# SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2008 Saint Joseph's men's soccer team looks to continue some of the good vibes from last season and turn it into success this Fall. Head coach **Tom Turner** returns eight of 11 starters that won five games, the most wins in a season since 2003.

SJU retains starters at two of the most important positions on the field; a veteran goalkeeper and a proven scorer. Senior **Bryan Benedict** will be between the pipes for a third consecutive year, while reigning Atlantic 10 Rookie and Philadelphia Soccer Seven Freshman of the Year **Colin Baker** looks to improve on his team-leading eight-goal campaign from a year ago.

Although the attack is led by a sophomore, the team is rich in experience on all parts of the field. **Michael McInaw** led the offense in 2005 and 2006, but is now a stabilizing force in the midfield, helping the Hawks control the run of play.

A trio of senior midfielders join McInaw as **Andrew Tursi**, **Nick Pozzessere** and **Tom Johnson** will patrol the central part of the pitch in 2008. Pozzessere and Johnson will take care of the outside half-back roles and Tursi looks to regain his form after an ankle injury sidelined him for the last seven games of his junior campaign.

A mostly inexperienced defensive line in 2007 earned its stripes through many trials. At its core, third-year starter **Travis Gast** is the main fullback with sophomores **Greg Dusing**, **Giacomo DiLisi** and **Rocco Pozzessere** shoring up the rest of the line. The youthful and aggressive defensive corps look to turn defense into offense.

In the reserve roles, Turner has many options to chose from including veterans and rookies alike. Juniors **Matteo Chiappini**, **Bill**

**Layton** and **Jason Lewis** will spell those starters in the midfield and defensive roles. Sophomores **D.J. Salmon** and **Alex Garst** will provide depth to the attack and midfield, respectively.

Senior **Joe Bodnar**, junior **Joe Fluehr**, and freshman **Michael Troha** will back up Benedict in net and sophomore **Brendan Duddy** looks to see valuable time in reserve after missing 2007 with an ankle injury.

Many times, the contributions the freshmen make on a team aren't fully realized until the end of the season, but Turner hopes a solid blend of youth can help spark the Hawks when they need it.

**Vito Smurro** looks to lead the newcomers up top, while **Kevin Rhoades**, **Greg Rom** and **Nico Galati** shore up the midfield. **Jake McPaul**, **Tom Smart** and **David Salter** are the primary fullbacks for the freshman contingent.

SJU's task within the Atlantic 10 Conference was made easier when the schedule fell in the Hawks' favor. Unlike in 2007, SJU faced the top four teams; Charlotte, Saint Louis (NCAA participant), UMass (NCAA Semifinalist), and Rhode Island, going 0-4. This season, they face none of those teams and hold a 5-3-1 record from the last games against their 2008 A-10 opponents.

Saint Joseph's will tackle five road games to start the A-10 season with trips to St. Bonaventure, Duquesne, Richmond, George Washington and Temple before hosting Xavier, Dayton, La Salle and Fordham to end the season.

The non-conference schedule sees the Hawks opening at Drexel and Delaware, returning home to face Navy, then ending September with a game at George Mason. The Hawks cap the October portion of the non-conference schedule with games at Rider and at home against NJIT leading into Atlantic 10 play.

# HEAD COACH



## Tom Turner Head Coach 22nd Season

Tom Turner enters his 22nd year as Saint Joseph's head men's soccer coach in 2008. He is also marking his 26th season of association with SJU soccer, including his four years as a player. Now one of the longest-tenured coaches at the University, Turner continues to lend a great deal of experience to the Hawk program. Additionally, he is just one win away from matching the legendary Jack Dunn's record of 120 wins in the men's soccer program. In his 21 seasons thus far, he owns a 119-243-28 mark.

A rash of key injuries have plagued the Hawks in previous years, but with the return of a number of talented veterans and a group of skilled young players in the fold, Turner will look to return Saint Joseph's to winning ways in 2008. A glimmer of former success was shown in 2007 when the Hawks won four A-10 matches and finished a game out of qualifying for the A-10 tournament despite having the Conference's toughest schedule.

Turner took over the Saint Joseph's soccer program in 1987, and his rebuilding plan led the Hawks to back-to-back double-digit win seasons in 1993 and 1994. That success was reminiscent of his playing days in the early 1970's, when the Hawks made two appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

In 1993, Turner guided the Hawks to a school-record 12 wins, a first-ever Soccer Seven title, and an Atlantic 10 Tournament appearance. For his efforts, he was named the Coach of the Year in both the Atlantic 10 Conference and the Philadelphia Soccer Seven. He followed that with a 10-7-2 record in 1994, marking the first consecutive double-digit win campaigns in the program's history. The Hawks advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament, falling to NCAA semifinalist Rutgers.

After a span of six seasons in which the team totaled 23 wins, Turner got the Hawks back on track with 26 victories in the next three seasons. That stretch included a 10-7-2 record in 2001, in which he earned his second Soccer Seven Coach of the Year Award.

A former defensive standout at Saint Joseph's (1970 to 1973), he played on the school's 1971 and 1972 NCAA Tournament teams. Turner took over the reins of the Hawk soccer program after a 10-year coaching stint at La Salle College High School (1977 to 1986), where he compiled a record of 100-88-21. During that period, he also coached the Montgomery County All-Stars in Pennsylvania's Keystone Games scholastic competition while continuing his playing career in the Major Division of Philadelphia's United Soccer League.

Turner has worked at La Salle College High School since 1981, and currently serves as the assistant dean of students and director of transportation, while also teaching social studies.

Turner resides in Churchville, Pa., with his wife, Michelle, and their daughters, Brigid, a 2005 graduate of Saint Joseph's, and Mary Catherine.

# ASSISTANT COACHES



**Hugh McInaw**  
Assistant Coach  
Philadelphia '72 – Fifth Season

Among the most respected names in Philadelphia-area soccer for over 30 years, Hugh McInaw is in his second stint as an assistant coach at Saint Joseph's University. He previously served on Tom Turner's staff at SJU during the 1994 season.

McInaw got his start in coaching as an assistant on Turner's staff at La Salle College High School from 1978-79. In 1980 he was named the head coach at Cardinal Dougherty High School. He compiled an 85-74-17 record in 14 seasons at Dougherty, leading the team to a pair of Catholic League crowns.

He spent the 1994 season as an assistant at Saint Joseph's before being appointed the head soccer coach at Temple University. He spent five seasons (1995-99) in North Philadelphia, capturing Philadelphia Soccer Seven Coach of the Year honors in 1997 after guiding the Owls to a 10-7-2 record and a City Series title.

A 1972 graduate of Philadelphia Textile, McInaw was the Rams' leading scorer as a junior, helping the team become the nation's top-ranked soccer program for most of the year (1970). Prior to Textile, he was a prep standout at North Catholic High School, leading the team to three straight League titles.

McInaw resides in Upper Dublin, Pa., with his wife Jean. He has two children; the youngest, Michael, is a senior on the Hawk squad.



**Chuck Gesing**  
Assistant Coach  
Saint Joseph's '93 – Second Season

Joining coach Tom Turner's staff for his second season is Saint Joseph's alum Chuck Gesing. A 1993 graduate of SJU, he has served as both an assistant coach and a head coach at a number of levels.

Gesing played for three seasons under Turner, earning a degree in economics. During his time at SJU, he was also a member of the Fox Chase Soccer Club, where he served as team captain. Prior to coming to Hawk Hill, Gesing was a standout at La Salle College High School, where he was an All-Catholic selection in his senior season.

Gesing, 37, has served as an assistant coach for his alma mater, La Salle, and at Upper Dublin High School. He is also the head coach of the FC Dublin U-16 squad, which reached the finals of the Challenge Cup in 2007.

A Philadelphia native, Gesing currently resides with his wife Nicole and their two children in Glenside, Pa.

## THE HAWK



One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Saint Joseph's Hawk has been flapping its wings for 52 years.

The Hawk, which celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06, is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its over 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook*, *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was nominated for the Mascot Hall of Fame in 2008.

# FINNESEY FIELD



Finnesey Field has been home to 10 different varsity squads at Saint Joseph's University as it enters its 80th year. Opened in 1929 as home to the SJU football squad, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years and has been home to over a thousand SJU varsity games, matches and track meets.

The most recent upgrade happened this past summer as the AstroTurf, laid down in 2001, was replaced with new, state-of-the-art TigerTurf. Additionally, the track will receive a new coat of rubber material in 2009 to better suit the athletes who use it for all seasons.

Home to the men's and women's soccer teams, men's and women's lacrosse teams, the field has seen other modifications done to it since its inception in 1929. The prospect of a 70,000-seat bowled stadium for football was dashed when the sport was discontinued following the 1939 season.

Baseball re-occupied the space in 1947, calling Finnesey home until 1959. In 1960, the original grandstand as well as the hillside seating near Overbrook Avenue were eliminated as Villiger (now Post) Hall and the Bluett Theatre were built. In the process of the 1960 construction, the field's elevation was raised five feet to its current location.

In 1990, artificial turf replaced the grass, making Finnesey a truly multi-purpose facility. In 1994 the installation of lights furthered the use of the grounds, while new bleachers in 2003 on the hill next to Mandeville Hall were another touch of renovation to a historic stadium.



Saint Joseph's men's soccer was started in 1958 and played every season but one (1960) at Finnesey. The squad has compiled an overall 159-155-30 mark in 49 seasons at Hawk Hill, the most victories of any program on Finnesey Field. SJU opened its playing grounds with a 6-0 victory over Rutgers-South Jersey in October 24, 1958.

The location has also been home to women's soccer since 1996 and the field hockey team wrapped up its last season on Finnesey in 2007. Field hockey open on a new playing surface on the Maguire Campus in 2009.

Overall, the site has seen 1,053 games entering the 2008-09 academic year, and SJU teams put together a total record of 493-518-42 in 79 years.

# 2007 YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2007 Saint Joseph's men's soccer team used a blend of youth and experience to propel the squad to its best season in three years with five wins.

SJU hit the road running at the Coastal Carolina/adidas Invitational, getting shut out 6-0 by Furman. Despite the loss, the Hawks bounced back two days later in a come-from-behind victory over the hosts, Coastal Carolina, 3-2 thanks to a hat trick by freshman Colin Baker. Baker's trio was the first indication of a special season by the first-year standout.

Returning to Pennsylvania, Saint Joseph's struggled to regain its offensive touch in losses at Villanova (4-0) and at home against Rider (2-0). There were signs of life in the Rider game as SJU out-shot the Broncs 20-6.

In their travels across the state, the Hawks dropped a tough 2-1 overtime loss to Pittsburgh. Freshman Greg Dusing gave Saint Joseph's an early 1-0 lead, but the Panthers tied it up to send it to overtime before prevailing in the extra frame. Pitt held a 23-3 edge in shots.

At La Salle, a cross-city rivalry was played with the Explorers coming out on top 4-1, the lone Hawk goal coming from the foot of junior Andrew Tursi. One more cross-city rival would take another match from Saint Joseph's as Penn won a 4-0 decision at Finnesey Field to end the Hawks' September at a disappointing 1-6.

October would be one of the most successful months in men's soccer in over a decade thanks to timely scoring and lock down defense. SJU finished the month 4-2-1 and was atop the heap in the Atlantic 10 heading into November for the first time since 1994.

An unassuming 1-1 draw at NJIT didn't seem to right the Hawks' ship at first, but was a step in the right direction. The leading goal scorer a season before, Michael McInaw recorded his only goal of the season in Newark that day, and set the stage for Saint Joseph's to take four of the next six games.

A week later Saint Joseph's returned to Hawk Hill for its A-10 opener versus Temple. What looked to be like a game heading into overtime instantly changed when an Owl giveaway near midfield saw senior tri-captain Pat Duddy go the distance and score the 81st

minute game-winner.

Next time out, SJU suffered a demoralizing 3-1 loss to Philadelphia University as Duddy provided the lone bright spot. A few days later, Duddy and company worked their magic again against George Washington. Duddy tallied a second half equalizer and fellow senior tri-captain Ian Kane scored his only goal of the year in a dramatic double-overtime win, 2-1.

Two days later, SJU would score its third straight A-10 victory when a Colin Baker header found its way into the Richmond net for a 1-0 win on October 21. Baker received the ball on a Travis Gast free kick from about 30 yards away.

The Hawks would hit the road for four straight contests to the outer reaches of the Conference. In the first pair of games, SJU fell to Dayton, 4-1, after an early Duddy goal gave SJU a slender 1-0 margin. Two days later, SJU would strike back when Baker scored another game-winner at Xavier. This time, it came in overtime to snatch a crucial 1-0 victory. Bryan Benedict earned his third shutout of the season in Cincinnati.

November would not treat SJU kindly as the Hawks would struggle. A crushing 8-0 loss at nationally-ranked Saint Louis, coupled with a 3-1 defeat at Charlotte later that weekend left Saint Joseph's at 4-3 in A-10 play with two games to go.

SJU would go on to outplay UMass for most of the game, but the eventual NCAA semifinalists would capitalize on Hawk mistakes to snatch a 3-0 win on Hawk Hill. Saint Joseph's then let in four tallies to start the match versus Rhode Island, before two free kick goals by Baker in the last 20 minutes finished the match, 4-2.

For the season, Baker earned A-10 Rookie of the Year honors, while he and Duddy earned Philadelphia Soccer Seven accolades. Next year looks promising as Baker, Benedict, McInaw, Dusing, and Gast headline a strong Hawk corps in 2008.

# ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10—the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

On June 2, 2008, Bernadette V. McGlade was named the fifth full-time commissioner in Conference history, replacing Linda Bruno, who held the position for 13 years. McGlade's experience in collegiate athletics as a student-athlete, coach and administrator spans more than thirty years.

"Bernadettes's deep experience with arguably the class-act athletic conference [Atlantic Coast Conference] in the country makes us incredibly excited to be bringing her on board as commissioner of the Atlantic 10 Conference," said Father Michael Graham, Xavier University president and president of the Atlantic 10 Presidents' Council.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation work. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every

Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized 1,247 student-athletes in the Fall 2007 while 1,106 were named to the Spring 2008 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. In 2007-08, 192 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes.

The Atlantic 10 Conference had 34 teams among the 712 Division I sports teams honored by the NCAA with public recognition awards for their latest multi-year Academic Progress Rate scores. These teams posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports. Saint Louis and Xavier led the Atlantic 10 in the number of high-performing squads receiving awards with six teams each. In twenty of the twenty-one sports sponsored by the Atlantic 10, the league's Academic Progress Rates (APR) were at or above the conference average nationally according to the most recent data released by the NCAA.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 74 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

## JACK DUNN

Legendary Jack Dunn, the first-ever coach of the Saint Joseph's soccer team, has done more for the Hawk program than any one individual. The team's head coach from 1958 through 1975, Dunn compiled a career record of 120-57-23 (.658) in his 18 years at the helm, leading SJU to the NCAA Tournament in 1966, 1971 and 1972.

The 74-year-old Dunn played on the 1952 U.S. Olympic team and went on to a long playing career in the old German-American Professional League.

Dunn, who also served as an assistant coach with the Hawks in the mid-90s, was one of 20 inaugural inductees to the Saint Joseph's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999.

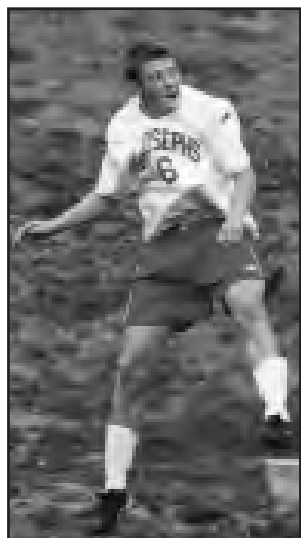

**From the South:** I-95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to Exit 5 (Rte. 1). Follow Rte. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles.

**From the West:** PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rte. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.

**From the Airport:** I-95 North to Rte. 76 West towards Valley Forge. Follow Rte. 76 West to Exit 339 (Rte. 1, City Avenue). Follow two miles to SJU.



# THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who strive to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment comprises approximately 4,150 students. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400 students.

## THE JESUIT TRADITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Saint Joseph's nationally-recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in *Barron's*, *U.S. News & World Report* and *Peterson's*. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience from trained experts. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education that prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

## A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events that draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

SJU's Philadelphia location gives students access to two worlds. The campus resembles a park, surrounded by the stately homes of Philadelphia's historic Main Line suburbs. Yet students have access to the cultural, commercial and recreational activities of downtown Philadelphia — only a short ride away.

SJU students take frequent advantage of the artistic and cultural resources Philadelphia offers, as well. They visit the Philadelphia Museum of Art; the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts; the Franklin Institute Science Museum; the Academy of Music, which houses ballet and opera; and the new Kimmel Center, home to the Philadelphia Orchestra. In addition, SJU students enjoy rooting for Philadelphia's teams in the four major professional sports leagues.

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students to literally enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

## SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Men and women leave Saint Joseph's prepared. The University boasts an excellent record of placing its graduates in first-time jobs, professional schools and other advanced degree programs. Part-time work and internships provide real-world experiences, the kind which delight future employers.
