If a girl chooses not to register as a Girl Scout, she will need to pay the \$50 non-member fee at registration time.

Day Camp Ages

Day Camp ages have changed to serve girls in grades 1-5. Day camp is tax-deductible for many families. We will not offer the optional overnight this summer. However, any girl, who attends day camp that registers for a resident camp session after her day camp week is over, will receive a \$50 discount on her overnight program.

Extended Hours at Camp Trading Posts!

Camp Trading Posts will now be open during the week at camp. Girls can bring money for the week, or parents can purchase Trading Post Pesos through the council, which work like gift cards. One Fee!

Each program has just one fee listed, which is the full price for a girl to attend that session. Take advantage of the early registration date and register by midnight on **Tuesday, March 15** to save \$50 off weeklong resident camp programs.



Health, Safety, and Special Needs

Girl Scouts Carolinas Peaks to Piedmont camps meet high standards for health and safety of not only the Girl Scouts of the USA, but of the American Camp Association. Both organizations place an emphasis on the safety of campers and staff, and offer standards and training to assist staff in providing quality programming.

Every summer, GSCP2P camps welcome girls with a wide range of skills, abilities and needs. Camp is a safe, supportive environment where staff strive for every girl to have a memorable experience. If your daughter has dietary needs (including severe food allergies), special health care or physical limitations, please call the camp your camper plans to attend. You will be able to discuss the nature of your camper's needs with the director and determine if the support and accommodations we can offer will be enough for your camper to have a safe, fulfilling camp experience. We are committed to serving ALL girls and accommodations can be made in the majority of cases. Please contact the camp directly for more information prior to registering.

In order to provide a safe, supportive environment, girls are expected to be respectful of camp guidelines and camp property, as well as other campers and staff. We reserve the right to send any camper home that is unsafe, endangers other campers, staff or property. We have a zero tolerance for bullying behavior. Parents/guardians or emergency contacts will be notified and are responsible for picking up the camper immediately from camp. No refunds are given if a camper is asked to leave for behavior concerns. We also ask that parents encourage their campers to speak up when they see unacceptable behavior among others in their unit. The staff are there to ensure every camper is having a safe and fun experience at camp.

Camp Accommodations

All three GSCP2P camps have units (campsites) unique to their property. Most of them are cabins, while others are platform tent units, tree houses or bunkhouses. Each camp has trained counselors housed in separate quarters within the unit, close enough to supervise campers and their interactions, but sleeping in their own cabin. For some of the younger girl programs at Camp Pisgah and Keyauwee, staff actually stay in the larger cabins with their groups. Please be sure to read the camp descriptions, and remember you are welcome to attend an open house at any or all of our camps to see the housing each camp has to offer.

In addition to meeting the industry standards for health, safety, program and personnel criteria set by the federal, state and local governments, all our camps meet the high safety standards set forth by Girl Scouts of the USA.



Summer Staff

Our directors recruit and hire mature, skilled staffers who have program experience and a sincere desire to work with young women in an outdoor environment. Staff are hired locally, as well as from anywhere in the United States, and from other countries. By hiring such a diverse staff, campers are given the opportunity to broaden their experience of other cultures, languages and customs. All our staff are Nationally Certified in First Aid/CPR and attend our intensive pre-camp training program that includes program design, behavior management, health and safety and outdoor camping skills. Staff responsible for specialty areas such as the waterfront, archery range, pool or climbing walls are required to complete focused training in safety and management of those activities.

Counselor-in-Training I – Fee: \$500

Camp Ginger Cascades – July 3-16

Camp Pisgah – July 10-23 OR July 24-August 6

Keyauwee Program Center – July 10-23

Thinking about working at camp someday? CIT I's learn leadership, teamwork, group dynamics and more as they develop new skills and practice them under the supervision of our trained staff. You will work with younger girls leading games, teaching new songs and sharing your love of camp. With successful completion of this program, CIT's earn the CIT I pin and an opportunity to apply as a CIT II. Campers in this program will stay over the weekend at camp.



Counselor-in-Training II – Fee: \$580

ALL CAMPS – June 19-July 9

If you have successfully completed the CIT I program, you may apply for CIT II. If accepted, you will learn how to design and deliver programs, facilitate specialized camp activities and further develop your leadership and teamwork skills. CIT II's nationally certify in First Aid/CPR and receive their CIT II pin. Campers in this program will stay over the weekends at camp. *The Early Bird pricing does not apply to this program.*



Program Aide Training – Fee: \$145 for the week (round-trip transportation for the week is \$60)

Camp Pisgah and Keyauwee Program Centers – June 20-24

Girls will attend and complete Program Aide training the first week of camp, on a day camp basis. Girls in this program will spend a portion of each day using their skills. You will spend time focusing on a specialty area (art, drama, games, etc.) during the week as well. With successful completion of this program, campers earn their PA pin and are eligible to register as a trained Program Aide for day camp weeks 2-6.

Program Aide Day Camp – Grades 7-12 • June 20-24 – Fee: \$90; add an additional \$60 for transportation.

This program is for girls who have already been trained as Program Aides and want to assist at Day Camp. Dates are the same as Day Camp. *The Early Bird pricing does not apply to this program.*

Ginger Cascades Troop Explorers • June 19-21; June 26-28 – Fee: Girl \$100; Adult \$50

You and your troop will have time to try a variety of activities during the day and sleep in the comfort of Hilltop Lodge at night! Activities may include swimming, boating, cascading, hiking, climbing, crafts and more. Program activities will be facilitated by camp staff and all meals, snacks and a T-shirt per participant are provided.

Keyauwee Core Camp • June 15-17 – Fee: Girl \$100; Adult \$50

If you want to go troop camping but haven't had the time to organize it or have not been able to get your outdoor license, come to Keyauwee and experience camp in all its greatness; go boating, geocaching, swimming and do some fun crafts, while we do all the work. 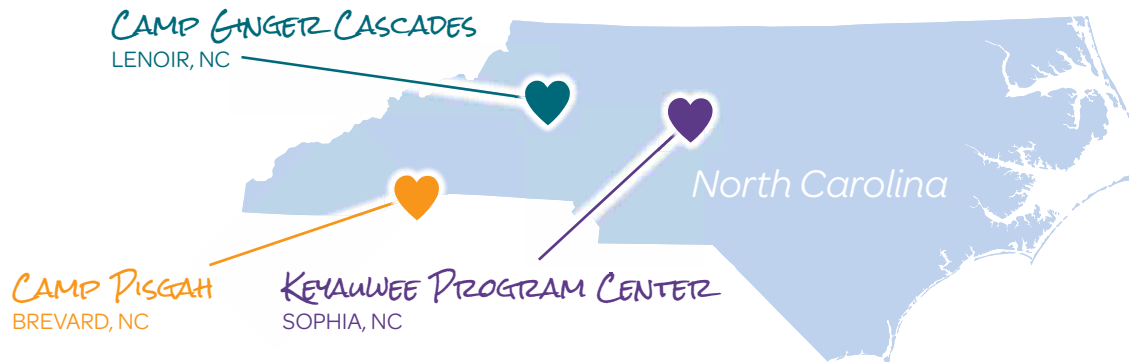
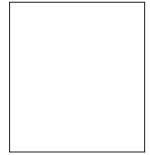
