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Welcome to Bowen & Collinsville

It is with great pleasure that we welcome visitors and new residents to Bowen, Collinsville and the surrounding area.

You will find that there is something for everyone in our beautiful region. You can visit one of our many award winning beaches; Horseshoe Bay has some wonderful snorkelling which you can access by walking straight off the beach. There are also a number walks you can do in and around bush and parkland which will take you up to some of the most amazing lookouts. Our most popular lookout is on top of Flagstaff Hill which will give you a 360 degree view of Bowen and out to the top of the Whitsunday Islands.

Bowen has a very rich and interesting history, which has been depicted in 26 murals painted on the walls throughout the town. You can also visit the Bowen Historical Museum which has been labelled one of the best regional museums in the state. Bowen is very well known for its diverse industries; mining, fishing and agriculture. Farmers grow a variety of fruit and vegetables throughout the year- they call Bowen the salad bowl of Australia for a reason!

Bowen is most famous for the Kensington Pride Mango or commonly known as the 'Bowen Special'. Bowen's 'BIG MANGO' structure was erected on the 25th May 2002 as part of a successful community campaign to revitalise the local community and boost tourism.

In early 2014 the Big Mango was involved in a heist where it mysteriously disappeared



overnight. The news of the 'missing mango' made global headlines within hours. It was mentioned in 3149 media reports reaching over 25 million people worldwide with a total public relations value of nearly 13 million dollars. It was later revealed the popular restaurant chain; Nando's was responsible for the stunt in light of promoting their new mango and lime flavour. A half size replica mango used in the stunt will be placed at the front beach during the year.

The coal mining town of Collinsville is well worth a visit. Only about one hour's drive from Bowen, Collinsville offers a warm welcome to all travellers. Be sure to visit the Coalface Museum and the historical Bowen River Hotel and the Bogie River Bush House. On your way to Collinsville you may even spot some wild emus, buffalos or camels.

Bowen and Collinsville are located in the Whitsundays Region that encompasses a total land area of 23,862 square km. As at June 30 2011, the estimated resident population of the region was 34,764 persons. The population of Bowen is 10,260 and Collinsville has 1845 persons.

How to get there

BOWEN sits in the northern section of the Whitsundays, a 45-minute drive from Airlie Beach and Whitsunday Resort islands and is halfway between North Queensland's major cities Mackay and Townsville.

COLLINSVILLE is located 85km inland from Bowen, about a 45-minute drive. It is

Home Hill situated at the foothills of the Clarke Range. The turn-off to Collinsville is about a 10-minute drive north of Bowen off the Bruce Highway. It is clearly signposted. Burdekin Shire Whitsundays Bowen X Shute Harbour

AIR access is via the major airports of Whitsunday Coast (Proserpine) and Hamilton Island. The Mackay and Townsville airports are a 2-hour drive from Bowen.

The Whitsunday Coast Airport sports a new departure lounge, check-in counters, café/bar, as well as a new arrivals area. New transit infrastructure and car park has also been constructed with drop-off and pick-up facilities, and a designated bus parking area and rental car park.



RAIL Queensland Rail's "Spirit of Queensland" services provide regular connections into Bowen.

BUS Coach services connect from Bowen daily and provide north and southbound services.

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Top Beaches

Bowen's claim to fame is its beautiful array of pristine beaches that offer anything from ideal swimming locations to snorkelling beautiful coral reefs.

Everyone will find a beach to suit his or her taste. Have a look at the descriptions below and find yours.

HORSESHOE BAY Small and cosy, its white sand and crystal clear water make it one of Bowen's favourites. Just metres offshore is a spectacular coral reef that provides fantastic snorkelling and scuba diving. There is a paved parking area and a licensed cafe. It also has an entry point to the Cape Edgecumbe Walking Trail that provides some of Bowen's best views.

GRAYS BAY When the tide is in the water laps less than a metre from the road and with its azure water, white sand and rocky outcrops, it is one of the most picturesque bays in Queensland. It's great for snorkelling, fishing and water sports, has a boat ramp, free barbecues and a playground situated under big shady trees.

CORAL BAY Secluded and tucked away between Horseshoe Bay and Grays Bay, it is the only clothes-optional beach in Bowen.

MURRAY BAY Located between Horseshoe Bay and Rose Bay, this is a beautiful tropical bay complete with coconut trees. The beach is secluded and wind-protected, and provides excellent snorkelling, diving and fishing.



ROSE BAY This award-winning beach is perfect for families who can make use of the free barbecues, picnic tables and playground. It features magnificent views over the Whitsunday islands of Gloucester and Middle. It is another favourite spot among snorkellers, divers and fishermen.

FRONT BEACH Is the showcase of Bowen, and now has a half replica of the Big Mango. There is a soundshell, an interpretive centre commemorating the Catalinas stationed in Bowen during World War 2, and a display that depicts the town's role in the making of the movie Australia. Lots of picnic areas, an amenities block, a playground and a skate park completes the foreshore. A Water Park for kids is located close to the playground. Take a walk on the wharf and catch a fish or just view the abundant marine life.

KINGS BEACH Beautiful and often deserted means you can have the place all to yourself. It offers sweeping long stretches of sand. Fishermen and kite surfers can be seen here.

QUEENS BEACH A long white sandy beach, it's great for walkers, being the longest beach in Bowen at 5km. Free barbecues dot the beachfront, and there is a large playground and a shared walkway and bicycle circuit that goes to Yasso Point. When the wind is right, kite surfers favour this beach.



Top Lookouts

Whales can be seen from **Flagstaff Hill and Horseshoe Bay** lookouts between **June and September**

Offer some of the best coastal views you will ever see

Flagstaff Hill The vista from Flagstaff Hill lookout is spectacular, with Gloucester Island looming in the east and Gloucester Passage, the gateway to the Whitsunday Islands clearly visible. Closer, one can marvel at breathtaking views of Edgecumbe Bay, the North Head lighthouse and Stone Island.

The sweeping views along Kings Beach to Rose Bay and out across the township are beautiful. Pop into the Interpretive Centre on the top of Flagstaff Hill for a brief history of Bowen and a delicious bite to eat at the café. The road to Flagstaff Hill is bitumen sealed but isn't suitable for caravans, so it's best to leave them in the park.

Binoculars and get a superb view of basically Abbot Point to almost Proserpine. The proceeds of these support Bowen Tourism and Business and the Zonta Club of Bowen.

If your visit coincides with the lowest tide of the year, you will have the rare privilege of walking across Dalrymple Point to the lighthouse. However your visit will be short as you'll need to start your journey back before the tide turns.

Mt Nutt lookout If you want to see Bowen's fertile Don River delta and Queens Bay, head to the Mt Nutt lookout at Queens Beach. The viewing platform at the top of the reservoir provides views of the coal loading port at Abbot Point.

Horseshoe Bay lookout This is one lookout that you will need your walking shoes for. The Cape Edgecumbe walking circuit takes you to Horseshoe Bay Lookout, the World War II Radar Station Lookout and Mother Beddock. These lookouts offer stunning views of the coast and township, and lots of interesting scenery along the way.

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Grays Bay lookout This accessible lookout is just a short walk from the Grays Bay car park. It's also beside a picnic and barbecue area so sit back, have a feed and enjoy the gorgeous view, any time of the day.

Reservoir Hill Not really a lookout, but a drive up Bowen Hill (Reservoir) via Tynwald Avenue where the Bowenwood sign is located, offers some extraordinary views of the township, Mullers Lagoon and the coast.

Whales can be seen from Flagstaff Hill and Horseshoe Bay lookouts and resort balconies from June through to September.





Fishing is one of Bowen's biggest attractions

Fishing is one of Bowen's biggest attractions with its numerous creek systems, coral studded islands, offshore reefs, and most importantly abundant fish life.

Whether you are chasing barramundi up a creek, coral trout off the reef or Spanish mackerel out in the bay, the fishing in Bowen is something which must be experienced.

Top Fishing

Boat Ramps

You'll find public boat ramps at the Bowen Boat Harbour, Grays Bay and at the mouth of the Don River at Yasso Point, at Queens Beach. The Yasso Point boat ramp is only accessible at high tide and is not suitable for large craft.

Creek Fishing

Bowen has many creek systems which hold healthy numbers of mangrove jack, barramundi (closed season Nov 1st-Feb 1st) bream, whiting, flathead and very large mud crabs. There are numerous creek systems south of Bowen including Adelaide and Duck Creeks and can be accessed by sea around the top of the tide only. There are also several creeks north of Bowen including Bob Moses, Boat and Meatworks Creek which can also be accessed by sea around the top of the high tide from the Don River Boat Ramp. It's important to keep in mind that access to all of our creeks is limited. All may be entered by sea at high tide, but many become land locked by the tidal flats at low tide.

Offshore Fishing

Bowen has a multitude of offshore fishing options and you only need to go a short way to access many of the inshore islands and reefs which hold good numbers of coral trout, sweetlip and mackerel. Islands include Lighthouse, Stone, Middle and the magnificent Gloucester and Holbourne Islands. All these islands have abundant reef for both line and

spear fishing especially for the very tasty painted crayfish.

Bowen is renowned for its Spotted and Spanish mackerel fishing and from June through to September the infamous Bowen Mackerel Patches only a short 5km boat run from Grays Bay Boat Ramp. These fish arrive in huge numbers and when they come on the bite the fishing is simply world class.

If you don't have a boat

There are plenty of land based options in Bowen including the Bowen Jetty, the rocks at the southern end of Kings Beach and the rocky outcrops at Horseshoe, Grays and Rose Bays often deliver some good sized fish as well as squid on jigs in winter. Whiting are caught around creek mouths in the town area, including Magazine Creek near the boat harbour, Doughty's Creek at the western edge of town and Sandhills Creek at King's Beach. When the wind is light many of the town's open beaches provide some terrific fishing for Queensfish, barramundi and trevally.

Best fishing fun

For some of the best fishing fun check out Australia's biggest family fishing event the Bowen Family Fishing Classic and Wet Weekend which will be held in September this year.

Diving

Bowen has a surprise for you waiting just below the water's surface is an abundance of marine life waiting to be discovered.

Bowen is one of the few places on the Queensland coast where you can walk off the beach and head underwater to see the living reef.

Snorkelling For both beginners and experienced alike, our beautiful bays allow you to slip on your mask, snorkel and fins and find a new world waiting for you. Within a very short distance of the beach you will see reef fish below you swimming amongst the hard and soft corals on our fringing reefs that form part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park. Most of the fish life tends to gather close to the coral encrusted rocky outcrops that line the bays, so that is where you will have the best chance of seeing them. Of course this also means you never need to be

far away from shore to enjoy the experience. Spearfishing is not permitted in Grays Bay and Horseshoe Bay, so the fish particularly like these areas.

See the map above for optimum snorkelling trails and head on into the water and meet our finned locals.

Scuba Diving For a closer look at Bowen's reef fish and corals you can head under the water for a scuba dive. One of the great things about diving in Bowen is that you do not need to incur the cost of boat charters or the seasickness that afflicts some of us. There are grassy areas where you can rig up your gear in a clean and relaxed environment and then you can walk right off the beach and enjoy a dive when it suits you.

The most popular locations are Horseshoe, Rose and Murray Bays, where the depths are only six to seven metres so an hour long dive is not uncommon. Once you are breathing underwater you will notice some of the fish are curious about you too and you will observe them hiding from you only to peek out and have a closer look at who this visitor is sharing their habitat. Bowen diving doesn't disappoint in that on each dive, divers tend to discover something different to rave about.

If you are looking for more depth and maybe a wreck dive or two, you will need access to a boat. There are several local snorkelling and diving sites nearby. A WW2 landing craft (the "barge") in about 18m makes for an interesting dive; Holbourne Island and Middle Island give you the opportunity to make a day of it and head out on the water for your own, personal adventure.

To get all you can out of this underwater playground, full dive services, including off the beach introductory/try dives and dive Θ snorkel gear hire and sales are available locally and come highly recommended.

Stinger protection Like other centres in north Queensland, Bowen does, at times, have marine stingers. They are most common between October and April. For minor stings, doctors recommend flooding the sting area with vinegar that deactivates the stinging cells of the jellyfish tentacles. Bottles of vinegar are located at beaches. Never rub or wipe the tentacles away. Instead, seek medical attention. Medical attention is recommended for all stings.




Walks



One of the best ways to see Bowen's coastal scenery is to explore one of the many beautiful tracks. Slip on some comfortable walking shoes and find one to suit you

Kings Beach Walk (1.8km)

An easy walk along the sandy beach, starting from the car park area below Flagstaff Hill. Access to the beach can also be made from Rose Bay and via a short unsealed dirt road off Queens Road.



2600m / 3250 steps (one way)

Hansen Park to Horseshoe Bay Walk (2.6km)

Boasts some of Bowen's prettiest views, and follows Queens Bay around to Horseshoe Bay. It's a wide paved track making it wheelchair and stroller friendly.



1650m / 2060 steps (one way)

Queens Bay Beach Walk (1.6km)

Follows Queens Beach starting at the Don River estuary to Golf Links Road. You get beautiful views of both the bay and the suburb of Queens Beach.

Muller's Lagoon to Queens Bay

Includes a scenic walk around the lagoon and gardens, as well as along Soldiers Road that will take you to the beaches. Alternatively, if you are a keen bird watcher or botanist, stroll through Mullers Lagoon and enjoy the flora and fauna that is encased by 24 hectares of picturesque parkland.



3800m / 4750 steps (one way)

Front Beach & Jetty

Enjoy the new foreshore parklands or walk the planks of the town jetty that was built in 1865 and observe the marine life including turtles and stingrays that cruise the shallows when the tide is in.

Cape Edgecumbe Walking Trail

With its many elevations and beautiful views, taking in Horseshoe Bay, Murray Bay and Rose Bay nature lovers will be impressed by postcard-worthy lookout views of the bays and beaches, while having the opportunity to see the native wildlife

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

and bird life. You can walk the entire circuit or just part of it and there are entry points at Horseshoe, Murray and Rose bays.

If you start at Horseshoe Bay, it begins with a 100-metre uphill track with a lookout at the top offering breathtaking views. Continue along the main track for a few hundred metres and keep an eye out for a side track on your right which leads to the site of a World War II radar station and anti-aircraft battery. While the guns are long gone, you can still see the mounting points.

Keep walking past Murray Bay until you come across a large imposing rock balanced precariously on a granite outcrop. This landmark, seen from many locations throughout Bowen, is Mother Beddock. From here you can walk down to Rose Bay and Kings beaches.

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The most recent mural to be painted is the Coal Loading from the Jetty by Glen Gillard. This mural can be viewed at the Centrepoint Shopping Centre.

Bowen's first mural was painted in 1988 after a former Bowen resident visited Chemainus in Canada and was mesmerised by the town's history painted on walls. She returned to Bowen determined that its rich historical past would be honoured in the same way. Money was raised and the instigator of the Chemainus murals was brought to Bowen. A committee was formed following his visit, and by November 1988 the first mural had been painted. It is on the wall of the Bowen Library located in the main street of town, Herbert Street.

Bowen's diverse history from the early settlement through the various industries of the region to present time, comes to life through the paintings by many well known artists, some returning to paint more than one. Apart from Frances Rowland Wregg, Glen Gillard is another well known mural artist. After seeing how successful the murals have been as a tourist attraction in Bowen, a number of other communities are now following suit. The determination and hard work of the small band of volunteers who have worked hard over the years to raise the necessary funds to finance the murals has never waned.

The mural of local medico Sir Peter Delamothe, who became Queensland's attorney general, although not commissioned by the Mural Society, it has accepted the care of this mural. It is painted on the wall of the Council Chambers facing into the Town Square.

Another mural at the State School's tennis courts commemorates the life of James Morrill, and marks the year 1863 when he appeared out of the bush, who after been shipwrecked 17 years earlier had spent the intervening time living with the local Aborigines. He is buried in the Bowen cemetery.

The students of the Bowen High School painted one of the murals located at Horseshoe Bay, and Ken Done painted the one at Centrepoint Shopping Centre for Expo 1988 in Brisbane which deterioated and had to be replaced.

Most of the murals are located within the town centre so self guided walks, with the aid of the map opposite, comes highly recommended. Bowen is widely known for its murals and all 27 are displayed throughout Bowen's streets, and depict the diverse history from the town's early settlement to present day.

Early years

Holding the title of North Queensland's oldest town has provided Bowen with a long, colourful and interesting history.

Declared a town in 1861, its history predates that by many years. Aboriginal people inhabited the Bowen region long before the first white settlers sailed by.

Once occupied by the Girudala people, the first European to set eyes upon the present site of Bowen was Captain James Cook who passed within 9 km of the coast in 1770.

Captain Cook named Cape Gloucester, which turned out to be an island, one that dominates the view from Bowen's eastern beaches. Behind the island was a bay that he named Edgecumbe Bay.

Captain Henry Daniel Sinclair discovered Port Denison, which is the Bowen Harbour, in 1859. Sinclair, accompanied by William Henry Thomas (part financier of the voyage)

Machinery collection

You can get up close and personal to many of the props that were used in the movie Australia that was filmed in Bowen.

The crew was so impressed with local farmer Bill Ashman's large privately owned collection of old machinery, that they filled two huge trucks with everything from a 1934 English Fordson tractor, chaff cutters, saddles and black smithing tools to be used as props. They even took his century old ornate gates that mark the entry of his property. These were taken to the Sydney movie set to be used in particular scenes. The pieces used in the film were all dated prior to 1942.

What started as a hobby in 1991 has grown to hundreds of pieces of machinery and farm implements collected from around the district and dating back as far as the early 1800s.

Included are cultivation implements, engines, tractors, corn crackers, shellers and grinders, milk separators, circular saws and chain saws, horse drawn seed planters and a wool press. Most is under cover with concrete walkways between each section.

The collection is open to the public by arrangement and is only a 10-minute drive from Bowen. Visits can be arranged with Mr Ashman by telephoning 4785 2210. He is extremely knowledgeable, knows how every piece works, you will get an authentic history lesson it's well worth the visit.



and two passengers named James Gordon and Benjamin Poole, had set sail in the ketch 'Santa Barbara' from Rockhampton to find a suitable harbour that would serve as a port for North Queensland.

Two years later, Sinclair, leading a sea party, returned. There he met with George Elphinstone Dalrymple, who had led a land party, and founded a town they called Port Denison, on April 13 1861.

Sinclair's sea party, which was not allowed to set foot on the mainland until the arrival of Dalrymple, had waited on Stone Island, 2km offshore. Unfortunately this stopover resulted in the area's first European burial.

A man named Peter Craigie slipped on some planks, accidentally shot himself and died a few hours later. His grave, which was marked with stones, can still be seen. Several months later District Commissioner

George Elphinstone Dalrymple wrote to Brisbane and sought permission for the town to be named Bowen after Queensland's first Governor.

Within a year of settlement there were 20 cattle stations in the area, and hotels, stores and government agencies had been established. In 1862 the North Australian Hotel obtained its liquor licence. It now has the longest continuous liquor licence in North Queensland. However it is only the licence that is old. The original pub (on the site of the Commonwealth Bank) has long gone. Today the North Australian is a modern, single-storey hotel with attached motel facilities, renamed Sails On Main.

Perhaps the most interesting moment in the early history of Bowen occurred in 1863, incidentally the year Bowen became a municipality, when James Morrill appeared out of the bush shouting "Don't shoot mates, I'm a British object".

A sea mate on the Peruvian, he had been shipwrecked 17 years earlier on the Minerva Shoals east of Rockhampton, drifting 42 days and coming ashore north of Cape Bowling Green, making him the first white man to live in the region, and had spent

the intervening time living with the local Aborigines. He died in Bowen in 1865 and is buried in the local cemetery.

The town continued to prosper for a while but as more towns were opened further to the north, Bowen's role as a service port for a vast hinterland was reduced. In 1963 a group of citizens, concerned that much of this history was in danger of being lost, formed the Bowen Historical Society, later to become the Bowen Historical Society and Museum Inc, and established a museum.

Local museum

Much of Bowen's pioneer history has been preserved and is on display at the museum located at 22 Gordon Street. It has been described as one of the best regional museums in the state. There are hundreds of items catalogued and displayed along with accurate records of the town and the district.

Besides well laid out displays the museum has storage areas, strong rooms, workshop areas, members' room, kitchen and toilets. Nearby a slab cottage built in the district in 1872, was brought into town slab by slab, re-erected and restored. Period furniture and fittings were painstakingly collected to furnish the building.

Bowen's role in World War II

The Coral Sea Museum located at the Bowen Aerodrome is a smaller museum and honours Bowen's association with Catalina Flying Boats during World War II. Bowen was a base for the flying boats during the battle of the Coral Sea. The area's involvement is remembered by five dioramas all built on 1/72 scale and one is of the USS Lexington, believed to be the largest model of a ship on public display. This museum is open seven days 9am to 3pm.

An interpretative centre commemorating the Catalinas is also situated at the Front Beach foreshore.

The foreshore precinct is the undisputed focal point of Bowen, a major attraction for both tourists and locals

> Bowen's Front Beach has been transformed into a recreational area that includes an outdoor amphitheatre, interpretive centre, grassy picnic areas, a first class skate park, shared walking and bicycle tracks, public barbecues and children's playground.





It's a space that is enjoyed by people from all walks of life, backpackers travelling around Australia, couples having an early morning walk, teenagers using the skate park, CBD workers enjoying a quiet spot for lunch.

Families use the large grassy areas to enjoy barbecue dinners and to relax while kids play on the nearby playground or ride bikes and scooters along the wide tracks.

The soundshell and festival space is frequently used for all kinds of events, including a big budget QI5O celebration, Australia Day and New Year's Eve celebrations and cultural festivals. 2011 saw this space used to celebrate Bowen's I5Oth birthday, the Whitsunday Youth and Children's Arts Festival, as well as the Queensland Music Festival premiere event Behind The Cane, a musical that chronicled in song, dance and story, the courageous spirit of Queensland's South Sea Islanders.

Housed in one of the soundshell's booths is a Tourist Information Centre. Beside it is a display housed in huge glass panels, about Bowen's involvement in the filming of Australia, as well as other information about the town and region.

The Catalina Interpretive Centre incorporates the historical significance of the site. It's located beside the hardstand area where in World War 2, Catalinas were maintained and serviced before being redeployed.

Information about Bowen's involvement in World War II and images of the Catalinas are etched into large glass panels which gives the effect of the planes coming in to land on the bay when the viewer is looking at the images. It also includes a modern war memorial wall.

The precinct is dotted with plaques that explain significant historical events that helped shape modern day Bowen. The planting of several hundred mature trees, several thousand shrubs as well as many ground covers, completes the stunning foreshore.

A state of the art kids Water Park was constructed in 2012 and is located close to the playground and amenities block and as expected has proved to be very popular with families.

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Mullers Lagoon

Mullers Lagoon is a 23.57 hectare picturesque botanical gardens and wetlands habitat, situated in the centre of town, making it easy to visit. It consists of 11.97 hectares of land and 11.60 hectares of water.

A popular site for weddings and functions, it's also a place to relax and have a picnic with family or friends. There is a playground, picnic area with toilets, free barbecues and shade trees.

A walking track around the lagoon features interpretive facilities, seating and bridges, and it is well worth the walk with displays of dry climate palms, native and exotic shrubs and perennials on offer.

On the corner nearest Soldiers Road and Herbert Street is a collection of Cordylines, Heliconias, Cannas and palms. If you walk on the right hand side of these you come to a rustic bridge framed by Golden Cane palms and many interesting shrubs.

Ahead on the right there is a rockery displaying xerophytic plants, plants that have the ability to grow with very little rain. These are often referred to as cactus but this is not the case and there are only a couple of cacti growing here.

There are Aloes, Adeniums and Euphorbias from Africa; cacti, Agaves, Nolinias and Yucca from America; and Cycas and Pachypodiums (Latin for elephant's foot) from Madagascar. There is Stapelia from Afghanistan. The flowers smell like putrid meat and are pollinated by blowflies, having evolved without bees.

There are Plectranthus (native Coleus) and cycads from Australia, as well as some succulent bromeliads, a close relation of the pineapple, from America. Near this collection are the Erythrinas with many different species.

Further on is a stand of Melaleuca or tea trees, so called because Captain Cook made a herbal tea for scurvy out of a close relation when he first landed in Australia.

Close by is a colourful collection of Bougainvilleas that provide a profusion of colour.

Near the bridge is a stockade-like structure that acts as a wind break for a Japanese Friendship garden established to mark Bowen's connection with its sister city Oseto. There is a good collection of selfheading Philodendrons too.

Between here and the lagoon is a collection of Pandanus, a palm like plant. The border is Hymenocallis littoralis commonly known as spider plants that are salt resistant.

If you walk back across the bridge and turn right, walking along the lagoon edge, looking to your left you will find more tea trees and a Prostrate Grevillea and native Lagerstroemmia nearby.

Across the pathway you can walk through

a small grove of exotic palms including the African Oil Palm and the Cuban Royal Palm, to come to the picnic area.

Adjacent to the barbecues is a grevillea that attracts large numbers of birds. More recently a grove of about 60 different varieties and colours of Frangipani on the Hillview Road side of the park has been established.

During certain times of the year, in particular the dry season, the lagoon attracts many migrating bird species. Many of these birds lay eggs on the small island in the centre of the lagoon and there is a hide on the bank of the lagoon for secluded viewing.

John Wren, a noted local observer, has listed more than 170 different birds found in the area. Display boards alongside the path near the hide illustrate some of the birds you can expect to see.

One of the bird species that visitors may delight in seeing is the Great Bowerbird. Scan around the base of shrubs and overhanging branches to spot one.

The lagoon can be a hive of activity for waterfowl with large flocks of Plumed Whistling Ducks and Magpie Geese vying for a roosting place on the two small islands.

Situated in the dry tropics, the diversity of bird life in Bowen as a whole is great.

Cape Edgecumbe and Inaminka rocks are a great location to observe Brown Boobies, Pied Cormorants and Common Noddies. Sooty Oyster Catcher and Wandering Tattlers settle amongst the rocks.

Plenty of Brush Turkeys are found on the walk from Horseshoe Bay up to the first lookout. Mother Beddock lookout provides an opportunity to watch a number of diurnal birds of prey playing games over the rocky outcrops.

At Rose Bay check the beach for waders, and at Queens Beach watch large flocks or Red-Tailed Black Cockatoos search for beach almonds.



Backpackers are made to feel welcome in Bowen with work opportunities, lots of things to see and do, as well as a wide range of accommodation options on offer, to make your holiday experience a positive one.

Accommodation includes dedicated backpacker establishments located within a short walking distance to the beach, town centre, shops, restaurants and pubs, and transport. There are also affordable caravan parks, guest houses and pubs to stay at.

If you're on a working holiday most venues can help you find work. Some run buses to and from farms. Being the second largest vegetable producer in Queensland means Bowen has work available during the season from April to November either planting, picking, sorting or packing. Experience is not necessary, many positions offer on-thejob training.

However vegetable picking is physically demanding. Working conditions can be hot and dusty, so being fit and healthy is important. Early 6am starts are a common requirement of picking jobs. You will need to wear sunscreen, a collared shirt, wide-brimmed hat, insect repellent and sturdy footwear. It's also recommended that you carry a large container of water with you while working.

Weather plays an important role in harvesting, as some crops cannot be picked wet. If it rains work may not be available and your income may be temporarily affected. Wages are generally based on the volume of crop picked rather than the number of hours worked. If working in a field does not appeal to you, there are other types of work available in the fishing and tourism industries.

Once your work day is over, you can enjoy the local attractions including the sandy beaches where you can snorkel and see coral reef fish within metres of the shore. Fishing is another recreational favourite, either off the beach or rocks, as is walking, with a number of great trails offering



Whitsunday Coast Airport

Whitsunday Coast Airport now offers direct flights to Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne. From June 25th 2015 Whitsunday Coast Airport will welcome Jetstar return flights from Melbourne. This adds to the new direct return flights to Sydney with Tiger Air which commenced in April 2014. Jetstar and Virgin also offer daily return flights to Brisbane.

The new routes are more exciting and positive news for the Whitsunday Coast Airport and the local tourism industry. Whitsunday Regional Council has worked hard over the last few years to secure these direct flights to Melbourne and Sydney.

From June 2015, Jetstar will offer three return flights a week to Melbourne on Monday, Thursday and Saturday. Tiger Air offers three-four return flights to Sydney a week on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday and Monday's during school holidays and the busy August-September sailing season.





Did you know ?

• On a clear day, you can view the Port of Abbot Point from Flagstaff Hill in Bowen. NQBP donated funds for a telescope and shelter on Flagstaff Hill.

- The Port of Abbot Point was established in 1984 and has a proud 30 year history neighbouring the beautiful Queensland coastal town of Bowen.
- This strategically significant port is vital to Australia's export trade. It achieved throughput of 2013-2014 of 22,895,551 tonnes.
- The top three countries that Abbot Point Bulk Coal export to are China, India and Japan, but coal is also exported to countries such as Israel, Sweden and Spain.
- The Bowen Wharf is a perfect place for viewing sea turtles, manta rays and even the occasional dugong! The wharf was refurbished by NQBP in 2014.
- A new mural funded by NQBP was painted by artist Glen Gillard and is located at the Centrepoint Plaza. It depicts Bowen's connections with shipping, showcasing the growth of shipping in the area between the 1930s and 1970s

Top Development

The Port of Abbot Point is one of Australia's most significant emerging bulk ports and is one of four ports in Queensland that North Queensland Bulk Ports (NQBP) is responsible for as a leading port authority.

Located 25 kilometres north of Bowen and north-east of the Bowen and Galilee coal basins, coal is currently supplied to the Abbot Point Terminal 1 by rail from the Newlands, Collinsville and Sonoma mines and a number of Goonyella customers.

Terminal I is leased from the Queensland Government by Mundra Ports (which forms part of the Adani Group) and is operated by Abbot Point Bulkcoal (a Glencore subsidiary).

The port comprises rail in-loading facilities, coal handling and stockpiling areas; and a single trestle jetty and a 2.8 kilometre conveyor connecting to two offshore berths and two shiploaders.

Development

The State Government has set aside the Abbot Point State Development Area as its key site for future industrial development in Queensland. The planning and delivery of timely and efficient port capacity capable of supporting the trade of resources is critical for the development of this area.

NQBP is delivering on this vision for Government through facilitating future development including offshore facilities and onshore coal terminals at the Port of Abbot Point, in addition to the existing Terminal I. NQBP has been working closely with GVK Hancock regarding Terminal 3 and Adani Group regarding Terminal 0.

Further expansions at the port are an essential part of the critical infrastructure required to accommodate coal exports from the Bowen Basin and Galilee Basin.

These projects will enable Queensland to meet the worldwide demand for coal and confirm Queensland as the world's largest exporter of coal.

Abbot Point and the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park

As the Port of Abbot Point is situated adjacent to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, NQBP plays a critical stewardship role which includes investing in in-depth studies which guide sustainable development and protection of the values of the Great Barrier Reef.

Australia's best-practice development within the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area has maintained environmental values and economic growth for more than 30 years and this is evident when enjoying the picturesque environment around Bowen.

NQBP implements a comprehensive environmental program known as the EcoPorts Program, which sets annual targets and environmental objectives. Regular monitoring of our marine environment occurs and in particular, seagrass monitoring has been ongoing for many years. Seagrass environments around Bowen and Abbot Point are thriving systems sustaining life for important marine species.



Top Fruit & Vegetables



The Bowen and Gumlu region is well known for its horticulture products and boasts an estimated annual value of \$450 million dollars to the horticulture industry and the local economy.

The Bowen and Gumlu region is the largest winter growing vegetable region in Australia exporting to both domestic and international markets. The major commodities grown are tomatoes, capsicums, mangoes, beans, sweet corn, melons and eggplant.

Bowen is a fertile tropical paradise and has the perfect climate for production through the winter months. The region has been producing fruit and vegetables since the 1880's, spanning more than 130 years with some families still farming today. Produce is sold through the central market system, supermarket chains and to export agents.

The industry employs more than 3200 skilled and unskilled workers during the season. There are a wide variety of career options available within the horticulture industry ranging from farm operations, business management, marketing to technical support and professional roles.

In addition to fruit and vegetables growers, two large-scale seedling nurseries in the Bowen region supply seedlings locally and throughout Queensland. Tomato and mango processing plants and range of rural businesses make up the supply chain for the horticulture industry in the region.

The region is supported by Bowen Gumlu Growers Association (BGGA) a not for profit organisation and the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry Bowen Research Facility, located in the Delta. Grazing

High quality beef is produced for both domestic and overseas markets Queensland is Australia's main producer and exporter of beef. Bowen and the Whitsunday Region plays a role in this, with its hinterland sustaining a large cattle grazing industry, with high quality beef produced for various markets.

More than 2.5 million hectares of the Bowen region is devoted to producing beef cattle, mostly comprising Brahman and Brahmancross breeds. An estimated 315,000 head of beef cattle roam more than 175 stations,

concentrated around the Collinsville and Mt Coolon districts ranging in size from 500 to 100,000 hectares.

Over recent years the live export cattle trade has sourced many head from the Whitsunday district, and has now become a major outlet for the sale of various classes of livestock. These are mostly exported via the Townsville Port, 200km to the north of Bowen.

Local store cattle are also sold to various feedlots and restocker graziers throughout Queensland, with slaughter cattle being transported to abattoirs up and down the coastline, supplying both domestic and export beef markets.

The local area also has a number of stud herds that play an important role in ensuring local graziers can buy genetics that are acclimatised to the region. These stud cattle are also marketed through selected stud auctions between Rockhampton and the Northern Tablelands.

Graziers in the Bowen/Whitsunday region have the dubious honour of experiencing some of the most variable rainfall in Australia. Climatologist Dr Roger Stone identifies that the Bowen region wet season can vary from almost nothing to monsoonal deluges.

Local graziers are adept at risk management techniques and take this in their stride.



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Coke Works

Bowen Coke Works supplies metallurgical coke to one of the world's largest producer of lead for use in the lead smelter in Mount lsa.

Salt Works

Bowen's solar evaporation salt field and refinery at the entrance to the town, which began operating in 1925, is one of a number owned and operated by Australian Saltworks in Australia.

Bowen's salt production involves seawater being pumped from a tidal creek into a broad expanse of low-lying land that is impermeable to water.

The land used for solar evaporation is about 154 hectares. Most of the area is comprised of a series of interconnected ponds through which seawater continually passes as it evaporates.

Top Coke & Salt

Located in Norris Street, Bowen Coke is owned and operated by Glencore. It was originally established by the Queensland Government in 1933 to utilise coking coal from the State coal mine in Collinsville.

By 1975, MIM had taken over coal mining operations at Collinsville and in 1988 it purchased and took over operation of the coke works.

Xstrata acquired MIM Holdings in 2003; Glencore merged with Xstrata in May 2013.

The coke works uses coking coal from Newlands, transported to Bowen by rail for processing in the 54 bee hive ovens at the site. The coal is crushed to a fine texture and up to 14 tonnes is loaded into each oven. The heat inside the ovens ignites the coal and a

When salt crystals start to form the brine is pumped into specially prepared crystallisers. As long as evaporation exceeds rainfall a crust of salt grows on the bottom. In a good year, the crust can be 150mm thick.

Once harvested the salt is washed in a concentrated brine to remove any impurities, and is then crushed to the correct grain size for use in many applications.

From autumn to spring, most of Bowen's output went to stockfeed manufacturers and rural suppliers throughout North Queensland for supplementary feeding of stock. During the summer months, swimming pool salt and water softener salt are the main products, distributed in various grades from Cairns to the Gold Coast, and controlled burning process lasting between three and four days removes the volatiles to leave carbonised coal, better known as coke.

The red hot coke is then pushed out of the ovens onto a receiving car before being quenched under the water sprays. It is then stockpiled ready for transport to Mount Isa. The entire battery of ovens is typically "pushed-out" 2 times each week.

The coke produced, up to 48000 tonnes each year, is transported by rail to Mount Isa for use in the smelting process.

Bowen Coke operates within strict Department of Heritage and Protection (DHP) environmental controls, working continually to improve their environmental performance.



west to Mt Isa. The company also supplies a range of salt products into the hide and skin, water treatment, mining and industrial sectors.

The Bowen site is classed as a 15,000 tonne field but in dry years up to 30,000 tonnes can be harvested annually.



Top Fisheries

Fisheries

A fishing fleet operates out of Bowen Harbour that supports a live fish export business and a trawling industry, with a gross turnover of about \$20 million in good seasons.

Bowen is Queensland's second biggest port in shipping out live coral trout, and it's undisputed that the most sought after coral trout in the world comes out of Bowen. The red colour of the fish is the most sought after colour by the Chinese, and the reddest fish come from Bowen. The market for this fish can vary between \$30 and \$62kg.

The harbour has three integrated berthing facilities, which are attached to fish receiving and processing businesses. These companies receive large quantities of prawns, bugs, scallops, live fish, fresh and frozen fish, and crabs in season.

There are fresh seafood retail outlets at the harbour and a commercial slipway and boat maintenance facility.

There are about 20 registered master fishermen and 90 assistant/trainee masters in Bowen, operating the linefishing boats and trawlers, and the harbour is home to an estimated 15 local boats. It attracts, on average, another 20 trawlers and 10 line-fishing boats. Since the live fish trade started in Bowen in 1995, it has grown into a thriving industry, providing jobs, generating significant economic activity, attracting tourists, and has put Bowen on the map as being a source of some of the best seafood in the world.

Bowen's Big Mango is the biggest in the world

The 10 metre high roadside sculpture is a great photo opportunity not to be missed. Erected in 2002 it cost almost \$90,000 to design and build and was part of a community campaign to revitalise the local community and boost tourism.

The giant piece of fruit is located at the Bowen Visitor Information Centre at Mt Gordon, 5kms south of the town. It is painted in the lush colour of the Kensington Pride mango that was introduced to Bowen from India in 1871.

After the initial flurry of interest, nationally and internationally, about whether it was built upside down or not, people now accept it as another one of Australia's BIG tourism drawcards, alongside the Big Rig at Roma, the Big Pineapple near Nambour and Gayndah's Big Orange. In early 2014 the Big Mango was involved in a heist where it mysteriously disappeared overnight. The news of the 'missing mango' made global headlines within hours. It was mentioned in 3149 media reports reaching over 25 million people worldwide with a total public relations value of nearly 13 million dollars. It was later revealed the popular restaurant chain; Nando's was responsible for the stunt in light of promoting their new mango and lime flavour. The stunt put Bowen back on the map to tourists not only from Australia but worldwide.

Mangoes originally come from India and Queensland's iconic Bowen Mango, also known as the Kensington Pride, is the cream of the crop. In the second half of the 1800's a thriving horse trading business operated between North Queensland, centred in Bowen, and India. Among the items Indian Bowen's famous Big Mango depicts the delicious Bowen Mango that was named after the town itself

crews bought with them were mangoes.

The Bowen harbourmaster and customs officer, Mr.GE Sandrock, collected a quantity of mango seeds from the sailors and planted them on his property called Woodlands just south of Bowen. As the initial stock came into fruit, seeds from the better quality trees were given to a Mr McDonald, who planted them on his property at Adelaide Point, south of Bowen. The name Kensington Pride had remained, but it's more widely known as the Bowen Mango or Bowen Special.



Molongle Creek is a paradise for fishermen

Fishing is one of Whitsundays region's biggest attractions, and a short drive north of Bowen, Molongle Creek offers great fishing, as well as access to Cape Upstart National Park that is only accessible by boat.

If you have the time, you really should plan to stay for a few days, and Molongle Creek Tourist Caravan Park is worth considering. To get there turn right off the Bruce Highway onto Molongle Beach Road only 55 kilometres north of Bowen. The park caters for all who love fishing and crabbing and there's plenty of parking for boats.

The Molongle Creek Boat Club offers modern facilities and they are open to the public. There are four boat ramps that are well maintained all year round. Beside the ramps is a huge multipurpose area that includes showers, toilets, and a large covered area fitted out with barbecues. The club is continually working to improve access.

The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park surrounds Cape Upstart National Park and is only accessible by boat.



Before dropping a line check the marine park zoning plan for advice on activities permitted in the marine park waters.

It's a low-key park for self-sufficient visitors and you can camp at Coconut Beach. No facilities are provided and you need to take drinking water and a fuel stove.

For more advice on camping in the national park contact the QPWS Whitsunday Information Centre on telephone 4946 7022. There are plenty of other activities to indulge in including bushwalking, swimming and photography.

The Cape is also accessible from the Elliot River near Guthalungra. The Elliot River boat ramp is accessible on a well-maintained dirt road on the southern side of the river. Turn right off the Bruce Highway onto Wally Sproule Road. If you need to stock up on supplies first, stay on the highway, cross the bridge and Guthalungra store will be right there on your right hand side.

Another tranquil place to stay in the north of the shire is Gumlu, at the Gumlu Caravan Park and Tavern. The park offers powered and un-powered camping sites and on-site van accommodation under shady trees.

Gumlu Caravan Park is also close to Cape Upstart National Park, only eight kilometres from the Molongle Creek boat ramp, and an on-site shop sells bait and ice.

So there you have it. The region's north really does have it all. You can be immersed in serenity and quiet bliss, fish to your heart's content, whether you stay in a beachfront caravan park, a park in a bush setting, or camping in a national park.





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Top Collinsville, Scottville & Mt Coolon

Historic Collinsville has plenty to offer and delight visitors.

The historic mining town of Collinsville is located 85km west of Bowen, about a 45 minute drive, situated in the foothills of the Clarke Range. The Collinsville Developmental Road will take you inland to an area rich in coal mining and grazing history.

The Collinsville area was opened up as a grazing run in early 1861, Strathmore Station being the first in the district. During the 1880s several gold mines were operated at Ukalunda, My Wyatt, and Normandy and later at Mt Coolon.

In 1865, reports of a large coal deposit at Moongunya resulted in extensive testing and mining eventuated in 1919. The area was renamed Collinsville in 1921. The main township of Collinsville was established in late 1922 when 20 homes were erected.



The State School and Police quarters were already operational, as were a general store and butcher shop.

A hospital opened in 1926 and the town received reticulated water in 1930, with electricity connected in 1947. In 1967 a powerhouse was opened. It closed in 1988, was later privatised and reopened in 1997 and closed again in 2013.

While in town, stroll around and look at the murals and heritage signs that will provide an insight into the lives of the region's early settlers. A visit to the Miner's Memorial and Coalface Experience Museum is a must.

The town reservoir hill offers spectacular sights of Mt Devlin to the north, the Leichardt Ranges to the east, and Sonoma and Collinsville mines to the south and west. The reservoir hill at

Scottville offers a spectacular night-time view of the Collinsville Coal Mine, Collinsville Power Station and Sonoma Coal Mine.

Visit the Collinsville Bakery for their famous fresh bread, stroll downtown and delight in locally made Arts and Crafts or simply enjoy a delicious cup of coffee.

There is a pleasant 3.7 km walkway from Collinsville to Scottville that provides easy walking or biking for those who want a bit of exercise.

Located adjacent to the Collinsville Hospital, is the new look Visitor Information Centre. Make this your first stop, for brochures or information on what to do and where to go.



camping at the Town Common, located by the Showgrounds. A dump point is available for your needs. Collinsville is the passage to your inland journey through the Historical Mining Trail. The Collinsville Development Road connects directly to the Gregory Development Road heading North to Charters Towers, or South to Clermont.

Coal Face Museum

Collinsville's Mining Heritage Centre, the Coalface Experience, is dedicated to the history of Queensland's coal mining industry and showcases the rich mining heritage of the region. Stories of struggle, strife and mateship are played out at a range of interactive displays, audio-visual exhibits, two theatrettes and historical records presenting visitors with a great interpretation of the past, present and future of Queensland's coal mining industry. The museum also shows visitors what life was like for the coal miners, both above and below ground in the 1950s.

The museum's opening coincided with the 50th anniversary of the town's biggest underground mining disaster, in which seven men were killed in an underground gas explosion on October 13, 1954. It honours those men, and 19 others who have also lost their lives on the Collinsville coalfield.

Collinsville was recognised as a potential coalfield as early as 1866, when the area became known as the Bowen River Coalfield. Railway construction from Bowen started in 1916 and full scale coal production started in 1922 following the railway's completion that provided access to coastal markets.

Collinsville Coal Mine

Collinsville Coal Mine is an open-cut mine located 4km west of Collinsville. It produces a variety of coking and thermal coal products for both overseas and domestic markets. It is owned Glencore by the NCA Joint Venture whose principal beneficial owners are Xstrata Queensland Pty Ltd and Itochu Corporation. It's operated by Xstrata Coal Queensland Pty Ltd.

Sonoma Coal Mine

Sonoma Coal Mine was established in September 2007, located 6km south of Collinsville and is owned by Q Coal and operated by Theiss. The mine's first shipment of coal was railed in January 2008. It produces coking and thermal coal products for export.

History

Collinsville Scottville and District Historical Society Inc. opened its Historical Display Centre in May 2014 at 81 Garrick Street (in a section of the old hospital). The rooms are filled with local photographic history, historical items, an impressive bottle display and much more. The small band of volunteers work tirelessly to preserve local history and items for public viewing. The Historical Display Centre is open every Wednesday 9am Ipm. Out of hours opening can be arranged if volunteers are available. Phone 0429 431 414.

Bogie River Bush House

Nestled in 25 acres of virgin bush land, a short drive from Bowen is a tranquil, relaxing local secret, known as the Bogie River Bush House. Surround yourself with abundant wildlife and birdsong, lunch at the poolside cafe, take morning tea on the veranda, take a dip or bush walk. Upcoming events - movie nights, boot camps, mother's day special. Day trippers are welcome. Don't miss the morning sunlight, close encounters with our furry local residents whilst being treated to real home style cooking and hospitality, a delight for children and adults alike, it's great to be in the bush.





Bowen River Hotel – Strathmore Pub

Originally established around about 1860, the building was donated to the National Trust of Queensland in 1974 by Ted Cunningham, of Strathmore Station. It lay abandoned but in 2003 was rebuilt and comprises of two buildings connected by a covered walkway, and is an example of careful bush carpentry and skilled jointing fixed with wooden pegs. The hotel has a licensed bar, an informal beer garden that is family friendly and serves lunch and dinner, and accommodation is also available. There's also a collection of photographs, paper clippings and memorabilia from yesteryear.

The immediate surrounds are abundant with wildlife and the Bowen River is abundant with fish. There is also free camping down by the river. Caravans are welcome but are asked to contribute a small fee to cover power costs. Every May Day long weekend, a fishing competition is hosted at nearby Terrible Creek, a junior competition is held there in October, the Bowen River Rodeo and Campdraft is held every Queens Birthday long weekend in June.

Top Collinsville, Scottville & Mt Coolon

Bowen River Rodeo & Campdraft

The Bowen River Rodeo and Campdraft is held annually on the Queen's Birthday long weekend in June at the rodeo grounds behind the Bowen River Hotel. Campsites are available over the weekend & there is also plenty of live entertainment.

Mt Coolon Hotel

This is a great old pub with heaps of character and memorabilia, offers big burgers for lunch, as well as offering a dinner menu, and has rooms for the weary driver. Mount Coolon is situated about 124km south-west of Collinsville, 200km north of Clermont, and is known for its gold mining history and the infamous Tom Coolon murders. A jackeroo called Luke Reynolds from Yacamunda Station discovered gold there in 1913. Thomas Coolon was the first to peg a claim in 1914. Today the town boasts an array of old buildings and ruins to capture the imagination.

Bowen River Weir

Bowen River Weir is about a 20-minute drive from Collinsville. Take the Mt Coolon Road out of town and when you get to Sonoma Mine, the turn-off to the weir is on the left hand side, opposite the mine's entrance. The road can be rough at times so drive to the road conditions. The weir is a popular fishing and camping spot and the local fish stocking association restock the weir with barramundi fingerlings each year. The Collinsville water supply is pumped from here and is controlled by Sunwater. Be aware, saltwater crocodiles do inhabit these waters.

Creek picnics

3 MILE CREEK 3 Mile Creek is part of the Pelican Creek system and is located 15 minutes west of town as you travel through Scottville and out along the Myuna Road. It's a great little swimming hole and picnic area.

PELICAN CREEK Pelican Creek is a nice little creek that runs from the north east of town round to the western area. It's easily accessible

from several locations.

40 FOOT 40 Foot is nestled up in the heart of Mt Devlin and in the wet season puts on a lovely waterfall display. A 15 to 20-minute hike up Mt Devlin will see you at the waterfall.

TERRY'S CREEK Terry's Creek is a 15-minute drive along the Peter Delemothe Road towards Bowen. It is another popular picnic and swimming place in the wet season.

BOWEN RIVER The beautiful Bowen River can be accessed in many places from Collinsville out along the Bowen Development Road, on Strathmore Station, or along the Mt Coolon Road. Just after crossing the Bowen River bridge there is a turn left into Exmoor Road which takes you to Eungella Dam. There are many tracks that turn off along this road that lead to the river. There are many lovely spots to picnic, fish and swim. However, be aware that salt water crocodiles and fresh water crocodiles inhabit these waters.

Fossicking

Fossil shells, opalised wood and petrified wood, hornblende, agate, perhnite, clear crystal clusters, jasper and calcite can be found in the Collinsville area. Fossickers need to get permission from property owners. For the best places to seek the local gems, contact the Bowen Lapidary Club on 07 4785 6312. A well equipped clubhouse is located at Queens Beach, Bowen.

Accommodation & dining

Accommodation and dining facilities in Collinsville are both varied and numerous. Catering to a predominantly mining community, accommodation provides both long term and short stay facilities and caters to all budgets. There is a caravan park, free camp site (72 hrs) at the Showgrounds hostel-like accommodation at the newly renovated former Queensland Rail single persons' quarters, as well as farm stays, hotels and motels. They offer clean, comfortable rooms that are fully serviced, as well as good wholesome meals.

The Pit Pony project

On the 5th of February, 1990, Australia's last working pit ponies retired from service at Collinsville Coal's No.2 Mine. Much loved members of the mine workforce and the wider community, Wharrier and Mr Ed were more than working horses, they were mates to the miners and symbols of strength and unity to

the small town. 25 years on, Wharrier and Mr Ed, along with the hundreds that descended the mines before them, continue to live on in the memories of the locals.

Collinsville, as with many other historic mining towns, has felt the effects of the rise and fall of coal prices since the retirement of the pit ponies, surging in and out of good times and bad. The recent push towards transient workforces in the mining industry has left the town a little quieter than before, with fewer locals left to uphold the proud community spirit. We believe a focus on our unique history can help forge a new identity for the town, establishing Collinsville as the Pit Pony Capital of Australia, and opening employment pathways into alternate industries. We'd like to rebuild our strong community spirit and remember the strength and unity of our past, inspired for so many years by our adored pit ponies.

The History of the Pit Pony

The partnership between miner and pit pony in Collinsville began with the commencement of coal mining in 1921. Horses were used below ground hauling coal to the surface, and in the long journey above ground to deliver the coal to port. Despite their name, the Collinsville pit ponies were typically Clydesdale horses, renowned for their strength, and able to work efficiently in the larger mine tunnels.

During their working life, the pit ponies formed strong bonds with their handlers and the other miners around them. Their even temperament made them suitable for the never-ending darkness and loud noises, while superior intelligence ensured they never endured a heavy load, and always found unguarded cribs to munch on. living out their final days on a nearby grazing property, in the care of previous handler Bill Hoffman.

The Pit Pony Experience

The Collinsville Pit Pony Experience will centre on the construction of one large pit pony in the centre of town. Molded from cast bronze, the pit pony will be a long-lasting, child-friendly monument displaying the strong community spirit in Collinsville. Behind the pit pony sculpture will stand a donators wall with the

names of each donator on display. We want the project to be built by the community, for the community, and recognising every contribution, both local and abroad, will enhance this spirit of unity.

In addition to the pit pony sculpture and donators wall, three "selfie" walls will be constructed about the town. Located to encourage a tourist trail through the town, the walls will detail scenes of the pit ponies and miners at work and will be designed to allow tourists to take photos of themselves in-situ. The trail will finish at the No.1 State Tunnel model outside the Workers Club where visitors can learn about the Collinsville Mine Disaster, and proceed to visit the Coalface Experience. A smart phone app will be developed to guide visitors through the town, following the historic trail, and provide stories about the pit ponies and

their place in the history of Collinsville. Several lines of merchandise will also be developed stickers, belt buckles, a children's book about the pit ponies, and a resin model of our pit pony sculpture. These items are available as rewards in the various categories on the right. Finally, we will purchase a 3D printer to generate pit pony models for sale. Working in conjunction with the high school, the 3D printer will be available for use by students to develop CAD and 3D printing skills.



By 1987 machinery underground had assumed many of the pit pony's tasks and mine management in Collinsville were eager to retire the ponies. In order to protect their rights, the final two pit ponies were made honorary members of the union, and became subject to the law of seniority the longest serving miner would be the last to leave the mine. In 1990, however, it became clear to miners and management that the era of the pit pony had passed and the final two ponies were retired,






Collinsville & Scottville Maps

Golden Arrow Tours

A Scenic Tour around Tropical Bowen

ENJOY the scenic delights of Bowen by following the Golden Arrow Tour prepared for you by members of the Rotary Club of Bowen.

Your tour starts at arrow "1" which is sited some 200 metres on the town side of the Bowen Salt Works. Proceed via arrows 2, 3 on Leichhardt Street then 4 which is located at the intersection of Herbert and Livingstone Streets. Proceed via Herbert Street and the town's business centre with its wide streets and centre garden plots to arrow 5, located at Santa Barbara Parade.

Continue from arrow 5 along the harbour foreshore to arrow 6 located at the roundabout, travelling through the roundabout, your tour will take you via arrows 7 and 8 to Flagstaff Hill Lookout.

The view from the summit gives panoramic views of the harbour and surrounding islands.

However, because of the steep gradient, it is not suitable for caravans. Retrace your journey back via arrows 8, 7 and 6 to arrow 9 which will lead you back through the main shopping centre. Your tour now takes you via arrows 10 and 11, past the State High School and the Showgrounds, to arrow 12 at the base of Mount Nutt Lookout. Unfortunately, here you must leave your vehicle and walk to top.

The scenic view from the top of the water tower lookout commands views of the many small crop farms and mango plantations which contribute to the town's economy. In the distance, the offshore coal handling facilities of Abbot Point can be seen.

Returning from the lookout to arrow 13, your Golden Arrow Tour continues through the beachside suburb of Queens Beach via arrows 14 to 19.

Continuing to arrow 20, you will pass the Bowen Golf Club nestling along the shores of Queens Beach. Turning at arrow 21 into Wests Lane, your journey continues past the Bowen Old People's Homes Society Nursing Home, Hostel, Day Therapy Centre and Rotary Village.

On the opposite side of the road is Cunningham Villas, once a retirement home for ex-servicemen and women. It is now open to all.

Following arrows 22 to 35 will provide you with a tour of picturesque Horseshoe Bay, just one of the many beautiful bays which are ideal for swimming or sunbaking all year round.

The view from Rotary Lookout is something which should not be missed. Retracing your journey back to arrow 26, your tour will continue to Rose Bay and the magnificent view of Gloucester Island and Kings Beach. Your tour will then return via arrows 27 to 30 where it will end at Mullers Lagoon with its abundant wild birdlife.

We, the Rotarians and citizens of Bowen, trust you have enjoyed the Golden Arrow Tour and hope you will return to our delightful spot on the Coral Coast.

Rotary meets at the Central Hotel each Tuesday at 6.30pm.


