
BELIZEAN INNOVATION: THE BELIZE NATIONAL HEALTH INFORMATION SYSTEM



Perched on the Caribbean coast and as diverse ethnically and culturally as it is geographically, Belize is developing a cutting-edge web-based health information system.

The Belize Health Information System (BHIS), which was inaugurated on 16 September 2008, is a fully integrated, comprehensive health information system intended to improve individual health outcomes and public health performance, and optimize resource utilization.

According to Dr. Peter Allen, Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Health: "The measure of success is the positive outcomes for those who encounter our system. There will always be challenges since no system or tool is ever perfect - the focus must always remain on the benefits to patients and our people."

The BHIS allows population-based, health services, and records-based data to be made available to authorized users anywhere in the country almost as soon as they are entered in the system. It comprises a set of mostly interdependent surrounding modules the central Health Record Electronic and Admissions-Discharge-Transfer functions.

The system was financed initially through a health sector reform loan from the Inter-American Development Bank and the Caribbean Development Bank. The Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization (PAHO/WHO) and Accesstec of New Brunswick, Canada provided technical cooperation.

"Health information is at the heart of the public health system. In 2006, a grant was received from the Health Metrics Network (HMN) that first brought the Belize system to the attention of the wider Network. In May 2008, Belize became the first country in the Americas to be granted priority technical support from HMN, as a "Wave One" country.

The country has completed an assessment of its health information system (HIS) and is currently in the process of finalizing its HIS Strategic Plan, with continued HMN and PAHO/WHO technical cooperation. As part of

the process, a 2-day stakeholder consultation was held in July 2009 to finalize Belize's HIS strategic plan for the next five years.

The consultation identified the following key areas for inclusion in the strategic plan:

- Development of a modernized legal framework in support of HIS. This will facilitate better links between health services and health outcomes.
- Strengthening data management across the sector. The efficacy of health interventions depend in part on the overall quality of the HIS data, which form the basis for evidencebased decisions.
- Better dissemination and use of information. Good data lead to better information, which in turn leads to better decisions and health outcomes.

The workshop "Belize Health Information System: Lessons Learned to Strengthen National Health Information Systems in Barbados, Eastern Caribbean Countries, Jamaica, and Trinidad and Tobago" was held in Belize from August 17-19, 2009. The workshop was organized by the Belize and Eastern Caribbean Countries offices of PAHO/WHO in collaboration with the Ministry of Health of Belize and the Health Metrics Network (HMN), and the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States.

Its purpose was to share experiences and lessons learned relative to the design and implementation of the BHIS with Barbados, Eastern Caribbean Countries, Jamaica, and Trinidad and Tobago in order to strengthen partnerships and networking among participant countries. Creating and implementing integrated health information systems represents major challenges for both developed and developing countries; however, a harmonized approach to HIS development and implementation may allow developing countries in this and other regions to maximize their investments through understanding and implementing best practices and standards.
