# K-STATE WELCOMES BYU TO MANHATTAN FOR FIRST TIME

Kansas State continues its season-opening three-game home stand on Wednesday night at 7 p.m., as the Wildcats host BYU for the first time in school history. K-State will look to open a season 2-0 for the second straight season and the 12th time under head coach **Deb Patterson**.

Wednesday night's contest can be seen live on K-StateHD.TV and will be broadcast on the K-State Sports Network. Audio for both will be provided by the award-winning Brian Smoller on the play-by-play and former K-State letterwinner Kristin Waller on the color analysis. At 6:15 p.m., K-StateHD.TV will broadcast K-State Gameday live from the Bramlage Coliseum sideline with Smoller hosting the show and former Wildcat letterwinner Danielle Zanotti providing analysis.

K-State came out on top in a season-opener for the seventh time in the last eight years with a 54-20 win over Dartmouth omn Saturday night. This was the fewest points allowed by K-State in a season-opener in the 44-year history of the program and the fewest points allowed in a game since Dec. 1, 2006 against Mississippi Valley State. The Wildcats forced the Big Green into 28 turnovers, which was aided by 17 steals by the Wildcats. K-State also blocked six shots and outrebounded Dartmouth. 58-31.

The Wildcats were led by senior **Tasha Dickey**, who registered a memorable debut in purple. The guard from Sandy, Utah, finished with a career-high 20 points, six steals and two blocks while adding five rebounds to her final stat line.

Aiding K-State's 26-2 advantage in bench points on Saturday were freshman **Ashia Woods** and sophomore **Chantay Caron**. Woods recorded a solid debut with nine points, seven rebounds, three steals, a block and an assist in 18 minutes of action. Caron picked up seven points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals in 19 minutes.

Following Wednesday night's game with the Cougars, K-State welcomes in the first of two Missouri Valley Conference opponents this season, Missouri State, to Bramlage Coliseum for a 7 p.m., tip on Friday, Nov. 18.

#### PATTERSON RECORDS 300TH WIN AT K-STATE

**Deb Patterson**, the career wins leader in K-State women's basketball history and the longest-tenured women's basketball coach in school history, has a career record of 301-175 (.632) and a record of 129-111 (.538) in the Big 12, including Big 12 regular season titles during the 2003-04 and 2007-08 seasons. Patterson's 300th career victory came in the quarterfinals of the 2011 Big 12 Championships against lowa State on March 9.

Following the 2007-08 season, Patterson was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year by the league's coaches and a number of media outlets. She also garnered national attention, finishing as the Russell Athletic/WBCA Region V Coach of the Year and a finalist for the WBCA and AP National Coach of the Year honors.

Patterson has steered K-State to nine postseason appearances during the last 10 seasons, including a trip to the NCAA Mideast Regional Semifinals in 2002, the 2006 WNIT Postseason crown and a second round trip during the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

# K-STATE 13TH PROGRAM TO 800 WINS

With a 69-64 win at Nebraska on Feb. 19, 2011, Kansas State became the 13th program in NCAA Division I women's basketball history to record 800 or more wins. K-State's record in its 44-year history of women's basketball stands at 804-478 (.627). The Wildcats have accumulated 22 20-win seasons and have secured 242 victories inside Bramlage Coliseum. K-State has 129 wins as a member of the Big 12 conference, while 10 of the victories have come in the NCAA Tournament. The Cats have registered 211 victories when they were ranked in the Associated Press top-25 poll and achieved 67 wins against teams ranked in the AP poll. K-State head coach **Deb Patterson** has achieved the most wins of any of K-State's eight head coaches with 301.

K-State was the fifth program out of six to reach the milestone during the 2010-11 season, joining Stanford, Georgia, Penn State, Long Beach State and Belmont.

# K-STATEHD FO

In a landmark endeavor Kansas State has launched an exclusive, high-definition digital network known as K-StateHD.TV that has provided a world-wide connection to Kansas State University and K-State Athletics and established the university as an international leader in programming, accessibility and exposure.

The K-State women's basketball team will make their first five appearances of the 2011-12 season on the new K-StateHD.TV, beginning with the exhibition opener against Oklahoma City on Nov. 3 at 7 p.m. The additional games on K-StateHD.TV include: the Nov.9 exhibition game against Washburn at 7 p.m., the season opener against Dartmouth on Nov. 12, and match-ups against BYU on Nov. 16 at 7 p.m., and Wichita State on Dec. 10 at 7 p.m.

K-State will also play two contests against Big 12 foes on K-StateHD.TV. The Wildcats' Big 12 home opener against defending national champion Texas A&M on Jan. 4 at 7 p.m., has been selected, as well as K-State's matchup against defending Big 12 champion Baylor at 7 p.m., on Feb. 4.

# CATS PROTECT THE HOUSE AGAINST NON-CON FOES

In its 24th season of action inside Bramlage Coliseum, Kansas State has protected its home floor with determination against non-conference foes with a record of 129-22 (.854) record, including a current streak of nine straight wins.

In the **Deb Patterson** era, the Wildcats have been even better with a record of 92-9 (.911).

# HALFTIME LEAD = K-STATE 'W' SINCE 1999-00

Having the edge after the first 20 minutes of action has proven to be prophetic since the 1999-00 season, as K-State is 207-32 (.866) when leading at the break.

During the last five seasons, K-State owns a 75-6 (.926) record when leading with five minutes to play.

#### WILDCATS IN THE PURPLE PALACE

K-State has enjoyed the friendly confines of Bramlage Coliseum in its 24th season of existence with a record of 242-89 (.731), including a 13-2 mark in 2010-11. During the last 10 seasons, K-State is 116-26 (.817) in Bramlage Coliseum and are 79-41 (.658) in Big 12 home contests.

Kansas State has protected its home floor against non-conference foes with a record of 129-22 (.854) record and a 92-9 (.911) mark in the **Deb Patterson** era.

#### WILDCATS' DEFENSE STRONG IN OPENER

Kansas State's tenacity on the defensive end of the floor picked up where it left off last season in the 2011-12 season-opener. K-State held Dartmouth to just 20 points on a field goal percentage of 13.2 percent (7-of-53). The 20 points allowed were the fewest in a season-opener in the 44-year history of the program. It was the fewest points yielded by the K-State defense since Dec. 1, 2006, when the Wildcats allowed 18 to Mississippi Valley State.

During the last 11 seasons, K-State is 62-1 (.984) when holding an opponent to 49 points or less. In the Deb Patterson-era, K-State has held opponents to 30 points or less five times.

The Wildcats put together a solid defensive effort during the 2010-11 season. K-State held nine of its 32 foes to point totals of 49 points or less, which tied the school record for holding an opponent to 49 points or less. For the season, K-State allowed its foes to score 56.31 points per game.

K-State held its foes this season to a scoring average of 56.31 points, which ranks third in the Big 12 and 36th in the nation. K-State has also held its foes to a field goal percentage of .380, which ranks fifth in the Big 12 and 93rd in the nation.

K-State's bench mark low for points allowed this season came against Nebraska on Jan. 22, as the Huskers scored 37 points. This was the lowest opponent point total since K-State held Missouri to 33 points on Feb. 10, 2010.

Excluding the first two games of the season, the Wildcats have held 26 of the other 30 opponents this season under their scoring average entering the contest with K-State.

# GOOSE EGG FROM DISTANCE FOR BIG GREEN

K-State used a solid defensive performance to register a season-opening win over Dartmouth. The Wildcats' perimeter defense was stout, as K-State held the Big 12 without a connection from beyond the arc on 16 attempts. This was the seventh time in the last six seasons, including the fifth time in the last three seasons, that K-State has held an opponent without a connection from beyond the arc.

Kansas State held a pair of opponents in 2010-11 without a made three-point field goal, including the Big 12's leader in three-point field goal percentage. On Nov. 13, the Wildcats held St. John's without a three-point field goal on seven attempts.

On Jan. 12, K-State's perimeter defense was up to the challenge as it held Oklahoma without a connection from beyond the arc on nine attempts. The Sooners entered the contest as the Big 12 leader in 3-point field goal percentage at .398.

#### K-STATE'S GUARDS CONTINUE TO CRASH THE BOARDS

Continuing a trend that developed under former K-State point guard Megan Mahoney (2001-05), Kansas State's guards continue to attack the glass for rebounds in 2011-12. In the season-opener against Dartmouth, K-State's guards tallied 28 of the team's 58 rebounds (48.3 percent).

Last season, K-State's guards pulled in 511 of the team's 1136 rebounds (45.0 percent). The 45.0 percent of the total rebounds, was the highest percentage in the last 10 years. K-State guards averaged 16.0 rebounds per game, which surpassed the 2009-10 season's final per game average of 14.2. The 14.2 average from last season was the highest in 10 years in terms of rebounds per game from K-State guards.

The K-State guards who attacked the boards last season were **Brittany Chambers** and **Mariah White** with averages of 5.8 and 4.1, respectively.

Chambers, who finished second on the team in rebounding in 2010-11, pulled in 185 total rebounds which included a season-high 13 rebounds against Dartmouth on Dec. 29. She led the team in defensive rebounds per game (130; 4.1 drpg), where 70.3 percent of her rebounds have come from. For her career, she has 37 games with five or more rebounds including eight games with 10 or more and has 374 career rebounds. In the 2009-10 season, Chambers led the team in rebounds with 5.8 per game and was the first freshman to lead K-State in rebounding since Shalee Lehning during the 2005-06 season (6.6 rpg).

White recorded a career-high nine rebounds against St. John's, with eight of the nine coming on the defensive glass. White ranked fifth on the team in rebounds per game and she recorded 13 games with five or more rebounds. She finished the season with a career season-high 132 boards in 2010-11.

#### **DICKEY DOES IT IN DEBUT**

Senior **Tasha Dickey** made her K-State debut a memorable one, as the senior transfer from Arizona tallied 20 points, five rebounds, six steals and two blocked shots in 23 minutes of action in K-State's 54-20 win over Dartmouth on Saturday. Dickey, a guard from Sandy, Utah, registered career-highs in points, free throws made and attempted, steals and blocks with the performance and tied her career-highs in field goals made and attempted. Her 20 points and five free throws made on Saturday were exactly half her point total and free throws made total from the 2010-11 season in 21 games with Arizona

In addition to her career milestones, Dickey tallied the most points in a K-State debut since Laurie Koehn registered 27 against Georgia Tech on Nov. 16, 2001. With her six steals, Dickey pocketed the most steals by a Wildcat since Shalee Lehning carded six against Chattanooga on March 23, 2008 in the NCAA Tournament.

#### **WOODS SOLID AS OAK IN DEBUT**

Freshman **Ashia Woods** made her K-State debut on Saturday with a solid performance off the bench. The guard from Wichita, Kan., recorded nine points, seven rebounds, three steals and a blocked shot in 18 minutes of action against Dartmouth. Her nine points came on 4-of-6 shooting from the field.

Her seven boards were the most rebounds in a K-State debut since Ashley Sweat hauled in eight against Green Bay on Nov. 10, 2006

# **CHAMBERS LOOKING TOWARDS 1,000-POINT MARK**

During K-State's NCAA Tournament first round game against Purdue on March 20, 2011, **Brittany Chambers** surpassed the 900-point plateau for her career and became the fourth player in school history to score a combined 900+ points in their freshman and sophomore seasons. For her career, Chambers has scored 903 points in 65 career games (13.9 ppg). The 2011-12 preseason All-Big 12 honorable mention selection has scored in double figures in 47 career games including 13 games with 20 or more points. She is the 11th player in school history to tally 300+ points in each of her first two seasons as a Wildcat.

For the season, Chambers' point total of 514 ranked fourth in school history for points by a sophomore. She was the fourth player in school history to record 500+ points in their sophomore season and the first since the 2002-03 campaign (Kendra Wecker). Chambers led the squad, ranked 10th in the Big 12 and 95th in the nation with a scoring average of 16.1. Among the sophomore guards in the NCAA Division I final scoring rankings, Chambers ranked 10th.

In league games, Chambers averaged 16.8 points per game to rank 11th and shot 46.7 percent from the field to rank 10th on her way to earning a unanimous All-Big 12 first team honor from the league's coaches. During the last nine games of the season, Chambers averaged 19.1 points and shot 48.6 percent from the field including 40.7 percent from beyond the arc.

# CHAMBERS MOVES INTO TOP-10 FOR CAREER 3-PT FGS

**Brittany Chambers** continued to be a deep threat for the Wildcats, shooting 88-of-236 (.373) from beyond the arc in 2010-11. She led the Big 12 and ranked 26th in the nation in three-point field goals made per game at 2.8 and ranked third in the nation among sophomore guards for 3-point field goals made per game. Her .373 three-point shooting percentage finished eighth in the Big 12 and 71st in the nation.

Her 88 connections from beyond the arc set a school record for 3-point field goals made by a sophomore. Chambers was the fourth player in school history to make 80 or more 3-point field goals in a season and her 88 connections ranked fifth in school history for a single season and her 236 attempts ranked fifth.

In 2010-11, Chambers made two or more 3-point field goals in 23 games, including 11 games with four or more connections from deep. She tallied her career-high performance with seven connections against Texas A&M on March 2. She became the first Wildcat

to make six 3-point field goals in three games in a season since Laurie Koehn made six or more in four games during the 2003-04 season.

For her career, Chambers has 57 career games with a 3-point field goal including 14 games with four or more connections from beyond the arc. She is 153-of-411 (.372) in 65 games with the Wildcats and ranks tied for seventh in school history for career 3-point field goals made and eighth for three-point field goals attempted. Her current career percentage ranks 10th in school history.

#### CHAMBERS, CHILDS FORM INSIDE-OUT SCORING DUO

K-State leaned heavily during the 2010-11 season on the production of its two All-Big 12 performers, guard **Brittany Chambers** (514 points) and forward **Jalana Childs** (411 points). The pair was responsible for 925 of the team's 1,950 points last season (47.4 percent) and one of the two players paced the team in scoring in 25 of the team's 32 contests. They are the first K-State teammates since the 2008-09 season to each score 400+ points in a season. The pair scored in double figures in the same game in 17 contests.

Chambers and Childs sparked Kansas State to a 69-64 win at Nebraska on Feb. 19, as the tandem combined for 54 of the Wildcats' 69 points. In the latter stages of the second half of the contest, the duo combined to score 25 of K-State's final 27 points.

The effort by the two players was historic, as it was the 19th time in school history that two Wildcats have combined to score 50 or more points in a game, but it was the first time since Jan. 29, 2005. K-State is 19-0 when two players combine to score at least 50 points in the same game.

The output by Chambers and Childs ranked tied for the fourthmost points scored by two Wildcats in a single game since the 1986-87 season. Of the 19 games in which two Wildcats scored 50 or more points, Chambers and Childs rank first in terms of percentage of the team's total points accounted for (78.3).

# CHILDS TALLIES 700 POINTS FOR HER CAREER

Jalana Childs put her improved low post game on full display during the 2010-11 season and was rewarded with All-Big 12 second team honors. For the season, Childs was K-State's second-leading scorer and ranked 19th in the Big 12 with a career-best scoring average of 12.8 points (411 points) for all games and ranked 12th for league-only games and led the Wildcats with 15.7 points per game (251 points). Her field goal percentage of .454 for all games ranked 15th in the Big 12 and 104th in the nation. She was the second Wildcat in 2010-11 to reach the 400-point plateau (Brittany Chambers).

At Baylor on Feb. 23, Childs tied her career-high with 22 points which was her fourth 20+ scoring effort of the season and of her career. She has reached double figures in points in 34 career games, including 20 in 2010-11.

At lowa State on Feb. 13, Childs notched her second career 20-point game as she tallied 21 points, including 19 in the second half, and was a career-best 10-of-16 from the field.

Against Oklahoma State in the Big 12 opener, the product of Or-

lando, Fla., tallied her second career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Ironically, Childs' first career double-double also came against the Cowgirls as she notched 14 points and her careerhigh of 16 rebounds on Feb. 15, 2009.

For her career, Childs has scored 755 points and was the second Wildcat in 2010-11 to reach the 700-point club for a career (**Brittany Chambers**).

#### WHAT BROWN HAS DONE FOR US

**Branshea Brown** gave K-State a strong interior presence to pair with **Jalana Childs** in 2010-11. For the season, Brown averaged a career-best 5.4 points on a .437 field goal percentage, a team-leading 0.7 blocks and a team-leading and career-best 5.8 rebounds per game and was fourth in steals with 1.1. She ranked ninth in the Big 12 for offensive rebounds per game (2.5 orpg).

Against St. John's, Brown turned in one of her best games as she touched every statistical category with a career-high 14 points on 5-of-6 shooting, six rebounds, four blocks, a steal and an assist.

At Colorado on Jan. 26 and against Kansas on Jan. 29, Brown tied her career-high for rebounds with 11 against the Buffaloes and then pulled in 10 against the Jayhawks. In both games, Brown pulled in six offensive boards. This was her second and third double-figure rebounding effort of 2010-11, as she pulled in 11 at lowa on Dec. 5. She led the Wildcats in offensive rebounds with 81, which represented 43.1 percent of her total rebounds.

For her career, she has 33 games with five or more rebounds, including seven games with double figures.

#### **BROWN WITH THE BLOCKS**

**Branshea Brown** paced the Wildcats in blocked shots with a career-high 22 in the 2010-11 season. Her blocked shot total for a season is the highest by a Wildcat since Marlies Gipson sent back a school record 86 during the 2008-09 campaign.

The product of Walterboro, S.C., sent back a career-high four shots against St. John's and South Dakota State, which is the highest total by a Wildcat since Marlies Gipson tallied four blocks at Kansas on Jan. 24, 2009. She is the first player since Gipson in 2008-09 to block at least four shots in two games in a season.

Brown has 11 career games with two or more blocked shots and 49 blocks for her career.

# WHITE HOT MARIAH

Guard **Mariah White** displayed one of the most improved games of any of the Wildcats during the 2010-11 season. In the 32 games, White averaged a career-nigh 4.8 points and led the team with 3.9 assists and 1.5 steals. She finished fifth on the team in rebounding with 4.1 per game. Her assists per game ranked ninth in the Big 12 for all games and was tied for 10th in league contests (3.5 apg) and she was fourth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.7) for all games. Her assist-to-turnover ratio ranked 47th in the nation.

In 2010-11, White reset her career-highs for points in a game (17), points in a season (152), rebounds in a game (9), rebounds in a season (132), assists in a game (8), assists in a season (126), steals in a game (5) and steals in a season (49). She also made more free throws (43) than she attempted during her entire freshman campaign in 2009-10 (13).

White is on the cusp of joining the career assists list in school history, as she currently has 163 and needs 10 to move into 28th on the career chart.

# 2011-12 KANSAS STATE GAME RECAPS AND BOX SCORES

GAME DARTMOUTH 20 54 November 12, 2011 • Manhattan, Kan.

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Making her career-debut at K-State a memorable one, senior Tasha Dickey led the Wildcats to a season-opening 54-20 win on Saturday night in Bramlage Coliseum over Dartmouth.

Dickey registered a career-high 20 points and six steals and added five rebounds and two blocks to her diverse final stat line. Her 20 points were the most scored by a Wildcat making their career debut in purple since Laurie Koehn poured in 27 against Georgia Tech on Nov. 16, 2001. Dickey's six steals were the most by a Wildcat since Shalee Lehning tallied six against Chattanooga in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament.

Also adding to the cause on Saturday night were freshman Ashia Woods and sophomore Chantay Caron. Woods carded nine points, seven rebounds, three steals and a blocked shot in 18 minutes off the bench. Woods' seven boards were the most by a Wildcat making her career debut since Ashley Sweat pulled in eight against Green Bay on Nov. 10, 2006.

Caron registered seven points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals in 19 minutes of action off the bench. In total, K-State's bench outscore the Dartmouth bench 26-2 on Saturday evening.

As a team, K-State (1-0) recorded a sound defensive effort by allowing just 20 Dart-mouth points, which were scored on just a 13.2 field goal percentage (7-of-53). The 20 points were the fewest allowed by the Wildcats since surrendering 18 to Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 1, 2006.

In addition to the 20 points allowed, the Wildcats forced 28 Big Green turnovers with the aid of 17 steals. K-State also controlled the glass, 58-31. The 17 thefts were the most since K-State notched 23 against Western Illinois on Nov. 21, 2003.

Kansas State jumped out to a 12-3 lead on the strength of its defense, by holding the Big Green to one field goal on its first 17 attempts in the first 10 minutes of the game. During the run, K-State was paced by the interior play of Jalana Childs with four points and the defense and rebounding of Dickey.

Dickey ended an 8-minute K-State drought with her first career 3-point field goal at the six minute mark to give K-State a 16-6 lead. She then exploded to the basket for a layup to boost the K-State lead to 21-6. A fast break lay-in by Caron gave the Wildcats a 23-6 edge and forced Dartmouth to call their second timeout of the half.

K-State pieced together an 11-4 run in the first eight minutes of the second half to extend the lead. Chisholm and Caron each hit a three during the run. The K-State defense opened the second half just as solid as the first, holding the Big Green to one field goal on their first 13 attempts in the opening 11 minutes.
