## Decision

1. The official, Mr. Sergio Jadue, is found guilty of infringement of art. 13 (General rules of conduct), art. 15 (Loyalty), art. 18 (Duty of disclosure, cooperation and reporting), art. 19 (Conflicts of interest), and art. 21 (Bribery and corruption) of the FIFA Code of Ethics.
2. The official, Mr Sergio Jadue is hereby banned from taking part in any kind of football-related activity at national and international level (administrative, sports or any other) for life as of notification of the present decision, in accordance with Article 6 lit. h) of the FIFA Code of Ethics in conjunction with Article 22 of the FIFA Disciplinary Code.
3. No costs are to be borne by the official, Mr Sergio Jadue.
4. The official, Mr Sergio Jadue, shall bear his own legal and other costs incurred in connection with the present proceedings.
5. This decision is sent to Mr Sergio Jadue. A copy of the decision is sent to Confederación Sudamericana de Fútbol (CONMEBOL) and to the Federación de Fútbol de Chile. A copy of the decision is sent to the chief of the investigation, Dr Cornel Borbély.

**Note relating to the terms of the decision:**

Pursuant to art. 78 of the FIFA Code of Ethics, the Ethics Committee may decide not to communicate the grounds of a decision and instead communicate only the terms of the decision. The addressee of the decision has ten (10) days from receipt of the terms of the decision to request, in writing, the grounds of the decision. Failure to do so will result in the decision becoming final and binding. A request for the grounds of the decision does not affect the terms of the decision, which come into force as soon as they are communicated (art. 45 par. 1 of the FIFA Code of Ethics).

**Note relating to the legal action:**

Only the motivated decision can be appealed against to the FIFA Appeal Committee (Article 80 of the FIFA Code of Ethics in conjunction with Articles 119 et seq. of the FIFA Disciplinary Code).
