

Introduction

This year, try something new in Galloway! There's a unique chance to get down and dirty with the Iron Age excavation near Monreith, and try construction as you've never known it by putting your mark on history and helping us build a replica Iron Age house at Whithorn. View the Celtic art objects on show at the Whithorn Trust, to see how sophisticated our ancestors of the first millennium BC were; contemporary artists and crafters take over the town during the July Creative Whithorn Art Trail.

Community festivals with competitions, food and fun at the Isle of Whithorn and Port William are a favourite with visitors year after year. Wigtown is flourishing year-round these days, with food and crafts as well as poetry, media and celebrities at its now famous Book Festival. To the north, you can join wildlife events in the Galloway Forests and walks in the Southern Uplands.

There are programmes of family-friendly outdoor events all year at Castle Kennedy and Logan Botanic Gardens, and learning activities at Stranraer's Museum; or if you're enticed by a lofty view from the cliffs, try ascending the lighthouse at the Mull of Galloway. It's Portpatrick for trad music and lifeboats !

Whether you come for forest and upland, beaches, history, food or music, you're welcome!

ROYAL BURGH of Whithorn

To celebrate the Year of Architecture, Innovation and Design, Whithorn has its very own "Grand Design" - not glossy and contemporary this, but the construction of a full-size Iron Age roundhouse, by craftsmen and volunteers. Last year, and returning again in 2016 to a site nearby Monreith, archaeologists unearthed a remarkable series of roundhouses, dating to the mid 400's BC, complete with detailed evidence of construction. The Whithorn reconstruction will involve traditional woodwork and tools. wattle weaving, daub, thatching, as well as a spot of cooking on a hearth which is 2.500 years old. Visit the Whithorn Trust for information about your chance to get involved ! Still on the architectural theme, find out why Whithorn is named after a building,"Candida Casa", the very earliest church in Scotland, and owing to the popular devotion to its saint, Ninian, and his growing cult in the Middle Ages, was often a construction site during the many alterations and extensions to its Cathedral.

Contemporary artists will be participating in workshops during this year focussed on crafts and will showcase their own works during several arts events. Visit their galleries by taking a stroll down Whithorn's urbane Georgian terrace, nearly ¾ mile long !



Isle of Whithorn

Postcards dating from the late 19th Century, when visitors came to nearby Whithorn by train and then on to "The Isle" by horse and cart, prove that the village's salty holiday appeal is nothing new. But the peaceful main street with its brightly painted houses, some with sea front and back, belie a more dramatic past. The headland jutting out into the Solway is the site of a powerful Iron Age fortification. The charming Isle Castle (privately occupied), the last tower house to be built in Scotland in 1664, was occupied in the 18th Century by Sir John Reid, whose charge was to control the blatant smuggling trade centred here and at Port William, both within sight of Isle of Man, only just over fifteen miles away. Brandy and luxuries found their way from here along the Old Edinburgh Road which can still be seen leaving Old Minnigaff.

If you choose to follow the panoramic coastal path from the Post Office round the southernmost point, you will hardly guess that Burrowhead was once the home to hundreds of troops and anti aircraft practice during World War II, or that the cult horror film, The Wicker Man, was filmed here.

St Ninian's Priory Church stands in the grounds of the late medieval cathedral Whithorn Priory. Much of the former cathedral has disappeared since its glory days in the early 16th century when it rivalled the abbeys of Galloway, in wealth and size. Built in 1822, the interior of St Ninian's is pleasantly light with two recently restored stained glass windows and it contains a fine carved pulpit and communion table. By visiting the church you will tread a path that many have taken to reach one of medieval Scotland's major pilgrimage destinations in past years. Do come and visit.



1600 years of Faith, Mud and History



For over 1000 years, pilgrims came to Whithorn, from all over Britain and beyond, seeking cures and forgiveness at the shrine of Scotland's most revered saint. Over the last century, archaeologists have unearthed the story of this earliest Christian community in Scotland, its art and artefacts. Visit us to see how the architecture, trade and power politics of pilgrimage worked, as the Britons, the Anglo-Saxons, the Vikings and the Gaels settled, promoted and reinterpreted Whithorn.

In 2016, we are continuing our excavation of a spectacular Iron Age settlement nearby, and we shall celebrate the Year of Architecture by building a life-size replica roundhouse on our site at Whithorn.Join us this summer to help with ancient carpentry, thatching, wattle and blacksmithing!

This year's special loan from National Museums Scotland features Celtic art from the locality and the Iron Age archaeology of nearby Luce Sands.

On your visit, there's a daily range of traditional home-baking and deli-style platters made with local produce at our visitor centre and our gift shop offers the best of Galloway products.



ROYAL BURGH of WIGTOWN

As befits the site of a former royal castle in the Middle Ages, Wigtown dominates over the Bay, now a designated area for wildfowl on its atmospheric saltmarshes. Looking across to the granite town of Creetown, it's not surprising that a ferry across the bay was the shortest route for pilgrims en route for Whithorn. Wigtown later outshone its more southerly rival Royal Burgh by becoming the County Town, and signs of its status are everywhere : a former jail is visible on Harbour Road, large houses belonging to county families and the lawyers who once attended cases here grace the central square. The County Building is now the hub of the Book Festival, which – more than an autumn fortnight packed with famous names – now includes craft, food and literary events at other times of year. Enjoy its quieter vennels, bookshops and cafes and a splendid view from the Martyr's Monument.

Below the town and its golf course, the most southerly distillery in Scotland perches on the edge of on the peaty Bladnoch, filtering its waters to make the fragrant, Lowland malt, which you can try at the end of a tour of the intricate traditional process.





Galloway's Great Outdoors

The Galloway Hills have attracted walkers and writers for generations; even today as you stand on the peaks of the Southern Uplands, there's nothing but remote uplands and wilderness as far as the eye can see. This rugged area has many titles -UNESCO Biosphere, one of the first Dark Sky Parks in Europe, Cairnsmore of Fleet Nature Reserve but none are half as evocative as the local names : Rig of the Jarkness, the Dungeon Range, the Silver Flow or the Devil's Bowling Green. Join one of the organised walks in May during the Walking Festival to receive expert guidance in what can be surprisingly challenging terrain.

The Galloway Forests were deliberately planted for timber, vet wildlife flourishes here - red squirrel, red deer and red kites are all to be seen. Some of the most challenging mountain biking trails in the country have been developed here; for something more contemplative try fishing on a tranquil inland loch.

Family-friendly beaches are to be found at sheltered Monreith, gently-shelving Garlieston, or all down the eastern side of the Rhins peninsula. At the sheer cliff edges of the Mull, southernmost point in Scotland, you'll see puffins and diving gannets.



For a taste of the exotic, take the scenic coastal route to the South Rhins, enjoying the magnificent beaches of Luce Bay on the way, and visit the tropical outpost of the Royal Botanic Gardens,

Edinburgh, to see magnificent palms, a Gunnera swamp, manicured lawns and a tranquil ornamental fish pond (to say nothing of the award winning tearoom). At nearby Port Logan, with its picturesque early 19th Century lighthouse and fish larder pecked out of the rock, Sir John Ross stopped en route for his epic trip to discover the North West passage, after a crew member severed a finger before they had got beyond his hometown of Stranraer.

Coming back eastwards, Castle Kennedy Gardens are north of the Bay, and have a constant programme of family-friendly activities. Sweeping lawns and shelter belts, with carefully landscaped lochs, were laid out by successive members of the Stair family, best known for Stair's *Institutions of the Laws of Scotland*.

In the Machars, on the gentle beaches of Rigg Bay, Galloway House Gardens is also an 18th Century landscape, with magnificent specimen trees. Claymoddie is the place to add to your plant collection, and see the swallows swooping to drink over the pond.

The Rhins

With its miles of rocky coastline (traced by coastal paths) and sandy beaches, the history of the Rhins is intertwined with the sea : it boasts no fewer than two lighthouses, north and south. both of which you can visit (the north, a luxury hotel). At Portpatrick, today's lifeboat is a high tech affair, replacing wooden boats which were bravely rowed out into the choppy waters of the North Channel; the RNLI lifeboat week is a prominent feature of Portpatrick's lively summer calendar. The harbour there is built to protect the picturesque village from the tides and provides an intimate space for cafe culture to flourish. Nearby Stranraer is the regional shopping centre, with small independent shops and narrow streets circling its central Castle of St John.


Museums

Whatever the weather, you will want to familiarise yourself with the region's culture and history, which, thanks to multiple layers of invaders and settlers, is one of the most complex in Scotland. You can't miss the castles dotted all along the line of the A75 and administered by Historic Environment Scotland. At Creetown, once the jumping off point for ferries heading to Wigtown on the pilgrimage route to Whithorn, you can learn about the granite quarrying that - literally - built the town and head up the steep brae to the Gem Rock Museum, to learn all about geology and gemstones : just visible to the north, the rounded granite intrusion of Cairnsmore of Fleet, and the UNESCO Biosphere, home to Galloway's true wilderness and Dark Sky Park. Take one of the old roads into the nature reserve and see the vertiginous railway viaduct which features in the 39 Steps film.

To understand the area's agricultural history, you'll head to Stranraer Museum, with varied exhibitions, and Newton Stewart with its charming displays of 19th and 20th Century domestic technology. Whithorn is the jewel in the crown for historians and archaeologists, with its internationally important collection of Early Mediaeval Christian stones.


