Australia's biggest sporting event, the Ford Australian Open, continues to attract the world's top players to Flinders Park, Australia's finest multi-purpose venue.



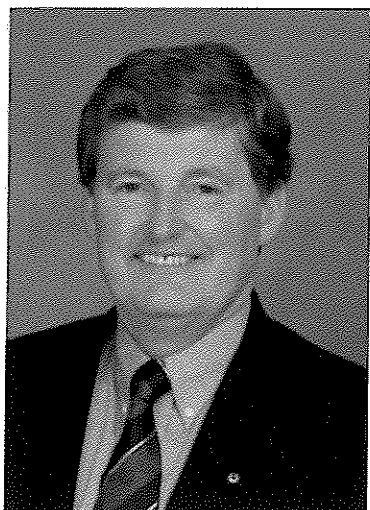
At the top-level, Australia's players are making their presence felt. Young guns like Pat Rafter and Mark Philippoussis are firing up world tennis.

But much of the effort behind the scenes has gone into Tennis Participation, making sure every Australian has a chance to either play tennis or be involved in some way - either as an official, spectator or administrator.

President's Report



*O*n behalf of Tennis Australia, it gives me great pleasure to present the 90th Annual Report and Financial Statements of the Lawn Tennis Association of Australia, trading as Tennis Australia. This report covers the progress and activities for the calendar year ending 31 December, 1994.

It was a difficult year for tennis, both globally and in Australia. Public and media criticism of the way the game is played gained momentum and presented a formidable challenge for players, officials and administrators to reverse.

We are confident the tide will turn. Tennis is a great game with characteristics no other sport can match. It is a clean and healthy sport, is still relatively cheap to play and is played by people of both sexes, all ages and all social classes.

A number of significant changes to Tennis Australia administration occurred during the year. After more than a decade of debate, the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory were each given a vote on Council. NSW and Victoria increased their vote to three votes each and the other states remained on two votes each.

The Council formally handed over its director powers to a Board of Directors consisting of the President, Vice President, three Councillors and two outside Directors. To ensure some continuity, only half the Directors seek re-election each year.

John Newcombe was appointed McDonald's Tennis Australia Davis Cup Captain to replace Neale Fraser, who retired at the end of 1993 after a record 24 years in the position. At a formal function in March, Neale Fraser was awarded Honorary Life Membership of Tennis Australia. He continues to serve the Association as Ambassador for Tennis Australia.

In an unprecedented move, Tony Roche was appointed Davis Cup Coach to join Newcombe as Captain, which gave another dimension to one of the greatest combinations of all time.

There was also a change in the Federation Cup where Lesley Bowrey took over from Wendy Turnbull as McDonald's Tennis Australia Federation Cup Captain. The team will take its place in Group 1 in a new-look Fed Cup in 1995.

The appointment of Tony Roche and the

expanded program undertaken by Lesley Bowrey are supported by the Olympic Athlete Program, which is a joint project of the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Olympic Committee and the State Institutes.

Another former Davis Cup player, John Alexander, took over from John Newcombe as Chairman of the Player Development Board.

There were some good results on the international circuit during the year, especially by the male players, many of whom achieved their best-ever rankings. Equally important, there were some very promising performances by our juniors, which heralds good things to come.

During the year, the Association increased its commitment and contribution towards Participation, with a new Participation Board.

Together with the Tennis Industry Council, and the new Community Development Program, which is supported by the ball manufacturers, there is now a wealth of ideas on participation being converted to action.

Tennis Australia manages Flinders Park under an agreement with the National Tennis Centre Trust and the Victorian Government. This agreement was re-negotiated and, as part of this agreement, the Government announced a re-financing structure that ensured Stage Two would be undertaken in 1995.

Tennis Australia acknowledges the support of Ford, McDonald's, the Australian Sports Commission, the Olympic Athlete Program, the Seven Network and our other sponsors for their contribution to tennis.

Tennis Australia continued its own huge financial contribution to all aspects of the game in Australia, ranging from court construction to coaching, sending players overseas or supporting tournaments in Australia. The ultimate result was that in 1994 expenditure exceeded income. The Association has the reserves from previous years to absorb this loss, but the overall program is being reviewed.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to my colleagues on the Council and the Executive Board for their support, and to our hard working and loyal staff for the tremendous job they have done throughout the year.

Ford Australian Open

*P*ete Sampras and Steffi Graf continued their domination of international tennis at the 1994 Ford Australian Open - the 89th year of the event. The men's and women's world number one both blitzed their respective opponents, but in decidedly different fashion.

Top seed Sampras overcame a spirited Todd Martin, playing his first Grand Slam final, in three tight sets. Graf played devastating tennis - which many experienced judges reported was the best tennis any woman had ever played - to crush world number two Arantxa Sanchez Vicario in just under an hour. Graf dropped just two games.

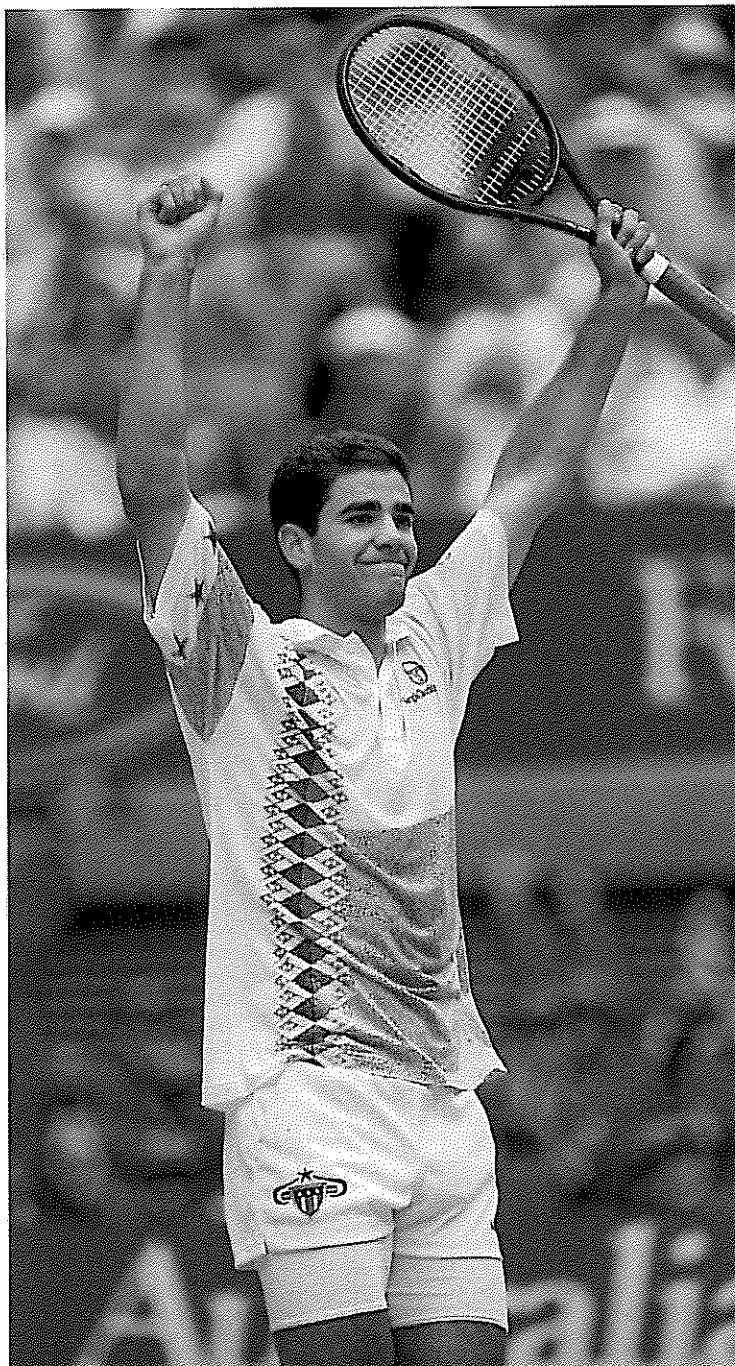
Both Graf and Sampras continued the trend, since Australia's Grand Slam moved to Flinders Park in 1988, that the event has only ever been won by the world's top-ranked man or woman.

The field was also world-class - 28 of the world's top 30 men and 27 of the world's top 30 women entered the 1994 Championships.

One thousand on-site media helped ensure Australia's biggest sporting event commanded centre stage.

All 14 day and nine night sessions were telecast live on the Seven Network in Australia and the action was relayed live to more than 500 million people in 50 countries. Many more received the one hour highlights package for delayed coverage.

The Ford Australian Open is also Australia's richest sporting event. The 1994 Ford Australian Open again boasted record prizemoney. Sampras and Graf collected \$460,000 each, and the total payment to players was \$8,158,500 - a 12 per cent increase.

The event employed more than 1,600 staff in 30 different areas, including 180 courtesy car drivers, 170 ballpeople, 309 umpires and 45 scoreboard operators.

Aussie legends Evonne Goolagong Cawley and Rod Laver were inducted into Australia's Tennis Hall of Fame, in a special Australia Day celebration at Flinders Park.

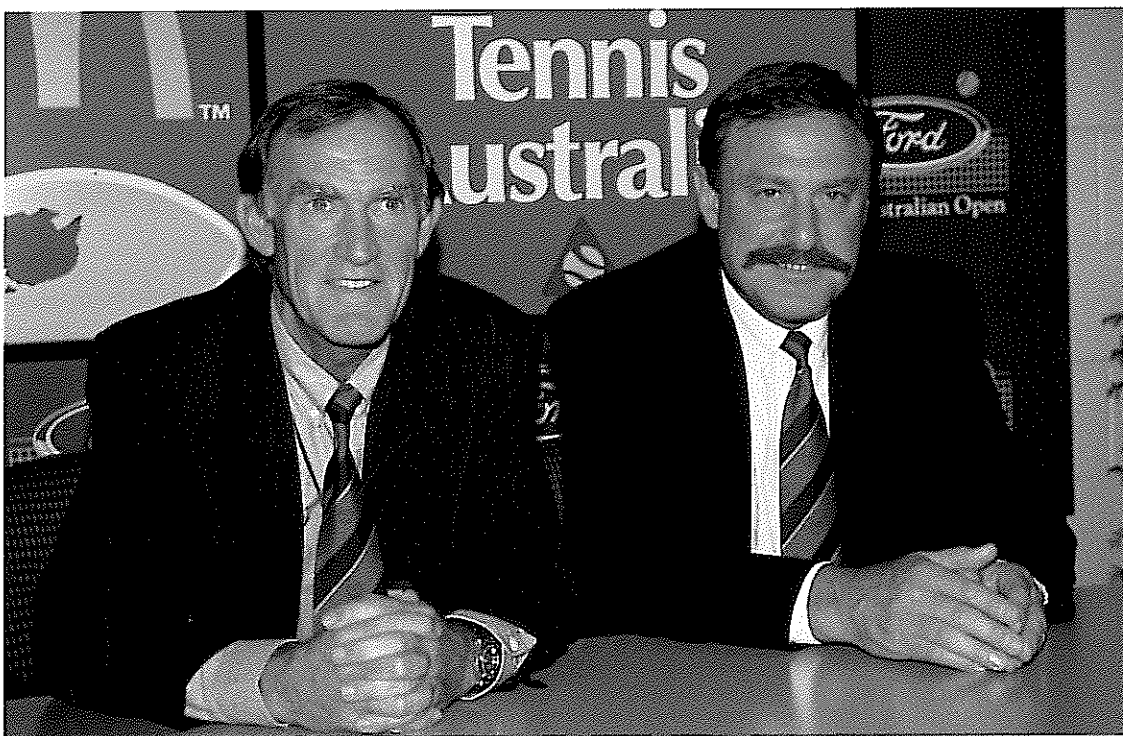
HIGHLIGHTS

John Newcombe and Tony Roche, who in a historic move had been appointed McDonald's Tennis Australia Davis Cup Captain and Coach respectively, led their charges into their first tie in Russia.

Newk and Roche took the bold step and selected two rookies, Pat Rafter and Jamie Morgan, to make their Davis Cup debuts. But playing Russia in the midst

of a St Petersburg winter was always going to be tough, Russia was too strong and Australia faced the grim reality of a qualifying tie in September to survive.

But Australia turned in a solid performance in front of a vocal home-town crowd in Christchurch, New Zealand. Australia ensured its record of always being part of the World Group remained intact - it qualified again for the World Group in 1995.

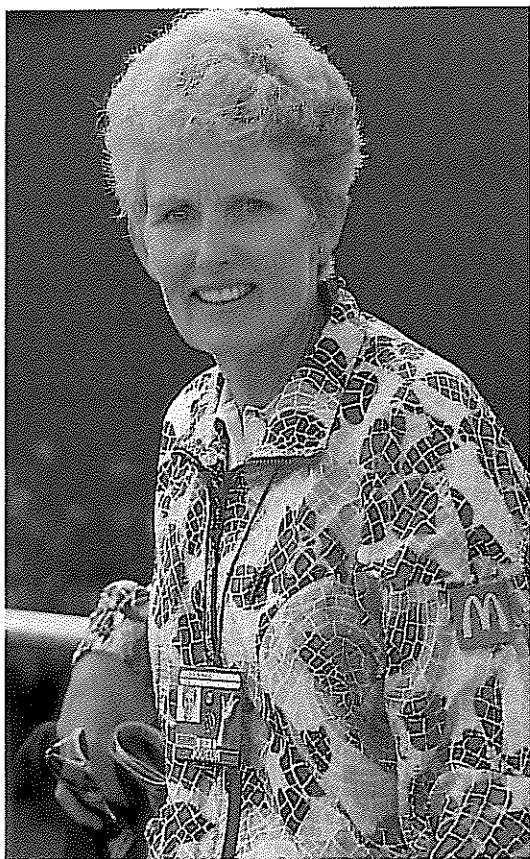
Federation Cup

HIGHLIGHTS

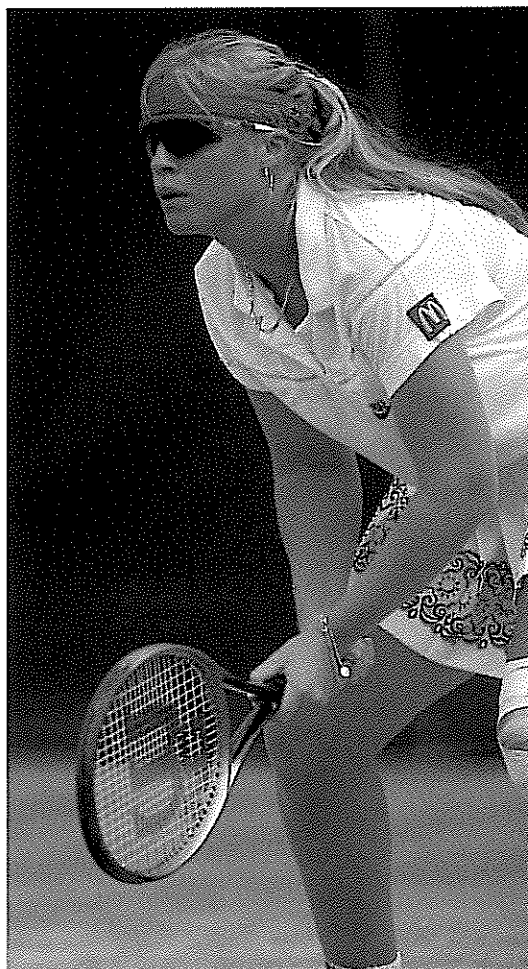
This was the last year the Federation Cup was played under the old format, where the top 32 nations play at the one venue over one week. In 1995 the competition will be known as Fed Cup, and will boast home-and-away ties, along the same lines as Davis Cup.

By winning its first round against Latvia in Frankfurt, The McDonald's Tennis Australia Federation Cup ensured a spot for the top 16 nations in 1995, rather than having to face regional qualifying.

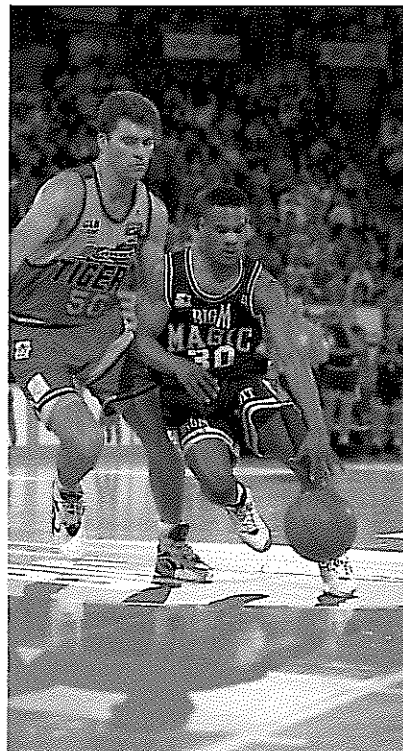
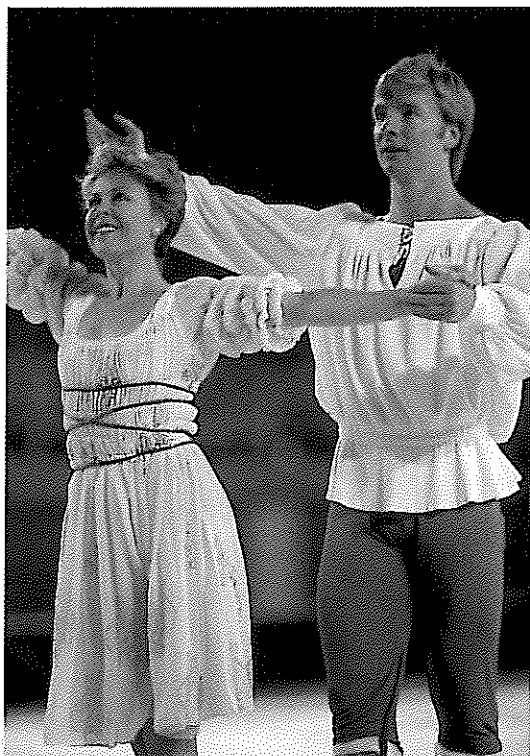

More than 233,000 people attended 30 basketball games at Flinders Park, the third year of basketball for the venue.

The two home teams - S.E. Melbourne Magic and Melbourne Tigers both made the finals. In the first time since moving to Flinders Park, both were defeated in the semi-finals. Melbourne Tigers were defeated by the Adelaide Super Sixers and S.E. Melbourne Magic by the North Melbourne Giants.

FLINDERS PARK TENNIS

More than 50,000 people "played where the champions play" in 1994, which gave tennis enthusiasts of all standards a first hand opportunity to experience Flinders Park's world-class facilities.

More than 8,000 children participated in introductory clinics, which were developed with the support of Sunsmart and conducted by Flinders Park coaches.

Corporate membership were popular, boosted by the extension of available court time. Social competition provided a friendly-yet-competitive outlet for regular players, with year-round week night competition for more than 100.

Tennis Australia's official introductory program for juniors, Ace Tennis is now offered at Flinders Park, directed by the coaching team.

Major tournaments that were held at Flinders Park included the McDonald's Nationals, Coca-Cola Masters, Country and Metropolitan Carnivals, National Wheelchair Championships, and Victorian Schoolboys and Schoolgirls Championships.

FUNCTIONS/CONFERENCES

Several hundred small functions and conferences took place at Flinders Park when the venue was not being used for a major event.

A new logo for Flinders Park was introduced in 1994. The logo reflects the multi-purpose nature of the venue and the unique design feature of the building - the opening roof. The logo forms part of a corporate image campaign for the entire venue that is being implemented over two years.

STAGE TWO DEVELOPMENT

The multi-million dollar Stage Two Development was endorsed as an Agenda 21 project by the Victorian Government. The expansion, to cost \$23 million including clearance of the site, will ensure the Ford Australian Open continues to flourish.

The development will provide much-needed facilities including two stadium courts, eight other Rebound Ace courts, one clay court, a function centre with a capacity of up to 1800, a 500 space car park and a large garden area. It will occupy 5.5 hectares on land previously occupied by the railway yards.

Construction commenced in January 1995 and is scheduled to be completed by December, in time for the 1996 Ford Australian Open.

Officiating

The standard of officiating continued to improve in 1994. The Ford Australian Open, with 260 Australian and 50 overseas officials, was again the highlight of the officiating year.

The ongoing education and development of officials was a major priority. An ITF Level 2 Course was conducted in Sydney, where 13 Australians achieved White Badge status.

Level 1 Courses were held in each State, adding significantly to the number of formally educated umpires available. The ITF Level 1 is now the standard introductory course for all Australian umpires. A Level 1 Referees Course is also being finalised.

Australian officials continue to be highly regarded overseas - 10 umpires were selected for both Wimbledon and the US Open, in addition to other overseas appointments.

Donna Ring from NSW was appointed to the ITF full-time officiating team as a chair umpire, which was a notable achievement.

Various other initiatives such as the Junior Umpire System and Player Education recommendations were introduced during the year and should benefit tennis in general.

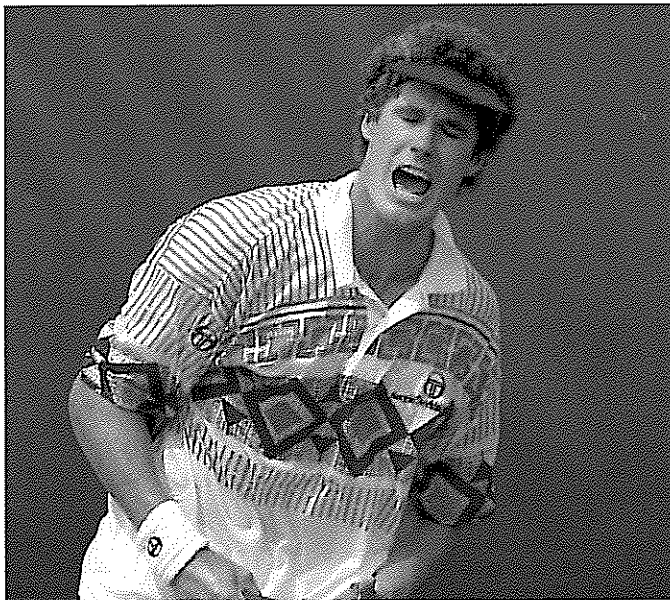
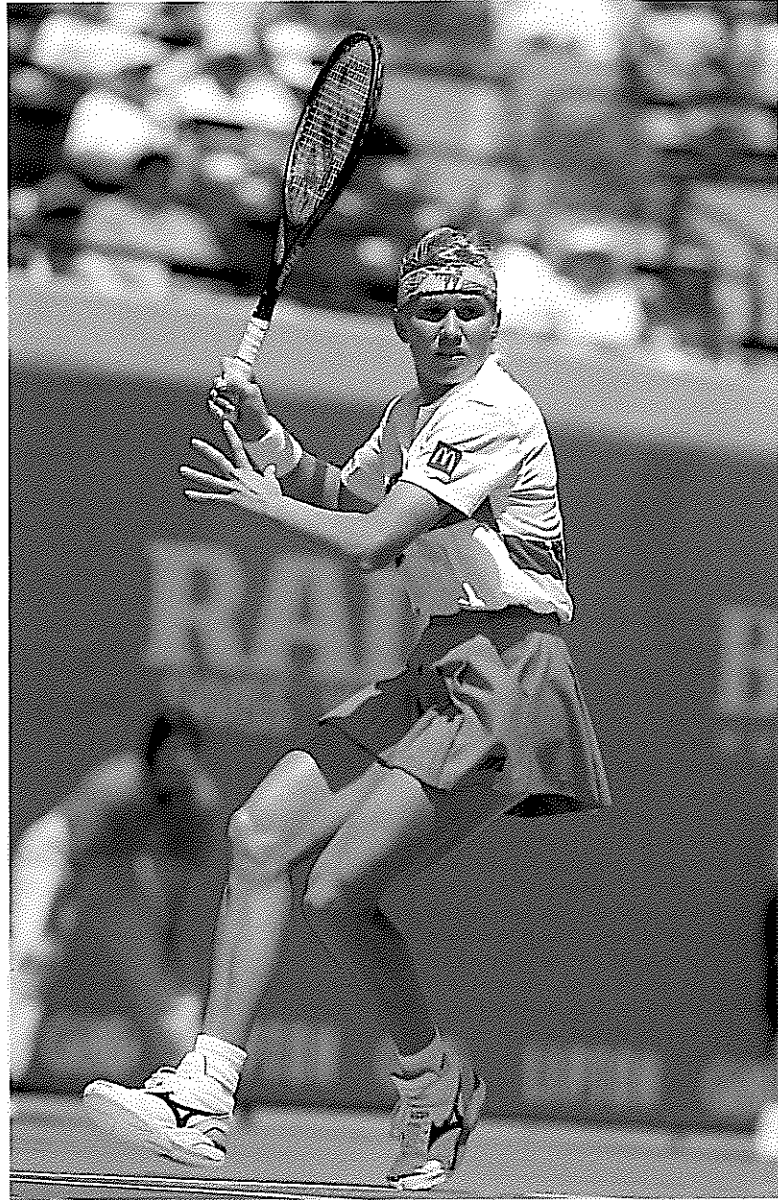

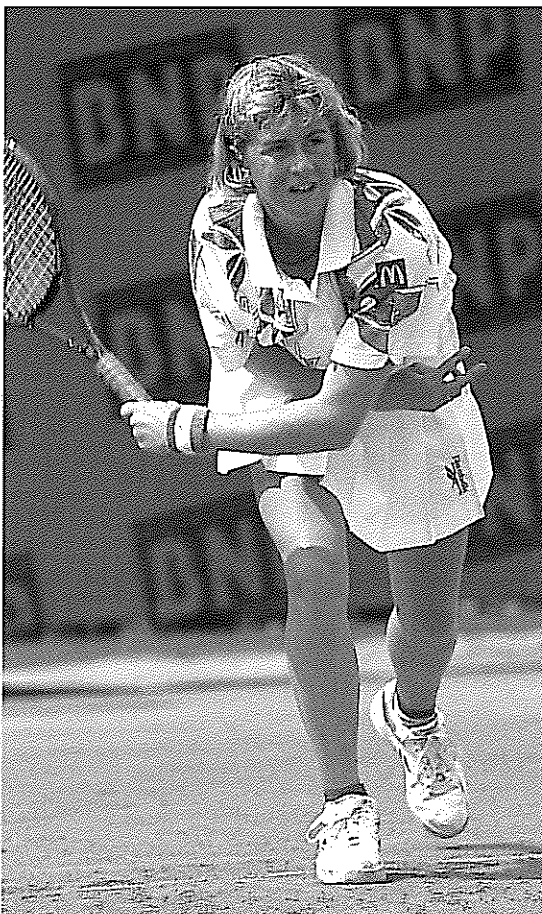

Tennis Industry Council

The Tennis Industry Council, a group consisting of Tennis Australia and key industry representatives and chaired by Director, Mr Bill Beischer, continued to meet on a regular basis, giving an industry view on the promotion of tennis in Australia.

The Council supports a national marketing campaign putting greater emphasis on

participation; the development of "cool, streetwise" tennis attire and the concept of a National Tennis Fun Day.

Proposed industry breakfast and luncheon forums in 1995 will give the opportunity for Tennis Australia and the Tennis Industry to exchange views in an open environment.

Tennis for People with Disabilities

Through the support of the Australian Sports Commission, Tennis Australia has continued to provide opportunities for people with intellectual, sensory and physical disabilities to get involved in tennis at a level which suits them.

Developments in the program in 1994 included:

- Through the grassroots funding scheme, 20 tennis programs around Australia have been developed at tennis clubs and centres.
- Come'n Try Days continue to provide opportunities for people with disabilities to have their first taste of tennis and to get involved in tennis club activities.
- An intensive training camp was held at Flinders Park for the Australian Deaf Tennis Squad. The camp was held to prepare the squad for overseas competition in 1995.
- The Ford Australian Wheelchair Tennis Open was upgraded by the International Wheelchair Tennis Federation this year in recognition of its development.
- Australia won the World Team Cup for wheelchair tennis for the first time in the event's ten-year history. The all-NSW team comprised of David Hall and Michael Connell, who did not lose a rubber for the entire competition.
- The Tennis for People with Disabilities coaching module continued to be implemented into the Tennis Professionals Australia trainee courses around Australia. This ensures that coaches coming through the system will have an understanding of coaching athletes with a disability.
- The Special Olympics National Championships were held in Perth in November. It was the first time that tennis was a medal sport in the championships for the intellectually disabled.

Media and Public Relations

A proactive media and public relations strategy has helped keep tennis in the spotlight 12 months of the year.

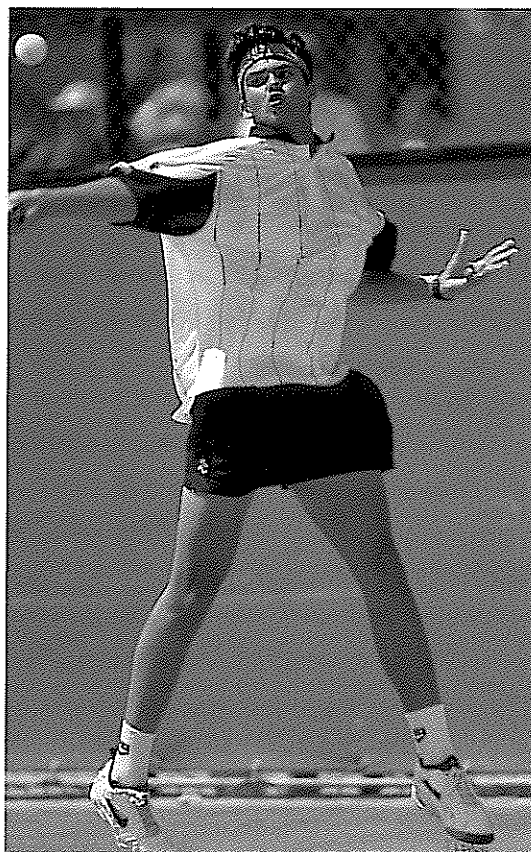
Media coverage has been generated on the realm of Tennis Australia initiatives - ranging from McDonald's Tennis Australia programs like Davis and Federation Cup, international touring teams and junior development; to coverage of veterans tennis, participation and Tennis for People With Disabilities.

Australia's biggest sporting event, the Ford Australian Open, which attracts 1,000 local and international media, has continued to be a key element of the media campaign and commands positive front and back page news around the world.

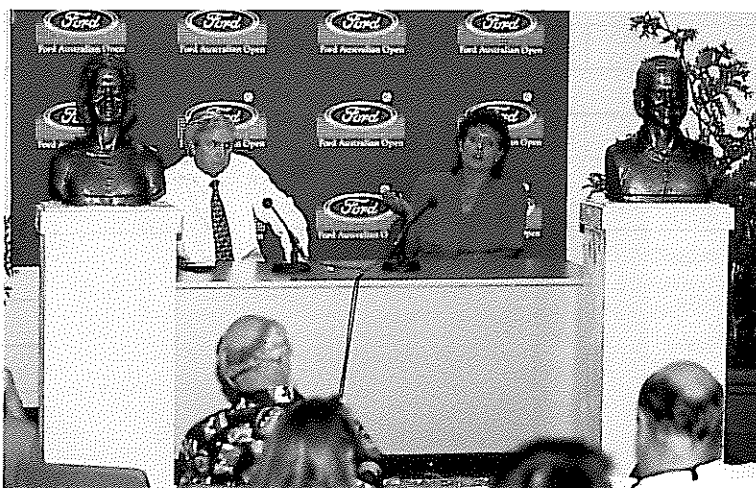
The Media and Public Relations team also handles thousands of media enquiries and requests for official comment each year from media representatives in Australia and overseas.

Media training workshops with Australia's top juniors have been held around Australia, which is part of Tennis Australia's campaign to help develop various aspects of a tennis player's progression.

Thanks to Ford's support, Media Awards were introduced during the October Media launch of the Ford Australian Open, in a bid to encourage responsible and accurate reporting of tennis in general and the Ford Australian Open.

McDonald's Tennis Australia

JUNIORS

The first year of the new McDonald's Tennis Australia program, which replaced McDonald's Junior Tennis Australia (MJTA), also marked the anniversary of a successful 10-year partnership between Tennis Australia and McDonald's.

Despite the broadening of the overall program, the main elements of the junior national program - squads, competitions, tournaments and overseas touring teams - continued in 1994.

The year started with the world-class wins of Trudi Musgrave and Ben Ellwood in the Ford Australian Open Junior Championships. Young powerhouse Mark Philippoussis was runner-up in the Junior Wimbledon Championships. Ben Ellwood capped off a great year by finishing number three in singles in the ITF Junior World Rankings and number one in doubles. Andrew Ilie was ranked eight, James Sekulov 15, Trudi Musgrave six and Annabel Ellwood was ranked 19.

In the domestic program the Australian Championships were restructured. A 12/u hardcourt tournament was introduced, while the previous 14/u and 16/u Nationals were replaced with the 14/u and 16/u McDonald's Australian Claycourt Championships.

Another initiative was the introduction of the 14/u and 16/u McDonald's Australian Grasscourt Championships. As a result there are now Australian Championships contested on the three main surfaces - hardcourt, claycourt and grasscourt.

A new Player Development Board was elected: - John Alexander (Chairman); Helen Gourlay; Steven Healy; Peter Johnston; Barry McMillan; Gary Penberthy; Geoff Pollard; Alan Stone; Vanette Tobin. John Newcombe, following his appointment as McDonald's Tennis Australia Davis Cup Captain, stepped down after nine years as Chairman of this Board, while Carol O'Sullivan, Kerry Pratt and Brian Beers did not seek re-election to the Board.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

- A continuation of the decentralisation of the AIS program, with both residential and non-residential scholarships offered.
- 23 International Tennis Associations/Federations were represented at the 1994 Australian Junior Championships.
- Continuation of subsidiary sponsorship from the Australian Sports Commission and Coca-Cola (Australian Junior Masters).
- 23 individual players represented McDonald's Tennis Australia in nine countries as part of the overseas touring program. Overall, 48 team positions were filled, with 15 coach/manager positions.
- McDonald's Tennis Australia junior media training workshops.
- McDonald's Tennis Australia was the major sponsor of the Australian Schools Sports Council's tournaments, the Secondary Schools' Pizzey Cup and Primary Schools' Bruce Cup.
- Promising juniors Mark Philippoussis and Ben Ellwood accompanied The McDonald's Tennis Australia Davis Cup team to ties in Russia and New Zealand, thanks to Optus.

Summer Circuit

*T*he world of tennis begins each year in Australia in January with a progression of tournaments and special events leading up to the Ford Australian Open. In January, Tennis Australia finally achieved events in all States.

However, as the Ford Australian Open now boasts record player participation with 18 of the top 20 players competing in both the men's and women's event, the renewed interest in a January schedule has led to increasing competition to our traditional tournaments.

The circuit began with the Colonial Classic at Kooyong, in late December, 1993, which was

televised by ABC TV. Due to incessant Melbourne rain, the special event was transferred indoors to Flinders Park.

The summer circuit, which is televised on the Seven Network, began with the Pepsi Hopman Cup in Perth, where the Czech Republic defeated Germany in the final. The Australian combination of Wally Masur and Nicole Provis won their way through to the semi finals, defeating Sweden in the first round, France in the quarter finals, before losing to eventual winners, the Czech Republic.

In Adelaide, there was an all-Russian final of the Pura Milk Australian Men's Hardcourt Championships.

with Yevgeny Kafelnikov defeating Alexander Volkov in straight sets.

This proved to be a warning for our Davis Cup match against Russia two months later.

In the same week, the women played in Brisbane, where the Danone Australian Women's Hardcourt Championships was won by the promising young American, Lindsay Davenport, who defeated Florencia Labat of Argentina in straight sets.

The following week both the men and women moved to Sydney for the Peter's NSW Open. Top seed Pete Sampras retained his NSW Men's Open title with a victory over Ivan Lendl in the final.

In the NSW Women's Open, the young Japanese player Kimiko Date was a surprise champion defeating the current title holder and Wimbledon Champion, Conchita Martinez, in the quarter final. She went on to beat Mary Joe Fernandez in the final.

Meanwhile, the other women players contested a new event in Hobart, while six men played the Rio Challenge in Adelaide.

It was a good week for Japanese women, with Mana Endo winning the final of the ANZ Bank Tasmanian International in three close sets over the Australian player Rachel McQuillan.

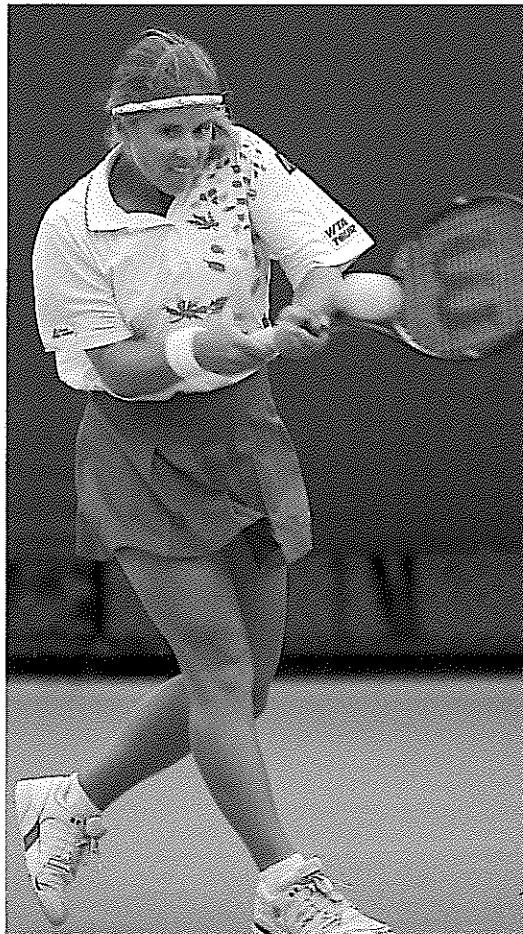
While not part of the traditional summer circuit, the Ansett Australian Indoor Championships in Sydney, in October was televised by Channel 7 for the first time. Australian players performed well - Patrick Rafter and Mark Woodforde both made the semi finals. Both were eliminated with Richard Krajicek going on to defeat Boris Becker in four sets in the final.

Unfortunately, just when Tennis Australia had achieved its goal of major events being played in all Australian States, it was forced to review the program for January 1995, because of the Seven Network's reduction to its telecast to three weeks. The Network believes that less coverage will produce higher ratings.

The events removed from the Seven telecast were the Australian Women's Hardcourt in Brisbane, the Australian Men's Hardcourt in Adelaide and the Hopman Cup in Perth. The Brisbane event has been leased to Indonesia, the Adelaide event will be conducted without television at considerable cost to Tennis Australia, while the Hopman Cup will join the Kooyong event on ABC TV.

Consequently, in 1995 the Seven Network will be left with Peter's NSW Open in Sydney, the International Challenge in Adelaide and the Ford Australian Open in Melbourne. The Adelaide (Men's) and Hobart (Women's) events will both proceed without Australian television.

International Tennis Federation

The Annual General Meeting of the ITF was held in Hong Kong from September 13-17, 1994. Australia was represented by its Vice President, Mr Des Nicholl, Director, Mr Alan Hicks and Chief General Manager, Mr Trevor Dohnt. Tennis Australia President, Mr Geoff Pollard, was also present in his role as a member of the ITF Committee of Management.

The meeting was advised of another successful financial year for the ITF which recorded a financial surplus of US\$4.4 million against an estimated US\$1.8 million, primarily as a result of higher television income, a reduction in expenses and some beneficial changes in exchange rates.

It was a non election year so all our existing members retained their places on the various committees - Mr Geoff Pollard (Committee of Management and Rules Committee), Ms Helen Smith (Junior Tournaments Committee), Mr Harry Spilsbury (Veterans Committee) and Ms Wendy Turnbull (Olympic Committee). In January 1994, Mr Geoff Pollard resigned from the Davis Cup Committee and Mr Neale Fraser was appointed in his place.

The ITF's flagship event, the Davis Cup by NEC, was won by Sweden who defeated Russia in the final in Moscow. It was Russia which eliminated Australia in the first round in St Petersburg. The stature of the Davis Cup competition continues to increase each year.

The Federation Cup by NEC was again successfully conducted in Frankfurt, Germany, with the Spanish team retaining its title with a final round victory against the United States. Australia was defeated by Austria in the second round and will play in the Group One draw in the new look Fed Cup in 1995.

In a difficult economic climate the ITF Marketing Department has produced some excellent

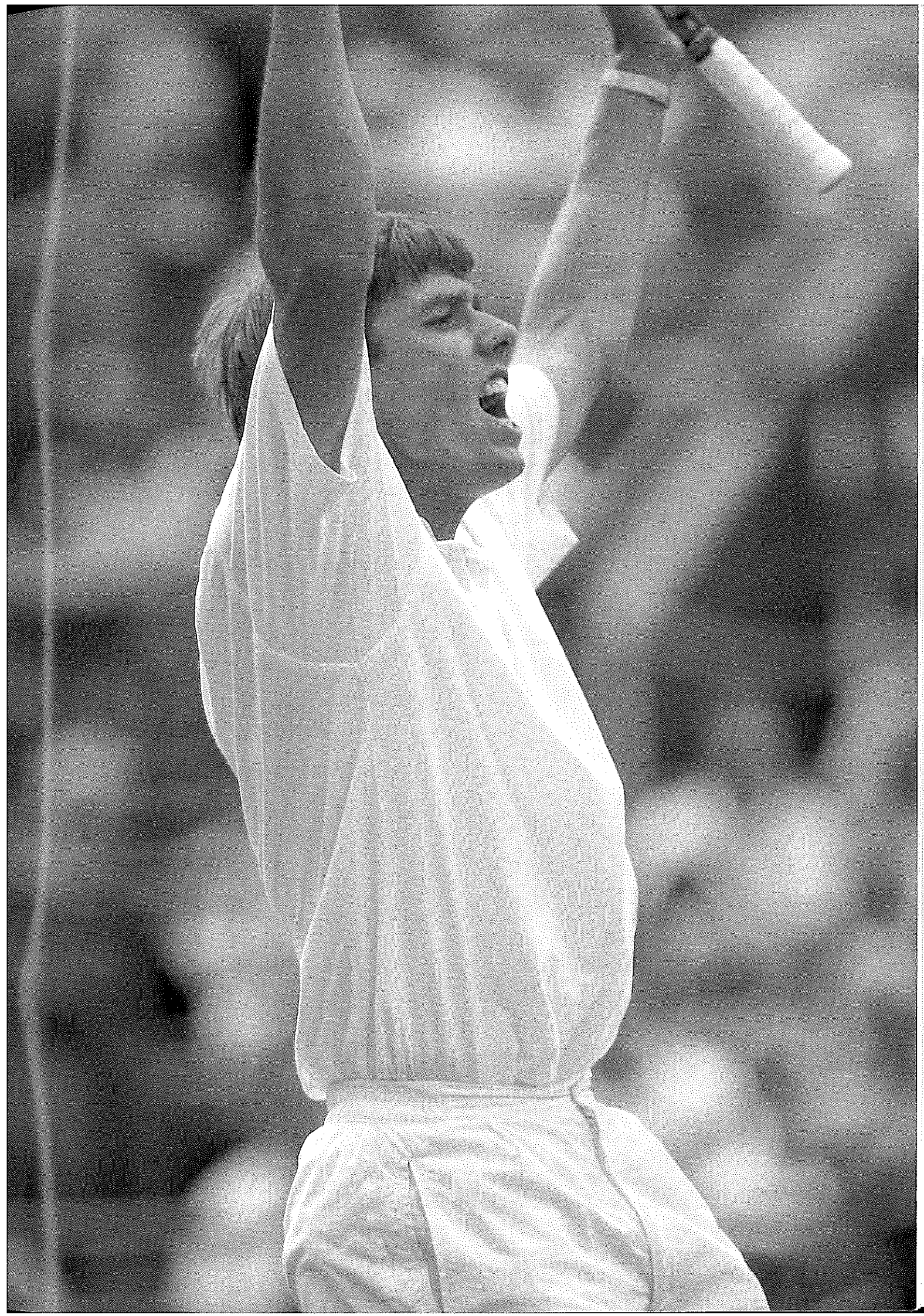
sponsorship contracts for the Davis Cup, World Youth Cup, NTT Juniors and Wheelchair Tennis through to the year 1998, with only the Fed Cup still unsponsored. In addition, a very advantageous television contract has been negotiated with Germany so the ITF financial future appears secure. It was therefore disappointing to be advised that Mike Davies, General Manager and Director of Marketing announced his retirement to apply from April, 1995.

The Grand Slams continued to pledge US\$2 million from the Compaq Grand Slam Cup to the Grand Slam Development Fund which is the backbone of the magnificent efforts by the Federation around the world to develop the game of tennis. For the record, Magnus Larson defeated Pete Sampras to win the Cup. He collected US\$1.5 million while Sampras received US\$750,000 plus a further US\$500,000 as the winner of two Grand Slam events.

After years of negotiation, the ITF was pleased to announce that a joint anti-doping agreement had been reached between the ITF, WTA Tour, ATP Tour and IOC. Common procedures and penalties would now be applied throughout professional tennis, which should be proud that none of its competitors had suffered drug penalties to date.

In another significant development, the WTA Tour finally released the report of the Age Eligibility Commission. While not all the recommendations have yet been adopted, the so-called "burn out" problem amongst young female players has been addressed and positive solutions offered.

It is an honour for Tennis Australia that our former President and Life Member, Mr Brian Tobin, continues to serve as President and CEO of the International Tennis Federation. He carries out this esteemed position with distinction and is highly regarded throughout the tennis world.



Veterans Tennis

Veterans tennis continues as one of the fastest-growing areas of the game.

In 1994, registered Veterans Tennis Association of Australia (VTAA) members totalled 4,300, compared to 4080 last year - an increase of 5.4 per cent.

DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The VTAA has adopted a five-year Development Plan with the prime objective to increase participation. The Plan resulted from a workshop of representatives from all divisions, funded by the Australian Sports Commission, in Melbourne in October.

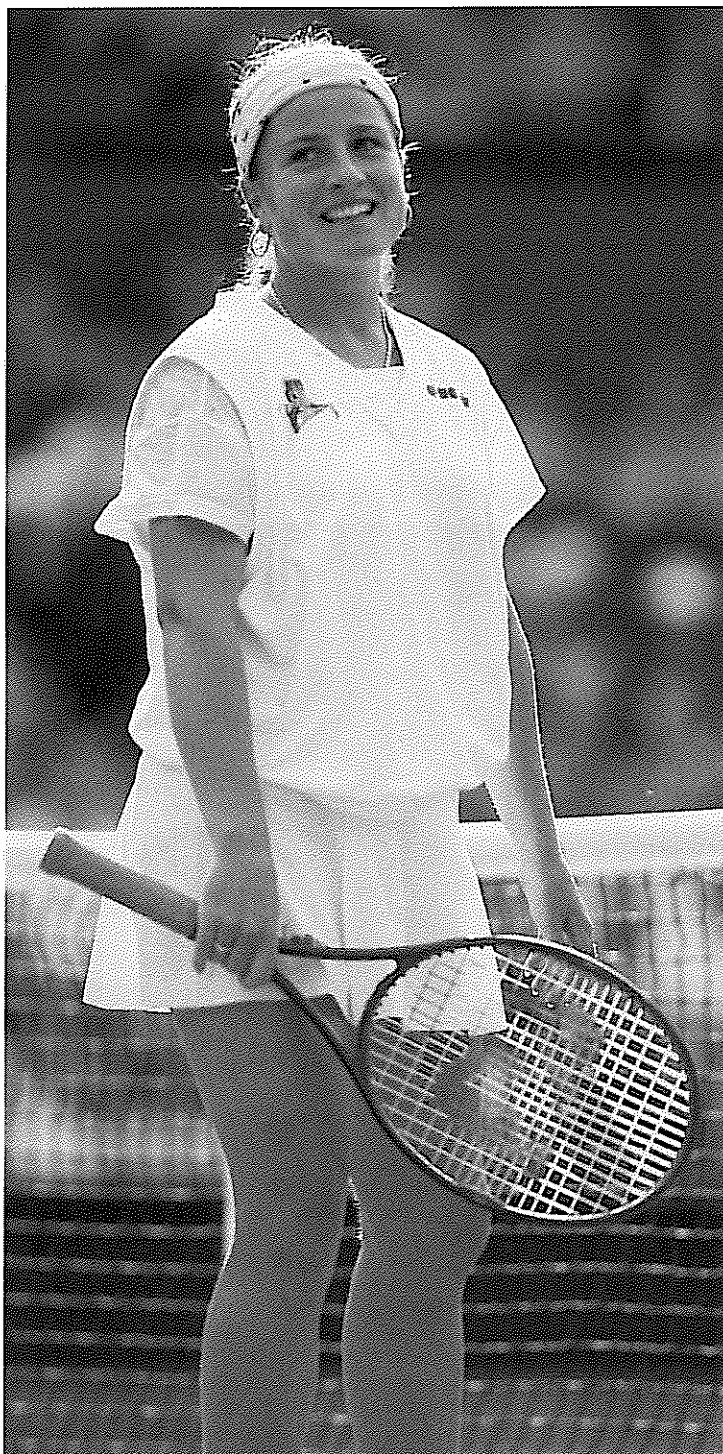

Women in Tennis

*A*s a result of the financial support of the Australian Sports Commission, Tennis Australia has developed a Gender Equity program to provide opportunities for women of all ages to become involved in tennis.

Its initiatives over the past twelve months include:

- An awareness campaign, which has included the distribution of brochures and posters to promote women's tennis and depict positive ways in which women can get involved.



Each state and territory tennis association was also supplied with a promotional display kit.

- The publication of a Women In Tennis Register, which is a booklet containing an up-to-date database on women involved in tennis administration, coaching, officiating and playing.
- Six \$1,000 Tennis Australia Coaching Scholarships, which have been established since 1992, were awarded to female coaches around the country to develop their skills, knowledge and experience in the area of coaching.

Participation

Tennis Australia is committed to developing the growth of the game through its strategic National Participation Plan.

Tennis Australia conducted a national "We're Going To Make It Happen!" participation workshop in March which was the catalyst for the national focus on attracting more people to play tennis.

A range of recommendations were endorsed by the workshop to boost participation and five state participation workshops were held, as part of the consultative process.



ACE TENNIS

Ace Tennis, Tennis Australia's Official Introductory Skills Program, is a fun-orientated skill acquisition program which ideally marks the beginning of a life-long involvement with tennis.

Ace Tennis has been introduced into more than 3,000 primary schools in each state and territory. During the 1994 Ford Australian Open, Tennis Australia conducted Ace Tennis Super Clinics for more than 500 children on the Old Scotch Oval

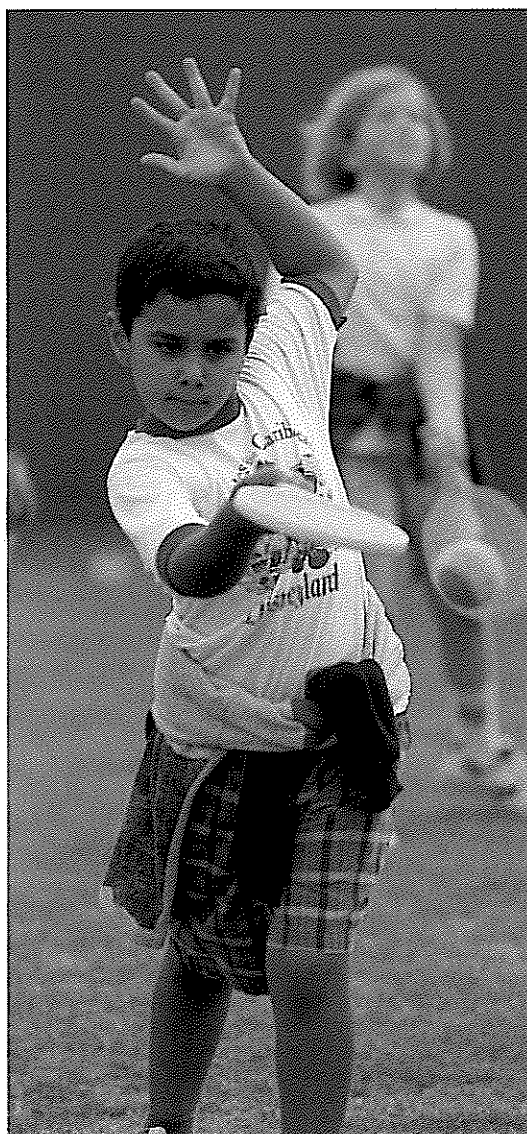
CLUB/CENTRE DEVELOPMENT
