The Ready4Work team has been diligently working with our participants to insure their success. In only 3 months, Oct to Dec 2011, 101 participants joined the program and 62 were placed in jobs. Almost 30 participants are currently enrolled in some type of educational or trade program. In order to case manage the growing numbers, Ready4Work welcomed a new case manager. The addition allows case loads to decrease, in turn creating more one-on-one opportunities with each client.

We've also been working to give back to the community. Members of the team volunteered in the 100 Homes Jacksonville campaign to house the highest risk homeless in our area. The campaign exceeded its goal and our team helped make it happen. Staff and participants also partnered with the Salvation Army to help sort and handout gifts to needy families this holiday season.
