Mielie Mielie iPod/Camera pouch




Here's an step-by-step tutorial to make a handy Mielie pouch that will protect your iPod or camera from bumps and knocks.


You will need:


- A piece of hessian (burlap) approx 40 x 30cm depending on the size of your pouch
- Some t-shirt fabric, preferably in different colours.

- A crochet hook
 Contact glue
 A piece of felt, approx 30 x 15cm
 Needle & thread
- A press stud


Place the pattern on a piece of hessian (burlap) E mark. Also add the width of 3 fingers all the way around your pattern. Mark E Cut.









Throw on your design with a permanent marker.



Cut a piece of t-shirt fabric along the selvedge into strips about 3cm wide. Pull the strips lengthwise so that the edges curl inwards.




Using a crochet hook, pull the t-shirt strip through the hessian from the bottom so that the end bit is on top. Now hook a loop of t-shirt strip through the hessian to form a "corn Kernel" on the top.



Follow the pattern, changing colours as you go. Don't worry about the messy end bits — we'll deal with them later.







When you've finished weaving, snip the end bits flush with the rest of the weaving £ turn over. Fold the hessian over the weaving £ cut away any overlap.

the corners,

closer than lcm.






15 Glue the hessian onto the weaving with contact glue.



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Cut a piece of felt to the exact size of the weaving E stick it on to the hessian. You can use a bottle or rolling pin to roll it flat.



Fold according to your iPod/Camera size & Sew up the sides. Add a press stud to close. Et Volla! You're done.
