Our Partnership with Berklee College

The WYJB is presently in partnership with Berklee College School of Music and is supported by various organizations including the Council of Jazz Advocate (COJA) and the City of Wilmington. We also enjoy support from the Gilliam Foundation and the East Side Charter School.

As part of our partnership with Berklee College of Music, our weekly curriculum requires that all students are enrolled in the <u>Berklee PULSE Music Method</u>. This is a web based program that is accessed through the Berklee City Music Network Nationwide. It offers a fun and innovative way to provide music instruction.

The program also includes a staff of successful professional musicians who have the heart to help the youths in our city. This staff includes Fostina Dixon-Kilgoe [woodwinds], James Dixon [brass], Vernon James Sr. [woodwinds], Todd Kilgoe [percussion], and Dill McDaniel [bass & piano]. Aaron Walker, and Jeff Knoettner are also instructors who have participated with the WYJB.

Other professional musicians have expressed a sincere interest in volunteering their services as needed. Wilmington native Fostina Dixon-Kilgoe founded the Wilmington Youth Jazz Band in 2003. An Alumna of Berklee College of Music, she was awarded a grant to launch the program. The Delaware Division of the Arts also supports the WYJB. Our in-kind supporters include the late Dr. Frank Foster, the late Dr. Billy Taylor, Sam Ash Music/Paul Ash, the Grand Opera House, Council of lazz Advocates, Wilmington Music School, East Side Community Learning Center, and the Afro- American Historical Society.

Fostina Dixon-Kilgoe Founder/Executive Director/Director of the Band

Fostina Dixon-Kilgoe is the founder and director of the Wilmington Youth Jazz Band and a native of Wilmington. She is a composer, vocalist and jazz soloist who plays the soprano, alto and baritone saxophones, flute, and clarinet. She has recorded several of her own jazz albums with group Winds of Change on the Fossiebear production label. In 2010, she released a new CD called, "Yesterday, Today and Forever". Mrs. Dixon-Kilgoe has performed and recorded with jazz greats such as Dr. Frank Foster, Dr. Billy Taylor, Charli Persip, Melba Liston, Abbey Lincoln, Gil Evans, Gerald Wilson, James Blood, the Mary Lou Williams Jazz Festival, and numerous tours in the U.S., Europe, and Asia. She also traveled with the late great Marvin Gaye for four years and recorded with the Fat Boys. She has been featured in several books including: Black Women and Music: More than the Blues, by Linda Williams and Eileen Hayes (2007), Black Women in American Bands and Orchestra, by D. Antoinette Handy (1995), The Genuine American Music, by the Honorable James M. Baker (1993), and American Women in Jazz, by Sally Placksin (1982). Mrs. Dixon -Kilgoe currently teaches in the Christina School District and completed her Master's program in Educational Leadership at Wilmington University in 2008. She was the recipient of the Outstanding Art Educator Award for the Christina School District in 2009 and the recipient of the Christi Awards of Outstanding Achievement in Arts Education by Christiana Cultural Arts also in 2009. Mrs. Dixon-Kilgoe served on a panel at the Kennedy Center selecting the best emerging saxophonist throughout the world for 2008. Fostina is a recipient of the Delaware Division of the Arts 2012 Individual Artist Fellow as "Established" and won the \$6,000 award for Jazz: Composition.
