

Nordic Combined Season Highlight

- 3 days, 3 competitions, 1 winner
- 100.000 € of Prize Money
- 200 World Cup points for the overall winner (double the amount of a normal World Cup competition)

Competition Format

- 28.01.2016 Provisional Competition Round
- 29.01.2016 Ind. Gundersen: 1 jump, 5 km
- 30.01.2016 Ind. Gundersen: 1 jump, 10 km
- 31.01.2016 **Final Ind. Gundersen:** 2 jumps, 15 km
- After the Prologue, the number of competitors will be reduced to 50, after the Individual Gundersen only the Top 30 ranked athletes of the TRIPLE standings are allowed to start
- As in any stage race, the athletes will take their results with them from day to day.
- The first athlete to reach the finish line on Day 3 is the overall winner.

Attractive Side Events

- Thursday, 28.01. at 20:00 Start Ziesel-Promi-Race in the city centre
- Friday, 29.01., from 19:00: Ö3 Disco at the Seefelder Pavillon
- Saturday 30.01., from 18:00: Seefelder Kristallzauber with Gregor Glanz, featuring an appearance of the best Nordic Combined athletes in the world, Pavillon Seefeld
- Sunday, 31.01., 18:00: ORF Sport am Sonntag "live" from the Casino Arena Seefeld

 3. Akito Watabe (JPN)



The column "points" indicates the results of Day 1, converted in minus points for the jumping event at the beginning of Day 2



The white box above the name indicated the current TRIPLE rank. The minus points are directly calculated in the ski jumping score



The score shown after the jump is the final score. The minus points from the previous day are already deducted.

In case the athlete takes the lead, the box above his name will turn green (as shown above)

The digits in the box indicate the time advantage he has on the current second-placed athlete for the race.

The Venue



The ski jumping rounds are held on the HS 109 Toni-Seelos-Olympiaschanze

The cross-country races take place on a 2.5 km lap in the Casino Arena Seefeld: 2 laps of 2.5 km on Day 1, 4 laps of 2.5 km on Day 2 and 6 laps of 2.5 km on Day 3)
