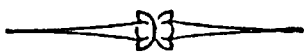

The following Extracts from the Rules, formed by the Committee for managing the Home, will explain the principles on which the Establishment is conducted:—

Every Servant applying for admission into the Home, must bring a recommendation or reference, and is not to be admitted into the house until her statement has been verified. She must also satisfy the Superintendent as to her moral character, qualifications as a servant, and the respectability of her present abode. She must promise to conform to the Rules of the Institution, and to be attentive to the advice and instruction of its conductors.

Every Servant thus entering the Home must pay One Shilling for one week (in advance), and must renew the payment weekly during her stay in the Home.

Servants not wanting to be Inmates of the Home may register their names and the situations wished for, on payment of One Shilling.

Persons, not Subscribers, wishing to engage Servants from the Home or Registry, must pay Two Shillings and Sixpence on entering their names in the Registry-book. Subscribers of One Pound annually have the privilege of engaging four Servants, and those of Ten Shillings annually have the privilege of engaging two Servants in the year, free of Registration charges.

*The Committee hope that all persons wanting Servants will apply to this Institution, for every pains and care is taken to ascertain the respectability and good conduct of the Servants that are recommended.*

The consolidated rate comprehends Landing, Wharfage, Weighing at landing, Coopering or Mending for housing, Marking, Sampling, Housing, Weighing for actual delivery, Delivering, Furnishing landing and delivery Weights, Surveying and Furnishing Certificates of Damage, and Twelve Weeks' Rent from the date of the Ship's commencing to discharge.

A West India Ship coming to the Southampton Docks effects a saving in Wages, Provisions, Pilotage, Lights, Dock Dues, Insurance, and Wear and Tear, of at least 10s. 6d. per ton register, as compared with a voyage to and from the Thames.

To the Importer of Sugars for the supply of Southampton, Portsmouth, and the neighbouring districts of Hants, Sussex, Wilts, and Dorset, the Docks present the obvious advantages of greater dispatch in bringing the produce to market, a better price from the saving of the cost of carriage from London, a reduction in the Insurance, and a due participation in the gain from the above-mentioned reduction of freight charges.

Such portions of West India cargoes as are transmitted from hence to London, will have the benefit of an earlier arrival at market; whilst the saving upon the freight of the whole cargo will be more than equivalent to the railway charge (10s. per ton) upon the London portion of it.

To obviate all doubt as to the procuring of outward cargo from Southampton, it is to be urged that most of the goods now exported from London, are first *brought thither*, a considerable portion having previously passed up channel for the purpose: when it is found that such goods are equally required for shipment at Southampton, they will be brought to that port for the purpose with equal facility, and, in many cases, with advantage.



That the inmates of the Institution shall be employed in washing, and in all the business of a laundry, together with needle and every sort of household work ; and that the proceeds of their labour shall be applied towards the current expenses of the Institution.

That in accordance with the main object of the Institution, the religious instruction of its inmates will be matter of especial care and attention : and for this purpose a Chaplain shall be appointed, and a Committee of Ladies will attend as visitors in rotation.

That a Subscriber of ten shillings per annum shall be entitled to vote at all general meetings of Subscribers, provided that one whole year shall have elapsed since the payment of the first subscription.

That the Ministers of the various denominations of Christians within the range comprehended by the Female Penitentiary, be requested annually to preach Sermons in aid of the funds of the Institution.

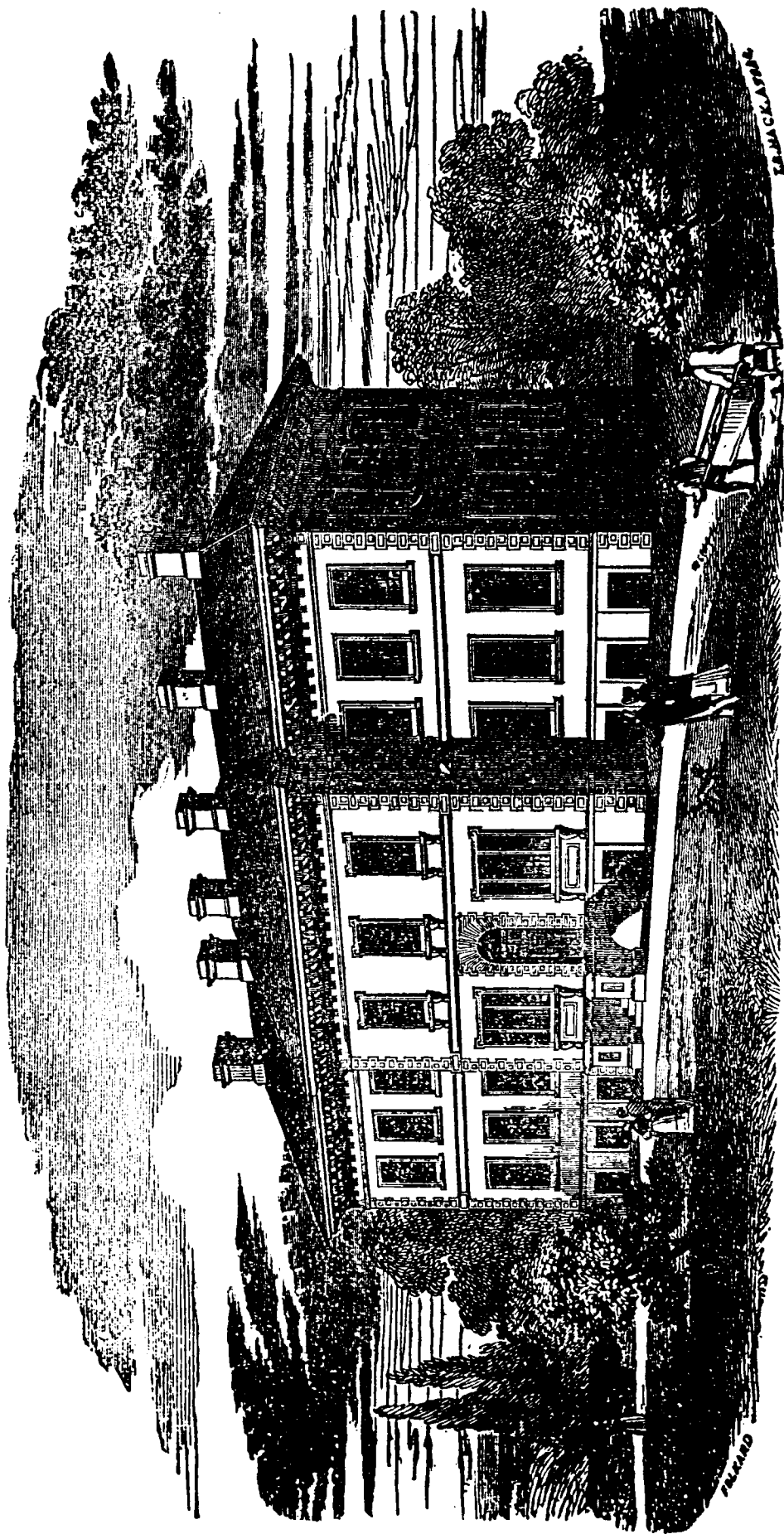

If the Incumbent of any parish, or the Minister of any chapel, shall make any collection on behalf of the Dispensary, he shall be entitled to recommend two persons for every pound collected.

THIS SOCIETY is founded with the view of giving relief and assistance to the *widows and orphans of fishermen*, and of mariners, members of this Society, who lose their lives by storms and shipwreck on any part of the coasts of the United Kingdom, while engaged in their lawful occupations; and also to render necessary assistance to such *mariners, soldiers, or other poor persons*, as suffer shipwreck upon the said coasts.

It is considered that a general subscription throughout the kingdom, of two shillings and sixpence annually, not only from persons in good circumstances, but also from those who, being in work and employment, may be enabled to contribute so small a sum for so benevolent an object, added to the donations that may be given by those in more affluent stations, who shall approve of this undertaking, will supply sufficient amount of funds to meet the contemplated expenditure.

*Should it, however, happen that demands are made on the funds of the Charity, beyond what it is able fully to meet, then members of the Society, and their families, are to have prior consideration to other applicants.*

The nature of relief intended to be given by the Society is of the following description:—Should a fisherman, having a wife and family depending upon him, be unfortunately drowned whilst in the exercise of his calling, the agent, or some member of any Branch Committee on the spot, shall visit, with as little delay as possible, the cottage of the poor widow and orphans; and if it be ascertained that the fisherman has left a son old enough to pursue his father's business, for the maintenance of the widow and family, he is to be assisted in part or the

whole, as the case shall prove to require, so as to place him with materials in a boat, to enable him to undertake it. If, however, the lost fisherman shall not have left a son old enough to assist, in any material degree, the widow and family, the next endeavour should be to induce the widow to maintain herself and family by her own exertions; and, to assist her first efforts, the rent of her cottage, for the first year of her widowhood, might be paid; or such other description of relief might be afforded, as may appear to those on the spot best calculated to rescue the widow and orphans from want and distress. Relief of a like nature will also, under similar circumstances, be afforded to the widows and orphans of mariners, who, at the time of their being lost, were members of this Society.

In the case of mariners, soldiers, or other poor persons, who may suffer shipwreck:—*they are to be supplied with food and cheap clothing, when their cases absolutely require it, and as speedily as possible are to be forwarded to their respective parishes, or to the places of residences of their friends*; it being clearly understood, that the Society cannot do more than may be absolutely necessary to afford early but temporary succour to widows and orphans of wrecked fishermen, and of mariners, members of this Society, and to secure to unfortunate persons cast on shore from shipwreck a safe and speedy return to their homes. Nevertheless, as it is clear that extreme cases of distress from storms may occur, the Central Committee are empowered to apply such relief as they may deem proper, consistently with the finances of the Society.
