

IV. Supreme Reason (10:3)

See 1 Peter 1:15-16.

The closer we are to God, the closer we must pay attention to holiness.

Five potential views of what happened:

- 1. They illegally entered the Holy of Holies. But, see verse 4.
- 2. They offered incense at the wrong time of day. No evidence.
- 3. They offered improper incense. But, not the wording of Exod 30:9, 37.
- 4. They were drunk. Possible because of context (verse 9), but not mentioned in any other reference to this incident (Num 3:4; 26:61).

5. They used unauthorized coals from some place other than the altar of burnt offering. – That is the wording here and it is supported by Lev 16:12-13; Num 3:4; 26:61.

There were five other occasions when the fire of God consumed sacrifices:

- 1. Judges 6:20-24 Gideon, when he was called.
- 2. Judges 13:15-22 Manoah, when Samson's conception and birth were announced.
- 3. 2 Chronicles 7:1-3 Solomon, when the Temple was dedicated.
- 4. 1 Kings 18:38-39 Elijah, when he challenged the prophets of Baal.
- 5. 1 Chronicles 21:26 David, when he consecrated the threshingfloor of Ornan.
