fully in 2003. One of the finest collegiate athletics facilities of its kind, the center includes the 4,000-seat Sojka Pavilion, the Olympic class Kinney Natatorium, the Krebs Family Fitness Center and the Berger Family Weight Room. A Hall of Fame area, a display of Bucknell's Medal of Honor recipients, an Academic All-America wall, a sports medicine suite, modern offices for coaches and staff, and locker room and classroom space are also included in the facility's layout.





























BUCKNELL BISON ATHLETICS

A NATIONAL MODEL IN PROMOTING THE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE IDEAL

Bucknell Athletics is first and foremost a student-centered organization, one that strives to be a national leader when it comes to operating by a true scholar-athlete model. At Bucknell, student-athletes' academic programs are their first priority, and providing a competitive Division I athletics program only advances the mission, values and residential learning goals of the university. To that end, the Department of Athletics and Recreation proactively seeks ways to assist student-athletes in their daily academic pursuits. Below are just some of the student-athlete support programs currently in place.

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE: The faculty athletics representative (FAR) is a member of the faculty or administrative staff who is designated to represent Bucknell in its relationships with the NCAA and the Patriot League. Bucknell's FAR is Mitch Chernin, Professor of Biology. The FAR can enhance the student-athlete experience by promoting a balance between academics, athletics and the social lives of student-athletes, which affords them opportunities to enjoy the full range of collegiate experiences available to students generally.

SIDELINE COACH PROGRAM: This program is a truly unique initiative in Division I college athletics, and it involves the invitation of a member of the faculty, administration, staff or community by one of Bucknell's 27 varsity teams. The participant has the opportunity to discuss the overall program with the respective coaching staff, including practice preparation and strategy for the upcoming contest. The sideline coach attends a practice session and an actual intercollegiate competition, where he/she is introduced to the team and gains rarely seen insight into the relationships that exist between player-coach and player-player. The purpose of the Sideline Coaches Program is to foster a better understanding by the faculty and administration of the roles played by coaches and athletes in the university's competitive intercollegiate athletic arena.

ACADEMIC ENHANCEMENT CENTER: In the Fall of 2005, the Department of Athletics opened a study/computer lab for student-athletes on the concourse level of Sojka Pavilion. The center is outfitted with computers, a laser printer, four television monitors and a projection unit with computer, VCR and DVD player. Additionally, the study lab can be used as a meeting place for group projects, tutorial area or just a secluded and quiet study space before or after practice.

LAPTOP PROGRAM: The Department of Athletics owns a number of laptop computers that may be signed out by student-athletes for use on away trips.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAAC): Representatives from each varsity team comprise the SAAC, which is designed to enhance the total student-athlete experience by promoting opportunity, protecting student-athlete welfare, and fostering a positive student-athlete image. The Committee is an invaluable resource for promoting communication between athletics administration and student-athletes; promoting communication between athletics and campus-wide administration; providing feedback and insight, as well as soliciting responses into department issues and proposed NCAA legislation; building a sense of community within the athletics program involving all athletics teams; organizing community service projects and efforts; creating a vehicle for student-athlete representation on campus-wide committees; serving as a collective voice of campus student-athletes; and disseminating information to the student-athlete body.

BUCKNELL BISON LEADERSHIP ACADEMY: In 2011-12, the Department of Athletics launched the Bucknell Bison Leadership Academy. As part of a Patriot League-wide leadership initiative, this program is designed to help student-athletes learn how to be effective leaders on and off the playing fields. The Leadership Academy features programming and instruction that bridge theory, development and real experiences in an interactive learning environment. Through this endeavor, team leaders can enhance their impact on their teammates' and their program's performance immediately and for years to come.























Historical roots are important in Lewisburg. The town celebrates the holidays with the annual Victorian Holiday Parade and exhibits at the Packwood House Museum and the Slifer House Museum. Its many historical sites include an Underground Railroad station.

A weekly market brings Amish farmers to town in horse-drawn wagons.

Lewisburg is ranked 15th in the nation in the book, The 100 Best Small Towns in America, written by Norman Crampton. The town earned this ranking by scoring high in areas such as the number of physicians per 100,000, the percentage of college-educated residents, the lowest number of serious crimes, and its location near state parks as well as being host to an institution of higher learning.

The borough of Lewisburg began its early life as "Derrstown" named for its settler, landowner, and miller Ludwig Derr. While the date remains obscure, the historians point out that in English, the German name for Ludwig is Lewis.

The town's growth from 1785 until well into the 19th century was slow due to the lack of transportation, until a ferry was built to carry wagons across the Susquehanna River and a canal was completed in 1833. Lewisburg, surveyed in 1769, was not officially founded by Ludwig Derr until 1785. The borough was incorporated on March 31, 1812. Located on the Susquehanna, it has benefited with every development in transportation: turnpike, canal, railroad and now, highways.

Enhanced by the chartering of Bucknell University on February 5, 1846, and the seating of the county government on October 9, 1855, the community expanded its development past Fifth Street to what is now Route 15. Most of the builders of this community are protected through historic district regulation.

In addition to Bucknell, the Lewisburg Federal Prison System and Evangelical Community Hospital enhance the area's financial stability.

Education has always played a primary part in Lewisburg's social society. As early as 1790 the basics were taught in private homes. In 1805 the "Log Cabin Academy" was built. In 1835 three new schools were added, while the present system consists of two elementary schools, a middle school — which was recently named the top middle school in the state — and a high school. Sixty-five percent of Lewisburg's high school graduates go on to college.



Bucknell Among Nation's Leaders in Salary Potential Among U.S. Liberal Arts Colleges

Graduates of Bucknell University have among the highest earning potential in the nation, a research survey revealed in 2010. The 2010 Education and Salary Report, prepared and released by Seattle-based PayScale Inc., named Bucknell graduates No. 3 among graduates of top U.S. liberal arts colleges <mark>by</mark> sala<mark>ry</mark> potential.

The top liberal arts college category showed that the starting median salary for Bucknell graduates was \$55,800, while the mid-career median salary was \$115,000.

National Reputation

A number of recent reports have served to underscore Bucknell's national reputation:

- In 2007, The Washington Monthly ranked Bucknell No. 7 among the best liberal arts colleges in the country when it comes to fostering research and promoting an ethic of service and social mobility.
- In 2008, the Peace Corps listed Bucknell at No. 6 on its top 25 list of small colleges and universities producing Peace Corps Volunteers.
- In 2008, Kiplinger's Personal Finance magazine rated Bucknell as the 11th best value in private liberal arts colleges.





Bucknell is a unique national university where liberal arts and professional programs complement each other, where 3,583 full-time students are educated for a lifetime of critical thinking and strong leadership. For 160 years, the University has remained true to its fundamental purpose: to educate and prepare students for lives that make a difference and have a positive impact on the world.

In keeping with that purpose, the University has developed **The Plan for Bucknell**, which includes its collective vision — "To provide students with the premier undergraduate experience in American higher education."

The Plan comprises five strategies.

Strengthen the Academic Core aims to ensure that a Bucknell education is challenging and engaging, with openness to new ideas and a culture of innovation;

Deepen the Residential Learning Experience will provide a residential learning and living experience that complements the academic program, integrates the athletics and recreation program and promotes personal growth and development and civic and ethical responsibility;

Enhance Diversity is a commitment to diversity in all its forms within a civil and supportive environment of open exchange to prepare Bucknell graduates to live and work in a globally integrated and intercultural world;

Build Bridges will bring the world to Bucknell — through visiting scholars and sports teams, international students and alumni, guest speakers, international focus semesters, and electronic communications — and bring Bucknell to the world through strategic partnerships and community engagement activities as well as opportunities for off-campus study and faculty research;

Secure Our Financial Future will secure resources necessary to engage new opportunities, lessen dependence on tuition, and ensure our financial future.

The Plan for Bucknell was unanimously approved by the Board of Trustees on April 29, 2006, having previously been approved by the students and faculty. We have begun implementing it and are determined to make it a reality over the next decade. University Administration

Bucknell President Dr. John C. Bravman



John Bravman, a highly respected academic leader and distinguished professor of engineering, became the 17th president of Bucknell University on July 1, 2010. His longtime dedication to undergraduate liberal arts education at the highest level has set an innovative and dynamic tone for his presidency.

During John's first year in office, the University broke ground on infrastructure for Academic West, the first academic building constructed at Bucknell since 2004. Off campus, he continues to strengthen ties between the University and

downtown Lewisburg, where Bucknell recently renovated several University properties, including the Campus Theatre, the Post Office Building, and the Entrepreneurs Incubator, Small Business Development Center and Downtown Art Gallery.

In his earliest months at Bucknell, John initiated an in-depth examination of the quality of student life by creating the Campus Climate Task Force. This group of faculty, staff and students assessed student views and actions related to personal responsibility and recommended ways to improve the University experience for all students. Ongoing campus dialogue about expectations of students has been firmly established as a top presidential priority.

John has steadily built a foundation of support through numerous meetings and speaking engagements with Bucknellians across the country and overseas. In October 2012, Bucknell will initiate the public phase of the largest comprehensive campaign in its history, with a goal of raising half a billion dollars.

Prior to joining Bucknell John spent 35 years at Stanford University, where he led their undergraduate program as the vice provost for undergraduate education for 11 years. He played a critical role in Stanford's Campaign for Undergraduate Education, which raised more than \$1.1 billion. In recognition of his accomplishments, Stanford awarded him the university's highest honors for both teaching (1989) and for lifetime service (2010).

Born in 1957, John grew up in New York City and on Long Island. He completed his bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree in materials science and engineering at Stanford. He has published more than 160 peer-reviewed articles and taught primarily in the fields of materials structure and analysis, thin-film mechanical phenomena, microelectronic reliability and high-temperature superconductivity. A tenured professor of electrical engineering, he recently patented two coatings that may make coronary stents safer for heart-disease patients.

John is married to Dr. Wendelin Wright, an associate professor of mechanical and chemical engineering at Bucknell. They have two young sons, Cole and Cooper. John has two older sons, Christopher and Matthew.

ATHLETICS ADMINISTRATION

<u>John P. Hardt</u> Director of Athletics and Recreation

At the helm of a proud and flourishing Bison athletics program is director of athletics and recreation John Hardt, who is now in his 13th year at Bucknell and his 27th year in athletics administration. Hardt administers a broad-based sports program with a proud and successful history.

Since his arrival, Hardt has orchestrated one of the nation's most assertive facilities overhauls, built and maintained relationships with major donors, restructured the athletics administration in order to help Bucknell stay ahead of the curve in the fastpaced world of Division I athletics and built upon Bucknell's long-standing tradition of scholar-athlete excellence.

Hardt is privileged to oversee a varsity athletics program that has long been at the head of the class in the Patriot League, both on the playing fields and in the classroom. From Presidents' Cups to Academic All-Americans to the nation's best graduation rate, Bison Athletics carries a proud heritage.

While building on Bucknell's athletic and academic excellence is paramount, Hardt has also incorporated progressive ideas in the area of external relations. Initiatives such as the Bison Now radio program, a new graphics identity package, an informative and visually appealing athletics website and a revamped Bison Club all serve to bring Bison Athletics into the homes of its supporters.

Hardt reorganized the management structure of the department and implemented a sport management group, dividing the direct oversight of 27 men's and women's varsity programs among Hardt and a handful of associate directors of athletics.

During his productive tenure at Bucknell, Hardt has overseen 10 consecutive years of growth in Bison Club donations, and he has seen the program benefit from several major gifts. While the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the crown jewel of a successful university fundraising campaign, other significant offerings include a \$7.6 million donation from William Graham — one of the largest in university history — which was directed toward women's athletics and the successful restoration of wrestling to varsity status. Graham Field, the AstroTurf venue at the West Fields, was also a result of that gift.

Other major gifts have included the funding of the FieldTurf playing surface and new lighting in Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium, a new natural grass soccer pitch that opened in 2005, Holmes Stadium, the stadium/press box facility that now supports both Graham Field and Emmitt Field, the refurbishment of the baseball and softball facilities, as well as endowments for football, track and field, swimming and diving and water polo.

While much has been achieved during his first 12 years at Bucknell, Hardt's vision for Bison Athletics carries well into the future. Working with campus and department leadership, he has developed a long-range plan for Bucknell Athletics that meshes with the University's strategic plan, entitled The Plan for Bucknell. Hardt's plan focuses on future facilities upgrades, places an emphasis on diversity and gender equity, and promises the continued commitment to a student-centered athletics and recreation program that adheres to the



student-athlete ideal.

In the fall of 2011, Hardt announced the launching of the Bucknell Bison Leadership Academy, a program designed identify, develop, challenge and support student-athletes and coaches in their continual quest to become leaders in academics, in athletics and in life.

Hardt, who received the Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding Athletic Director Award in March 2008 the All-American Football Foundation's 91st Banquet of Champions, also remains very active in athletics governance at the national level. In 2006-07 he served as chair of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Committee, and recently he has served on the Division I Baseball Committee. In the summer of 2012 he was appointed to the NCAA Division I Leadership Council.

He began his tenure at Bucknell on February 15, 2000, after serving four years as associate director of athletics at Michigan State University. While there, Hardt supervised the sports medicine staff, strength and conditioning, equipment operations, computing and tech services and NCAA/Big Ten rules compliance. In addition, he handled legal and contractual issues for the department.

Prior to his tenure at MSU, Hardt spent five years at Syracuse University as director of athletic compliance and four years with the NCAA's national office as a compliance representative.

A native Iowan, Hardt is a 1984 honors graduate of the University of Iowa, and he was a member of the Hawkeyes' 1982 Rose Bowl football team. He later earned his law degree from Iowa and is a doctoral candidate in Iowa's College of Education.



Season credentials will be granted to members of the media that cover Bucknell football on a regular basis. Requests for single-game credentials should arrive no later than three days prior to the game. RADIO INFORMATION

There are two booths for electronic media in the Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium press box, one of which is reserved for the Bison Sports Network. The remaining booth will be reserved for the official station of the visiting team, as designated by that institution's sports information director. If there are more than two stations broadcasting the game, or if the game is on television, then at least one broadcast crew may have to work from the main press box.

Permission to broadcast the game is granted through the Bucknell Office of Athletic Communications and arrangements for use of a phone line should be made prior to gameday. Bucknell reserves the right to deny access to an organization for not following procedure. All long distance phone calls must be charged to a credit card or other third party.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

The NCAA has a sideline control policy to keep those areas free from congestion. Only photographers on assignment and working members of the television media are issued sideline passes. Per NCAA rules, photographers are not permitted between the 25-yard lines.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The postgame interview room is located under the east stands adjacent to the Bucknell team locker room. Media members will be escorted by a member of the Athletic Communications staff to and from the interview room.

PRACTICE COVERAGE

Members of the media are invited to attend practices at all times if accompanied by a member of the Athletic Communications staff. Please contact the Office of Athletic Communications 24 hours in advance to determine the status of practice and gain clearance into the workout. Interviews are typically conducted after practice.

MIDWEEK INTERVIEWS

To arrange a telephone interview with coaches and student-athletes, please contact Todd Merriett in the Athletic Communications Office. Every effort will be made to coordinate an interview as long as it does not interfere with practice or class schedules.

PHOTO REQUESTS

The Bucknell Office of Athletic Communications maintains a digital photo library of student-athletes and coaches, and pictures are available on request to members of the media.

Bucknell football hits the airwaves again this fall on the Bison Sports Network. Radio broadcasts of all 11 Bucknell games will be carried live on the Bison Sports Network. The network's flagship station again this season is Eagle 107 (WEGH 107.3 FM). The pre-game show begins 30 minutes prior to kickoff.

The broadcasts also have a worldwide audience over the internet at BucknellBison.com.

Doug Birdsong enters his 14th season as the "Voice of the Bison." A 1987 Marshall University graduate who has called play-by-play for college and high school athletics for more than 25 years, Birdsong was named Radio/TV Coordinator and Marketing Specialist at Bucknell in July 2000.

He is just the second full-time "Voice of the Bison," following in the footsteps of Bob Behler, who called the action for 13 years. In addition to calling the Bucknell football action, Birdsong also handles the play-by-play duties for men's basketball, in addition to numerous other Bison teams. He has worked numerous NCAA Tournament contests in men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's soccer and women's soccer during his tenure at Bucknell.

In 2008, Birdsong took on additional duties as he is responsible for all video shown on Bison Vision on BucknellBison.com. He interviews coaches and student-athletes and obtains highlights from many Bison events to post on the popular Bison Vision, which has received rave reviews as it enters its sixth year in 2013-14.

Birdsong also helped initiate and served as host of *Bison Live!* and *Bison Now!*, former radio shows that originated from local restaurants.

Birdsong, the host of the weekly Bucknell Football Luncheons in the fall, came to Bucknell from AVC Communications in Cambridge, Ohio, where, as the sports director, he managed the play-by-play crews on five radio stations for 12 years. He called play-by-play for Muskingum College football, men's and women's basketball, softball and volleyball, and also handled the same duties plus baseball for area high schools. Birdsong was also responsible for writing and producing 11 daily sportscasts focusing on the six area high schools and Muskingum College.

During his final five years at AVC, Birdsong coordinated advertising and posted an outstanding record, increasing sales by at least 10 percent each year.

Prior to his experience at AVC, Birdsong worked at WTCR in Huntington, W.Va., for a few years after graduating from Marshall. While he was a student at Marshall, he worked for WMUL as its Sports Director and called football, basketball and baseball for the Thundering Herd. In addition, Birdsong produced and hosted a weekly one-hour sports talk show.



He has won numerous awards, including citations from the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters for "Best Local Sporting Event Coverage" two years in a row. Birdsong has also won four Outstanding Sports Operation for Play-by-Play citations from the Associated Press in Ohio, and two from the Associated Press in West Virginia. In 1999, he was chosen as the Eastern Ohio Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association Media Person of the Year.
