# 32nd ANN ARBOR FILM FESTIVAL

MARCH 15 - 20, 1994

Welcome to the 32nd Ann Arbor Film Festival. As the oldest festival of its kind in the United States, the Ann Arbor Film Festival is a showplace for independent and experimental 16mm cinema. The intent of the festival is to encourage the work of the independent filmmaker, to promote the concept of film as art, and to provide a venue for screening as much independent film as time allows. For you the viewer, this festival is a unique opportunity to screen state-of-the-art experimental and independent film in the perfect setting: the Michigan Theater's respect for film guarantees excellent projection on the big screen.

Film entries have arrived from all over the world: Australia, Austria, Canada, England, France, Switzerland, New Zealand, and all around the US. Length of film varies from one minute to two hours. Films are selected into the festival program based on overall quality in technique and creativity. The festival does not program by category. Every show has a mix of every genre submitted including narrative, documentary, animation, and experimental.

The Ann Arbor Film Festival is supported by wonderfully kind and generous members of the Ann Arbor community who donate money, food, time, and in-kind support. Funds for festival operations are financed through filmmaker entry fees, ticket sales, and dollars contributed from local businesses and friends and supporters from around the United States. The Ann Arbor Film Festival is made up of an all-volunteer staff with a board of directors that oversees activities.

This year's Festival is dedicated to the Sarajevo Arts Festival in Ann Arbor: Artists Under Siege and to the artists and filmmakers in Sarajevo who, like us, embrace the arts as a necessity of life. We also dedicate the Festival to Fredrico Fellini the master, Frank Zappa the genius, and to the right to privacy and choice for all.



#### THE SCREENING COMMITTEE ®

The Festival received a total of 343 films this year. Each film submitted was viewed in its entirety by the 5-member Screening Committee, who viewed the 105 hours of film every evening over the past six weeks. Because the number of entries exceeds the available public screening time, not every film can be programmed; however, every film entered is still in competition, whether or not it has been programmed.

The function of the committee is to select as many films for the public screening as time allows. Screening Committee members are selected for their love & knowledge of independent and experimental film, as well as for their commitment to the Festival's goals. # THE AWARDS

The Awards Jury is comprised of internationally-recognized filmmakers, artists, and critics who are dedicated to independent and experimental film as an art form. They view all public screenings and other non-programmed entries of their choosing.

The function of the Awards Jury is to: (1) screen all entries that have been programmed into the public screenings, and others as time allows; (2) distribute the awards money; and (3) suggest the program of awarded films and highlights for the Sunday night winners screenings. Decisions regarding awards and the distribution of prize monies are the prerogative of the Awards Jury; their decisions are final. This year's Awards Jury is:

Jules Engel, Founding Director of the Experimental Animation Program at Cal Arts. Mr. Engel is highly regarded as a painter and printmaker, as well as a filmmaker. Introducing modern art to animation, he was a trailblazing animator, having worked with Walt Disney on Fantasia and Bambi in the early Disney Studio days. Mr. Engel is the recipient of the Norman McLaren Heritage Award (1992), which recognizes outstanding achievement in animation around the world.

Barbara Sternbera, a Canadian visual artist who uses the film medium to express her interest in time, motion, repetition, reality perception, and memory. She has taught film at York University, worked for the Canadian Filmmakers Distribution Centre, served on the Toronto Arts Council and Ontario Arts Council juries, and helped organize the 1989 International Experimental Film Congress. Her films have been highly awarded around the world and are held in the National Gallery of Canada collection.

Zack Stialicz, an experimental filmmaker, optical printing artist, and film historian. His film Aristophanes on Broadway has been screened widely both nationally and internationally. Mr. Stiglicz is currently a visiting artist teaching film production and aesthetics at the

#### Tom Berman Award \$1250 Most Promising Filmmaker




