Indicators at a Glance

Real GDP by Expenditure

In 2014, Alberta's real GDP by expenditure grew by 4.8%, the strongest growth rate among the provinces and the fifth consecutive year of robust growth. Nationally, real GDP grew by 2.5% in 2014, up from 2.2% in 2013.

Population

Alberta's population was 4,216,875, as of October 1, 2015. This was an increase of 1.7% from the year prior. Nationally, population grew 0.9% from a year ago.

Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 11,232 in the third quarter of 2015. There was a quarter-over-quarter increase of 9,998 persons in net international migrants. However, net interprovincial migrants fell to 1,234, the lowest level since 2009-2010.

NEW: Employment¹

Alberta added 1,400 jobs in February. Job losses were limited to the private sector (-25,900) while the public sector (8,400) and self-employment (7,400) added jobs.

NEW: Unemployment Rate¹

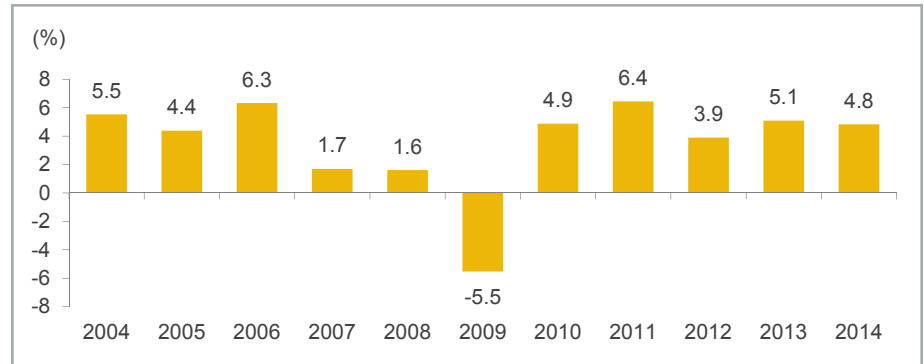
Alberta's unemployment rate rose to 7.9% in February, its highest level since April 1995 and the first time the province's rate has surpassed the national average since December 1988.

Rigs Drilling

In February there was an average of 113 active rigs in Alberta, a 47% decline from a year prior. Only 23% of available rigs were in use. Across Canada, there were 175 active rigs, down 44% y/y and just a quarter of the total rigs available for use.

Real GDP by Expenditure

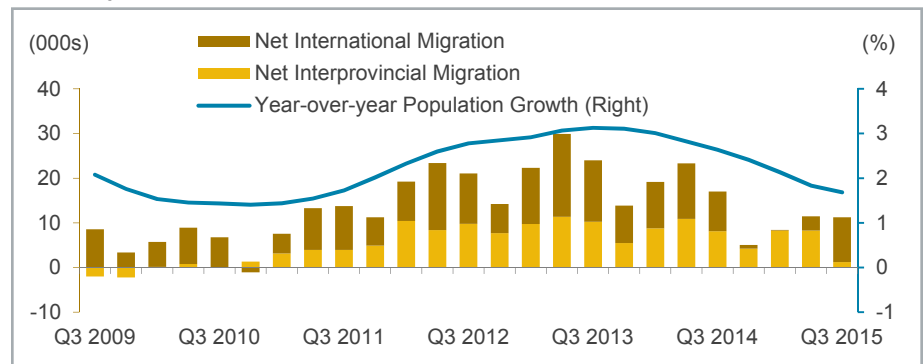
Annual, % change

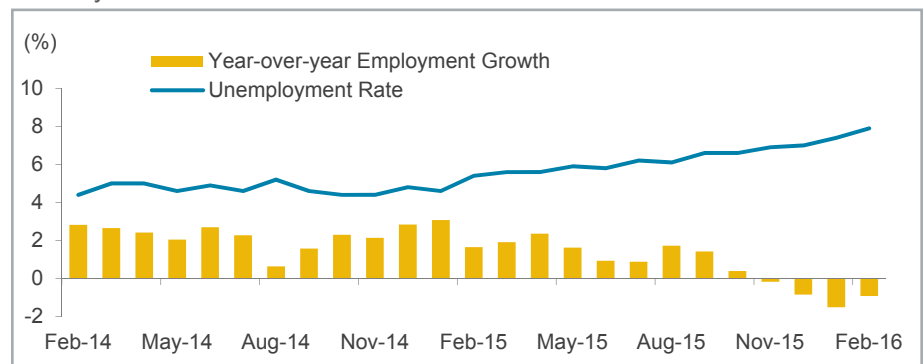

Inflation

The Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 2.1% y/y in January. Inflation got a boost from food prices (4.0%) that helped offset energy prices (-6.8%). Excluding food and energy, inflation rose 2.4% y/y.

Average Weekly Earnings¹

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta was up 1.1% m/m in December to \$1,147. In 2015, Alberta's AWE were down 0.3% compared with 2014. Canadian AWE increased 0.9% m/m to \$959, pushing earnings up 1.7% y/y.

Retail Sales¹

Retail sales totaled \$6.1 billion in December, down 5.5% y/y. The slowdown was limited to three out of eleven retail categories that reported declining sales.

NEW: Housing Starts¹

Alberta housing starts fell to 22,670 (annualized) in February, down 47% y/y. Housing starts were under 10,000 units in both Edmonton and Calgary for a third straight month.

NEW: New Housing Price Index

Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) fell for a fourth month, down 0.3% y/y in December. Calgary's NHPI fell another 0.9% y/y, weighed down by a 1.9% y/y decline non-land prices.

NEW: Building Permits¹

The value of building permits issued in Alberta fell to \$1.1 billion in January, down 22% year-over-year. Residential permits were especially weak, down 31% y/y.

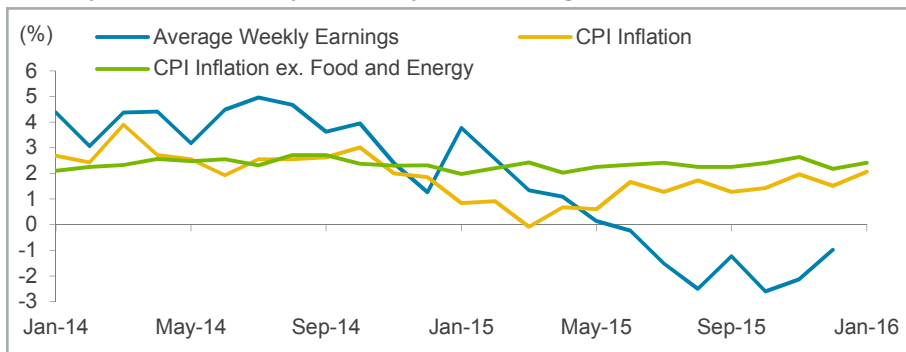

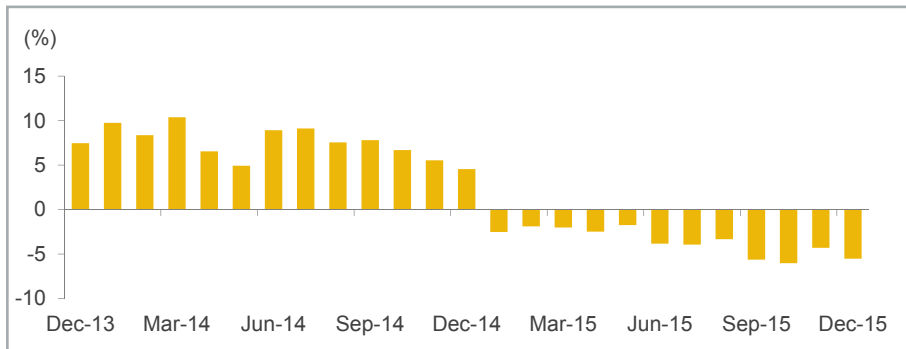
Monthly, CPI and AWE, year-over-year % change

Retail Sales

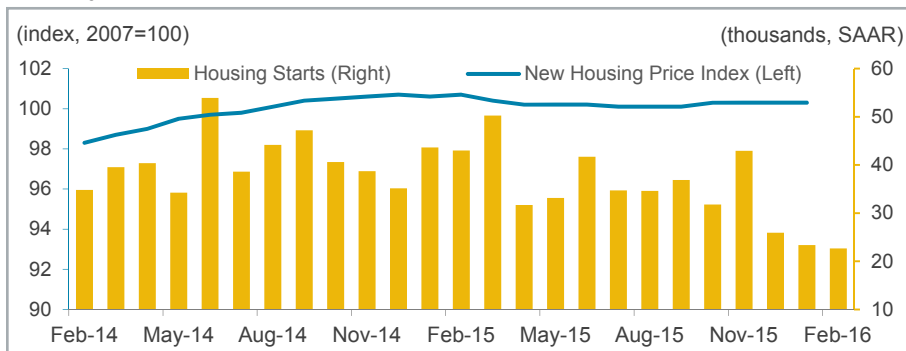
Monthly, year-over-year % change

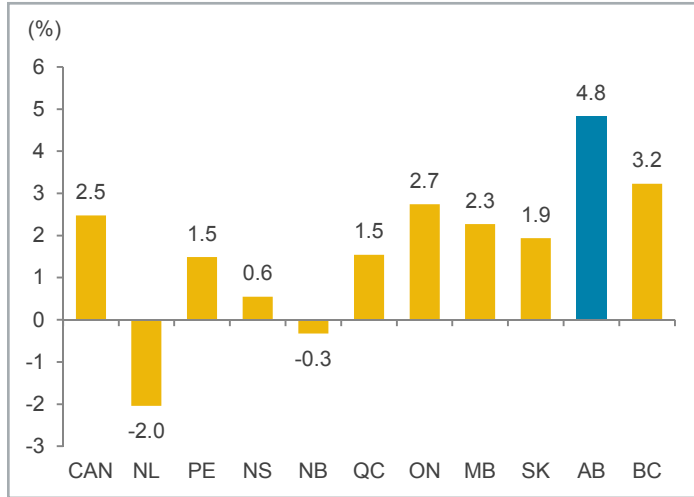

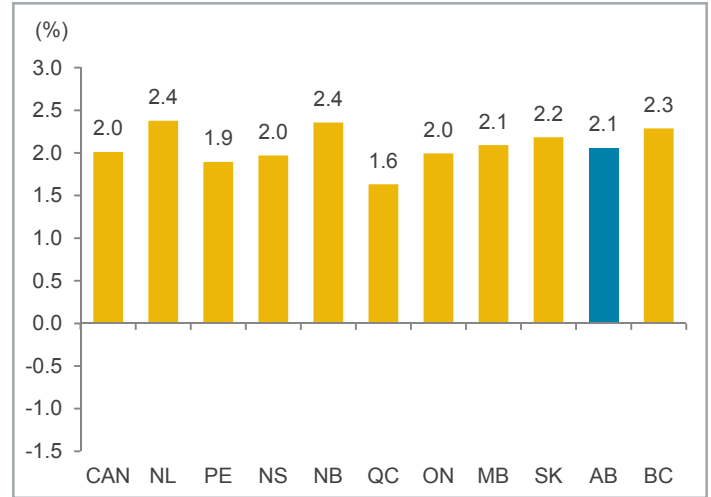
Real GDP by Expenditure

(2014, year-over-year growth)



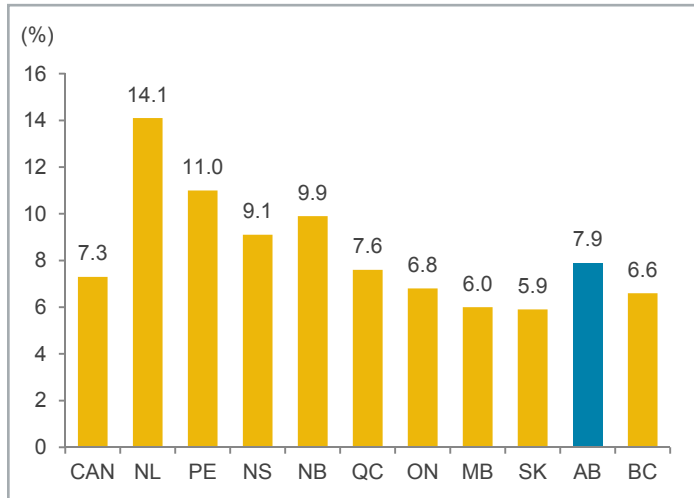
CPI Inflation

(January 2016, year-over-year growth)



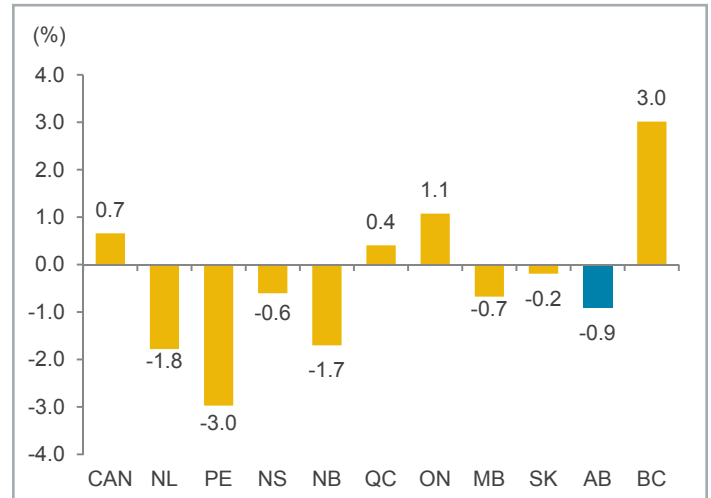
Unemployment Rate

(February 2016)



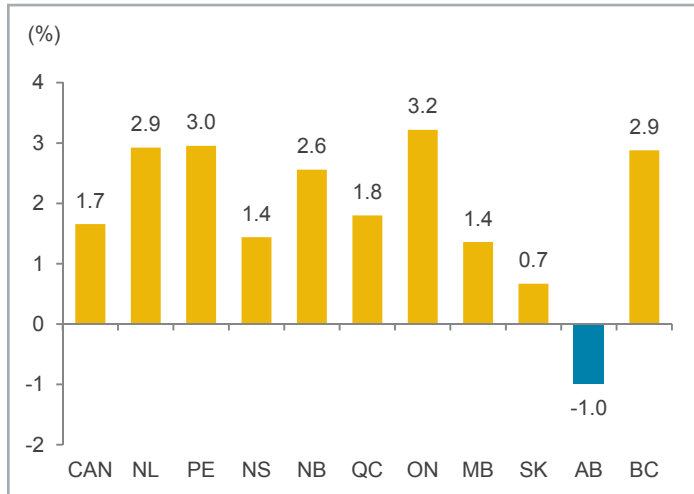
Employment

(February 2016, year-over-year growth)



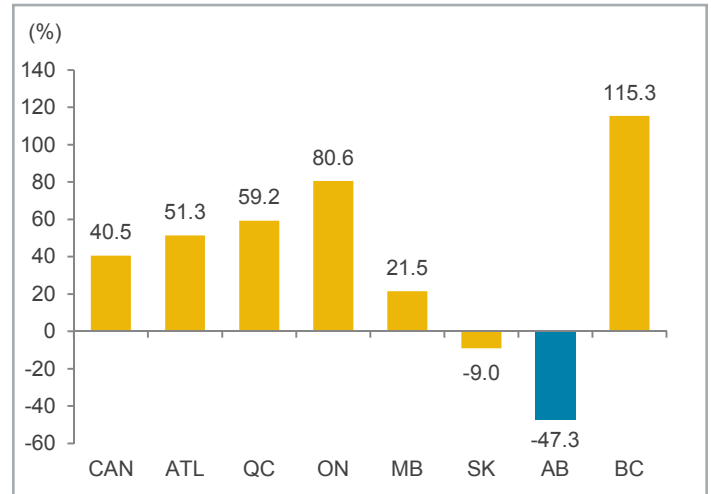
Average Weekly Earnings
