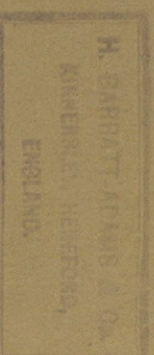

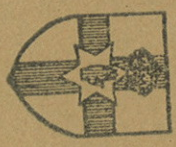

PREFACE

Early this year, Dr. Percy Rendall, who had specialised in the stamps of Great Britain for some 30 years, sought my advice as to the disposal of part of his collection. Eventually I purchased a portion, including one volume dealing mainly with the "1844" and subsequent cancellations.

It seemed a pity to break up a collection which had taken many years to bring to its present state and which, when added to my own, formed a most interesting study. After a little pressure, Dr. Rendall agreed to compile a list of certain numbers and varieties which were evidently scarce and details of some of which had never been recorded.

At that time it was my intention to publish merely a small list of these scarcer items, but the lists which Dr. Rendall gave me only touched the fringe of a very wide subject, and eventually I decided to enlarge the scope of the work, and after many months the result is before you. That it is incomplete I am fully aware, that there are mistakes I do not doubt, but owing to the fact that lists of the numbers allocated to the various towns are unobtainable in published form at a popular price, I believe that, if only for that reason, this book will fill a decided want.

All the Post Office official lists and records (incomplete and out of order in parts, and one London section still missing) from 1856 to date—some issued only for official use—have been through my hands, and assistance rendered through the G.P.O. Record Office must therefore be duly acknowledged.

The work of my friend Mr. Daniels, "History of British Postmarks" (1898), was a fine pioneer effort, and to him British students owe a deep debt of gratitude. In 1905, the late Mr. T. Whitworth, secretary of the Postmark Society, published "A List of Obliterating Numbers used at the Post Office," and this work proved the basis of much that has been written since that date. To the late Mr. J. G. Hendy, who was curator of the Record Room at the General Post Office, London, we owe an even greater debt.

Mr. Hendy's first work (1905) was, "The History of the Early Postmarks of the British Isles, from their introduction down to 1840." Mr. Hendy's second volume (1909) was "The History of the Postmarks of the British Isles from 1840-1876. Compiled chiefly from Official Records."

This second volume therefore covers a field which must interest my present readers, but the book, like the others mentioned, is now practically unobtainable. It is a wonderful record and should be consulted on all points except the numbered lists, which, in view of later information, and the further official records, are, of course, not up-to-date.

In 1926 that well-known philatelist and student of British Postal History, Mr. C. F. Dendy Marshall, issued his sumptuous work, "The British Post Office from its Beginning to the End of 1925." I have read every word of it with the greatest interest, and only wish that the price were a more "popular" one. Apart from the general scope of this excellent work, the lists of Postmarks contain an extraordinary amount of information regarding the dates of the opening and closing of offices, and the serious philatelist should certainly consult the work, for I know from experience how useful a book it is.

Where my information, or lack of same, has been questioned (especially regarding the lists of towns and numbers), I have had to rely upon Mr. Dendy Marshall's book, as being the latest published.

From Mr. J. B. Seymour, who does not pose as a postmark specialist, but whose general philatelic knowledge is profound, I have received encouraging help, and to him, I, in common with all philatelists, owe a debt of gratitude.

I am particularly grateful to Mr. E. Egly, for the loan of two volumes of his "MSS. Notes on British Postmarks since 1844." These copious notes were circulated among the members of the Postmark Club. As the members included several well-known collectors such as Daniels, Dendy Marshall,

Raynor, Badgley, Merrington, among others, each one adding their comments and additions to the notes, I have been able to extract much supplementary information. These two volumes are unique, and should be preserved most carefully.

I am indebted to Mr. Charles Nissen for much that has appeared in his House Organ; and also to Mr. H. F. Johnson, who has at times given me valuable hints not only for this work but also in the formation of my British General collection.

From various other friends I have received help and encouragement, but especially from my old friend, Dr. Percy Rendall, who has been keen and helpful, and it was owing mainly to his enthusiasm that I embarked on this work, which is now completed. I would mention that, except when otherwise stated, all postmarks have been reproduced from specimens in my own collection; and, as a final word, I wish to express my indebtedness to my daughter, who has drawn every postmark by hand and who has shown a keenness in the work which has greatly encouraged me. I can go so far, unknown to her, as to advise any reader requiring similar accuracy and neatness, to secure her services.

I shall appreciate correspondence and constructive criticism at all times, but I would draw particular attention to the note on page 14. And now please turn to my "Final" word at the end of the book.

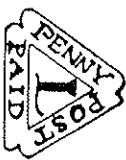

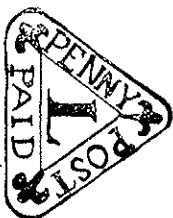

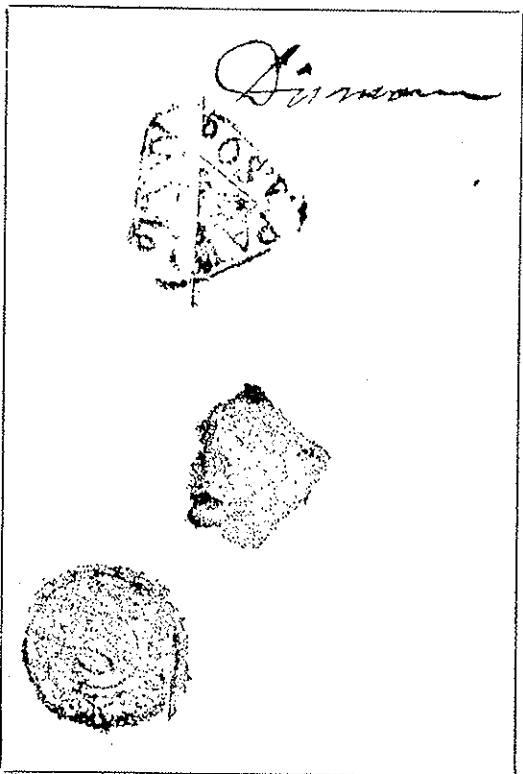
Earliest type (24th May, 1678).

INTRODUCTION TO BRITISH POSTMARKS

A study of the postal markings from about 1661 to 1840, when adhesive stamps were introduced, together with the so-called "Maltese" Cross cancellation, is such a wide field that it will probably never be covered completely. A study of these will well repay the philatelist or student of British Postal History.

There are thousands of different kinds of markings and types from which gradually evolved the post mark as we know it to-day, the most widely now used being that of the automatic cancelling machine with the date and lines as shown on page 11.

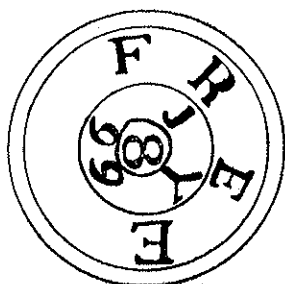
Even after stamps were introduced for some years (in fact up to 1865), there remained a system by which correspondence could be sent through the post either "Paid" (in cash) or "Free" (franked), a Crown in the design signifying Government correspondence. [A few merely typical markings are illustrated in the following pages.] Somewhat similar arrangements exist at the present time for correspondence in bulk.

After the Maltese Cross came the district numbers, and it will be noticed that there is a great similarity throughout. In the London Suburban, for example, there are some four or five types which are found throughout the whole series, but their variations are many.

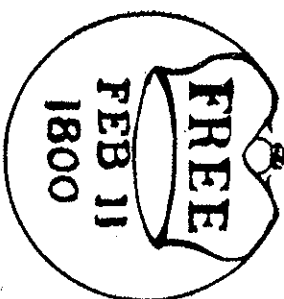
Broadly speaking, the marks for England and Wales were round or oval, those for Scotland were oblong, and the Irish were diamond shaped, whilst "Foreign" postmarks usually had a letter in front of a number. [It is quite impossible to deal with the hundreds of variations and exceptions to the general rules, and in some cases the reproduction of postmarks show details exaggerated purposely to help the less advanced student of the subject.]

As with everything else, common-sense must be used in postmark collecting. For example, the Maltese Cross which was used before the adoption of the "1844" type of postmark must necessarily be scarce or even rare on the stamps of a later issue, and those town and other markings which should have appeared only on the envelope must of course be scarce if on the stamps themselves.

A red postmark on a red stamp is a rare item. Then again, as the instructions were to cancel each stamp separately, it is unusual to find, say, a pair of early stamps with only one postmark. Naturally postal business increased, as is reflected by the number of stamps issued, therefore as a general rule the earlier the stamp, or even the plate number, the scarcer the postmark is.



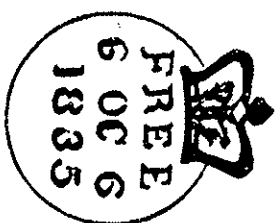

Crown indicating Government correspondence.



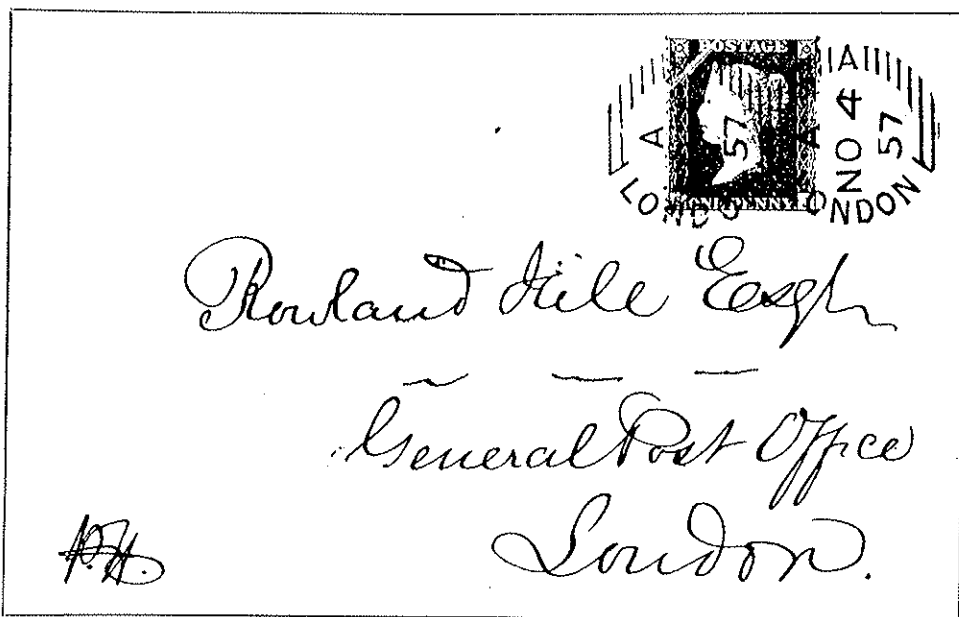
The earliest type: nearest approach to present postmark.



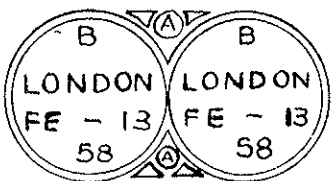

Showing mileage from London to determine charges to be paid. (Discontinued 1829.)

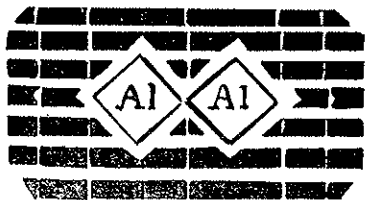
EARLY MACHINE CANCELLATIONS



Envelope addressed by Pearson Hill, the inventor of this cancelling machine, to his father, Rowland Hill. The date (Nov. 4th, '57) has been stated to be the first day of official use. Cancellations are, however, known earlier. The author's earliest dated copy is Sept. 26th, 1857.

THE MALTESE CROSS

(Sometimes called "Croix Patée.")

With the advent of adhesive stamps, in 1840, came the decision to use "obliterators," as, of course, it was necessary to cancel the stamps to prevent them being used again, and the so-called "Maltese" Cross cancellation was adopted. At first red ink was used, and was followed by black. On Penny Blacks the black cancellation is somewhat the scarcer, whilst on the 2d. Blue there seems little difference in comparative scarcity.

The instructions to the postmasters as to the composition of the ink to be used were often not carried out exactly, so that various shades exist, some of which are scarce, or even rare.

Early in February, 1841, the black ink came into general use, and the red cancellation on the last two plates of the 1d. Black (10 and 11) is decidedly scarce.

Blue (e.g., Preston, Truro, etc.) and violet cancellations, varying in shades, are also known on both the 1d. Black and the 2d. Blue, but when the 1d. Red and 2d. Blue of 1841 came into use the red cancellation was seldom used.

Being hand-cut, the Maltese Cross varies considerably, and those which were used at some places were probably made locally.

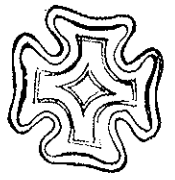
At the London Chief Office, Maltese Crosses with numbers in the centre from 1 to 12 were in use, the tops of all except number 3 being marked with a small cross. The size of the number varies somewhat, especially with number 1. Impressions with a dot in the centre were in use not only in London, but in other places. Solid centres and other varieties are known, but some are caused by the irregular surfaces of the envelopes and in but few cases can any definite opinion be given as to the places of origin when off cover.

The G.P.O. records show that numbers 1 to 6 (except 3) were issued on 23rd March, 1843, and 7 to 12 on 1st April, 1843. They were probably used by individual stampers, and a pair of 2d. Blues is known cancelled with 11 on one stamp and 12 (?) on the other.

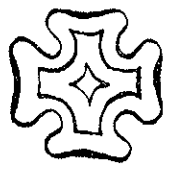
The type (not illustrated) showing a nick on each of the four sides of the cross, is now believed to have been in use at Mullingar.

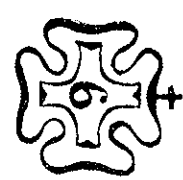

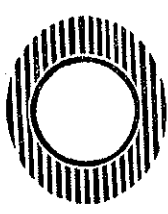

AUTHOR'S NOTE

Note.—The Author is quite aware that he may be criticised for not discriminating fully between single and duplex postmarks. This work deals, however, with the markings intended for the stamps, and not on other parts of the envelope, although he fully appreciates the importance of the latter—and the difficulty of obtaining sufficient material. The first illustration in each of the following London Districts is a single obliterater.

The Author most strongly advises collecting the whole of the postmark (date and obliterater), whenever possible; but the difficulty of obtaining sufficient entire envelopes makes a complete collection of them impossible, and therefore stamps either on or off pieces of the envelope are the next best thing.

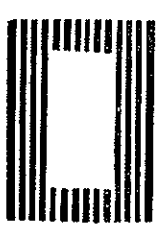

LONDON POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS

(After 1844)

The beginner, and in fact the more advanced at times, finds it somewhat difficult to understand the Post Office arrangements as to the marking of letters in the early days of postmarks as generally known and a few words of explanation may be desirable.

In May 1844—that is after the Maltese Cross Postmark period—there were two entirely separate and distinct departments:—

1.—The General Post, afterwards called the

LONDON INLAND OFFICE

which dealt with the letters for London Inland, the Provinces and for abroad. These were date-marked somewhere on the envelope, either at the G.P.O. or at the offices in Lombard Street, Charing Cross, Old Compton Street, or Bow, and the stamps were obliterated with the Diamond mark with a number in the centre and were then sorted.

2.—The Old Penny Post, afterwards called the

LONDON DISTRICT OR SUBURBAN POST.

Letters posted in London for this post, working on a 12-mile radius from the G.P. (then in Lombard Street), were postmarked with a **Circular** mark, as shown on page 22.

The two departments were for economy and easier management amalgamated in 1854 at which time the numbers of certain suboffices were rearranged and others added. The Duplex form of marking came into full use, the dating and obliterating being thus done in one operation at the office of origin.

THE INLAND OFFICE TYPE (May 1844) SOMETIMES CALLED THE LONDON CITY TYPE

For some three years the Maltese Cross was in use, but as it was practically impossible to decide at which Post Office any particular letter had been posted, if the date stamp on another part of the envelope was not legible, it was decided in 1844 to supply numbered obliterators to every post office at which letters were postmarked, hence the term "1844" Cancellations. Dated postmarks were still added elsewhere on the envelope.

First of all a single obliterator was used. In 1853 the well-known Duplex postmark (name of Post Office, date and other details and number combined) came into use, and the whole of the necessary details were thus stamped in one operation.

This operation obviated the necessity of turning over the letters on the back of which the date stamp had, up to then, been separately applied.

It is interesting to note that "Duplex" is not a term used by Post Office employees. It was known as "Combined" Obliterator. There were in fact triple obliterators as well as the "Duplex"—in the latter the obliterator and



date stamps were usually made together, and in other cases the two were hinged or slotted together, and if desired could be used separately. This accounts for the faulty adjustments and the different spacings between date stamp and obliterator, which are so noticeable in No. 53 (G.P.O. type), and especially in Scottish marks and the Scottish types of Carlisle and Newcastle-on-Tyne. A Twin obliterator is also known—two numbers joined together in the centre (Nos. 45 to 47). The Triple obliterator was first used in 1854 (Nos. 48 and 49).

Numbered Postmarks, which were in full use till about 1879, continued long after the period covered by this book (i.e., Plate Numbers), although many of the designs were altered or modified and many mistakes in numbers can be found. To show that they have not entirely ceased to be used, an envelope is in the Author's collection, dated 18th Oct., 1935, at Manchester, and the stamps are cancelled by the old 498 obliterator—the original number given to that Post Office on 1st May, 1844. These old numbered obliterators are now used to deface the stamps which have inadvertently escaped the automatic cancelling machine. The same remarks apply to the use in various places of the naval obliterators used in the Great War (1914-18) which, not being now needed on ships or abroad, have been distributed to various places for general use.]

Originally the numbers were 1 to 20, but on 2nd March, 1847, a new set, differing somewhat as to the number of lines, etc., was brought in from 1 to 22 and later, (March, 1851) to 31 (except 9) and still later to 38 and to 44 (end of 1853) just before the Perforated stamps appeared which accounts for the difficulty collectors have in obtaining copies of the later numbers on Imperfs. (The numbers 48 and 49 have been dealt with elsewhere and are joined numbers, double or triple for the first time.)

Early in 1855 the series was extended from 50 to 75, but there appeared to be no definite record of 61 and 66 and the 61, seen in some collections, is probably 19 (inverted). Nos. 76 to 78 were used in London to 1857 for "Too Late" letters.

(It is about this time that the official records are incomplete and some of the other records are slightly inaccurate, and it is only by the study of entire or pieces showing date markings that any complete records can be made.)

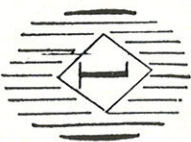
Throughout the whole period the Post Office have realized the possibilities as to confusion of 6 and 9 in various forms and combinations and, at times, have endeavoured consistently to eliminate somewhat and have even tried methods such as dots at the top or side to discriminate between the two. In about 1860 the well-known Diamond type (as illustrated but with variation) came into use for the City office.



This runs from 1 to 74 on imperf. to about No. 42 and on early perforated stamps.
 AUTHOR'S NOTE: Very valuable articles on London Obliterations, fully illustrated, by Mr. H. C. Westley, appeared in April 1924 and these should be in the hands of all collectors. (See Bibliography.)



Later came the thickened bars from 1 to 107 in various sizes, the 75 illustrated being part of a Duplex with hexagonal datemark.

In 1862 a new type of obliteration (as illustrated, with variation) was brought into use at the G.P.O. (Inland office).

This was for Nos. 12 and 13 which are now known to have been used at the Foreign Branch and 14 and 15 at the Registered department and the same type also for No. 52 to 74 (except 66 which was omitted probably to avoid confusion with a future No. 99) was used at the Inland Newspaper office and for this reason, examples are somewhat difficult to obtain (the Author, has, in fact, only two in his collection).

CRIMEAN POSTMARKS



War was declared 28th March, 1854, and whilst at the commencement there were certain rather haphazard postal arrangements, the first official Post Office appears to have been opened in November, 1854. This was close about the middle of 1857. Of the two postmarks illustrated the first much the scarcer. The single and triple cancellations (48 and 49, and perhaps others) are now known to have been applied in London. The numbers are not necessarily "Crimea," although they often appear on letters



from the troops. They are known on letters unconnected with the war and were made more easily to cancel correspondence, often in official hands from overseas, and usually bearing three or more stamps. These figures 48 and 49, vary in size, and No. 42 is also known used on January 26th, 1854. Other numbers are also known on "Crimean" letters.



This is a rough, very large London type of a much later date and must not be confused with the smaller Diamond marks of the Crimean period.

LONDON AND SUBURBAN TYPES

The old Twopenny Post (letters delivered for 2d. within a radius of 12 miles from G.P.O., which, 100 years ago, was in Lombard St.), was re-named London District Post on 20th May, 1844, and the practically circular type of postmarks were allotted each with a number in a circle.

The numbers were 1 to 70, but probably to prevent confusion with 6 and 16 the numbers 9 and 19 were omitted until later. Thus there were really only 68 numbers in all and 71 and 72 (making 70 numbers in all) were added later.

The numbers 1 to 49 were used at suburban offices as will be seen by the adjoining lists and it will be noted that 42 to 49 were definitely for central offices.

It is well-known that examples of these numbers are very scarce and the general postal system should be remembered. Letters received at district offices were, as a general rule, sent to the Chief office for marking and despatch; they were marked with the diamond shaped obliteration for Provincial and Foreign and the circular one for London and District (12-mile radius, as the old 2d. Post). This was the general rule, but as was undoubtedly done before 1844, it was the custom in at least some district offices to mark letters (1 to 49) for their own district and in some cases adjacent districts with their own obliteration and deliver them without being sent to Chief office first.

Now it is noticed on the official lists that, broadly speaking, the numbers were divided into groups called "roads" or "rides" as follows:—

1.	Nos. 1-3.	6.	Nos. 18-23.
2.	" 4-6.	7.	" 24-26.
3.	" 7-11.	8.	" 27-30.
4.	" 12, 13 and 17.	9.	" 31-36.
5.	" 14-16.	10.	" 37-41.

and central offices, Nos. 42-49.

That is to say in group 7, for example, Nos. 24 (Dulwich), 25 (Sydenham) and 26 (Beckenham) were all within an easy "ride." But it must also be remembered that there would be comparatively few letters posted in, say, Sydenham for Beckenham as a private messenger or a personal call would, in those days, be cheaper and even quicker. The post boy also would only take those letters which were on his route to London and, of course, only at his stated hours of departure whereas he would deliver those letters which he received from the Chief office on his way back in the opposite direction.

There are apparently no records of definite instructions as to the procedure mentioned which appears to have been adopted generally. Now the date stamp (as distinct from the obliterator) was generally used with blue or other coloured ink and as there was only one inked pad in use at the local office, the occasional local obliteration also appeared in colour. A few examples are known of letters from districts other than local bearing the early number obliterations, but these are probably the few which escaped cancellation at Chief office.



Nos. 1-49 (except 9 and 19) were sent to Suburban offices.

No. 50 was allotted to the Chief office.

" 51 Registered department.

" 59 Unpaid department.

(The Author has reason to believe that 50, 51 and 59 were put into use about the end of 1848. Entries, however, exist with Nos. 51 and 59, which were not Registered or Unpaid.)

Nos. 52-72 (except 59) were used at the E.C. Sorting office.

The records show that No. 59 is an elongated type of centre and surround was allotted to Chief office and a few days later 60, 61 and 62, in the same type were sent to Kibbourn, Willesden and Harrow.

There is also a type with centre circular but surround elongated and with one line over the inside circle which is well-known and which certainly runs from 52 to 59, except that whereas 56 is omitted 65 is known and it has been suggested that a mistake had been made.

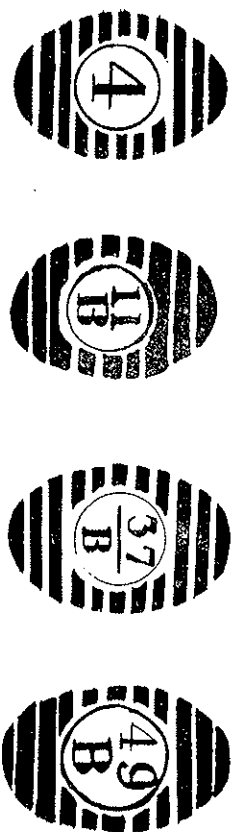
Later (1850-51?) a variation of type, practically circular and with fewer side lines was brought into use at the E.C. office with numbers 71-79 and also for a few early Suburban numbers (1 to 49), but exactly which ones, there appears to be no record, but 59 is noted on a much later date.

The same numbers (71-79) were issued in 1855 for the use of E.C. sorters but of a type with a smaller centre and with more short radiating lines. (No. 50 of this type is recorded but is believed to have been issued later, probably to replace a "No. 50" of an earlier type damaged or mislaid.) The numbers 79-82 are known in type with much larger lettering.

The records show that on September 1st, 1860, Nos. 63 to 70 and 93 to 98 (except 96) were sent to E.C. office but there seems no trace of the reason and examples of their use are rare. No. 96 is, however, known used in 1878.

The year 1863 saw another change, this time from elongated to upright oval (Duplex).

LONDON SUBURBAN



Above are illustrations of several types of the London Suburban Postmarks showing size and variety of surrounds. There are, of course, other varieties but those illustrated show the main features with the circular centre. The original 1844 list was 1 to 49 for Suburban offices. As a general rule, in the following list where 2 or more names are given, the first office received the original number, but later that office was given another designation which can often be found in the list of English numbers as distinct from London. The original number was usually transferred to some other office newly opened, Post Office.

Later all numbers from 1 to 53 (except 50) were duplicated by the addition of the letter "B" whilst 31A also existed later still. The letter "C" is found below Nos. 37 and 38 but whether 35C was also used has never been proved.

The 1874 official list gives numbers from 1 to 76 and later 77 to 90 were added, but these were only used as tax marks and not for obliterations.

LONDON DISTRICTS

In 1855 London was divided into ten Districts as follows: N., N.E., E., S., S.E., S.W., W., N.W. and Eastern Central and Western Central.

N.E. and S. were abolished in 1874 (although the former is still in use to-day as a district designation).

In the following lists these districts are, for more easy reference, put in order of N., S., E., W. Of course, these postmarks mostly appear on 1d. red plate numbers but seldom appear on imperfs. or the early star issues.

SPECIAL NOTE.—Many varieties exist, including some of those illustrated either with or without surrounding circle. Many of the postmarks are "Too Late."

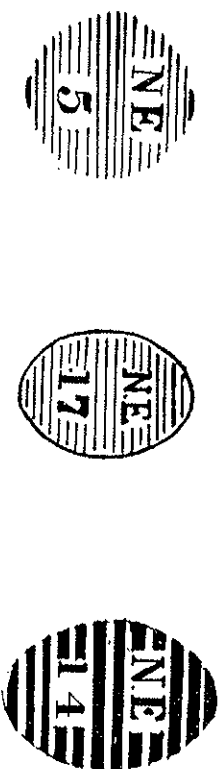


N.

The thin line type (No. 1) is certainly known 1 to 14; No. 2 is an early type. The commonest (on Plate Nos.) is No. 3. There is also the circular type (No. 4).

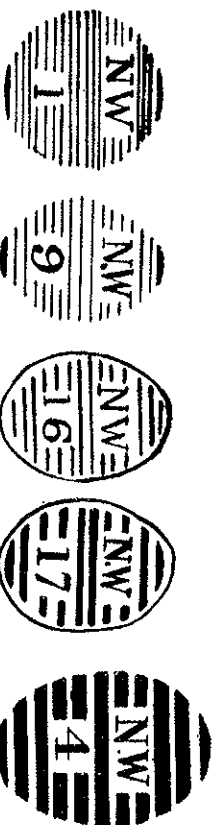
A type is also known with the N separated from the number by a short line and also without the line, the whole enclosed in a circle. [The numbers 21 and 23 are the only ones known to the Author.]

These whole series of postmarks run from No. 1 to 28.



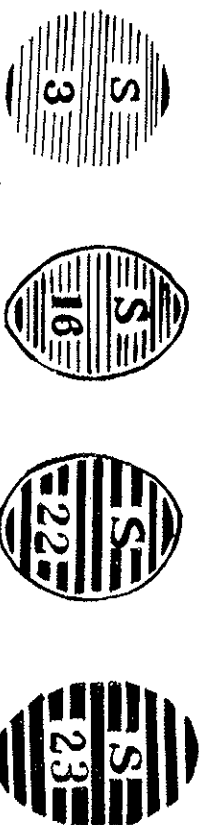
N.E.

As this district was soon combined with E, in 1869, these obliterations are somewhat scarce. Type No. 2 is the commonest. Numbers run from 1 to 20, but below 13 are difficult to obtain.



N.W.

Numbers run from 1 to 24, types 1, 2 and 3 persisting up to No. 17. Type 4 is scarce.



S.

All these are scarce, especially type 1, as the district was divided between SE and SW in April, 1886. The numbers run from 1 to 23 in the Author's collection, and Mr. Egly has S 24 "Too Late," Nov. 12th, 1867.



S.E.

The type I of the S District also exists in SE, but is not common. Type 4 shows the variety with letters replacing numerals.

The Author's numbers run 1 to 25. SE 26 is also known on later issues (Id. liacs, etc.).



S.W.

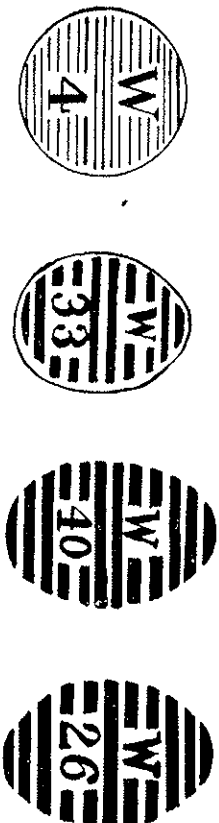
Type 4 is common after 32 with a variation, Type 5 with smaller letter and figures.

The numbers run from 1 to 60, and continue to 66, but in the Suburban type with the number in circle and "SW" in the date stamp.



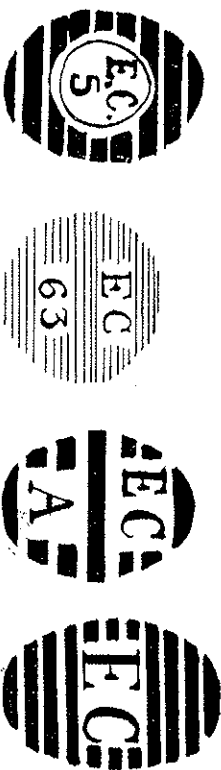
E.

Type 1 is scarce, and probably only runs from 1-7. The E is solid, but occasionally examples are found in which the letter appears outlined as illustrated. As in N, No. 5 is the most usual, but here a variation is shown in which are larger letter and figures. The numbers certainly run from 1 to 41 [the latter being shown to the Author by Mr. Egly, on a postcard dated June 29th, '88.]



W.

Type 1 is again somewhat scarce—early numbers, to at least 20. Type No. 3 appears to be the commonest. Numbers in all run from 1 to 59.



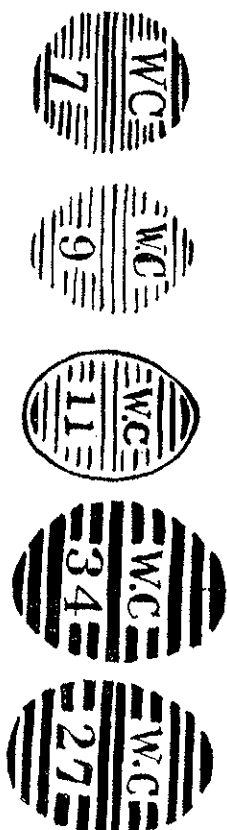
E.C.

The types shown are typical of this series (on plate numbers). The circle type is shown, Nos. 1 to 84. This is known, later, with figure above the circle. Type II came into use later (1879).

The large type with "A" is shown—this certainly exists up to N—whilst the E.C. only is also known, generally on printed matter.

A type similar to W.C., No. 4 (below) was used in E.C. from 1866.

[The Author also has W over A—similar to EC, over A, as illustrated elsewhere—he is now informed that C and D also exist, but no information is available as to their use except that they were used in 1874 and were superseded by the W (dated).]



W.C.

Types follow the general scheme. Type 3 is known with only one line below the number and above the letters. No. 6 is known with letter D.E.F. and R. (Registered). Numbers were generally thought to run from 1 to 37, but Mr. Egily now has No. 39 and 40 (single obliteration) used on registered letters the same as 36 and 37. It may be presumed that No. 38 also exists—probably on registered letters, and therefore rare.

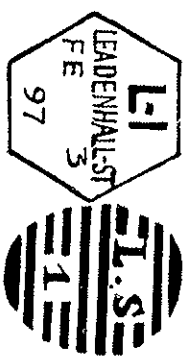

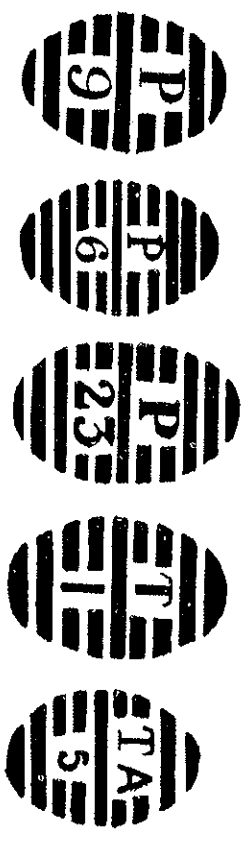

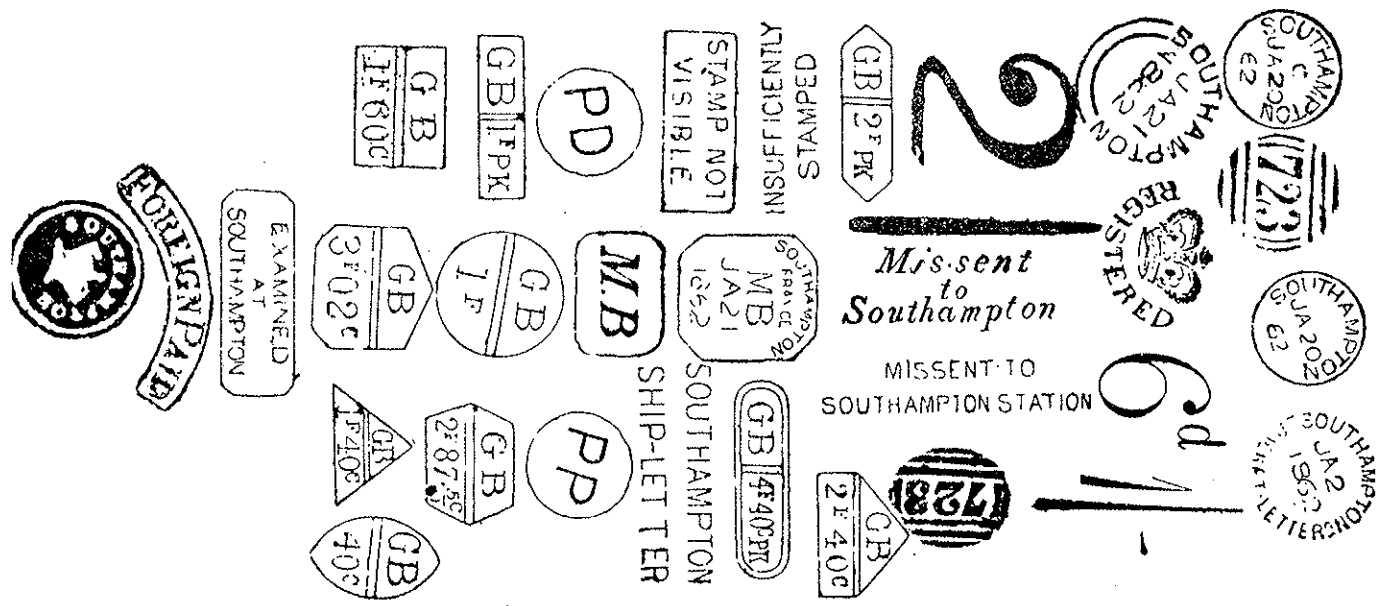

ANGLO-FRENCH CONVENTION

Under a Postal Convention between England and France (24th September, 1856) it was arranged that, in addition to the regular mail service, letters could be sent by private vessels of either country—one penny being paid on each ordinary letter. It was further agreed that unpaid correspondence charged with sea rates should "receive in some conspicuous part of the address, the impression in black of a stamp intended to show the rate at which the despatching office shall have delivered those letters to the other office." France used similar types but bearing the letters "F.R." instead of "G.B." This accounts for the well-known stamps of, say, St. Vincent bearing these G.B. or F.R. cancellations.

FOREIGN BRANCH

F.B. (Foreign Branch).

Nos. 1 to 13. These are later types (various) mostly used for newspaper stamp cancellations, and there is little information available as to the period in use.

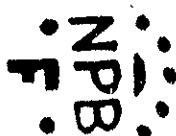


In 1865 obliterations with large letters B, F, H and P were used. These were London marks, and supplied by the G.P.O. to the Foreign Branch for both outward and inward mails. At one time it was considered possible that the letters represented Bristol, Falmouth, Hull and Plymouth, as ports of arrival or dispatch of foreign postbags. It seems probable, however, that the letters were those allotted to individual markers at the Foreign Branch. The smaller letters (A, B, C and D) were undoubtedly used at London Central Office.

RAILWAY AND TRAVELLING POST OFFICES

[As the main feature of this book is the numbered obliterator lists, the Author finds it absolutely impossible to include even a fraction of the many other markings which are known. Those of Railway and Travelling Post Offices, Sorting Carriages, are most interesting, and offer good scope for the specialist.]

NEWSPAPER PARCEL BOOK POST



N.P.B. (Newspaper Parcel Bookpost).

Only a few typical types are illustrated, but there are scores of others, some apparently being very roughly hand-made. All letters of the alphabet were used below the lettering, and numerals 1 to 12. Used not only in London, but in many parts of the country.

D.S.

This is a later mark over the letter F, and is practically always found on stamps perforated with the letters D.S. (Wm. Dawson and Sons Ltd.). They are generally on newspaper wrappers, and may have been postmarked on the train or before dispatch by the firm mentioned.

S.S.

This mark over F is similar to the above, but for W. H. Smith and Son.

REGISTRATION MARKS



Registrations obliterations with the large R appear to possess little variety, either in the surround, in the letter, or in the figures which lie within it. The numbers run from 1 to 36 [and the Author has all of these in his collection except 22 and 26, and it is doubtful if No. 26 was ever issued]. No. 37 is also stated to exist, but if it does it is probably of a different and later type. The small R type as shown is a scarce impression. An oval mark was certainly in use in 1859, and probably before. The letters R.L.B. in a diamond is well known, and Mr. Egly has an interesting envelope showing two circles overlapping; this is dated London 13 Sp. 66.

Probably intended for telegraphic purposes but apparently used also for Postal cancellation.

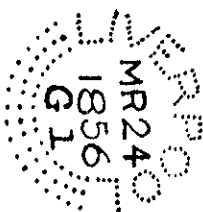
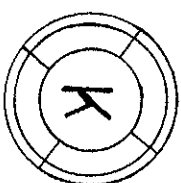
A Cape Colony postmark in oblong, sometimes found on British stamps on re-addressed letters. Not to be confused with London markings.



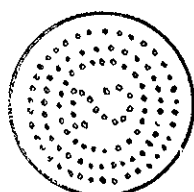
"Mis-sorted," Cancellation, July 17th, '75. Abolished early in 1890. "M" means missent; "E & D" shows where sorted, and "A" shows office where the letter was originally posted.



In 1868 Messrs. Smith Elder's banking business was amalgamated with that of H. S. King & Co. An earlier and a later type of postmark used for their correspondence.



Various forms of pin cancellations have been tried at different times. Centre illustration shows one for Salisbury, of which slight variations are known. This particular one is on 1d. red star (large crown, perf. 14). Later the pins were removed.



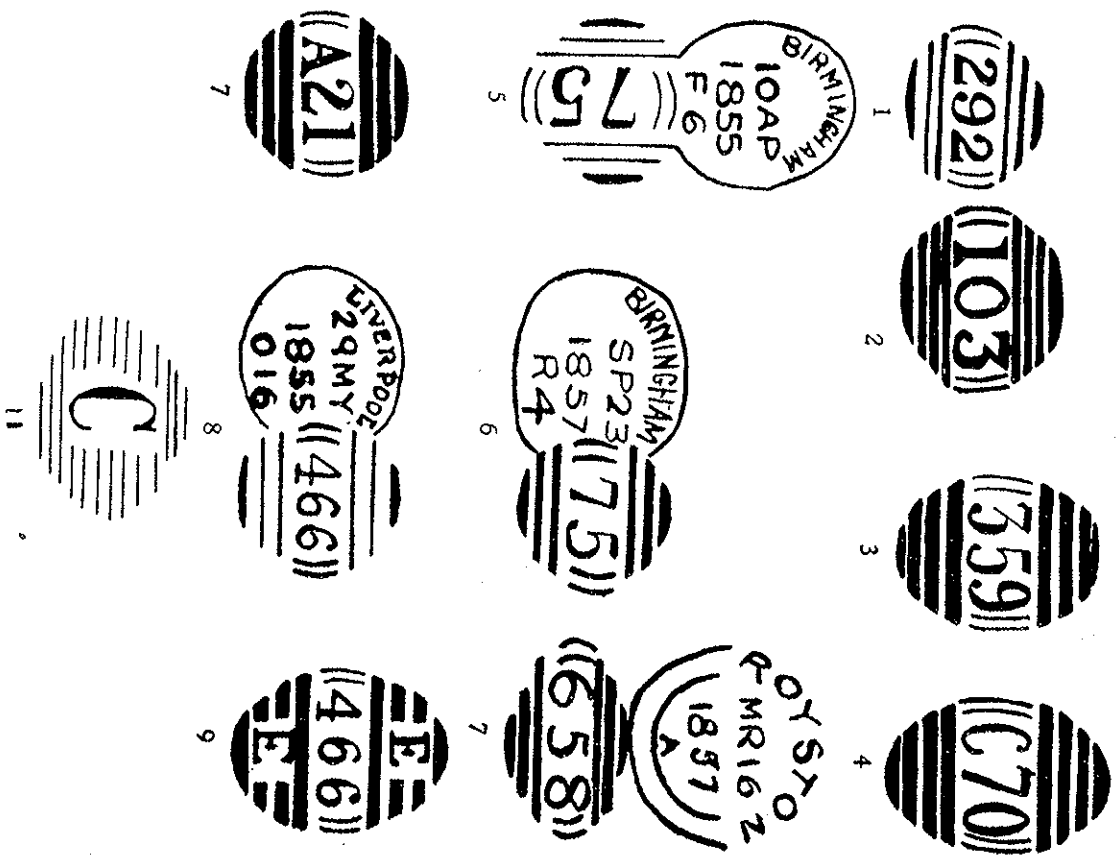
The first illustration shows the Liverpool experiments (1855-1856), and the third, in Mr. Seymour's collection, the origin of which is, so far, unknown.



This is a scarce type (1 and 3 also known), the origin of which is not known with any certainty. This particular example is from a letter posted at Brentford February 15th, 1876, to Hornsey Rise. It is also postmarked on the back London E.C. and London N. the same date. It seems probable that it was used at London Chief Office—the stamp on arrival there not having been previously cancelled.

All these are "Duplex," except Nos. 1, 2 and 11.

No. 3 exists Single and Duplex. There are also types (not illustrated) with 3 and 5 bars above and below the number.

England and Wales and "Used Abroad"

(Also see Maltese Cross obliterations on pages 12 and 13.)

Just a few of the better known types are illustrated, but these are merely typical, and scores of varieties exist. The early types naturally appear more frequently on the imperforate issues and on "Stars." Type II is typical of "used abroad".....Constantinople, Gibraltar and Malta. Letters used before the number are well known, and some only were used abroad (see list). The type with No. 466 is Liverpool, showing one of the several district letters (duplex).
 Type I was used 1844-1863, followed, for about two years, by Type 2, which was in use for about 12 years, when a type with four thick bars at top and bottom came into use, later reduced to three bars. A few places had obliterators with five bars top and bottom.

ERRORS AND VARIETIES.

Not only in the English List, but throughout the whole system, many mistakes have been made and discovered. These are often caused by mistaking 6 for 9 and certain combinations of figures, and many cases have occurred of the wrong, or even two numbers, being sent to the same place. A well known example is Oxford, 613 for 603; but there are many other permanent or temporary mistakes and alterations.



Brighton (132) was supplied with a wrong design as was also Easing-wold (931), as illustrated.

ENGLAND & WALES

List (compiled mainly from official sources) of the numbers allocated to the various Post Offices. As a rule, where two Post Offices have received the same number, the first Post Office had been closed, or given a new number and the original one given to a new office.

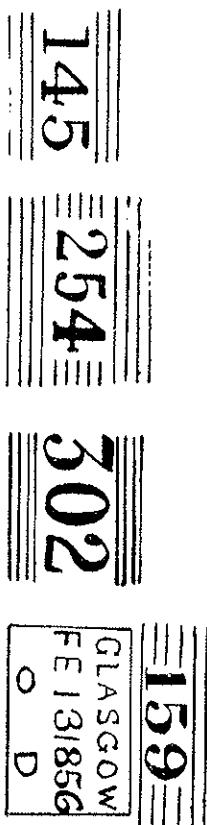

Typical early types are shown (1 and 2) followed by No. 3 (Duplex). Local (rural) cancellations (5) ceased in 1858, names repeated on the same obliterator being scarce. The combination (4) was used for a short time. The illustrations show the more general typical oblong markings, the parallel lines differing in number, thickness and length. Edinburgh (No. 131) often had a star, whether in the so-called "Brunswicks" or on either side of the figures, with parallel lines above and below. Roller cancellations of Scotch markings are known, but scarce. Type 6 shows the undated, circular mark, which are really locals, but if used with dates are ordinary Postmarks.*

Prior to the use of the numbered Postmarks, of course, various types were in use, these showing plainly the name of place and date. The combined date and number obliterations were brought into use early in 1854.

Edinburgh Star Cancellations

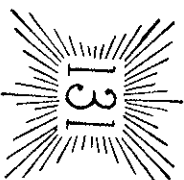
For some reason, collectors know this Pearson Hill "Parallel" hand-stamp as "Brunswick" Star Cancellations. It was only used in Edinburgh. So far the earliest known copy is dated 3rd Feb., 1863, and this postmark was in use as late as 1873. These Brunswick Stars were used together with the Edinburgh date stamp, but spacing between the two differs. Whilst the main features are similar, there are interesting variations.

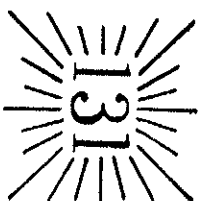

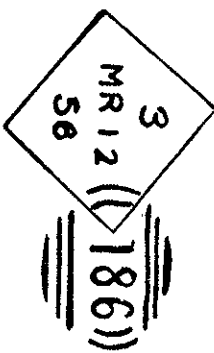

Types 1, 2 and 3 are typical postmarks of the earlier types. Type 4 was in use in Dublin only, and it is seen that the date only (no name of town) is in a diamond with the number (186) adjoining. A few Irish towns had their numbers enclosed in an oval postmark—such as Cork, Belfast, Galway, Waterford, etc. (type 5). It will be noticed that type 5 follows the form of the English obliterations.

Throughout the sizes of figures, names and dates vary as much as do the lines and shapes of the diamonds. Black is the normal color, but others, especially blue and green, are not very scarce. Red and its shades are difficult to find, and naturally "1844" and later cancellations are scarce on the 1d. and 2d. stamps of 1840.

Irish Local markings, similar to Scottish types are also well known.

NUMERAL CANCELLATIONS
