

WHY DUKES?

he nickname "Dukes" goes back to the changing of the name of the university from The University of the Holy Ghost to Duquesne University of the Holy Ghost in 1911. The Duquesne name was chosen in honor of Marquis Duquesne, who built Fort Duquesne at the confluence of the Monongahela and Allegheny Rivers in 1754, and is recognized as the first man to bring Catholic observances to the City of Pittsburgh.

Since a Marquis and a Duke dress similarly, the unofficial symbol of the school's athletic teams became a man dressed in a top hat, tails and a sash of royalty across his chest. "Dukes" being more readily known than "Marquis," the name Duke was popularly assigned to the symbol and stuck ever since the fall of 1911.

A new Duke came to town for the 2006-07 season when Duquesne University Director of Athletics Greg Amodio unveiled an aggressive look for DU's 20-sport intercollegiate athletics program with the release of a new logo (above) July 26, 2006.

The primary mark, a determined top-hatted Duke with a flowing cape above the words "Duquesne Dukes," replaces the script "Duquesne" used by the department since the fall of 1998.

The new identity program for Duquesne Athletics was created by award-winning Rickabaugh Graphics of Columbus, Ohio.

Duquesne's school colors of red and blue, the colors of the Congregation of the Holy Ghost, have been in place since the school's inception.


Glistening skyscrapers, bordered on all sides by flowing rivers and lush green hills welcome visitors to an area known widely as one of America's most livable cities.

SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

t Duquesne University, coaches and staff believe that academic excellence, combined with the competitive edge of athletics, are the keys to a successful career.

Duquesne academic counselors visit regularly with student-athletes and provide assistance on matters such as registration, degree planning and compliance with University and NCAA policies and procedures. DU counselors also have an excellent relationship with the University administration, faculty and deans.

The four or five years spent on a college campus represent one of the most important times of a young person's life. Duquesne University is the right choice for the person who has the same high goals both academically and athletically.

GRADUATION RATE LAUDED

Duquesne University was cited among the nation's Top 15 in highest graduation rate by U.S. News & World Report in its March 18, 2002 edition. DU's student-athlete graduation rate was +8 percentage points higher than that of the general student body.

DUKES SOCCER REPORT CARD

The Duquesne University men's soccer program excels in the classroom as well as on the field. Evidence of this lies in the fact that the Dukes have been cited by the NSCAA for academic success in each of the past eight seasons, including the 2003-04 campaign when they had the second highest team grade point average in the country.

Individually, Duquesne has had the Atlantic 10 Men's Soccer Student-Athlete of the Year in each of the past five years and six out of a possible seven years. Noah Salsi was chosen the past two years as a sophomore and junior, following Jason Kutney in 2003 and Terry McNelis in 2001 and 2002. Salsi was also chosen as an *ESPN The Magazine* First Team Academic All-American and an Academic All-District 2 choice in 2005 and an ESPN the Magazine Second Team Academic All-American and an Academic All-District 2 honoree in 2004.

Last year, Salsi became the third Duquesne men's soccer player to be named First Team CoSIDA Academic All-America, following up Jason Kutney in 2003 and Terry McNelis in 2002. It also marked the sixth straight year and the eighth out of ten total that DU had a national honoree.

In 2002, Duquesne had three soccer players (Jason Kutney, Terry McNelis and Christian Reinecker) named to the Verizon Academic All-America Teams, making it one of just three schools to have more than one player named Academic All-America (St. John's and Western Illinois were the others) and the only school in the nation to have three. McNelis also became just the third DU student-athlete to be named a three-time Academic All-American, following former basketball player Korie Hlede who was honored from 1996-98 and cross-country/track standout Kelsie Hess (1996-97).

Over the years, Duquesne has had 10 different men's soccer players named to the All-District 2 Team a total of 17 times. In fact, Scott Gibson, Jared Helfrich, Noah Salsi and Zach Varga's Academic All-District selections last year made it the tenth straight year that Duquesne had a men's soccer player chosen. District 2 includes schools in Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and West Virginia).

To be eligible for the Verizon awards, a student-athlete must be at least a sophomore at their institution, be a starter or important reserve and has at least a 3.20 cumulative grade point average on a 4.00 scale.



ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

n March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation work. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. In doing so, the Atlantic 10, under the leadership of commissioner Linda Bruno, instituted the Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better. The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. A male and female Scholar-Athlete of the Year, which encompasses all A-10 sports, is also named. The Atlantic 10 also provides postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes. The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 73 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

2005-06 REVIEW

he Atlantic 10 saw 18 teams earn NCAA bids in 2005-06 and six teams represented in the NIT for a total of 24 post-season team participants. In all, 392 teams have represented the Atlantic 10 Conference in postseason play since the 1976-77 season.

Individually, cross country performers Sean Quigley and Rachel Papin of La Salle and Charlotte's Cassie Ficken earned All-America status after qualifying for the NCAA Championship. Charlotte's Shareese Woods also claimed All-America honors in the indoor 400 meters, while teammate Courtney Patterson was named an All-American in the outdoor 100 meters. Kate Austin of George Washington was named a second-team All-American in women's rowing, while Temple's Candice Dupree garnered third-team honors in women's basketball. Men's basketball players Mardy Collins of Temple and Steven Smith of La Salle and Xavier women's basketball player Tara Boothe were named Associated Press honorable mention All-Americans. Chase Eckard of Charlotte was named a Junior All-American in the outdoor 800 meters, while Richmond's Jessica Young was honored in the outdoor 200 and 400 meters.

Additionally, Charlotte's Roy Sichel became the first player in school history to qualify individually for the NCAA men's tennis championship; **Duquesne's Tom Slosky** (3,000-meter steeplechase), Quigley (10,000 meters), Papin (10,000 meters), and Charlotte's Lamarra Currie (4x100-meter relay), Tsehaye Dagnachew (3,000-meter steeplechase), Ficken (5,000 meters), Patterson (100 meters, 4x100-meter relay), Pat Springs (4x100-meter relay), and Woods (100 meters, 200 meters, 4x100-meter relay) all qualified for the NCAA outdoor track & field championships.

Atlantic 10 student-athletes excel in the classroom as well. In all, 22 Atlantic 10 student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America teams, including **Duquesne's** first team honoree **Noah Salsi** (men's soccer); second-team Academic All-Americans **Bob Healy** (men's track & field) and **Steve Maiolo** (baseball) as well as third team pick **Melissa Stewart** (women's track & field).

Dr. Charles J. Dougherty University President

harles J. Dougherty, Ph.D., was elected president of Duquesne University by its Board of Directors in May 2001. His selection as the 12th president of Duquesne University came with overwhelming support from the campus community

and the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, the sponsors of Duquesne

Dougherty, 57, is a nationally recognized scholar and expert in health care ethics, and has served on numerous health care advisory commissions and projects. Most recently, Dougherty has worked with the Not-for-Profit Hospital Trustees Project at the Hastings Center and the New York Academy of Medicine, as well as the National Coalition on Catholic Health Care. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the Catholic Health Association and the Board of Editors at both Creighton University Press and "Health Progress." Dougherty has also served as a Commissioner for the State of Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission, a government

He is a member of the Board of Directors of Mercy Hospital; Mercy Health Systems in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; The Allegheny Conference on Community Development, Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership; World Affairs Council of Pittsburgh; and the Urban League of Pittsburgh. He serves on the board of the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania and is the Chair of the President's Committee of the Pittsburgh Council on Higher Education.

Dougherty has published extensively on the subject of ethics and health care. His publications on the subject include two books published by Oxford University Press and more than 50 scholarly

He received his master's and doctorate degrees in philosophy from the University of Notre Dame in 1973 and 1975; he received his bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. Bonaventure

University in 1971.

Dougherty comes to Duquesne from Creighton University in Omaha, Neb., a Catholic university operated by the Jesuits. He served as academic vice president from 1995 to 2001 and as acting president of Creighton in the summer of 2000. Dougherty joined the Creighton faculty in 1975, and chaired the department of philosophy from 1981 to 1989. He also has held faculty appointments in medicine, pharmacy, dentistry and nursing, and served as the first director of the Creighton Center for Health Policy and Ethics from 1988 to 1995.

Born in New York City on June 28, 1949, Dougherty has been educated in Catholic schools all his life, including St. Anthony's High School in Smithtown, NY. The oldest of four children, Dougherty was the first in his family to attend college.

Dougherty and his wife, Sandra, who is a judge on the Nebraska District Court in Douglas County, have two children: a daughter, who is a Notre Dame and Georgetown University graduate working as a lawyer in Washington, D.C.; and a son, a Creighton alum who works as an employment counselor in Omaha.

Duquesne University was founded in 1878 and is located in downtown Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Duquesne has 10,000 students, 10 schools, more than 2,500 employees, an annual budget of approximately \$150 million, and an endowment of more than \$130 million.



Greg Amodio Director of Athletics

reg Amodio, cited by Duquesne University President Dr. Charles Dougherty as "one of the brightest young minds of college athletics" at the time of his hiring, is in his second year as DU's director of athletics.

Amodio, who came to the Bluff after a 10-year stay at Xavier University, wasted no time in putting his stamp on Duquesne's athletics programs by overseeing completion of a \$2 million renovation of the A.J. Palumbo Center. He also introduced a contemporary look for the department with the introduction of a new athletics logo this summer. On the personnel front, Amodio was responsible for the hiring of head men's basketball coach Ron Everhart and the addition of full-time assistant coaches for three other sports.

While at Xavier, the 44-year-old Amodio moved up from assistant director of marketing and promotions, to assistant athletic director and finally to associate athletic director. As associate AD, he managed a strategic, integrated program focused on increasing attendance, enhancing alumni participation in athletics and increasing fund-raising. During his last seven seasons at XU, men's basketball attendance reached 97 percent capacity and women's basketball attendance increased 150 percent.

Amodio directed the corporate partner programs, season and group ticket sales strategy, advertising campaign, fund-raising initiatives and game operations for Xavier athletics. In addition, the Long Island, N.Y. native served as administrator for the men's soccer program and participated in the Atlantic 10 Conference Men's Soccer Committee and the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators (NACMA).

Prior to his stint at Xavier, he served as the promotions manager for the Professional Golfers', Association of America, with a focus on national fund-raising programs and junior golf initiatives. He also served as coordinator of Community Programs and Educations with the American Heart Association in New York City and spent five years as a high school teacher/coach.

Amodio earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from the City University of New York, Queens College. While at Queens College, he served as a research assistant in the Department of Health & Physical Education. Amodio received his bachelor's degree in education in 1984 from Davis & Elkins College.

He is currently serving on the Atlantic 10 Television Committee. Amodio and his wife, Kerry, have two children: Jake (13) and Alexandra (11). The Amodios reside in Pine Township.


WHERE WE ARE ...

With enrollment continuing to grow and general interest in health and wellness increasing, University President Dr. Charles Dougherty made a bold move to expand the University by acquiring several blocks of Forbes Avenue for construction of a 125,000-square-foot multi-purpose recreation center.

By the end of 2007, the recreational center is expected to open its doors and will boast modern cardio-fitness exercise equipment, basketball and racquetball courts, locker rooms, exercise and dance studios, athletics offices and new classrooms. In the first phase, this multipurpose center will also house a window-filled conference space with a ballroom, kitchen and roof-top deck, Barnes and Noble Booksellers, Starbucks and other retail shopping.

2006 OUTLOOK

irst year head coach Jake Ouimet takes the reigns of the Duquesne men's soccer program in 2006, looking to lead the Dukes to its first Atlantic 10 Championship crown and NCAA Championship appearance. He brings recent postseason experience to the Dukes as an assistant coach at Atlantic 10 foe George Washington where the Colonials captured the 2002 and 2004 A-10 titles and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tourney in 2004.

Ouimet has the tools in place at Duquesne to make his first season as a head coach a successful one, with eight starters and 16 lettermen returning, including three pre-season Atlantic 10 All-Conference honorees in senior defenseman **Noah Salsi**, senior goalkeeper **Zach Varga** and junior midfielder **Travis MacKenzie**.

Salsi has started all 57 possible games at Duquesne and brings experience and leadership at both ends of the field. He helped lead a Duquesne defense that allowed a league-low 13 goals last season and also filled the net three times and assisted on two other goals. Varga has been a mainstay in goal for Duquesne the past three seasons, posting a school record 0.76 goals against average through three cam-

In recent years, the Dukes have been a perennial force in the Atlantic 10, qualifying for the post-season tournament in each of the past four years and capturing or sharing the regular season title the past three. Duquesne has also established itself as one of the top defensive teams in the Atlantic 10, allowing just 13 goals in 18 contests in 2005, 18 scores in 20 matches in 2004 and 14 goals in 19 games in 2003.

FORWARDS

Duquesne lost four forwards to graduation during the off-season, leaving a bulk of play-

ing time available for a few returnees and a couple newcomers. Leading the competition will be senior **Tom Sochacki**. Sochacki started all 18 games in 2005 and was tied for third in scoring with 10 points on three goals and four assists. Junior **Garrett MacKeznie** also saw significant field time last season, playing in 15 matches and making two starts. He scored his first collegiate goal last year, burying the game winner at Robert Morris. Sophomore **Drew**



MIDFIELDERS

Travis MacKenzie and fellow junior Greg Annan head a deep corps of midfielders. Annan started all 18 matches and was fourth on the squad with nine points, scoring twice and assisting a team-best five times. Senior Brian Bartek and sophomore John Strosser were also key contributors to last year's success. Both started all 18 contests and combined for four assists. Also providing quality minutes were junior Nick Balara and sophomore Evan Browne. Sophomore transfers Bryan Matthews (Virginia Tech) and Phil Kowalick (Marshall) and true freshman Matthew Groves will also push the veterans.

DEFENSEMEN

Seniors Salsi and Jared Helfrich return to lead the top-ranked Duquesne defense for a fourth straight year. Helfrich started the first ten matches last year, before an injury ended his season early. In those ten games, he managed a goal and an assist, both of which were collegiate firsts. This experienced duo will seek help from sophomores Pat Flinn and Brock Weaver who combined to play in 24 matches as freshmen. Redshirt freshman Kevin Foglesong and true freshmen Austin Haller and Patrick McKinney will challenge for playing time.





JAKE OUIMET • HEAD COACH



ake Ouimet was named the head coach of the Duquesne University soccer program in March, 2006, making him the third head coach in the 11-year history of the sport on the Bluff. He comes to Duquesne after seven seasons on the George Washington University men's soccer coaching staff, including one year as associate head coach. He spent six seasons as the Colonials assistant

coach before being promoted to associate head coach in July 2005. Ouimet, 33, replaces Wade Jean, who guided the Dukes over the past eight seasons.

During his tenure at GW, Ouimet served as recruiting coordinator and was the primary assistant in the day-to-day running of the program. In that capacity, he was also responsible for field coaching, player development, opponent scouting and match preparation.

Twelve Colonials earned all-conference honors while Ouimet was at George Washington and his efforts have also helped produce two Atlantic 10 Championships, including the school's first in 2002 as well as two NCAA Tournament berths, one in 2002 and more recently in 2004. He has also helped guide the Colonials to four of the past five Atlantic 10 Championships and was instrumental in the Colonials historical win over the University of North Carolina in 2004.

A standout player at the University of Maine from 1992-96, he was the 1992 North Atlantic Conference Rookie of the Year. Ouimet is the all-time leader in career goals and points at the University of Maine and was a three-time regional All-American. He graduated from Maine in 1996 with a degree in business administration.

As a player in the professional ranks, Ouimet competed for the Worcester Wildfire of the A-League from 1997-98, leading the team in points and goals. He was named to the A-League Team of the Week on July 20, 1997. Ouimet also played for the Cape Cod Crusaders of the USISL from 1998-99 and led the squad in points and goals. He was named the USISL Player of the Week on July 8, 1998.

Ouimet began his coaching career in 1997 as an assistant with the boys varsity soccer team at W.T. Woodson High School in Fairfax, VA, where he coached for two seasons.

In addition to his collegiate coaching, Ouimet has also been the head coach of the Sterling United Soccer Club, a highly competitive team, ranked in the top three in Virginia. He also holds two diplomas from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) where he received both his national and advanced national diplomas from the organization.

Ouimet resides in the Pittsburgh area, with his wife, Rose, and daughters Olivia (7) and Elle (3).

ARTHUR J. ROONEY ATHLETIC FIELD

ocated high atop the Bluff in the center of the Duquesne University campus, Arthur J. Rooney Athletic Field is one of the most unique facilities in the nation. Bordered by Academic Walk on one side and Mellon Hall of Science and the Duquesne Towers Living and Learning Center on either end, Rooney Field also offers scenic views of downtown Pittsburgh, the Monongahela River and Pittsburgh's historic South Side.

The lighted, AstroPlay-covered facility, which celebrates its 13th anniversary this season, was named in honor of Duquesne University football letterman and founder of the Pittsburgh Steelers National Football League team, Art Rooney.

The completion of Rooney Field in 1993 enabled the Dukes to play football on campus for the first time since 1929 and the addition of three varsity sports — men's soccer, women's soccer, and women's lacrosse.

Foresight and planning turned a former staff and faculty parking lot into what is now the focus of the Duquesne campus. Workers had to cut down approximately six feet to finish the playing surface. The excavation created both excellent sight lines and the terrace effect that allowed for concrete bleachers on the Academic Walk side of the field and a grassy knoll on the Bluff Street side of the field. During the season, temporary bleachers are installed on the Bluff Street side of the field to better accommodate fans.

A field house, located off the east end zone, houses football coaches' offices, a conference room, a fully operational athletic training room and home and visitor locker rooms. A three-tier press box, funded largely by the contribution from the Eugene P. Beard family, was completed in the summer of 1995.

At the end of each fall season, an air-supported structure is erected over a 70-yard portion of the playing field. The lighted, temperature-controlled "bubble" — originally purchased by the Pittsburgh Steelers — provides Duquesne student-athletes with a spacious and comfortable area in which to train.

In addition to serving as home for the DU men's and women's soccer and women's lacrosse teams, numerous other activities are held on Rooney Field. Metro Index football coaches clinics, soccer and lacrosse camps, baseball and track practices along with intramural activities kept he field in constant use.

Rooney Field has enjoyed the national spotlight on the football front as the host of three televised games. On Monday, October 31, 1994, ESPN2 televised U's 16-12 win over Iona to a national audience. In addition, two games in 1995 — the MAAC Championship-deciding game vs. St. John's and the ECAC Bowls game vs. Wagner — were aired locally by the then-Prime Sports. Rooney Field was the site of the 2003 Atlantic 10 Women's Lacrosse Championship.

DIRECTIONS TO ROONEY FIELD

From the Airport - WEST

Take route 60 South from the airport exit. Follow signs for Pittsburgh. Route 60 merges into I-279 (the Parkway). Follow I-279 to Downtown Pittsburgh. You will enter the Downtown area through the Fort Pitt Tunnel/Fort Pitt Bridge. Stay in the right lane through the tunnel and over the bridge. Veer right at the end of the bridge and follow signs for Exit #8 [Monroeville/ I-376). Merge into the left lane and take the Grant Street exit. Follow Grant Street to Forbes Avenue and turn right. Follow Forbes Avenue (0.2 miles) to the Forbes Avenue parking garage (on right). Take elevator to eighth floor. There is a map located outside of the elevator that will direct you to Rooney Field.

From the NORTH

Take I-79 South to I-279 South. Take I-579 (Veterans Memorial Bridge) across the Allegheny River to the 6th and 7th Avenue Exit. Follow signs to Mellon Arena. At the traffic light when you are facing Mellon Arena, make a right onto Washington Place. To get to the Forbes Avenue parking garage, make a left at the third light onto Forbes Avenue. The Forbes Avenue parking garage is located on the right-hand side of the street (just past the McAnulty Drive entrance to Duquesne). Take elevator to eighth floor. There is a map located outside of the elevator that will direct you to Rooney Field.

From the SOUTH

Take I-79 North to the Parkway (I-279), continue to the city as described above (from the airport). If you are coming from Route 51 or Route 19, head north until you reach the entrance of the Liberty Tunnels (downtown Pittsburgh). Go through the tunnel and cross the Liberty Bridge in the right lane. Follow bridge to the light at Forbes Avenue. Make a right at the light, pass the Armstrong Tunnels (on right) and the McAnulty Drive entrance to campus. Make a right into the Forbes Avenue parking garage. Take elevator to eighth floor. There is a map located outside of the elevator that will direct you to Rooney Field.

From the EAST

Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Monroeville (Pittsburgh Exit) and follow the Parkway (I-376) to Blvd. of the Allies/ Duquesne University exit. Stay in right lane, The road will split into a "Y", keep right. This takes you onto the campus of Duquesne University. On football game days, you must make a right on Stevenson Street, cross Forbes Avenue and make a left on Fifth Avenue. Proceed to Washington Place and make a left (the McAnulty Drive entrance to campus will be directly in front of you. The Forbes Avenue parking garage is lo-cated on the righthand side of the street (just past the McAnulty entrance to Duquesne). Take elevator to eighth floor. There is a map located outside of the elevator that will direct you to Rooney Field.

2005 IN REVIEW

he men's soccer team extended its recent success by claiming a portion of its third straight Atlantic 10 regular season title with a 13-5-0 record and attaining an all-time best national ranking of 13th in 2005. Eighth year head coach Wade Jean was named Coach of the Year for the second straight season and fourth time in his tenure at Duquesne. The Dukes made their fourth straight Atlantic 10 Championship appearance and saw four players receive All-Conference recognition.

The season opened on a positive note, with the Dukes hosting St. Bonaventure in a non-conference match and taking a 2-0 victory from the visiting Bonnies. Steve Mellor had a goal and an assist while Travis MacKenzie had the game-winner. The following weekend, the Dukes traveled to St. Bonaventure for the SBU Classic. The Red and Blue bowed to nationally ranked Binghamton, 1-0 before rebounding to top Western Michigan, 3-1. Mellor, MacKenzie and Tom Sochacki were named to the All-Tournament Team.

DU ran off three more victories in the upcoming days, defeating Cal-Poly and Marshall in the Dayton Invitational and blanking visiting Cleveland State, 3-0 on Rooney Field. Jared Helfrich was named the Most Outstanding Player of the tourney while Mellor, Noah Salsi and Zach Varga garnered All-Tournament laurels. A brief trip to the West Coast resulted in a 3-0 loss at San Diego State before a 1-0 win at Robert Morris closed out the non-conference portion of the schedule.

The Atlantic 10 slate opened with the Dukes hosting its first five conference opponents. The Red and Blue managed one-goal victories in the first three contests over Saint Joseph's, Temple and UMass, setting up the two most exciting home matches of the season. The Dukes would host Rhode Island on a sunny Sunday afternoon for Senior Day. It was a sophomore however that gave the Dukes the overtime victory as Greg Annan buried the winning goal in the 105th minute. Standing at 4-0 in A-10 play, the Red and Blue would then host conference newcomer Saint Louis who was also 4-0. Rich in tradition and deep in talent, the Billikens handed the Dukes their only home loss of the season, a 3-2 overtime decision.

DU closed out conference play by shutting out its next three opponents on the road and bowing, 1-0 at Charlotte. The Dukes, though tied for first in the standings, entered the Atlantic 10 Championship as the two-seed, facing third-seeded Rhode Island. The Rams sought revenge from their earlier loss to the Dukes and found it, topping DU, 2-1 in overtime. After a scoreless first half, Duquesne grabbed the lead as Sochacki found the net off an assist from John Strosser in the 68th minute. However, a controversial penalty kick was issued to URI in the 81st minute, allowing the Rams to tie the score and send the game into overtime. It was there that the Dukes' dreams were dashed for a fourth straight year as Rhode Island captured the victory and eventually, the Atlantic 10 Championship.

Overall, the season was a success with several Dukes receiving post-season accolades and the program reaching new national notoriety. The agony of defeat would linger however and should motivate the players returning in 2006.
