Lisa Carlsen, a highly-decorated head coach who spent the last eight seasons at Lewis University, was introduced as Northern Illinois University's 10th women's basketball head coach by NIU Associate Vice-President and Director of Athletics Sean T. Frazier on June 30, 2015

"I'm excited for this opportunity to work with the NIU family and the Huskie basketball program," said Carlsen. "It was clear to me on my visit that NIU has a real chance to elevate itself to the next level. I want to thank Director of Athletics Sean T. Frazier for allowing me this wonderful opportunity to coach at Northern Illinois University. This is a great move for my family and I look forward to getting to work with this current team and instilling the expectation of competing for, and winning, Mid-American Conference Championships."

In eight seasons at Lewis, Carlsen guided the Flyers to a 148-89 record, four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and two Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) championships.

"When we began the search for our next head women's basketball coach at NIU, we were looking for someone who was the right fit to lead the resurgence of our program," said Frazier. "Lisa Carlsen has a proven record of success, an understanding of the educational mission of our university and the integrity and values to get the job done here at NIU. I have no doubt that Lisa is the right person at the right time to lead our student-athletes and compete for championships in the years to come."

In 2014-15, Lewis posted a 31-3 record and reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament; Carlsen was honored as the 2015 Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Division II National Coach of the Year. The Flyers started the season on a 23-game winning streak and spent five weeks ranked number one in the nation. Along with earning national coach of the year honors, Carlsen was also named GLVC Coach of the Year, Illinois Basketball Coaches Association (IBCA) Women's Collegiate Coach of the Year and WBCA Region IV Division II Coach of the Year.

Her final season at Lewis was the culmination of an outstanding three-year period during which Carlsen guided the Flyers to a 78-15 mark and three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Carlsen led the Flyers to the best turnaround in the nation in Division II during the 2012-13 campaign, recording a 24-6 mark. Lewis won the GLVC East Division and Tournament championships and earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Carlsen was named the GLVC Coach of the Year and was also the IBCA Women's Collegiate Coach of the Year.

In 2013-14, Lewis went 23-6 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Carlsen was named the 2014 IBCA Women's Collegiate Co-Coach of the Year and the WBCA Region IV Division II Coach of the Year.

During her tenure with the Flyers, Carlsen mentored two All-Americans, two conference players of the year, four all-region honorees and 10 all-conference award winners. In eight seasons at Lewis, Carlsen's program had a 100 percent graduation rate; she also served as the Senior Woman Administrator at Lewis from 2007-13.

A native of Earling, Iowa, Carlsen began her basketball coaching career at Nebraska Omaha as an assistant in 1998-99 and 1999-2000. Carlsen was promoted to head coach at Nebraska Omaha prior to the 2000-01 season and led the Mavericks to postseason play in 2003, recording the program's best finish since the 1991-92 season. In 12 seasons combined between Lewis and Nebraska Omaha, Carlsen has a career record of 184-163.

Following her tenure at Nebraska Omaha, Carlsen spent three seasons as the associate head coach at Winona State, helping guide the Warriors to a 12-win improvement before taking the reins at Lewis prior to the 2007-08 season.

Before coaching basketball, Carlsen coached both softball and volleyball collegiately. She served as the head softball coach at the College of St. Mary (Neb.) from 1994-97 and was twice named the Midlands Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. Carlsen then worked as an assistant volleyball coach and head softball coach at Wayne State (Neb.) during the 1997-98 school year. She compiled a career record of 120-51 as a softball coach.

A 1992 graduate of Northwest Missouri State, Carlsen was a four-time all-conference basketball honoree while also earning all-conference and all-region honors as a softball player. During her senior year, Carlsen was named the 1992 Champion NCAA Female Athlete of the Year. She went on to earn her master's degree from Nebraska Omaha in 1994 and played basketball professionally for the Nebraska Express of the Women's Basketball Association from 1992-95 and was named an all-star in 1995.

Carlsen and her husband, Chris, have four children; sons Jacob (18), Zachary (15) and Sam (14) and daughter Lexi (10).

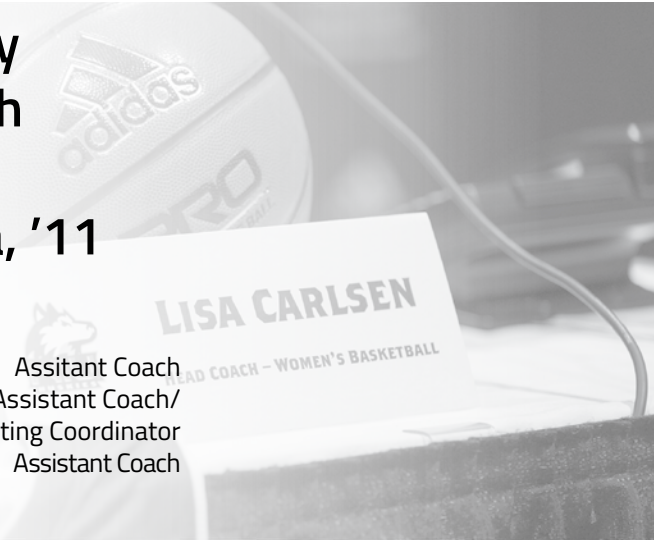

A former Assistant Coach at Lewis with NIU’s newly minted Head Coach Lisa Carlsen, Kierra McCleary enters her first season with the Huskies in 2015-16.

McCleary comes to Northern Illinois University after spending the last two seasons at Western Illinois, where she served as the recruiting coordinator for the Leathernecks. In her first season at WIU, the Leathernecks set a new record for points in a season with 2,392 and field goals in a season with 846.

Led by three All-Summit League selections, one All-Newcomer team selection and a CoSIDA Academic All-American (Ashley Luke), Western Illinois would go on to finish the 2013-14 season with a 14-16 record. WIU foes from the Horizon League, Conference USA, the Ohio Valley, the Atlantic-10 and WAC while finishing fifth in the Summit League, the Leathernecks best league finish since 2007-08.

The team would surpass that standard in 2014-15, finishing 17-13 overall and 9-7 in the Summit League to finish third in the regular season standings. Luke would finish the season as the Summit League’s Player of the Year, as well CoSIDA’s Academic All-American of the Year.

Prior to her two seasons at Western Illinois, McCleary worked one season at Lewis with Carlsen, helping the Flyers to the best turnaround in Division II during the 2012-13 season. Lewis finished the year 24-6, earning an NCAA Tournament berth, after finishing the 2011-12 season with an 8-20 mark.

A three-time captain at North Alabama, McCleary helped the Lions to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2010-11, the program’s first appearance since 1994. In her final season, North Alabama finished 21-7 and was a perfect 12-0 in the Gulf South Conference. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native graduated from UNA in 2011 with a degree in business administration.

“Kierra worked for me three years ago and is a promising, up and coming coach,” said Head Coach Lisa Carlsen. She did a great job at Western Illinois and gained more and more responsibility there. “She adds a dynamic aspect for us, especially as a recruiter and her familiarity of this position especially at the Division I level will be key.”

**COLUMBIA, Mo.** – The Northern Illinois University women's basketball team held SEC foe Missouri to 47 points and caused the Tigers to turn the ball over 19 times at Mizzou Arena Sunday afternoon. Attempting one final shot after a missed free throw with eight seconds left, the Tigers blocked the Huskies' final shot to defeat NIU, 47-44. Missouri extended its home non-conference winning streak to 30 games with the win.

Seniors Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) and Danny Pulliam (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike) combined for 25 points as Corral shared the lead for all scorers in the game with 13. MU's Jordan Frericks led the Tigers with 13 points and eight boards. The Huskies (2-5) played the final 4:29 within four points of the Tigers (8-2) as they tied the game, 42-42, on a three-point basket from Pulliam. NIU also held Mizzou to a season-low in scoring. The Tigers entered the game averaging 71.2 points per game. "Our effort tonight turned into a great competitiveness and I think that's the hardest I've seen us compete this year. We definitely defended like there's no tomorrow and we showed what a good defensive team we are and how well we can pressure other teams," said Head Coach Kathi Bennet.

"We struggled a little bit offensively at the beginning but we made some big shots to gain the lead and even tie it late in the second half. We played with a lot of poise late," added Bennet. Missouri started the game with three-straight field goals, including two behind the arc, to build an 8-2 lead over the Huskies. A pair of free throws by Corral prior to the first media timeout started 9-0 run for NIU that put the Huskies on top, 11-8, with 12:03 left in the first.

Freshman Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) hit a three-pointer to cut the Huskie deficit to one point, 8-7, with 15:15 remaining. A layup by Pulliam gave NIU the lead at the 13:58 mark, followed by another Pulliam layup to put the Huskies on top by three heading into the media timeout.

NIU's pressure defensively was the prime catalyst for the Huskie lead as it created 12 turnovers in the opening 12 minutes. Mizzou would bounce back at the end of the half, creating a 12-0 run in the final minutes. Corral broke the duck with a basket in the lane as MU trailed the Tigers at halftime, 22-15.

The two teams opened it up offensively in the second stanza with NIU pacing the way with a 12-of-27 (44.4) shooting performance, including an 4-for-8 clip from behind the three-point line.

Four of the Huskies 29 points in the period came via fast break layups from Corral, who twice intercepted passes around the Missouri key and ran the ball down the court for wide open shots.

Mizzou looked to break away from the Huskies as it built a nine-point lead in the second half. However, NIU clawed back to close the Tiger gap. MU went up by four with 59 seconds left as Bri Porter made two free throws and Morgan Eye's hit a jumper to put Missouri on top 46-44.

Going right back down the floor, freshman Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) sunk a layup and was fouled with 25 seconds left to close the NIU deficit to two points, 46-44, and possibly within one with a free throw attempt upcoming.

After missing the shot, the Tigers sank one more free throw with eight seconds left as Maddie Stock failed to make her second attempt.

With sophomore Amber Gray (Mukwonago, Wis./Mukwonago) snatching the rebound and dishing it to classmate Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek), the guard ran the ball up the court and threw up a three-point shot with one second left. Stock would gain redemption after the missed free throw as she blocked the final shot to seal the MU win, 47-44.

NIU's ball distribution topped Missouri's as they led in assists, 12-8. NIU led in steals, 8-6, and committed the fewest turnovers in the matchup, 19-12. The Huskies held Mizzou to a 35-percent field goal percentage.

**DeKALB** - The NIU women's basketball team played a well-rounded offensive and defensive game Wednesday night versus SIUE Edwardsville as the Cougars (3-6) were held under 50 points and the Huskies (3-5) shot. 528 from the field to defeat SIUE, 69-47. The win improved the Huskies to 2-1 at the NIU Convocation Center this season.

Senior Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) scored a season-high 26 points on an 11-of-17 shooting performance, a new career-high in field goals made. Sophomore Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) scored 15 points with six assists and three blocks. Danny Pulliam (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike) dished five helpers to reach the 200 assist plateau and become the 20th Huskie to reach that mark in her career.

"I thought we shot the ball really well tonight and did nice job shutting their zone down. We were able to get some things going offensively against the zone which was good to see. We did enough in the first half to get the win and we really played hard on the defensive end but I wish we would have played better in the second half," said Head Coach Kathi Bennet.

The Huskies opened the contest with a hot shooting hand as they made 15-of-30 shots in the first stanza for an even 50-percent field goal percentage. NIU's offensive fury tied its season-high for points in the first half at 36, last recorded versus Delaware State on Nov. 30.

Defensively, the Huskies were just as strong in the period as they created 15 turnovers and accounted for 15 points off takeaways. The Huskies closed the first period on a 23-5 run.

The Cougars finished the half shooting 37-percent, going 7-for-19 from the field. Micah Jones led the Cougars at the half with five points, scoring three from the free throw line.

Corral led NIU with 13 points in the first half, going 6-of-10 from the field. The senior was followed closely by Lehman, who accounted for eight points.

**CEDAR FALLS, Iowa** - NIU women's basketball did not allow Northern Iowa to score a field goal in the final 9:45 of the game. The Huskies' (3-6) held the Panthers (4-6) under 60 points, marking the sixth-straight game NIU has accomplished the feat but NIU fell, 51-42.

NIU's Jenna Thorp (Hinckley, Ill./Hinckley-Big Rock) led the Huskies with a season-high 13 points and added seven rebounds while Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) grabbed eight boards with five points and three assists. Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) and Kelly Smith (Arrowhead, Wis./Hartland) both contributed eight points.

"We were out of sync tonight offensively. We passed up some wide open looks and drove into the defense and it's really a shame because we did what we could on the defensive side of things. We didn't take advantage of our opportunities offensively and at some point that has to change," said Head Coach Kathi Bennet.

"Northern Iowa is a really good ball club and we fought with them tooth and nail. We just missed our opportunities to get a win and we'll look to clean that up after break," added Bennet.

In a defensive first half of basketball, both NIU and UNI accounted for eight field goals apiece and combined for 10 turnovers. The Panthers carried a 23-16 lead at halftime as they made four shots behind the arc and three baskets at the charity stripe.

NIU out rebounded UNI in the half, 20-19, and accounted for five assists on its eight baskets. Thorp was the Huskies top-scorer in the period as she scored six points, starting the game 3-for-3 from the field. Smith added four points.

The second half opened as a wide open affair as the Huskies were 6-of-7 shooting in the opening four minutes of the stanza while the Panthers were 4-of-7. Only NIU continued that hot shooting trend as it was 11-of-22 in the final 20 minutes of the contest while UNI was 8-for-25.

After the wide open four minutes, the Huskies and Panthers defense tightened back up, highlighted by Northern Illinois University's final 9:45 of stellar play in which NIU did not allow a single field goal.

In that span, Northern Iowa missed its final 11 shots, however, the Panthers were 10-of-15 from the free throw line in the half to hold their lead over NIU.

At game's end, the Huskies made three more field goals than the Panthers, 19-16, and grabbed one more board than UNI, 37-36. Both Thorp and Sladek made three baskets in the stanza as the redshirt senior pacing NIU in the half with seven points.

The Hinckley, Ill., native finished the afternoon with 13 points and seven rebounds, going a season-best 6-of-9 from the field. The six baskets tied her career-high set versus Central Michigan on Feb. 22, 2014. UNI's Jordan Weekly scored 13 points to lead the Panthers.

**PEORIA** – Four different NIU scorers reached double-digits Tuesday night at Bradley (1-10) as the Huskies (4-6) closed their non-conference season in strong fashion, defeating the Braves, 67-54.

Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) led the Huskies with 18 points, followed by Danny Pulliam's (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike) 16 point night. Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) and Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) each scored 10 with Lehman adding 11 rebounds for NIU's first double-double of the season.

Defensively, NIU extended its streak to seven-straight games with an opponent under 60 points, forcing the 22 Bradley takeaways. 23 of the Braves 54 points came from the free throw line as they shot 29.5 percent (13-for-44) from the field.

"I thought we were a little sloppy the last 10 minutes of the game but I thought we played a great game. It was great to see our post players really get going with their high-low action," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "Overall, our passing was the best I've seen it this year and I thought we had some really good chemistry from an offensive standpoint and that really created for us."

The Huskies played a complete opening half as it was 16-for-30 (.530) from the field and outscored the Braves, 29-13, in the final 12:39 of the half. Defensively, the Huskies forced 12 turnovers and scored 20 points off of those takeaways.

NIU's offensive output was its highest in a first half this season as Pulliam and Corral both reached double figures with 11 and 10 points, respectively. The Huskies distributed 11 assists in the stanza as well.

A quick 5-0 run to start the second half gave the Huskies a 17-point lead as Pulliam converted a layup and Corral nailed a three-pointer to put NIU up, 47-30.

The Huskies presence in the paint was a large part of their success on the night as they scored a season-high 38 points in the paint.

Though Bradley tried to close the scoring gap, NIU continued to hold a double-digit lead in the period and built its way to a 19-point lead with 5:34 left as Pulliam sunk two-free throws to put the Huskies on top, 64-45.

With a jumpshot in the paint at 3:34 left, Lehman recorded the Huskies first double-double of the season, finishing with 10 points and 11 rebounds. She also dished five assists in the game.

Freshman Georgia Breunig (Sauk Prairie, Wis./Sauk Prairie), who suffered injury during preseason, made her collegiate debut against the Braves as she dished two assists in six minutes. Alex Dumoulin (Hampshire, Ill./Elgin CC) returned to the NIU lineup tonight, scoring two points in four minutes after suffering injury Nov. 20 versus Valparaiso.

Bradley's Whitney Tinjum scored a game-high 28 points, going 14-for-14 from the free throw line.

**DeKALB** – The NIU women's basketball team overcame a nine point deficit to Eastern Michigan (7-5, 0-1 MAC) in the Mid-American Conference opener and finished strong in overtime as the Huskies won their second-straight MAC opener, 54-48. NIU outscored EMU in overtime, 11-5.

Huskies' Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) and Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) each recorded a double-double in the game as the duo became the first Huskies to accomplish the feat in the same game since Kim Davis (2010-12) and Marke Freeman (2008-11) versus Loyola on Dec. 28, 2010.

Corral and Sladek scored 15 and 12, respectively, while adding 14 rebounds apiece. Corral added three assists and two blocks in the game.

"We love to play team defense and that's what we did today. We did a great job of getting in gaps early in the second half and stopping initial penetration and making the shot clock wind down," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett.

Both teams played a very defensive first half as both NIU and EMU committed nine fouls in the period with the Eagles narrowly outscoring the Huskies at the free throw line, 8-7. NIU was a perfect 7-for-7 at the line.

NIU led the turnover battle as it forced eight Eagle takeaways, three fewer than the Huskies first half total. With both sides playing a smothering defense, the Huskies and Eagles combined for a field goal percentage of .241.

Northern Illinois University started the second half on an 14-4 run to reclaim the lead, 33-30, as Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) sunk a layup on an inbound play under the basket, despite being fouled. Her ensuing free throw put NIU up by three points with 12:24 left to play.

The Huskies would go on to build a seven point lead in the period but the Eagles stormed back with 3:48 left as Cha Sweeney hit a layup to bring EMU within one point, 42-41.

After back-to-back turnovers by EMU and NIU with under a minute left, Sweeney took a shot to put the Eagles back in front but it was air mailed over the rim. Sladek jumped over a sea of green to grab the rebound and was fouled, allowing her to make one free throw and put NIU up by two.

Sweeney tied the game with 4.8 seconds left as she sunk a jumper to force overtime, 43-43.

The Huskies waited until overtime to make its lone three-pointer of the game as Corral nailed one from the corner to tie the game again, 46-46. NIU built its lead up to six points in the half as it was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line in the stanza. Corral hit four from charity stripe while Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) and Smith each made two.

EMU's Sweeney finished with a game-high 21 points. The Eagles only dished one assist in the game.

The Huskies tied their season-high in shots made from the free throw line as they closed the game 21-of-25 (.840) from the line. NIU's rebounding was at its best as it accounted for 49 boards, including 35 on the defensive glass which bested Eastern Michigan's 34 defensive rebounds.

It was the second time this season Northern Illinois University had held a foe under 50 points, holding SIUE to 47 on Dec. 17.

**LAS VEGAS** – The NIU Huskies' (5-7, 1-1 MAC) held Mid-American Conference West division favorite Central Michigan (8-6, 3-0 MAC) to 56 points and 37 percent shooting Saturday night in Mt. Pleasant. The Huskies couldn't answer for Naismith Trophy candidate Crystal Bradford, however, as her 20 points led the Chippewas over NIU, 56-43.

Amanda Corral led the Huskies in scoring with 12 points and eight rebounds in the contest.

"We came out tentative and the energy just wasn't there with some of our players. Amanda played really tough today and I was proud of the way she played," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "I was happy to see Lacia make a couple baskets and Georgia make her first three tonight, I think that will create some competition and that can't hurt us."

The Huskies and Chippewas traded runs in the first half with NIU taking the first crack at the scoreboard with two-straight baskets in the paint from Jenna Thorp (Hincley, Ill./Hincley-Big Rock) and Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) to put NIU on top, 4-0. After trading two more runs, the Huskies would go on a 7-2 run to lead, 14-10, with 8:48 left in the first half.

Corral scored five of NIU's points on the run, starting with a reverse layup under the basket, curling baseline despite being covered over by three Chippewa players. She then followed up with a three-pointer to give the Huskies their fourth point lead and force CMU to take a timeout.

Central Michigan would lead at halftime, 25-21. Northern Illinois University held the Chips to 11-of-30 shooting in the half (36%) as Bradford accounted for 11 points and five rebounds. Corral finished with nine points and five rebounds for the Huskies.

NIU sophomore Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) opened the second half scoring as she hit a jumpshot to lift the Huskies within two points, 25-23. CMU would then go on an 8-0 run to build the first double-digit lead of the game, 33-23, with 14:27 remaining.

Though the Chips would lead by 17, the NIU defense continued to disrupt shots for Central Michigan and cause turnovers as the Chippewas shot .377 from the field in the game and led in turnovers, 11-9.

CMU's field goal percentage marked the sixth-straight game that the Huskies did not allow a team to shoot over 40 percent from the field. The Chippewas 56 points also marked the ninth consecutive contest NIU did not surrender 60 points in a game. Central Michigan entered the contest with a field goal percentage of .412 and a scoring average of 71.0 points per game.

The Huskie offense was diverse as eight of the 10 NIU players that appeared in the game scored for the Huskies. Corral reached double-figures for the second-straight contest as she finished with 12 points, adding eight rebounds and two assists in all 40 minutes on the floor. Freshmen Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) and Sladek each added seven points for the Huskies.

Bradford finished with 20 points with nine rebounds and four assists, while teammate Lorreal Jones finished with an 11 point, 12 rebound double-double performance.

**DeKALB** - Overcoming a seven point halftime deficit, the NIU Huskies (9-10, 5-4 MAC) outscored Miami University (3-18, 0-10 MAC) by 18 points in the second half to defeat the RedHawks, 60-49. Freshmen Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) and Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) both recorded double-doubles in the game, each individuals second of the season.

Smith finished with 15 points and 10 rebounds, including seven on the offensive glass while Sladek accounted for 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind.) also scored 15 points, including six in the final minutes from the free throw line, while adding eight rebounds, five assists and three steals.

"I thought we started out the game very flat, especially on the defensive end which has to be our identity. We just did a great job turning it all around in the second half," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett.

After opening the first stanza in a 4-3 deficit, the Huskies would go on a 10-0 run and take a 13-4 lead over the RedHawks with 12:31 on the clock. Miami University would respond with a 17-6 run over the next 7:40 to takeover the lead, 23-18. The RedHawks would keep that lead into halftime as the Huskies trailed, 29-22.

MIU posted a strong shooting performance in the half as it was 12-of-27 (.444) from the field while NIU was 9-for-28 (.321) shooting in the stanza. Sladek led the Huskies with six points while Lehman grabbed six rebound with five points in the period. Smith also scored five points on the night.

"I told the team that we needed to have tremendous energy on the defensive side of things. It's who we are and if we don't play hard on that side of the floor, we don't have a chance to win and so we had to get after it on that end," Bennett said on what it would take for the team to come back in the second half.

Thanks in part to consecutive stops, Smith opened the half scoring eight points to become the first Huskie to break into double digit scoring. Sladek followed up with four points as the two freshmen combined to outscore the RedHawks, 12-2, and put NIU back on top, 34-31.

Miami (Ohio) would take one last crack at the lead as it went up 35-34 with 1:50 left but a jumper by Lehman put NIU back on top, 36-35. A trey from Lacia Gorman (Fort Wayne, Ind./Wayne) extended the Huskies lead to four and put NIU back in the drivers seat, which allowed the team to extend their lead to 13 points in the final minutes of the game.

The Huskies were 12-for-12 at the free throw line after opening the game 3-of-9 from the charity stripe. NIU also improved its field goal percentage in the second half as it was 12-for-29 for a mark of .414. Miami (Ohio) was 8-of-25 from the field in the second for a mark of .320.

Gorman finished the game with six points as she was 2-for-2 behind the three-point line to lead the Huskie bench in points. Sladek's 15 points tied her career-high for the third time this season, last doing so at Ball State on Jan. 31.

The double-doubles by Smith and Sladek marked the second-time this season that two NIU players registered such a performance, doing so versus Eastern Michigan in the MAC opener on Jan. 3.

Defensively, Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) had a career-high three blocks in the game. The RedHawks became the fifth NIU opponent to score less than 50 points in a game this season, joining Missouri, SIUE, Eastern Michigan and Kent State. The Huskies three-straight MAC wins are the most since Jan. 2009.

Miami's Kayla Brown led all scorers in the game with 21 points on 9-of-15 shooting.

**DeKALB** - Trailing Akron (17-5, 7-4 MAC) by 15 points with 8:38 remaining, NIU (10-10, 6-4 MAC) reached the 500 mark and won its fourth-straight game as the Huskies defeated the Zips, 62-56. Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart), who hit the go-ahead shot with 43 seconds remaining, finished the night with a career-high 31 points.

The comeback was the largest of Head Coach Kathi Bennett's five year tenure at NIU and the Huskies first double-digit comeback since a 10-point rally versus Western Michigan when NIU defeated the Broncos March 8, 2014, 59-51.

Sophomore Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) scored 10 points and grabbed five rebounds while freshman Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) added 12 points and eight rebounds. Jenna Thorp (Hickley, Ill./Hickley-Big Rock) scored all seven of her points in the Huskies 26-5 run in the final eight minutes of the game. The Huskies rushed out of the gate with gumption, taking the opening tip and starting the contest on an 8-0 run as Corral and Smith jumpstarted NIU. The offensive oriented Zips rallied back and took its first lead of the game with 9:07 left, 15-14, however, NIU would rally to take back that lead as it capitalized on a 6-0 run to lead, 20-15.

The Huskies and Zips would trade points in the final eight minutes but the Zips would take the lead into the halftime locker room, 27-26. Corral led the NIU offense with 11 points while Hannah Plybon also added 11 points for Akron. The Zips, who lead the MAC in scoring with 77.1 points per game, was 10-for-28 (.357) from the field in the opening stanza while NIU was 12-for-32 (.375).

The Zips started the second half on a 10-0 run to build an 11 point lead with 16:25 left in regulation. A pull-up jumper by Lehman broke the UA scoring run and shifted some momentum in NIU's favor as the Huskies brought it back to within six points, 42-36, seven minutes into the stanza.

Going on an 8-0 run, the Zips took their 15 point lead on a jumper by Kerri McMahan with 8:58 remaining, just before Corral was forced to the bench after receiving a three fouls in a span of 1:01. A three-pointer by Smith and a jumper by Lehman put NIU within eight points and poised the team for a comeback.

"When we cut (their lead) down at that point, I thought 'we're going to do this.' I could just tell with the look in our players eyes. Amanda and Jenna wanted the ball and when you get that look, you have to go with it. I told them don't be afraid to take shots and Jenna took a long a three that brought us back within one and Amanda tied the game on a three-pointer," added Bennett.

A putback and a pair of free throws by Thorp, as well as a trey by Corral, gave the Huskies a 14-0 run and put NIU within one point with 2:59 remaining, 51-50. Leading by three points, 56-53, with 1:28 left, Akron could not stop Corral from tying the game on a three-pointer with 1:19 left. After a DiAndra Gibson turnover, Corral converted the go-ahead layup and followed with four free throws to reach her 31 points and secure the Huskie's first victory over the Zips since 2012, 62-56.

Corral's 20 point second half was the largest total by an NIU player this season, surpassing Lehman's 18-point second half versus Valparaiso on Nov. 20. It was the second time in the last four games that Corral eclipsed the 30-point mark in a game.

While Lehman contributed 10 points and Smith added 12 to support Corral's scoring, Lacia Gorman (Fort Wayne, Ind./Wayne/Wisconsin) dished a career-high four assists to lead the game in helpers. Thorp finished with seven points, all in the final five minutes, and tied her season in rebounds with eight.

**DeKALB** - The NIU women's basketball (10-11, 6-5 MAC) played tight with Mid-American Conference West Division leader Western Michigan (16-7, 9-3 MAC), leading by three points with six and a half minutes left, but a 10-0 Bronco run vaulted WMU over NIU to defeat the Huskies, 60-51.

Sophomore Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) recorded her second double-double of the season, scoring 13 points and pulling down 10 rebounds to lead NIU in both categories. Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) added 12 points while Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) scored 10.

"I thought we played a really good game and we had some opportunities down the stretch. Last game (versus Akron), we knocked those shots down, this game we didn't. Western Michigan is a really good team that's 9-3 in the MAC right now. (They're) one of the best team's in the conference. We gave them everything we had tonight," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett.

The Huskies and Broncos opened the game trading baskets with WMU taking its first lead after the first three-pointer of the game, 11-10, at the 13:22 mark. The two teams then traded runs in the stanza with NIU starting things off with an 7-0 run, taking a 17-11 lead.

A matching 7-0 run later in the half by Western Michigan deadlocked the game at the final media timeout, 20-20. The Huskies added eight more points before the halftime buzzer, taking a 28-23 lead into the locker room.

NIU carried a balanced scoring sheet in the stanza as Corral, Lehman and Jenna Thorp (Hickley, Ill./Hickley-Big Rock) each shared the scoring lead in the half with six points. NIU shot .444 in the first period, going 12-for-27, while holding Western Michigan to just 9-of-30 from the field (.300).

The second half opened much the like first half did with both teams trading baskets and then trading runs.

Deadlocked at 39 apiece with 9:05 left, Lehman made her first free throw and missed her second, but Smith grabbed the offensive rebound, one of three in the game for her, and put the shot back to give NIU a three-point lead, 42-39, with 8:21 left.

Thorp made her final basket of the game with 7:40 left in the game, 44-41, which was NIU's last basket before the 10-0 run by WMU. The Huskies found open looks at the end to make a comeback, which would have been it's third-straight second half comeback, but the shots didn't fall as NIU ended its four-game winning streak, 60-51.

NIU only committed three turnovers in the game, a season-low that surpassed its six turnover night versus Kent State on Jan. 17.

The Huskies finished the night 21-for-59 from the field (.356), three more field goals than the Broncos, who finished the night 20-of-22 (.910) from the free throw line to gain the final edge in the contest. The Broncos finished with an 18-for-20 (.900) clip at the charity stripe in the second half.

"We took them the distance and we were right there with them. If we knock down some of those shots, we're talking about a win tonight," Bennett added, "I'm just proud of this team right now because we gave ourselves a chance to win against the best team in our division."

**KENT, Ohio** - Tied 52-52 with 0.8 seconds left under the Kent State basket, KSU's Larissa Lurken lobbed the ball to Melanee Stubbs, who sank the shot at the buzzer as Kent State (4-19, 2-10 MAC) defeated NIU (10-12, 6-6 MAC) as time expired, 54-52. The Huskies and Golden Flashes exchanged the lead 12 times in the game, the most in an NIU game this season.

Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) scored all 17 of her points in the second half to rally the Huskies in the period, going 5-for-7 from the field. Jenna Thorp (Hincley, Ill./Hincley-Big Rock) scored 10 points with three rebounds.

"It was a really tough loss with a lot of miscommunication down the stretch. I take full responsibility for this loss, I should've changed the lineup that I had out there," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "We committed a silly foul at the end of the game when we didn't need to and we missed a couple free throws on the back end of bonuses."

"We overcame some key misses tonight too, moving around some players and getting some players in off the bench and I thought we were going to get the win. It's just disappointing not to get it because we shot ourselves in the foot at the end," Bennett added.

The NIU defense was on a mission in the first half as it forced 13 Kent State turnovers in the period, while only committing four in the stanza. The Huskies took their first lead of the game with 10-04 remaining on a three-pointer by Danny Pulliam (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike) to make it a 10-9 NIU. A pull-up jumper by Kelly Smith gave the Huskies a 12-9 lead but the Golden Flashes would end the half with the advantage, 22-17.

NIU registered five assists in the period as five different players distributed from the field. Kent State carried a 24-9 rebounding advantage in the first stanza.

The Huskies offense awoke the second half as it went 11-for-19 (57.9) from the field in the final 20 minutes of the game, outscoring the Golden Flashes, 35-32.

NIU and Kent State began trading baskets and free throws as the teams traded leads 10 times in the second half, including seven changes and three ties in the final five minutes of the game.

A layup by Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) with 17 seconds left gave NIU a one point lead, 51-50, but a foul after the inbounds pass sent Mikell Chin to the line, who made both free throws to put KSU back in charge, 52-51.

Corral rushed down the floor with 16 seconds left and worked the ball into the key with heavy opposition. Being pushed to the court with 7.8 seconds left, Corral went to the free throw line and tied the game with her first shot, 52-52.

Missing the second shot, Kent State rebounded Corral's miss and zipped down the court to attempt the final shot. Chin lost control of the ball and her body at the base-line. After an official review decided possession and time on the clock, 0.8 seconds, Kent State attempted the final lob shot, where Stubbs caught the ball at the top of the key and threw the ball back off the rim. After teetering off the left and right side of the rim, the ball fell in the basket with no time left, lifting the Golden Flashes over NIU, 54-52.

Pulliam finished the game with nine points and four assists to complement Corral's and Thorp's double-digit efforts. The Huskies led the final turnover battle, 18-7, to outscore the Golden Flashes in points off turnovers, 16-5.

**TOLEDO, Ohio** - Senior Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) scored 27-points Wednesday afternoon for NIU (10-13, 6-7 MAC), going 10-of-17 (58.8) from the field, as the Huskies fell to Toledo (14-10, 7-6 MAC) on Education Day, 73-57. Corral became the 13th Huskie in program history to reach 1,400 career points.

Corral moved up to No. 12 all-time in scoring at NIU with her performance, as she now has 1,417 points. The game also marked the 75th game of her career with 10-or-more points, making her just the 12th Huskie to ever accomplish the feat.

"Toledo shot the ball really well today and it started with No. 11 (Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott. She can be a streaky shooter but she shot the ball like there was no tomorrow," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "That being said, that was the poorest defense we played all year, their motion affected us. I don't feel like a lot of Toledo's shots were uncontested but they just played really well."

Both the Huskies and Rockets scored in spurts as the two squads nickel and dimed their way to a 36-24 halftime score, favoring Toledo. The Rockets, who averaged 30.7 percent from behind the arc entering the game, were 4-for-9 (.444) in the first half to separate themselves from NIU.

Northern Illinois University shot 40 percent from the field (10-for-25), accounting for 10 points in the paint, while Toledo was 14-for-27 (.519) shooting in the period. The Huskies only committed five turnovers in the half.

Corral scored 10 points in the stanza, shooting 4-for-7 (.571), to lead NIU. Her first half performance made her the 12th player in program history to score 10-or-more points in 75 career games and the 13th to reach 1,400 career points. She is the first since Stephanie Raymond (2003-07) to accomplish both feats.

The Toledo offense shot strong again in the second half as it was 13-for-26 (.500) and 6-for-11 (.545) behind the arc. However, the Huskies were heel-to-heel with the Rockets in the second half as they were only outscored by two points in the period, 37-35.

NIU went to the free throw line 12 times in the stanza, missing only one shot to finish the game 13-of-14 (.929). Corral scored 17-points in the second half to finish with 27, the most by any player in the game.

Eight of the nine Huskies who appeared in the contest recorded points as NIU outscored Toledo off the bench, 16-12. The teams were deadlocked in the paint, 28-28, as forward Alex Dumoulin (Hampshire, Ill./Elgin CC) accounted for a season-high six points, three rebounds and two steals in 22 minutes. Jenna Thorp (Hincley, Ill./Hincley-Big Rock) pulled down six boards to lead the Huskies in rebounds.

Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott led Toledo with 24 points as she was 6-of-9 behind the three-point line and 9-of-14 from the field. Rocket point guard Inma Zanoquera recorded a double-double with 14 points and 10 assists. Zanoquera was held to two-points in the second half.

**MUNCIE, Ind.** - Trailing 51-43 with 1:26 left, the NIU Huskies (10-14, 6-9 MAC) went on a 7-0 run with 0:3 left in regulation versus Mid-American Conference West Division leader Ball State (15-10, 11-3 MAC) and had one last crack at a game-winning shot. Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart), who finished with 16 points, hit the final shot off a perfectly run inbounds play but the shot came after time expired, leading BSU past the Huskies, 51-50.

"We played extremely hard and extremely well together tonight and I thought we made some incredible plays down the stretch. I thought we deserved to win this game tonight and it just didn't fall our way," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "We knew the situation at the end of the game and we played well enough at the end of the game. The plays that we made down the stretch, makes it (harder to cope with) because it really felt like we were going to pull it off."

"We stayed in the moment and this really hurts right now because we won (in Muncie) and we knew they'd come with a little extra fire this time around and we did everything we could to win tonight's game," Bennett added.

Corral totaled 16 points, three assists and a career-high four steals while Lacia Gorman (Fort Wayne, Ind./Wayne) and Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) totaled 11 and 13 points, respectively.

The Huskies and the Cardinals were deadlocked in the first half as they finished the period tied, 23-23. It was the first time since Jan. 13, 2013 versus Ball State at the NIU Convocation Center that NIU had been tied with a foe at halftime. The Huskies lost that matchup, 57-51.

Corral was the Huskies main line of attack in the half as she closed the period with 13 points, shooting 6-for-12 from the field. NIU was 10-for-28 in the half (35.7), outshooting Ball State in the period by two percent (33.3). The teams were even on the boards as well with the teams each grabbing five offensive rebounds and 13 defensive rebounds a piece.

The Huskies and Cardinals continued to play neck-and-neck in the second half as they traded leads three times and found themselves tied three times in the period.

Ball State accrued their biggest lead of the second half with 1:26 left, thanks in part to an 8-2 run, as it led NIU, 51-43, after a jump shot by Renee Bennett.

Smith responded with a layup with 1:02 left to cut the lead to six points, 51-45. Three-straight Huskies fouls put Ball State in the bonus to force a one-and-one with Calyn Hosea at the line. Missing her first, NIU grabbed the rebound and Jenna Thorp (Hincley, Ill./Hincley-Big Rock) sunk a layup with 44 seconds left to put NIU within four points, 51-47.

Rinse, wash, repeat, the Huskies fouled the Cardinals again to force another one-and-one, this time with Candycy Ussery at the stripe. Ussery missed her first to give NIU the ball back with 40 seconds left. Only four seconds later, Gorman hit her third three-pointer of the game to bring NIU with one point with 34.1 seconds left, 51-50.

Cardinal Jill Morrison would miss the Cardinals third-straight one-and-one to give NIU the ball back with 27 seconds left.

After grabbing an offensive rebound on a missed trey by Smith, Gorman would pull the trigger quickly with three seconds left on one more three-pointer "to give ourselves a chance at a putback or one last shot" as she said in the postgame press conference.

The ball would bounce off the rim and out of bounds, and after an official review, possession was given to the Huskies with 0.3 seconds left.

Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) tossed a perfect lob pass to an unguarded Corral in the key, who caught the ball and tipped it back into the Huskies basket. However, the shot was deemed no good as time had expired, sealing the Cardinals victory, 51-50.

**DeKALB** - The NIU women's basketball team (11-14, 7-8 MAC) used team defense, ball distribution and a season-high eight three-point field goals to defeat Central Michigan (12-14, 7-8 MAC) Wednesday night at the NIU Convocation Center, 69-62.

Amada Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) scored 25 points while Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) distributed a career-high 10 assists. Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) added 16 points as well. The Huskies accounted for a season-high 20 assists in the game and eight three-point field goals.

"I'm very proud of the way this team bounced back after Saturday's loss and they showed a great mentality to overcome that and win tonight," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "Ally did a great job defensively on Crystal (Bradford) and it was the best performance I've seen against her by one of our players. She distributed the ball really well tonight, finding the open players and the gaps in CMU's defense."

The Chips hit two-straight three pointers to start the game and take a 6-0 lead. The Huskies did not sit idle for long as it rallied back, taking a 9-8 lead on a Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) layup with 16:49 left.

NIU would go on a 9-2 run to build a 18-12 lead and follow that up with 7-0 run later in the half to go on top by eight points, 25-17, with 8:22 remaining on a Trey by Lehman.

She would lead the Huskies in points (9), rebounds (6) and assists (4) as she was 4-for-8 from the field at halftime. Corral only scored seven points in the first half, allowing her to explode for 18 in the second period.

The Huskies would carry their lead through the final 20 minutes of the half, though Central Michigan knocked on the door throughout the period, coming within five minutes of NIU five times in the stanza. With 3:52 left in regulation, CMU's Aleah Swary made a three-point field goal to bring the Chips within one point, 55-54.

Northern Illinois University responded with a 7-0 run to go back up by eight as Jenna Thorp (Hinkley, Ill./Hinkley-Big Rock), Smith and Corral all attacked the paint with layups to go back up by eight with 1:48.

The Chippewas were forced to foul in the final minutes of the period, however, they sent Corral to the line nine times in the period, where she made eight of her shots in the half. Overall, Corral was 10-for-11 at the charity stripe against the Chips.

The Huskies 69-points were the most scored this season by NIU in their 15 Mid-American Conference games this season.

Lehman was just shy of the Huskies first triple-double in 20 years, finishing with nine points, 10 assists and eight rebounds. As a team, NIU dished a season-best 20 assists while only committing seven turnovers. Corral scored nine of her 25 points from behind the three-point line and finished the game 6-of-16 from the field. Smith led NIU in field goals with seven.

Lehman's 10-assist game was NIU's first since Courtney Shelton dished 12 at Indiana on Dec. 17, 2011.

After shooting .387 from the field in the first half, NIU finished with a .481 percentage in the final 20 minutes (13-for-27) to close the contest 25-for-58 for a clip of .431. Da'Jourie Turner led CMU with 20 points, followed by Crystal Bradford, who added 19 points for the Chips.

**YPSILANTI, Mich.** - The NIU women's basketball team (11-15, 7-9 MAC) fell to Eastern Michigan (16-11, 9-7 MAC) Saturday afternoon at the Convocation Center as the Eagles made two more three-pointers and two more free throws to defeat the Huskies, 60-52.

Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) led NIU with 15 points while Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) added 13 points. Renee Sladek (Merrill, Wis./Merrill) was one point shy of double-double with nine points and 10 rebounds. Danny Pulliam (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike) scored eight points with four rebounds.

With four assists in the game, Lehman surpassed the 100 assist mark for the season to become the first NIU player since Courtney Shelton in 2011-12 to dish 100-or-more assists in a season.

"It wasn't our best offensive performance today, I understand most of our turnovers but mentally from a preparation standpoint, I feel like we all have to get on the same page. Just thought we were all really random," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "I thought Danny played well, giving us great minutes and showing us what we could do on (Cha) Sweeney.

The Huskies and Eagles went back and forth in the half as the teams swapped leads seven times with five ties. Ball movement was strong for NIU in the stanza as it distributed eight assists, four of which came from the Huskies front court as Jenna Thorp (Hinkley, Ill./Hinkley) had three helpers, kicking the ball inside-out.

Lehman opened the game 3-for-3, including one field goal behind the arc to give her seven points in the half. Smith led the Huskies with nine points in the stanza, finishing 4-of-8 from the field.

Defensively, Northern Illinois University was sound through the first 20 minutes as it did not allow Eastern Michigan to lead more than two points in the half. The Eagles were only 11-for-30 from the field (.367) while forcing seven turnovers.

In the second half, Eastern Michigan built a 12 point lead with 13:38 left in the half, thanks to three three-point field goals by Sera Ozcelci in the game.

NIU played a spirited half but the double-digit deficit early in the half proved to be too much to overcome. The Huskies and the Eagles traded baskets and runs for the remainder of the second half, including two separate 6-0 runs by Northern Illinois University in the half.

Down the stretch, Thorp made three clutch baskets in the paint, one of which lifted NIU to within seven points with 4:10 left in regulation. Lehman added eight points in the half as well, going 4-for-7 from the field in 20 minutes on the court.

The sophomore finished 7-of-13 from the field with 15 points, four assists and six rebounds. Smith scored 13 on the night. The Huskies finished the second half 11-of-26 from the field for a clip of .423.

Eastern Michigan's Cha Sweeney finished with 21 points to lead EMU.

**DeKALB** - Consistent shooting and constant defensive pressure pushed the NIU women's basketball team (12-15, 8-9 MAC) past Toledo (17-11, 10-7 MAC) on Wednesday afternoon as the Huskies defeated the Rockets, 68-64. NIU caused 19 takeaways to outscore Toledo, 23-10, on turnover opportunities while Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) scored 19 of her 25 points in the second half.

Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) scored 13 points with seven assists while Jenna Thorp (Hinkley, Ill./Hinkley-Big Rock) added 10 points. In their final regular season game at the NIU Convocation Center, the senior class combined for 44 points to improve the Huskies to 9-3 at home this season.

"I'm so proud of this basketball team. How we've stayed together and how we fought with the numbers we have, I'm just so proud of them. We had two kids play 40 minutes. I think Toledo was one heck of a hot team to play today and to play as hard as we did and get this win, means a lot to us. I'm excited about what the future holds," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett.

The Huskies opened the first half with precision offensively as they made 10 of their first 20 shots in the opening 12 minutes of the game. NIU built an 11-point lead with 7:29 left in the first period and maintained a double-digit lead for most of the half until the Rockets ended the stanza on a 10-2 run.

NIU survived Toledo's late push and would enter the halftime locker room with a 30-28 lead. Lehman led the Huskies in scoring in the half with nine points. Playing in their final regular season game at the NIU Convocation Center, the Huskies seniors combined for 19 points in period. Both Corral and Thorp scored six points.

The Rockets started the second half with the same energy it ended with in the first half as they traded leads with NIU to start the period. However, the Huskie defense quelled Toledo's advance in the period as it again took an 11-point lead with 6:33 remaining, 60-49.

The Huskies and the Rockets traded a few more baskets before Toledo made one last push at a comeback, making it a one-possession game with 59 seconds left as Sophie Reecher hit two free throws, 64-61. Lehman responded with two shots at the charity stripe to put the Huskies back up by five with 51 seconds left.

A confident Inma Zanoguera sank a three-pointer seven seconds later to bring it back to a one-possession game as the Huskies then led, 66-64, with 44 seconds left. Winding the clock down, Lehman missed a three-pointer with 16 seconds left to give the Rockets the go-ahead shot with little time remaining.

The NIU defense locked up Zanoguera, forcing the Rockets to move to Ana Capotosto, who took the shot with eight seconds left and pushed the ball wide right of the basket and rim to give the Huskies the ball back with four seconds left. Corral finished with two more points at the free throw line to seal the Huskies ninth win of the home regular season, 68-64.

Corral was 7-of-8 from the field in the second half, scoring 19 points to lead NIU. She finished with 25 points, seven rebounds and four assists. It was the fourth-straight game against the Rockets she scored at least 20 points. As a team, NIU dished 19 assists in the game. The NIU defense limited Toledo to seven helpers in the game. Offensively, the Huskies shot over 46 percent both halves to finish with a .474 average (27-for-57).

**KALAMAZOO, Mich.** - In a game of back and forth runs, the NIU women's basketball (12-16, 8-10 MAC) couldn't overcome a three-point deficit with a minute to play as Western Michigan (18-11, 11-7 MAC) defeated the Huskies, 50-45.

Huskies Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart), Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) and Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) all scored in double figures with Smith leading the Huskies with 12 points and eight rebounds. Corral led NIU with three assists.

"I thought (Western Michigan) was a lot more physically and mentally tougher than we were today. When they bumped and banged us a little, it got into our head a little bit and that's the way (Western Michigan) likes to play. They're a very physical team," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett.

"We had our opportunities but we just couldn't hit that shot or get that stop when we needed to. I'm just disappointed we didn't play tougher because I know we can play better than that," Bennett added.

The opening seven minutes of the game was all NIU as it started the game on a 17-2 scoring run. While the Huskies were red hot, the Broncos were only 1-of-9 from the field to open the period. However, WMU found its rhythm as it snapped back with a 9-0 run to close the gap, 17-11.

NIU responded with two free throws from Corral and a basket from Lehman to rebuild its double-digit lead with 7:17 left in the half, 21-11. The Broncos would make one last run in the half, going on a 12-2 run to deadlock the teams at halftime, 23-23.

Corral finished the first half with a game-high 11 points and three assists. Smith registered a balanced six points and five rebounds in the opening stanza. As a team, NIU out rebounded the Broncos, 23-18, including a 5-3 advantage on the offensive boards.

Western Michigan continued its run in the second half as it built an 11-point lead with 16:16 left in regulation, 34-23. Five times in the final 10 minutes of the contest NIU chipped back to within five points, eventually coming back to within three points with a minute left as the Huskies recorded three-straight defensive stops to make it a one possession game.

In the final three minutes of the game, Northern Illinois University had its opportunities to tie or take back the lead but it finished 2-for-6 from the field while WMU was 4-for-7 at the free throw line and 0-of-2 from the field.

Both teams scored 22 points in the paint with the Huskies leading in points off turnovers, 10-7, and from second chances, 10-8. NIU also led in rebounds, 40-39, finishing with 11 offensive rebounds.

Alex Dumoulin (Hampshire, Ill./Elgin CC) finished with six rebounds and helped create at least two team rebounds on the afternoon in 22 minutes off the bench. Lehman also pulled down six rebounds in the game while Smith led the Huskies with eight.

WMU was 8-of-19 (42.1) from the free throw line while NIU was nearly perfect with a 8-for-9 (.889) clip. The Broncos had a 32-6 run over the first and second half.

**DeKALB** - The NIU women's basketball (12-17) ended its season Monday night as it fell to Central Michigan (13-17) in the First Round of the Mid-American Conference Tournament, 49-44. Down by three points, the Huskies had two shots to force overtime in the final 18 seconds of the game but were unable to convert the shots.

Ally Lehman (Nineveh, Ind./Indian Creek) recorded her third double-double of the season with 11 points and 12 rebounds while Amanda Corral (Hobart, Ind./Hobart) and Kelly Smith (Hartland, Wis./Arrowhead) added 11 and 10 points, respectively. Lehman had a game-high five assists. As a team, NIU was perfect 10-for-10 at the free throw line.

"It was a tough way to lose tonight. Central Michigan had a lot more fire and energy in them than we did tonight," said Head Coach Kathi Bennett. "I felt like we had some good looks but when we started missing outside shots, we started settling for them, instead of attacking the rim. We just couldn't find that energy that was characteristic of us all season long tonight."

The Huskies and Chippewas shot a combined 26.1 percent from the field in the first half as Central Michigan led NIU at halftime, 26-16. Northern Illinois University had an early 6-4 lead in the half until a 13-0 run by the Chips put CMU on top, 17-6. Three-pointers by Lacia Gorman (Fort Wayne, Ind./Wayne) and Lehman gave NIU life at the end of the half as it pulled within eight of CMU, 23-16.

A hook shot at the buzzer by Jas' Mine Bracey put Central Michigan back up by 10 at halftime, 26-16. Lehman finished with five points in the half while Renee Sladek scored four points. Da'Jourie Turner led the game with 10 points.

In the second half, NIU outscored Central Michigan, 28-23, twice coming within three points of the Chippewas, despite trailing by 12 points in the opening minute of the second half.

With 12:59 left in the regulation, Corral nailed two free throws to bring NIU within three points, 32-29. However, the Huskies couldn't get back over the hump as CMU responded each time NIU attempted to overcome its deficit in the final stanza.

With 1:38 left, a baseline jumper by Jenna Thorp (Hinkley, Ill./Hinkley-Big Rock) made it a three-point game, 47-44, and put the Huskies in a position to force overtime. Lehman had NIU's best look with 25 seconds left as she received a pass from the wing at the baseline corner behind the arc, but the ball pinged off the rim and into the hands of CMU.

Corral attempted one last shot with 13 seconds left but it was blocked by Aleah Swary to end the NIU threat.

Lehman and Corral led the Huskies with 11 points in the game while Lehman led in boards with 12. It was her third double-double of the season. Smith finished with 10 points in the contest. Bracey and Turner both had 14 points for Central Michigan in the game.

Tonight's win marked the third-straight season that the No. 9 seed upset the No. 8 seed in the first round of the tournament.

# WOMEN'S BASKETBALL MOVES TO A FOUR-QUARTER FORMAT

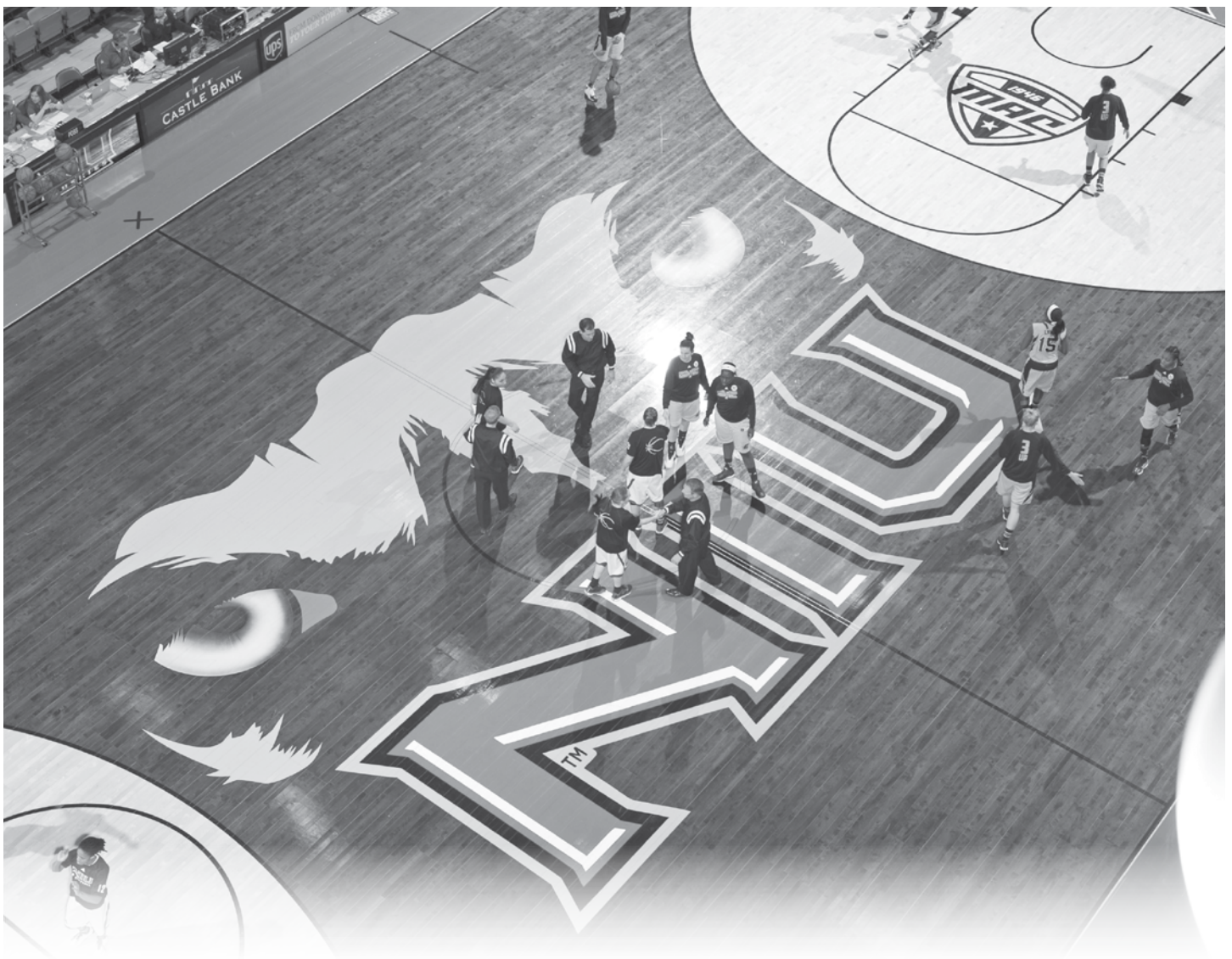
**INDIANAPOLIS** - NCAA women's basketball games will be played in four 10-minute quarters next season.

The NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel approved moving the game to the new format and away from the 20-minute halves the sport has always used in NCAA competition on a conference call today.

The NCAA Women's Basketball Rules Committee, which initially recommended the rule change, believes the four-quarter format will enhance the flow of the game. The change also was endorsed by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Board of Directors.

Teams will now reach the bonus and shoot two free throws on the fifth team foul in each quarter. Previously, teams reached a one-and-one bonus on the seventh team foul of each half and reached the double bonus (two shots) on the 10th team foul.

In the four-quarter format, team fouls reset to zero at the start of each quarter. However, if a team reaches the bonus in the fourth quarter, that team would remain in the bonus during any additional overtime periods.

### **ADVANCING THE BALL**

The panel approved a rule that allows teams to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a timeout immediately after a made basket in the last 59.9 seconds of the fourth quarter and any overtime periods.

Teams also will be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt after securing the ball from a rebound or a change of possession. In these scenarios, the ball would be inbounded at the 28-foot mark on the side of the court where the scorer's table is located.

The committee made the initial recommendation because it felt this change would add more excitement to offensive possessions at the ends of games because teams would no longer be required to travel the length of the court after inbounding the ball.

### **10-SECOND BACKCOURT EXCEPTIONS**

NCAA women's basketball implemented the 10-second backcourt rule during the 2013-14 season.

For the upcoming season, a team will not be subject to the 10-second backcourt count when a throw-in results from the following:

- The ball is deflected out of bounds by the defense.
- There is a held ball, and the possession arrow favors the offensive team.
- A technical foul is called on the offensive team while the ball is in its backcourt.

### **POST DEFENSE**

The panel approved a new rule that allows defenders to place a forearm or an open hand with a bend in the elbow on an offensive post player with the ball whose back is to the basket.

### **BANDS AND AMPLIFIED MUSIC**

In an effort to improve the overall fan experience, bands or amplified music may be played during any dead-ball situation during a women's basketball game. Previously, rules allowed music to be played only during timeouts and intermission.

### **MEDIA TIMEOUT CHANGES**

The NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel approved a new media timeout format for televised women's basketball games.

Beginning next season, media timeouts will occur at the first dead ball at or below the five-minute mark of each period and at the end of the first and third periods. Additionally, the first team-called timeout of the second half will become a media timeout.

In the new four-quarter format, teams will have four timeouts (three 30-second timeouts and one 60-second timeout). A team may use the 60-second timeout at the discretion of the coach during the first or second half of the game. Teams will be allowed to carry over three of those timeouts into the second half. Each team will be awarded one 30-second timeout in each overtime period, plus any unused timeouts remaining from the second half.

In non-televised games, teams will have five timeouts (three 30s and two 60s). Four of the timeouts can carry over to the second half.

The panel also approved a proposal that allows officials to use zeroes on the shot clock, in addition to the hearing the shot clock horn, to determine if a shot clock violation occurred at any point in the game.

## FRAZIER ON LISA CARLSEN: 'SHE'S A WINNER'

**DeKALB** – When Northern Illinois athletic director Sean Frazier introduced Lisa Carlsen as the newest women’s basketball coach on Tuesday morning, one theme kept popping up.

“She’s a winner, bottom line,” Frazier said of Carlsen, who signed a five-year deal.

Carlsen, 45, takes the reins of the Huskies women’s basketball program after going 31-3 at Lewis University – a Division II school in Romeoville – last season and helped lead the Flyers to the Elite Eight, which earned her the 2015 Women’s Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Division II National Coach of the Year.

“Looking at her body of work, she wins – and that’s a big one for me,” said Frazier, who notified Carlsen on Friday that she was offered the position.

Carlsen, who becomes the 10th coach in program history, will look to end a drought of non-winning seasons for the Huskies that dates back to 2006-07 – when they finished 19-12 overall and 8-8 in Mid-American Conference play under Carol Owens. The Huskies finished 10-6 in the MAC and 15-15 overall in 2008-09 under Owens, which was the last time they had a winning record in conference play.

“I feel like all the pieces are really in place for this program to take that next step – to fight for MAC championships and get to postseason play,” Carlsen said. “I think everything is right there for the taking.”

Carlsen said lifting the Huskies into prominence starts with bringing in a culture of higher expectations for the program but that it’s not a long-term project – that she’s ready to win immediately.

"I think it's important to establish your culture right away – and that doesn't happen overnight but I don't think it's something where you have to start from the ground up," she said. "Especially the success we've had the past three or four years, that's a lot more fun than losing, so the sooner we can win and win a lot the better."

Frazier pointed to several aspects of Carlsen that were positive reasons to hire her, including her familiarity with Chicagoland for recruiting, focus on her players to do well academically – she had a 100 percent graduation rate in her eight years at Lewis – and that she has won a lot of games in the past few years.

"We've got great momentum," Frazier said. "I think we're at a critical crossroads and we do things the right way. We have a great coach. We had to recruit the hell out of her. We really feel like we have all the pieces in place."

As a head coach, Carlsen has a career record of 184-163 in 12 seasons. She went 36-74 in four years at Nebraska Omaha (Division I) and 148-89 in eight years at Lewis. However, in the past three seasons at Lewis, the Flyers went 78-15 (.839 percent).

"Having built one of the best women's basketball programs in the nation at the Division II level, Lisa is a qualified, competent and quality hire for NIU," Lewis athletic director John Planek said. "She does a great job with her players and they like playing for her."

Carlsen said she wants to bring her up-tempo style to Northern Illinois and feels the roster has players that fit that model and that recruiting, which begins right away from the new coach, can boost the Huskies.

For Frazier, Carlsen's knowledge of the coveted Chicagoland was a major plus.

"Everybody recruits nationally in Chicago," Frazier said. "I think what we're looking for is a piece of our own. We need to make sure we have the fence up as much as we can in the state of Illinois and, frankly, Chicagoland. We want to make sure we put our best foot forward."

Now that she's behind the wheel of a Division I program, Carlsen said it may be easier to nab some of the recruits from the Chicago area.

"Hopefully I can go get some of the kids that maybe I couldn't get as Lewis, but I know who they are," she said. "I know those names, I know those programs, I know those AAU teams, or whatever it is."

The position became available after former coach Kathi Bennett unexpectedly resigned on April 29. Bennett compiled a record of 57-93 in five seasons at Northern Illinois and was 12-17 in 2014-15. The Huskies were riddled by injuries this past season – losing Natecia Augusta and Jazmine Harris before the season began.

While Frazier said he's happy the search is over and he found a coach he's excited about, he didn't want to rush the process of finding a replacement for Bennett. Carlsen, who still has loose ends to tie up like finding a place to live and schools for her four children, said she's happy the process is over and to become the newest Huskie coach.

"I'm ready to get back to work."
