# 1. Campus Development

## Opening up of a path through the Craigweil Road sites

The acquisition of Craigweil Lodge and its grounds makes it possible to open a pedestrian route from Carleton Turrets to Craigweil House. This will enable pupils and staff to move from one building to another without needing to leave the perimeter of the campus.

#### Short-term use of Craigweil Lodge

The school has a number of accommodation requirements and, using the existing structure, it may be possible to develop Craigweil Lodge in order to meet some of these needs.

# Consider the value of engaging outside agencies to assist in drawing up a whole-school plan for development

Wellington School now consists of a contiguous campus stretching from Blackburn Road to the end of Craigweil Road. A holistic approach to future development, in both the short and medium terms, is needed and the possible benefits of seeking professional guidance will not be overlooked.

## Consult with appropriate groups

Staff have already been given the opportunity to identify the campus development needs of the school and the findings are being considered the Estates Committee. In due course, other groups will have the chance to contribute to the consultation exercise.

## Managed long-term development, staged coherently

The aim is to produce a campus development plan that will serve the needs of the school for the next decade. Developments will be prioritised in line with need and the availability of funds.

# Development of alumnus register

There are plans to formalise and develop the existing FP records, in order to maintain closer contact with former pupils throughout their lives. Ways will be considered to encourage former pupils to maintain closer links with their school, and to contribute to its future success.

# 2. Marketing

## Website development (by August 2016)

See Saw Creative, based in Kilmarnock, have been awarded the job of producing a new website and prospectus for Wellington School. Work has already begun on this and the aim is to launch the site in August 2016. The aim is to ensure that the school has an appropriate and attractive online presence that properly communicates its key strengths.

- Development of opportunities for prospective families to visit the Senior School, the Junior School, the Nursery and the Outdoor Nursery Alternative forms of open event are being considered to enable prospective families to experience life at Wellington for themselves.
- Evaluation and development of the annual Open Evening and Open Afternoon

The existing Autumn Open Events will remain on the calendar, but every effort is being made to maximise their effectiveness.

# New printed prospectus to showcase School ethos and strengths

The production of a new printed (and digital) prospectus is being undertaken by See Saw Creative in conjunction with the website project.

- Evaluate, develop and highlight association with ARFC Opportunities will be sought to maximise the benefits of the school's partnership with ARFC.

#### Guidance Staffing

Consideration is being given to the possibility of increasing the number of staff with special guidance responsibilities. The aim is to bridge the gap between the existing roles of the Form Tutor and Assistant Head.

- Introduction of National 5 PE in S3/S4
- Change S1 and S2 2<sup>nd</sup> language offering to widen exposure and broaden provision

All pupils in S1 and S2 study French and, currently, one of German, Spanish and Latin. Adjustments are being made to enable every pupil, in addition to studying French, to have some experience of two out of the three additional languages. This will increase the pool of languages from which each pupils can choose when selecting National 5 courses for S3/S4.

Review of Reporting Schedule

The existing schedule of reports and Parents' Evenings is under review. The recently formed Curriculum Committee (see 7 below) will make proposals to SMT in due course.
