Needs 77 points to become the 33rd player in Gopher Basketball history to score 1,000 career points • Minnesota's active leading career scorer • named Honorable Mention All-Big Ten last season.

Honorable Mention All-Big Ten in 2007 • scored in double figures 26 times last season and 48 times in his career • has six 20 -plus point games in his careeer • recorded five double-doubles last season, also his career total • scored his 900 th career point vs. Michigan on Feb. 24, 2007 • recorded his 400th career rebound vs. Michigan on Feb. 24, 2007 • played in 93 games in his Gopher career, starting 64 times • named to AllBig Ten Freshman Team in 2004-05.

## 2006-07 I JUNIOR SEASON:
