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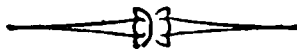

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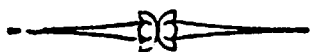

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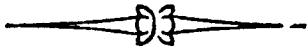

The following Extracts from the Rules, formed by the Committee for managing the Home, will explain the principles on which the Establishment is conducted :—

Every Servant applying for admission into the Home, must bring a recommendation or reference, and is not to be admitted into the house until her statement has been verified. She must also satisfy the Superintendent as to her moral character, qualifications as a servant, and the respectability of her present abode. She must promise to conform to the Rules of the Institution, and to be attentive to the advice and instruction of its conductors.

Every Servant thus entering the Home must pay One Shilling for one week (in advance), and must renew the payment weekly during her stay in the Home.

Servants not wanting to be Inmates of the Home may register their names and the situations wished for, on payment of One Shilling.

Persons, not Subscribers, wishing to engage Servants from the Home or Registry, must pay Two Shillings and Sixpence on entering their names in the Registry-book. Subscribers of One Pound annually have the privilege of engaging four Servants, and those of Ten Shillings annually have the privilege of engaging two Servants in the year, free of Registration charges.

*The Committee hope that all persons wanting Servants will apply to this Institution, for every pains and care is taken to ascertain the respectability and good conduct of the Servants that are recommended.*
