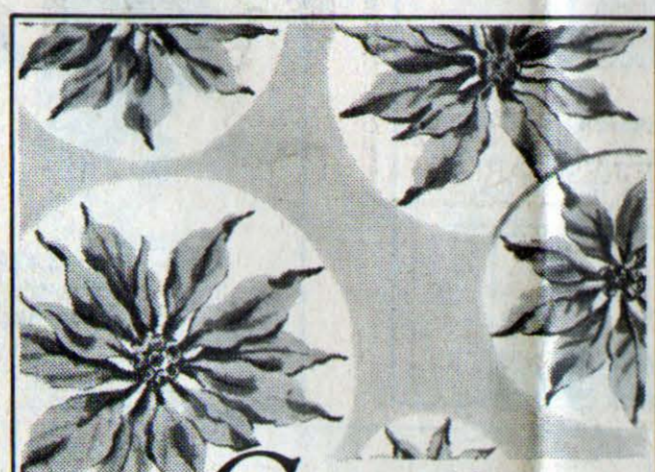

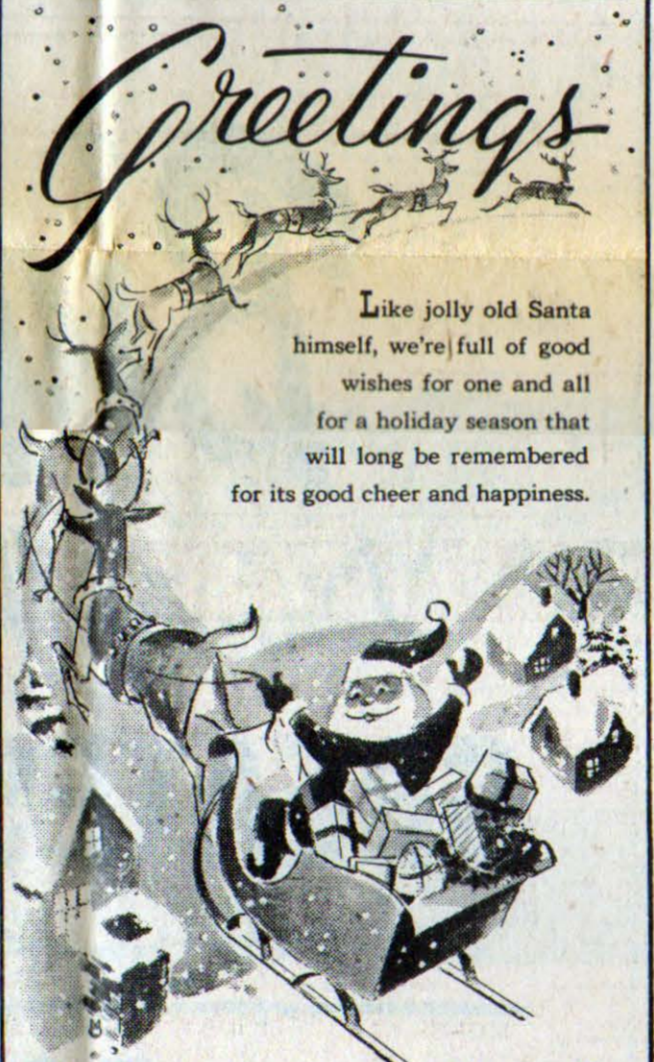

QUAIL: This year's early quail hunt was one of the best hunts since 1952, according to both checking station and field

data. Hunters seemed to be pleased with the early season and the birds became increasingly wary and managed to "take care of themselves" after the first few days of shooting. This early hunt may make a noticeable difference in the behavior of quail during the

coming hunt, since the birds have already been exposed to shooting. The high hunter success of this hunt has been attributed to the large production of young birds during the past summer, although the earlier season undoubtedly had some effect also, since some

birds would have been lost naturally by a later date. **RABBITS:** Very little rabbit hunting was done during October, partly because so many hunters felt it was "too early" to take rabbits, while many others were just not interested in anything but quail.

Most reports received to date are from ranger hunter check sheets, which provide a good method of spot checking in various areas and will be continued in the future. Data from wing collection boxes has not been completely analyzed as yet.




