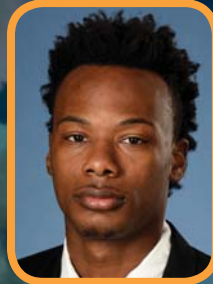

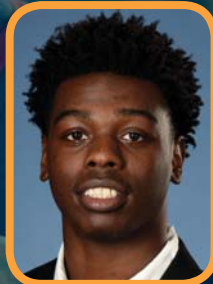

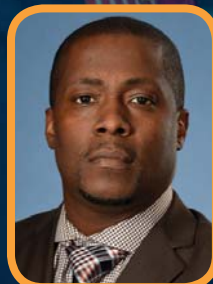

# ALEX ANDERSON 3

Guard • 5-11 • 180 • Senior • Memphis, Tenn. • Itawamba CC

**2014-15:** Emerged as one of the best shooters in the nation, playing in all 34 games while starting 33 games in a row following the season-opener...Led the OVC and ranked third in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (.480)...Also ranked first in the OVC in three-point field goals made (2.8 per game) while ranking third in minutes played (34.9 per game)...Averaged 12.5 points per game, scoring in double-figures in 22 contests...Knocked down 94 three-pointers (fifth-most in a single-season in UT Martin history), hitting at least one in every game and multiple trifectas in 23 games...Shot at a 56.4 percent clip from three-point range over the last 16 games (61-for-108)...Eclipsed the 20-point plateau three times, including a career-best 30 points and career-high seven 3-pointers in the CIT first round win at Northwestern State on March 19...Tallied 23 points (with six 3-pointers) against Morehead State in the OVC Tournament quarterfinals on March 5...Also displayed the ability to convert pressure free throws, making 27 consecutive attempts from the charity stripe from Jan. 22 through March 21, which tied Lester Hudson (2008-09) and

Dee Oldham (2013-14) for the school record...Sank 88.9 percent of his free throw attempts (48-for-54) on the season...Sported an impressive 1.5 assist-to-turnover ratio (66 assists against 43 turnovers).

**BEFORE UTM:** Earned 2013-14 NJCAA second team All-American status after averaging 16.7 points, 4.6 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 1.2 steals per game at Itawamba Community College in Fulton, Miss....Playing for head coach Grant Pate, Anderson helped lead the Indians to a 17-10 record, their first MACJC championship since 2008 and the quarterfinals of the NJCAA Region XXII tournament... Was named the first NJCAA All-American for the Indians since 2008...Had nine 20-plus point games, including a season-high 29 points at Northwest Mississippi Community College on Jan. 13...Handed out a season-best 10 assists (against zero turnovers) against Snead State Community College on Dec. 14...Shot 49.1 percent from the floor, 36.9 percent from beyond the three-point arc and 88.9 percent (sixth in the nation) from the free throw line...Also earned all-region status and was selected to the MACJC All-Star Game... Played at Jacksonville State University in 2012-13, averaging 6.8 minutes over 25 games as a true freshman...Played at East High School for head coach Sam Bachelor, helping guide the Mustangs to the 2012 AAA state title (the school's first state championship since 1996)...Tallied 12.8 points, 6.5 assists, 2.4 rebounds and 2.4 steals per game during his senior campaign, shooting 52 percent from the field and 48 percent from three-point range...Ranked as one of the top 50 high school players in the state of Tennessee, rounding out his career with over 1,000 points scored to go along with over 500 assists...Averaged 13.3 points and 5.1 assists during his junior season.

**PERSONAL:** Born on Nov. 27, 1993...Son of Earl and Barbara Anderson...Has one brother and one sister... Majoring in health and human performance.

Guard • 6-3 • 195 • R-Senior • Memphis, Tenn. • South Plains College

**2014-15:** Appeared in 29 games off the bench, tallying 7.3 minutes per game...Compiled 21 points, 21 assists, 25 rebounds and eight steals...Logged double-digit minutes in nine contests, including a career-high 19 minutes at Evansville in the CIT semifinals on March 31...Handed out multiple assists in five games, including a career-best four assists in 11 minutes against Eastern Illinois on Jan. 29...Scored a career-high six points in 15 minutes against Champion Baptist on Nov. 20 and added five points in 12 minutes in the OVC Tournament quarterfinals against Morehead State...Had one of his best all-around games in the second round of the CIT, tallying four points, a career-high three rebounds, an assist and a steal in 10 minutes at USC Upstate on March 21.

**2013-14:** Redshirted.

**BEFORE UTM:** Originally signed with TCU out of high school but played two seasons under head coach Steve Green at South Plains College in Levelland, Texas...Helped lead the Texans to a 58-8 record in his two seasons at SPC, including a perfect 36-0 mark and NJCAA national championship during his freshman season...Played in 49 games at SPC...Best game as a sophomore came on Nov. 13 against Temple, when he poured in 17 points, seven rebounds, three steals and two assists...Best game as a freshman came against Frank Phillips College on Feb. 16, when he handed out nine assists...Spent the 2010-11 season at Brehm Preparatory School in Carbondale, Ill. – one of the most prominent prep schools in the nation that also produced former Skyhawk Mike Liabo...Averaged 12.8 points, six assists and five rebounds per game for head coach Aaron Lee...Prior to Brehm Prep, Durham was a three-star recruit by Rivals.com and earned an 85 out of 100 ranking by ESPN.com's recruiting services after a spectacular career at Craigmont High School in Memphis...As a senior, he was a 2010 Commercial Appeal Best of Preps Class AAA selection after leading the Chiefs to a 26-5 record and state ranking as high as No. 6...Was listed as the third-best combo guard prospect in the state of Tennessee and a top sleeper candidate by recruiting guru Rick Bolus.

# TWYMOND HOWARD 30

Forward • 6-6 • 210 • Senior • Pearl, Miss. • Southwest Mississippi CC

**2014-15:** Earned a reputation as one of the most skilled frontcourt players in the OVC, earning a spot on the league's All-Newcomer team...Ranked fourth in the conference with 34.8 minutes played per game and eighth in rebounding, hauling in 6.6 boards per contest...Averaged 13.6 points per game, leading the team in scoring six times (including twice in the CIT)...Tied a career-high with 23 points (on 9-of-13 shooting) in the quarterfinals of the CIT at Eastern Kentucky on March 25 after scoring 15 points in the second round of the CIT at USC Upstate on March 21... Corralled five double-doubles, three of which occurred in OVC play...Accumulated 17 points and 10 rebounds in the CIT semifinals at Evansville on March 31...Poured in 21 of his career-best 23 points in the second half to help the Skyhawks erase a 19-point second half deficit to win at Arkansas State on Nov. 17...Added two more 20-plus point games in conference play (22 points against Eastern Illinois on Jan. 29, 21 points at Southeast Missouri on Feb. 12)... Grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds and had the game-winning tip-in layup with 3.7 seconds left in overtime to cap off a 75-73 victory at Eastern Illinois on Feb. 19...Brought home three adidas OVC Newcomer of the Week awards...Led the team in free throws made (106) and free throws attempted (148).

**BEFORE UTM:** Was named a 2013-14 NJCAA honorable mention All-American after averaging team-highs of 15.8 points and 9.8 rebounds at Southwest Mississippi Community College in Summit, Miss....Playing for head coach Casey Carter, he started in all 25 games, shooting 44 percent from the floor...Also averaged 1.4 assists, 1.4 steals and 0.7 blocks per game...Eclipsed 20 points on eight different occasions while notching 14 double-doubles...Scored a season-high 30 points against Holmes Community College on Dec. 5...Was also named all-region and first-team all-state while garnering Most Valuable Player honors after scoring a game-high 20 points in the MACJC All-Star Game...Began his collegiate career at the University of Texas-El Paso, where he played in 12 games and averaged 5.6 minutes per game as a true freshman in 2012-13...Was a 2012 Parade All-American and ranked as a four-star recruit, No. 14 small forward in the country and No. 69 overall ranked player by Rivals.com following a stellar prep career at Pearl High School... Averaged 25 points, 12 rebounds, three assists, two blocks and 1.5 steals per game while guiding Pearl to a 27-4 record as a senior... Shot 56 percent from the field, 38 percent from beyond the three-point arc and 72 percent from the free throw line... Had season-highs of 39 points against Clinton High School and 19 rebounds against Canton High School...Was a first-team all-state and all-metro player while being named a finalist for Mississippi Mr. Basketball and Gatorade Player of the Year...Was one of the Clarion Ledger's "Dirty Dozen" as one of the top 12 players in the state of Mississippi...Averaged 23 points, 12 rebounds, three assists, 1.5 steals and 1.3 blocks as a junior, earning second team all-state accolades...Shot 58 percent from the floor and 39 percent from three-point range as a junior.

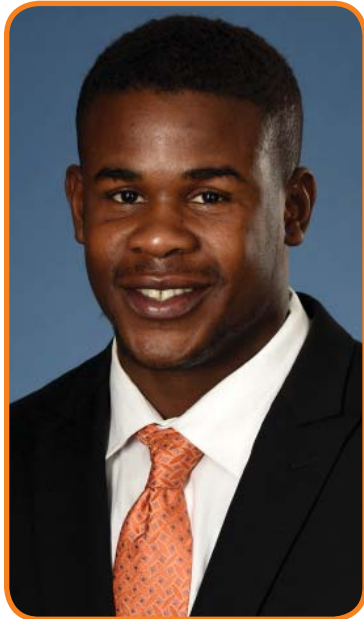

# HEAD COACH HEATH SCHROYER



Leading UT Martin to an unprecedented era of success is Heath Schroyer, who was introduced as the program's ninth head men's basketball coach in program history on March 20, 2014.

In his debut season at UT Martin, Schroyer was at the forefront of one of the most successful seasons in school history in 2014-15, as the Skyhawks finished one win shy (21) of the school record. UT Martin's 13-win increase from the previous season was tied for the fourth-best improvement in the nation as the Skyhawks led all of Division-I with 12 road victories, which was a school record.

UT Martin notched the first three postseason victories in the program's Division-I history (since 1992), advancing all the way to the Final Four of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. Out of 345 Division-I members, the Skyhawks were one of the final 14 teams alive in the hunt for a postseason championship.

After guiding UT Martin to just the second 20-win campaign in the program's Division-I era, Schroyer was named the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Men's Basketball Coach of the Year in 2014-15. He was also one of 16 finalists for the 2015 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, which honors the nation's top mid-major coach.

Schroyer, 43, has 19 years of collegiate coaching experience, including eight years as a head coach at the Division-I level. All seven of Schroyer's stops at a Division-I institution has culminated in either a conference championship or postseason play.

Before coming to UT Martin, Schroyer spent three seasons at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas working as the associate head coach under Dave Rice. The Runnin' Rebels sported three 20-plus win seasons, a 71-32 overall record (29-19 against Mountain West Conference opposition) and appearances in the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Tournaments in Schroyer's tenure. He was named a top-15 assistant coach in the nation by Bleacher Report in 2012-13 and followed that with a top-20 assistant coach in the nation honor by College Sports Madness for the 2013-14 campaign.

Schroyer coordinated UNLV's recruiting efforts since he joined the staff in 2011. The Runnin' Rebels' 2012 recruiting class was ranked No. 7 in the nation by ESPN and one year later, UNLV produced Anthony Bennett - the No. 1 overall selection by the Cleveland Cavaliers in the 2013 NBA Draft. Bennett joined Larry Johnson (Charlotte Hornets, 1991) as the only players in UNLV's prestigious history to be selected first in the NBA Draft.

UNLV knocked off seven nationally ranked teams in Schroyer's first two seasons, including a win over No. 1 North Carolina in 2011. That marked UNLV's first win over the nation's top team in 22 years and the first time a MWC team had defeated the No. 1 ranked team. The Runnin' Rebels spent 25 combined weeks in the national top-25 polls during Schroyer's first two seasons, topping out at No. 11 during the 2011-12 campaign.

The Runnin' Rebels boasted a pair of Associated Press All-Americans (Mike Moser in 2012, Bennett in 2013), 10 All-MWC selections, the two-time MWC Defensive Player of the Year (Khem Birch in 2013 and 2014) and 2012 MWC Newcomer of the Year (Moser) in Schroyer's time at UNLV.

Schroyer began his collegiate head coaching career at Portland State, where he took over the reins in 2002 as the nation's second youngest Division-I head coach at age 30.

Schroyer propelled the Portland State program to new heights from 2002-05. His teams improved in the win column each season (jumping up 14 wins from his first to last year), culminating with a Big Sky Conference regular-season title in 2004-05, which was the school's first-ever Division-I championship in any sport. That season, the Vikings went 19-9 overall with an 11-3 conference slate. The 19 victories were the most for the program since the 1958-59 campaign and occurred a year after he guided Portland State to a top-three turnaround in the nation during his second year.

At Portland State, Schroyer presided over six All-BSC honorees, including 2004-05 BSC Player of the Year Seamus Boxley. He concluded his career as the program's fourth all-time leading scorer (1,498 points) and was also named BSC Defensive Player of the Year in back-to-back seasons (2003-04,

2004-05).

Schroyer then joined Fresno State University as an associate head coach under Steve Cleveland for two seasons, serving as the Bulldogs' recruiting coordinator and overseeing the team's academic turnaround. Overall, he coached four All-Western Athletic Conference performers, including NBA Draft pick Dominic McGuire.

In Schroyer's last season on the bench at Fresno State (2006-07), the Bulldogs went 22-10 with a 10-6 WAC record, earning a trip to the National Invitation Tournament. That marked the most wins for the program since the legendary Jerry Tarkanian guided the Bulldogs to 22 wins in 1995-96.

Schroyer parlayed that success into a head coaching gig at the University of Wyoming from 2007-11. During his four-year head coaching stint at Wyoming, Schroyer coached seven All-MWC players, including Brandon Ewing (second all-time leading scorer in Cowboy history with 2,168 points) and Afam Moujeke (2008-09 MWC Freshman of the Year after becoming the league's all-time leading freshman scorer).

Schroyer's best season at Wyoming was in 2008-09, when he led the Cowboys to 19 victories and an appearance in the College Basketball Invitational postseason tournament. He also helped the program make huge strides academically, as he inherited the worst Academic Progress Rate (APR) of any sport in the entire MWC. Schroyer constructed a comprehensive plan that improved the Cowboys' men's basketball APR by 164 points to a program-high 935, which was the third-best turnaround in the nation. He was also a member of Wyoming's Academic Integrity Subcommittee in 2010-11.

Before his head coaching appointment at Portland State, Schroyer had previously been an assistant coach at Wyoming under head coach Steve McClain for the 2001-02 season, when the Cowboys went 22-9 (11-3 MWC) and upset No. 6 Gonzaga in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Arizona. Schroyer was in charge of a ferocious defense that led the MWC in field goal percentage defense, defensive rebounding and rebounding margin.

Schroyer's first Division-I assistant coaching job came at Brigham Young University, who was a member of the Western Athletic Conference before joining the MWC for Schroyer's last two seasons there.

Joining a Cougar program that had went 1-25 the season before, Schroyer and Cleveland - the BYU head coach who Schroyer would also work with at Fresno State almost a decade later - engineered a dramatic turnaround that led to a 46-20 record and pair of postseason berths in the final two years. The Cougars went 24-9 overall (10-4 MWC) and made an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2000-01. The MWC championship in 2000-01 was BYU's first conference tournament title since 1992, its first regular-season championship since 1993 and first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1995. The year before that, the Cougars went 22-11 and advanced to the NIT quarterfinals.

Schroyer presided over six all-conference honorees at BYU, including 2001 MWC Player of the Year and Associated Press All-American Mekeli Wesley.

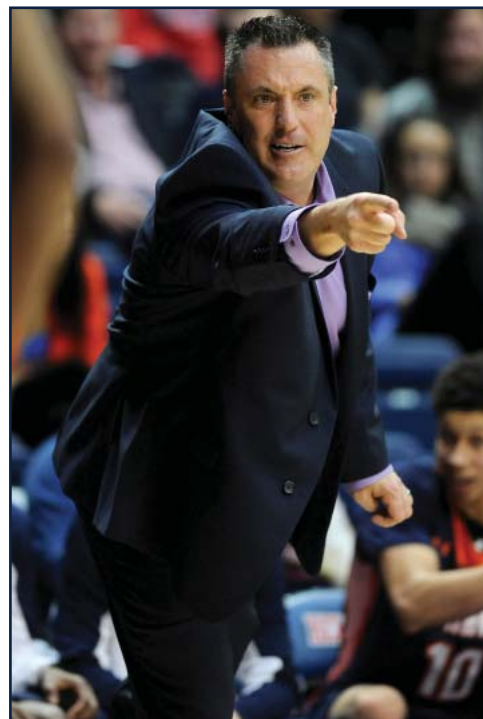
In a coaching career that began as an assistant coach under Cleveland at Fresno City College in 1996, Schroyer has recruited or coached over 60 players who have gone on to play professionally. He has also shared his extensive basketball knowledge as a television analyst during the 2011 NCAA Tournament coverage on The Mtn Channel and during the 2011 CBI on HDNet. He also served as a television analyst for the Utah Jazz during the 2001 NBA playoffs.

Schroyer started his collegiate playing career at Kings River Community College in Reedley, Calif., where he earned all-conference accolades and led the team to the California Junior College Final Four in 1992. He concluded his playing career at Armstrong Atlantic State in Savannah, Ga., where he led the team to the NCAA Division II Sweet 16 as a senior.

Schroyer prepped at the prestigious DeMatha High School program in Hyattsville, Md., where he played for the legendary coach Morgan Wootten, whose 1,274 wins as a head coach are the second-most in the history of basketball at any level.

Earning his bachelor's degree in liberal studies from Armstrong Atlantic State in 1995, Schroyer earned his Master's degree in institutional leadership from National University in Fresno, Calif. in 1996.

A native of Walkersville, Md., Schroyer married the former Kim Ortega of Logandale, Nev. in May of 2014. He has one daughter, Sierra (18) and a son, Hayden (13) from a previous marriage.





## ASSISTANT COACHES



Anthony Stewart is in his second season as the UT Martin associate head coach under Heath Schroyer.

Stewart was an integral part of one of the best seasons in UT Martin history in 2014-15, as the Skyhawks went 21-13 - finishing just one win shy of the program record. The 21 wins marked a 13-win improvement from the previous season, which ranked as the fourth-best turnaround in the Division-I ranks.

UT Martin set a program record and led the nation with 12 road victories in 2014-15, including three straight road wins in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The Skyhawks advanced all the way to the Final Four of the CIT, recording their first three postseason wins in the school's Division-I history (since 1992) in the process.

Stewart, 44, spent two seasons at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio before venturing to UT Martin. The Bobcats went 49-22 in Stewart's tenure, which included a pair of postseason appearances.

In 2013-14, Stewart helped Ohio to a 25-12 record and a quarterfinals appearance in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). That followed a 2012-13 season where the Bobcats tallied a 24-10 record, earned a share of their first Mid-American Conference regular season championship since 1993-94 and earned a spot in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

While at Ohio, Stewart helped sign Maurice Ndour (top 100 junior college player, second team All-MAC and National Mid Major Player of the Week on Feb. 3, 2014), Travis Wilkins (junior college All-American), Tariq Owens (top 100 player out of high school) and Nehemias Morrilo (member of the Dominican National Team).

Stewart also spent time at Southern Illinois (2011-12), where he worked under head coach Chris Lowery. During his time in Carbondale, he signed Jeff Early, who was a junior college All-American from Monroe College.

Prior to that, Stewart worked alongside Schroyer at Wyoming from 2007-11. He helped recruit seven All-Mountain West Conference players while helping lead the Cowboys to 19 wins and an appearance in the College Basketball Invitational in 2011. He also inked Afam Muojeke, who was named the MWC Freshman of the Year accolades in 2008-09, breaking the all-time freshman scoring record at Wyoming.



Stewart also coached two seasons at Long Beach State (2004-06) and three years at Columbus State Community College (2001-04). He was directly responsible for recruiting Desmar Jackson (2009-10 Freshman All-American) at Wyoming, Aaron Nixon (No. 1 junior college player in the country, 2006-07 Big West Conference Player of the Year) at Long Beach State.

Stewart helped develop Columbus State into one of the best Division-II junior college programs in the nation. In 2003-04, the Cougars tallied an impressive 29-2 overall record and at one point were ranked No. 1 in the nation before falling to Cuyahoga Community College, the eventual national champion. Overall, Stewart recruited three All-Americans and five all-conference first teamers while tallying a 86-36 record at Columbus State.

A native of Akron, Ohio, Stewart played collegiately at University of Mount Union in Alliance, Ohio. He was a two-time Most Valuable Player in basketball while he also lettered three years on the Mount Union baseball squad as a pitcher. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in business management in 2003.

Stewart completed his Master's degree in business administration from Chancellor University in Cleveland, Ohio in 2006.



## ASSISTANT COACHES



Jermaine Johnson is in his second season as an assistant coach at UT Martin under Heath Schroyer.

Last season, Johnson was part of the Skyhawks' remarkable turnaround as UT Martin tallied 21 wins (one shy of the school record) and claimed its first three postseason victories in the school's Division-I era (since 1992).

Johnson helped the Skyhawks to the Final Four of the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament, capping off the nation's fourth-best improvement from the previous season (13 wins). UT Martin led the country in road victories (12) on its way to just the second 20-plus win campaign in the program's Division-I era.

Johnson, 37, joined the Skyhawks from Georgia Southern University in Statesboro, Ga., where he helped the Eagles to the Southern Conference tournament semifinals in 2013-14.

A Memphis native, Johnson made a name for himself as head coach of the highly successful Melrose High School boys' basketball program from 2007-13. He developed Melrose into a top-25 program in the nation after he won five straight District 16 AAA championships. His team also won the 2010 TSSAA Class AAA state title on its way to a 37-win season. During his tenure, he coached 26 seniors and all 26 players received college scholarships.

Johnson also had coaching stops at Ridgeway High School (his alma mater), Cordova High School and Craigmont High School, where he began his coaching career. Overall, Johnson posted a 353-91 record as a high school head coach.



At Melrose, Johnson coached McDonald's All-American Adonis Thomas while also coaching an eventual National Junior College Player of the Year and two All-Americans. All in all, he has coached 12 professional players, including eight who played in the NBA.

Johnson began his coaching career as an assistant for four years (1999-2003) at the University of Memphis under head coach John Calipari. He helped build the Tigers into a nationally ranked program, posting 71 wins in three seasons. In Johnson's final season, Memphis won the Conference USA championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Johnson played collegiately at Texas-Arlington for two seasons (1997-99) after attending Chattahoochee Valley Community College for two years. While at Texas-Arlington, he set the all-time Mavericks' single-game assists record with 17 against Sam Houston State on Dec. 28, 1998.

Johnson earned his bachelor's degree from the United States Sports Academy in 2007 and also obtained his Master's degree in coaching and athletic administration from Concordia University in December of 2014. He has one son, Carson.



## ASSISTANT COACHES



John Aiken begins his second season on the UT Martin men's basketball coaching staff in 2015-16.

In Aiken's first season as a Skyhawk, the program led the nation with 12 road wins on its way to 21 victories - just one shy of the school record. UT Martin rode its success into the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament Final Four, racking up the program's first three postseason victories since becoming a Division-I member in 1992.

Aiken also was part of the Skyhawks' 13-win increase from the previous season, which ranked as the fourth-best turnaround in Division-I basketball in 2014-15.

Before joining the Skyhawks, Aiken tallied seven seasons of collegiate coaching experience, including two years as head coach at Belhaven University, a NAIA school located in Jackson, Miss.

Aiken posted 30 overall wins and a 22-16 Southern States Athletic Conference record as head coach at Belhaven. In 2013-14, he helped guide the Blazers to an 18-15 record (14-6 SSAC) and a spot in the NAIA Division I National Tournament. He spent the previous four seasons as the top assistant at Belhaven, which included two more trips to the NAIA national tournament (2010 and 2012). The Blazers went 24-10 during the 2009-10 season, earning a spot in the national tournament for the first time since 1972.

All in all, Aiken coached four honorable mention All-Americans, six all-division honorees and nine all-conference selections during his tenure at Belhaven.

Before his stint at Belhaven, Aiken was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of New England, an NCAA Division-III school located in Biddeford, Maine. He helped the Nor'easters reach the 2008 ECAC New England Regional Championship game after New England posted a 17-12 overall record.

Aiken also served as an assistant coach at Cheverus High School in Portland, Maine and Greater Portland Christian School in South Portland, Maine before entering the collegiate coaching ranks.

Aiken has gained valuable experience working prestigious summer camps at the University of Louisville, Xavier University, University of Connecticut, Wake Forest University, Florida State University and the University of Miami. He also worked as the director of basketball operations for Camp Caribou in Winslow, Maine.

A native of Portland, Maine, Aiken earned his bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Southern Maine in 2008. He also completed his Master's degree in sports administration at Belhaven in 2013. He and his wife Michelle spent a summer working with Athletes in Action in South Africa and Mozambique where they volunteered at orphanages, coached against several professional and club teams and visited with various schools and governmental organizations. He and Michelle have two children - a daughter Gracie and son Macrae.

DeAndre Walker is in his second year on the Skyhawk staff under head coach Heath Schroyer. He serves as the strength coach and is also in charge of player development at UT Martin.

Last season, Walker helped develop a UT Martin squad that finished just one win shy of the school record (21) and tallied the first three postseason victories in the program's Division-I history (since 1992). The Skyhawks advanced all the way to the Final Four of the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament thanks in large part to 12 road victories, which led the nation.

Before joining the Skyhawks, Walker served as head coach at Columbus State Community College in Columbus, Ohio. He was the fifth head coach in the history of the program in 2013-14.

Before his head coaching appointment, Walker was an assistant coach at Ohio Dominican University in Columbus, Ohio.

After a standout prep career at Firestone High School, Walker began his collegiate playing career at Columbus State, where he played for two seasons (2000-02). He helped the Cougars to a 20-9 record and a 9-5 mark in the Ohio Community College Athletic Conference record during his freshman season.

Walker then transferred to Fairmont State University in Fairmont, W. Va. He guided the Falcons to a 37-21 record in his two seasons at the Division-II school.

Walker played professionally from 2006-08. He began his career with the Columbus Cyclones of the International Basketball League, helping the team to a 20-3 record under head coach David Cecutti. He followed that with a stint with the Indiana Alleycats of the Continental Basketball Association, playing for head coach Carlos Knox. He also played with the Marysville Meteors of the International Basketball League (2007), Long Beach Summer Pro-Am League in Long Beach, Calif. (2007) and the Gary Steelheads of the International Basketball League (2008).



An Akron, Ohio native, Walker began his coaching career as a student assistant coach in 2004-05 at Fairmont State. He specialized in recruiting and player skill development. He also was tabbed as the president of Hidden Gems AAU Basketball program, with his best season coming in 2012 when the team posted a 33-19 overall record. He also served as an assistant coach with the King James AAU program.

Walker earned his Bachelor's degree in business management from Fairmont State in 2004 and is currently pursuing his Master's degree in project management. He has two daughters, Aniaya and Arianna.

Garner Small is in his second season on the UT Martin coaching staff, serving as a graduate assistant for head coach Heath Schroyer.

Small's first season as a Skyhawk ranks as one of the best in school history, as UT Martin notched 21 wins (one shy of the school record) on its way to the first three postseason victories since 1992 when the program reclassified to Division-I status. The Skyhawks led the country with 12 road wins - three of which came as UT Martin advanced to the Final Four of the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

Before joining UT Martin, Small was an assistant coach at Olivet College in Olivet, Mich., where he worked primarily with the post players in 2013-14.

A native of Schoolcraft, Mich., Small played his senior year of college at Olivet College, averaging team-highs of 15.7 points and 6.3 rebounds per game under head coach Chris Coles in 2012-13.

Small played his junior season at Goshen College in Goshen, Ind. He averaged 8.3 points and 4.6 rebounds per contest for the Leafs under head coach Gary Chupp.

Before that, Small played two seasons at Kalamazoo Valley Community College for head coach Dick Shilts, whose 650 victories make him one of the winningest coaches in NJCAA history. Small helped lead the Cougars to a 24-8 record and their first-ever appearance in the NJCAA Division-II national championship appearance in 2010-11. Small also earned MCCA third team and academic all-conference accolades at Kalamazoo Valley.

Small played for his father, Randy Small, at Schoolcraft High School where he was a four-sport athlete (basketball, baseball, football and track). Small helped lead the Eagles to the state championship game in 2009.

Small earned his degree from Olivet in 2013.

## SEASON PREVIEW

One year after tasting success to the tune of 21 victories and the program's first three Division-I postseason victories, the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball program is hungry for more in head coach Heath Schroyer's second year at the helm in 2015-16.

Schroyer returns eight key players and three starters while mixing in six newcomers into the fold this season. This year's edition of the Skyhawks will look to one-up the 2014-15 squad that finished one win shy of the program record, advanced to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament semifinals and boasted the most road wins in the nation (12).

"The deep CIT run was invaluable for us – I don't think you can put a price tag on it," said Schroyer, who was crowned the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year last season. "Our guys gained great experience and understanding what it

means to play late in the year. Probably the most important thing it has done is it raised the expectation level of this program to the point where we want it to be. Making deep runs in postseason tournaments is what we expect out of this program."

Last year, Schroyer took over an eight-win team that was picked last in the Ohio Valley Conference preseason polls. This season, it is evident that UT Martin is not going to sneak up on anybody – as the program was selected by Sporting News and Athlon Sports as the pick to win the OVC West division. The league's head coaches and sports information directors also recognized the program's rapid progress, tabbing the Skyhawks with the second-most overall first place votes in the official OVC preseason poll.

"It's a lot different being the hunter versus the hunted," Schroyer said. "Every year there is pressure and every year there are expectations and I think that the biggest thing for us is going to be to concentrate what we can control, which is how hard we work and how hard we prepare."

In order for UT Martin to be in the OVC championship hunt and subsequently make its second consecutive postseason appearance, Schroyer will need to replace the production of a dynamic backcourt. Gone from the lineup are seniors Deville Smith (team-highs of 13.8 points and 4.5 assists per game) and Marshun Newell (13.1 points per game, team-best 6.9 rebounds per game), who each earned All-OVC second team honors in 2013-14.

"Last year's team played with great poise," Schroyer said. "We are going to have to figure out how to close games with this team because last year we were able to rely on those two senior guards down the stretch."

Expected to step in and pick up some of the leadership void are seniors **Twymond Howard** (13.6 points, 6.6 rebounds per game last season) and **Alex Anderson** (12.5 points per game, third nationally with a .480 three-point field goal percentage in 2014-15). Each

player earned Preseason All-OVC honors while Howard was named the OVC's "Best Playmaker" and Anderson was tabbed as the OVC's "Best Shooter" by Lindy's Sports magazine.

"We count on Twymond to do a lot – from defending the best perimeter player to sometimes defending the best post player," Schroyer said. "He's really extended his range in the offseason and his ballhandling has improved. I think Twymond is going to have a banner year and a potential OVC Player of the Year type of season. Alex had a great postseason run last year and he had an outstanding summer. I've never had a young man in my 21 years of coaching that's worked any harder than Alex. He's a guy that will initiate a lot of offense but obviously with his ability to score and shoot the ball, we will play him off the ball as well."

One of the most intriguing players on the 2015-16 roster is veteran **Myles Taylor**. A four-year starter in the frontcourt, Taylor returns as a fifth-year senior after recovering from an ACL injury for the majority of last season. He ranks in the top-10 in seven UT Martin career statistical categories, including points (1,342, sixth).

"Myles has been through a lot in the last two years," Schroyer said. "He's put in the work and he's in really great shape right now. He wants to have a great senior year and I really hope for Myles that he can leave UT Martin with a bang and have the great year that he deserves to have."

Another senior that Schroyer expects to log heavy minutes is **Terrence Durham**, who served as a backup point guard and one of the team's best defensive options in 2014-15.

"I've really taken to Terrence on a personal level," Schroyer said. "He's worked extremely hard to be where he is right now in life. He's gotten better as a basketball player and I expect a lot of great things from Terrence."

Two more returners who gained valuable experience last season are junior forwards **Javier Martinez** and

**Chandler Rowe.** That duo combined to start in 20 of the team's final 21 games and stepped up big in the absence of Taylor.

"Javier is maybe the toughest guy on our team," Schroyer said. "He has the ability to rebound the ball, especially for his size. He has a better understanding and a grasp of what we do offensively now than he did a year ago – which I think will enable him to really have a good year. Chandler understands everything we are doing – he is a very cerebral basketball player and plays with a great motor. He's a guy that can affect the game by not having to fill up a statsheet and I absolutely love that about him."

Shooting guard **Richard Lee** returns after seeing time in 25 games as a true freshman in 2014-15 while 7-2 center **Nick Detlev** will also make his Skyhawk debut this season after redshirting last year.

"Most of the time, players make their most strides between their freshman and sophomore years and I think

the same can be said for Richard," Schroyer said. "He really understands our system, he knows how to defend and he knows how to run what we do offensively. I don't think anyone has improved more in this program in one year than Nick. He obviously is a huge presence. His offensive game has gotten better and defensively, he's a great rim protector at this point."

Five juniors and one redshirt freshman will look to contribute immediately for UT Martin in 2015-16. **Jacolby Mobley** and **Jalen Variste** will likely account for steady minutes out of the backcourt. Mobley is a combo guard who compiled 15 games of at least 20 points in two seasons at East Mississippi Community College while Variste is a true point guard who averaged 4.1 assists and a 1.9 assist-to-turnover ratio last season at West Texas College.

"Jacolby has the ability to be a primary ballhandler but he also has the ability to really score the basketball," Schroyer said. "He is a great shooter and the other thing I like about him is that he is a fearless competitor. He's a guy that will be asked to defend the best perimeter player on many nights. Jalen is really growing into having a huge role on our team. He has the ability to really break down defenders and can get to the lane to create other opportunities for open people. He has picked up our system as fast as any new guy that we've had since we've been here."

A pair of juniors will vie for playing time on the wing in **Kedar Edwards** and **James Harrison**. Edwards averaged 16.8 points and 7.7 rebounds per game at State Fair Community College in 2013-14 while Harrison is an accurate shooter who earned all-conference honors at McLennan Community College last season.

"Kedar hasn't played a lot of college basketball but he has a lot of talent," Schroyer said. "We're working on harnessing that talent into our system of play. He's going to be as big and athletic of a wing as there will be in our league. James is a big guard that brings

us the ability to shoot the ball. He's an unbelievable kid off the floor and he really fits our locker room well. Once he figures it out and trusts his instincts, he has a chance to be a really special player."

Junior **Malik London** and redshirt freshman **Fatodd Lewis** are expected to contribute immediately in the frontcourt. London shot .560 and swatted away 83 blocked shots in two seasons at Missouri State-West Plains while Lewis averaged 23.8 points and 14 rebounds per game as a senior at Raleigh-Egypt High School in Memphis.

"Malik is by far our longest, most athletic post player," Schroyer said. "He has the ability to protect the rim and change or alter shots. He's a perimeter defensive player for a post guy so his ability to switch ball screens late in the shot clock and switch screens late in the game is something that we are looking forward to being able to utilize him for. I think Fatodd has a chance to be Freshman of the Year in the conference. He has God-given ability and talent on the offensive end. Once he understands the toughness and the grit that you have to play with at this level, he's going to be a monster."

Schroyer has boasted on his team's willingness to learn during the preseason as he tries his hand at mixing and matching the pieces in order to make another deep run into March.

"Our strengths right now are that our post play has gotten better and I think we will be better defensively this year just because of our length and we have more athleticism," Schroyer said. "With that said, this league still runs through Murray State and Belmont. If we want to become one of those teams year-in and year-out, we're going to have to find a way to get into that conversation. That's hopefully the next step for our program. But we also need to understand that we have to be ready because we are going to get everyone's best shot every night."



# PRESEASON PUBLICATIONS

After UT Martin engineered the nation's fourth-best turnaround under first-year head coach Heath Schroyer in 2014-15, the Skyhawks enter this highly-anticipated season with championship aspirations. UT Martin has been tabbed as the preseason favorites in the OVC West by Sporting News and Athlon Sports college basketball preseason publications, one year after the program finished with 21 wins (one shy of the school record), including the first three postseason victories as a Division-I member.

In the official OVC Preseason Poll, voted on by the league's head coaches and sports information directors, the Skyhawks were tabbed to finish second in the OVC West. UT Martin received nine out of 24 first-place votes in the West division, garnering 115 overall points. Murray State was tabbed as the league's preseason favorite in the West, tallying 15 first-place votes and 125 points. Voters were also asked to crown an overall champion, as the Skyhawks received the second-most first-place votes with two. Belmont – the preseason East division leader – received 21 overall first-place votes while Murray State accounted for the remaining vote.

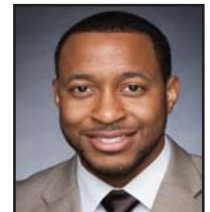

REVIEW**



## SEASON RECAP

One of the most successful seasons in University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball history played out under first-year head coach Heath Schroyer in 2014-15. Schroyer, who was hired after the Skyhawks posted an 8-23 overall record and 3-13 mark in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2013-14, oversaw a remarkable resurgence of the UT Martin program. The Skyhawks finished one win shy of the school record, going 21-13 with a 10-6 league mark while notching the first three postseason victories in the program's Division-I history (since 1992). The 13-win increase was tied for the fourth-best improvement in Division-I behind only Temple (17), UC Davis (16) and Northern Iowa (15) as UT Martin advanced all the way to the Final Four of the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament before falling to eventual champion Evansville. Out of 345 Division-I members, the Skyhawks were one of the final 14 teams alive in the hunt for a postseason championship.

A staple of UT Martin's success in 2014-15 was attributed to its gritty

performances on the road, as the Skyhawks ranked first nationally with 12 road victories (also a school record). That came after UT Martin had posted just 11 combined road wins over the past five seasons.

The tone for the Skyhawks' successful campaign was set in just the second game of the season. Following a 79-63 loss at Big East member Marquette to open the season, UT Martin engineered an incredible come-from-behind win at Arkansas State on Nov. 17. The Skyhawks were down by 19 points early in the second half before staging a comeback for the ages, as Twymond Howard scored 21 of his team-best 23 points in the second half to lift UT Martin to a 75-73 victory. It was the program's first win in Jonesboro since 1968.

The Skyhawks then broke a school record for largest margin of victory in their home opener on Nov. 20, defeating Champion Baptist by a 115-29 margin. UT Martin broke a record that had stood since 1991 and also set a new mark for fewest points allowed in the Division-I era.

UT Martin then notched another road win with a convincing 74-56 win at Bethune-Cookman before falling by a 75-64 margin at Big Ten Conference power Nebraska. The Skyhawks were within four points of the Cornhuskers with nine minutes left to play before coming up short against a squad that was nationally ranked for the first two weeks of the season.

The road streak continued with three more nonconference wins away from home, as UT Martin knocked off Northern Kentucky (71-56), Longwood (77-67) and Illinois-Chicago (81-78 in overtime). The victory at Longwood came with a price, as the Skyhawks lost four-year starting power forward Myles Taylor for the season after the Preseason All-OVC honoree reagravated a knee injury he suffered at the end of his sophomore campaign.

The gutsy win at Illinois-Chicago also served as a coming-out party of sorts for senior guard Deville Smith, who transferred in from UNLV where he played for Schroyer when he was the Runnin' Rebels associate head coach. Smith – who received an NCAA waiver to play immediately – tallied a career-high 26 points, seven assists, six rebounds, five blocks and three steals

against the Flames. According to STATS, LLC, Smith's final stat line marked the first time a player had at least 25 points, five assists, five rebounds, five blocks and three steals in a single game featuring two NCAA Division-I teams since Minnesota's Joel Przybilla accomplished the feat against Iowa on Jan. 12, 2000.

UT Martin then held its own before falling 64-54 at eventual National Invitation Tournament participant Illinois State on Dec. 17, its eighth road game in the first nine outings of the season. The Skyhawks then returned home to defeat Presbyterian by a 77-60 margin on Dec. 20, marking the best 10-game start (7-3) for UT Martin since 2001-02.

In their next game, the Skyhawks were only down by eight points at the halftime break to future NCAA Tournament team Butler before falling 64-37. A disappointing 63-60 home loss to Maryland-Eastern Shore then followed before UT Martin rounded out nonconference play with an 84-61 home win over Crowley's Ridge.

The Skyhawks opened OVC action at home against defending OVC Tournament champion Eastern Kentucky. UT Martin led from the 11:44 mark of the first half until 4:32 to go in the second half before the Colonels came back for a 66-58 win. The Skyhawks then bounced back with an impressive 75-72 overtime triumph over Morehead State just two days later. That victory snapped a nine-game losing skid since 2009 to the Eagles and also passed UT Martin's win total from the previous season.

Another lengthy losing streak to a conference foe was snapped in the Skyhawks' next outing, as UT Martin dialed up a 63-60 overtime win at Tennessee Tech. That marked the program's first win over the Golden Eagles since March 3, 2009 – ending an eight-game skid.

UT Martin then grinded out a 55-52 home win over Jacksonville State for the fourth 3-1 start to the OVC season in program history and first since the 2002-03 campaign. The Skyhawks' rise did not go unnoticed on the national level, as Mike Lopresti of NCAA.com identified UT Martin as one of 10 midseason candidates for the All-Improved list. The Skyhawks were referenced along the likes of Notre Dame, Maryland, TCU, DePaul, UC Davis, Hofstra, Cornell,

Lamar and Temple.

The Skyhawks then held a nine-point halftime advantage at eventual OVC Tournament champion Belmont before narrowly falling 72-67. A pair of OVC wins followed as UT Martin dispatched Southeast Missouri (70-53) and Eastern Illinois (81-51) in a span of five days. The Skyhawks led wire-to-wire against Eastern Illinois and registered their first 30-plus point conference victory since a 92-62 win over Southeast Missouri on Feb. 20, 1997.

The Skyhawks then pushed OVC regular season champion Murray State to the brink before falling on the road, 65-62. That would be the first of two tight matchups with the Racers, who finished the season with a perfect 16-0 OVC mark before advancing to the NIT quarterfinals.

A monster night by redshirt senior guard Marshun Newell (career-highs of 23 points, 17 rebounds) helped UT Martin get back on the right track with a 76-64 win at Austin Peay to open the month of February, as the Skyhawks won in Clarksville for the first time in exactly six years. UT Martin then recorded a 64-

59 win over SIU Edwardsville to improve to 7-3 in the OVC standings.

A rare defensive letdown at Southeast Missouri resulted in a 98-76 loss but the Skyhawks won their next two contests – a 67-61 win over Austin Peay followed by a 75-73 overtime road victory at Eastern Illinois. The Austin Peay win marked the first season sweep over Austin Peay since 1995-96 and was the 100th in Schroyer's career while the Eastern Illinois game was decided on a tip-in layup by Howard with 3.7 seconds remaining.

UT Martin fell 76-68 at SIU Edwardsville before closing out the OVC regular season with a 69-52 win at Tennessee State and a narrow 73-67 home loss to Murray State. The Skyhawks led over the Racers in the regular season finale before the loss settled UT Martin in for the No. 4 seed in the OVC Tournament.

The Skyhawks failed to find a rhythm offensively in the OVC quarterfinals against Morehead State, falling by a 76-65 margin. However, that would not mark the end of UT Martin's season, as the Skyhawks accepted an invitation into the CIT, reaching the postseason for just the second time in the program's Division-I history (also playing in the 2009 NIT).

True to form, UT Martin's road to the CIT semifinals was on the road – as the Skyhawks chalked up three straight road victories to get to that point.

The CIT-opening win at Northwestern State was an offensive explosion, as UT Martin posted a 104-79 victory. The Skyhawks never trailed in the contest and drained a school-record 16 three-pointers. Individually, Alex Anderson canned seven trifectas on his way to a career-best 30 points while Smith notched a triple-double of 21 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists. He became just the second player in program history to accumulate a triple-double, tallying only the 11th triple-double in OVC history.

Less than 48 hours later and after a 780-mile bus ride, the Skyhawks grinded out a 60-49 win at USC Upstate in the second round of the CIT. UT Martin did not take a lead until 5:37 left to play in the game and ended the contest on a 14-3 run.

Four days later, the Skyhawks found themselves squaring off against a familiar foe in OVC rival Eastern Kentucky. In a game that swayed back-

and-forth throughout, Newell emerged as the hero, as he buried a three-pointer in front of the Skyhawk bench with 3.3 seconds left for the game-winning bucket in UT Martin's 70-69 win. The victory was the Skyhawks' first in Richmond since 2003.

In a nationally-televised CIT Final Four showdown at Evansville, the Skyhawks matched the Purple Aces blow-for-blow in the first half before UT Martin ultimately ran out of gas, falling 79-67.

Schroyer concluded the season by taking home the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Men's Basketball Coach of the Year honors. He was also one of 16 finalists for the 2015 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, which honors the nation's top mid-major coach. Schroyer guided UT Martin to just the sixth 20-win campaign in program history and second at the Division-I level (first time since 2008-09). The Skyhawks also received votes throughout the season in the College Insider Mid-Major Poll for the first time since 2008-09.

The trio of Smith, Newell and Howard each earned All-OVC accolades. Smith and Newell were both named to the All-OVC second team as well as the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 19 second team. Howard joined Smith on the five-man OVC All-Newcomer squad while Smith was also one of 26 finalists for the Riley Wallace Award, presented annually to the nation's top transfer.

All in all, four Skyhawks (Smith, Howard, Anderson, Arkeem Joseph) garnered adidas OVC Newcomer of the Week honors during the season. UT Martin became only the second team in the league's history to tally four different recipients on the weekly top newcomer list, joining former member Middle Tennessee in 1999-2000.

UT Martin led the OVC and was 15th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (.394), defensive rebounding (30.5 per game) and defensive rebound percentage (.747). Individually, Anderson led the OVC and ranked third nationally in three-point field goals made (2.8 per game) while Smith (35.9 minutes per game), Newell (35.3), Anderson (34.9) and Howard (34.8) ranked first through fourth in the OVC in playing time.

The University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball team gave a valiant effort in its season opener at Marquette before falling by a 79-63 margin at the BMO Harris Bradley Center.

A trio of newcomers led the Skyhawks in scoring in head coach Heath Schroyer's UT Martin debut, led by Deville Smith's 12 points. Twymond Howard and Alex Anderson each added 11 points for UT Martin while Marshun Newell provided nine points, five rebounds and a team-high three assists.

Myles Taylor snared a game-high 11 rebounds in only 15 minutes of play before fouling out, helping the Skyhawks outrebound their Big East Conference opponent by a 34-25 margin.

Marquette was led by Jajuan Johnson, who scored a game-high 20 points. Juan Anderson (16 points, seven rebounds), Matt Carlino (11 points, seven assists) and Deonte Burton (10 points) also cracked double-figures in the scoring column for the Golden Eagles.

### UTM GRINDS OUT 75-73 COMEBACK VICTORY AT ARKANSAS STATE

Down by 19 points early in the second half, the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball team staged a comeback for the ages at Arkansas State, downing the Red Wolves by a 75-73 victory to give first-year head coach Heath Schroyer his first win as a Skyhawk.

Down by 43-24 with 18:54 left, Howard and Newell put the Skyhawks on their back to post UT Martin's first victory in Jonesboro since 1968. The duo combined to score 33 of UT Martin's 52 points in the final 20 minutes to snap a seven-game skid against the perennial Sun Belt Conference power.

Howard poured in 21 of his team-best 23 points in the second half, shooting 9-for-15 from the floor to go along with five rebounds, three assists and a steal in 37 minutes. Newell tallied 12 of his 15 points in the final half, connecting on a career-high four 3-pointers (in five attempts).

Myles Taylor narrowly missed a double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds while the backcourt of Deville Smith (11 points, five assists, five steals and three rebounds) and Alex Anderson (nine points, three steals) helped UT Martin shoot 56.7 percent (17-for-30) in the second half.

Arkansas State was led by Anthony Livingston's 26 points and nine rebounds. Cameron Golden (17) and Sean Gardner (15) also reached double-figures in the scoring column for the Red Wolves.

### SKYHAWKS COAST TO 115-29 WIN OVER CHAMPION BAPTIST IN HOME OPENER

A pair of school records were broken as the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball team soared to a 115-29 victory over Champion Baptist in the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center.

UT Martin set a school record for biggest margin of victory (previously 76 points against St. Louis Christian on Jan. 5, 1991) and also lowest points allowed in the Division-I era (1992-present).

All 14 Skyhawks who saw playing time scored, as no UT Martin player logged more than 18 minutes of time on the court. Myles Taylor scored a game-high 18 points with three blocks for the Skyhawks while Alex Anderson and Richard Lee (5-for-5 shooting, 3-for-3 from three-point range in collegiate debut) added 13 points apiece.

Twymond Howard scored 12 points with a career-best nine rebounds while Marshun Newell tallied 10 points for the Skyhawks. Deville Smith handed out a career-high nine assists (against zero turnovers) and Christian Taylor set a new career-high with nine rebounds.

As a team, UT Martin shot 60.6 percent (43-for-71), including 14 three-pointers in 29 attempts, falling one trifecta short of the school record.

Champion Baptist, a member of the Association of Christian College Athletics located in Hot Springs, Ark., was led by 13 points and five rebounds out of Stephen Hurst. The Tigers shot 23.1 percent (12-for-52) from the floor for the contest.

The Skyhawks were within four points with nine minutes left to play in front of the crowd of 15,987 – the second-largest attended game in school history. UT Martin stayed within single-digits for a majority of the time the rest of the way until the Cornhuskers made five of six free throws in the final minute.

Twymond Howard led four Skyhawks in double-figures in the scoring column, pouring in 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting. Deville Smith put on a shooting exhibition midway through the second half, finishing with 15 points on a career-best five 3-pointers, game-high six rebounds, team-best six assists and game-high three steals.

Myles Taylor sank all seven of his free throw attempts on his way to 11 points tonight while Alex Anderson added 10 points for UT Martin, who knocked down 11 three-pointers but committed 18 turnovers and lost the rebounding battle (34-25) for the first time all season.

Nebraska, who was ranked at No. 21 nationally for the first two weeks of the season, was led by 19 points on six 3-pointers by Walter Pitchford, who entered tonight's contest shooting 6.3 percent from three-point range. Newell tallied game-highs of 15 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and two steals in 39 minutes of action for the Skyhawks. It marked the third time this season that the Memphis, Tenn. native had scored 15 points while the 11 rebounds equaled a career-high set against Belmont on Jan. 11, 2014. The University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball team never trailed and saw two players tally double-doubles in a convincing 81-51 victory over Ohio Valley Conference rival Eastern Illinois at the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center.

The win marks the first 30-plus point conference victory for UT Martin since the Skyhawks defeated Southeast Missouri by a 92-62 margin on Feb. 20, 1997.

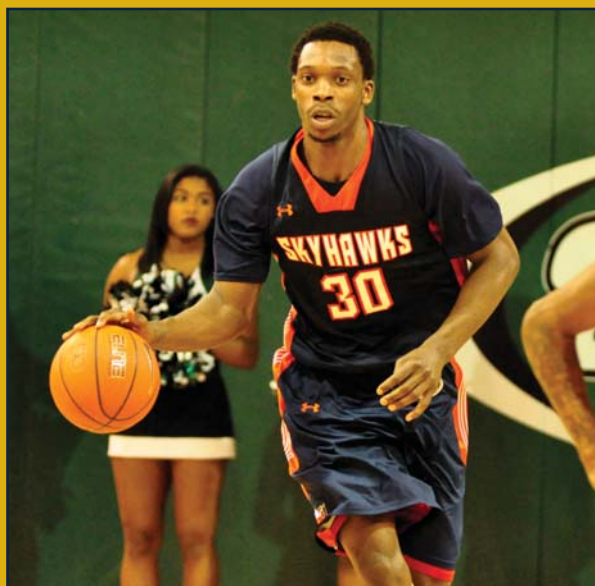
## UTM ADVANCES TO CIT ELITE EIGHT WITH GRITTY 60-49 WIN AT USC UPSTATE

The University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball team shook off a slow start and took command of the final five minutes of the contest at USC Upstate, winning by a 60-49 margin in the second round of the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

The Skyhawks took their first lead of the game with 5:37 left to play, ending the game on a 14-3 run. In the process, UT Martin won its second postseason game in less than 48 hours and its third postseason game in the history of the program.

Twymond Howard led the Skyhawks with 15 points while adding seven rebounds and three steals. Deville Smith added 14 points, seven rebounds and four steals while Alex Anderson scored seven of his 13 points in the game-ending 14-3 spurt. Marshun Newell narrowly missed a double-double (nine points, eight rebounds) for UT Martin, who shot 28.3 percent but made four of its nine three-pointers in the final 7:48.


USC Upstate was led by Atlantic Sun Conference Player of the Year Ty Greene, who scored 17 points but struggled from the field (4-for-21 overall, 1-for-15 from three-point range). Fred Miller and Jacob Schulte also added 10 points apiece for the Spartans, who were held to 19.2 percent shooting (5-for-26) in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-for-54) for the contest.

Marshun Newell swished a go-ahead three-pointer from the right corner with 3.3 seconds left for the game-winner in the University of Tennessee at Martin's 70-69 victory at Eastern Kentucky in the 2015 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament quarterfinals.

Newell's last-second trey was his fourth of the second half alone, as he made all four of his three-point attempts in the final 7:17 of the contest after the Colonels built a seven-point lead. The senior out of Memphis concluded the game with 16 points to go along with a game-high eight rebounds to lead the Skyhawks to their nation-leading 12th road win and first win in Richmond since 2003.



Twymond Howard equaled a career-high with 23 points for UT Martin this evening, converting nine of his 13 shot attempts while adding seven rebounds. Alex Anderson drained four 3-pointers on his way to 14 points while Javier Martinez (11 points on 5-for-5 shooting, seven rebounds) played big in 24 minutes off the bench for the Skyhawks, who led for 25:26 of the contest and outrebounded Eastern Kentucky by a 43-19 margin.

Eastern Kentucky was led by Corey Walden's 21 points, seven rebounds and six assists. Timmy Knipp scored all 15 of his points in the second half while Eric Stutz added 10 points for the Colonels, who made nine of their 15 three-pointers in the final 20 minutes.

**UTM'S REMARKABLE SEASON COMES TO AN END IN CIT SEMIFINALS AT EVANSVILLE**

The incredible journey of the 2014-15 University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball team concluded in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament semifinals, as the Skyhawks fell 79-67 at Evansville at the Ford Center this evening.

UT Martin wraps up the season with a 21-13 overall record under first-year head coach Heath Schroyer. The Skyhawks end the season with 12 road wins (tied for the most in Division-I basketball) and the fourth-largest turnaround in the nation (13-win improvement).

Tonight's game also marked the end of the collegiate careers of UT Martin seniors Deville Smith, Marshun Newell and Khristian Taylor. The trio was instrumental in the Skyhawks posting the second-highest win single-season win total and first three Division-I postseason victories in program history.

Smith racked up 18 points behind a career-high six 3-pointers to lead UT Martin in scoring for the 13th time this season. Twymond Howard recorded his fifth double-double of the year with 17 points and 10 rebounds while Alex Anderson tallied 15 points on five trifectas for the Skyhawks, who made 13 three-pointers on 27 attempts (48.1 percent) tonight.

Evansville was led by DJ Balentine's game-high 28 points. Adam Wing (16 points) and Blake Simmons (13 points) also reached double-figures for the Purple Aces, who shot 57.1 percent (32-for-56) for the contest.

# ALL-TIME HEAD COACHES



**JC HENSON**  
1951-52

Ushering in the men's basketball era at UT Martin was James C. Henson.

Henson, a former standout football player and track performer at Mississippi State, served in numerous capacities during his early years at UT Martin. He coached football and basketball, headed the Department of Physical Education, served as director of athletics and taught a chemistry class. Colleagues and students both remember his philosophy of life, good humor and amicable manner.

In 1952, the UT Martin athletics department opened a new branch of the department that catered to only women's athletics, thanks in large part to Henson's funding.

Henson also was at the helm of some of the most successful programs in school history - the men's tennis program. Henson won four Volunteer State Athletic Conference titles in the 1970's. After coaching the team for three decades, Henson retired in 1980.

Henson's presence is still very much around the UT Martin campus, as the Henson House overlooks the team's varsity tennis courts, and serves as an office for head coach Dennis Taylor as well as a dressing room, media room equipped with surround sound, a stringing room with three stringing machines, a full kitchen and a team meeting room.

All in all, Henson served as athletics director from 1947-71, and head coach of the football (1947-56), men's basketball (1947-52) and men's tennis (1952-80) squads.

In 1984, Henson was the ninth member inducted into the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame.

**FLOYD BURDETTE**  
1952-71

The longest tenured coach in UT Martin history, Floyd Burdette was at the helm when UT Martin competed in the Volunteer State Athletic Conference.

Burdette, who played basketball at UT Martin in the mid-1930's, returned home to head the men's basketball program in 1952. A native of Martin, Burdette had served for seven years as the head basketball coach at the University of Alabama prior to his appointment at Martin.

Burdette won the most games of any coach in UT Martin history (197), and posted a .500 record or better in nine of his 11 seasons in the VSAC. As the team prepared to exit the VSAC and enter the Mid-South Conference in 1970, Burdette's team stormed to three successive victories and the conference championship.

Burdette also was part of a major change in UT Martin athletics history in 1969, as he recruited Leonard Hamilton, who was the first African-American to suit up for a UT Martin athletics program.

Burdette was a charter member into the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame in 1983.

**BOB PAYNTER**  
1971-80

As the UT Martin program entered the Gulf South Conference, Bob Paynter was appointed to run the men's basketball program, as well as direct the athletics department in 1971.

Prior to becoming head coach and director of athletics, Paynter had been serving as an administrative assistant to UT Martin Chancellor Archie R. Dykes. A native of Richmond, Ky., he received his bachelors degree from St. Mary's College in Minnesota, his master's degree from Eastern Kentucky University, and a doctorate in education from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. His coaching experience included a 14-year stint as head coach at the University High School of East Tennessee State University.

Paynter compiled three seasons with a .500 or better record, but could never reach that mark in GSC competition. Paynter did, however, coach eight different players to All-GSC honors. Paynter was responsible for Fred Sanders, Jim Martin and Larry Carter earning All-GSC first team accolades in his tenure, as well as guiding Jack Bendure, Marcus McLeMore, Vic Quinn, Joe Biddie and Don Hubbard to All-GSC second team mentions in his tenure.

In fact, Paynter was the man responsible for recruiting Hubbard, who ended his four-year UT Martin career as the school's all-time leading scorer, reaching 1,124 points.

**ART TOLIS**  
1980-82

Leading the UT Martin program to its first-ever 20-win season and NCAA Division II Tournament appearance was head coach Art Tolis.

Tolis, who had served as an assistant coach at Louisiana State University for six years, was highly respected as a coach and a recruiter prior to his appointment at UT Martin by Chancellor Charles E. Smith and athletics director Ray Mears.

In Tolis' first season at the helm, he led UT Martin to five Gulf South Conference wins, which was the total of combined GSC wins the team had accumulated in the previous two seasons. Don Hubbard earned All-GSC second team honors in 1980-81.

The team took off in Tolis' second season, setting a program record for single-season overall wins (20) and GSC victories (nine). The team earned one of the program's biggest wins at the time, a 65-41 drubbing of Mississippi State in Starkville on Dec. 12, 1981. In the season's 11 losses, only one loss was more than eight points, including an amazing seven losses by five points or less. Three of the team's losses came to GSC rival Livingston by a combined eight points, including the GSC Tournament championship game. Even with the loss, the team advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament, defeating Central Missouri before falling to future OVC member Southeast Missouri by a 56-53 score.

Tolis' second season also produced another school record, as the team landed two first-team All-GSC selections in Larry Brooks and Darrell Smith.

**TOM HANCOCK**  
1982-90

Leading the most successful stretch in UT Martin basketball history was Glen Ellyn, Ill. native Tom Hancock.

Hancock had spent one season as an assistant coach at UT Martin before being promoted to head coach after the resignation of Art Tolis concluding the 1981-82 season.

Hancock's first season was a season of many firsts in UT Martin program history, as the team broke or tied 19 school records en route to a program-best 21 win season, its first Gulf South Conference championship, and second consecutive NCAA Division II South Central Regional Tournament.

Picked seventh out of eight teams in the preseason poll in 1982-83, Hancock earned GSC Coach of the Year Honors and 6-7 junior center Jerry Davis was named GSC Player of the Year - both of which were the first time UT Martin was represented in those GSC categories. The Pacers went 17-1 at home and ranked No. 4 in the NCAA in defense, as Davis, Gus Rudolph and Mitch Stentiford were all named to the GSC's first team.

Hancock would go on to post two more 20-win seasons and win one more GSC championship in the 1987-88 season. Overall, Hancock's teams shattered more than 40 records in his nine-year tenure, and his average of 19 wins per season are the highest of any UT Martin coach.

# ALL-TIME HEAD COACHES



**CAL LUTHER**  
1990-99

Perhaps the most influential coach in UT Martin history was Cal Luther. Tabbed by UT Martin athletics director Don McLeary to guide the UT Martin program through the NCAA Division-I re-classification process, Luther had more than 30 years of coaching experience.

After rebuilding DePauw (Ind.) to an Indiana Collegiate Conference championship, Luther moved on to Ohio Valley Conference member Murray State, where he was credited for laying the foundation for the program's success. At Murray State, Luther led the Racers to three OVC titles, was named OVC Coach of the Year three times, and earned a spot in the school's athletics Hall of Fame after leading the team to two NCAA Tournaments. From Murray State, Luther went to Longwood in Virginia, where he led a former all-girls school to a transition from Division-III to Division-II, earning five winning seasons and a 20-7 record in 1988-89.

At UT Martin, Luther guided the team into the Ohio Valley Conference and made the change from the Pacers nickname to Skyhawks. While the team scheduled the toughest opponents for most of Luther's tenure to keep up with Division-I budget restraints, Luther still found success - earning OVC Coach of the Year in 1996 after his program earned its first winning season in the OVC.

**BRET CAMPBELL**  
1999-2009

The UT Martin Skyhawks earned its first-ever postseason berth as a Division-I member under the guidance of Bret Campbell. An assistant coach at OVC member Austin Peay before his arrival in Martin, Campbell gave the Skyhawks its first-ever winning season since joining the Division-I ranks in just his third season in charge.

Six of the 14 UT Martin all-time 1,000 point scorers played under Campbell, including standout guard Lester Hudson. In Campbell's last two seasons as coach, the Skyhawks were led by Hudson, who quickly became one of the most dynamic players in the NCAA after tallying the NCAA's first-ever quadruple double (25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals) against Central Baptist in his third career game.

Under Campbell, the Skyhawks hosted its first OVC Tournament game and won its first two OVC Tournament games. The best season by far in Campbell's tenure was 2008-09, when the Skyhawks secured its first-ever outright regular-season OVC championship. The Skyhawks posted its first 20-win season since 1987-88, and made an appearance in the National Invitation Tournament, where it hung tough with Auburn before falling 87-82. For his efforts, Campbell received OVC Coach of the Year honors.

**JASON JAMES**  
2009-14

After spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at UT Martin, including the role of associate head coach during the 2008-09 OVC championship season, Jason James was named the program's eighth head coach. A native of St. Louis, Mo., he was the nation's second-youngest NCAA Division-I men's basketball head coach at the time of his hiring.

A bit of history occurred in December of James' debut season, as the Skyhawks earned back-to-back OVC Player of the Week accolades for just the second time ever.

In Year Two of the James Era, the team tripled its win output from the previous season. Senior Benzor Simmons became the program's 15th member of the 1,000 point club, while a trio of freshmen combined to win eight adidas OVC Freshman of the Week awards, the most awards recorded by one school since the league began handing out the award in 1978-79.

In 2011-12, James coached OVC Freshman of the Year Myles Taylor, who was also a member of the OVC's All-Newcomer team.

The following season, James led UT Martin back to the OVC Tournament, downing league heavyweights Eastern Kentucky (25-10 record) and winning at OVC West champion Murray State (21-10) for the first time in program history.

In 2013-14, James oversaw three players who joined UT Martin's exclusive 1,000 career point club in Mike Liabo, Myles Taylor and Terence Smith.

Leading UT Martin to an

unprecedented era of success is Heath Schroyer, who was introduced as the program's ninth head men's basketball coach in program history on March 20, 2014.

In his debut season at UT Martin, Schroyer was at the forefront of one of the most successful seasons in school history in 2014-15, as the Skyhawks finished one win shy (21) of the school record. UT Martin's 13-win increase from the previous season was tied for the fourth-best improvement in the nation as the Skyhawks led all of Division-I with 12 road victories, which was a school record.

UT Martin notched the first three postseason victories in the program's Division-I history (since 1992), advancing all the way to the Final Four of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. Out of 345 Division-I members, the Skyhawks were one of the final 14 teams alive in the hunt for a postseason championship.

After guiding UT Martin to just the second 20-win campaign in the program's Division-I era, Schroyer was named the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Men's Basketball Coach of the Year in 2014-15. He was also one of 16 finalists for the 2015 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, which honors the nation's top mid-major coach.

At all seven of Schroyer's stops at a Division-I institution, the Walkersville, Md. native has helped that team to either a conference championship or postseason play.

Now in its 68th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

Former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime in the national semifinals. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan State into overtime before falling 75-71; that game still marks the closest a No. 16 seed has come to knocking off a No. 1 in men's tournament action. More recently, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's. The Racers' 15 OVC Tournament Championships are the most among all OVC schools.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at University of Dayton Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346 and included many MSU fans who made the three-hour drive from Morehead for the game.

In 2009-10, Murray State made OVC history by winning a record 31 games (31-5) on its way to the league's regular season and tournament championships. In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the No. 13 seed Racers topped Vanderbilt in thrilling fashion when senior Danero Thomas hit a jumper as time expired to lift MSU to a 66-65 victory. It marked the first OVC team to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament since 1989, and snapped a skid of 71-straight losses to Southeastern Conference foes (dating back to 2000-01). In the second round, the Racers pushed eventual national runner-up Butler to the brink before losing 54-52.

it three NCAA Tournament wins in as many years for the league and got a bit of revenge for the 2009 tournament loss to Louisville in the process. After finishing second in the regular season and winning the OVC Tournament Championship, the No. 13 seeded Eagles were shipped to Denver to play the in-state foe Cardinals. MSU jumped out to a 15-2 advantage but were down four points (61-57) with just over a minute to play in regulation. After two free throws from two-time OVC Player of the Year Kenneth Faried, the Eagles held for one final shot attempt and senior Demonte Harper pulled up off a cross-over dribble to nail a 3-pointer with 4.3 seconds left that gave Morehead State a 62-61 lead. UoFL had one last attempt but Faried blocked the Cardinals last shot, giving MSU the win, its first over Louisville since the 1956-57 season.

In 2011-12 Murray State put together one of the greatest seasons in OVC history, beginning the year 23-0 (an all-time OVC best) and being ranked as high as No. 7 in the coaches poll on Feb. 6. The squad was the first OVC team to be nationally-ranked since Murray State was ranked in 1997-98; in addition the top 10 ranking was the first for an OVC team since the 1970-71 campaign (WKU). The Racers would top nationally-ranked Memphis and Saint Mary's during the season and win the league's regular season and tournament championships. MSU earned a No. 6 seed in NCAA Tournament, the highest-ever seed for an OVC team since the NCAA began seeding the field in 1979. The Racers would top Colorado State 58-41 in the second round before falling to Marquette in the third round. Murray State would win 31 games overall, tying the OVC all-time record the Racers set in 2009-10.

After the Murray State win in 2011-12, the league had won NCAA Tournament games in four-straight seasons, something that had never happened in league history (three-game winning streaks from 1960-62 and 1987-89 had been the previous best streaks). Over that time period (2009-12) the OVC was one of just nine conferences nationally to win a NCAA Tournament game in each season and one of only three non-BCS leagues (joining the Atlantic 10 and WCC) to do so.

In 2013-14 Murray State won five games to claim the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) and in the process became the first OVC men's basketball team to ever play games in the month of April.

The 2014-15 season saw five OVC men's basketball teams earn postseason bids, the most in league history. Those teams combined to win eight total games, the most ever by the OVC in one postseason. Entering 2015-16 OVC men's basketball teams have at least one national postseason tournament victory in seven-straight postseasons, an all-time league record.

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry)

at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft.

During the 2010-11 year Faried, the nation's leading rebounder during the season, became the NCAA's Modern Era (since 1973) career rebounding leader, totaling 1,673 rebounds which passed Tim Duncan for the record (he is 11th all-time in NCAA history). Faried also finished his career with 86 double-doubles, second all-time to only Duncan. He is one of only six players in NCAA history to finish with 2,000-plus career points (2,009) and 1,600-plus career rebounds. Faried was drafted 22nd overall by the Denver Nuggets in the 2011 NBA Draft, becoming the first OVC player selected in the first round since Tennessee State's Carlos Rogers 1994.

Murray State guard Isaiah Canaan, a first-team All-American in 2011-12, capped his illustrious career in 2012-13 by becoming just the 17th player in OVC history to score 2,000 or more career points. Canaan, who was a key part of Murray State NCAA Tournament victories in both 2010 and 2012, earned a pair of OVC Player of the Year honors (2012 and 2013) during his career as well as being named OVC Freshman of the Year (2010), OVC Tournament MVP (2010) and OVC Male Athlete of the Year (2012). He was drafted by the Houston Rockets with the 34th overall pick (No. 2 pick of the second round) of the 2013 NBA Draft.

In 2014-15 Murray State became just the fifth OVC men's team to complete a perfect Conference season (16-0). The Racers were led by sophomore Cameron Payne who was named OVC Men's Basketball Player of the Year, OVC Male Athlete of the Year and earned third-team All-American honors from CBSports.com. Following the season Payne declared for the NBA Draft, becoming the first sophomore in OVC history to do so and one of just four OVC players all-time to enter and stay in the draft with eligibility remaining. Payne was selected in the lottery by the Oklahoma City Thunder (pick No. 14 overall), making him just the ninth First Round NBA Draft pick in OVC history.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

# JULIO FREIRE

## ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

### HIRED: JAN. 13, 2014



Julio Freire, formerly the assistant/associate athletics director for development at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, was formally introduced as the 12th athletics director in University of Tennessee at Martin history on Jan. 13, 2014. He succeeds Phil Dane, who retired on Dec. 31, 2013 after 34 years of service at UT Martin, the last 14 of which were as athletics

director.

“At certain times, certain individuals rise to the top and that’s really what happened in this case,” UT Martin Chancellor Dr. Tom Rakes said of the athletics director search. “Julio demonstrates an understanding of protocol and team spirit necessary for this type of position. He also exhibits a level of energy and understanding of how to interact with a whole cross section of individuals. He has seen the intricacies of Division-I athletics and we are fortunate to have him here.”

“It’s such an exciting day for the future of Skyhawk nation,” OVC Commissioner Beth DeBauche said. “I am absolutely delighted for the opportunity to work with Julio and to get to work with his family as we move forward. There are some exciting things going on in the OVC and it’s the perfect time to be joining the league. I know Julio brings the right energy, excitement, vision and knowledge to really be a contributor to this fine conference.”

Freire stressed three messages at his introductory press conference, noting that he had a plan for comprehensive excellence, he would remain focused on the student-athlete and he would engage the community in a meaningful way.

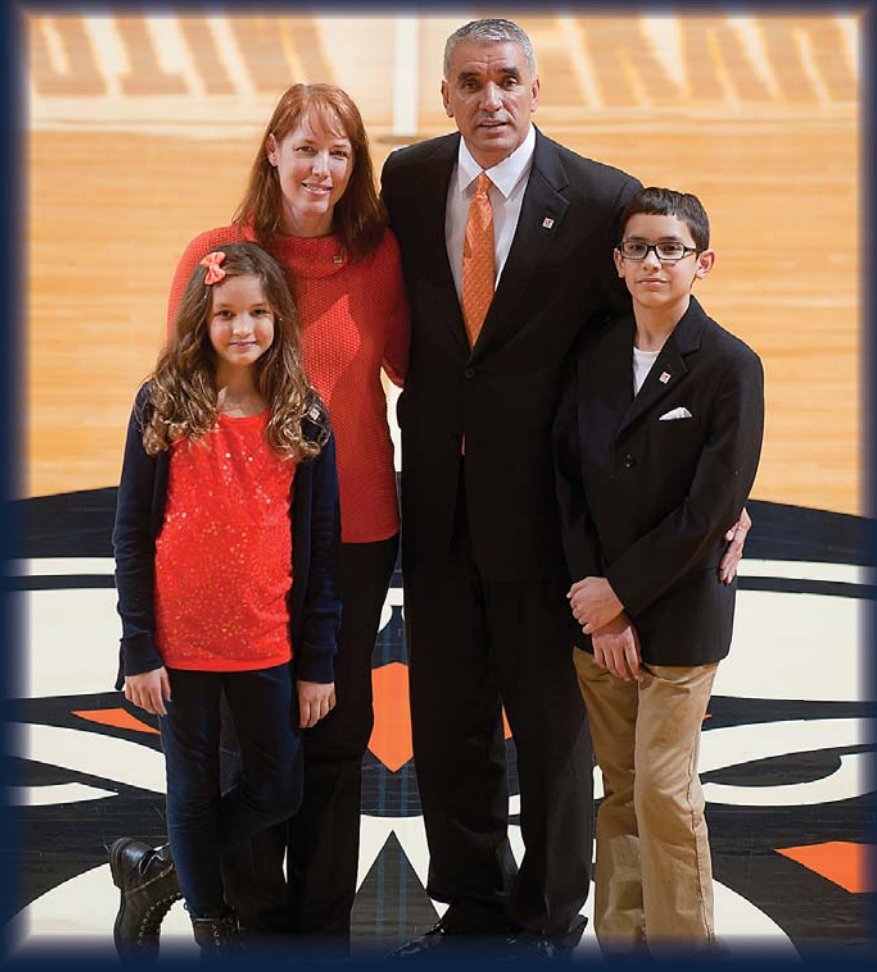

It is my intent to have us all represent this institution with the highest degree of integrity at all times.”

“We will work to communicate a plan that will focus on the well-being of our student-athletes,” Freire said. “This plan will be shared within our community, with university leaders, with the academic community, with alumni and fans. We will be inviting them all to be part of our plans and part of our success. I believe that community engagement must extend beyond the campus border, beyond the city limits and beyond the great state of Tennessee.”

Freire brings 22 years of experience within intercollegiate athletics and educational settings to UT Martin. He most recently worked under athletics director Jim Livengood at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas as senior associate athletics director from 2010-13. Freire worked closely with university relations, department leadership, athletics development, external operations, athletic program administration and compliance while at the Mountain West Conference affiliate.

Prior to his time at UNLV, Freire spent time at the University of Arizona from 2007-10 as the assistant/associate athletics director for development under Livengood. Among Freire’s accomplishments at the Pac-12 school were the increase of planned gifts by \$4.5 million and serving as the athletic program liaison for the highly successful football and men’s basketball programs.

Freire also served at fellow OVC institution Tennessee Tech under athletics director Mark Wilson from 2005-07 as the associate athletics director for development. While in Cookeville, Freire was responsible for the cultivation and stewardship of major gift prospects and donors. He increased annual donations by 300 percent and secured seven of the 10 largest gifts in department history.

Freire began his collegiate athletic administration career at Ohio University, where he served as an assistant/associate athletics director for development from 2000-04 under athletics director Thomas Boeh. During his time at the Mid-American Conference member, Freire managed all facets of facilities and game operations units, concession and merchandise contracts and also supervised the renovation and construction of numerous facilities.

Freire spent 10 years as a high school teacher, counselor, coach, athletics director and principal in Phoenix, Ariz. and Tempe, Ariz. before moving on to Ohio.

Born in Tijuana, Mexico and raised in Tucson, Ariz., Freire ran cross country and track and field at Arizona State University in Tempe, Ariz. He graduated with a bachelor of arts degree in education in 1990 and earned his Master's degree in counseling from the University of Phoenix in 1997.

Freire, 47, is married to the former Cherie Taylor and has two children, Christopher (11) and Gabriella (9).
