For the study of the inscriptions (see attachment 5, paragraph 3.3) the project will probably use a very modern Minolta 3D High Resolution Scanner. This scanner can only be operated by a professional. As yet one could not definitively inform use who this person will be.



Objectives

1 Protection of the site

As stressed in different scientific publications the monument on the Nemrud is in need of protection and restoration measurements. In accordance with the European Code for Restoration the first step is a systematic documentation and survey of the monument to fix the present situation.

2 Conservation of the site

Now the survey/documentation is available for the most part, the INF and WMF (World Monuments Fund) have organised a roundtable dedicated to the conservation of the monument (Kahta, Adiyaman July 2001 and Amsterdam November 2001). Participants were the archaeologists from the University of Amsterdam involved, representatives of the Ministry of Culture and international conservation specialists.

In close co-operation with the scientists, a long-term restoration and conservation plan is now defined. Next, we also prepared a detailed programme for the restoration work to be carried out from 2002 onwards in close co-operation with the supervising Committee of the Ministry of Culture. In the meantime minor protection measurements will be realised if approved by the authorities of the Ministry of Culture.

3 Excavation of the tomb of Antiochos I

This item will be the last objective to be executed and has not our primary interest, as the priority of the project are the objectives 1-2. Before any serious work can start an infrastructure will be required to enable modern and efficient working methods.

A detailed working plan can be made only after having completed the preliminary studies, largely carried out in 2001 and finished in 2002 (presented after the 'General Planning'). The scheme in the 'General Planning 2001-2009' may serve as indication for the activities on the longer term.



As will become clear from the 2002 programme this year's Nemrud Project will have two main points of interest:

1. Finish the documentation and archaeological study of the monument (on and around the mountain, highlighting different aspects from a virtual reconstruction to epigraphy)
2. Start a restoration and conservation project.

As the goals and intentions of the first point are also clearly described in the 2001 application, these are not enlarged upon. Most attention is given to the restoration and conservation project that will use external specialists working with- and monitored by the Project leaders (Brijder, Moormann, Versluys).

1.0 Infrastructure

The present gravel road from Malatya is inadequate. The stone road up to the foot of the mountain from Adiyaman has to be extended. On top of the mountain is no shelter, electricity or water.

1.1 Road

A temporary gravel road has to be constructed from the 'cafeteria' to the West-Terrace. To be included in the application.

1.2 Site Office

A temporary site office has to be constructed at the West-Terrace. To be included in the application.

1.3 Storage

A container storage of two 40 feet containers is required next to the Thor container. To be included in the application.

1.4 Lodging

During the campaign a modern kind of an excavation-house is required with facilities for sleeping, cooking and studying/computing as well as storage of small artefacts. The former Zeus Hotel annex Jandarma hostel is suited for the accommodation of the team. To be requested.

2.0 Topographic survey

In 2001 a topographic survey has been carried out by our team, making use of the most modern methods in order to prepare a detailed plan of the mountain and its surroundings, which will form the basis of further field work.

Objective:

The survey will be extended in four steps. First to the West-Terrace, East-Terrace and North-Terrace, and finally to the quadrant bordered in the east by the ice-caves, the entrance stele I and in the west by the entrance stele III. The 2001 campaign provided the largest part of the data; the topographical survey will be finished in this campaign.



3.0 Archaeological prospection and survey

3.1 Virtual reconstruction

Since the first expedition by Otto Puchstein in 1882 several reconstructions have been made. The most recent ones focussed on the statues but are either too schematic (Wright) or only partly detailed (Görkan).

Objective:

Study of the statues and stelae on the West and East Terrace, including the blocks scattered over the area; study of the slabs on the Northern Terrace. The sequence will be the West-Terrace, the East-Terrace and finally North-Terrace. In 2001 the greater part of the East-Terrace and some elements on the West-Terrace have been studied. The 2002 campaign plans a completion of this item. Next, an attempt at reconstructing the statues of the West- and East-Terraces in virtual form will be made.

3.2 Origins / Surroundings

No research has been executed on the origins of the monument on Nemrud Dağ. Traces of earlier sanctuaries, settlements or human activities on the mountain are unknown.

Objective:

Survey of the surroundings of the mountain in order to trace the presence of human activities, from prehistory onwards. In the 2001 campaign the southern ring around the mountain was surveyed and studied; in the 2002 campaign we will investigate the northern ring.

3.3 Inscriptions/Epigraphy

The inscriptions at the back of the statues are known. However, a comprehensive inventory and scientific description of all inscriptions is not available.

Objective:

Study of the inscriptions found on all terraces; more texts than the hitherto published epigraphs have been noticed and can be documented:

- the large inscriptions at the back of the statues at the East- and West-Terrace,
- the older inscriptions in the sandstone pieces of the stelae at the West-Terrace,
- the recently discovered inscriptions in the stone blocks of the statues at the West-Terrace, the inscriptions on the stelae and altar blocks of the ancestors.

During the 2001 campaign a number of texts on the backs of the stelae of the West Terrace have been studied and squeezes, photographs and descriptions have been made. This documentary work has to be completed by means of taking digital photographs with a special scanning engine: the Minolta High Resolution 3D scanner. The work has to be enlarged by a documentation of the epigraphical testimonies on fragments found during the expeditions of Theresa Goell and stored in the Museum of Adıyaman.

The second step, to be executed in the future, is to obtain a *corpus* of texts, including the other inscriptions in Commagene and foreseen of a comprehensive translation and a historical interpretation. Optional is the production of copies replacing the ones Puchstein made in 1883.

3.4 Catalogue / Archive



There exists no comprehensive inventory of the pieces and artefacts scattered over the mountain itself, the villages around and the museums in Gaziantep, Adiyaman, Ankara, Berlin, etc.

Objective:

Defining the outlines of an inventory incorporating the pieces and artefacts of Nemrud Dağ. The 2002 campaign provides a study of the material in the storerooms of the museum in Adiyaman.

We therefore ask permission to be enabled to study the boxes with material from the mountain stored in the Adiyaman Museum and to documentate those artefacts.

3.5 Pottery studies

The 2001 campaign established the important fact that there is indeed pottery to be found on the mountain. The study of this material, now in the Adiyaman museum, and of new finds (see 3.2) can provide important new conclusions on the function and chronology of the monument. Therefore we would like to start ceramological studies in co-operation with Dr. A. van As, Leiden University, a specialist in the field with a great knowledge of Anatolian pottery.

Objective:

Drawing and dating the finds; study the possibility of the set-up of a *reference corpus* of Commagenean pottery; set up of ethno archaeological studies in this respect.

We therefore ask permission to be enabled to study and draw last year's survey results stored in the Adiyaman Museum.

3.6 Documentation

In addition to the existing methods, a documentation of the work by photo and film is planned.

4.0 Conservation & Restoration

The following plan outlines the structural engineering program (4.1) and the stone conservation program (4.2) for the site work to commence in the summer of 2002.

This two-part program sets forth the proposed methodologies, work schedules, and team identification for this year's application to the Turkish Ministry of Culture.

4.1 Structural consolidation, conservation, repair and strengthening of Nemrud sculptures

This Plan Proposal has been prepared on the basis of discussion and agreement during the Amsterdam meeting of December 15 - 16, 2001. The Detailed Plan will be elaborated later by synchronization with the other activities on the Project Plan 2002.

Objective of this Plan Proposal is to specify activities of structural stabilization and conservation fieldwork in the year 2002 and to define the contents of the Pilot project, the Methods and Techniques, the Engineering time for structural work, the required equipment and materials.



4.1.1. Objectives

Main objectives of conservation and structural consolidation work will be:

East Terrace

- Stabilization of dislocated stones at both terraces (specially at the East terrace), bedrock stabilization north/south of the row of statues.
- Re-construction base lion/eagle, on north sides, which will be done by consolidation of existing part with necessary repair and /or strengthening and re-building of damaged parts using dry stone masonry.
- Re-erection eagle statue on prepared base.

This first part of activities should be considered as a pilot project by which methodology and techniques will be established and appropriate equipment will be checked and selected for future conservation and stabilization work.

The next activities should be considered as emergency work and is as follows:

- The Antiochos statue of the East terrace: The stabilization of the bedrock will be done as a permanent stabilization work which will consist of cleaning of deteriorated stones of bedrocks, consolidation and repair of existing cracks by injecting grout emulsion and rebuild bases below the bottom blocks of the statues.
- The Zeus statue of the East terrace: The stabilization of the bedrock will be the same as with the Antiochos statue and if necessary the repair of the first row of stones of the statue of Zeus.
- Temporary support and protection of the Antiochos statue by using wooden supports.

West-Terrace

On the West-Terrace the Engineering Team will assist the Stone Team (conservators):

- Apollo's damaged head: filling/bonding with Mr. Pagnin to find appropriate solution for structural consolidation.
- Lion horoscope + dexiosis relief (protection) shelter, to design and build light-weight shelter.
- Lion horoscope + dexiosis relief-structure repaired and strengthening on the base of study existing repaired work and to proposed solution to stone conservators to used invisible method and replaced concrete to avoid interaction in the future with sand stone.
- Assessment of bedrock condition below central statues, study feasibility for reconstruction, material condition etc.

Site Management

- Fence system to guide the tourists and protect them from the work area.

4.1.2. Methods and Techniques

Survey and Consolidation

Structural conservation work should start after accomplishment of the preparatory field works, survey and recording activities. It will be necessary to prepare a survey plan, recording of the present conditions and positioning of each stone, numbering as well as registration and collection of all the archaeological and architectural data. If that data or plans exist, they should be made available to the structural team.



The preparatory phase will also include stone identification, storage of stones, cleaning and repair, if necessary. Preparation and consolidation of bedrock as well as soil stabilization will be carried out, if necessary.

Rebuilding should be done by dry masonry techniques. New stones will be inserted, if necessary, to provide structural stability or pieces of new stone and will be placed within severely damaged stones by repairs using stainless steel and epoxy, adequately marked and recorded. Consolidation of bedrock below the statues of Antiochos and Zeus should be done as a permanent consolidation, but supporting of the Antiochos statue will be urgent and temporary.

In the process of protection of the Lion horoscope along with all the sandstone stelae on the west terrace, the stone conservators and the engineers have to re-evaluate the stability of those already repaired stones and incorporate additional strengthening in the process of protection.

Hoisting Methods

In the interest of saving time, it is proposed that an auto crane be used, a small portable crane, vacuum equipment for lifting stones and other hand-tools. Vacuum techniques will be carefully tested (not on original fabric) and if it is found to be safe, effective and appropriate, it will be used later for the actual work.

4.2 Structural conservation program

4.2.1. Objectives

The Stone Group will deal with the condition survey of the monuments on the site, in-situ testing of conservation materials and procedures as well as sampling of stone materials for subsequent analysis and laboratory testing. For this purpose, the Group can be divided into two teams, the documentation/diagnosis team (DDTeam) and the treatment testing team



(TTTeam), who on site may work independently but who will work closely with regards to laboratory testing and data analysis.

The DDTeam is composed of Prof. Bernd Fitzner and Dr. Kurt Heinrichs, as foreign participants (FP), and Ms. Evin Erder, MSc, Materials Conservation Laboratory at METU, and Dr. Ayse Tavukcuoglu, Conservation Architect, as Turkish participants.

The program for this team, which includes both site visit and laboratory studies, can be summarized as follows:

- compilation of documents and results from the previous campaign and research (FP);
- survey the lithotypes (limestone and tuffite and including quarry material) and their variability; survey and document the weathering deterioration;
- carry out the condition survey of the monuments with special reference to those documented in 1988;
- prepare the weathering damage maps for the above objects (FP);
- obtain appropriate samples for laboratory testing;
- carry out laboratory tests (analysis, accelerated weathering tests, evaluation of treatments (from TTT samples below);
- evaluate laboratory results, including comparison with previous study and preparation of a report.

The TTTeam is composed of Dr. A.Elena Charola, Dr. Eberhard Wendler and Mr. Paolo Pagnin, as foreign participants, and Dr. Emine Çaner Saltik, Conservation Scientist and Head of Materials Conservation Laboratory at METU and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Tamer Topal, Geological Engineer, as Turkish participants.

The program for this team, which includes both site visit and laboratory studies, can be summarized as follows:

- selection of objects as well as methods and products to be tested in situ;
- site testing of jointing/gluing of limestone pieces (for the eventual reconstruction/restoration of one statue);
- site testing of mortars for micro- and macro-fissures in limestone;
- site testing of injection procedures for gaps/fissures on tuffite samples;
- site testing of consolidation procedures for delaminated areas on tuffite samples;
- sampling for laboratory testing of antishwelling agents (for tuffite);
- laboratory testing of antishwelling agents (E.Wendler, evaluation analysis to be carried out by FP of DDTeam above);
- preliminary site evaluation of consolidation/injection procedures and first sampling for laboratory testing.
- laboratory evaluation of applied treatments;
- evaluation of results and report preparation;
- collaborate in the design of protective shelters for the most fragile objects, such as the Lion Horoscope stele.

Finally, the two teams in collaboration will prepare a risk assessment for selected objects.

It is foreseen that laboratory studies continue till mid-2004 and that a second mission will be required in 2003 to complete the project as follows:

- finalize the condition survey;
- sampling of in situ tested objects that weathered for one year;



- laboratory evaluation of these samples and completion of artificial weathering tests;
- eventual treatment of one object as pilot test.
