New \$10,000 Public Library at Peabody Now Ready for Occupancy.

The doors of the new Public Library building made possible by Andrew Carnegie will be thrown open to the public next Saturday, and visitors are cordially invited to inspect it. There will be no public exercise at this time, but citizens will be gratified at what they find. Few cases exist where so handsome and so serviceable a Library has been built with this amount of money and it is quite likely that Peabody will be a model for other towns.
