It was lovely to see parents in our school on the second day buying hats for their children. Only



Active after School

The Active after School Program is being replaced by the new Sporting Schools program.

Our school was a part of the Active after Schools Program provided by the Australian Sports commission: thanks to Bernie Altmann's dedication in her coordinator role. This is an outstanding achievement and all staff and community are also to be thanked for their support over this time. The new Sporting Schools program is due to begin midyear.

Sports Day

As mentioned last year in our newsletter, we investigated possibly joining the small schools sports day. After much consultation with Governing Council and the students, the staff decided at this stage to stay at Port Broughton, with the understanding that if our partnership of schools decide to organise a sports day we will investigate joining them.

Sports day will be at Port Broughton Area School on Friday 13th of March. This year we have negotiated with PBAS a handicap system of scoring based on the YP secondary sports day system and our team games will be mixed rather than single sexed. To maximise participation, a new team game will also be introduced.

The R-2s will participate for half the day and return to school. (They may stay for the full day under parent supervision). Years 3-7 will participate for the full day and will be expected to stay for the full day. We will take the community bus and the school bus but encourage parents to transport their children if they are able to.

REMINDER

During Term 1 & Term 4 in the case of catastrophic fire danger, the school will be closed and the school bus will not operate. On all other days, the school has a Bushfire Action Plan that sets out what we do in the event of a fire front approaching the town. Part of this plan is an identified Refuge (School Activity Hall) where students and staff stay until the front has passed.

Governing Council Elections

Parents, we need you! Four vacancies for Governing Council exist. I personally encourage you to nominate for Governing Council. Being on Governing Council gives you the opportunity to learn a little more about school operations, and you are able to provide us with a parent perspective when decisions are made.

Our next Governing council is Tuesday 17th February @ 7pm. The AGM is 24th March @ 7pm – Bernie, Katrina and Kelly are up for nomination and a replacement for Kerry Warner is needed. A nomination form is included on the right. You can complete the form and return to the office.

Elections for Governing Council occur after the annual report has been presented at the AGM. When the meeting closes, a short Governing Council meeting is held to elect office bearers. Governing Council meets Tuesday evenings, twice per term. Please consider joining us.
