Matilda Mossman Western Kentucky, 1979 Head Coach First Season

Matilda Mossman was appointed as the head women's basketball coach at The University of Tulsa on March 22, 2011. Most recently a prep coach in Oklahoma, Mossman previously held head coaching stints on the collegiate level at both the University of Arkansas and Kansas State University.

In over 16 years as a head coach, Mossman has compiled a 341-149 record for a .697 winning percentage. She has served as a head collegiate coach for eight years, while coaching on the high school level for the last nine seasons.

Mossman spent the past nine years as the head basketball coach at Norman High School, where her teams compiled an overall 191-53 record for a .796 winning percentage. Her teams qualified for the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Athletic Association (OSSAA) Class 6A state tournament in each of the last eight seasons.

Her prep teams won eight straight regional championships and advanced to the state semifinals six times, while winning 20+ games in seven of those seasons. Mossman led Norman High School to the state title in 2005 with an overall 25-3 record.

In 2010-11, Mossman coached the Norman team to a 19-9 record and advanced to the state quarterfinals. A year earlier, Mossman's team posted a 23-6 record and finished as the Class 6A state runner-up. Her teams also made the state semifinals in 2003-04, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2008-09.

In over eight years as a collegiate head coach, Mossman registered an overall 147-94 record. She had a 67-27 mark in three seasons at Arkansas and an 80-66 mark at Kansas State in five years, and is 0-1 this sesason.

Following her stint at Kansas State, Mossman served as an assistant coach at Illinois State under WBCA Hall of Fame Coach Jill Hutchison for three seasons (1991-94). She left the collegiate coaching profession following the 1993-94 season to spend time raising her two sons, while also teaching and coaching in Illinois.

Mossman earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1979 and her graduate degree in education in 1980, both from Western Kentucky.

She has two sons, Scott, 24, and Matt, 20.

Tulsa Hosts Home Opener against BYU

The University of Tulsa women's basketball team will open the home slate on Monday, Nov. 14th against BYU. Game time is set for 7:00 pm at the Donald W. Reynolds Center.

The Cougars have won all five previous meetings with TU, including a 78-59 victory in the last meeting in the first round of the Western Athletic Conference tournament in 1999.

Scouting the Cougars

The Cougars started the season with a 61-55 loss to Duke on Friday night. BYU netted a 25-9 mark, including a first-place 15-1 record in the West Coast Conference, and advanced to the third round of the WNIT a year ago. BYU returns seven letterwinners, including two starters, and welcomes five newcomers to the roster.

Kristen Riley is the returning scoring leader with 8.9 ppg, while Hayley Steed (Hall) had 8.5 ppg and Jennifer Hamson posted 7.7 ppg.

Last Time Out

The Tulsa women's basketball team opened the Matilda Mossman era with a narrow 52-48 loss to UALR last Friday at the Jack Stephens Center.

The Golden Hurricane received a career night from junior forward Tiffani Couisnard, who hauled in a career-high-tying 15 rebounds and added seven points. Junior guard Taleya Mayberry led the team in scoring with 17 points on 5-of-15 shooting. She also made a game-high six free throws.

Change in Attitude, Work Ethic and Expectations

The Tulsa women's basketball team is under the direction of the excitable and exuberant Matilda Mossman. Since she stepped foot on the TU campus in March, she has talked about a change in attitude, a change in work ethic and a change in expectations. Mossman not only brings a refreshing excitement to the Tulsa program, but an abundance of coaching experience and success.

Who Returns?

The Golden Hurricane team returns nine letterwinners, including four starters, and welcomes four newcomers to the roster. The Tulsa team features seniors Virginia DeWare, Denise Lewis and Chanice Scott; juniors Andrea Coggin, Tiffani Couisnard, Taleya Mayberry and Jessica McQuin; sophomores Taylor Hooker, Amanda Mason and Loren McDaniel; and freshmen Kadan Brady, Amber Fleet and Mariah Turner.

A Challenging Road Ahead

The Hurricane schedule is challenging as Tulsa takes on 10 post-season tournament teams and six teams that posted 20 or more wins a year ago. TU will face NCAA tournament teams Arkansas-Little Rock, Houston and UCF; WNIT teams BYU, Memphis, Oral Roberts, Rice, TCU and Tulane; and Women's Basketball Invitational National Champion UAB.

A Hurricane in Tulsa?

The Origination of The University of Tulsa nickname - Golden Hurricane - was created in 1922. A new football coach, Howard Archer came to town and inherited a slew of nicknames dating back to 1895. In the past, Tulsa had been named "Kendallites," "Presbyterians," "Tigers," "Orange and Black," "Tulsans," and of course, "Yellow Jackets." The team started working out in the fall with a new nickname "Yellow Jackets" which was apparently due to the fact that the team was wearing new black and yellow uniforms. The team opened the season and it was apparent that Tulsa was going to have a great year, and trying to seize some publicity for his team, Archer wanted to find a new nickname quickly. After a remark was made in practice one day about "roaring through opponents," and because of their new jersey colors, he thought of "Golden Tornadoes." But a check showed that Georgia Tech already had chosen that tag in 1917. From the tornado, he evolved meteorologically to the hurricane. A few days before the team left for a game against Texas A&M, Acher asked the squad to vote on the name, and thus "Golden Hurricane" was born.
