

A short history of Womens Golf i Sweden

1976

The first national youth tournament is played. It is held for participants 16 and under.

1980

Kärstin Ehrnlund the first Swedish winner on the European Tour.

1988

Liselotte Neumann the first Swedish winner of a major: US Open





1995

Annika Sörenstam wins the first of her two successive US Open titles.

1998

Annika is ranked number one in the world





Solheim Cup

1998

Six of twelve Europen players are Swedish, as well as the captain Pia Nilsson

2000

Half of the European team consists of Swedish players





2003

- * Solheim Cup hosted in Sweden

Why, such a success?

- Swedish Golf Clubs are open to all
- "Öppen golf" (Open Golf) It was created in 1983 with intention of making Swedish golfers more competetive in international tournaments.
- International team events Sweden has been participant, since 1964, in the World Amateur Team Championships.
- Strong support for Junior Golf



- National Youth Tournaments which started in 1976, Colgate Cup, and from the year 2005 is named Skandia Cup.
- Tjejer&Golf (Girls & Golf) with intention of recruiting more girls to the Game of Golf.
- A number of tournaments open to juniors.



- For women and men Sweden hosts at least one tournament a year on the European Tour.
- Pia Nilsson her philosophy has its own name "Trädgårdsmetaforen" (the Metaphor of the Garden), which in sport means that each player is different individual and therefore should be coached accordingly.




The Key for a future success


Research Junior Golf 2008











Sports and activities in School
