Gonzaga Bulldogs (32-19-1 / 15-6 WCC)

★ Gonzaga lost two of its last three to WCC champion San Francisco on the season's final weekend.

★ Freshman LHP/1B **Marco Gonzales** was named the WCC Co-Player and Co-Freshman of the Year. Gonzales led the conference with 11 wins on the mound, while hitting .315 during West Coast Conference play.

★ Junior LHP **Ryan Carpenter** earned West Coast Conference Pitcher of the Year honors. Carpenter was 5-1 with a 2.19 ERA over seven WCC starts, striking out a league-high 107 over 96 innings of work.

★ The Bulldogs closed their 2011 campaign with more victories (32) than any other WCC school.



Loyola Marymount Lions (30-25 / 11-10 WCC)

★ Loyola Marymount closed its season with a three-game sweep of San Diego at Page Stadium.

★ Junior RHP **Alex Gillingham** was named to the All-WCC Team. Gillingham posted a 2.49 earned run average, while working a WCC-high 112 innings.

★ Junior catcher **Matt Koch** was named to the All-WCC Team. Koch hit .321 against conference opposition.

★ Three Lions, sophomore RHP **Aaron Griffin**, sophomore DH/OF **Matt Lowenstein**, and senior outfielder **Joe Vierra** were named All-WCC Honorable Mention.



Pepperdine Waves (22-34 / 7-14 WCC)

★ Pepperdine lost two of its final three games to Saint Mary's at Field Stadium.

★ Junior LHP **Aaron Gates** was one of three Waves to be selected to the All-WCC Team in 2011. Gates limited opponents to just a .194 batting average against.

★ Sophomore 2B **Joe Sever** and junior outfielder **Brian Humphries** were both named to the All-WCC Team. The duo combined for seven home runs during WCC play.

★ Pepperdine right-handed pitchers **Scott Frazier** and **Corey Miller** were both selected to the 2011 WCC All-Freshman Team by the league's eight head coaches.



Portland Pilots (24-30 / 11-10 WCC)

★ The Pilots concluded their 2011 season with a three-game sweep of visiting Santa Clara at Etzel Field in Portland.

★ Freshman outfielder **Turner Gill** was selected to both the All-WCC Team as well as the WCC All-Freshman Team after hitting .372 with an on-base percentage of .449 during conference play.

★ Junior RHP **Kyle Kraus** was an All-WCC Team selection. Kraus tossed a pair of complete games in conference play, while posting a 3.16 earned run average.

★ Senior closer **Chris Dennis** was an All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2011. Despite limited save opportunities in 2011, Dennis leaves as UP's all-time saves leader. He was also a finalist for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Saint Mary's Gaels (27-28 / 9-12 WCC)

★ Saint Mary's took two of three games at Pepperdine to wrap up the 2011 season.

★ Sophomore RHP **Martin Agosta** and junior RHP **Kyle Barraclough** were both named to the All-West Coast Conference Team in 2011. Agosta posted a 2.31 earned run average during conference play over seven starts, while Barraclough was credited with a victory in four of his seven conference starts.

★ Sophomore 3B **Patrick Wisdom** was an All-Conference selection. He hit .317 with nine extra-base hits during conference play.

★ Middle infielder **Richard Boas** was an All-Freshman Team selection. Junior catcher **Toby DeMello** and sophomore RF **Brenden Kalfus** were both All-WCC Honorable Mention.



San Diego Toreros (22-31 / 11-10 WCC)

★ San Diego was swept in its season-concluding three-game set at Loyola Marymount.

★ Freshman third baseman **Kris Bryant** was named WCC Co-Player of the Year and Co-Freshman of the Year. Bryant started all 21 games during conference play for the Toreros, while leading the WCC with a .410 batting average, .525 on-base percentage, 26 runs scored, and eleven doubles. For the season, Bryant led the WCC with a .365 batting average.

★ Three Torero players were recognized as All-WCC selections by the league's eight head coaches: junior RHP **Bryan Haar**, junior catcher **Zack Kometani**, and junior 1B/OF **Corey LeVier**.

★ A pair of San Diego pitchers, left-hander **Paul Paez** and righty **Michael Wagner**, were selected to the WCC All-Freshman Team.



San Francisco Dons (32-25 / 16-5 WCC)

★ San Francisco won the 2011 West Coast Conference title by winning two of three games at Gonzaga to close out the season. The Dons made their first NCAA appearance since 2006, knocking off No. 12 UCLA in the first game.

★ San Francisco head coach **Nino Giarratano** was named the WCC Coach of the Year for the third time, and senior third baseman **Stephen Yarrow** was recognized as the West Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

★ The Dons had a conference-high six players selected to the 2011 All-WCC Team: junior 1B **Nik Balog**, senior OF **Connor Bernatz**, senior catcher **Travis Higgs**, senior outfielder **Pete Lavin**, senior third baseman **Stephen Yarrow**, and sophomore RHP **Kyle Zimmer**.

★ Kyle Zimmer threw a complete game shutout as the Dons stunned No. 12 UCLA in front of its home crowd, 3-0, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Zimmer scattered four hits, striking out 11.



Santa Clara Broncos (17-34 / 4-17 WCC)

★ Santa Clara was swept in its final three games of the season at Portland.

★ Senior RHP **Cory Hall** was selected to the 2011 All-WCC Team. Hall posted a 2.98 earned run average over seven West Coast Conference starts this season.

★ Senior catcher **Patrick Terry** was an All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2011. Terry batted .363 with 18 hits and nine runs driven in during the month of May.

★ Third baseman **Kyle DeMerritt** was selected to the West Coast Conference All-Freshman Team in 2011. DeMerritt made 48 starts as a freshman, posting a .280 batting average with 27 runs driven in.

WEST COAST CONFERENCE BASEBALL HISTORY

Baseball was originally established as a conference sport in 1968, and five conference institutions (LMU, Pepperdine, Saint Mary's, San Francisco, and Santa Clara) were charter members of the league along with three associates (Pacific, UC Santa Barbara, and San Jose State). The early period of WCC play was dominated by Santa Clara, as the Broncos claimed the first five conference championships. Loyola Marymount captured its first conference title in 1973, before Pepperdine won three straight conference crowns from 1974-76.

The conference temporarily split from 1977-84, as WCC teams competed with squads from the current Big West and Western Athletic conferences in the Northern California Baseball Association (NCBA) and the Southern California Baseball Association (SCBA). Pepperdine made the only College World Series appearance among WCC programs during this period, finishing third at the 1979 event.

Conference play resumed in 1985, and the league realigned to include San Diego and Nevada. The WCC would enjoy some of its greatest baseball success in the late 80's and early 90's, with LMU beginning the period with an appearance at the College World Series in 1986. Led by future Major Leaguers Billy Bean and Tim Layana, the Lions achieved a No. 1 national ranking in the ESPN/Collegiate Baseball poll on April 22 of that year. Pepperdine capped off the era with the conference's first-ever national championship in baseball, claiming the College World Series title in 1992. The Waves reeled off four straight victories in Omaha, including a 3-2 triumph over Cal State Fullerton in the championship game. The WCC sent multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament three times between 1986-89, with a conference record three teams (LMU, Pepperdine, and Santa Clara) earning regional bids following the 1988 season.

Nevada left the conference in 1991, creating a six-team loop until 1996 when long time conference members Gonzaga and Portland moved from the Pac-10 North to join the circuit for baseball. The WCC went to a two-division alignment in 1999, matching the two division winners in a three-game Championship Series to determine the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The WCC returned to a single-division format prior to the 2006 season, with the WCC regular season champion earning an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.
