

Notable Alumni in the Arts

Actors

Actor/comedian <u>Anthony Anderson</u> headlined Parlor Live Comedy Club in August 2010. He was a long-time cast member on NBC's hit *Law and Order*. Anderson has appeared in more than 20 films, including *Transformers*, *The Departed*, *Me, Myself*, and *Irene* and *Barbershop*.

On television, Shondrella Avery had a recurring role as Candy on the situation comedy One on One and later became a cast member

on the spinoff *Cuts*, playing the same role. Previously, she had been a cast member on the reality/prank television series *Girls Behaving Badly*. In movies, Avery appeared in *Napoleon Dynamite*, *Domino*, *Deja Vue* and *The Secret Lives of Bees*.



Starting at the age of two, <u>Corbin Bleu</u> followed his father's footsteps and began appearing in television commercials like Life cereal, Bounty, Hasbro, and Nabisco. He is best known for playing the role of Chad Danforth in the Disney Channel original movie, "High School Musical". He starred as Isadore, "Izzy" in Disney Channel movie called, *Jump In!*. From January to April 2010 Corbin appeared in the Broadway musical *In the Heights*. In July 2011 he appeared in *Hairspray* at the Hollywood Bowl.

<u>Lauren Blumenfeld</u> is an actor, performer, comedian, writer and visual artist currently residing in Brooklyn, NY. She also teaches Movement, Drama, Clowning and Superhero Club to children all over Manhattan. Since graduating from Tisch, Lauren has had quite the eclectic acting career, playing everyone from Barack Obama to Jesus to Olive Oyl in the award winning Off-Broadway production of *Sailor Man*. She was the protagonist in the HBO special called Daddy's Girl. She was also the protagonist in the CBS Schoolbreak Special What About Your Friends.

<u>Clea DuVall</u> breakthrough role was in *The Faculty* in 1998. Roles in *Girl Interrupted*, *The Astronaut's Wife*, *She's All That*, *But I'm a Cheerleader*, *Ghosts of Mars* and *Thirteen Conversations About One Thing* followed. After appearing in *The Laramie Project*, *Identity* and *21 Grams*, DuVall starred on HBO's Emmy Award-winning



Carnivàle, which ran from 2003–2005. During that time, she also starred in Helter Skelter (which earned her a Satellite Award nomination) and in *The Grudge*. She also appeared in an episode of *Buffy the* Vampire Slaver. In 2008 she appeared in Passengers. Recent projects have included Itty Bitty Titty Committee, Zodiac and a recurring role on NBC's hit series Heroes. In 2009-2010 she appeared in Saving Grace, Lie to Me, Private Practice, Bones, Numb3rs, Law & Order and The Event. In addition. DuVall has directed a film called It's Not Easy Being Green.



Jenna Elfman began her career appearing in commercials. She studied with Milton Katselas, the renowned acting teacher. She appeared in TV shows including Two and a Half Men. Brothers and Sisters and My Name is Earl and the films Looney Tunes, Krippendorf's Tribe, Keeping the Faith and Edtv. She played the leading role of Dharma in the ABC show Dharma & Greg, which ran for five years and which earned her a Golden Globe. She starred in the CBS comedy Accidentally on Purpose in the 2009-2010 season. She recently completed

shooting on the feature film Friends With Benefits which will be released in 2011.

Stacy Ann Ferguson better known by her stage name **Fergie**, is a singer-songwriter, rapper, fashion designer and actress. She was a member of the children's television series Kids Incorporated, and the girl group Wild Orchid. She is the female vocalist for the hip hop group the *The Black Eyed Peas* with whom she has attained much charting success worldwide. Her own debut album spawned four Billboard Hot 100 top five singles, three of which went to number one.



Spencer Grammer played the role of Casey Cartwright in the television series *Greek*. She has also appeared in *Robot Chicken*. Descent, As the World Turns, the pilot of Six Degrees, The Bedford Diaries, Law & Order Special Victims Unit, and Clubhouse, Jonny Watch, Cheers and Third Watch. She has also appeared in a few independent movies such as 2006's The Path of Most Resistance. Spencer has also been featured in commercials for MTV and Kodak.

Among Leonard Earl Howze's first film/tv appearances you will find: Barbershop (2002), Antwone Fisher (2002), and VH1 Goes Inside: Barbershop. Other appearances include: Blood River (2007). School for Scoundrels (2006) and My Name Is Earl (2006) and Memphis Beat (2010).



After graduating from UCLA's School of Theatre, Film, and Television, Tamara Hunter dove head first into the "real

world" as an aspiring theatre actress. After realizing there will never be enough theatre in LA to pay the bills, she started a casting internship with Mali Finn, which parlayed into an internship with Sarah Finn and Randi Hiller, where she knew she had stumbled upon a career that blended her two loves the most: being in the room with great actors and never having to sweat in front of a camera again. She has been working as an associate with Finn Hiller Casting for 4 years working on such features as Wall Street: Money Never Sleeps, Coach Carter, The Guardian, Fast and Furious: Tokyo Drift, Gridiron Gang, She's The Man, In The Valley of Elah, Battle in Seattle and most recently, Iron

Man, Vantage Point, and Hotel for Dogs. As a casting director, she done two AFI Master Thesis films, Caroline's Crossing and Still Life, for director Mahesh Pailoor, and the LA premiere of Headless by Lea Floden and directed by Don Bonnell at the Electric Lodge Theatre.

Taran Killam started his career by appearing in 1994 movie *Naked Gun 33-1/3: The Final Insult*. He showed his singing expertise in *Stuck in the Suburbs*. <u>Michael Longoria</u> was last seen starring as Frankie Valli in the critically acclaimed *Jersey Boys* on Broadway. He graduated from NUY's Tisch School of the Arts. He made his Broadway debut in the smash hit musical *Hairspray*, later creating the role of Joey in the original Broadway cast of *Jersey Boys*. 
Visual Artists



<u>Sam Gehry</u>, the youngest of Frank Gehry's four children, was born in Los Angeles in 1979. After studying at the Maryland Institute College of Art, he returned to Los Angeles and began work in his father's architecture studio, where he currently is involved in the development of several of the studio's most significant commissions, with his father including the Serpentine Gallery Pavilion in London pictured to the left.

Based out of Los Angeles, Karen Pike is described as "a prolific painter who quickly

made a name for herself within the highly competitive West Coast art scene with a catalogue of work that is both confident and vulnerable. That dichotomy, and the underlying emotion behind it, is what truly sets apart her body of work already striking in its bold strokes and rich color. Her collections have been featured in galleries and festivals from California to New York, and as far away as Japan. Some of her most popular pieces include "New Orleans", "Tipsy", and "A Night to Remember." She's also been featured in several live performance painting events, where she tells a story with paints and canvas for the audience, unfolding in real time, and seasoned by the energy of the event music, and the viewers. Her recent work shows that Pike



has truly matured as an artist. Using a bold palate of vibrant colors, she renders an air of exuberant nonchalance, demonstrating a sophisticated awareness of contemporary art, but with a clearly communicated joy of both the art and the medium." She earned her B.F.A at the University of Arizona.



<u>Sonia Romero</u> is a full time artist living and working out of North East Los Angeles in a studio called She Rides The Lion. Public works include mural commissions for the Los Angeles County Arts Commission, the Los Angeles Metro (Macarthur Park Station) and the Metro Neighborhood Poster Award. Exhibition highlights include her debut solo show at Avenue 50 Gallery and a printmaking



House(ballet) in their fall production of *Aida* and creating and learning repertoire from choreographers such as Adam Hougland, David Parker, Johannes Wieland, Ohad Naharin, Jill Johnson and Aszure Barton. Last year, Norbert was on tour with Aszure Barton & Artists in Vienna, Austria and Neuss, Germany. Today, Norbert resides in Italy; starting his professional career as a soloist in Balletto Teatro di Torino.



Natasha Diamond Walker states "I dance for those who are afraid to feel what I can feel for them, onstage—somehow ridding themselves of restraint and entertaining the fact that they too can be free...just use me: I am an instrument for experience." She received scholarships to Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre School, Alonzo King Lines Ballet School, and, Dance International Spain with Kazuko Hirabayashi. In May 2007 she graduated from the Alvin Ailey/Fordham University Program, earning her BFA in Dance. She has had the pleasure of dancing the works of Lester Horton, Martha Graham, Alvin Ailey, Paul Taylor, Francesca Harper, and Nacho Duato. She can be seen dancing with Buglisi Dance Theatre, Hunter Dance Company, Lester Horton

Dance Theatre, and most recently 360° Dance Company. A lover of travel she has had the opportunity to dance and choreograph throughout Canada, Germany, Spain, and Korea.

Ashleigh Doede is a member of the Nevada Ballet Theatre. From 2009-2010 she was a company member with Pasadena Dance Theatre, dancing under the direction of Cynthia Young, Associate Director Laurence Blake, Richard Bradley, Jean-Marie Martz, and Julia Ortega. From 2007-2009 she was a member of the Nancy Einhorn Milwaukee Ballet II Program. She also had the opportunity to perform with the Milwaukee Ballet in Michael Pink's *Sleeping Beauty*, Marius Petipa's *La Bayadere, Kingdom of the Shades* and Antony Tudor's *Offenbach in the Underworld*. Ms. Doede received the majority of her early training from Le Studio

Alex Escalante (performing his work 25th Frame with Nancy Garcia) is now a Brooklyn-based choreographer and performer. His work employs various mediums including movement, theater, film and live music. Escalante's works delve into current socio-political issues, creating a performance space in which viewers are invited to examine and reflect upon their own beliefs. Born in Los Angeles, Escalante received a BFA in Dance from SUNY Purchase. In 1999, he moved to New York City and subsequently performed and toured with Donna Uchizono Company, Jennifer Monson/Birdbrain, Doug Varone, Doug Elkins, David Neumann, Gerald Casel and the Metropolitan Opera, Over the past five years, Escalante's choreography has been presented in the United States at venues such as Dance Theater Workshop, Danspace Project, La MaMa E.T.C., Dixon Place, DUO Theater, Here Arts Center, Movement Research at the Judson Church, Brooklyn Arts Exchange and Joe's Pub. Internationally he has been featured at festivals such as Barroquísimo-Performatica (Puebla, Mexico) and at Tanec Praha (Prague, Czech Republic). Escalante was a 2007-2008 Movement Research Artist-In-Residence, and was awarded a LEXDance Under the Radar 2007 residency. His 2008 evening-length work *Clandestino* was selected by Time Out New York as a Best of 2008 performance. Escalante has collaborated with the theater company Division 13 Productions, creating choreography for their productions of Samuel Beckett's Cascando and Eugene Ionesco's Journeys among the Dead. Escalante also works as a freelance dance and opera photographer and is a teaching artist in the NYC public schools working with at-risk youth.



Mary Kay Lee began her professional career with the Long Beach Ballet, performing in the *Rite of Spring, Song of Norway*, and *The Nutcracker*. She then moved to Chicago to join the Chicago Lyric Opera Ballet as a soloist performing in *Aida, La Sonnambula,* and *Faust.* MK has also danced with the Pennsylvania-Milwaukee Ballet, Ballet West, Tau Dance Theatre, Ballet Hawaii, Corpus Christi Ballet and Ballet Florida. She has danced major roles including Sugar Plum Fairy, Snow Queen, Dew Drop, Autumn, Giselle, Bluebird, La Bayadere Pas de Deux, Les Sylphides, Romeo & Juliet, Paquita, and L'Histoire du Soldat. Upon returning from the Long Beach Ballet Ambassador Tour to China in 2009, she currently teaches and choreographs at the Coffeemill Dance Studio in Key West, Florida and dances with the Key West Contemporary Dance Company.

<u>Victor Quijada</u>, the son of Mexican immigrants, was nicknamed "Rubberband" after he hit the pavement of his Baldwin Hills neighborhood as a pretzel-like break dancer at age 8, and he's come full circle. His journey has been an inspiring one -- from street kid to diligent student at L.A. County High School for the Arts to dancer with Twyla Tharp and others. Rudy Perez, part of the New York-based experimental Judson Dance Theater in the 1960s and an L.A. dance fixture since 1979, agrees about Quijada's commitment. After teaching Quijada in high school, Perez invited him to join his postmodern troupe. Two years later, Tharp beckoned. After three years with Tharp, Quijada went on to work with choreographer Eliot Feld. But in 2000, he moved to Canada and joined



Les Grands Ballets Canadiens de Montreal, where he even managed to master choreography by ballet great George Balanchine. In 2002, he founded the Montreal-based Rubberbandance Group. The six-member troupe returned to his hometown, where it made its Los Angeles debut in September 2008 on two local stages, the Irvine Barclay Theatre and Cal State L.A.'s Luckman Theatre. With "Elastic Perspective Redux," a collection of works commissioned by an assortment of dance festivals, the company showcased Quijada's signature choreography: a fusion of hip-hop, ballet and contemporary movement. Quijada's experiments won two United Kingdom awards the following year--the Peter Darrell and the Bonnie Bird awards for choreography. Toronto, Washington, Brussels, London, Helsinki, and Aichi, Japan. Quijada choreographs for film and television and an adaptation of Hasta La Proxima was nominated for the 2004 American Choreography Awards in the short film category. He has made pieces for *Scottish Dance Theatre*.



Erica Robson has been a working dancer, actress, teacher, director and choreographer in the field of performing arts for more than a decade. The following two years, she worked in Sicily with Compagnia Zappala Danza, and the dance theatre company MotoMimetico. From March 2005 through May 2005, Julie was fortunate enough to be invited to Bari to

<u>Ai</u> Carina Uemura was born in Los Angeles to a Japanese father and half-Japanese, half-Italian mother. Because of her father's work, Ai traveled between Los Angeles and Japan. She appeared as a dancer in Janet Jackson's music video *Go Deep*, and debuted with label BMG releasing three singles and one album. In 2003 she departed from BMG and moved on to Def Jam Japan making history in being the 1st female signed to the label. Ai's range in music stretches from hip hop to R&B. She is capable of both rap and song and has been dubbed THE QUEEN OF HIP-HOP & SOUL in Japan. In July 2007, Ai performed at the Japanese leg of the *Live Earth* tour in Tokyo.

Songwriter, producer, vocalist, and instrumentalist <u>Jon B.</u> brings a distinctive focus on smooth melodies to contemporary R&B. Proficient on keyboards, guitar, bass, and drums, he wrote and produced songs for such rap music legends as Toni Braxton, After 7, and Color Me Badd. Born in Rhode Island and raised in California, Jon B. was the son of a professor of music and a concert pianist. Influenced by music found in his grandparents' record store, he began combining '70s soul with '90s hip-hop on his 1995 debut album, *Bonafide.* It sold more than one million copies and went gold. His second album, 1997's *Cool Relax*, continued the emphasis on classic hip-hop soul. He continued entertaining audiences, with several concert tours throughout



the world. Aside from personal performances, he writes for popular artists including Toni Braxton and the rap group Az Yet.



In the 2008/2009 season, <u>Angel Blue</u> made her debut with the San Francisco Opera Company as "Clara" in *Porgy and Bess*, she was the featured soloist with the Valdosta Symphony in Valdosta, Georgia where she sang the soprano role in Arthur Honegger's *King David* and also performed with the Korean Symphony Orchestra in Seoul and Busan, Korea. Born in Taiwan, <u>Gwhyneth Chen</u> emigrated to the United States with her family in 1980, where she continued her musical studies with Eduardo Delgado, Robert Turner, and Aube Tzerko. She received her Bachelors and Masters of Music degrees from the Juilliard School. At the age of nineteen, she was a laureate in the 1990 Tschaikovsky International Piano Competition. In 1992, she was once again a laureate, this time in the Prokofieff International Piano Competition. She was the grand prize winner of the International Web Concert Audition Competition in 1999,


and her first performance with orchestra was at age eleven when she performed Prokofieff's *Third Piano Concerto*. Ms Chen has appeared with an outstanding number of orchestras, including the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Hong Kong Philharmonic, Moscow Radio Symphony, Greenville Symphony, Bergen Philharmonic, Kyushu Symphony of Japan, Taiwan National Orchestra, Shanghai Symphonic, Moscow State Philharmonic, Pasadena Symphony, Pacific Symphonic, Aspen Music Festival Orchestra, Taipei City Symphony, Fort Worth Symphony, Orchestre de Fresne, Zagreb Philharmonic, and Lake Placid Symphonietta. Ms. Chen received high honor from international musical and diplomatic circles when she was invited by the government of China (PRC) to perform a concert in the National Grand Theatre ("Steel Egg") in Beijing, China, to celebrate the 2008 Olympics. The concert in Beijing was preceded by a triumphant preview concert in Taiwan at the National Music Hall, where she was acclaimed nation-wide as "The Pride of Taiwan."

While at LACHSA, <u>Gerald Clayton</u> was the winner of the 2001 Music Center Spotlight Awards and received the 'Outstanding Soloist' Award during the Monterey High School Jazz Competition in 2001 and 2002. Gerald was presented with the "level 1" award by the National Foundation for the Advancement of the Arts (NFAA) in January of 2002 and later was named Presidential Scholar in the Arts. He then performed at Steinway Hall in New York and was presented with a scholarship award by the Music for Youth Foundation. Later in 2002, he received the Shelley Manne Award for emerging young artists from the L.A. Jazz Society. In 2006, Gerald received Second Place in the prestigious Thelonious Monk Institute Jazz Piano Competition. Despite his young age, Gerald has already performed extensively with numerous outstanding musicians in a wide variety of venues. Notable engagements include



the performance of a composition for piano and orchestra with the Henry Mancini Orchestra at Royce Hall (August 2002) and Disney Hall (May 2006). In 2005, Gerald was asked to join pianists Benny Green,

Mulgrew Miller and Kenny Barron for a series of duo concerts in Europe. He also performed with trumpeter Clark Terry in Switzerland. His solo on Cole Porter's *All of You* on his debut album *Two Shade* was nominated for a Grammy in 2009 for Best Improvised Jazz Solo. After a 2010 tour of Europe and the States with his trio (Justin Brown-drums and Joe Sanders-bass), he returned to LA to perform at the Iridium with the legendary drummer Al Foster, Chris Potter on tenor sax, and Doug Weiss on bass. Later that month he premiered some new music for his quintet featuring Ambrose Akinmusire on trumpet, Logan Richardson on alto sax, Joe Sanders bass, and Justin Brown drums at the Jazz Standard.



In late 1998, the 17-year-old <u>Josh Groban</u> was introduced by his vocal coach to Grammy-winning producer/arranger David Foster. In the 1999 Grammy Awards—as a stand-in for Andrea Bocelli— he rehearsed Foster's "The Prayer" with Céline Dion. Groban was offered a recording contract at Warner Bros. Records through Foster's 143 Records imprint. Groban performed *There For Me* with Sarah Brightman on her 2000–01 *La Luna World Tour*. The singer's self-titled debut album *Josh Groban* was released on November 20, 2001. Over the next year, it went from gold to double-platinum. On February 24, 2002, Groban performed *The Prayer* with Charlotte Church at the closing ceremonies of the Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and by November, he had his own PBS special, *Josh Groban In*

Concert (2002). After his second album, Closer was released, it rose on the Billboard charts from number 11 to number one. Groban and his recordings were nominated for more than a dozen awards in 2004, including the American Music Award, a World Music Award, an Academy Award, and a Grammy. His third studio album Awake was officially released on November 7, 2006. A world tour to 71 cities in 2007 followed. He also recorded a duet with Barbra Streisand of All I Know of Love. In October of 2007 he released his Christmas album Noël and by December it had gone Quintuple Platinum and ultimately sold more albums than the record holder for most Christmas albums sold, Elvis Presley. Currently, Groban is finishing work on his fifth studio album, entitled Illuminations. The album is set for release in November 2010. He will appear in his first film, a comedy, Crazy, Stupid, Love that is due to be released on April 22, 2011.



Gretchen Parloto An alumni of the Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz, Parlato has been turning heads ever since she won its 2004 International Vocal Competition with which she displayed a musical individuality loaded with paradoxical powers. Her sultry, intriguing voice and unique, rhythmically agile phrasing came with inescapable centripetal force; the more intimate and understated she sang, the more she drew listeners in. Since then she has toured worldwide to sold out audiences with BBC Radio proclaiming, "Star over London...A star is born!" Her originality captivates musicians as well, prompting

invitations to appear on over 50 recordings with the likes of Terence Blanchard, Kenny Barron, Terri Lynn Carrington and Esperanza Spalding. Her breathtaking performances have been captured on television in Europe and Japan and she has become a sought after clinician on vocal styling. She has produced two CD's—*In a Dream* in 2009 and *The Lost and Found* in 2011 that have won critical acclaim internationally. Michael West of the Washington City Paper said: "It's indisputable that she sounds like no one else working in jazz today. Parlato is, in fact, arguably the emblematic jazz vocalist of her generation, and perhaps the most visionary to come along in a generation."

Julie (Pinchuk) McNamara is Senior Vice President, Drama Development, CBS Television Studios. In her position, McNamara oversees the development and creation of all primetime drama series. Most recently she developed *The Good Wife* and CBS's series, *NCIS: Los Angeles* and was part of the team that developed the hit CBS series' *Numb3rs*, *Criminal Minds*, *Ghost Whisperer* and the CW's 90210. Playwright/Screenwriter

At age five, Josefina Lopez emigrated with her family to the United States, where they settled in Boyle Heights. After graduating from LACHSA, she earned a BA in film and screenwriting from Columbia College Chicago, and an MFA in screenwriting from the School of Theater, Film and Television at UCLA. After having over 100 productions of her plays throughout the United States, Lopez is one of today's preeminent Chicana writers. She has written several plays such as Simply Maria, Or the American Dream; Confessions of Women From East L.A.; Boyle Heights; Lola Goes To Roma; Food For The Dead;

Unconquered Spirits; Queen of the Rumba and Real Women Have Curves. She is the co-screenwriter of the film version of her play Real Women Have Curves, starring America Ferrera (Ugly Betty) and Ingrid Oliu (Stand and Deliver). The movie garnered much acclaim, including at the 2002 Sundance Film Festival where the film won the "Audience Award" and a "Special Jury Award for Acting." Lopez has written several other screenplays including Loteria for Juarez about the mysterious murders of women in the Mexico/US border town of Ciudad Juárez. Lopez has won several awards including a Gabriel García Márquez award from Mayor of Los Angeles in 2003. She was also recognized by the WGA as the cover story for the December 2002/January 2003 issue of the prestigious Writers' Guild magazine Written By, entitled "Real Writers Have Courage." Lopez and cowriter George LaVoo won the "Humanitas Award for Screenwriting" for Real Women Have Curves.
