The North-South-Dialogue Scholarship Programme has proved to be a useful instrument in supporting science and research for development. The programme contributes to poverty reduction by strengthening personal and institutional capacities of the developing countries in the area of higher education and research, by taking into account the regional and thematic priorities of Austrian Development Co-operation (ADC). In the last 25 years, about 200 students and researchers from Ethiopia have successfully completed their MSc, PhD and research at various Austrians institutions with the support of this programme. Therefore the first Alumni conference will be held in Ethiopia.

SPEAKERS

Dr. Rudolf Agstner

Austrian Ambassador to Ethiopia

He was born 1951 in The Hague, Netherlands. He joined the Austrian Foreign Service in 1977, served in Paris (1980-1981), Brussels (1981), Tripoli (1981-1984), New York/UN Mission (1984-1987), Cairo (1991-1996) and Bonn (2005-2006). Since October 2006 he is the Austrian ambassador to Ethiopia and Permanent Representative to the African Union. He is expert on the history of the Austrian (Austro-Hungarian) Foreign Service and Austrian presence in the Middle East and East Africa; author of 15 books and over 200 articles on the history of the Austrian (Austro-Hungarian) Foreign Service and Austrian presence in Egypt, Ethiopia, Israel, Libya and Sudan. Dr. Agstner lectures at Innsbruck University Institute of Contemporary History.

Ato Yinager Dessie

Head of Bureau of Finance and Economic Development

Dr. Yeshimebrat Masresha

President of Bahir Dar University

Dr. Yeshimebrat Masresha was working as the Academic Programs Officer and the Academic and Research Vice President of Bahir Dar University and is currently the President. She has also vast experience in teaching in undergraduate and post graduate programs in Higher Education Institutions and is a gender expert. She founded and headed the Girls education Center; she was the chair person of the Women and Staff Association (WSA) and of the Gender forum. Additionally she founded and facilitated the Gender, Development and Cultural studies Institute at Bahir Dar University.

Elke Stinnig

Austrian Agency for International Cooperation in Education and Research (OeAD-GmbH)

Elke Stinnig is a MSc graduate of the University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences Vienna. Since 2005 she is working for the Austrian Agency for International Cooperation in Education and Research, formerly known as the ÖAD, in the Academic Cooperation and Mobility Unit (ACM). She is the manager of the North-South-Dialogue Scholarship Programme and the One-World-Scholarship Programme.

Dr. Leonhard Moll

Head of Coordination Office for Development Cooperation Austrian Embassy Addis Abeba

He obtained a PhD from the University in Innsbruck/Austria in Geology and Mineralogy. After working for Austrian consulting companies in the field of hydrogeology and geotechnics he got involved in development cooperation in the field of rural water supply. He was the project manager for different NGOs and consulting companies in Ethiopia, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Rwanda and Uganda. In 1996 he became the head of the coordination office of the Austrian Development Cooperation in Ethiopia, and in 2002 head of the Austrian Representative Office in Ramallah responsible for the West Bank and Gaza. Since 2006 he is once again head of the coordination office of the Austrian Development Cooperation in Ethiopia.



Dr. Zerfu Hailu

German Development Cooperation (GTZ)

Zerfu Hailu G/Wold is, since 2006, the manager of the project Global Environmental Facility, (GEF-IFAD supported) Community – based integrated Natural Resources Management. Before that he was the responsible deputy general manager for Environmental Protection, Land Administration & Use Authority (EPLAUA). He was also working as the environment protection team leader at the Bureau of Agriculture (BoA) and as a forestry management senior expert at the Bureau of Natural Resources Development & Environmental Protection (BoNRDEP). In 2002 he received a PhD from the University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences, Vienna, Austria.

Dr. Mulugeta Kibret

Vice president of Bahir Dar University

Mulugeta Kibret is since 2008 the Academic and Research Vice President of Bahir Dar University. Before that he was the Dean of the Faculty of Education and the acting head of the Department of Biology at Bahir Dar University. From 2003 to 2004 he headed the Department of Environmental Engineering at the Arba Minch Water Technology Institute. In 1999 he received a PhD degree in Biology (with specialization in Microbiology) from the Karl-Franzens University of Graz, Austria.

Dr. Teshome Tesema Kebede

Amhara Regional Agricultural Research Institute (ARARI), Forestry research director

Teshome Tesema Kebede is, since October 2008, the director of the Forestry Research Directorate (ARARI, Bahir Dar). Before that he was the head of the Natural Resources Conservation and Development Department and of the Forestry and Agroforestry Conservation and Development Department, at the Bureau of Agriculture and Rural Development, in Bahir Dar. In 2008 he obtained a PhD (Hon.) in Natural Resources Management from the University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences, Vienna, Austria.

Dr. Teshome Soromessa

Addis Ababa University

He obtained his PhD degree from the University of Vienna. Currently he is an academic staff of Addis Ababa University where he teaches, supervises graduate students and conduct researches. In the University, he has been and is coordinating many research projects, inter alia, administering college's graduate researches of many graduate students managing over 5 million Birr annually and working on projects of his research area. His research interest focuses on community and ecosystem ecology with great emphasis on phytodiversity and species richness. He is currently working on Indigenous Woody Species of Ethiopia.

Ato Abraham Abiyu Hailu

Amhara Regional Agricultural Research Institute (ARARI), PhD student at BOKU

Abraham Abiyu Hailu is born in Bahir Dar. He got a BSc in Forestry from the Wondo Genet College of Forestry in 2000, and a MSc in Mountain Forestry from the University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences, BOKU, Vienna, Austria, in 2005. Currently he is a PhD student at the Institute of Forest Ecology, at the University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences, Vienna (BOKU).

Ethiopian Institute of Agricultural Research (EIAR), National Case Team for Integrated Watershed Management (IWM)

Kindu Mekonnen is currently leading the National Case Team for Integrated Watershed Management (IWM) research of the Ethiopian Institute of Agricultural Research (EIAR). Moreover, he is coordinating the African Highlands Initiative (AHI) project at Holetta Agricultural Research Center (HARC). In addition to the coordination responsibilities he is serving as an associate editor of the Ethiopian Soil Sciences Society and technical committee members for sustainable land management initiatives in Ethiopia. In 2008 he received a PhD degree from Boku.

Dr. Maria Wurzinger

BOKU - University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences Vienna, Division of Livestock Sciences

Maria Wurzinger is on a joint appointment between BOKU, Austria and ILRI-International Livestock Research Institute, Nairobi, Kenya since 2007. Her position at BOKU is dedicated to tropical animal husbandry and tropical animal breeding, at ILRI she is a member of the working group "Improving utilization of farm Animal Genetic Resources". Her focus is characterisation and modelling of production systems, evaluation of indigenous knowledge related to animal breeding, and development of breeding strategies at a local level. She is involved in several projects world-wide (e.g., Bolivia, Argentina, Syria, Tunisia, Uganda, Ethiopia) related to improving the livelihood of smallholder farmers and pastoralists. She has a MSc in Agricultural Sciences and a PhD in Animal Breeding from BOKU-University, Vienna.

Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Studies, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Addis Abeba University

Kelay Belihu Desta is an associate professor in the department of animal production studies of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of Addis Ababa University.
