P R E S I D E N T ' S R E P O R T

On behalf of Tennis Australia, it gives me great pleasure to present the 88th Annual Report and Financial Statements of the Lawn Tennis Association of Australia, trading as Tennis Australia. This report covers the programs and activities of this Association for the calendar year, ending 31 December, 1992.

The Ford Australian Open was undoubtedly the highlight of the year. Virtually all the world's top male and female players participated, supported by record attendance.

The Ford Australian Open was also the most successful financial result for Tennis Australia and National Tennis Centre.

As a result, Tennis Australia recorded a profit of more than \$1 million for the first time in its history. An interim distribution of \$200,000 was made to the states early in the year, with a final distribution of \$300,000, once the profit became clear. The Association plans to establish a Loan Scheme for affiliated Clubs and Associations. Further grants to State Associations should now be possible.

It was the first year into our five-year Corporate Plan - many of the goals and strategies outlined in the plan were introduced or achieved. However there is still much to be done to make sure tennis continues to grow, to be available to the widest possible cross-section

of the Australian community as a lifetime experience and sport.

Significant developments in this regard included the staging, in August, of a successful conference, Tennis Towards 2000, and the creation of two new management positions. Ms Rosanne Michie joined the staff in

June as Media and Public Relations Manager,

while Mr John Brown of JFB Sport was appointed General Manager - Marketing in December, to commence in February, 1993.

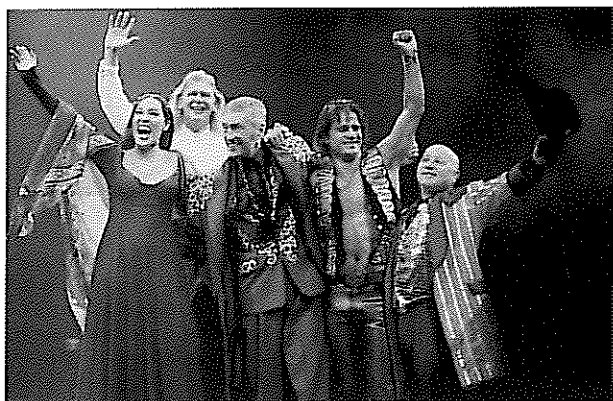
It was also pleasing to welcome basketball into the National Tennis Centre and to witness the substantial growth in entertainment activity at Flinders Park, leading to a financial return to Tennis Australia as the Centre's Manager.

We are indebted to our many commercial sponsors and the Australian Sports Commission for their support.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to my colleagues on the Council and the Executive Board for their support, and to our hard working and loyal staff for the tremendous job they have done throughout the year.

Jim Courier and Monica Seles might have won the 1992 Ford Australian Open titles, but John McEnroe and Emilio Sanchez will be remembered as the heroes with the most staying power.

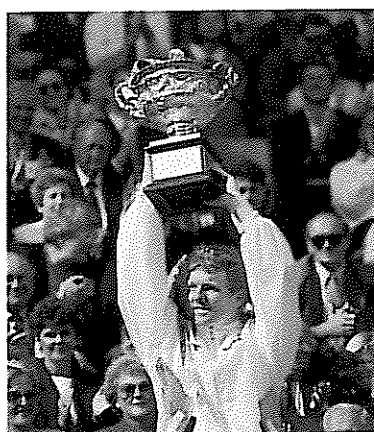
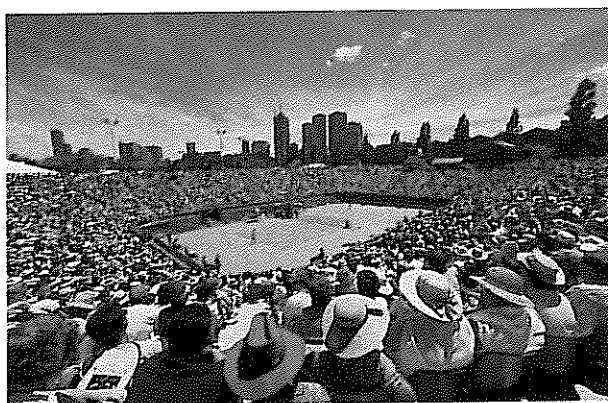
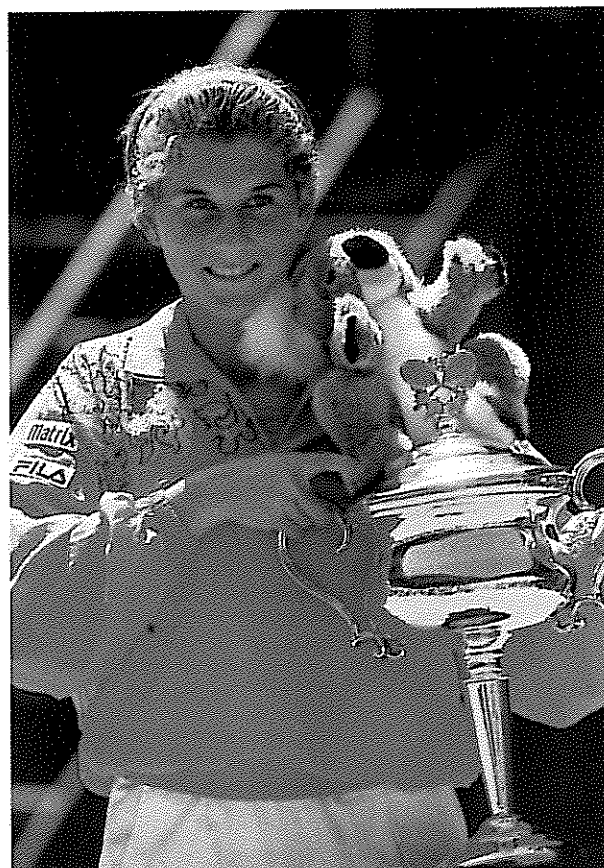
McEnroe and Sanchez's match will go down as one of the most exciting, and one of the longest, matches in Grand Slam history. In fact, host broadcaster Channel 7 delayed its 6 o'clock news bulletin by 36 minutes to relay the thrilling five-setter until the absolute end.

But the rest of the championships also produced excellent results. By winning the event, Courier and Seles kept the record intact that only world number one players have won the title since the Open moved to Flinders Park five years ago.

To do so, they both had to defeat the strongest Ford Australian Open field in history - 18 of the top 20

men and women entered, 17 in each event eventually played.

The Open also attracted record crowds - the 329,034 attendance was an eight per cent increase on 1991's 305,048.

Prizemoney rose by another A\$1 million to reach \$6.2 million, with each singles winner taking home \$360,000, making the Open by far the most significant

international sporting event in Australia.

All 23 sessions were telecast on the Seven Network in Australia and the action was relayed

live to more than 50 countries. Many more took the one hour highlights package for delayed coverage.

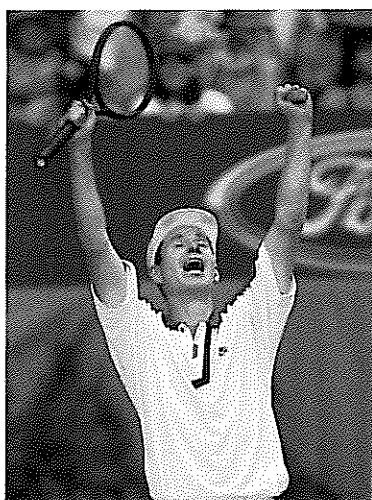


More than 900 local and overseas media covered the event. The dramatic performances of John McEnroe, defeating titleholder Becker in straight sets, and then Sanchez, before losing to Ferreira in the quarter finals, ensured front-page coverage in numerous newspapers worldwide.

Renewed sponsorship by the Ford Motor Company; new official supplier status granted to Reebok and Rado; extended TV rights for the Seven Network and substantially increased international television rights, enabled the Ford Australian Open to not only withstand the current economic recession, but to grow substantially. The Open continues to progress in line with its sister Grand Slam Championships in their quest to maintain status as the true flagship events of world tennis.

Australians did particularly well in the doubles events. Mark Woodforde (SA) and Todd Woodbridge (NSW) won the men's doubles and Mark Woodforde and Nicole Provis (VIC) defeated Todd Woodbridge and Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario (Spain) in the mixed doubles.

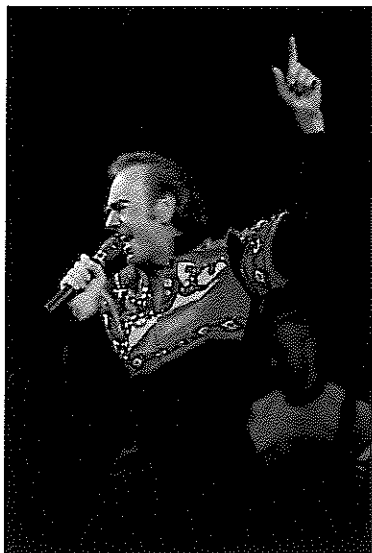


In the juniors, Grant Doyle (NSW) won the boys singles, Joanne Limmer (VIC) won the girls singles, Grant Doyle and Brad Sceney (VIC) won the boys doubles while Maija Avotins (VIC) and Joanne Limmer (VIC) were runners-up in the girls doubles.

The introduction of Seniors events was another interesting aspect of the 1992 championships. Entry was limited to doubles and Australian players, but its success will lead to expanded events in 1993. The Ford Australian Open has joined Wimbledon and the US Open in providing an opportunity for the former champions to participate again and for spectators to see some of yesterday's heroes in action.



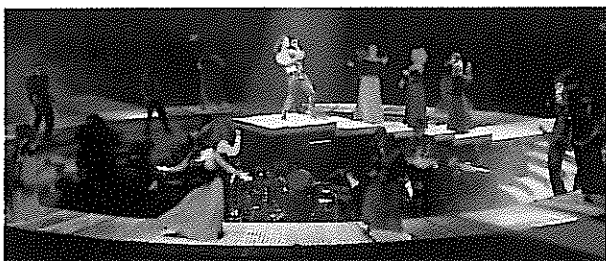

Finance: In a significant development, the long-term future of Flinders Park was secured by the State Government's decision to provide \$12 million a year for the next 12 years, to retire the centre's debt. In return, Tennis Australia agreed to stage the Australian Open at Flinders Park for the next 25 years.

For the year ending June 30, 1992, Flinders Park recorded an \$8.1 million dollar operating surplus, a far greater profit than any other venue in Australia.

Concerts: Rod Stewart, Neil Diamond, Prince and Jesus Christ Superstar were just a few of the highlights. Jesus Christ Superstar attracted a phenomenal 335,000 people to 22 performances - a new Flinders Park attendance record.

Basketball: NBL Basketball moved to Flinders Park in 1992 - both the Melbourne Tigers and SE Melbourne Magic adopted the venue as their home base.

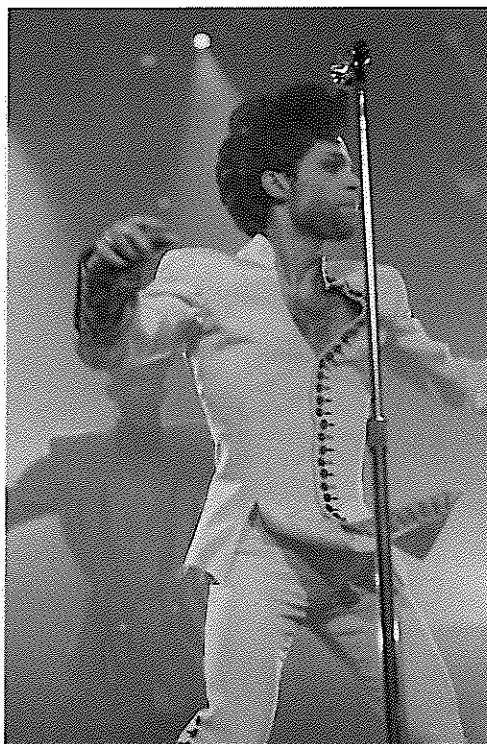
In an exciting finish to the season, both home teams played off in the Grand Final. SE Melbourne Magic clinched the tight third-game decider to win the championship in front of a packed house.

Other Major Events: The extensive Gift and Homewares Exhibition was staged for the fifth successive year at Flinders Park.

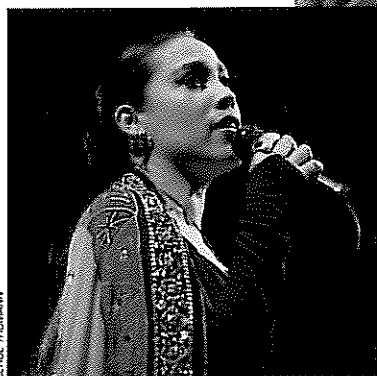
The Prime Minister's Olympic dinner for 900 guests was held on centre court.

The Dalai Lama, exiled leader of Tibet and spiritual leader of Tibetan Buddhism visited Flinders Park. The man known as the "living Buddha" attracted 28,000 people to two discussion sessions at Flinders Park.

VMA Convention and Trade

Show: The three-day 1992 Convention and Trade Show of the Venue Management Association (Asia and Pacific) was held at Flinders Park in May. It was the biggest and most successful conference of its type ever held in Australia, attracting 190 delegates from Australia, New Zealand, South East Asia and the United States.

Rocking Rod Stewart still attracts full houses.

Court Hire and Coaching

Activities: More than 90,000 people used Flinders Park's court hire and coaching facilities. Tennis memberships, providing social playing rights on outdoor courts, were introduced. More than 5,000 children participated in Sunsmart tennis clinics.

Total Attendance: In 1992, 140 events attracted 1.4 million patrons.



Olympic Tennis Captain, Neale Fraser, came back from Barcelona with more than Nicole Provis' and Rachel McQuillan's bronze medal. Tales of the highs and lows of the accommodation, tennis venue and other logistics peppered his post-Olympics report.

For example, after many anxious hours, the team found its luggage on a Barcelona street in a wire cage! Nine adults - four female, five male - shared one apartment, with two bathrooms and four bedrooms and 60 pieces of luggage.

Barcelona's tennis events boasted stronger fields than the Seoul Olympics in 1988 - nearly all the top players, who were eligible, competed on the hot dry clay courts at La Vall D'Hebron.

This was most evident in the Men's Singles when, in a draw of 64, Australia's three representatives, Wally Masur, Richard Fromberg and Todd Woodbridge met seeded players, Pete Sampras (No. 3), Michael Stich (No.8) and Emilio Sanchez (No.12) respectively in the first round.

But the women kept the flag flying. After a shaky start, the fifth seeded pair of Provis and McQuillan ran into form to reach quarter finals. They faced the highly ranked pair of Novotna and Strnadova for a medal.

The Aussie duo played their best tennis of the event but, unfortunately, in the semi-finals, the same form was not possible, and Australia had to settle for the bronze.

Of the 16 tennis medals, nine countries divided the spoils, with the USA and Spain winning three each. Germany, Croatia and the Unified Team won two medals each; South Africa, Argentina, Switzerland and Australia each won one medal.

The BP Australian Davis Cup Team defeated Yugoslavia, without dropping a set. Due to political turmoil in Yugoslavia, the tie was held on neutral soil in Cyprus.

Australia was overwhelmed by Sweden, led by 1991 ITF World Champion Stefan Edberg, 5-0 in the second round of the World Group of the Davis Cup by NEC.

Sweden lost in the semi finals to USA, which went on to win the Davis Cup against first-time finalists, Switzerland.

After blitzing Bulgaria, Austria and Czechoslovakia, Australia met the formidable Spaniards in the semis, who - with two top 10 players - were just too good.

Germany defeated Spain in the final, 2-1.

The operating result of the Association for the year ended 31 December, 1992 shows a profit of \$1,132,314 compared to a result in the previous year of \$70,156.

The major reason attributed to this improved result was the increased share of revenue generated from the National Tennis Centre. This was due to not only the improved trading result at the Centre but a revised revenue sharing arrangement that was negotiated in a new long-term management agreement with the National Tennis Centre Trust.

Against a solid financial income base, expenditure on tennis programs was able to grow in excess of 20% over 1991 levels.

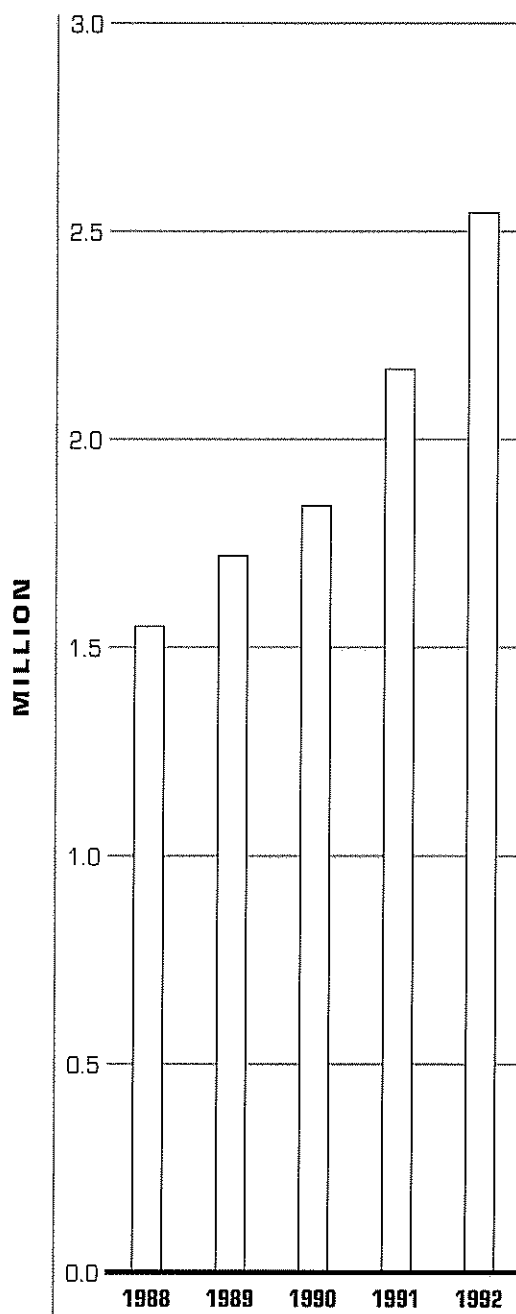
This graph reflects the continued growth of expenditure in the areas of youth development.

YEAR ENDING 31 DECEMBER 1992

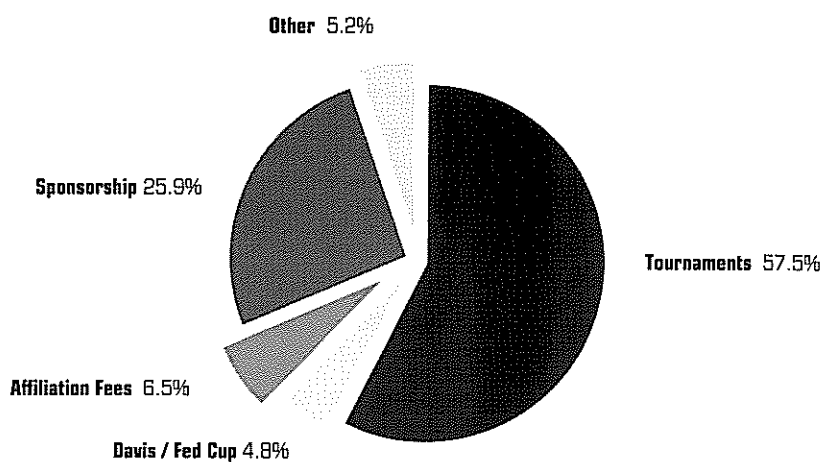

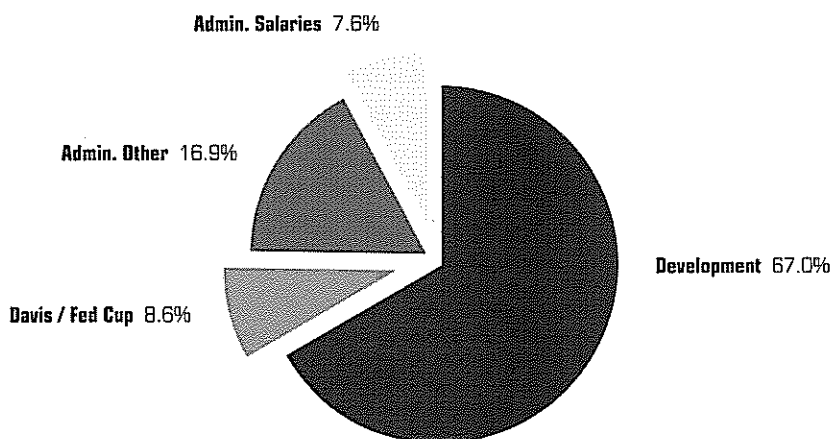

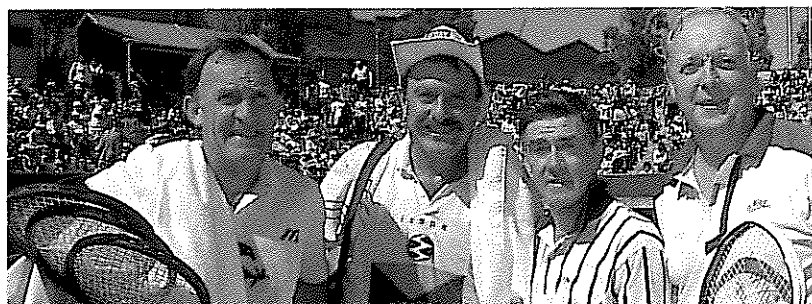

Tennis Australia is committed to gender equity. Tennis has been chosen with seven other sports to work closely with the Women in Sport Unit, Australian Sports Commission, to develop model gender equity policies and plans. Tennis will ideally be a 'lighthouse' to provide an example to other sports.

Gender equity in sport means the fair allocation of resources, benefits, opportunities, entitlements and

power without discrimination on the basis of

sex. It also involves redressing any undesirable or inequitable balance in the benefits available to males and females.

Tennis Australia has developed a Gender Equity Mission statement:

"Tennis Australia and its affiliated state/territory associations guarantee Australian men and women, boys and girls, equity wherever possible, in all aspects of the game including participation, training, competition, prizemoney, coaching, officiating and administration".

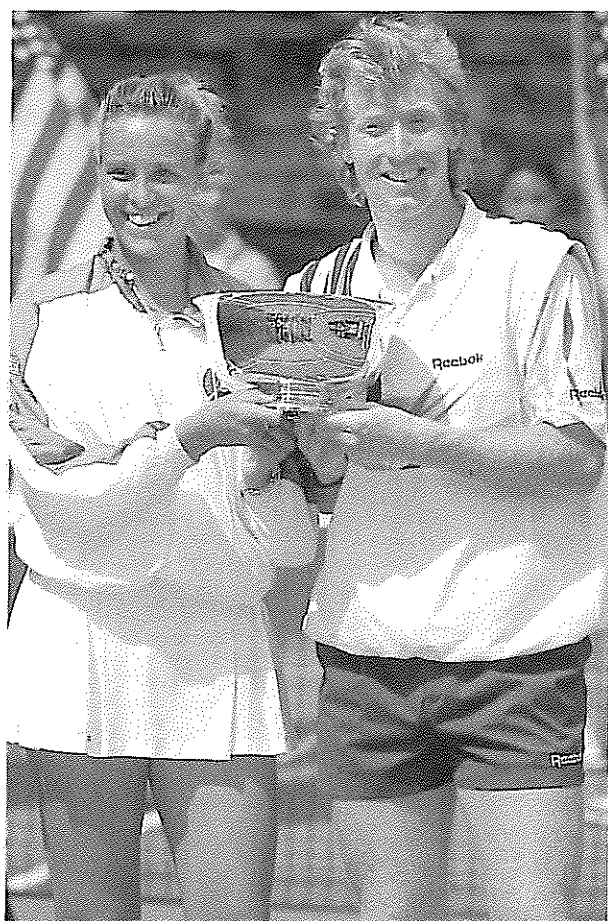
References with gender equity implications in Tennis Australia's Corporate Plan, endorsed by Tennis Australia Council, include:

- To encourage more effective representation on Council.
- To encourage all aspects of female participation, for example, administration, coaching, officiating and playing.
- Encourage women to become high performance coaches.
- Maintain parity, wherever possible, between men and women.

Tennis Australia has developed a Gender Equity Working Party (GEWP) to formulate a draft Gender Equity Development Plan for Australian tennis.

The GEWP has obtained data concerning the representation of women in all aspects of Australian tennis, for example administration, coaching, officiating and playing.

Attitudinal questionnaires have been sent to an equal number of men and women, involved with all aspects of Australian tennis, to determine and understand the barriers to women's full participation, and develop targets and strategies.



Interest in officiating continues to grow in Australia and young people continue to be targeted for recruitment.

Tennis Australia hired full-time National Umpires Co-ordinator, Mr Wayne Spencer, during the year, which is an indication of its commitment to first-class officiating at Australian tournaments.

The Ford Australian Open was again the year's highlight, with 310 umpires from around Australia and overseas - of these, approximately 11 were professionals, 70 from interstate, 38 from overseas, and the remainder were from Victoria.

Many Australian officials are now travelling overseas, to gain the experience required to progress as an umpire. Activities range from local club events, junior tournaments to major events like the Davis Cup By NEC.

The Tennis for People with Disabilities program, in action for 12 months, scored wins on and off the court. Tennis Australia's promotional and awareness campaign has been very successful, prompting many inquiries from coaches, players and tennis clubs. This has led to an increase in opportunities for tennis players with disabilities to play either social or competitive tennis.

TENNIS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

During 1992, Tennis Australia, in conjunction with its State and Territory Tennis Associations, conducted Come 'N' Try days and clinics, attracting about 600 tennis players with disabilities.

Under the supervision of Tennis Australia's National Disabilities Co-ordinator, Ms Karen Clydesdale:

- Tennis Australia has established a range of resources, available for coaches and players.

The Tennis for People with Disabilities program continues to grow.

- With the financial support from Fortress and the International Wheelchair Tennis Federation, Tennis Australia conducted four Fortress Junior/Beginner Wheelchair Tennis Camps in Victoria, NSW, SA and WA.

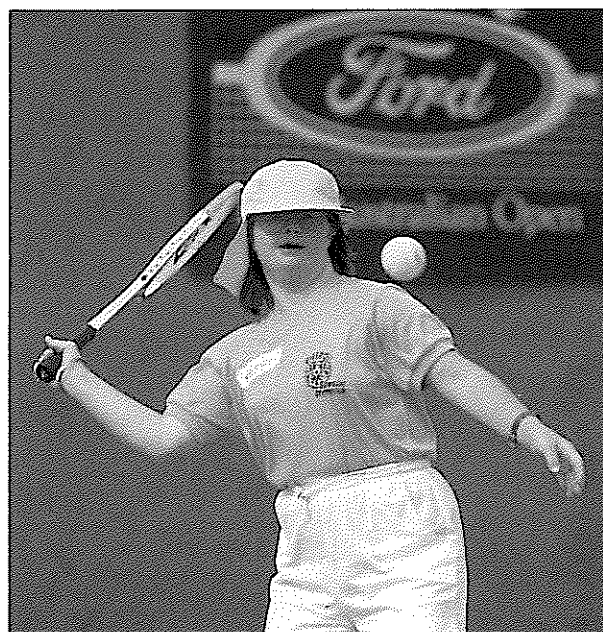
- Australia was represented at the Barcelona Paralympics by David Hall (NSW), Michael Connell (NSW), Suzanne Twelftree (SA) and Randa Hinson (Vic). Tennis Australia conducted a Paralympic Training Camp to prepare the players.

- A Coaching Resource Workshop was held in April at Flinders Park National Tennis Centre. As a result of the workshop, coaching manuals and videos to teach how to coach tennis players with disabilities are being developed.

- A joint Tennis on Wheels and Rallying Together newsletter is being produced.

- A National Wheelchair Tennis Ranking system has been established.

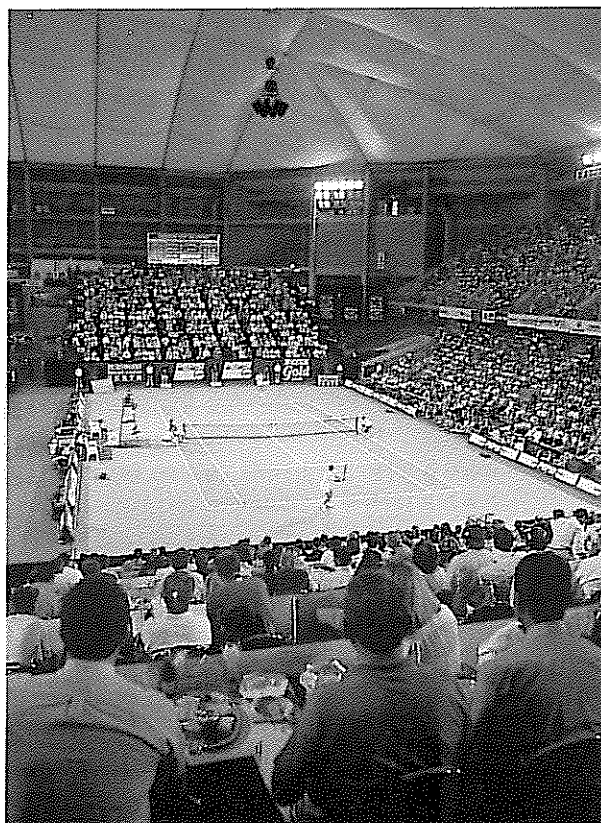
tralia's commitment in its Corporate Plan to provide a major event in each state leading up to the Ford Australian Open.

Australia has developed what it believes is the best modified sport package on the market - Ace Tennis.

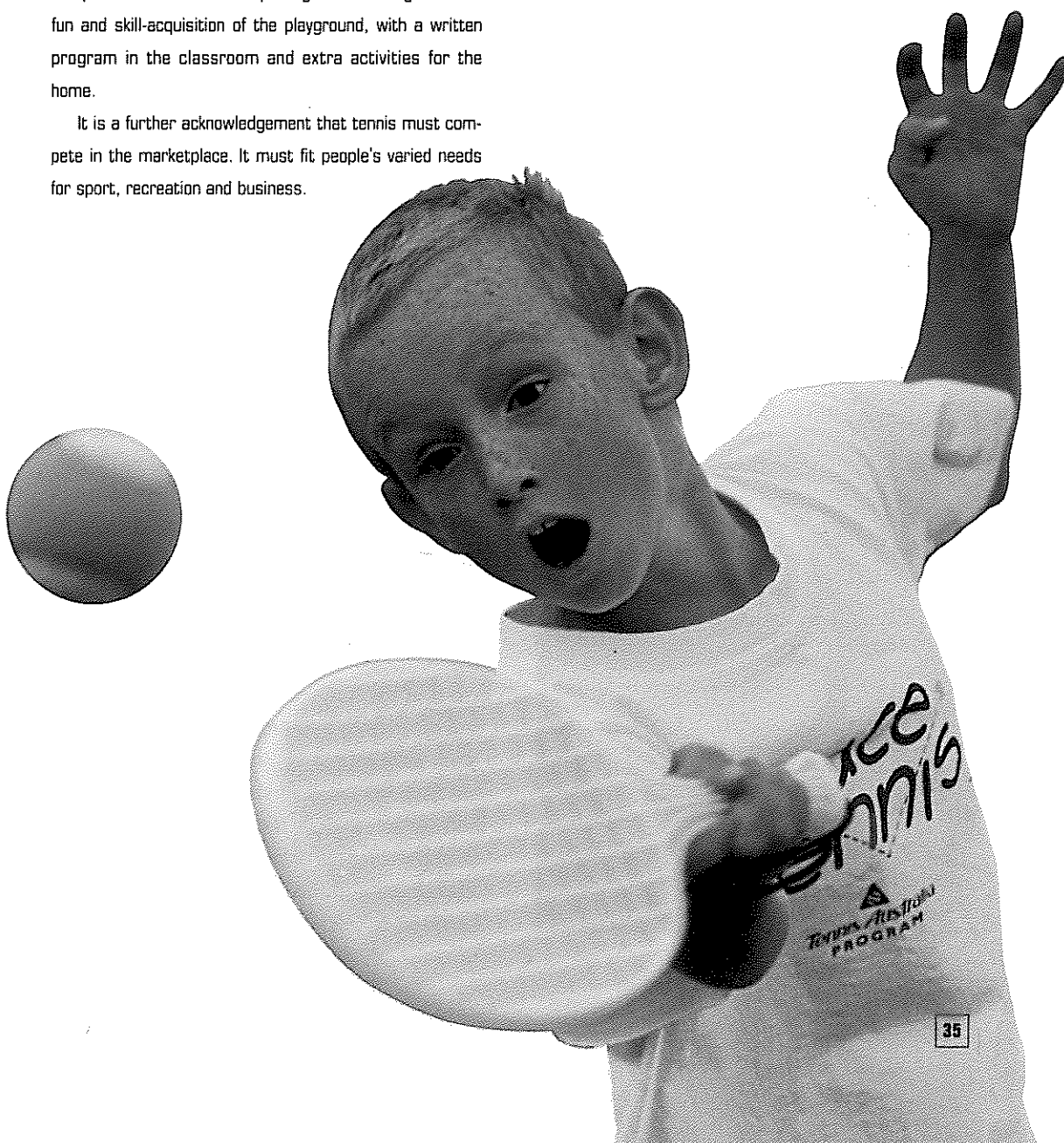
The official introductory skills program was devised in 1992. It is poised to be introduced to 1.7 million children in 8,500 primary schools, introducing kids as young as six to the joys of tennis.

The equipment, playing areas and activities are different. Primary school children can develop the basic skills needed to play tennis - and have some fun along the way.

Ace Tennis will be introduced to 1.7 million Australian children.

But Ace Tennis is far more than a "mini-game". It is a comprehensive educational package which integrates the fun and skill-acquisition of the playground, with a written program in the classroom and extra activities for the home.

It is a further acknowledgement that tennis must compete in the marketplace. It must fit people's varied needs for sport, recreation and business.



The New South Wales Tennis Association reports that the NSW Open, the Tournament of Champions, in January, was again a success. Emilio Sanchez won the Men's singles and Gabriela Sabatini won the Women's singles. The tournament also had a shared sponsorship arrangement with Ruffles (Arnott's Snack Foods), Northwest Airlines and the Hotel Intercontinental, Sydney. Mr John Whittaker completed his first term as President; there was an inaugural meeting of the Forward Planning Committee to establish the conduct of elite player tournaments and competitions under the control of New South Wales Tennis Association. Brad Drewett and Noel Callaghan were appointed as the White City professionals, Stephen Myers was appointed Marketing/Media Manager and Natalie Cutcliffe was appointed as the Development Officer.

AROUND THE STATES

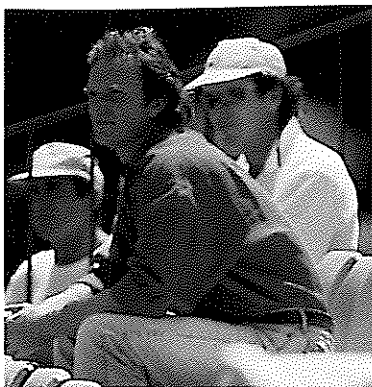
TENNIS HAS CONTINUED TO FLOURISH IN ITS HEARTLAND - THE STATES.

In South Australia, tennis adopted a new image - changing its name to **Tennis SA**. Mazda was signed to sponsor junior tennis and Farmers Union Iced Coffee sponsored (Pennant) Tennis League. Ace Tennis, supported by Foundation SA and Mazda, exposed 25,000 school children to tennis and a Tennis for People with Disabilities Program was developed. The inaugural McDonald's Junior Tennis Challenge, at Memorial Drive, was filmed by the ABC and Ms Allison Lyons was appointed as Tennis SA's Marketing Manager.



At the Tasmanian Lawn Tennis Association, Mr David Drysdale was appointed the State's Director of Tennis, Tasmanian tennis' first full-time employee. Mr Max McMullen resigned as President after 10 years, and was rewarded with life membership of the TLTA. He has been replaced by Dr John Barrenger. The TLTA celebrated its centenary. The Tasmanian Challenger, moved indoors to Launceston, was extremely successful. The Interstate Challenge Cup was again in Launceston, with added support from Tennis Australia. All States and the NT competed, with Queensland winning the event.

At Tennis West, winning the Wilson Cup for only the second time in 63 years was a highlight. Tennis is now part of the WAIS program - Paul McNamee is its head coach. The WA Government funded the installation of two American clay courts at the Superdome, to be used for the WAIS high performance program; the Tennis in Schools program, which catered for 3,000 children in 1992, the WA Open and Tennis West's involvement in the Hopman Cup were all highly successful. Another significant development for Tennis West was the acquisition of a lease of land at Burswood on which the State Tennis Centre will be built. By December 1992, Tennis West



had two Regional Development Officers in place in the country zones.

The Victorian Tennis Association's headquarters, the Albert Reserve Tennis Centre, boasting nine Rebound Ace courts, opened in July. The VTA launched its own quarterly magazine, The Victorian Tennis News; tennis promotions sponsored by SunSmart, funded by the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, have continued to flourish; and the Victorian Institute of Sport and MJTA continued to progress. Results during the 1992 summer circuit - Victoria won the Linton (18/u boys), Wilson (18/u girls) and Reid (16/u boys) cups.

Tennis Queensland is in the midst of a restructure, which will introduce a new regional system and board structure. With the help of the Queensland Government, Regional Development Officers will be appointed to each region to encourage the development of tennis at grass roots level. To boost the sport's administrative skills and its profile, Tennis Queensland appointed Ms Karen Denman, as Tennis Operations Manager, and Ms Liz Pidgeon, Marketing Services Officer.

In the ACT, **Tennis Canberra's** newly-appointed patron Ken Willis received the inaugural ACT Sport Minister's Award for Administrator of the Year. Mr Leon Braslin was appointed General Manager of the National Sports Club, in addition to his other Tennis Canberra responsibilities and administrator Anne Parkinson has retired. The Quit Primary Schools Tennis Program reached about 2,000 children in 1992, thanks to ACT Government's Health Promotion Fund's sponsorship.

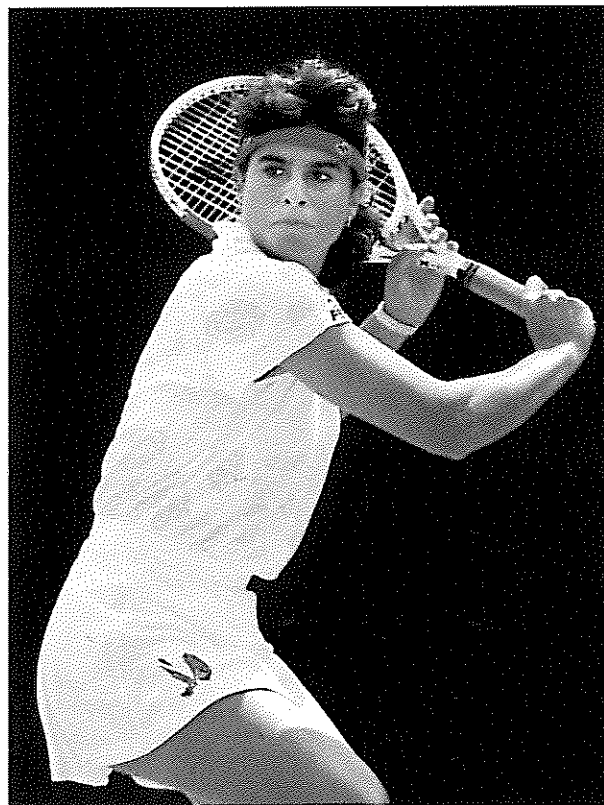

was rejuvenated; Oz Tennis projects to promote Aboriginal participation in the sport were extended to the NT; and an ITF World Ranking Points Junior Tournament

was restored to Darwin in the South-East Asian junior circuit. Peter McNamara established a scholarship for a Central Australian junior to have a week's coaching in Melbourne; the Veteran's Tennis Association of the NT inaugurated a veterans' event which is planned to become part of the South-East Asian region's circuit. NT Tennis Council President, Mr Max Horton, who has held the position since the Council's foundation in 1980, was elected its first Life Member and the NTTC is undertaking an Executive review.



The BP Achievers' program continues to provide a coach for our most promising players as they graduate from junior ranks and endeavour to make the transition to top-flight international tennis.

The team framework provides mutual support in the long months spent away from Australia.

Chris Johnstone, a former Davis Cup Squad member, was appointed coach of the Women's Squad for 1992.

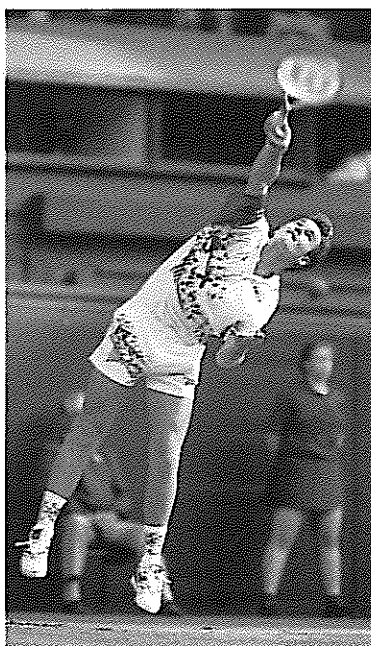

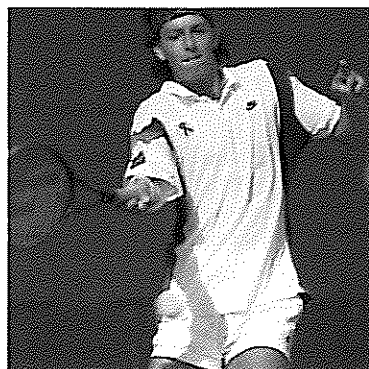
Nicole was a scholarship holder at the AIS throughout the year.

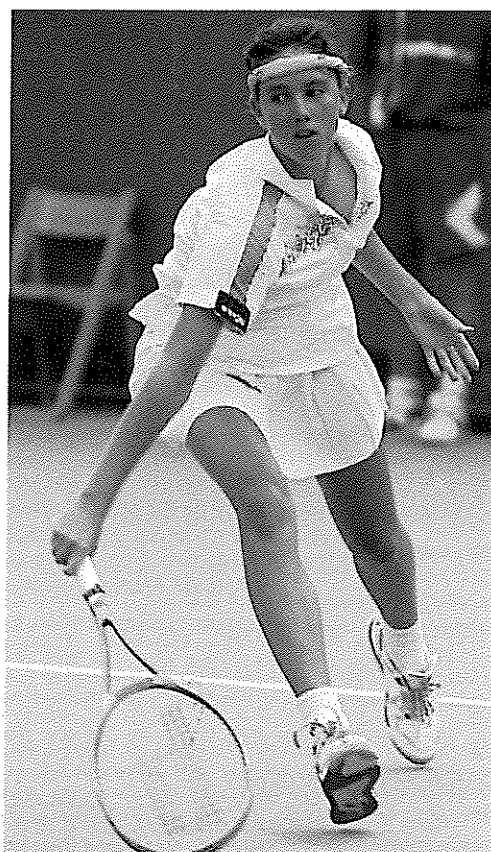

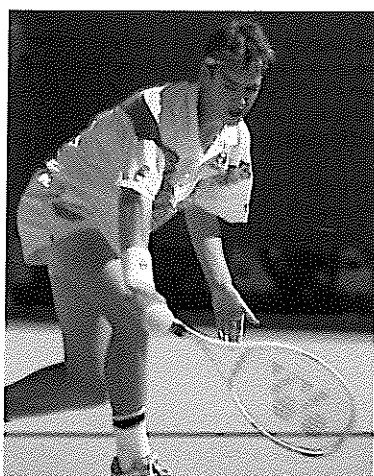

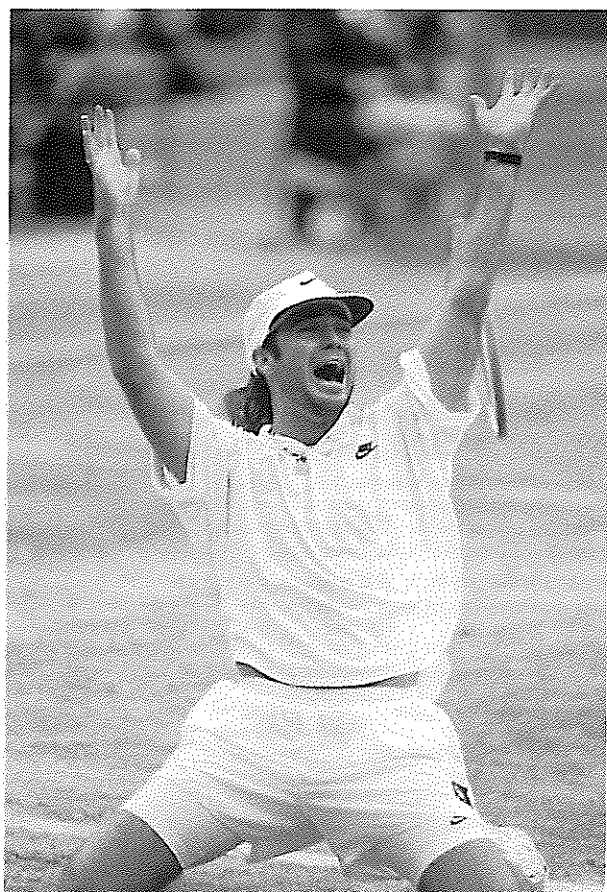

for the Federation Cup from 1995, which will make the women's event similar to the men's Davis Cup with home and away matches.

One of the controversial issues was the plan to revise the Committee of Management's structure. It was agreed the Committee would be boosted, from 11 to 12. The additional spot would go to the countries north of the Panama Canal. The other amendments were defeated, but the question appears certain to reappear in 1993, an election year.

Politically, it was a busy year for the ITF - membership changed and grew substantially with the indepen-

of Czechoslovakia. All presented different challenges requiring different solutions.

The most controversial tennis issue was the impact new technology was having on the game. Were powerful modern racquets harming the game for spectators and television? The debate fizzled after a baseline, Agassi, defeated the big-servers, Becker, Stich and Ivanisevic, on fast grass to win Wimbledon.

The Compaq Grand Slam Cup for men, played in Munich's Olympic Tennis Stadium in December, was

INTERNATIONAL TENNIS FEDERATION

It was a non-election year, but there were still some interesting developments, some areas of agreement ... and a sprinkling of controversy.

The International Tennis Federation's 79th Annual General Meeting was held in the Dominican Republic from 14-18 September. Australia was represented by Dr John Fraser, Mr John McInnes, Mr Mike Daws and Mr Geoff Pollard, in his role as a member of the ITF Committee of Management.

The ITF's 1992 highlight was undoubtedly the success of the Olympic Games tennis event in Barcelona. The other ITF flagship events, the Davis and Federation Cups were also successful. USA won a fascinating Davis Cup final against Switzerland in Fort Worth, Texas, while Germany, at home in Frankfurt, defeated titleholders Spain, to win the Federation Cup.

The Annual Council meeting approved a new format

won by Michael Stich over Michael Chang. This first final between two Grand Slam Champions in the event contributed \$2 million towards the Grand Slam Development Fund, which helps the ITF develop tennis around the world.

Tennis Australia representatives served on a number of ITF Committees. Mr Geoff Pollard was a member of the Davis Cup Committee, Mr Harry Spilsbury a member of the Veterans Committee, Ms Helen Smith a member of the Junior Tournament Committee and Ms. Wendy Turnbull a member of the Olympic Committee.

The year was most successful financially, with the ITF declaring a profit \$3.2 million. The Annual General Meeting resolved to distribute \$1 million amongst its representative nations. Grand Slam nations agreed to return their share to help increase the distribution to the poorer nations.

Veterans continue to be the sport's fastest growth area - Australia's membership and competition statistics clearly demonstrate healthy growth and its results are outstanding.

The Executive moved from Canberra to Melbourne, at the Annual General Meeting in January. Major General Bob Hay retired as President, after 11 years

at the helm. Harry Gibbs and Alison Ide had been Secretary and Treasurer respectively for the past five years. Their places were taken by Ray Stock, President, Lurline Stock, Secretary, and Carl Anjou, Treasurer - all from Victoria.

A mid-year meeting of the Presidents of the State and Territory bodies was inaugurated in September, and eight of Australia's Veterans' Championships are now internationally recognised.

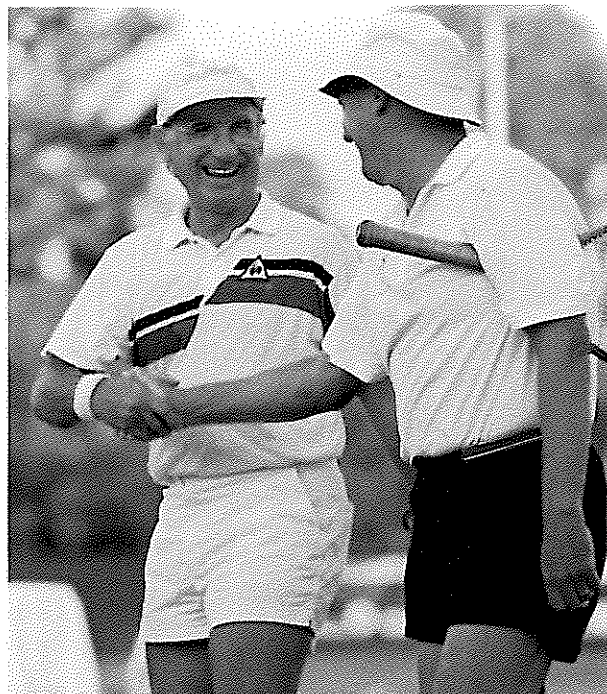
Australia competes regularly in the ITF's International Team Competitions and in the World Veteran Championships, where Aussies are usually the third-largest national group.

The ITF also granted approval to WA to hold the inaugural Margaret Court Cup in 1994, in Perth.

There are now 11 ITF Cups (team competitions), compared to four in 1981. A record 176 teams competed in the 1992 Cups competition. Australia's participation is assisted by considerable funding support to players by Tennis Australia and the VTAA - although these contributions only reach a little over a third of a player's total expenses.

On the international front, the ITF decided to split the 1994 World Veteran Championships between two venues and to appoint a Field Development officer, to promote the sport in underdeveloped countries.

TENNIS INDUSTRY COUNCIL

Although the Ford Australian Open attracts 900 local and international media, winning headlines around the world, tennis had largely slipped from the media gaze the remaining 50 weeks of the year.

Tennis Australia identified the void and has developed a comprehensive two-year Media Plan to raise and improve the profile of the sport in Australia. It was also an acknowledgment that tennis - like other sports and industries - had to compete for its share of the media and public relations action.

The plan is designed to put tennis back on the media map. It identifies the need to target metropolitan and suburban media around Australia and to take the good news about tennis to new audiences - for example, women's magazines, TV lifestyle and current affairs programs, general radio and business publications.

Stay tuned for the tennis information explosion ...

Tennis Australia and the key industry representatives had rarely discussed their mutual interests or problems - although, there was clearly room to work together on many industry issues. In response to this dearth, the Tennis Industry Council, a vision from Tennis Australia's five-year Corporate Plan, was established in May.

In fact, the dealings between the key players had been so sporadic, introductions were necessary for the inaugural meeting, at Tennis Australia in August.

Its main objective is to promote and expand player participation programs and to commission various research projects to assist the development of the sport.

TIC Chairman, Mr Bill Beischer, said there was a clear need to work closer with industry representatives.

TIC will lobby for the development of a national ratings system for all players.

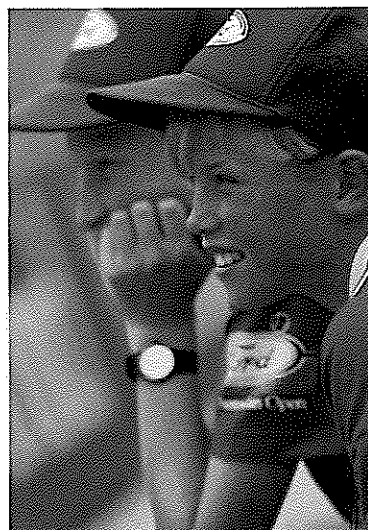

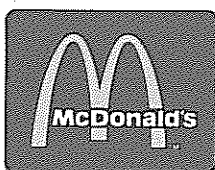
