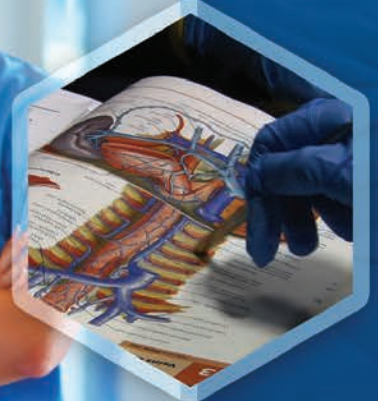

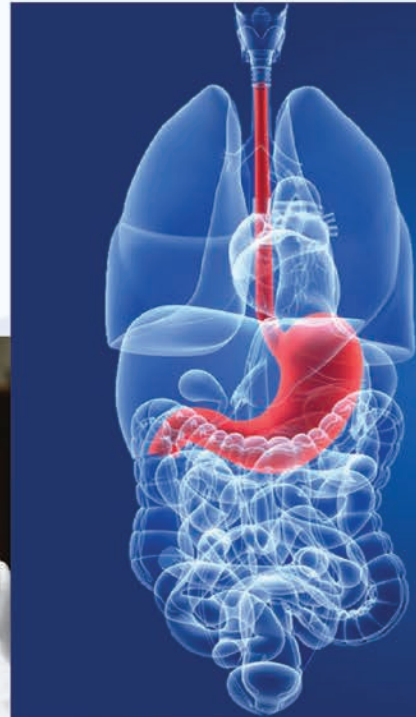


DID YOU KNOW?.....

ACCREDITATION

All Saints University College of Medicine is chartered by the Government of the Commonwealth of Dominica.

All Saints University graduates will be eligible to practice medicine in the United States, Canada, United Kingdom or any country that recognizes the FAIMER International Medical Education Directory and WHO/AVICENNA Directory of Medical Schools.

All Saints University is comprised of student from North America, South America, Africa, Asia, Australia and Europe.



APPLICATION

Application Overview & Acceptance

Grades are not the only criteria for acceptance. The Admissions Committee looks for student participation in volunteer and extra-curricular activities. Motivation and perseverance are some of the attributes considered when selecting an applicant.

For MD Professional Program Applicants

The members of the admissions committee will consider various factors in the evaluation process. For students from North America, MCAT is optional but highly recommended.

BSc and Completion of Prerequisite Courses

Students with the necessary prerequisites can gain entry directly into the 4 year MD degree program.

BA or BSc Without Completion of Prerequisites

Student without the fundamental science courses, but having university courses equivalent to some of the prerequisites, can transfer the credits and complete the remaining required courses through the premedical component. For example, if a student has Mathematics and English, he or she can transfer the credits and complete the missing prerequisites such as Physics, Chemistry or Biology through the premedical component. The length of the Premedical program will be shortened accordingly. All prerequisites must be completed prior to entering the 4 year MD degree program.

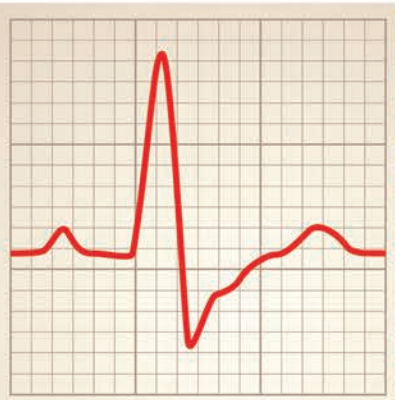

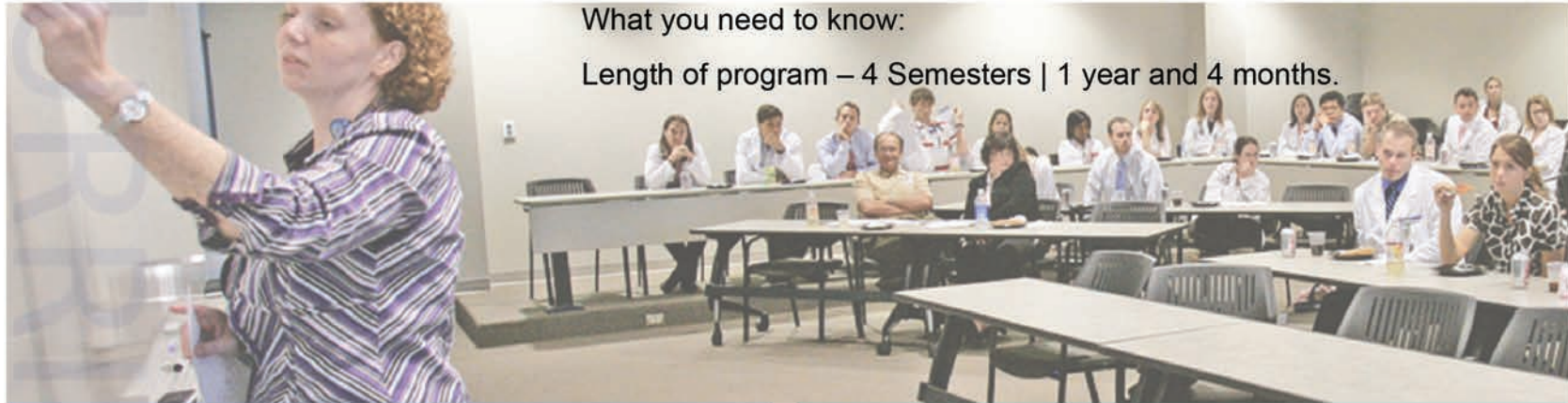
4 Year MD | 5 Year MD

The 4 year MD degree program is designed for applicants who have a Bachelors degree in the Sciences or the necessary prerequisites.

It consists of 2 academic years of Basic Sciences followed by 2 more years of Clinical Clerkships. Basic Sciences are conducted in our campus in Dominica. Clinical clerkships take place in teaching hospitals in various locations including the USA, Canada, Dominica, St. Vincent, and the UK.

If you are a recent High School graduate and are interested in getting direct admission into Medicine, then the 5-year MD degree program is the most suitable option. This program consists of 2 academic years (4 semesters) of premedical courses followed by the 4-year MD degree program. Students are exposed to medical topics early in their education for a seamless transition into the Basic Medical Sciences.

Years 3 & 4

In the third and fourth years, students become directly involved in the care and study of patients. They begin to work with members of team caring for hospitalized patients. Third year students rotate through the following clerkships:

Internal Medicine
 General Surgery
 Pediatrics
 Psychiatry
 Obstetrics/Gynecology
 Family Practice



The fourth year consists of a minimum 24 weeks of electives. The clerkship-program is designed to help students further discover where their interests lie when choosing their postgraduate training. The clerkship program introduces the student to the many areas of medicine, enhancing both their differential diagnostic, treatment and management skills.

Clinical faculty members evaluate the students' performance in every rotation. Personal and professional attitudes, appearance, knowledge and performance are some of the criteria evaluated during each rotation. The university always maintains high academic standards for its students and these same high standards are used in evaluating students at affiliated teaching hospitals. A student whose achievements are not up to these standard is informed as early as possible during a rotation and given assistance and counselling.

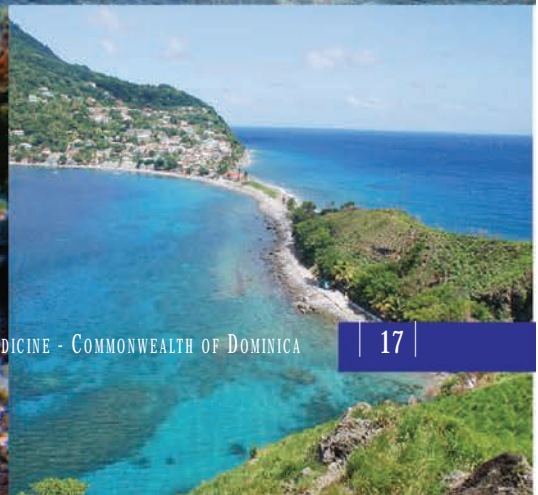

INTERNAL MEDICINE

In this clerkship, students learn the steps necessary for proper diagnosis and treatment of patients. Students learn how to take complete medical, personal & family histories, do a diagnostic work-up and develop a plan for managing a patient's immediate care.

They participate in clinical conferences where they learn to report their findings and logical conclusions.

Duration: 12 weeks

GENERAL SURGERY

In the course of the surgery clerkship, students learn about conditions requiring surgical intervention and have opportunities to observe how surgical patients are managed. In the process, they become familiar with the policies and procedures followed in the operating room.

Duration: 12 weeks

OB /GYN

In Obstetrics & Gynecology, students learn about the changes that take place during pregnancy, labor, delivery and the post-partum period. They also become familiar with diagnosis and treatment of major gynaecological diseases and various methods of family planning.

Duration: 6 weeks



PEDIATRICS

During the pediatrics clerkship, students acquire special skills and knowledge required for the examination, diagnosis and treatment of infants, children and adolescents.

Duration: 6 weeks

PSYCHIATRY

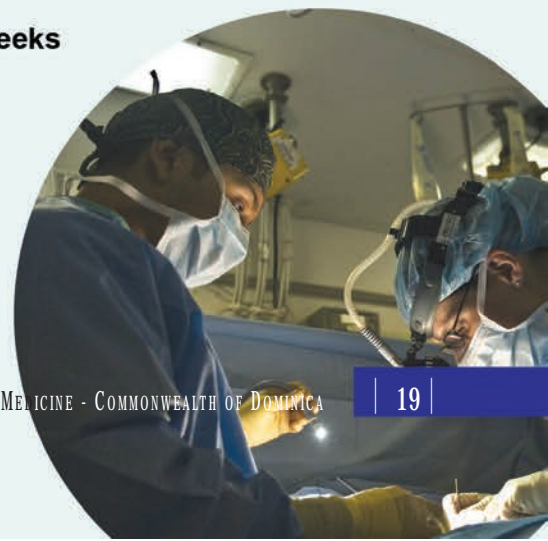
In this clerkship, students become familiar with the major categories of mental disorders, including diagnosis and some methods of therapy. In the process, they learn how to take a psychiatric history and evaluate a person's mental status.

Duration: 6 weeks

FAMILY PRACTICE

In family Practice, students acquire an understanding of the principles of Primary Care and of how these principles apply in community practice. Emphasis is placed on continued and comprehensive health care for people of both sexes and all ages within the context of their families, social groups and communities. Particular attention is paid to the diagnosis and treatment of common medical problems and to help with maintenance, ambulatory care and the continuity of care.

Duration: 6 weeks



FEES & FINANCES.....

All students pay an application fee of US\$100.00 and an enrollment/administrative fee of US\$1,000.00 at the beginning of a course of study at All Saints University. If fees are not paid on time, deregistration may occur and US\$250.00 penalty will be applied upon reinstatement. Returning students are required to pay tuition fees one month prior to the beginning of the semester or a US\$250.00 late payment fee will be charged.

CITIZENS OF DOMINICA ARE AWARDED A 50% TUITION SCHOLARSHIP.

Any student who is absent for two terms without providing a written request and without obtaining prior approval from the University is subject to academic sanction or dismissal at the University's discretion. The dismissal report will appear in the student's academic records.

Students Government Fee

Every student is a member of the central student government. An additional US\$150.00 student government fee is to be paid annually at the beginning of every year along with the tuition fee payment to cover the annual Student Government Fee of US\$50.00 per semester.

Additional General Costs – Food and Lodging

Food and lodging can range from US\$500.00 to US\$1,000.00 per month depending on individual habits and preferences. Housing expenses usually vary depending on the type of apartment preferred and if you are sharing with roommates.

When sharing an apartment, rent prices can be as low as US\$300.00/mnth



..... FEES & FINANCES MD-5 YEAR PROGRAM

The breakdown of fees for the 5-year MD Degree program is outlined below. Please note that all fees are in US Dollars. All students pay an application fee of US\$100.00 and an enrolment/ administrative fee of US\$1,000.00 at the onset or beginning of a course of study at All Saints University. Students are also required to pay US\$100.00 for insurance and US\$50.00 as a mandatory per semester Students Government Fee. Any student who is absent for two terms without providing written request and without obtaining prior approval from the University administration is subject to academic sanction or dismissal at the University's discretion; this will appear in the academic records of the student.

MISCELLANEOUS

Student Insurance

The government requires that students obtain proper health insurance before they arrive on the island. There will be no exceptions to this requirement.

www.InternationalStudentInsurance.com provides various links that may assist you in your search for the right insurance plan.

Indemnity/Malpractice Insurance during Clinical Rotations

All students are responsible for obtaining malpractice insurance prior to commencement of their clinical rotations. All Saints will assist students with information concerning insurance companies which provide this service. Please note that the cost of malpractice insurance is not included in the tuition fees. The cost is approximately US\$900.00 – US\$1,200.00 per year.

Tuition Refund Policy

A request for withdrawal must be submitted in writing, authorized by the Dean of Academic Affairs to the Director of Administration. The amount of refund for students who withdraw from the school in any semester is:

- 80% refund if enrolled for two weeks or less
- 60% refund if enrolled for three weeks or less
- 40% refund if enrolled for four weeks or less

The date of withdrawal is counted from the date of receipt of the withdrawal letter.



INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

SNAPSHOT

Students who are not Canadian or American students are considered international students. Equivalent qualifications for university admissions in their respective countries will be acceptable. Applicants will be evaluated on an individual basis. All Saints University has a growing international student population from many different countries including Germany, Australia, the Bahamas, Brazil, Cameroon, Colombia, Nigeria, Ghana, India, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Taiwan, etc...

TUITION

The fee structure is the same as the fee structure for US/Canadian citizens.

All international students are required to pay one year tuition fee (first three semesters) prior to the commencement of the program.

The refund policy is the same for all students. On acceptance students are required to submit the following to process their Visas. Transit Visas may be necessary for traveling to Dominica through some countries.

Health Clearance from the country of origin
(should include TB and HIV test reports)

.....TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer Students

All Saints University may accept students intending to transfer from other accredited medical schools. Transcripts will be evaluated by the Admissions Committee in order to determine eligibility.

Transfer Policy for Students transferring into the All Saints University MD Degree Program

Original copies of transcripts of academic records from previous medical school(s), colleges or universities must be submitted. Original copies will also be required later by the ECFMG before a student can sit for the USMLE and when applying for the residency match.

Advanced standing will be given only to students transferring from accredited medical schools and/or schools listed in the International Medical Education Directory (IMED).

The University does not award credits for Basic Medical Sciences courses completed online, through distance education or from non-accredited medical schools or schools not listed in the IMED.

In certain cases, a student who has successfully completed Basic Medical Sciences and passed USMLE may be allowed to transfer into the Clinical Phase of the MD degree program.

Transfer Policy for Students presently enrolled in a ASU Program

If a student of the University intends to withdraw from the medical school, he/she must submit in writing notice of such an intention at least one semester (4 months) prior to the date of withdrawal from the University, stating reasons. Failure to comply with this automatically means that the student will be considered enrolled in the program for the following semester and must meet all of his/her financial and other obligations to the University.

Notice of withdrawal from the University received in less than one semester (4 months) to the time of withdrawal will not be entertained and such a student will be deemed to be indebted to the University for the following semester.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS.....

To be eligible to receive the MD degree of All Saints University, students must complete ALL the graduation requirements of the medical School as listed below'

1. Successful completion of 5 semesters of Basic Medical Sciences.
2. Successful completion of 72 weeks of approved clinical clerkships/rotations at affiliated or approved teaching hospitals.
3. Successful completion of a National Board of Medical Examinations (NBME) administered exit examination for Basic and Clinical Sciences, or;
4. Successful completion of the United States Medical Licensing Exam (USMLE). In lieu of the USMLE a student may complete the MCCEE conducted by the Medical Council of Canada.



In exceptional circumstances, a student may be permitted to skip any of the above-mentioned examinations (USMLE/MCCEE) provided he/she completes comparable examinations by a national examination body of the country where the student intends to practice. This will be treated on a case by case basis.

5. A student must be in good standing. He/she must receive clearance from the different departments of the University including the student accounts department, the registry, laboratories and the library. He/she must also be of good conduct and character.

Geography

Dominica is an island nation that is roughly 289.5 square miles (750 km²) with a population of roughly 70,000. The capital is Roseau. Dominica is largely covered by rainforest and is home to the world’s second-largest hot spring, Boiling Lake. Dominica has many waterfalls, springs, and rivers. The Calibishie area in the country’s northeast has sandy beaches. Some plants and animals thought to be extinct on surrounding islands can still be found in Dominica’s forests.

Climate

Be prepared to bask in a tropical climate with the warmest months between June and September when temperatures can reach an average high of 30 degrees celsius. You will also be kept cool by the lovely trade winds that provide a welcoming breeze all year round. The months between December and May provide a cooler climate that is pleasant.
