



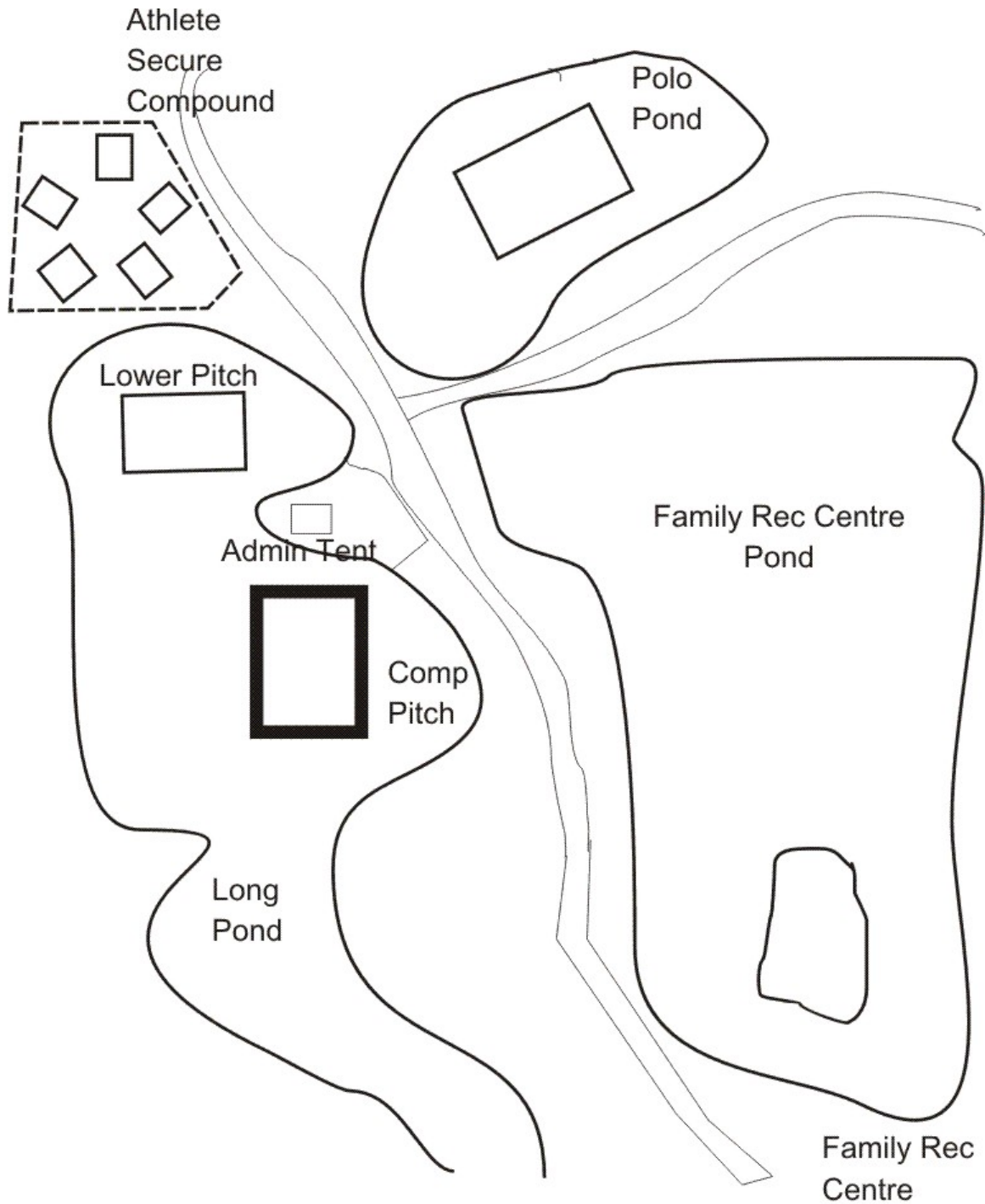

# Overall sketch of the Venue Layout:

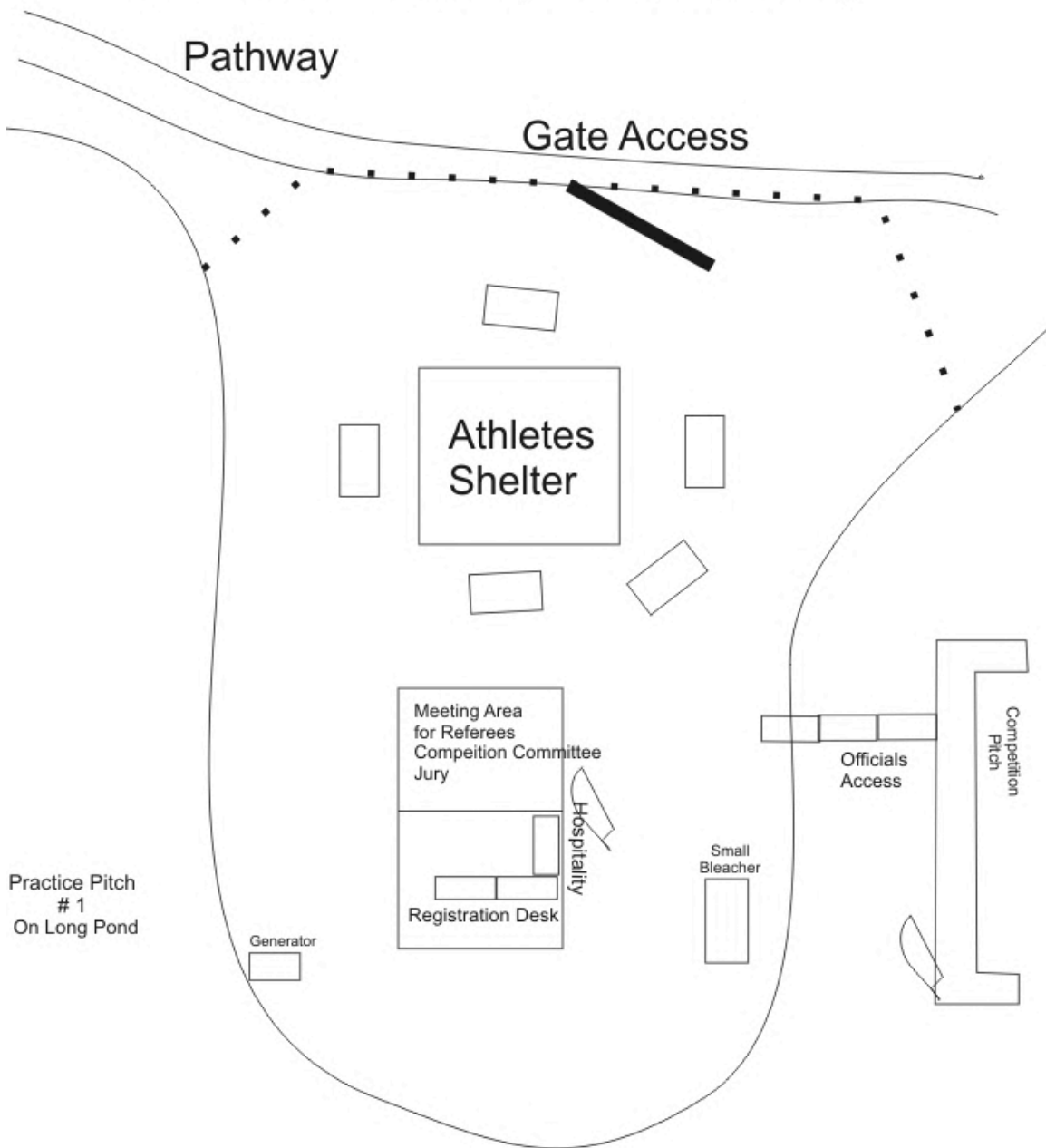
Park in west most parking lot in the Park (note Sea Can in southwest corner). Polo pond is visible, follow path to comp area.

RUNDLE PARK AUG 20-23

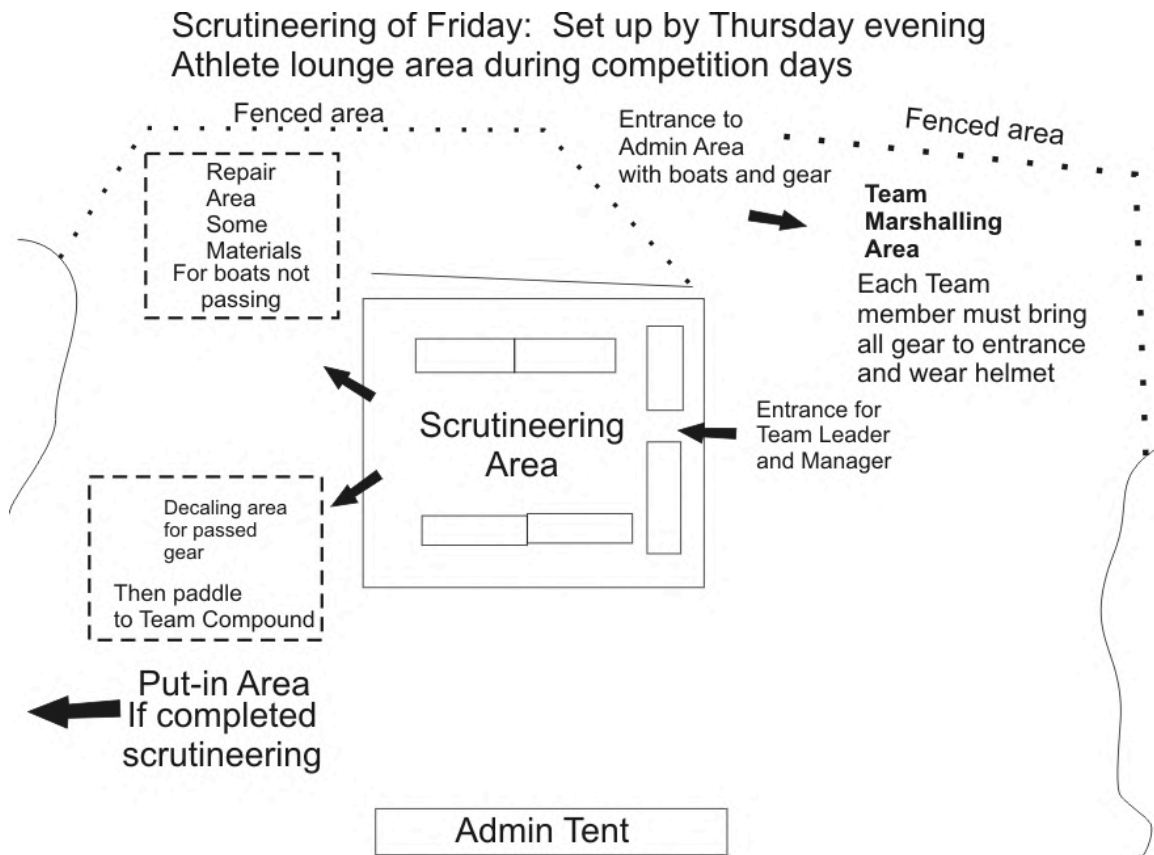
# ADMINISTRATIVE AREA

Boat-Free Area, except for scrutineering



The Administration Area will serve as the Centre for Administration of the Competition, including registration and as an athletes lounge area during the competition taking place on Aug 22 and 23. On the 21, which will be the day of scrutineering and official practice, the shelter for the Athletes will be used for scrutineering.

## DETAILS OF THE SCRUTINEERING AREA



### SCRUTINEERING ON FRIDAY, AUG. 21<sup>TH</sup>, 2015

Teams will be required to pass their equipment including boats, pfd's (measured for thickness, min. 20mm) helmets (to assess safety of coverage at the back and to measure opening size in masks which must not be able to allow a 7cm cube to pass through any opening) and paddles for sharp edges and blade thickness (minimum of 5mm).

Teams will marshal in the Administration Compound at the time of their scrutineering and pass through scrutineering as a Team. The schedule by which Teams will report to scrutineering is shown below. Players will be required to bring their own equipment to scrutineering and wear their helmet so it may be checked by Scrutineering officials to the criteria described above. The Team Leader and Manager or one other person, may accompany Team boats through scrutineering. Boats will be measured with Official ICF gauges. Any boats not to ICF specifications will be rejected. Any equipment deemed unsafe will be rejected. An ICF Official will be present to inform teams as to what will be acceptable for equipment for the 2016 Worlds. For this Pan Ams, we will be relaxing some of the 2016 requirements.

1. We will accept the color black being equivalent to carbon for helmets and boat decks.
2. We will accept vinyl on boat decks to match a “team color” and we will accept vinyl on helmets for this competition.
3. If a bumper on a kayak was acceptable for a past competition and providing it is in reasonable condition, it will be passed. Damaged bumpers and excessive taping will not be accepted.

For boats failing to meet any requirements for bumpers we will have a small area for repairs. It will contain glue for bumpers, tape to cover cracks or sharp areas on a kayak or on paddles . A kayak or paddle sent to this area will need to be re-scrutineered.

Boats and helmets passing scrutineering will be decaled appropriately. No equipment for any team not bearing scrutineering decals will be allowed in the competition.

Boats and equipment with scrutineering decals and paddles, which will not be decaled, only measured, can be returned to the Team Compound Area. Athletes can put-in beside the Admin area to paddle over to the Compound. Teams participating in their Official Practice Time will get in their boats and move to the competition pitch from the Team Compound Area. A put-in wharf will be provided.

**OFFICIAL PRACTICE**

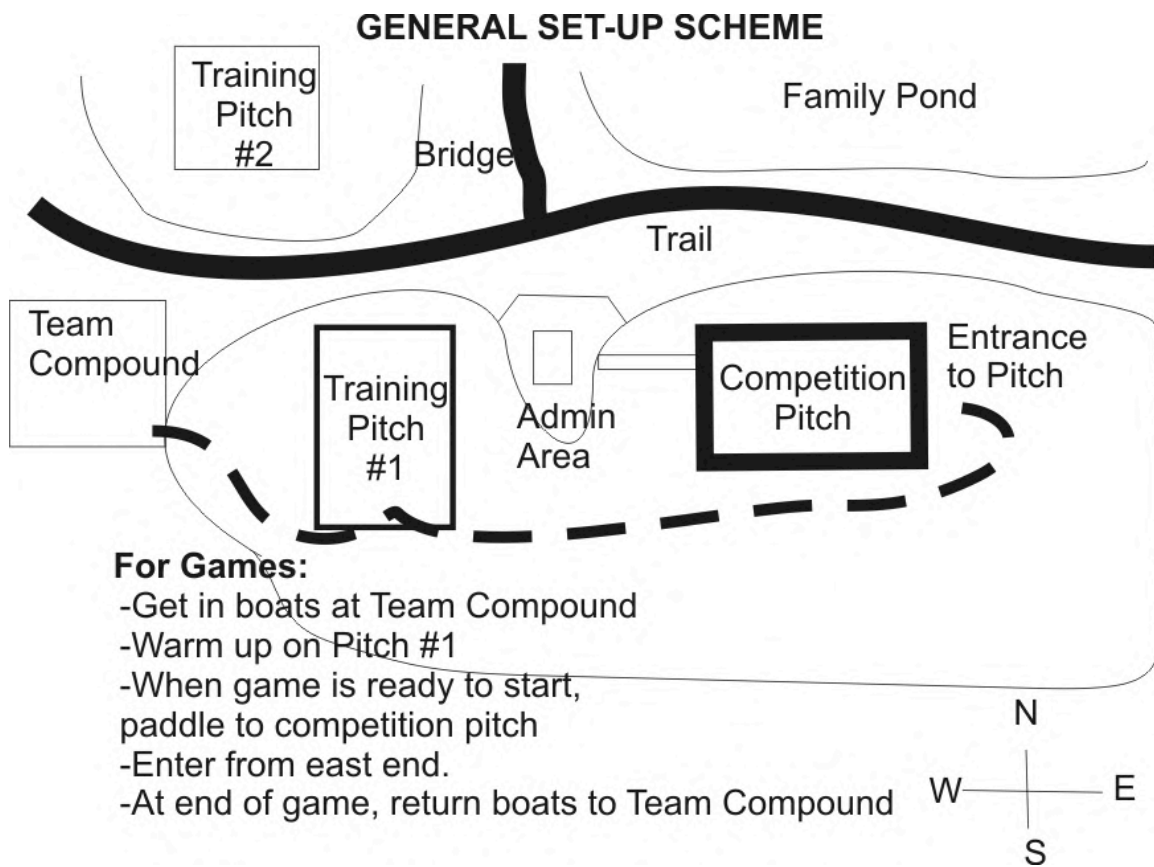
Boats and gear that have completed scrutineering successfully must be used in the Official Practice time, and the Competition. Official Practice is staggered on a schedule 2 hours behind scrutineering (which will end at 1230) while Official Practice will be completed by 1500. **WE STRONGLY URGE TEAMS TO EXAMINE THEIR EQUIPMENT PRIOR TO SCRUTINEERING TO AVOID FAILED EQUIPMENT AND DELAYS.**

Official practice times will be monitored by the Timing and Scoring Team and rigidly controlled. Teams can access the pitch when signaled to do so, and must depart on the Game end horn.

PAN AM COMPETITION, AUG 22-23, 2015

All boats and equipment will be kept in the Team Compound. Teams will enter the water from this area, adjacent to the Official Practice Pitch. After a suitable warmup

and just prior to their game time, teams will paddle from the Official Practice Pitch area to the Competition Pitch area, and enter the Pitch from the east end of the pitch which will be the only access since the rest of the Pitch will be bordered by wharf sections. At the conclusion of their game, teams will return to the Team Compound Area. No boats or equipment will allowed in the Administrative Area during the competition and after scrutineering has been completed. A map is provided (General Set-Up Scheme) to illustrate the movement of boats during the competition.
