### SEASON & SERIES NOTES; CONNECTIONS

**2015-16 Season Series:** The Lakers are 2-0 against the Pelicans this season.

**All-Time Series Notes:** The Lakers lost the 2013-14 season series to New Orleans 1-2, after sweeping the previous three season series (11 games straight, including overcoming a 25-point deficit and scoring 20 unanswered points to close the game March 6, 2013 in New Orleans) ... It was only the second series loss in franchise history (2006-07) ... The Lakers are 16-7 all-time against New Orleans at STAPLES Center in the regular season ... Since the Pelicans move to New Orleans from Charlotte prior to the 2002-03 season, the Lakers have gone 14-6 at New Orleans Arena while going 0-2 at Ford Center in Oklahoma City during their temporary relocation from 2005-07... In 2006, the Lakers and Pelicans took part in the city of New Orleans' first professional sports game following Hurricane Katrina when they met at the New Orleans Arena March 8, 2006 ... The Lakers won that contest 113-107 behind 40 points from Kobe Bryant ... In 2006-07, Bryant scored a series record 50 points 3/23/07, becoming just the second player in NBA history to score 50+ points in four consecutive games ... The Lakers and Pelicans met for the first time in the playoffs in 2010-11 with Los Angeles taking the First Round series 4-2.

**Connections:** Lakers G **Kobe Bryant** and Pelicans F/C **Anthony Davis** won a gold medal at the 2012 Olympic Games in London as teammates on the United States men's basketball team ... Lakers Head Coach **Byron Scott** coached New Orleans from 2004 to 2009 ... Lakers Assistant Coach **Paul Pressey** served as an assistant for New Orleans from 2007-10 ... Scott coached Pelicans F **Alonzo Gee** on the Cleveland Cavaliers from 2010-2013 ... Lakers Assistant Coach **Jim Emen** coached Pelicans G **Tyreke Evans** when he held the same position in Sacramento from 2009-2013 ... Emen was an assistant with Pelicans Assistant Coach **Fred Vinson** for the Los Angeles Clippers during the 2008-09 season ... Lakers F/G **Nick Young** was teammates with Gee on the Washington Wizards in 2009 and 2010 ... Young (2012-13) and Lakers G **Lou Williams** (2009-12) were teammates with Pelicans G **Jrue Holiday** on the Philadelphia 76ers ... Holiday attended high school at Campbell Hall in Studio City, CA and played his lone collegiate season (2008-09) at UCLA ... Pelicans Assistant Coach **Robert Pack** coached Young while serving as an assistant coach on the Los Angeles Clippers staff in 2012 ... Pack played under Scott in New Jersey in 2003-04 ... Pack also played collegiately at USC from 1989-91 ... Lakers F **Brandon Bass** played for New Orleans from 2005-2007 and attended LSU from 2003-05 ... Bass was teammates with Pelicans F **Ryan Anderson** on the Orlando Magic from 2009-2011 ... Bass and Lakers C **Robert Sacre** were born in Baton Rouge, LA, and Bass went on to play at Capitol High School ... Pelicans G **Eric Gordon** made his NBA debut against the Lakers on October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2008 ... Pelicans G **Toney Douglas** was originally drafted by the Lakers with the 29<sup>th</sup> overall pick in 2009 but was then traded to the New York Knicks ... Pelicans F **James Ennis** was born in Ventura, California and later played at Long Beach State from 2011-13 ... Pelicans G **Bryce Dejean-Jones** was born in Los Angeles and played basketball at William Howard Taft High School before playing one season (2010-11) at USC ... The Lakers remained perfect in the month of February and captured their first win on a Thursday this season in five chances with a victory to kick off the four game road trip leading into the All-Star break. Taking a 10-point lead into the final quarter after outscoring the Pelicans 33-20 in the second frame and leading by as many as 13, the Lakers staved off a come-from-behind defeat thanks in part to a Kobe Bryant dagger three-pointer with under a minute remaining to push the lead to six points at 98-92. Bryant was the most impactful Laker for a second straight game, leading the team with 27 points and 12 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. Jordan Clarkson scored 16 points in the first half and finished with 18 for the game, with D'Angelo Russell (13) and Nick Young (11) bolstering the offense from the second unit. L.A. held New Orleans to 4-20 shooting from long-distance and the Pelicans shot just 14-26 from the charity stripe, helping the Lakers overcome forcing just seven turnovers. Anthony Davis scored 39 points on 16-25 shooting with 11 rebounds for New Orleans, and combined with Jrue Holiday (19 points), Ryan Anderson and Bryce Dejean-Jones (17 each) to score 92 of their 96 points. The Lakers scored 16 fast break points, converting six of their eight chances - while New Orleans only came away with points on five of their 13 opportunities - and outrebounded the Pelicans by eight.

Kobe Bryant played for the 69<sup>th</sup> and final time against the Clippers – the most times he has played against one franchise in his career – in the penultimate home contest of his career and the second game of a back-to-back set against the hallway rivals, but the Lakers fell for the second straight night. Bryant led all scorers with 17 points, while Julius Randle (20 rebounds, seven points) put together a historic performance on the glass becoming the youngest Laker to ever grab 20 rebounds in a game. Rounding out the Lakers in double-figures were D'Angelo Russell (13 points), Jordan Clarkson (13 points, two steals) and Tarik Black (11 points, five rebounds). Russell also made history, sinking his 124<sup>th</sup> and 125<sup>th</sup> three-pointers of the year to eclipse Nick Van Exel's (123) previous franchise record for most three-pointers made by a rookie in a season. The start of the game was much different than the night prior, with the Lakers competing right from the jump and trailing just 29-25 after the first quarter. However, the Lakers allowed the Clippers to widen the deficit in the second frame and trailed by 12 points at the half. Trailing by as many as 17 in the second half, the Lakers could not manage to get the deficit back to single digits. For the Clippers, DeAndre Jordan led the way with 15 points and 11 rebounds, while Chris Paul tallied 13 points and eight assists, and Blake Griffin chipped in 13 points with eight rebounds. J.J. Redick also pitched in 15 points for the Clippers.

## LAKERS LATEST

### RANDLE REBOUNDS

Julius Randle corralled a career-high 20 rebounds, becoming the first Laker since Ed Davis (20) 2/4/15 at Milwaukee to reach the 20 rebound plateau.

- At 21 years and 129 days, Randle became the youngest Laker to ever grab 20+ rebounds in a game.
  - The previous youngest to grab 20+ was Rudy LaRusso, who hauled in 20 rebounds on 11/26/1959 when he was 22 years and 15 days old.
- The 21-year-old is 4<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in defensive rebounding percentage (32.3%) and 10<sup>th</sup> in total rebounding percentage (19.8).
- Randle is 1<sup>st</sup> among sophomore players as well as 6<sup>th</sup> overall in the NBA in total rebounds.
- He set the Lakers individual bench-high in rebounding with 14 12/15 vs. MIL.
- Randle has led the team in rebounding 66 times this season.
- The sophomore has 45 10+ rebound games this year, including eight with 15+ boards.

### KOBE VS. THE CLIPS

Kobe Bryant played his 69<sup>th</sup> and final game against the Clippers 4/6, the franchise he has faced the most times in his career.

- With the start, it marked Kobe's 61<sup>st</sup> time starting against the Clippers, breaking a tie with Memphis for most games started against a single opponent.

### 3'ANGELO

D'Angelo Russell surpassed Nick Van Exel (123) 4/6 vs. LAC for most three-pointers made by a rookie in Lakers history (125).

- He is also the youngest player in NBA history to make 120+ triples in a single season.
- Russell is the youngest rookie in NBA history to make at least 120 three-pointers in a season and one of only 20 players total to achieve the feat.
- D'Angelo became the youngest player in NBA history to make eight three-pointers in a game 3/1 vs. BKN at 20 years and seven days, surpassing Brandon Jennings' mark of 20 years, 177 days set 3/19/10.
  - The eight triples in a game are the most by a rookie in Lakers history (previously Nick Van Exel with six, twice).

### DEFENDING THE DEEP BALL

The Lakers have held their last four opponents to 27.2% shooting (25-92) from deep.

- Miami made just three triples in the overtime contest 3/30, tying an opponent season-low.

### THAT'S SO METTA

Metta World Peace scored a team-leading 17 points off the bench 4/5 at LAC, the first time he has led the team in scoring this season and first time he has led the Lakers in scoring since 1/25/13 vs. UTA (17 points, tied for team lead).

- The last time World Peace scored the most points outright was 1/8/13 (24 points at HOU).

### HOME SWEET HOME

Lakers guard Kobe Bryant set the NBA record for the most regular-season games played at one venue 4/3 vs. BOS. It was Bryant's 596<sup>th</sup> game at STAPLES Center, passing Hakeem Olajuwon's mark of 595 games played at The Summit (later known as Compaq Center).

### DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Julius Randle in one of only nine players in the NBA averaging a double-double this season, and is doing so in the fewest minutes per game (28.1) of anyone in the group.

### LEFTY LIVE

Julius Randle notched his team-leading 34<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season 4/3 vs. BOS, with 20 points and 10 rebounds.

- 3/22 vs. MEM, Randle finished with a career-high three blocks.
- Randle is currently 1<sup>st</sup> among second-year players in double-doubles.
- The 21-year-old is one of 10 players in the NBA with 34+ point/rebound double-doubles.
- He owns six 20/10 games this season.

## JU FOR TWO

Julius Randle hit a game-winning 8' jumper with :01.9 seconds remaining 3/30 vs. MIA to give L.A. its first overtime win of the year (in two chances) and slimmest winning margin in 2015-16 (two points).

- Randle finished with 13 points and 14 rebounds, his 33<sup>rd</sup> double-double of the season.

## MARVELOUS MARCELO

Marcelo Huertas had a **career-high** 10 assists 3/18 vs. PHX, the **most** assists by a Laker this season.

- Marcelo scored a **career-best** 13 points on a **career-high** six made field goals 3/10 vs. CLE.
- He had a **career-high** six rebounds 3/8 vs. ORL.
- Huertas is averaging 3.3 assists in his 15.6 minutes per game, **1-3<sup>rd</sup>-best amongst rookies this season**.

## JORDAN RULES

Jordan Clarkson has scored 20+ points 18 times this season.

- He scored in double-figures in a **career-best 27 consecutive games**, beginning 12/30 and stretching to 2/24.
- He has led the Lakers in scoring 16 times (**two** ties).

## RE-LOU-VENATED

In his **nine** games since returning from injury, Lou Williams has led the team in scoring **five** times (all from the bench).

- 3/18 vs. PHX, Williams scored 30 points off the bench, the **most** points scored by a Laker reserve this season.

## RUSSELL RISING

Since returning to the starting lineup 21 games ago, D'Angelo Russell has **eight** 20+ and **one** 30+ point scoring games in that span and scored 20+ points in **four** straight games from 2/24-3/2, the longest streak of his career.

- Russell set a **career-high** with eight free throws made and led the team in scoring with 22 points 2/26 vs. MEM.
- 2/24 at MEM, Russell posted 22 points to go with a **career-high** eight assists.

- He notched his **third** career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds 1/10 vs. UTA.
- Nance Jr. tied a career-high with three blocks 3/18 vs. PHX.
- His six offensive rebounds 1/1 vs. PHI and 10 defensive caroms 1/3 vs. PHX marked **career-bests**.

## HIBBERT'S HOUSE

Roy Hibbert had four blocks 3/28 at UTA, his fourth 4+ block game of the season, and **moved into 73<sup>rd</sup> place in NBA history for career blocks**, surpassing Thurl Bailey and Ervin Johnson.

- Hibbert is 23<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA with 1.38 blocks per game, including tallying a **season-high** five rejections 10/30 at SAC.
- Roy has the **10<sup>th</sup>-most blocks among active players**.
- Hibbert has led the Lakers in blocks in 40 games (14 ties) on the year.
- The 8<sup>th</sup>-year pro recorded his 1,000<sup>th</sup> career block 11/3 vs. DEN.

## ALL ABOUT THAT BASS

Brandon Bass is shooting a **team-best 54.9% from the field this season**.

- 3/22 vs. MEM, Bass equaled a season-high of 18 points (7-10 FG) with six rebounds.
  - He originally scored a **season-high** 18 points 1/20 vs. SAC, his first time as a Laker leading the team in scoring.
- 1/7 at SAC, he joined Anthony Davis, Draymond Green, Kawhi Leonard, and John Wall as the only players this season to have six rebounds, five steals, four assists, and two blocks in a game. Bass also went 3-3 from the field for 10 points and recorded a +17 rating in his team-high 36 minutes.
- Bass tied a **career-high** with four blocks 12/22 at DEN.

## STEALING THE SHOW

Rookies Larry Nance Jr. (four steals) and D'Angelo Russell (three) led the defensive charge for the Lakers 3/27 vs. WAS. Several Lakers have posted career-bests in steals this season:

- Lou Williams set a **career-high** with seven steals 12/2 at WAS.
  - The **last time a Laker had at least seven steals in a game was Metta World Peace** (1/9/13 at SAS, seven).
  - Since at least 1985-86, just nine Lakers have achieved the feat.
- Larry Nance Jr. finished with a **career-high** six steals 1/14 at GSW, becoming the **first Lakers rookie since Eddie Jones (11/8/1994 at NYK) to have at least six takeaways** in a game.
- Brandon Bass collected a **career-high** five steals 1/7 at SAC.
- D'Angelo Russell matched his **career-high** with four steals 3/15 vs. SAC, the fourth time he has done so this season.
- Nick Young tied a **career-high** with four steals 1/1 vs. PHI, the **fourth** time in his career he has done so and first since 3/28/14 at MIN.
- Julius Randle had a **career-high** four steals 11/1 vs. DAL.
- Roy Hibbert recorded a **career-high** tying three steals 1/20 vs. SAC.
- Ryan Kelly had a **career-high** three steals 1/31 vs. CHA.
- Tarik Black matched his **career-high** with two steals 4/5 at LAC.
- Rookies Anthony Brown and Marcelo Huertas have had **career-best** two steals multiple times each.

## 7 LAKERS A-SCORING

Seven Lakers scored in double-figures 3/6 vs. GSW and are now 2-0 this season in such games (also 12/15 vs. MIL).

## TRIPLE-DOUBLE FOR JULIUS

Julius Randle recorded his first career triple-double with a **career-high** 10 assists, 18 rebounds (one shy of his career mark), and 13 points. *[notes courtesy of the Elias Sports Bureau]:*

- The 21-year-old became the second-youngest player in Lakers history to record a triple-double (Magic Johnson).
  - He is the first Laker to have a triple-double since Kobe Bryant did so 12/30/14 at DEN.
- The triple-double came in Randle's 72<sup>nd</sup> career game, joining [listed reverse-chronologically] Elfrid Payton, Hassan Whiteside, Victor Oladipo, Michael Carter-Williams, and Tony Wroten as the only players in the last three seasons to record a triple-double within their first 75 career games.
- The 18 defensive rebounds were a **career-high** as well.

## FOUR-POINT PLAYS

Lou Williams completed a four-point play in the first quarter 3/23 at PHX, marking the **ninth** overall for the Lakers this season and his second this year (also done 2/19 vs. SAS, fourth quarter). Previous four-point plays by L.A.:

- Jordan Clarkson converted a four-point play in the second quarter 2/22 at MIL, and another in the third quarter 1/12 vs. NOP.
- Kobe Bryant notched his **fourth** four-point play of the season 2/10 at CLE, completing the feat in the fourth quarter.
  - Bryant previously converted four-point opportunities on 2/6 at SAS (third quarter), 12/22 at DEN (first quarter) and 12/15 vs. MIL (third quarter)
- D'Angelo Russell completed his first-career four-point play 1/23 at POR in the fourth quarter.

## STARTER-UP

The Lakers used their **12<sup>th</sup>** different starting lineup of the season 3/8 vs. ORL.

- The Lakers used a different starting five in three straight games between 1/23-1/28.

## THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

3/8 vs. ORL: The trio of D'Angelo Russell (27), Jordan Clarkson (24), and Julius Randle (23) combined to score 74 of the Lakers' 107 points.

- It was the **first time Clarkson, Randle, and Russell all scored 20+ points in the same game**.
- Randle's 23 points tied a **career-high**.
  - With 11 rebounds, he recorded his fifth 20/10 game of the season.
- Clarkson hit five three-pointers and was a game-high +15 for the night.
- Russell went 11-19 from the field and had three steals.
- Larry Nance Jr. chipped in 10 rebounds and eight points in 20 bench minutes, his fifth double-digit rebounding game of the season.

3/6 vs. GSW: The starting backcourt of D'Angelo Russell and Jordan Clarkson combined for 46 points (7-14 from beyond-the-arc).

- Russell tied a **career high** with four steals and added five assists.
- Julius Randle had a team-leading 14 rebounds and 12 points for his 27<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season.

## BEATING THE CHAMPS

The Lakers staged one of the biggest regular season upsets in NBA history, with the pregame winning percentage disparity the largest overcome by the underdog at least 55 games into a season (.190 verses .917).

- L.A. held the Warriors to 4-30 (.133) shooting from the three-point line, an **opponent season-low**.
  - The Lakers shot 95.5% (21-22) from the foul line.
- The Lakers had just one turnover in the first half and tied a **season-high** with 15 first half assists.

## PODIUM GAME

D'Angelo Russell had a historic rookie performance 3/1 vs. BKN with career-highs of 39 points, eight three-pointers made, and 14 made field goals.

- The 39 points was the most by a Lakers rookie since Elgin Baylor scored 39 on 3/11/59.
  - Russell is just the third rookie in Laker history to score at least 39 points in a game, joining Baylor (three times) and Vern Mikkelsen.
- It was the first 39+ point performance by a rookie in the NBA since Jordan Crawford did so 3/30/11.
- Russell became just the second rookie in NBA history to score at least 39 points while making eight three-pointers, joining Rodrigue Beaubois (40 points and nine triples 3/27/10).

## ENCORE PERFORMANCE

Jordan Clarkson has followed up his First Team All-Rookie performance in 2014-15 with a solid second season:

- Jordan drilled a **career-high six three-pointers en route to 28 points (10-18 FG) with six rebounds 2/24 at MEM**, the second-highest scoring output of his career.
  - His previous career-high for threes in a game was four, done three times this year, including twice since the NBA All-Star Break (2/19 vs. SAS and 2/22 at MIL).
- Clarkson tallied a **career-high 10 rebounds en route to his third career double-double (22 points) 11/29 vs. IND**, in addition to a team-high six assists.
- He tied a career-high and became Los Angeles' first 30-point scorer this season with 30 points 11/3 vs. DEN and also tied a career-high with 12 made field goals (fourth time).
- From 2/10-2/21, Clarkson netted 20+ points in three consecutive games, the longest such streak of his career.

## 20/20/20

Three Lakers have scored 20+ points in the same game **five** times this season, most recently D'Angelo Russell (27), Jordan Clarkson (24), and Julius Randle (23) 3/8 vs. ORL. The others:

- Jordan Clarkson (28), D'Angelo Russell (22), and Lou Williams (22) 2/24 at MEM.
- Kobe Bryant (22), Julius Randle (22), and Jordan Clarkson (20) 2/21 at CHI
- Kobe Bryant (25), Lou Williams (21), and Jordan Clarkson (20) 2/19 vs. SAS.
- Kobe Bryant (28), D'Angelo Russell (27), and Lou Williams (20) 1/7 at SAC.



## AB PROGRESSING

Anthony Brown finished in double-figures for the second time in four games 1/23 at POR, scoring 10 points (2-2 3FG) to match his [career-high](#).

- Previously, Brown set [career-highs](#) in points (10) and field goals made (four) 1/17 vs. HOU a night after tying his previous career marks with nine points and three FGM 1/16 at UTA.
  - Brown set [career-highs](#) in three-pointers made (three), defensive rebounds (six), and total rebounds (seven) 1/16 at UTA as well.
    - The seven rebounds were a team-high against the Jazz.

## CLARKSON & RUSSELL SHINE IN TORONTO

Lakers guards Jordan Clarkson and D'Angelo Russell were two of 10 American rookie and sophomore players selected by the league's assistant coaches to participate in the Rising Stars Challenge at NBA All-Star 2016.

- Clarkson, who started the game at shooting guard, finished with 25 points, five rebounds, five assists and four steals in 23:40 in a 157-154 USA victory over the World team.
  - Clarkson also participated in the 2016 Taco Bell® Skills Challenge, joining Kobe Bryant (2007) and Derek Fisher (2004) as Lakers who have participated in the Skills Challenge event.
- Russell tallied 22 points (9-15 FG), a USA team-high seven assists and two steals in 16:20 off the bench.
- The duo became the eighth and ninth Lakers elected to the game (previously known as the Rookie-Sophomore Game), joining Jordan Farmar, Andrew Bynum, Kobe Bryant, Derek Fisher, Travis Knight, Eddie Jones, and Nick Van Exel.



## CAREER DAY

Lou Williams has reached a number of career benchmarks this season:

- Williams set a [career-high](#) with 16 free throws made 11/3 vs. DEN on 19 attempts.
- He scored 15 or more points in 10 straight games from 1/7 through 1/23, [marking the longest streak of his career with 15+ in consecutive games](#).
  - Previously, he scored 15+ points in seven straight games between 12/4-12/15, now tied for the second longest stretch of his career.
- His three blocks 1/26 vs. DAL tied his [career-high](#), done for the fourth time in his career.

## RARE LAKER AIR

Lou Williams' 15-of-15 shooting from the free throw line 1/8 vs. OKC put in him in a small group of just six Lakers players who have gone perfect from the charity stripe while attempting 15+ free throws in a game (since 1963-64). Included in the list are:

- Kobe Bryant (seven times), Jerry West (six times), Magic Johnson (five times), Elgin Baylor (once), and A.C. Green (once).

## LOU FROM THE LINE

Lou Williams scored 10 points without making a field goal (10-10 FT) 1/5 vs. GSW, becoming just the 23<sup>rd</sup> player in NBA history since the 1962-63 season to score at least 10 points without making a shot from the field.

- Lou joined Magic Johnson (0-4 FG, 10-11 FT 4/2/96 at CHA) as the only Lakers player to do so.
- Williams became the first player since Jerryd Bayless 2/22/11 at CHA to achieve the feat.

## CAREER NIGHT FOR LOU

Lou Williams erupted for a career-high 44 points 1/8 vs. OKC, going 12-25 from the field and a perfect 15-15 from the free throw line.

- 23 of his 30 second half points came in the fourth quarter.
- The 12 field goals made matched a career-high (also done 11/20/09 vs. MEM).
- Prior to his performance against the Thunder, his previous career-best for points was 36 set on 11/22/14 at CLE.
- Williams also made five three-pointers, marking the 12<sup>th</sup> time of his career he has made five or more threes in a game.
- He became the first Laker to score 40+ points in a game since Kobe Bryant scored 44 points 11/16/14 at GSW.
  - The last non-Bryant 40-point performances came from Nick Young, who went for 41 points 4/14/14 at UTA and 40 points 4/1/14 vs. POR.
- Of the last 30 40-point games by a Lakers player, Kobe owns 26 of the occurrences, Young has the aforementioned two, and Williams and Jodie Meeks (42 points 3/9/14 also vs. OKC) have one apiece.
- Since November 2014, only Williams (twice) and Russell Westbrook (three times) have multiple games of making 15+ free throws without missing an attempt, while just two other players in the NBA (DeMar DeRozan and Marc Gasol) have achieved the feat.

## D'ANGELO DOUBLES UP

D'Angelo Russell recorded his first career double-double 12/4 at ATL with a [career-high](#) 10 rebounds and 16 points.

- Five of his rebounds came at the offensive end, also a [career-high](#).

## CAN'T HANDLE RANDLE

Julius Randle had the best performance of his young career 11/1 vs. DAL, scoring 22 points with 15 rebounds, four assists, and four steals, all of which were team-highs.

- The 20/15 performance came in Randle's fourth career game, joining a short list of players in the last 20+ years to do so [chart at right]:
- Randle became the first player in the NBA to record at least 22p/15r/4a/4s since Kevin Love did so 12/15/14.
  - Only six players in the NBA have achieved such numbers in the past five seasons in a single game.
  - Randle is the *youngest* player in the NBA to do so since Anthony Randolph on 4/13/09, who is the *ONLY* player younger than Randle to do so since at least the 1985-86 season.
  - The only *Lakers* to achieve such plateaus since 1985-86 are Lamar Odom on 3/25/07 and Vlade Divac on 2/24/95.

## WORLD LEADER

Metta World Peace ranks 5<sup>th</sup> among active players (trailing only K. Bryant, K. Garnett, P. Pierce, and C. Paul) in career steals and 22<sup>nd</sup> in NBA history.

## YOUTH MOVEMENT

Of the 15 players on the roster, seven are either rookies (four players) or have just one year of NBA experience (three), including Julius Randle who played just one game last season.

## GREAT PERFORMANCES

**3/22 vs. MEM:** The Lakers limited the Grizzlies to an opponent season-low tying 33 rebounds (also done 2/2 vs. MIN), including an opponent season-low 20 defensive rebounds.

**2/24 at MEM:** The Lakers registered season-highs in threes made (17) and attempted (39), the most in a game by the Lakers since 3/25/14 vs. NYK (18 3FG).

- It was the most threes made in a game by the Lakers since 3/25/14 vs. NYK (18 3FG).
- L.A. turned the ball over just seven times, marking a new season-low.

**1/17 vs. HOU:** The Lakers scored 36 points on 73.7% (14-19) shooting in the first quarter, tying the season mark for field goal percentage in a quarter and most points in the first quarter this season.

**1/12 vs. NOP:** Los Angeles had a **season-low** eight turnovers against the Pelicans – who tied an opponent-low with two steals – and also allowed a **season-low** six points off of their miscues.

- The Lakers nabbed their first victory of the season when trailing at the end of three quarters, outscoring the Pelicans 28-to-20 in the final frame.

**1/7 at SAC:** Despite a 46 to 18 run between the third and fourth quarters, the Lakers were unable to give Kobe a winning sendoff in his final trip to Sacramento.

- Trailing by 27 points (63-90) at the 6:14 mark in the third quarter, L.A. came all the way back to take a 109-108 lead on a Jordan Clarkson 8' running jump shot with 3:49 left on the clock.
- L.A. shot a **season-best** 53.9% (41-76) from the field and equaled a **season-best** with a 60.0% clip in the second half.

**1/3 vs. PHX:** The Lakers never trailed, their **first wire-to-wire victory** of the season and led by as many as 38 points, their **largest lead of the season**.

- Phoenix was held to opponent lows of first quarter points (10), second quarter points (12), first half points (22), points through three quarters (51), and total points (77).
  - The 22 first half points were just three shy of the NBA record-low in the shot clock era, and marked the **sixth time since the 2002-03 season that a team scored 22 points or fewer in the first half**.
  - The first half scoring output was the fewest for *any* half in Suns history.

**12/25 vs. LAC:** The Lakers played their best quarter of the season in the fourth period, holding the Clippers to a season-low nine points and outscoring them by 18.

- It marked the **first time since 3/16/13 at New Orleans that the Lakers held an opponent to under 10 points in a quarter**.

**12/22 at DEN:** The Lakers overcame a 21-point deficit to capture a 111-107 victory for their **largest come-from-behind victory of the season**.

- The Lakers had their **best shooting quarter of the season** in the third, going 14-19 (73.7%) and outscoring the Nuggets 32-16.

**12/2 at WAS:** The Lakers recorded a team **season-high** with 18 steals.

- The 18 takeaways were the **most for the Lakers since 4/6/1997 vs. DAL** (19 steals).
- Thanks primarily to the steals, the Lakers forced the Wizards into an opponent season-high 23 turnovers.

## KOBE'S FAREWELL

### KOBE BRYANT VOTED ALL-STAR STARTER

Kobe Bryant was selected by fans as a starter for the 2016 NBA All-Star Game in Toronto, and was the **leading vote-getter with 1,891,614 votes**.

- This is Bryant's 18<sup>th</sup> selection (2<sup>nd</sup>-most all-time) and also his record-setting 18<sup>th</sup> *consecutive* All-Star selection.
- It will be Bryant's 16<sup>th</sup> All-Star start, the most in NBA history.
- Bryant was the leading vote-getter for the fourth time in his career (also 2003, 2011, and 2013).
- He has been a four-time All-Star MVP in 2002, 2007, 2009, and 2011, tied with Bob Pettit for most ever.
- Kobe holds All-Star Game records for most points scored (280), most field goals made (115), and most steals (37, tied with Michael Jordan).



### MAMBA MILESTONES

Kobe Bryant reached yet another milestone this season, grabbing career-rebound No. 7,000 in the first quarter at the 8:27 mark 2/22 at MIL.

- Only 102 players in NBA history have reached the 7,000-rebound plateau.
  - He has the 11th-most rebounds among active players (defined as having played in a game this season).
- Bryant finished the game with 15 points and five rebounds.
- He also tied Rashard Lewis for 11<sup>th</sup> all-time in three pointers made with 1,787 2/22 at MIL, and made two three-pointers the following game 2/24 at MEM to move alone into the 11<sup>th</sup> spot.

### MAMBA MOMENT(S)

Kobe Bryant turned back the clock on the Lakers road trip leading into the All-Star Break:

**2/8 at IND** – Bryant caught fire against the Pacers late in the fourth quarter, scoring 11 straight Laker points, including three consecutive three-pointers, to take a three-point lead with 2:30 left to play after once trailing by 17.

**2/6 at SAS** – Scored a team-high 25 points in his final game in San Antonio.

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Bryant is the first player age 37 or older to score 25+ points in three straight games since Michael Jordan, who did so in four consecutive games in 2003 at the age of 40.

**2/4 at NOP** – Led the team with 27 points and 12 rebounds and hit a game-sealing three-pointer with under a minute remaining.

- It was Bryant's second double-double on the year.
- Kobe led the team in scoring, rebounding, and steals.

**2/2 vs. MIN** – Tallied a season-high 38 points, five rebounds, five assists, and two steals on 10-21 shooting (7-11 from deep).

- Bryant became the fourth player in the last 30 years age 37 or older to have a 35point/5rebound/5assist game, joining Michael Jordan (three times), Karl Malone (three times), and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (once).
- It was the 12<sup>th</sup> time in his career Bryant made at least seven three-pointers in a game, and the first time since 3/28/08 vs. MEM.

### PASSING JERRY WEST

Kobe Bryant tallied the 6,239<sup>th</sup> assist of his career on a pass to Lou Williams with 6:09 to go in the first quarter 1/17 vs. HOU, passing Jerry West (6,238) for 2<sup>nd</sup> place on the Lakers career assist list and 28<sup>th</sup> on the all-time NBA list.

- Bryant trails only Magic Johnson (10,141) on the franchise assist list.

## TURNING BACK THE CLOCK

Despite playing in his fourth game in five nights, Kobe Bryant came up big 12/2 at WAS, recording an individual season-high as well as a team-high 31 points in 35:34.

- Bryant hit two critical baskets, including a 26-foot three-pointer when the Lakers trailed by one with 58.9 seconds remaining and then a 16-foot jump shot with 30.8 seconds left, to give the Lakers the lead for good.

## BRYANT IN BEANTOWN

In his final game playing in Boston, Kobe Bryant posted his first double-double of the season, finishing with 15 points, 11 rebounds and three assists in 33:09.

- Bryant ended the contest with a game-high +/- rating of 12.
- It also marked his 175<sup>th</sup> career double-double and first 10+ rebound game of the year.

## PASSING PEJA

Kobe Bryant passed Peja Stojakovic (1,760) for 12<sup>th</sup> place on the NBA's all-time three-pointers made list 1/31 vs. CHA, hitting four triples to bring his career total to 1,762.

## TWENTY FOR TWENTY-FOUR

Kobe Bryant now holds the NBA record for most seasons played with one organization (20).

- Bryant is now six seasons ahead of Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Elgin Baylor, and Jerry West (each with 14) for most years spent with the organization:
- The only other players in NBA history to play 20-or-more seasons are Robert Parish, Kevin Willis, and Kevin Garnett (21), and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (20).

## YOUNGEST TO 33,000

With a 9' turnaround bank shot with 1:10 remaining in the first half, Kobe Bryant scored his 18<sup>th</sup> point of the game and hit 33,000 points for his career, becoming the youngest player in NBA history (37 years, 137 days old) to achieve that feat, besting Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (37 years, 335 days).

## MAMBA MOVES UP

Kobe Bryant moved into fifth place on the Lakers all-time blocks list 12/4 at ATL with his 629<sup>th</sup> career rejection as a Laker, surpassing Andrew Bynum (628). Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (2,694), Shaquille O'Neal (1,278), Elden Campbell (1,022), and Vlade Divac (834) top the Lakers career blocks list.

## OUTSIDE THE LINES

### LAKERS AMONG MOST POPULAR MERCHANDISE

In online sales between October and December, 2015, the Lakers were the fourth-most popular team in terms of merchandise sold, and Kobe Bryant had the third best-selling player jersey.

### GOING GLOBAL

Kobe Bryant conducted the largest global conference call in NBA league history on December 21<sup>st</sup>, when he spoke for a half-hour to 146 reporters from 24 countries and territories.



## NBA ROOKIE SURVEY

Results from the annual NBA Rookie Survey conducted this summer, where 36 rookies voted on honors for their fellow first-year players:

- D'Angelo Russell was the top vote-getter at 40.0% in the 'best playmaker' category. Russell also finished tied for 4<sup>th</sup> in 'Rookie of the Year' voting and was one of 12 players to receive a vote for rookie that will have the 'best career.' Fellow rookies also thought Russell was the third-funniest member of the rookie class.
- Anthony Brown finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the 'best shooter' category, and received a vote for both rookie who was the 'biggest steal' at where he was selected and 'best defender.'
- Kobe Bryant was the second-favorite player amongst rookies for a second consecutive year, finishing 3.0% behind Kevin Durant for top honors.

## GM SURVEY

The Lakers were tabbed in a number of categories in the annual survey of the league's 30 general managers:

### TEAM

- The Lakers were one of five teams to receive a vote for 'best offseason moves.'
- L.A. also received a vote for team that will be 'most improved' in 2015-16.

### INDIVIDUAL

- Roy Hibbert received a vote for both 'most underrated acquisition' and 'best interior defender.'
- D'Angelo Russell was one of five players to receive a '2015-16 Rookie of the Year' vote and tied for second in 'rookie that will be the best player in five years.'
- Lou Williams received a vote for 'bench player who makes the biggest impact when he enters the game' and 'best role player.'
- Kobe Bryant tied for third in the 'toughest player in the NBA' category.

## INTERNATIONAL FLAVOUR

Opening night NBA rosters featured 100 international players from 37 countries and territories, including Marcelo Huertas (Brazil) and Robert Sacre (Canada) of the Lakers.



Huertas was one of a record nine Brazilian players on opening night rosters.



Sacre was one of an NBA-high and record-tying 12 Canadian players.

- The Lakers have just four road games between February 25<sup>th</sup> and April 7<sup>th</sup> (as opposed to 15 home games). The team will only be away from L.A. for three nights during this span, as one "road" game is against the Clippers, and the other three away contests come on the second night of back-to-backs.
  - 17 of L.A.'s first 24 games were on the road, including a season-long 13-day, eight-game trip between December 1<sup>st</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>.
  - The Lakers had just one 'four-game in five-night' set on their slate, coming between November 28<sup>th</sup> and December 2<sup>nd</sup>.
