## RESURRECTION: A DAY OF JOY

The great and glorious Feast of the Resurrection reminds us of the renewed life of Jesus Christ, and His return to life

But the Day of Resurrection also symbolizes for us the many things that we like to associate and identify with the perennial observance of the greatest Christian holiday.

"After Lent: Challenge to Live the Risen Life" is the neading of an article in one of the American Catholic weeklies. During Lent we heard accounts of Jesus Christ's Passion and His death during Holy Week. We have fasted, abstained and nortified ourselves to imitate His sufferings and martyrdom. All this has a purpose and goal: we renewed our very nature as members of Christ, since we died with Him and we have risen with Him. That does not mean that our bodies are like His, but we do share in the spirit of the risen Christ, and He provides the source of our joy and happiness.

We who live far away from Ukraine, the country of our fathers and of many of us, cannot observe this glorious Feast of the Resurrection, the traditional Ukrainian Velykden, without our thoughts flying across the Atlantic, to those who are our brothers and sisters and who are enslaved by the Red Satan.

The Ukrainian people, too, are waiting the glorious day of the Resurrection of Christ, but they are prohibited to pay homage to Jesus Christ publicly, as we do here. All of the Ukrainian Catholic Churches in Ukraine have been closed, hundreds of priests were arrested, deported, executed, while a few dozen succumbed to pressure and terror and accepted the Communistcontrolled Orthodox Church. The true Ukrainian Orthodox Church also was brutally destroyed.

But the true faith in the victory of Jesus Christ and His teachings still persists and lives on in the hearts of the Ukrainian people. Even the communist and atheistic government of Moscow and its rulers in Ukraine cannot hide the fact that youth of every social layer is not imbued with materialistic philosophy, at any rate, not to the extent the communist government would like them to be. There are many cases of Soyiet school authorities finding crosses in pupils' lockers, or under their garments. Yes, Jesus Christ lives on in the hearts of the Ukrainian people, despite unrelentless persecution and oppres-

There could be speculation that the release of Metropolitan oseph Slipy from Soviet detention may signify a brighter hope for the suffering Ukrainian nation and the restitution of religious freedom. But there is no basis for such a development. Undoubtedly, the freedom of Metropolitan Slipy is in itself a victory of Christian faith over the atheistic Satan, symbolized by the communist regime. But there are still thousands of Ukrainian Catholic and Ukrainian Orthodox martyrs who are anguishing in Soviet slave labor camps, or are detained in a semi-slave status far from their native country, for the simple reason that Moscow is afraid that their return to Ukraine may bring a resurgence of anti-Russian feelings and Ukrainian patriotism



Процеси гри — образні ру-и — уподібнення. Гра про-

ходить так: Гурт хлонців (10 - 15) побравшись за руки, стас лавою проти такого ж гурту дівчат. Ці гурти - лави стають на віддалі 5-6 метрів. Хлоп'ячий гурт спочатку поволі, а опісля швидко підходить до дівочого гурту, співаючи: "А ми нивку виорем" і показує рухами, як вони оратимуть. Дівочий гурт швидко підбігає до хлоп'ячого, який відбігає закону Бога - вічність і проназад, на кілька кроків, і співас: "А ми в поле вийдем". Так проходить гра з відповідними імітаційними рухами до кінця: просо сіють, витоптують, коней переймають викопують і т. д. Хоч такі пісні як коляди-

ки, здебільшого мають гіпер-

мому, але в душі приявному. Чудесно подані образи: хлопця і дівчини; батька й матері; чоловіка й жінки в образ дітей і художнью — образ Весни-Лади.

Далі подано, що ворожлі. брак патріотизму, а поруч неча з-за території пасовиськ віддана жертвенна боротьба та орних земель приходила - родинні зв'язки. А разом подано, що в ті часи одруження молоді проходило через "умикання" хлопцем півчини, а також і через домовленість родів, видно, що дівчина з іншого роду була бажана, бо вже прапредки в ті часи знали, що элиття близької крови, тобто свого роду, було шкідливим і вело до виродження BATBKH! 36 ANITS 30.
