What a Year!

Buffalo won a school-record 23 games during the 2004-05 season and advanced to the Mid-American Conference championship game for the first time in school history. In addition, the Bulls made their first-ever postseason appearance - deafeating Drexel in the opening round of the NIT.

Witherspoon Earns Coaching Honors

After guiding the Bulls to a school-record 23 wins last season, head coach **Reggie Witherspoon** was named the 2005 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District I Co-Coach of the Year. He shared the honor with Syracuse head coach Jim Boeheim.

Battle Earns Numerous Honors

Turner Battle was named honorable mention All-America by the Associated Press. He became the first UB basketball player in the Division I era to earn the honor. In addition, the Bulls' point guard became the first UB player to earn MAC Player of the Year accolades.

The Big Man Has Range

Buffalo center **Yassin Idbihi** isn't afraid to pull the trigger from the outside. The sophomore big man ranked fourth on the team in three-point percentage, shooting 33.9 percent from downtown. Every one of his 25 career three-pointers have come from the top of the key.

Uncaged

Calvin Cage is the Bulls' top returing scorer in 2005-06. The senior shooting guard upped his scoring average to 10.0 ppg last season. He led UB and ranked ninth in the MAC with 66 three-pointers made on the season. It was the most three made by a UB player in a season since joining the MAC. With 132 career treys, Cage currently ranks second in school history in three-pointers. Mike Martinho holds the UB record with 328 three-pointers.

Road Warriors

The Bulls won eight road games last season for the second year in a row. The eight road wins in a single season were the most in the history of the Buffalo basketball program. Their previous high was seven wins accomplished during the 1994-95 season.

Working Overtime

After not playing an overtime game since the 2000-01 season, the Bulls played in seven overtime games last season. UB, which led the nation in overtime games played, went 4-3 in overtime games last season.

The Wins Are Piling Up

The Bulls won a combined 40 games over the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons. It was the Bulls highest win total in back-to-back seasons in school history.

Home Sweet Home

The Bulls are 19-2 in their last 21 home games - their losses coming against Western Michigan on Dec. 4 and Ohio on Feb. 2. The Bulls are averaging 4,749 fans in their last 18 home games. UB ranked third in the MAC in home attendance last season (4.417).

In Rod We Trust

Roderick Middleton's production increased since being reassigned as a reserve. The junior guard is averaging 12.5 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.5 assists over the final four games of the regular season. He also shoot 55.0 percent (11-for-20) from behind the arc over the same four games. The senior guard averaged 5.6 points over the previous 23 games.

Buffalo Wins Road Bracket Buster Game...Again

For the second straight season, Buffalo won an ESPN Bracket Buster game on the road with its 52-49 victory over Fresno State. In 2004, the Bulls defeated Indiana State, 64-51. UB is the only team to have won two Bracket Buster road games in the last two years.

A Season of Firsts

Last season featured many first for the Bulls. On Feb. 8, the Bulls won at Western Michigan's University Arena for the first time. On Jan. 6, UB defeated Central Michigan to win its first-ever game at Rose Arena. On Jan. 9, the Bulls defeated Toledo for the first time in school history. UB beat Penn State on Dec. 21 for its first-ever win against a Big Ten opponent. Buffalo downed Fresno State on Feb. 19 in the first-ever meeting between the schools. The Bulls advanced past the quarterfinal round of the MAC Tournament for the first time in school history. UB won its first postseason game as a Division I program with a victory over Drexel in the opening round of the NIT.

UB Welcomes Five New Players

Buffalo will have five new players join the program for the 2005-06 season. Vadim Fedotov (Munich, Germany/Schloss Hagerhof), Greg Gamble (Niagara Falls, NY/Niagara Falls), Eric Moore (Morristown, NJ/St. Benedict's), Andy Robinson (Schenectady, NY/Schenectady) and Sean Smiley (Erie, PA/McDowell) will take the floor come November.

Fedotov is a 6-9, 240-pound forward who played for the Rhoendorf Dragons. He averaged 25 points and 11 rebounds on the season.

Robinson, a 6-1, 180-pound guard, was a three-year starter at Schenectady High School. He averaged 14.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 5.1 assists per game as a senior, but was known more for being a lock-down defender.

Gamble, a 6-4, 195-pound guard, averaged 14.3 points, 5.8 rebounds and 3.5 assists for New York powerhouse Niagara Falls, which won the New York Federation and state championship in 2005.

Moore, a 6-1, 185-pound point guard, played for Danny Hurley at perennial power St. Benedict's Preparatory School. He averaged 12 points and five assists per game last season.

Smiley, a 6-2, 165-pound guard, averaged 15.5 points four rebounds and five assists as a senior at McDowell High School in Erie, PA. He finished his career as the school's all-time leading scorer.



REGGIE WITHERSPOON

HEAD COACH • SEVENTH YEAR AT BUFFALO • 85-120 COLLEGIATE RECORD (41-97 AT UB)

Reggie Witherspoon enters his seventh season as head coach of the University at Buffalo men's basketball program.

A native Buffalonian, Witherspoon was officially named head men's basketball coach at the University at Buffalo on March 10, 2000 after guiding the Bulls through the remainder of the 1999-2000 season as the interim head coach. He became the 11th head coach in Bulls' basketball history and the third since Buffalo returned to Division I play in the 1991-92 season.

Witherspoon has engineered one of the best turnarounds in Division I college basketball. Over the past two seasons, he has led the Bulls to 40 victories, including a school-record 23 wins during the 2004-05 season. He led UB to its first-ever appearance in the championship game of the Mid-American Conference Tournament in 2005. Although the Bulls didn't win the game, they did earn a spot in the National Invitation Tournament for the school's first postseason berth as a Division I program. UB defeated Drexel in the opening round of the NIT. Witherspoon was named the 2005 NABC District I co-Coach of the Year along with Syracuse's Jim Boeheim. His accomplishments haven't gone unnoticed

by the city of Buffalo as he was also named the 2005 Man of the Year by the Buffalo Club of the National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women's Club, Inc.

Witherspoon was named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year, collegeinsider.com Mid-Major Coach of the Year and the Division I Co-Coach of the Year by the Basketball Coaches Association of New York following the 2003-04 season. He guided the Bulls to a 17-12 overall record and an 11-7 conference mark, their best effort since joining the MAC in 1998. Buffalo won 12 of its final 15 games of the season, beating their opponents by an average of 14.2 points. The 12-win improvement from the previous season was the second best turnaround in the nation in 2003-04. He led UB to its first ever home playoff game in the opening round of the MAC Tournament and, after defeating Northern Illinois, led the Bulls to Cleveland for the quarterfinal round for the first time in school history.

In 2002-03, Witherspoon guided a very young UB squad to a 5-23 mark. With freshmen and sophomores playing over 80 percent of the minutes, the Bulls proved to be competitive in nearly every game as they lost 13 games by 10 points or less.

In 2001-02, Witherspoon led the Bulls to a 12-18 mark. The Bulls' eight-win improvement from the previous season was the sixth-highest among Division I teams. Witherspoon's biggest win of the season occurred on January 9, 2002 when the Bulls knocked off Kent State, 66-65. It was the Golden Flashes' only loss in the MAC and their last loss for before falling to Indiana in the Regional Finals of the NCAA Tournament.

The 2000-01 season saw Witherspoon guide the Bulls to a 4-24 record and their second MAC Tournament appearance. However, the record was not reflective on the strides the program made as they dropped 12 regular season games by 10 points or less, the second most in the country to American University's 13. Included in that list were seven of Buffalo's first nine games and four overtime games.

During his period as interim coach, which began five games into the 1999-00 season, Witherspoon tripled the team's win output in the highly-competitive Mid-American Conference from the previous season. Buffalo also saw its first three-game home court winning streak since the 1997-98 season.

Withous poon Notes

Witherspoon has 19 years of collegiate and high school coaching experience in Western New York and has enjoyed considerable success during his coaching career. In his two-plus seasons at Erie Community College, he produced a 44-23 record and, in 1998-99, earned Region III Division I Coach of the Year honors after leading the Kats to a 24-5 record and a Region III title.

In his first season at ECC, Witherspoon led the program to a 19-10 record and was named Western New York Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, an honor he repeated in the 1998-99 season as well. During his tenure at ECC, Witherspoon produced four Division I players, two All-Americans and one Academic All-American.

Prior to his stint at Erie CC, Witherspoon spent 13 years at Sweet Home High School, eight as an assistant and five as head coach. During his five years as head coach, his teams won four straight divisional championships, the first and only time that happened in school history. He was the first African American to be named head coach of a varsity sports program in any Western New York Suburban School District.

Witherspoon earned his associate's degree from Erie Community College and bachelor's degree in Interdisciplinary Studies from Empire State College. While at Erie Community College, he played for West Virginia head coach John Beilien. He played for former Philadelphia 76er head coach Jim O'Brien at Wheeling Jesuit College.

Witherspoon resides in East Amherst, NY, with his wife, the former Dawn Taggart, and the couples' two daughters, Lydia (12) and Rachel (11).

JIM KWITCHOFF

Assistant Coach • Seventh Year • Boston College, 1988

Jim Kwitchoff is in his sixth season at the University at Buffalo and has served as an assistant for head coach Reggie Witherspoon throughout his coaching career. His on-the-court duties focus on developing the post players while he also handles administrative duties and serves as the summer camp director.

Kwitchoff was as assistant coach at Erie Community College in Buffalo, NY, and helped build the Kats' program with Witherspoon. ECC finished the 1998-99 season as the Division I, Region III Champions with a 24-5 record, reaching a national ranking of 17th in the country. That team also finished second nationally in team defense. In the 1997-98 season, the Kats finished as the Region III runner up with a 19-10 record.

Prior to coaching at ECC, Kwitchoff was an assistant for Witherspoon at Sweet Home High School from 1992-97 and helped lead the program to four straight division championships.

Kwitchoff was a co-founder along with Witherspoon of the Buffalo Team ACE All-Star Program. Through his efforts, Team ACE won 17 AAU tournaments and helped in developing more than 20 players who went on to compete at the Division I level.

As a player, Kwitchoff captained Sweet Home High School to a 1984 NY State Class A public school title. He is a 1988 graduate of Boston College where he was a three-year letterwinner for the Eagles football team. Kwitchoff earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and his master's degree in educational administration from Boston College.

In addition to his coaching duties at ECC and Sweet Home, Kwitchoff worked for 10 years in high school administration prior to joining the Bulls' staff. He most recently served as an assistant principal at Lockport High School.

Kwitchoff resides in Wheatfield, NY with his wife Tricia and their daughter Madison (4) and newborn son Ty.



CHRIS HAWKINS

Assistant Coach • Sixth Year • Radford, 1992

Chris Hawkins enters his fifth season as an assistant coach with the Bulls. Hawkins has been instrumental in the recruiting efforts. Hawkins also contributes to the scouting of opponents and coaching the perimeter players.

Hawkins came to UB from Radford University, where he served as an assistant coach for three seasons. While with the Highlanders, Hawkins helped lead the team to a 58-28 record over three seasons, including the 1997-98 Big South Championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In 1999-2000, Radford was the Big South Conference regular season champions.

As a player for the Highlanders, Hawkins was named the Most Valuable Player of the 1991-92 team that won the Big South regular season championship. During his last two seasons playing at Radford, the team finished with a

42-16 record. He still ranks fourth in the school's records for career assists.

Prior to his coaching stint at Radford, Hawkins coached for three seasons at Bladensburg High School in Bladensburg, MD. His first year was as an assistant coach, followed by two seasons as the head coach. During his tenure as head coach, he guided the team to a 27-15 record, including a 17-5 record during the 1996-97 season.

Hawkins received a bachelor's degree from Radford University and a master's degree in education from National-Lewis University. Hawkins resides in Amherst, NY, with his wife, Jacquie, and their daughter, Chandler (9).



KEVIN HECK

Assistant Coach • First Year • Wayne State, 1992

Kevin Heck enters his first season as an assistant caoch on Reggie Witherspoon's staff.

Heck comes to Buffalo from Rutgers University where he spent three seasons as an assistant coach. His primary duties included off-campus recruiting, developing the perimeter players, scouting of opponents, scheduling and game preparation. He helped lead the Scarlet Knights to the NIT in 2002 and again in 2004 when they made it to the championship game.

Prior to being hired at Rutgers, Heck spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Kent State. He helped lead the Golden Flashes to three postseason appearances, including the NCAA Tournament in 1999 and 2001. Kent State won the Mid-American Conference Tournament in 1999 and 2001.

From 1994-1996 was an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan and helped lead the Eagles to a 45-16 record over two years. Eastern Michigan earned a berth in the NIT in 1995 and after winning the Mid-American Conference title in 1996, made it to the NCAA Tournament.

Heck first began coaching at Wayne State University where he spent two seasons as a graduate assistant coach. The Warriors made it to the NCAA Division II Final Four in 1993 and the Sweet Sixteen in 1994.

A native of Rossford, OH, Heck earned his bachelor's degree from Wayne State University in art in 1992 and received his master's degree in sports administration from WSU in 1994. He was a team captain on the Warriors' basketball team.
